



G.O.P. Chairman Resigns

Town of Bethlehem Republican Party Chairman Arthur E. McCormick has submitted his resignation to the Republican Town Committee. Mr. McCormick said his resignation is effective upon the naming of a successor or on March 1, 1971. It is expected that a new chairman will be elected before that date.

Mr. McCormick, who has served as party chairman for six years, told the committeemen that his only reason for resigning is that the position takes too much of his time and that he must devote more time to his law practice. He stated that he has enjoyed his tenure as chairman very much and regretted the necessity of resigning. He indicated that he expects to remain active in politics.

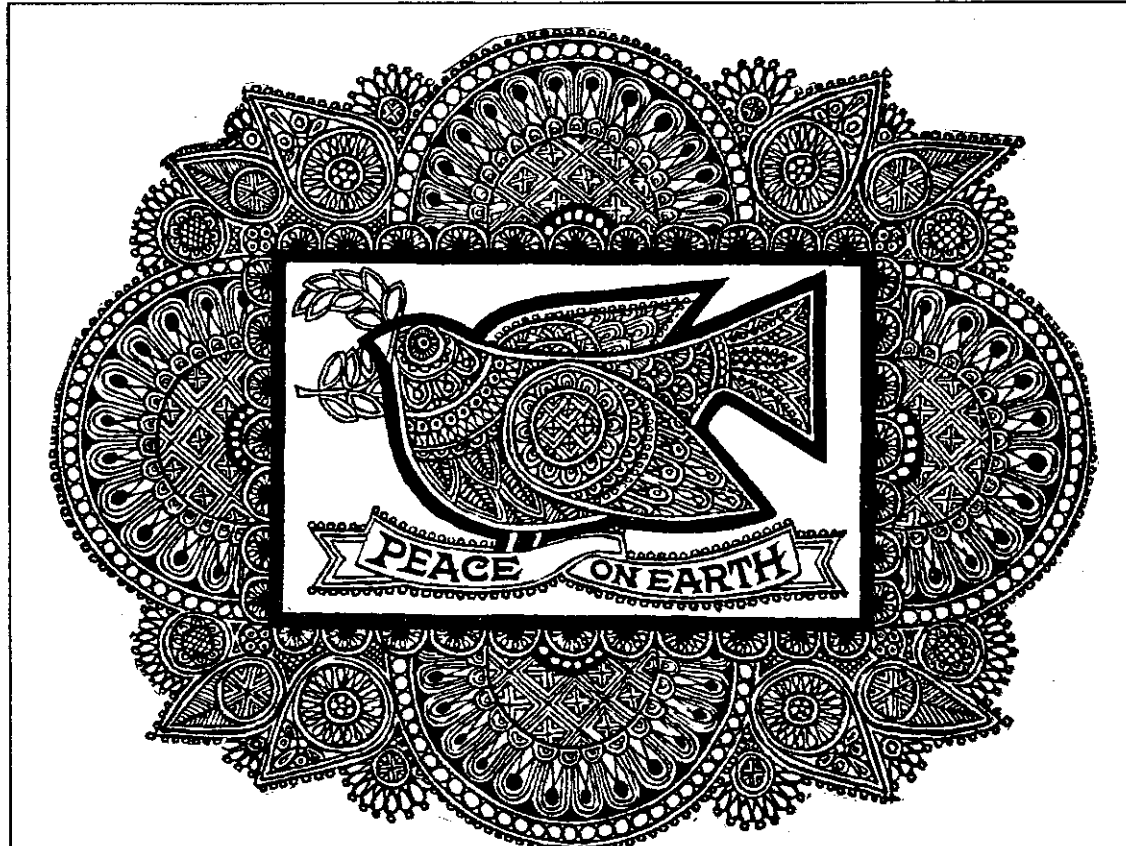

The directors of National Commercial Bank and Trust Company of Albany and the First Trust and Deposit Company of Syracuse have voted unanimously to recommend to their shareholders the formation of a new registered bank holding company.

Subject to approval of share-

Based on September 30 statements, the holding company banks would have assets of \$1,155,397,145; deposits of \$1,003,996,210; and capital funds of \$77,033,317. For the twelve months ending December 1, 1970, combined earnings, before securities gains of losses, of the two banks were reported to be \$11,529,038.

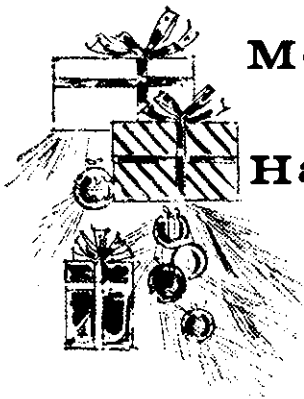

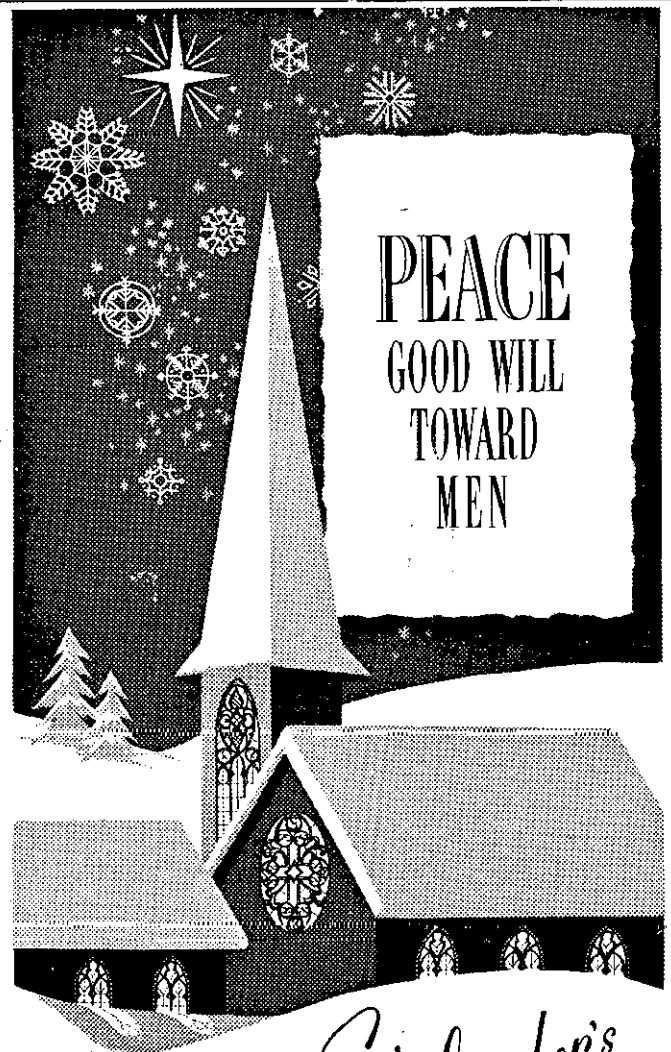

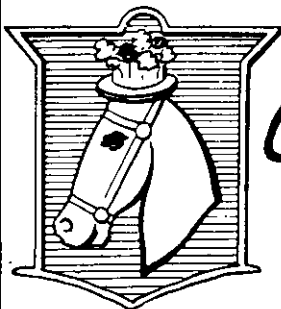

pany for each share of the bank.

The dividend policy of the holding company will be a matter for decision by its Board of Directors and the amount of any dividend payment will be determined in consideration of the circumstances existing at the time of its declaration. However, in the discussion between the two banks which culminated in the proposal and in consideration of the interests of the stockholders of each bank, an annual dividend rate of \$1 per share on the stock of the holding company is contemplated.

Mr. Herzog will be Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of the holding company. Mr. Spaid will be President and Chief Administrative Officer, while Douglas Barclay, a Syracuse attorney and state senator, will be Secretary. The board of directors will be made up of six members nominated by each bank. Those to be named by National Commercial are Erastus Corning, 2nd, Mayor, City of Albany; Frank Wells McCabe, Chairman of the Board of National Commercial; Mr. Herzog; Arnold Cogswell, President of Aird Island Inc.; Richard F. Sonneborn, President of Mohawk Brush Company and James A. Fitzpatrick, Chairman of the Power Authority, State of New York.

It is anticipated that headquarters of the holding company will be in Albany. The holding company will operate 87 offices serving 61 communities in Northeastern and Central New York.

Mr. Herzog stressed that each bank will retain its present name and will operate under its own management and directors, as it does today, "retaining that close customer relationship which is so essential to success in banking." The capabilities of the holding company, operating through the individual banks, will assure a greater range of services and will make it possible to meet more fully the banking needs of the customers of both banks.

New Director

William P. Blackmore, M.D., Ph.D. of Delmar, has been named

director of the newly-established division of clinical research of the Sterling-Winthrop Research Institute, a corporate division of Sterling Drug Inc.

The announcement of Dr. Blackmore's appointment was made by W. Clarke Wescoe, M.D., Sterling vice-president for medical affairs. In his new capacity, Dr. Blackmore said, Dr. Blackmore will direct the planning and conduct of all clinical pharmacology and clinical research on Sterling medical products in the United States.

The new division which he heads will encompass the former Institute departments of clinical pharmacology, previously headed by Dr. Blackmore, and clinical research.

A prominent pharmacologist; Dr. Blackmore was associate professor of pharmacology at Southwestern Medical School of the University of Texas before coming to the Institute in 1962. He is the author of many papers published in scientific journals.

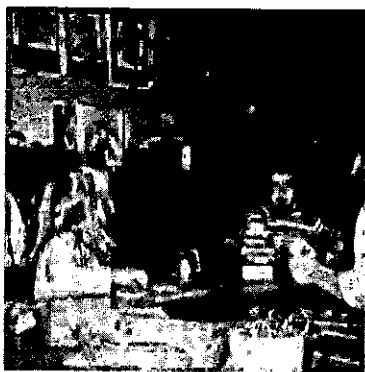



Foster Parents Needed

Team B of the Eleanor Roosevelt Development Services, which serves South Albany and Greene Counties, is in the need of foster parents who are interested in caring for children experiencing developmental disorders either of a physical or emotional nature. The allowance provided for this is \$150 a month per child. This is, however, likely to go up in the near future.

The Eleanor Roosevelt De-

velopmental Service is a division of the Mental Retardation and Children's Services of the N.Y. State Department of Mental Hygiene. Its purpose is to help handicapped children up to the age of 21 and the retarded of any age. At times foster homes are needed for children or adults because they cannot function within their own home for one reason or another.

Being a foster parent can have several rewards and gratifications beyond the remuneration offered. Persons interested in becoming foster parents for the Developmental Services will have the opportunity for training sessions as well as the support from a clinical team.

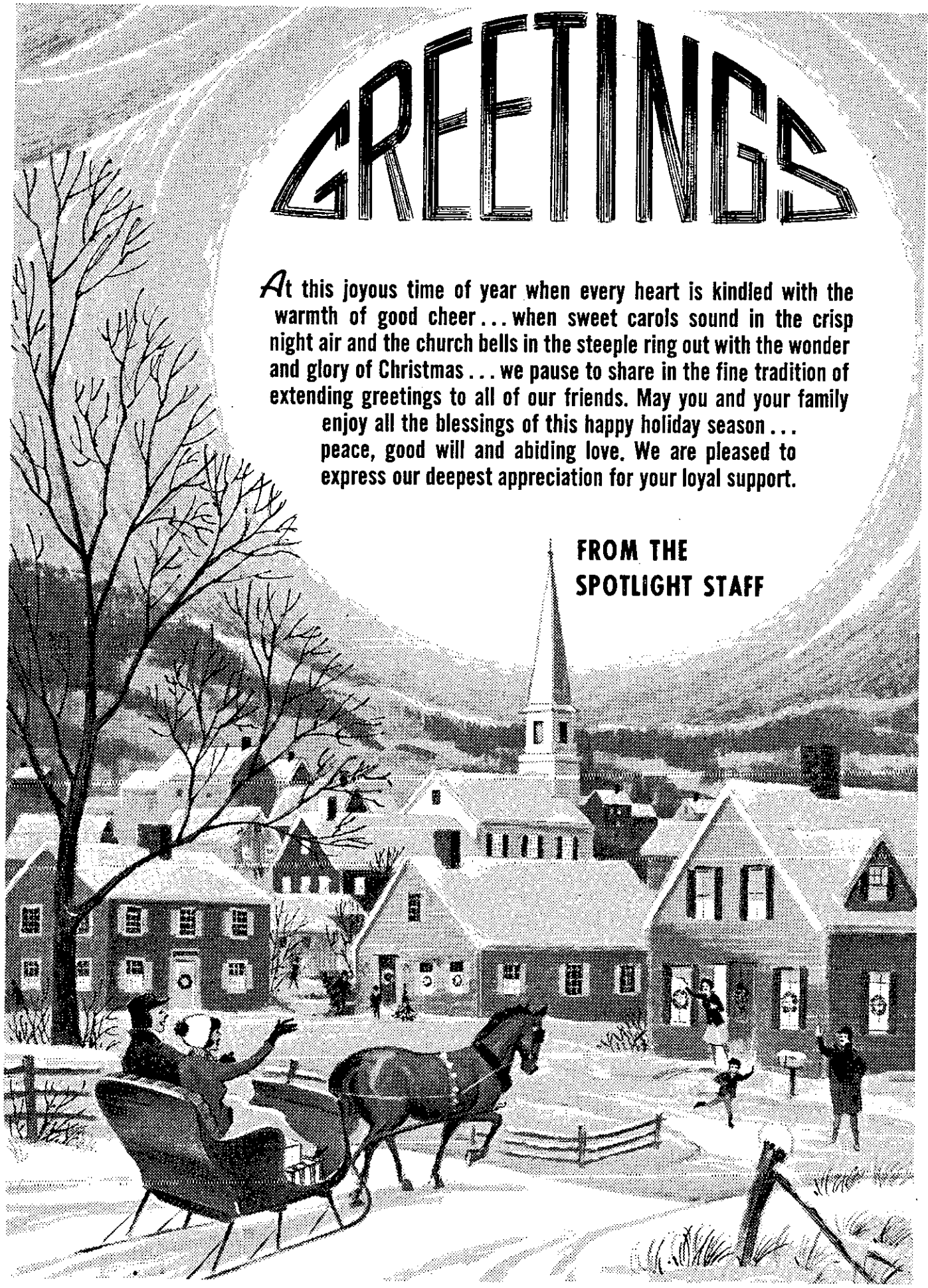

INDIAN FIGHTER QUILTS — Last week William Wadsworth Cade walked into the office of Vincent L. Tofany, Commissioner of the State Department of Motor Vehicles, and voluntarily surrendered his driver's license. "It's time to call it quits," said Cade. The man who didn't call it quits when he was an Indian fighter in the old west had decided that he could no longer fight the daily battle with traffic on the local roads. At 97, having traveled from a four-horsepower covered wagon through the Model T Ford up to the 250-horsepower cars on modern highways, Cade felt that after 53 years of safe driving with nothing more serious than a slight dented fender to mar his record he'd better quit while he was ahead. Cade lives near a curve on Route 9W in Selkirk and the view from his window has often been more harrowing than battlefields on which he fought in Cuba during the Spanish-American War or those on which he fought in the Philippine Insurrection. "I've helped take out 11 dead and 128 injured from accidents since 1939," he said. "There is one pole they've replaced 11 times." ing Contest - as part of a continuing effort to encourage more young men to become auto mechanics.

The program improvement was announced in New Orleans by John H. Moore, Jr., manager of the Plymouth Trouble Shooting Contest, during the 64th annual convention of the American Vocational Association.

Moore said that all participants in the contest now will be able to purchase a valuable set of mechanic's tools at minimal cost directly from Contest Headquarters in Detroit. In the past, Trouble Shooters had to be employed by a Chrysler Motors Corporation dealer to be eligible to purchase the tools at reduced cost.

Moore explained that the Tool and Job Program was inaugurated in 1968 by Chrysler-Plymouth to help defray the purchase price of these tools. A substantial investment in proper tools is a prerequisite to employment for most new auto mechanics.

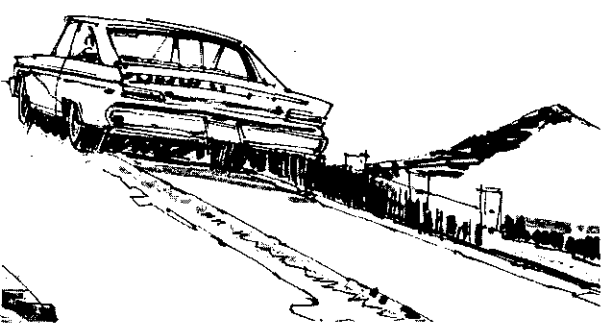
"The goal of the program," Moore said, "is to get as many as possible of the 4,000 young men who compete annually in the Trouble Shooting Contest to seek employment in the automotive service field. And, of course, we would like to see them working in Plymouth dealerships."

Under the revised Tool and Job Program, Moore said all students who participate in a local Trouble Shooting Contest will receive a certificate which entitles him to purchase for only \$274 a 181-piece tool set and a six-drawer tool chest which has a retail value of \$539.

As a further incentive for a Trouble Shooter to seek employment at a Plymouth dealership, Moore said the program also provides that if a Plymouth dealer hires the Trouble Shooter, the dealer can buy the tools and then sell them with no down payment to his new employee for \$224. This is less than half the retail price and is \$50 less than the direct purchase price.

This means the Trouble Shooter can go to work immediately for a Plymouth dealer with his own set of tools and can use these tools while he is paying for them through a weekly payroll deduction. For example, a deduction of

only \$4.30 each week will pay for the tools in one year.

If the apprentice mechanic's employment is terminated for

any reason before the tools are paid for, the program provides that the dealer and Trouble Shooter can reach an agreement on ownership and final payment.

Children in Grades 7 and 8 are required to be accompanied by an adult OR a responsible Senior High School pupil. Admissions personnel have the right to challenge any such admission to avoid the practice of 7th and 8th-graders simply asking older pupils at the door to go in with them.

Copies of the official admissions rules and procedures have been sent to all school building principals, and they passed this information along to all pupils.

Some disciplinary problems have arisen in the past, particularly with pupils who don't care much about watching the basketball game, but just want to be where the action is. This is the reason adult supervision is required for pupils through Grade 6. High School pupils who accompany 7th and 8th-graders must assume the responsibility for supervising them, as must the adults who accompany younger children.

QUESTION: Why are 5th-graders at the Delmar School being required to sell all sorts of products to raise money for spending a week next spring at Lawson's Lake?

ANSWER: For the past four years, Mr. Hugh Williams, a 5th grade teacher at the Delmar School, has taken his class to Lawson's Lake for a week of outdoor education. Since the project was initiated by Mr. Williams, some other teachers and pupils in the school district have also had this educational experience.

The teachers and pupils spend five days and nights together at the lake site, usually during the first week in June. According to Mr. Williams: "I have found this to be an extremely valuable and motivating experience for my pupils."

Some of the educational values of the project, as cited by Dr. Harold Bookbinder, School District Director of Program Development, are:

- 1) It is in keeping with nation-wide trends toward fuller understanding of our environment and safeguarding of our natural resources,
- 2) It stimulates all of a child's senses for a better under-

QUESTION: Are Middle School pupils allowed to go to basketball games or not? I have three children in the Middle School. One was allowed admittance to the first game, but another was told she would be admitted only if she paid the adult price.

ANSWER: The price of admittance for all Middle School pupils is 50 cents, and they are never to be charged the adult price of \$1. Perhaps she didn't identify herself as a Middle School pupil; High School pupils also pay \$1 if they buy their tickets at the door.

Children in Grade 6 are required to be accompanied by an adult to be admitted to any home basketball game. (This also applies to all elementary school pupils.)

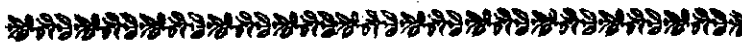

standing of environmental factors, 3) Many experts from the State of New York participate in the project, giving our pupils exposure to top authorities in the environmental field, and 4) It is a valuable growing-up experiences, with children learning how to share tasks and get along together in an informal setting.

No child HAS to participate in the outdoor education project, and no child HAS to sell products to raise money to pay his expenses. Mr. Williams has done his best to communicate these facts, and other facts about the project, to the parents of the pupils involved.

The project is self-supporting and expenses amount to about \$12 per child. Mr. Williams supervises fund-raising on the part of the pupils, to pay their own way. They are engaged in door-to-door selling of various products. Perhaps he used poor judgment this year, Mr. Williams admits, in ordering a large variety of products to be sold, rather than just one or two items. He invites parents who have questions or complaints about the outdoor education project to contact him personally.

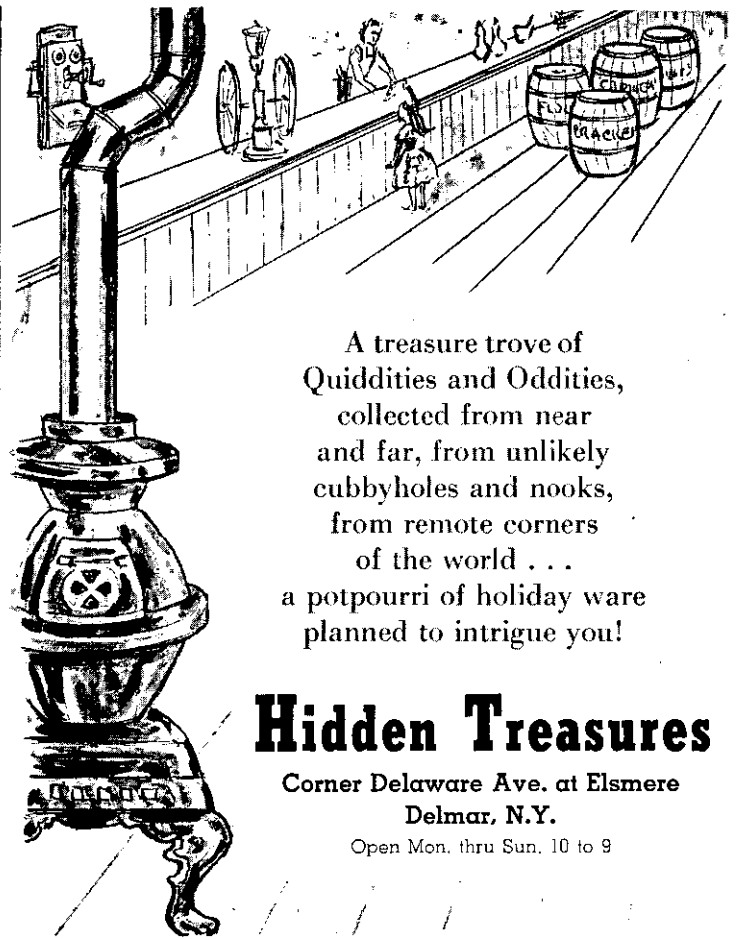

tained the wealth of families, providing the means for both food and shelter. In earlier days, when tribes roamed the world to establish their homelands, gems were used as money and the barter system prevailed. In China, a person's wealth was measured in terms of their collection of fine jade rather than in gold coins.

Psychologically, there is aesthetic pleasure in gem ownership. In Edwardian days, men prided themselves on their collection of unmounted gems which they held in fine leather cases, removing them one at a time to warm them in their hands and admire their fire and color. The contemplation of beautiful stones, their cool, smooth feel to the hand is epitomized by again, the Chinese, in their appreciation of jade.

Now, in the seventh decade of the twentieth century, fine gems are at a premium. As world population and affluence make the possession of beautiful gems more feasible for the average man, their supply is diminishing. This results from natural mineral deposits being depleted with few new sources



being found. Since one of the major factors in gem value is their rareness or scarcity on the market, this point over the years tends to make a fine gemstone an interesting investment. Besides security, they provide an invaluable return in pride of ownership and beauty. Best of all, they are negotiable and easily portable.

The American Gem Society cautions, however, in seeking a fine gem to purchase, that only the most reputable source be consulted. For one thing, the jeweler should be gemologically trained and skilled in gem identification techniques and evaluation. With the advent of man-made stones that closely duplicate natural gems in color and other factors, the person seeking a fine jewel should deal with the type of jeweler who is knowledgeable and respected and recognized by the fine jewelry industry. One way of knowing him is by American Gem Society recognition which is awarded to a select segment of the industry. It is a non-profit organiza-

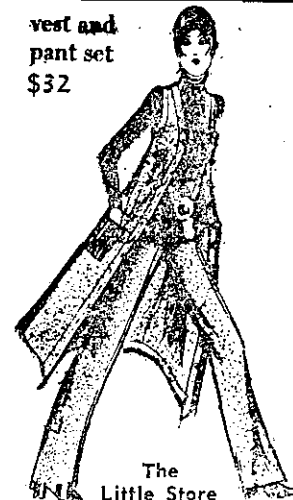
