





1971 FIREMEN'S CONVENTION

THE DELMAR VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY will be host for the 44th Annual Convention of the Hudson-Mohawk Firemen's Association this week, July 14-18. Delegates to the convention registered yesterday for the two-day meeting schedule. In conjunction with the Convention, a Carnival will be held at the Town Parking Lot on Adams Street across from the Police Station. The carnival will start at 7 P.M. tonight, tomorrow and Saturday nights.

Tomorrow evening (Friday), starting at 7, a Mardi Gras Parade will march from Delaware Plaza up Delaware Avenue to the Four Corners, right on Kenwood to the Carnival grounds on Adams Street.

Saturday afternoon at 2, the Dress Parade will start at the corner of Oakwood Place and Delaware Avenue, proceed up Delaware to Van Dyke Road and disband at the Bethlehem Central High School. More than 3,000 people will participate in the line of march including 15 musical organizations, 50 fire departments and more than 70 pieces of fire-fighting equipment.

Sunday afternoon at 1, racing teams will meet at the Fire Training Grounds off Winnie Place opposite the Tri-Village Little League Park. This is the equivalent of the meet held in September on Nathaniel Boulevard near the fire house. The Delmar team is a three-time winner of the Central New York State Racing Team Association: 1968, 1969, 1970. The Ladies' Auxiliary racing team placed second in both 1969 and 1970.

The last time the Convention was held in Delmar was 1937.

## What is Organic

Gardening?

Organic gardening is a system of maintaining a fertile soil by applying Nature's own law of replenishing it, that is, the addition and preservation of humus, the use of organic matter instead of chemical fertilizers, the making of compost, and mulching. Organic gardening and farming is a rapidly growing movement, one that will hopefully alter our concepts of the garden and the farm.

Last fall students of the Man and Science Class at Bethlehem Central High School started work to set up a model organic garden. We turned the ground over and covered it with truckloads of leaves delivered by the Town of Bethlehem which is cooperating in the project. Over the winter plans were made, books on organic gardening were studied, and seeds and plants were ordered and donated. In the late winter, we started tomato and onion plants in a local greenhouse and later, when the plants grew too big for the greenhouse flats, they were passed out to those who were willing to 'babysit' them. In the spring, the field was planted according to plans drawn up in the winter. The garden is now in full swing and visitors are welcome.

We hope to aid in the rapid spread of the organic philosophy. Today, composters by the thousands are telling their neighbors of the wonders of this new, yet really age-old method, and they, in turn, are listening and beginning to follow. Compost heaps are becoming an integral part of many farms and gardens. When it is possible to see astounding results obtained by organic methods, a quick good-bye will be said to the artificial test-tube methods which produce inferior food and destroy good land.

Organic gardens don't believe in using pesticides or synthetic chemical fertilizers. We feel that human health is more precious than quick profits and insect-free crops. Any method to bolster yields should be adopted only after we are thoroughly convinced that future generations will not be injured.

When man attempts to completely disregard the Balance of nature there are often disasterous results. Spraying, for example, kills off beneficial insects and birds, contaminates the soil, leaves poisonous residues on food crops, and kills the bacteria, earthworms and fungus which turn organic matter into food for the plants. Rather than using rapidly soluble artificial fertilizers, organic gardeners use compost, manure, mulches, natural ground rock, and vegetable matter. We do not exclude a chemical simply because it is a chemical any more than we include an organism just because it is natural. There are, however, some chemicals that disrupt everything the organic gardener is trying to achieve. Those are the villians that this series of articles is being written to battle.

#### Over My Shoulder

IT WAS IN 1935 that I had the pleasure of shaking the hand of a musician who was, in a few years, to be recognized as one of the greatest of all the world's jazz trumpeters. I don't have a picture of him—but you wouldn't recognize him as the 71 year old man who died on July 6. In the middle years of his life, he weighed nearer 200 pounds than the 125 of recent years.

In '35 he'd already changed from the mellow tones of the cornet to the more strident notes of the long, golden trumpet. His recordings weren't in the top 10 in those days — yet his ability was all there and his singing was much the same as in later years.

The personality that won him so many friends and fans around the world was the same in those years. The confidence in himself that eventually paid off so well, was much in evidence.

And now the whole world mourns his passing. We'd like to pay our homage along with the other millions who admired him so much: Louis (Satchmo) Armstrong.

swimmers to enroll in tuitionfree Red Cross swimming and lifesaving courses. The Albany Chapter's Learn to Swim Program at Area Parks is ideal for beginners and nonswimmers.

The Red Cross is steadily expanding its small craft training program in schools, colleges, and summer camps, such as the Aquatic Institution held in June at Camp Von Schoonhoven in Averill Park. It has developed a method of instruction by which theory can be taught in classrooms in cold weather, with practice sessions on the water following in the spring and summer, Mr. Carnahan said.

He recommended that boat perators follow these safeguards to reduce boating accidents:

1. Carry a Coast Guard-

approved life jacket for everyone aboard. Insist that weak swimmers and non-swimmers wear them at all times and that all others wear them in hazardous weather conditions.

- 2. Don't overload the craftkeep passengers down to a safe number.
- 3. Don't overpower the boat. Ask your dealer what horsepower motor it can take.
- 4. Don't smoke while refueling.
- 5. Don't let passengers stand up in a small boat or sit on the gunwales while you are under way.
- 6. Equip your boat with essential gear--an anchor, oars, boat hook, extra line, fire extinguisher, tool kit, and first aid kit. Running lights are a "must" for

night-time operations.

7. Check weather bureau forecasts before taking your boat out on open water. Take a transistor radio along to keep posted on changing weather conditions.

8. Most boats if swamped or capsized will stay on the surface, so stay with the boat in such accidents until help arrives. But in dangerous or extremely cold water, try to get to shore as fast as possible.

Mr. Carnahan listed these basic rules of the waterways:

1. When boats are meeting in or nearly in a head-on position, each should keep to the right.

2. When boats are in a crossing position, the one on the right has the right of way.

3. When one boat is overtaking another, the boat being overtaken has the right of way.

4. Power boats should give way to manually propelled or sail boats unless the sail boat is overtaking the power boat. Small sail boats when sailing in a channel should give way to power boats which cannot operate outside the channel.

5. Sail boats to windward must keep out of the way of sail boats to leeward.

"All skippers conscious of safety make a point of knowing the swimming abilities of their passengers, "Mr. Carnahan said. "If a person goes overboard accidentally, rescue procedure is based on the ability or inability of the




