Helpful Advice From Your Power People:

Some easy ways to make your home safer.

Here are some hints about gas safety that might be useful to you:

One. If your gas oven or range has to be lit with a match, the match should be lit first and held in position *before* you turn on the gas.

THE BETHLEHEM Central Board of Education has hired two Pinkerton security guards to patrol the building and grounds of the Middle School seven nights a week.

ADCBG BETHLEHEM CENTRAL Schools

(The purpose of this weekly column is to give all residents of the Bethlehem Central School District the opportunity to get answers to specific questions about what's going on in district schools. Questions may be directed to Mrs. Treadway by mail to 700 Delaware Ave., Delmar, or by calling her weekday mornings at 439-4921.)

QUESTION: I heard that the floor of the new gym in the High School was flooded a couple of weeks ago when we had that heavy rain. Is the gym badly damaged?

ANSWER: This was just a rumor. In fact, the gym was not flooded — nor did the roof collapse, which was another rumor — but there was danger of flooding damage at one point during the downpour.

For several years, there has been a warping of the gym floor. Recently the underground drain line on the north side of the building was exposed, and the maintenance staff discovered that it was not carrying water to the sump pit. A meeting was held with the architect, general contractor, project engineer, and school representatives, and it was agreed that the general contractor will replace the drainage line, remove the blacktop adjacent to the drainage line, and fill the area with crushed stone for better drainage, to prevent water from seeping through the exterior wall.

Hopefully, this work will remedy the warping situation and prevent such close calls as we experienced during that heavy rainstorm.

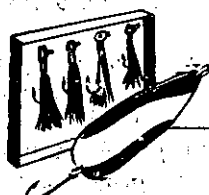

He has completed five years of the Biomedical Program and is commencing his fourth year of study at Albany Medical College.

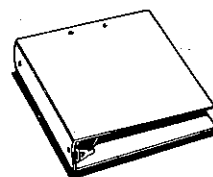

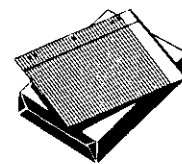

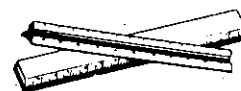

THE COMBINED Federal Campaign for the Albany area began with a kick-off breakfast at Valle's Steak House, with an announced goal of \$28,750. President Nixon has determined that all Federal offices will now use this once-a-year campaign which combines the United Fund/Red Cross Joint Appeal, the National Health Agencies and the International Service Agencies. vehicular laws.

The Bureau, and the 150,000 independent insurance agent members of the National Association of Insurance Agents acting as its sponsors, is striving to get these habitual offenders off the road.

You can join their campaign in several ways by:

- Being a safe driver yourself
- Thinking before drinking and realizing the drinking driver is an impaired driver
- Calling for strict and fair enforcement of all traffic laws
- Writing legislators to encourage the strengthening or enactment of laws

against the habitual offender.

Automobile production standards have already been affected by a safety-conscious citizenry but considerably more remains to be accomplished.

The Consumers Insurance Information Bureau suggests that you:

- Contact state and federal officials encouraging enactment of additional, pertinent safety regulations to be developed jointly with auto makers
- Write directly to the president of your auto producer calling his attention to faulty or unsafe equipment on your present vehicle and urging a priority effort in developing safer cars.
- Pay particular attention to tires and buy only those best suited to your vehicle and driving needs. Top grade tires will not only provide extra safety, driving will be more enjoyable.
- Use those devices already available: buckle seat and shoulder belts, check the accuracy of your speedometer, keep seat and door latches in repair.

Highway conditions are the third factor behind the traffic accident numbers. Traffic signs' shapes and symbols are standardized for easy

recognition but all too often they are poorly located or use hazardous supports.

Pavement may be rough or broken, lanes end abruptly or curves poorly graded. Billboards and other signs may obscure visibility. Superhighways present special hazards.

The Bureau suggests that you:

- Drive especially carefully whenever poor highway or weather conditions arise.
- Work with local government groups for the installation and maintenance of roads, signs and traffic lights.
- Urge the establishment of state and federal standards for all signs and traffic regulating devices.

unbeatable combination. These past few months have seen the South Albany Airport on Jericho Road suddenly come to life as never before. Many facility im-

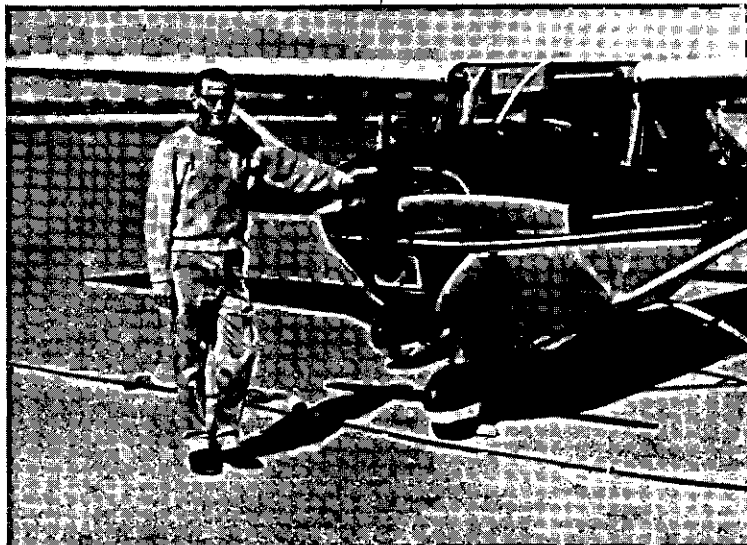
