UNTIL YOU FLY over New York you are not fully aware of the abundance of farm ponds that dot the landscape. Their numbers continue to increase at the rate of about a thousand a year. Many have furnished hours of fishing pleasure to their owners, and supplemented the family diet with tasty fresh fish. Others have been bitter disappointments.

Though there are many reasons why a pond does not produce the anticipated fishing, surprisingly, one major cause of failure is improper or inadequate fishing. Too often the old idea that "conservation is preservation" still prevails. With limited resources this may be so, but with a renewable resource, such as fish in a farm pond, this is not the case. Living resources cannot be stockpiled the way minerals or coal can, but must be used when they are available. Stockpiling, either intentionally or unintentionally, is probably the most common cause of farm fish pond failure.

A farm pond is limited in the amount of fish flesh that it can

produce, just as a pasture is limited in the number of cows that it can support. The fact that the cows and the fish respond differently when they don't get enough food clouds the issue. When cows are underfed they starve, but when fish are underfed they continue to live and reproduce, but do it as a stunted population instead of a normal size population. Though abundant, they offer little fishing satisfaction.

This situation commonly develops in New York when the balance between the bass and bluegills is upset. As long as there are adequate numbers of bass to eat enough of the prolific little bluegills, the balance is maintained. If the bass can't do the job, shortly there are too many bluegill mouths to feed.

When bluegills get the upper hand they will prey on young bass enough to further reduce the bass potential. It becomes a vicious circle until all that remains are stunted fish not worth the time of the fisherman.

Too many pond owners are

more interested in catching bass, and as a result there is an underharvest of bluegills. Many is the time when bluegills are most readily taken, so extra fishing effort at this time will pay big dividends. If help is needed, a few strategically placed phone calls to city friends or an invitation to the local cub pack will usually bring aid.

Where many young fishermen are involved a word of caution may be in order. The same young bass that you are trying to encourage are gullible and ferocious biters. If they are hooked deeply, they may not survive when returned to the water.

To maintain the proper balance between the bass and bluegills, it is necessary to remove about fifteen bluegills for each bass taken. Since big bass are the most efficient bluegill controllers, it may pay to return some of the big bass instead of the smaller ones.

Sporting regulations designed for public fishing waters will not always permit proper cropping in a farm pond. For this reason the

Department of Environmental Conservation issues a free five-year **Farm Fish Pond License** to any eligible pond owner on request. The license may designate other ways of catching fish and make exceptions to the regular fishing seasons. Applications for these licenses should be made to the Regional Fisheries Manager.

In licensed ponds where control of bluegills cannot be obtained by fishing, a cylindrical trap of one inch mesh chicken wire can be effective. This trap, four or five feet long and two feet in diameter, has one end formed by a funnel extending at least to the center of the trap with a three inch hole for the fish to enter the trap. A small door must be made to remove the catch. The trap is fished by placing it in four feet of water parallel to the shore. Bait, such as cottage cheese, may help, but is not necessary. The trap should be pulled daily and all fish removed. When your daily catch drops to one half the first day's catch, stop trapping or you may remove too many small fish.

SPADARO RAPS ROCKY'S STAFF PAY RAISE BILL



HUDSON — John P. Spadaro, Town of Coeymans, Democratic candidate for Assembly, today criticized Governor Rockefeller's quest for salary increases for his top staff that would cost \$2-1/2 million tax dollars.

Spadaro said the incumbent Republican assemblyman, Clarence D. Lane of Windham, and other members of the GOP-controlled Legislature, too often side with Rockefeller.

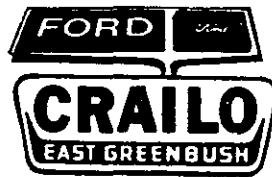
"I find the Governor's request for raises for his top staff, deplorable, ridiculous and defiant," Spadaro said, "on one hand he would penalize, under provisions of the Taylor Law, mental hygiene, prison guards and other state workers who had anything to do with the CSEA strike. But it is perfectly all right for him to spend tax dollars any way he sees fit. As far as the Legislature is concerned, what Rocky says they had better do."

"The voters can help correct this situation," Spadaro said, "by voting for me and replacing Lane in the November elections. I will be a watchdog for voters in Albany, Greene and Columbia Counties."

Spadaro said he had sold his construction equipment and gave up outside business interests to devote full time to the job.

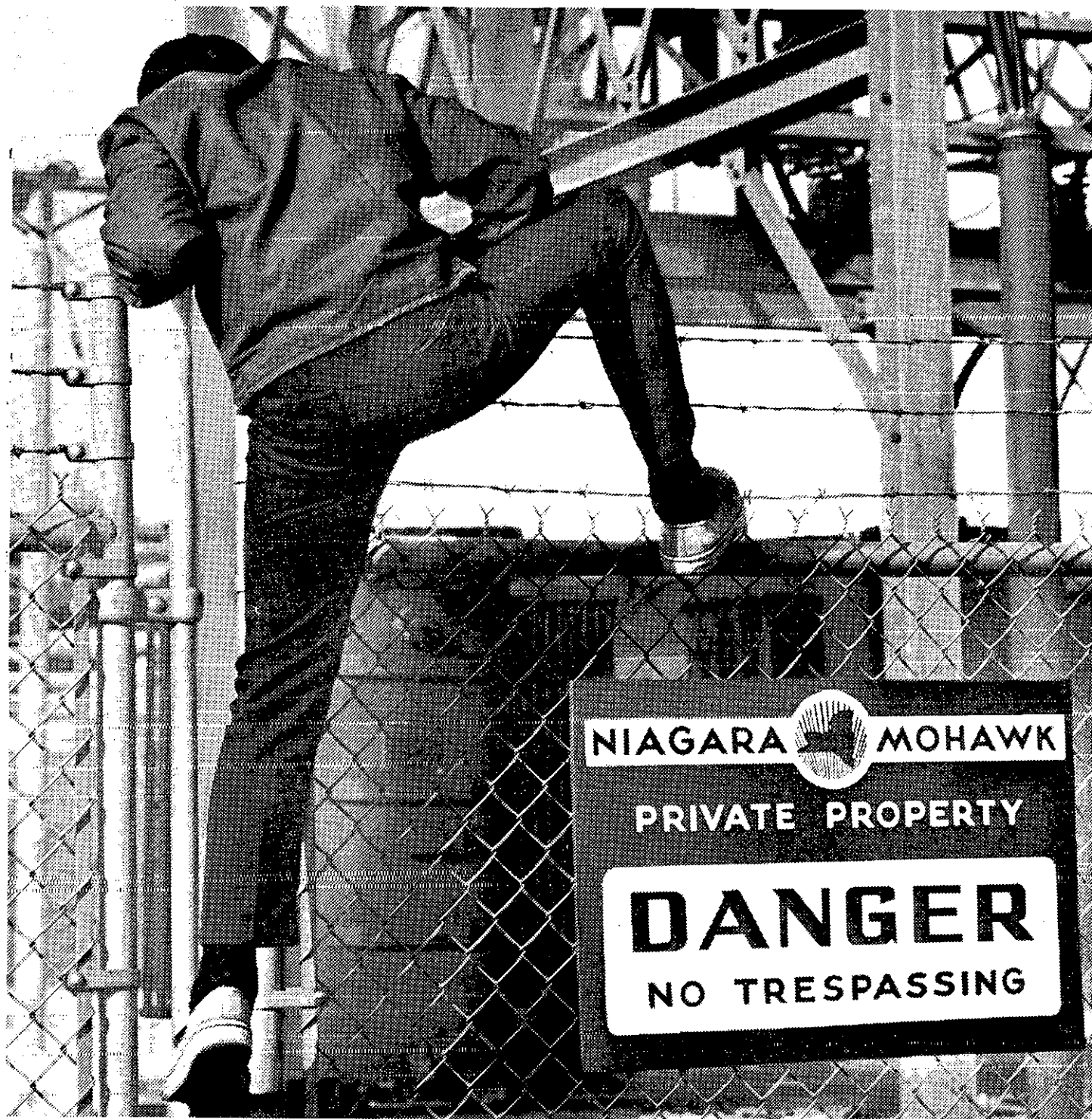
