## Look what we found! IN THE MAILBAG

In your July 6' issue, you printed a letter from a group of parents concerning sex education. Their letter urged everyone to complain to the Superintendent of Schools of Bethlehem about the manner in which sex education is being taught (do they even know what is being taught and how?).

They say they are opposed to youth being informed about sex without being given a corresponding morals code. Yet it is probably parents groups like this one that are responsible for the limitation of discussion in school of sex and associated morals (teachers claim that they are not allowed to discuss this because of parent pressure).

This group of parents seems to be trying to shove sex education out of their way so they won't have to deal with it. They do this neatly by passing the buck to the schools saying they are responsible for teaching the moral aspect of sex if they are going to offer sex education. However, it would be impossible to determine what would be the proper morals to teach because of different opinions resulting from differences in values and religious backgrounds. Therefore they would again be objecting to a sex education program because of the failure to agree on a moral code to accompany such a program. I wonder how many of those who signed the letter would even be able to reach an agreement.

On the other hand these parents seem to advocate sex education as the parents' duty. Still they admit there are parents that don't discuss sex with their children. What they don't admit is that too many parents can't inform their children about sex properly or adequately. They must realize that their children are going to get their education in sex whether or not it is taught in school. The choices are simple. First children can receive a "street education" in sex learning the supposed facts of life from a magazine or friends' rumors, while picking up typical misconceptions. The other choice is to allow sex education in school where a student can obtain reliable facts about sex and V.D.

What annoys me about their letter is that these people speak without knowledge and criticize without offering realistic solutions or alternatives (if they offer any at all). They obviously didn't do any research before sounding off. For example, which of them has any first hand information on the sex education curriculum at Bethlehem schools. Also, which of them is qualified to back up the implication of their question: "What sixteen year old really needs sex?" Perhaps if they had checked with a psychologist who had studied the question they might have found the answer to be: many sixteen year olds need it.

What their letter really seems to indicate to me is that maybe they are afraid of their children becoming more educated on the subject than they are.

### The Spotlight Goes to School

DR. ROBERT K. Bair of Slingerlands was re-elected president of the Bethlehem Central Board of Education at its recent organizational meeting. John J. McKenzie of Clarksville was re-elected vice president.

New Board member Bernard K. Harvith, who defeated Incumbent Ralph A. Holmgren for a seat on the Board last month, was sworn in at the July 5 meeting.


