**GOLFERS**, dairymen and horsebreeders who find their business or pleasure threatened by horse or deer flies may have relief within sight.

A mechanical trap that can capture and significantly reduce the number of flies in a given area has been designed by Prof. LaVerne L. Pechuman, and entomologist at the N.Y. State College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Cornell University.

Pechuman, said that horse and deer flies, which plague New Yorkers from early June through Labor Day, can inflict painful wounds with their piercing mouthparts. Only the females in need of a blood meal for their eggs

bother to attack. Male flies are content to feed on flowers and foliage.

To the golfer, picnicker or beach enthusiast these "gadflies" are a painful annoyance. Dairymen dread their appearances because attacked dairy cattle often show a drop in milk production. But to the horsebreeder, track manager, or stable owner the presence of horseflies presents a more severe danger.

Dr. Mathias J. Kemen Jr., a Cornell veterinarian collaborating with Pechuman, explained that horse flies serve as a carrier for a viral disease, equine infectious anemia. There is no cure for this disease and in recent years many valuable animals have succumbed to this anemia.

Kemen said that the dis-

ease organism are transmitted mechanically by horse flies. Since horsefly bites are painful, the host tries to remove the fly. When dislodged, the fly returns to the attack but selects a different animal. If the first host had disease organisms in its blood, some of those adhering to the fly's sharp mouthparts are injected and transmitted into the blood of the new host.

The fly trap designed by Pechuman takes advantages of some of the fly's unusual behavioral traits. The flies, which are attracted by dark, moving objects, are lured to the trap by a swinging, shiny, black ball. A carbon dioxide supply, which fools the flies into thinking there is life about, provides an additional lure.

Once inside the trap the


Data shows that more driving accidents occur during the holidays than during comparable non-holiday periods. Highway deaths are higher during the winter than other seasons. An average of more than 750 Americans have died during the Christmas period each year since 1964 in motor vehicle accidents.

Because visiting is popular during the Christmas season, homeowners are advised to serve non-alcoholic drinks to guests making the rounds. You can still keep in the spirit of things by serving eggnog without spirits. Eggnog never killed anyone.



This trial was historically significant in view of the fact that it was one of the first times that a medical verdict had great significance in a court of law.)

Bethlehem in 1853, and the Meads Lane area in particular where much of this story takes place, was, to the casual observer riding scattered farmsteads. The farms were occupied mostly by people of modest means, but the kind people who made up the base of the American economy at that time and whom we venerate as the solid stock of our ancestors.

When John Hendrickson was brought to trial in July of 1853 for the murder of his wife, we find that he was a young man about 21 years of age, 5 ft. 10 in. in height, well built and generally fine in appearance and he was a resident of Meads Land, Town of Bethlehem, N.Y. His demeanor on the day of the trial was calm and self-possessed.

Two years before he had married Maria VanDusen, daughter of Lawrence Van Dusen of Clarksville, who was Albany County Clerk, although deceased at the time of the trial. Maria had been 17 years of age at the time of her marriage and 19 at the time of her decease, March 7, 1853. She was described as being well educated, accomplished, affectionate and kind-hearted and a dutiful and loving daughter in every way. Her father had returned from the County Clerkship shortly before her marriage with the reputation of possessing considerable wealth for a person residing in the country. Apparently Hendrickson considered the connection advantageous to him, so proposed his suit and married Maria in January 1851, although the marriage was opposed by her parents, on the grounds that Hendrickson has led a life of idleness and was therefore not

a fit helpmate for their daughter.

The couple lived at first with the Van Dusen family in Clarksville, occasionally visiting his father, who lived four miles away (Meads Lane). In the summer of 1851 the prisoner conducted a gross assault upon a respectable young lady of Clarksville.

In consequence if this, Hendrickson was compelled to leave the area and went to Corning, New York in August of 1851, where he remained for 3 months, but returned in November or the beginning of December. 

was found dead in bed in a very singular manner, Hendrickson occupying the middle, the wife the back, and the child the front part of the bed.

After his return from Corning, he told his wife that he had contracted a very loathsome (venereal) disease and this was to be the cause of great bodily affliction to her, which not only ruined her health, but was of intense shame to her sensitive mind. This led to the dismissal of Hendrickson from the home of the Van Dusens, who became greatly incensed at the disgrace of their daughter and disgusted with the conduct of this son-in-law. This took place in January 1852. Hendrickson went to live with his father, but occasionally visited his wife in Clarks-ville, and she went to see him at the house of his father. In January 1853 Hendrick-



son induced his wife to visit him at his father's house and she went two or three times during that month. About the middle of February, Hendrickson came for his wife to the Van Dusen home and she returned with him and was not looked upon again by her fond mother until the 7th of

March when she was returned to her, a cold and silent corpse.

The sudden and mysterious death of this young woman was caused by a deadly poison called Tincture of Aconite.

She appeared well while staying at her father-in-law's house and on the Saturday

before her death visited her aunt, Mrs. Slingerland, and while there declared that she was going to go to her mother's the next day, Sunday, which was the day that she was poisoned. On Sun. she didn't for some unknown reason, go home as she desired. She arose, had breakfast in the morning and dinner at 3 P.M. Whether she partook of supper is not known. In the even-

ing she attended divine service with the family at a church about 3 miles distant from the dwelling of the prisoner's father (Feura Bush Reformed Church). They returned from church between 9 and 10 o'clock, and the deceased read from the Bible and a religious paper for the family, and retired to her bed with her husband about 10 o'clock. It was testified at the time of the

trial by William J. Snyder, a tavern keeper in Bethlehem, that Hendrickson had come into his tavern after church, about 9:30 P.M. and remained but a very short time, and took a drink. (Snyder's Tavern was located on an 1851 map as being at the NW corner of Waldermeier Road and Route #32.)

According to her husband, they slept in an upstairs bedroom that had been lately used by a hired farmhand—a Dutchman. They talked for awhile before they went to sleep and about 2 o'clock he awoke to ask her to move over


in the bed, as she was crowding him, and he found upon examining her that she was dead. The family was aroused, neighbors were sent for, but the nearest physician was not called as he lived three miles away. At the trial the family testified that they heard no disturbance at all from the bedroom that night — no thought of anyone being abused or ill or vomiting. The neighbors who were called upon to come at the discovery of death were Jeremiah and Lucy Mead, who lived about one half mile north of Hendrickson's on Mead's

Lane and were of the family for whom the road is named. (House is present day Mead's Dairy property.) They were still awake at 3 A.M. when Hendrickson's brother came to rouse them, as Wendel Oliver had been visiting their daughter and Mrs. Mead testified that she had heard the clock strike 2 and Oliver had left shortly after that. The Meads helped out at the house when they found the dead girl and took her body down to the parlor and thence to her widowed mother in the morning. Hendrickson followed the body to Clarksville,

and a coroner and an able surgeon and physician from the city were called, because the whole community was moved by the apprehension that a dark and shocking

### SNOWMOBILING ON STATE LAND —

To the best of my knowledge, no snowmobilers were accidentally shot by deer hunters during the first half of the big game season in the western part of the State, though I did hear a few valid threats where snowmobilers rocket round and round on old firelanes. In years gone by all other outdoor users, mainly hikers, and grouse and rabbit hunters have withdrawn from the woods during the big game season, probably more in fear

than courtesy.

True, the snowmobiler has just as much right to be out as the deer hunter. He has the whole winter ahead of him, however, while the hunter has only a few days. At a time when snowmobilers should be doing everything they can to build a good name, it would be wise to confine their activities during the deer season to locations not frequented by hunters. New York's great outdoors still has enough room for everyone if people cooperate and respect each other's choice of recreation.

This philosophy is basic to the snowmobile regulations that the Department of Environmental Conservation has established to cover the lands under its jurisdiction. Because of differing legal responsibilities for different types of natural resources custodianship, regulations vary.

The 3 types of custodianship are: (1) Forest Preserve lands which were acquired to protect the watershed and are given Constitutional protection to remain "forever wild." Recreation since has become an important by-product of watershed protection. (2) State Reforestation Areas are primarily for production of timber, with conforming recreation secondary. (3) Wildlife Management Areas, though superficially often indistinguishable from Reforestation Areas, were purchased for the purpose of providing public opportunity to enjoy wildlife resources.

On Forest Preserve Lands in the Adirondacks and Catskills snowmobilers may be used on specifically designated and marked trails when completely covered with ice or snow, and on frozen lakes or ponds when access may be gained from a public highway or from one of the marked snowmobile trails. Markers on designated trails are similar to the round markers along hiking trails, but are

orange and bear the words "snowmobile trail." Cross-country travel on Forest Preserve land is prohibited.

On State Reforestation Areas the more limited mileage of marked trails is supplemented by an additional 1,000 miles of truck trails, old logging roads and fire lanes which are also suitable for use by snowmobiles. Though there are no regulations banning cross country travel, it is not encouraged because of damage that can be done to small trees particularly coniferous plantations buried under the snow. Some of the most tempting fields have signs prohibiting the use of snowmobiles because these areas are new forest plantations.

On Wildlife Management Areas snowmobiles may be used only on trails specifically designated and marked for their use by the Department of Environmental Conservation.

The relationship between snowmobiles and wildlife, is not yet fully understood. Paths made by snowmobiles do make it possible for deer to move around a little more easily in some deep snow situations. On the other hand, these same paths make it easier for dogs to get into winter yarding areas. As with crust-ed snow, deer may be able to walk in the paths, but the packed snow may not support them adequately when they are forced to run, while it will support dogs, giving them a distinct advantage.

Properly used on trails, snowmobiles probably do not harass wildlife as much as most people think. Animals can move into heavier cover and let the noise go by. If intentionally used to see how close one can get to wildlife, snowmobiles can be very harassing. Incidentally, pursuing or harassing deer is a misdemeanor, and violators are subject to fines of from \$100 to \$200.

## Wandering & Wondering . . . .

IT'S SO EASY TO FORGET — It wasn't that long ago that the Township of Coeymans was depending on one doctor to take care of the ill. Imagine 15,000 people trying to get an appointment with one man — or conversely, imagine one man trying to spread the hours of a day to best meet the needs of 15,000 individuals. It was an impossible situation that demanded (and received) the attention of the Town Board. With Supervisor Ralph Pape leading the way, the Board set out to find a solution that would provide the best possible medical care.

Through advertising and publicity citing the desperate need, they hoped to attract at least one (preferably two) General Practitioners to the area. When this failed to bring the necessary results, another avenue was sought, resulting in the creation of the Center.

When the plan was finalized, the Town agreed to operate what became known as the Coeymans Medical Center with the Town providing the building and acting as operator. Dr. Nicholas Vianna and seven other resident physicians staffed the facility. The solution was almost perfect; one flaw recognized by the patients, was the lack of the one-on-one relationship between doctor and patient which has been the centuries-old custom not only here but mostly
