Question:

What funeral benefits are available to the survivors of a deceased worker who qualifies under Social Security?

Answer:

A lump sum death payment based upon the Social Security record of a worker who dies either fully or currently insured may be payable to his survivors. This may be as much as three times the worker's primary insurance amount, but no more than \$255. The lump sum may be paid in addition to any monthly survivors' insurance benefits that are due.

If there is no eligible surviving spouse, the lump sum benefit may be paid to the person who paid the funeral expenses, or it may be assigned to us as a credit toward funeral expenses.

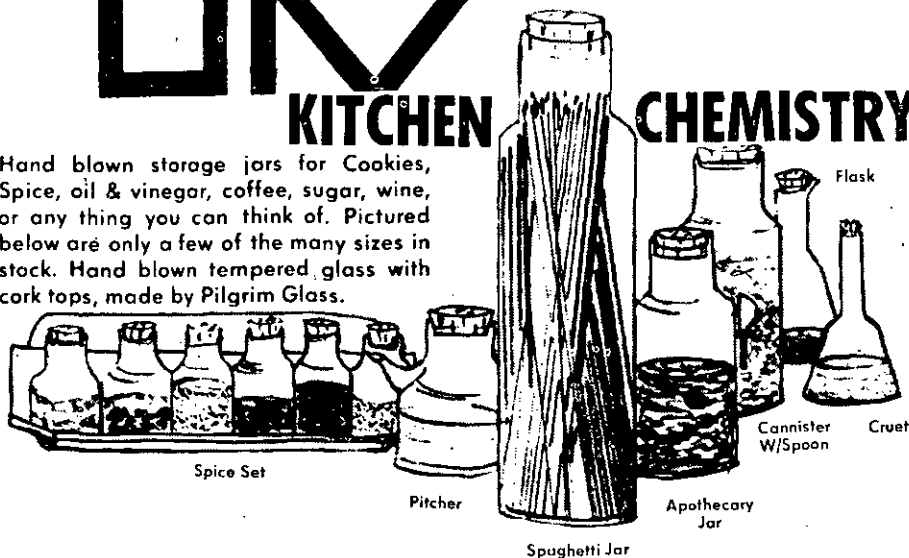

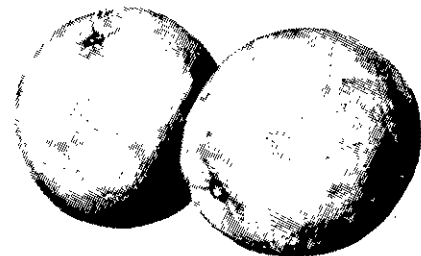

he plans monthly meetings with programs that promise to be stimulating and worthwhile. NEW PARKS AND RECREATION SUPERINTENDENT FOR BETHLEHEM

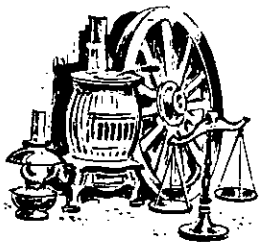

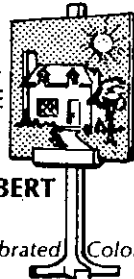

locality. At present, each county is on its own in interpreting and administering the law, with the state acting only in an advisory capacity.

The League is also urging more uniformity and quality in the training of election personnel.

Since only 55% of persons of voting age participated in the last election, the League feels that registration opportunities should be greatly expanded, and is urging the state to see that they are. The League wants year-round registration sites in every locality if the present system of requiring a personal appearance is to be retained. Other methods might include the use of trained volunteer registrars, traveling teams and mobile units.

An alternative approved by the League would be an entirely new system of mail registration carried out by the government, preferably in conjunction with existing systems such as social security, internal revenue or the census.

The League considers restrictions on student voting

a glaring example of unfair and diverse administration of election law. Prior to the last election, the League announced its support of students voting where they claim residence.

League members feel that present absentee voting requirements are clumsy and that they discourage absentee voters from voting at all. The League will work for removal of all proofs and affidavits now required for absentee registration, and since January, 1972 has been working for absentee voting in all elections, including primaries.

The League is presently lobbying in the Legislature for bills which would improve sections of the election law, and at the same time is continuing pressure for complete rewriting of the law.
