The Glenmont PTA's intention is to promote scholarship in the Elementary School and to recognize its former



ON APRIL 5, the students of the Distributive Education classes at Bethlehem Central High School visited the Brown Paper Company. They were accompanied by Robert A. Pierson, Coordinator of Distributive Education; Hugh J. Brown, Distributive Education Teacher; and Bruce Levin, student teacher.

The trip was arranged through Miss Eileen Taylor, Personnel Manager. Iohn Giambrone, Mill Production Manager, and William Rogers. Production Manager in the Carton Plant, served as guides and explained the operations which the students observed They were given an opportunity to see the steps involved in the recycling of paper and the process of printing on the paper used to make cartons. The cartons made for Beechnut, Arm and Hammer, and Permalife (a fishing equipment company) were being printed during the tour.

The Bethlehem Central Chess Club, in its first year as an active group, holds monthly meetings, and members practice almost daily in after school sessions in the High School library. Mrs. Jane Streif, a librarian, serves

this year as volunteer adviser.

The Club has had several matches in recent months with other area schools, including Vincention Institution, Milne, Guilderland, and Shenendehowa, Mr. Metthew Katrice, a local chessmaster, recently came to Bethlehem Central to compete against 25 pupils and one, Terry Newton, played him to a draw.

Studies revealed that Scouts like the advancement program and its recognition but only one Scout in five went beyond Second Class.

The answer in the improved program is to offer a choice of 12 skill awards that have been devised to make more immeditate attainment of goals possible with instant recognition in the form of colorful belt loops.

Other improvements that Scout leaders expect will appeal to more boys for a longer period of time include an optional program for 14-and 15-year-olds called the leadership corps, and a personal growth agreement that finds the Scoutmaster helping the boy arrive at some short-and long-term goals based on the Scout's own interest and strengths.

# Wandering & Wondering ...

"MARY, MARY, HOW DOES YOUR GARDEN GROW?" -

This looks like a fair question for 1973. What with huge farm subsidies and huge payments not to grow — plus high prices for all foods, it would seem that the backyard garden is again in fashion and even patriotic. If you're a novice, we suggest that you get the help offered at the garden centers. For instance, the Garden Shoppe always has three or four helpful sales people to guide you — and we assume that the others do too. Therefore, inexperience isn't any reason for not having a garden.

Sunday before last, we planted peas, lettuce, beets, carrots, onion sets, chard and radishes. The scallions and radishes are good, but there's nothing that quite equals home-grown, freshly-picked peas. And then there's the watching and waiting for that first home-grown tomato. One more thing to remember: home-canned or home-frozen vegetables are ever so much better than any you can buy at the store. Our canned tomatoes gave out just a week or two ago; we didn't can quite enough to complete the cycle to this year's crop.

There's a lot of personal satisfaction and joy from a home garden — even if the yield isn't that great. The years of the bumper crops are just added pride and satisfaction.

We've had a much bigger struggle than the average home gardener. Our land, besides being completely side hill, is also a heavy clay which had lain fallow for too many years. Consequently, it has taken tons of leaves worked into the soil so it isn't a mud patch in spring and fall and a concrete playground in the hot summer. The leaves, compost and peat moss plus a generous amount of nitrogen have combined to give us a soil that will successfully grow almost anything.

If you have heavy clay, it's a long, difficult process to change the soil's character — but it can be done.

This year, plant yourself a garden — and enjoy it!






