organizations in New York were not involved in any way, and cannot be held responsible for the mess.

The organization which ran the President's re-election campaign was set up outside of Republican National Committee framework and jurisdiction. This ad hoc organization hired the burglars and buggers. The 1972 campaign finance committee also was outside of the party's organization and control.

Not too surprisingly, most responsible commentators have recognized these easily provable facts. The New York Times made the point editorially this month that the Watergate principals were not party people, but individuals of very limited political and governmental experience. The Buffalo Evening News on April 27 referred to the Watergate instigators as "faceless aides" with a "raw sense of power." To liberal columnist Joseph Kraft on May 3 they were "aides whose silent characteristic is fidelity to the boss," and whose "loyalties to the man blinded them to the interest of the presidency and the nation." The U.S. News and World Report described them editorially as persons "who were dedicated to reelecting the Republican President in 1972 and to nothing else."

An Associated Press story by Saul Pett on May 6 pointed out that the division between the Republican Party and the ad hoc organization running the President's campaign was so sharp that "(former National GOP Chairman Robert) Dole and the national committee were excluded from important strategy sessions by what he called 'the tight circle' around the Oval Office."

Dole was more outspoken in an interview with columnist Carl Rowan on May 3. He said the men behind Watergate "came into power without really working to get there. They had no practical knowledge of politics. When

they got power they didn't know what to do with it." He said "these people around Nixon were not Republicans in the sense of trying to build the party. Their only interest was in re-electing the President." The National Committee, he added, "was relegated to the back of the bus -- no, the truth is that we weren't ever on the bus at all."

The distinction between the Watergate zealots and the Republican leadership is deep and real. Whereas the men involved in Watergate had no allegiance to the party. Republican leaders take a long view that goes far beyond the next election. Their concern is not with winning alone, but with upholding the prinipals that made the party great and that put a Republican in the White House for most of the years since Lincoln became President.

Republicans are at least as deeply concerned over what happened in 1972 as anyone else. As the New York Times pointed out on May 2 in calling for an independent Watergate prosecutor, "It is significant and encouraging that members of the President's own party in Congress have taken the lead in urging this essential action." Columnist Robert Thompson observed earlier, on April 9, that "normally loyal GOP Senators and Congressmen are as offended by it (Watergate) as are the Democrats." James Reston of the Times made a similar observation on March 30, noting that the Republican members of Congress "feel obliged to expose the facts, even if the facts hurt the President and expose the tricks of his political associates."

In light of the foregoing, which is a small part of the record, I submit that it is untrue and unfair to infer that Watergate ever was "a Republican project." Aside from the abuse of trust and criminality involved, the breakin and subsequent events made absolutely no sense to

GOOD MANAGEMENT

ROADS IN THE TOWN OF NEW SCOTLAND should benefit greatly from the federal funds now being allocated under the revenue sharing plan, according to John Cossac, highway superintendent for the town. He is so confident of this result that he is proposing a five-year plan for the portion of the federal money earmarked for highway improvement, he said last week.

"The most important aspect of revenue sharing is that it does not add to the tax burden now being carried by the citizens of New Scotland," Cossac said. "This is money that the federal government is issuing to the localities for much-needed capital improvements and other effective projects that could not get off the ground if they were to depend on local taxes.

"First among these is the improvement of our roads. We have been doing the best we can with the money provided each year by the Town. There is no question, however, that there are many other highway improvements that can be made, and equipment purchased, if we have the necessary money.

"As soon as it is determined how much will be allocated to road improvements in the next fiscal year, I will submit my plan. It can be extended for the entire five-year period," he said.

Cossac, who has been superintendent of the Town of New Scotland Highway Department for 12 years, is running for the Republican renomination in the primary elections on June 4.

enrichment. "Just as you can't explain the taste of a certain food," he said, "you must experience an art form to know it."

A basic goal of any good art program, he said, is to bring about pride and satisfaction, a sense of accomplishment, and "an emotional glow" which is rewarding to the individual pupil. He stressed that the art program does not primarily train future artists or prepare pupils for college, but seeks to enrich the present and future lives of young people and thus is a very important part of the overall district educational program.

Getting down to specifics of the Bethlehem Central art program, Mr. Reich reported that this year there have been 3.2 teachers conducting elementary art classes in the six district elementary schools. There have been 2.4 art teaching positions at the Middle School, and 3.4 at the High School. (The art staff totals 9 persons).

Mr. Reich said that, particularly at the High School level, enrollment in art classes and the quality of art work leing done have both increased significantly. Hiring of an additional High School art teacher is provided for in next year's budget.

Coeymans History

We were very fortunate to have spoken this week with Edward Giddings, author of "Coeymans and the Past," an illustrated 150page history of Coeymans. The book will contain an authoritative description of Baron Petier Coeymans, his family and their descendants, along with 50 pages of photos, maps and letters. Interesting anecdotes which refer to incidents as far back as the 17th century, are found throughout the book. 



PETIER COEYMANS was essentially a miller. This was the very last mill to operate in the area — having been in use for 200 years on Coeymans Creek.




ANN MARGARET COEYMANS married Andries Ten Eyck and settled in this home built in 1749. It was located around Shear Farm and was torn down in the 1890s.




THIS PARTICULAR TOLL GATE, in Ravena, was built around 1850, located on the road from Coeymans to Westerlo.

Question:

Does a coroner or medical examiner have the right to direct where a deceased person be taken after death?



The orderly processes of government require that sudden and violent deaths be thoroughly investigated. When the coroner or medical examiner is involved in these circumstances he may legally deny removal of the body from his jurisdiction until the cause of death is determined, but he may not order the body sent to any private mortuary without the consent of the decedent's family. If none of the family is available at the time of death the coroner or examiner may order the body temporarily removed to a public morgue or private mortuary. When this is done the receiving facility acts solely as a repository until a mortuary is chosen by the survivors.

It is morally, ethically, and legally wrong for any emergency personnel to steer the families of people involved in these unfortunate circumstances toward any certain mortuary. Their interference is unlawful and punishable by either legal or disciplinary action.


