In regard to Mrs. Elbow's letter to the Editor in the May 31 issue of the Spotlight, she is quite correct. Tri-Village Nursery School is not the only

pre-school registered with the New York State Education Department. The caption should have read: Tri-Village Nursery School is the only pre-school in the Tri-Village area registered as a "Non-Public Nursery School" with the New York State Education Department.

In the Albany-Troy-Schenectady area there are seven registered pre-schools, according to a list released by the Bureau of Child Development and Parent Education, New York State Education Department. Four are in the city of Albany, one is in Rensselaer, one in Troy, plus Tri-Village Nursery School in Delmar.

Registration as a non-public nursery school with the State Education Department is strictly on a voluntary basis. The advantages of this registration are to give recognition to schools meeting the standards of health, safety and educational requirements set by the department; to

____nswer:

It is virtually impossible to have this marker repaired if it has become illegible from erosion, but under certain circumstances, it can be replaced. If you will come by our office, we will complete the forms necessary to request a replacement of this stone from the Office of Support Services.

It is the government's policy to replace all veteran's headstones that have been damaged, or that have become unsightly or illegible due to weathering. It is also the policy of the armed services to mark permanently with a stone or a bronze plaque the grave of every deceased veteran of wartime or peacetime whose last service period was terminated by death or an honorable discharge.

Avenue Park is one of the finest accomplishments of our Town Board and Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke, we feel a certain obligation to answer the following letter:

Dear Mr. Fuller:

As the parents of two small children, my husband and I were delighted to hear of the opening of our Town Park. On Memorial Day, we attended the open house.

Much to our dismay, there is no playground equipment. This means that there is still no adequate playground and we must take the children to Albany if they wish to use playground equipment. There are scattered pieces of equipment at the grade schools but nothing on the order of either Washington or Lincoln Parks.

Also, the kiddie pool area does not seem a very safe area. One of the pools has a spray emanating from four pipes sticking up from the sloped floor of the pool. There is no fence separating the kiddie area from the fifty-meter pool.

On the whole, the park looks like a delightful addition to our town. However, it does seem that we need these few additions and corrections to make it a safe place fo all the citizens, including the very smallest.

When we received Mrs. Steadman's letter, we immediately called our friend, J.D. Hills, Superintendent of Park and Recreation for Bethlehem, and asked him to show uthese pitfalls and inadequacies. We were fairly sure that they were non-existent or (at the most) a temporary condition.

First, the playground equipment. It Mrs. Steadma means see-saws, merry-go-rounds and the like — forget it! This type of playground equipment is today frowne upon by every insurance company in America. The reason too dangerous! If this is what is being sought, it will st make the Albany trips a necessity. However, safe equipment has been ordered and is expected to arrive very soo

What Mrs. Steadman fails to mention is the two large plots of beautiful sand provided for the small fry. We do mean sandboxes! These are sand areas possibly 30' x 6

each! Small children should have a ball shoveling, filling pails, making castles, using their own roadbuilding equipment, etc.

Furthermore, the Bethlehem Central School District has provided a playground at every elementary school. Probably there would be a greater variety if the demand for it was known — and IF it could be free of vandals. Some area districts have had to remove playground equipment because it was either partially stolen or smashed to the extent that it became useless.

We sincerely feel that the **safe** equipment which is on order plus the big sand areas plus a great deal of lawn plus the school playgrounds are certainly adequate. Right?

Now, the safety factor. One beautiful kiddie pool is completely finished and in use. The other is obviously not inished — and has no water for wading — this can be ascertained from some distance. The four sprayers for the 'four pipes' have not come. They will be installed immediately upon arrival. Then, there is a soft doughnut-like piece which will forever keep the small fry from an accident.

Let's talk about the "missing fence." The kiddie area is completely fenced in. A 3 - 3-1/2' fence adequately separates the kiddie pool area from the diving and swimning pools. There's even a wood rail on the top of this ence to prevent a small child from being injured if he fell on the wire or fence post! The only added safety feature hissing might be the blood, sweat and tears of the designer who thought of so many safety features not commonly ound in like areas.

That's the end of our reply to Mrs. Steadman.

We'd like to add our own further observations. From ne gate-tender to the fartherest corner of the park, everyne is courteous, kind and helpful. We sympathize with the ate-keeper. In one afternoon, more than 25% of those who came had neglected to either obtain or bring with nem a proof of residency in Bethlehem. This park was will by and for those who reside in Bethlehem. The cards f residency are FREE! Why should anyone try to con the atekeeper? Let's try to do it right!

The swimming and diving pools are a swimmer's ream; the tennis courts and basketball areas are really uper; the landscaping (though very new) is pleasing and ill improve every day. J. D. Hills is doing a top-notch job, are his associates and Bill Hermance is doing for the ark the same high quality job he did as transportation rector for BCSD.

We repeat: Elm Avenue Park Phase I is one of the fint things that ever happened in our town. It's open . . . s yours . . . have fun!

And while we're handing out plaudits, let's not forget e men who made it all possible . . . making a long-time eam come true.
