Beside his academic life, Mr. Rosetti has worked in customer relations and is a certified official of the Capital District Umpires Association.

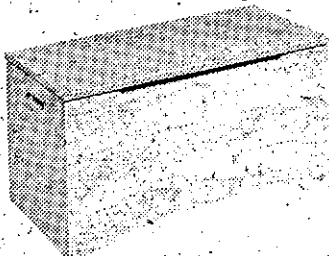

Wandering & Wondering . . .

NOW IT'S BEEF THAT CAUSES CANCER! — Have you read the latest medical and scientific report that credits our large consumption of beef for one particular form of cancer? The report is based on the fact that fish- and poultry-eating people have much less incidence of this form of cancer than the US population — who are big beef eaters. First they told us not to eat cabbage, then stay out of drafts, then button up your overcoat — and so it goes!

What this latest scare fails to tell us is whether this report covers, say, a 50-year period or whether this greater incidence is present only since cattle raisers have been using drugs and additives to make the cattle weigh more in less time and at less cost. We never have approved of these un-natural methods that have been adopted — but then, we're old-fashioned conservative.

Anyway, we don't intend to give up eating no matter what they discover — and, to hell with Burgundy!

SO MANY INTERESTING FACTS KEEP TURNING UP in the gas shortage that it's impossible to stay away from the subject. Thus far we've been lucky — the facts that were true as each column was written were still unchanged when the **Spotlight** was published. But with this column written so far in advance of its publication, we take a real gamble that what we write may be really stale when it is read. That's the chance we have to take — and here we go again!

We were extremely interested in that meeting of local labor leaders who invited State and Federal officeholders to be present — and none showed up! Only Sam Stratton and Carleton King had representatives at the meeting. Our Senators, Javits and Buckley, and Governor Wilson ignored the whole thing.

This was an important meeting because Labor's Emergency Energy Committee was seeking the answer to the question: why are so many unmarked tank trucks (as many as 30-35 a day) filling up at one company's Port of Albany tanks and heading out when the average heretofore was 5 or less a day? The question

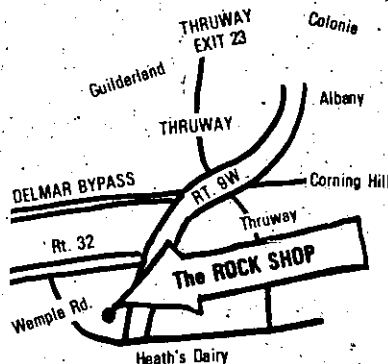

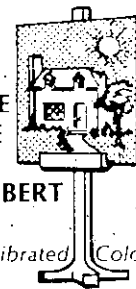

was a good one and just might have led to some interesting answers — except that it was handled badly. Before any attempt was made to discover where these thousands of gallons of gas were going each day, all of the news media announced that the Committee was **planning** an investigation. Of course, after such an announcement, there'd be no evidence of wrongdoing — or if there was, someone would have to be very stupid. Another idea with unknown potential went down the drain!

Back on January 23 in the **dark hours before dawn**, a tank truck was seen presumably filling the tanks of a closed-down station in Delmar. Our report of this in this column was the **first** that any such information appeared anywhere. A few days later, Barney Fowler had a similar story on a station in Westerlo. Then the Times-Union Editorial page carried the facts and asked questions. Finally, on Feb. 20, WRGB got into the act by having one of their by-liners check the tanks of the Delmar gas station. **But this was a whole month later!** Naturally, the tanks were **EMPTY!** The explanation by the oil company official who made the check, was that gas was being pumped **out** of the tanks for re-distribution to needy dealers. But somewhere in the story it also came out that the gas had been laying in the tanks for the better part of a year. The first inconsistency is that the oil companies tell us that gas is **no good** if stored for any long period of time — like a year! So who got this lousy gas? If that tank truck was actually pumping the gas **OUT** on Jan. 23, why was it done in the dark? Isn't it easier to do legitimate acts in the daylight hours? Then there's that ever-present credibility gap in the fact that a month elapsed between when it was first noticed and the actual check. There's the fact that lots of publicity was given to the fact that closed-down gas stations were having their tanks filled. The whole thing is like investigating a 100-year-old-murder. Most of the evidence (if there was any) is gone.

The other day we read the words of one columnist who said that anyone who believes that the gas shortage isn't on the up-and-up is crazy. Which oil company does he work for? Without the dozen dirty Washington scandals, we might believe it. But when an energy crisis creates the havoc this one has, including widespread unemployment; when the American people have their attention and pressure taken off Watergate et al, because of the energy shortage — then we wonder just how much is real and how much contrived.

Another thing we wonder: how many gas station operators will ever be the same after the present crisis is over? They have been buffeted by the Government, bullied by the oil companies and abused both physically and mentally by the gas-buying public. They have seen their profits disappear, their hours cut. They have been forced to lay off help in order to survive. They have gone from a group enterprising business men to a flock of badgered, government- and oil company-regulated sheep that have no idea what new monstrous regulation may be put into operation because of some Washington bureaucrat's dream.

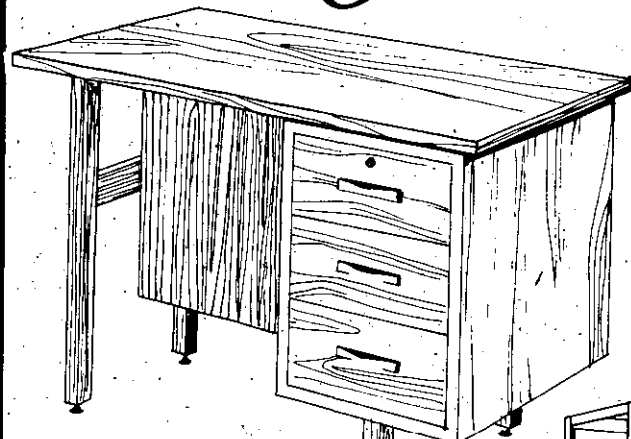
