This letter was sent to Dr. Lawrence Zinn, Superintendent of Schools in Town of Bethlehem:

Dear Dr. Zinn:
This year fourteen students signed up for the study of Latin I starting next September. The class was cancelled due to insufficient registration, projected over a three-year period. My daughter, who will be a junior next fall, will be unable to take two years of a course

I feel is still important in the curriculum of a first rate learning institution.

Dr. J. Briggs McAndrew explained to me that the Board of Education makes the decision as to whether or not a borderline class will be held. Since I consider no decisions irrevocable, I would ask you to bring my dissenting opinion to the attention of the board members at the next meeting. I would ask that Latin I be offered next fall with an announcement this spring that in the future it will be offered only every other year, thereby garnering two years of study into their four year high school schedules. Dr. McAndrews said it would be unfair to have a student complete two years of Latin, only to find he would not be able to continue with the third year because of a dwindled class number. Why not offer only two years of Latin, but guarantee those two years, even if only 12 or 13 are in Latin II? This would keep Latin in the school and satisfy more of the students and parents than the present system.

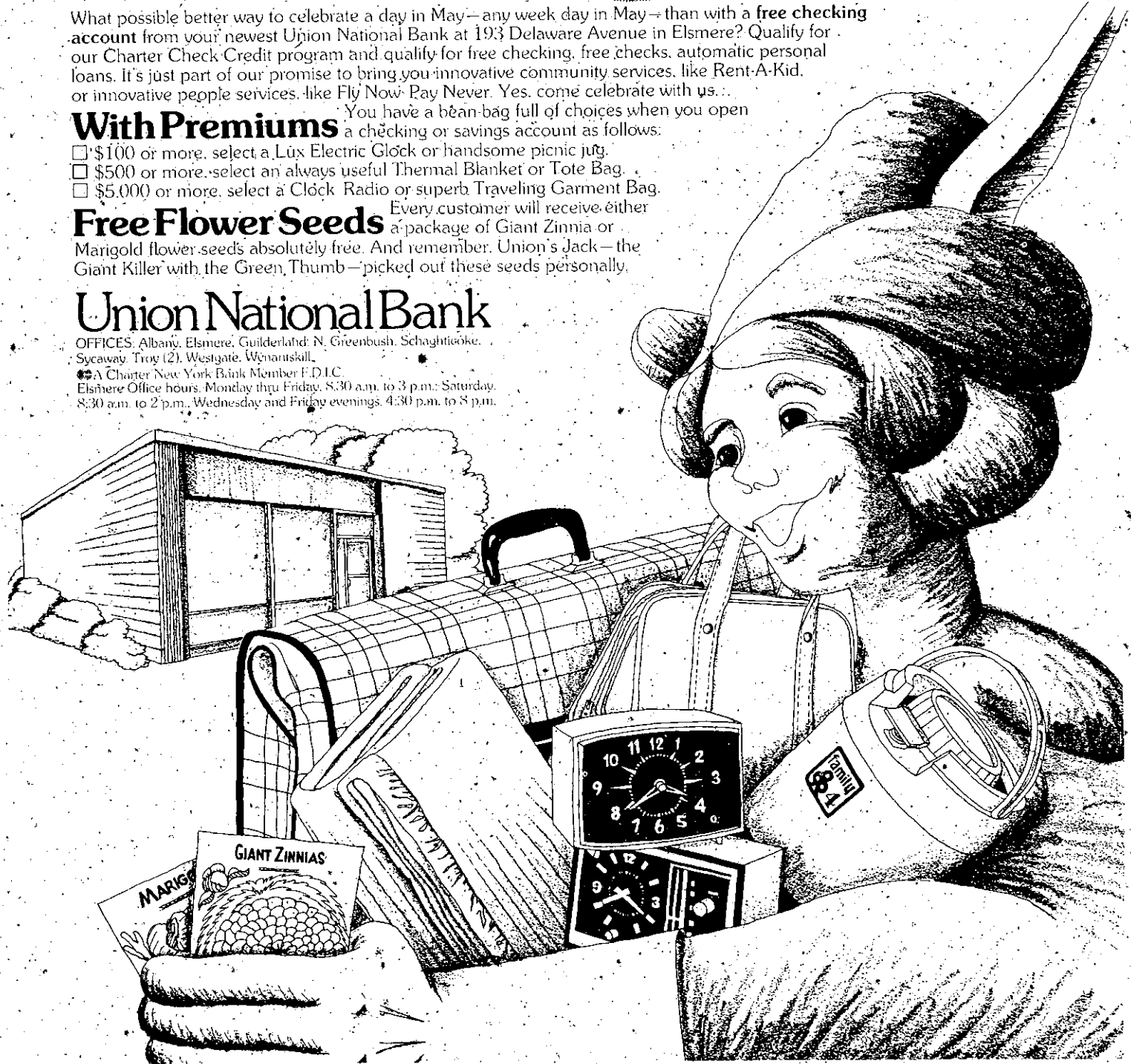

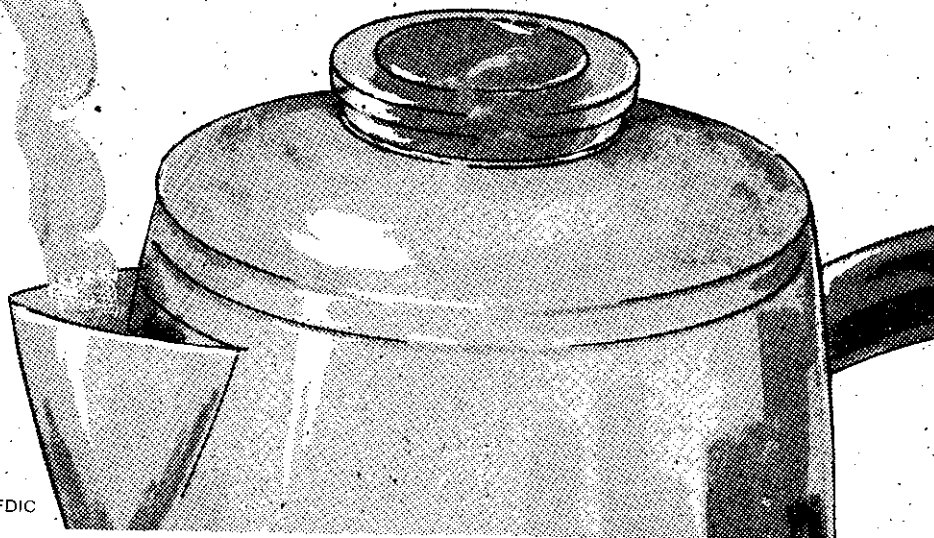

Why do some of us parents recommend that our children take Latin? What better place for students to learn the culture of Western Civilization or the rudiments of Roman mythology, or to reinforce their own English grammar or to aggrandise their vocabularies?

I do not believe German or French or Spanish should be considered as a replacement for the study of Latin. I believe they are important in conjunction with, but not as a substitute for a classical study. French and Spanish are so similar, that having mastered one of these Romance languages, an astute student could teach himself the other. This is not true of Latin and I ask that the Board of Education not become a party to the extinction of Latin in the Bethlehem School District. If the present policy is followed, there is a distinct possibility that exactly what has happened this year will continue to occur, until eventually Latin will not even be offered.

I am aware of the budget problems, but surely, as an institute of learning, Bethlehem Senior High School can find some way to offer a classical language to benefit a relative few, as well as subjects like Jewelry, Photography, Ceramics, Sculpture, Housing, Production Metals and Architectural Drawing to benefit the masses. Could not some of these courses be offered in alternate years, also, thereby cutting down on budget costs?

I would appreciate your reconsideration of making Latin available in the curriculum next fall.

Head Football Coach this past year has produced the enviable record of 10 wins and 0 losses. Notre Dame defeated Alabama 24-23 in the Sugar Bowl. As National Chairman for 1974 Multiple Sclerosis campaign, he is applying some of those winning energies against MS; thecrippler of young adults.

Parseghian states "I spend my life working with beautiful young adults; the kids who play for me, but there are hundreds of thousands of other beautiful young adults in this country who are struck down in the prime of life by multiple sclerosis."

"I know this. Three members of my immediate family, including my sister, have been af-

flicted by MS. They need my help; the National MS Society needs **your** help."

A project entitled "Athletes vs. MS" has been devised. It is believed that this is the first time the entire American sports world has been called upon to support a single cause.

The idea being to involve athletes at all levels — professional, collegiate, high school and local — in order to raise the necessary millions of dollars for MS research and patient services.

According to Parseghian, there are hundreds of thousands of athletes across the country. The fact they are already in the public eyes and generally are about the same age as most patients, who are diagnosed as having MS. It is a disease that attacks the central nervous system of young adults between the ages of 20 and 40. To date, there is no known cause or cure.

The National campaign to solicit funds for MS this year will be carried on from Mother's Day (May 12) to Father's Day (June 16).

Last year, the MS society raised more than \$12 million. This year the goal is \$14 million. 60% of the funds raised stays with the local chapters; the other 40% goes to National headquarters to help support the MS Society's research and medical programs.

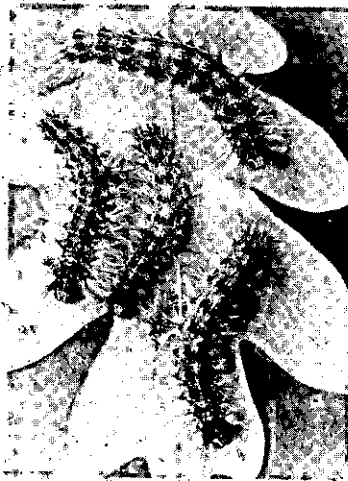

Gypsy Moth Found Here

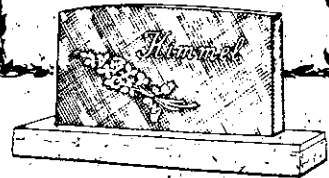
An infestation of gypsy Moth has been found in Elsmere. This pest has been denuding the New England countryside for years and has now spread to New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.



This species does not make a web like the Tent Caterpillar. Instead the caterpillars are usually seen singly or in groups crawling up trees and shrubs from the middle of May to early June. The caterpillar is dark in color with tufts of long bristles on each segment. The first four segments behind the head have indistinct blue spots on top, the rest have mahogany spots. The caterpillars are extremely destructive to vegetation, feeding on over five hundred kinds of plants, though preferring oak, apple, willow, poplar, alder, basswood and gray Birch. As these are defoliated, they turn to maple, other birches and cherry, and, in a pinch, to pine, spruce and cedar.

Nobody knows whether the current infestation in Bethlehem is localized or widespread, but junior members of the Bethlehem Sportsmen's Club have been trained to identify these pests. If you see caterpillars resembling those described above, on your shrubbery or trees, please call 439-1162 (Russell Miller, Chairman of the Council) or 439-2810 (Gardiner Bump, biologist) and someone will be out pronto to check the identification. If they prove to be gypsy moth caterpillars, we will recommend that control measures be taken to prevent the spread of this pest and the de-

The office is an experiment that is being tried for a year to see if it brings about better efficiency and coordination for the administrative work of the churches. The five churches participating in the experiment are — The Jerusalem Reformed Church, Feura Bush; The Unionville Reformed Church; the New Salem Reformed Church; the Clarksville Community Church (Reformed); and the Onesquethaw Reformed Church, Tarrytown.

Two of the three ministers — Rev. Johannes Meester of the Unionville and New Salem Reformed Churches, and Rev. Gerald Wondra of the Jerusalem and Onesquethaw Reformed Churches have their primary offices at the new facility. The other — Rev. It is hoped that the ministry of each of the five local churches will be made more fruitful and effective as a result of this facility. These goals are being tested during the experimental year. The Office is located on Delaware Turnpike, Clarksville, in the same building as the Post Office. The Public is welcome to come and see it on Sunday, May 19, 2:30-5 P.M. Refreshments will be served.

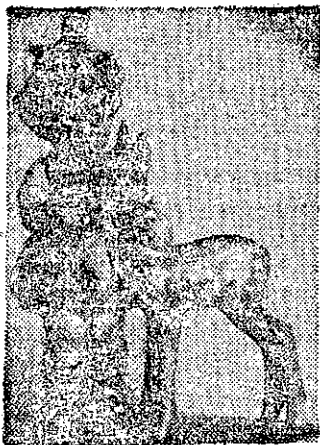

Bad Roads Waste Fuel Study Finds

New York drivers could save more than 39 million gallons of gasoline a year if 12,000 miles of rough, rutted roads were resurfaced, according to a study released today by The Road Information Program (TRIP).

This would enable New York motorists to drive an extra 522 million miles a year, says the Washington, D.C. agency.

The study shows that vehicles use up to one fourth more fuel traveling on uneven and broken pavement, compared with operation on smooth pavement. The higher fuel consumption on rough road surfaces is attributed to loss of traction and an uneven flow of power caused by accelerating and decelerating.

"Energy conservation is a long-term goal in New York and state and local highway departments should concentrate on upgrading substandard roads that waste fuel," said TRIP state chairman Richard E. Forrestell, who announced the study.

TRIP's study involves New York's 33,437-mile system of arterial and collector roads which amount for 31 per cent of the state's roads. The study does not include 71,000 miles of local roads, for which statistics are not available, and any road handling less than 100 cars a day.

The study shows that New York motorists drive 45 million miles a day on deficient pavement.

We're not talking about the interstates or the freeways — which are in generally good condition — or the back roads few people use," said Forrestell. "We're concerned about New York's major roads used for business, agriculture and commuting. Some 34 percent of the traffic on these roads travels on bad pavement."

Forrestell said New York drivers are paying for the delay in road improvements in terms of wasted time, money and fuel. Bad pavement increases tire wear and damages front-
