The Spotlight Goes to School

Letter to Board Members

The following letter was written to each member of the Board of Education:

Dear Mr. Clyne:

I attended my first Board of Education meeting on May 22 at the Educational Services Center. Midway through the meeting, one of the audience complained that the decisions made by the Board were so final that the community really had no way of influencing these

decisions, except to vote against the budget. The thought occurred to me that what the community wants and needs might be a voice in **suggesting** areas for budget cuts, not meetings to explain the final, unalterable budget. Granted, there would be some scatter-brained suggestions, but if the law of averages holds, there would be some noteworthy ideas too, especially in a community that sends 76.7% of its graduating seniors on to further education. You already have the informational organ in "Bethlehem Central Highlights." Be assured that the average parent reads it very carefully. If budgetary-cut suggestions, with reasons, were solicited from the community, I believe the Board would receive a good response. Since you are our representatives, give us a chance to let you know how we feel before the final budget is proposed. As you know, both the parental and teaching communities are distressed by the cut in staff at the middle school. There are alternate ways to solve the budget problem. Take a long look at the curriculum in the middle school, not just the teacher number. In the future, do not wait until the budget is defeated.

You are to be commended, Mr. Clyne, on your "no" vote for German in the sixth grade. Now is not the time to be add-

ing a language at a lower level while preventing fourteen students in the high school from taking Latin I. Please think one step beyond this. Are, French, Spanish and German necessary or even desirable at the sixth grade level? Our early language program is twelve yrs. old now. Has any local study been made to determine if the value of this program outweighs the budgetary expense? I asked this question of the head of curriculum and he said he knew of no local study, but gave me two articles from Washington, D.C. and Philadelphia, Penna. that showed foreign language study in elementary school develops creativity, flexibility in thinking, and a facility in reading one's own language. Since we are not offering a foreign language in elementary school, i.e. grades 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, I do not think these studies apply.

Four years of French, German and Spanish can be taken at the high school level. Has it been determined if a student with three years of high school French is as facile with the language as one who has taken French in grades 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10? It is a simple enough determination to make in both French and Spanish. If there is no significant difference, what are the advantages of starting a foreign language in sixth grade?



By the time a student reaches high school, with three years of a language behind him, he is often turned off to further study. Would not it be better to return to the old method of offering him his choice of French, Spanish, German and Latin at the 9th grade?

Third and fourth year levels of foreign languages are in trouble at Bethlehem. Next September third level students in German and Latin will be combined with second level students. Will 15 minutes a day of German III and Latin III prepare our children adequately for Regents' tests? Certainly not. This problem might be solved by discontinuing early language learning.

More, and more colleges are not requiring a foreign language for entrance, while more and more secondary schools are adding such courses at lower levels. Are we behind the times now after twelve years? If only those students who were interested in and wanted to take a language did so at the high school level, our language program might be in better shape.

I am in no way against the study of foreign languages. I have had four years of Latin and three of French in high school plus two of Spanish in college and one of conversational German. What I am against is a redundant language program in the middle school that might not serve any useful purpose and be costing the tax-

payers a considerable amount of money.


