As a student in the Bethlehem Central Schools who has worked on the Budget Information Committee with Dr. Zinn (Superintendent Schools) I find it very hard to believe the budget can exist with Mr. Clyne's allegations. 



My Series E Savings Bonds were payable upon my death to my mother. She passed away recently. Must I now cash these bonds?

nswer:

You may cash the bonds but you are not compelled to do so because of your mother's death. The maturity dates on Series E Bonds have been extended. These bonds are now earning approximately 5.5% interest depending upon how long they are held. Your bank can arrange to have-these bonds reissued bearing the same dates as the originals without any loss of interest. The proof you will need of your mother's death can be secured from us.

Reissued bonds may be registered in one of three ways: (1) your name alone, (2) your name and a co-owner, (3) your name payable upon death to someone else. If you cash the bonds now the interest must be considered for Federal Income Tax purposes. On the reissued bonds, however, any interest consideration may be deferred until the bonds are cashed or until they mature, which ever comes first.
