Vote on Addition

Residents of the Bethlehem Central School District, will vote on July 10 on whether to add six separate budget items to a contingency budget adopted by the Board of Education on June 19.

The contingency budget totals \$9,857,979; (including \$143,850 for Bethlehem Public Library indebtedness) or about \$270,000 less than the budget which was defeated on June 12. It was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Board.

The six budget propositions, which will be added to the contingency budget if they get voter approval on July 10, are:

1. Library and reference books, \$12,965. If approved, this would add about 22 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation to the Bethlehem tax rate, and about 32 cents per \$1,000 for New Scotland residents.

2. Plant operation and main-

tenance, \$32,555. If approved, this would add about 40 cents per \$1,000 in Bethlehem and about 59 cents per \$1,000 in New Scotland.

3. Equipment, \$41,077. If approved, this would add about 69 cents per \$1,000 in Bethlehem, and about \$1.01 per \$1,000 in New Scotland.

4. Transportation at present distance limits, \$57,395. If approved, this would add about 97 cents per \$1,000 in Bethlehem, and about \$1.42 per \$1,000 in New Scotland.

5. Supplies for pupils, \$58,300. If approved, this would add about 99 cents per \$1,000 in Bethlehem, and about \$1.45 per \$1,000 in New Scotland.

6. Interscholastic Athletics, \$68,513. If approved, this would add about \$1.02 per \$1,000 in Bethlehem, and about \$1.49 per \$1,000 in New Scotland.

With just the contingent budget in effect, and none of the propositions, the school tax rate in Bethlehem would be about \$109.288 per \$1,000 assessed valuation, and in New Scotland about \$160.214 per \$1,000. The proposed budget which was defeated on June 12 would have added about \$4.29 per \$1,000 to the Bethlehem tax rate, and about \$6.29 per \$1,000 to the New Scotland rate, above the contingency budget rates.

If all six propositions are approved by district voters and added to the contingency budget, the total will be the same as the originally proposed budget. It was the unanimous opinion of the Board of Education that a contingency budget, without further cuts, be adopted. "We had already cut as much as we could, without seriously harming our educational program," Board member Bernard Harvith said.

The six propositions are being voted upon by district residents, because they cannot be included in a contingency budget according to State Education Law. Complete details on what passage or defeat of each proposition will mean to district pupils will be explained in a special issue of "Central Highlights" to be mailed next week.

It should be of immediate concern to parents, however, that if the transportation proposition is defeated, busing can be provided only for pupils in grades kindergarten through 8 who live two or more miles from their school, and for pupils grades 9 through 12 who live three or more miles from the High School. These are distance limits set by State Law when a district is operating on a contingency budget.

If the supplies proposition is defeated, it will mean that parents will have to pay for their children's supplies. The average cost of school supplies for each child in grades 1 through 12 is about \$13.20.

Many of the total amounts listed for each of the separate propositions will be offset by income factors. For example, allowable transportation costs (not including field trips) are reimbursed by the State at the rate of 90 per cent, to be received by local districts the following year. Interscholastic athletic events annually produce gate receipts to the district of about \$8,000. Federal funds are available for purchase of new library books only when a district maintains its own purchase program.

The polls will be open on July 10 at the Middle School from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. for voting on the propositions. All district residents are urged to read the special "Highlights" carefully, ask whatever questions they may have by calling 439-

Since I was in Viet-Nam and have a brother who has been missing-in-action since 1967, I don't let a day go by without thinking about Viet-Nam. I wanted to let people know a few facts about Viet-Nam that people don't know or really think about.

I am deeply distressed that little attention has been taken to the plight of more than 1200 Americans who were captured or reported missing in Viet-Nam have not been accounted for.

60 American men that the other side claimed had "died in captivity, POW," are still buried in alien soil.

More than 50 of those who were known to be prisoners of war, were not returned.

Very few of our missing in-action were among the men that were returned.

"Death is truth, but not knowing is a deep pain that lasts forever."
