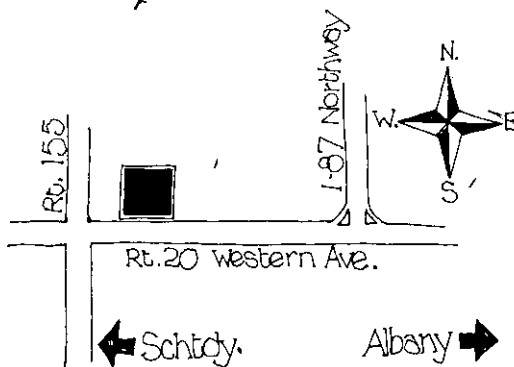

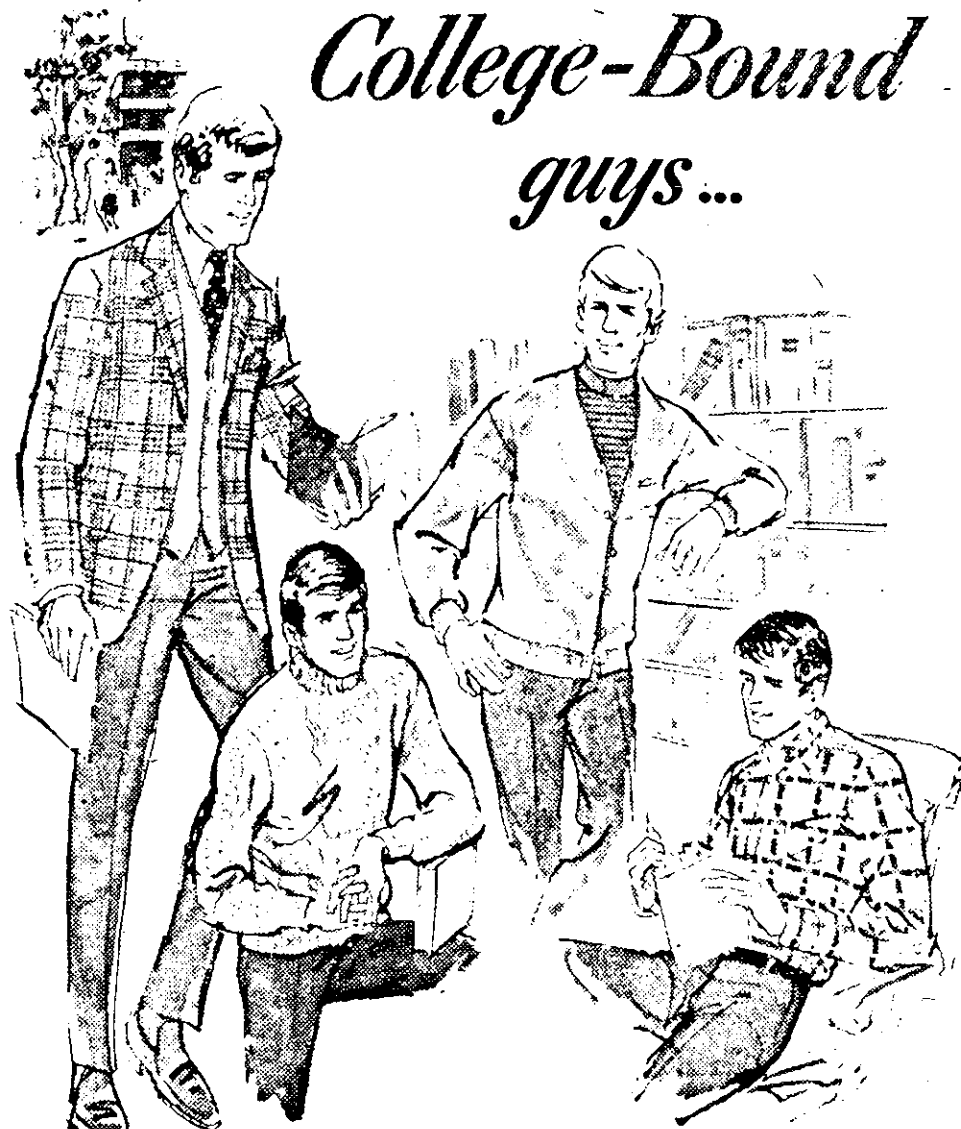

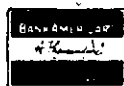

Low Tire Pressure Detection
A "red-alert" system for detecting low tire pressure at the touch of a button is now available to local motorists. The new device is being marketed by Montgomery Ward.

S. S. Burgio, metropolitan district manager of Ward's Albany district, noted that low pressure can be an important cause of poor gas mileage and excessive tire wear; it can also be a contributing factor leading to dangerous skidding in emergency braking.

Marketed under the name "Pressur Checker™", the device screws onto the valve stem and remains there as a permanent attachment. The color showing through its clear stem is an attention-getting red, reminding the driver to check the pressure periodically. When the button top is pushed, the color changes to a brilliant green if tire pressure is at or above the proper level. If the pressure is too low, however, the color remains red, alerting the driver to an under-inflated condition.

Air pressure can be increased or decreased and checked by gauge without having to remove the unit.

"You can't tell if tires are properly inflated just by looking at them," Burgio said, "especially with radial tires that look soft at proper pressures. In fact, tires may lose up to half their air pressure and still look almost normal. And don't forget the spare! How many times have you put your spare tire on and discovered it was too low or even flat?"

"Every year tens of thousands of tires which were not defective are junked or replaced long before they should be, due to under-inflation or other avoidable problems such as misalignment."

By keeping tires properly inflated to reduce rolling friction, a consumer can save up to 50 gallons of gasoline a year, Burgio noted, and unequal tire pressure can cause uneven braking or even skidding, increasing the risk of a serious accident.

Pressur Checkur is available at \$1.35 each in 24, 26, 28 and 32 pounds-per-square-inch ratings, which covers most passenger car and light truck tire specifications. The rating is stamped in bold figures on the top, eliminating the need to remember tire pressure requirements (many auto manufacturers specify different pressures for front and rear tires). The unit weighs only 3.8 grams and will not affect tire balance.

All working parts are tightly sealed in molded plastic to avoid rust and freezing problems which could be caused by water penetrating the unit.

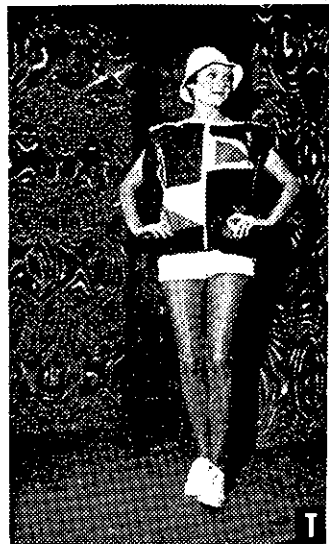

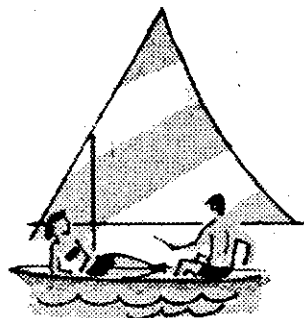

shows that if we go back to World War II and look at each of the 10-year periods from the beginning of 1946 to the end of 1973 (a total of nineteen 10-year periods), we find that the total return for the average mutual fund (in-

cluding reinvestment of all dividends and distributions) worked out to a compound annual rate of 10.2%"

Even allowing for the 4.3% average rate of inflation, that means a real growth of 5.9%. Assuming your money was left to accumulate in a savings institution for the same time period, inflation practically eliminated any real growth. While there is no assurance that future mutual fund performance will duplicate the past, this form of investing should be considered and thoroughly explored by anyone who wants to plan for financial independence.

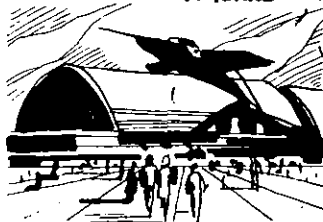
The award was based on the safety performance of all 73,754 Union Carbide employees in the United States, Canada and Puerto Rico.
