LIBRARY NOTES

It's time again for the facts — in hopes that they will answer some questions about activities in the Children's Room of Bethlehem Public Library. If there are further questions, please call Mrs. Harris, the Children's Librarian, at 439-9314.

The Pre-School Storyhours which are on Wednesday and Thursday mornings require registration. The Kindergarten Day does not necessitate registration, and any kindergartner may come on Tuesdays at either 10 A.M. or 2 P.M. for 45 minutes of stories, games, songs and films. There will be three 8-week sessions beginning October 1, January 7 and April 1. Mark these dates on your calendar.

The 45 minute Storytime for first and second graders begins October 3 at 4:00 P.M. There will be one movie and a long story, so that those children who are ready for action after school, could probably not sit through this quiet time. These will also run in three 8-week sessions: October 3, January 2 and April 3.

The clubs which are for grades 3 through 6 will meet once a week in conjunction with the school calendar. On Tuesdays at 4:00 P.M. there will be a book club which will be for the person interested in a quiet, but fun, club. Films will be used and a chance will be given for writing creative pieces. This begins October 1 for anyone in grade 5 through 7.

Puppet Club is again being included in the program. It will be for grades 3-5 and meet on Wednesday at 4:00 P.M. Children will have a chance to make many varieties of puppets during the first part of the year, and then the second half of the year they will produce a play, using their puppets. This begins October 2.

On Thursdays at 4:00 P.M. there will be a dramatics club for grades 4-8. This will begin with activity-oriented creative dramatics, and then the second half of the year will be working on short skits and plays to produce for the public. This group begins October 3.

There must be something to interest everyone, and if there's not, let me know. I'll see you all on October 1.

The Bethlehem Public Library has been delayed in getting overdue notices out for some books taken out since the middle of July, due to a problem with the film. Please don't forget to return any books you have, even if you haven't gotten a notice yet. They will still be considered overdue, whether you've gotten your notice yet or not.

Touhey on Property Tax

The state must ease the burden of property taxes by picking up a larger share of school costs, Carl E. Touhey declared Friday as he launched a series of "walks" through the 42nd Senate District (Albany and Greene Counties) which he seeks to represent as the Republican candidate.

His remarks came as he met homeowners along Hackett Avenue in Colonie.

"Property taxes in this area and throughout the state have passed the saturation point," he said, "and the prime reason is the local cost of education."

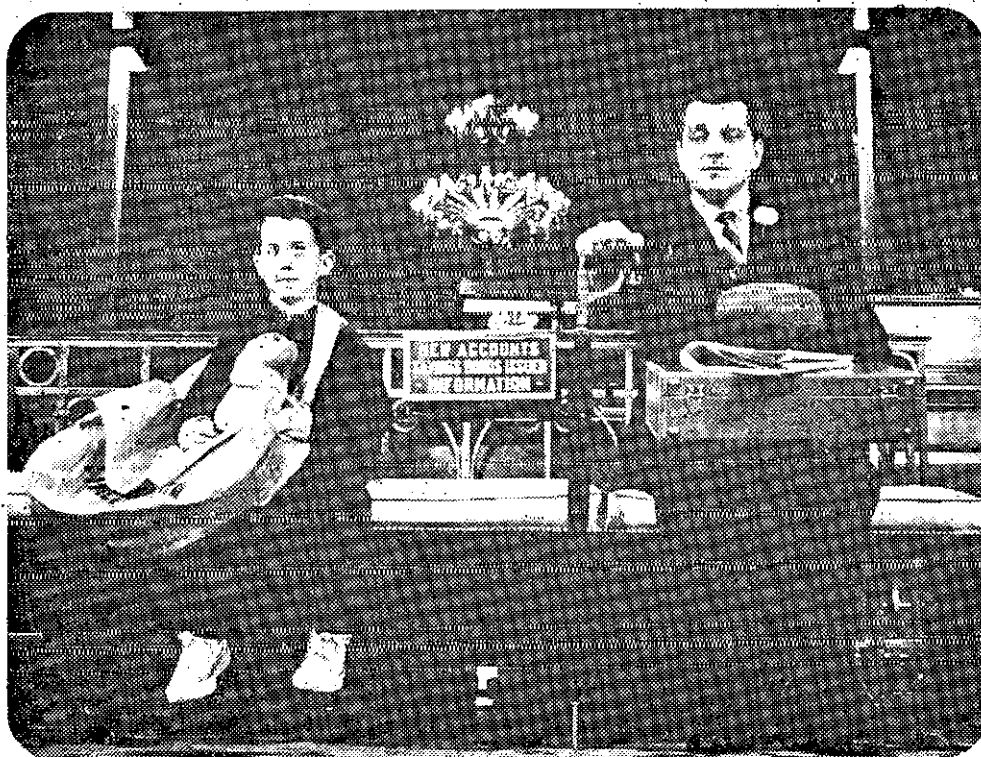
"As the cost of public elementary and secondary education has more than doubled in New York State in the past six years, the state share has slipped from 50 cents on the dollar to 40 cents on the dollar," Touhey explained.

As a state senator, Touhey said, "I will work to see that at the very least the state returns to its percentage sharing level of six years ago so that a property owner can see some relief in sight."

Noting that in the infant days of this country Chief Justice John Marshall warned, "The power to tax is the power to destroy," Touhey declared, "Everywhere I go, people tell me it is harder and harder to afford to live in their own homes or they cannot afford to pay taxes on homes they would like to buy."

"It is fairer and makes more sense for the state to assume its equitable share by using its broader revenue base than for the costs of education to keep piling up at the doorstep of the home owner," Touhey remarked.

Sal Amato Believes . . .

That all participants in Family Court proceedings be given a fair and reasonable opportunity to present their case.

That no case be given a "fast shuffle" and that no party should suffer from a lack of representation before the court.

That a Family Court Judge should cooperate with Family and Youth Counseling Services in the community to aid in solving the problems of family discord BEFORE they reach the courtroom.

That reforms should be undertaken in the areas of courtroom facilities, procedures and calendaring.

"The situation has snowballed," he continued, "to a point where many of the elderly must sell homes which represent a lifetime of living to them and the younger generation finds property taxes as great a roadblock as high interest rates and large down payments are when they want to buy their own homes."

"Those renting also find their housing costs spiralling as the result of school property tax rates, and such increased costs to the business property owner get passed on to the buying public."

The situation, Touhey said, also places local school boards in the "unenviable position, more often than not, of either having to ask the homeowner for more and more money or limiting educational programs and opportunities."

"Further hikes in school property taxes are unacceptable," Touhey concluded. "Both the individual home owner and the housing market already have been seriously hurt by the dramatic increases of the past few years and can tolerate no further financial damage."

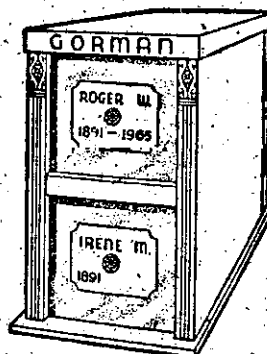


Bethlehem Sportsman's Clubhouse — a new log cabin replaces the old clubhouse which burned in 1973.
