"Project Rescue" Life Launched

Project Rescue, a totally new program to help firemen save lives in residential fires or other emergencies has been introduced by the Town of Bethlehem Fire Departments in cooperation with Mr. Charles E. Bryant, President of the Charles E. Bryant Insurance Agency.

Mr. Bryant is assisting local Fire Departments, by making available to the public distinctive decals to be placed on the windows of the elderly, infirm or invalids. The decals mark the location of a priority rescue attempt in case of a fire.

It has been pointed out that in 1973, over 11,000 people died in fires in the United States and better than half of these deaths occurred in dwelling fires. By far the largest groups of people vic-

tims of dwelling fires are those in the categories covered by Project Rescue.

Repeatedly local Fire officials have stated that their greatest concern and responsibility is for the lives of our residents. Project Rescue is a great step forward in providing them with the ability of carrying out this responsibility. In responding to a home emergency, our men will be able to effect rescues and evacuations more efficiently while fighting the cause of the emergency.

Project Rescue decals are available free from all the Town of Bethlehem Fire Departments. Call your area Fire Department for a decal or for further information.

It's so good to know there is still some good-hearted people in this world.

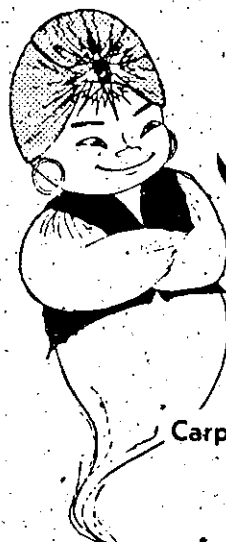
Dear Sirs:

We want to offer you our sincere apologies for the great inconvenience we have brought upon you, by giving false information to Albany detectives that led to an unnecessary investigation and search for five non-existent persons in the month of July. We do not in any way justify our lying to the police. Our story was the result of a spur of the moment decision to help a friend avoid embarrassment by explaining an accidental, but self induced injury.

We realize that, because of us, a great amount of overtime and considerable effort were put forth by the men on your forces. We know that this time and energy could have been spent on valid cases that posed a real threat to the community.

As we apologize to the police forces for the trouble we have caused them, so do we apologize to the people of Albany. We realize that feelings of tension and anxiety were generated by our story, especially to those who reside in or frequent the neighborhood of New Scotland and Madison Avenues, and that businessmen in the area suffered on account of this.

We regret that there is nothing we can do now to erase the effects of our actions, ex-

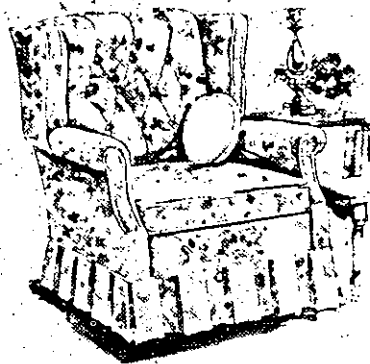

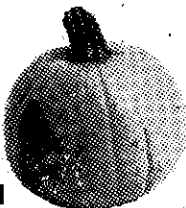

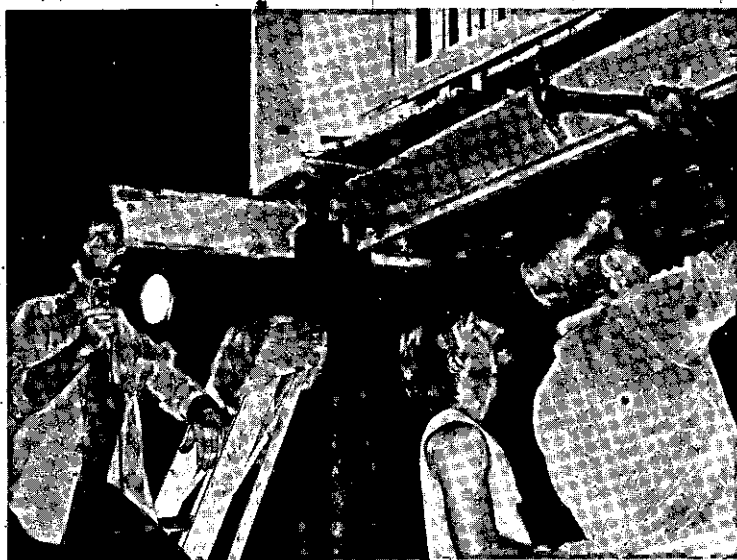
For the Slingerlands Players this has been a summer of great activity and physical change in their Unionville Playhouse. President Dick McGrath, with the assistance of a small but determined group of Players, has revised the facade of the old hotel-turned-Playhouse and created an enlarged theatre now capable of seating an additional fifty to sixty souls.

This effort, which required the extension and enclosure of the front porch, the removal of almost forty feet of interior wall and the erection of an equally long section of steel beam, was undertaken to help the Players meet two dilemmas. The first, one with which we are all familiar, was the problem of rising costs and a limited income. The second was the inability to seat all the theatregoers who wished to see Players shows.

The enlargement of the theatre will help the Players to solve both problems. While the size of the theatre is still modest, less than 150 persons, it will allow more people to enjoy good local productions and give the Players a greater income with which to continue their work.

The existence of the Slingerlands Players in this area has created the tradition of enjoyment of live theatre for several generations of Players neighbors. Moving into their 23rd season this fall, the Players offer not only a bigger and better theatre but a full and varied program of comedy, music, drama and Showcase productions as well.
