### Tri-Village Little League

Mr. Frank Shipp has indicated that the Tri-Village Little League is open this year to boys and girls of the Town of Bethlehem, eight to twelve years of age, providing they register with proof of age and are accompanied by a parent or guardian at the time of registration. **Free Milk For Students**

If Bethlehem Central School District families who are eligible to get free school lunches for their children don't wish to get free lunches, they may still obtain free milk for their children at lunchtime.

The free milk is available to children from these eligible families in all Bethlehem schools whether they purchase a lunch or bring one from home.

The procedure for applying for free milk is the same as applying for free lunches. Forms are available in all district schools.

No one except the building principal knows which children are receiving free lunches or milk.

**Bond Issue**

At a meeting of the Town of Bethlehem Fire Officers tonight, (Feb. 6) Mr. Bruce Houghton and Mr. Franz Zwicklbauer, school district staff members, will be present to explain the district's building needs and the Board's decision to ask voter approval of the bond issue method of paying for them.

All district schools have scheduled informational meetings on the bond issue, and the second will take place next Tuesday, Feb. 11, at 8 P.M., at the Hamagrael Elementary School. (Slingerlands School held its parents' meeting last night.)

Next Wednesday, February 12, Superintendent Lawrence Zinn and Board Member Bertold Weinberg have been invited to attend a luncheon meeting of the Second-Milers, a local group of retired men, to explain and answer questions about the bond issue.

Next Thursday, Feb. 13, at 8 P.M., Middle School parents are particularly invited to attend an informational meeting at that school.

The D.A.R. will award a \$50 savings bond to the winner of the contest.






