## LIBRARY NOTES

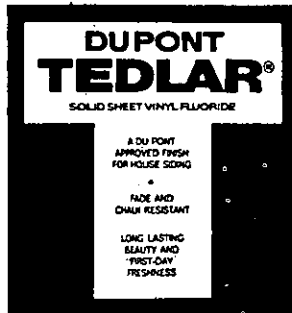
The Staff and Board of Trustees of the Bethlehem Public Library are pleased to announce that a new Library Director has been appointed. The new Director is Miss Kay Ann Cassell and she will assume her position on Monday, June 2nd.

The Library and the Community are both fortunate that Miss Cassell has decided to come to Bethlehem. She comes to us from the Westchester Library System in White Plains, N.Y. where she was Adult Services Consultant, providing assistance to 38 public libraries in the county with collections, services, programs, in-service training, and public relations. From 1971 to 1973 Miss Cassell served as a consultant and professor of librarianship for the Peace Corps in Morocco, and for several years before that she worked as Adult Service Consultant for the New Jersey State Library in Trenton.

In addition to her work experience, and her formal studies, she has written book reviews and articles for the LIBRARY JOURNAL, an article on Morocco for the WILSON LIBRARY BULLETIN, and has published information on library services in New Jersey. Miss Cassell is an active member of many professional organizations, and is Vice President/President-Elect of the Adult Services Section of the New York Library Association.

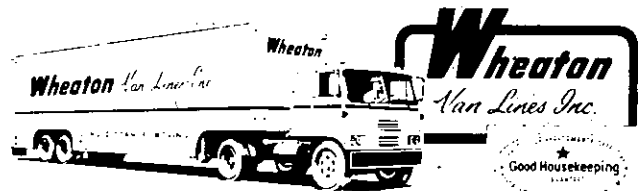

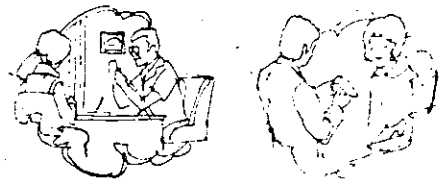

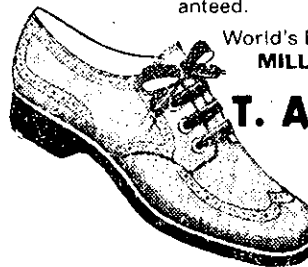

### Evening Band Program

A summer evening band program co-sponsored by the Town of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Central School District is again being planned for instrumental band students presently in grades 6-12, and any interested alumni. The program will be directed by Mr. Samuel Bozzella, Senior High Band director, and is scheduled to begin Monday, June 30, and end Wednesday, July 30, with a \$15 registration fee for each participating student.

The program will consist of two weekly rehearsals and two outdoor evening concerts. All music will be supplied by the

Bethlehem Central Music Department and instruments are available without charge to school district residents.

### BC Honor Graduates

**BC School District Vote**

All residents of the Bethlehem Central School District will have the opportunity to vote on June 11 on these ballot items: 1) a proposed school budget for 1975-76, 2) a proposed Bethlehem Public Library budget for 1975-76, 3) candidates for two seats on the Bethlehem Central Board of Education, and 4) candidates for one seat on the Library Board of Trustees.

The proposed school budget, adopted by unanimous vote of the Board of Education, totals \$10,734,120, or an increase of \$650,463 over this year's budget. The budget would increase taxes for Town of Bethlehem residents by \$4.59 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, and by \$6.74 per \$1,000 for Town of New Scotland residents. Of these projected tax increases, 1.4 per cent is due to bond issue and 2.8 per cent is for other budget needs.

The proposed Bethlehem Public Library budget totals \$462,375, or an increase of \$45,881 over the current Library budget.

Five persons are running for the two open seats on the Board of Education. Voters will elect either Mary Anne Stringham, Robert D. Reed, or John H. Williams to one Board seat, and either Guy D. Paquin or Robert Ruckterstuhl to the other seat.

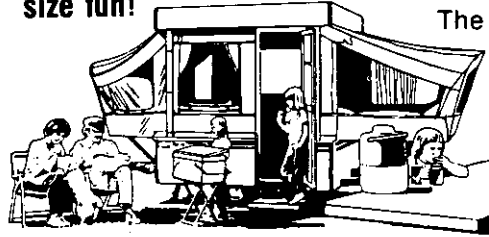
The two persons running for the open seat on the Library Board of Trustees are Florence Newell, the incumbent, and Robert E. Vines.

**Obtaining Food Stamps**

If you and your family are finding it increasingly difficult to stretch your dollars to the end of the month, you may be able to obtain some relief. You may be eligible to receive Food Stamps. As of January 1, 1975, new regulations were instituted making more households beneficiaries of this money-saving way of purchasing food. You need not be on Public Assistance in order to qualify for Food Stamps. If your income is low and your resources small, for example, less than \$1500 in the bank, you should consider applying. Many older people on fixed incomes may discover that they are eligible.

The Social Action Committee of St. Thomas Church in Bethlehem is ready to help anyone in that community determine if his household is eligible for Food Stamps. The members will review household income and resources, help fill out applications and accompany people to the Albany County Social Services Department if necessary.

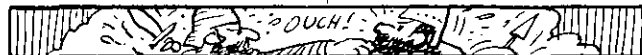

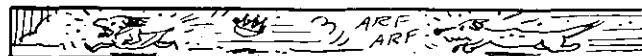
