Elm Avenue Park Permit Applications

Applications for Elm Avenue Park Use Permits are being accepted at the Parks and Recreation Department, 114 Adams St., Delmar. The office is located in the building next to the Town Police and will be open weekdays from 8:30 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. and the Saturdays June 7th and 14th from 9:00 A.M. to 12 Noon. After June 14th the office will close at its usual time, 4:30 P.M.

Applicants will be requested to show proof of residence in the town. After applications are verified, permit cards for each individual over age seven will be issued by mail as proof of eligibility for admission to the park and the pool.

Residents **must** apply for a park permit to be eligible to enter the park or pool complex during the summer season.

Permits are issued on a daily (pay as you go), monthly, or seasonal basis according to the following:

— Daily permit cards (issued without charge) will be used only as proof of town residence and eligibility to pay daily park and pool fees.

— Season permit cards will permit park use and admission to the pool complex for all eligible members of a family unit or individual member all season. The fee payable at the time of application will be \$40.50 for a family or \$22.50 for an individual.

— Monthly permit cards will allow park and pool usage as follows:

- \$5.00 — Family Permit — June.
- \$2.50 — Individual Permit — June.
- \$20.00 — Family Permit — July.
- \$10.00 — Individual Permit — July.
- \$20.00 — Family Permit — August through Labor Day.

mit rates will not be pro-rated
for shorter periods. There will
be no refunds of seasonal,
monthly or daily fees once paid.

day, June 14th and will remain
open seven days a week
through September 2nd. The
hours will be:

Pool — 11 A.M. to 8 P.M.

Tennis Courts — 8 A.M. to
11 P.M.

Basketball Courts — 8 A.M.
to 10 P.M.

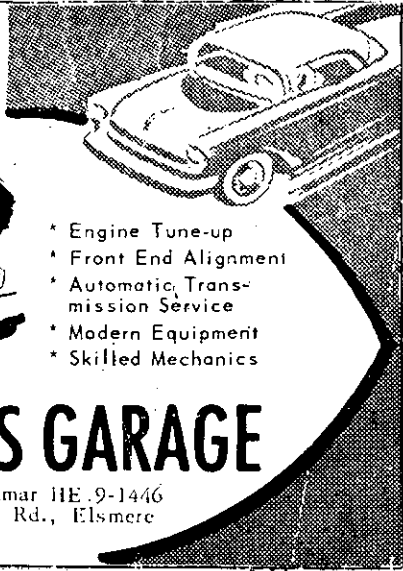

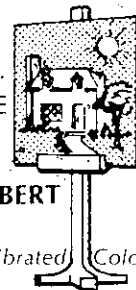
Adult Summer Classes
