**Best Makeup Base:  
Clean, Conditioned Skin**

The best foundation for any cosmetic is skin that is really clean and in good condition. Thorough removal of cosmetics, atmospheric dirt, and perspiration—even when you feel so tired you think you can just about make it to bed—is the way to help keep skin clear, soft, and ready for any makeup.

A dermatologist, writing for a medical journal, suggests that adolescents wash their faces three to four times a day to remove sebum. However, the mature adult usually does not need to wash his face more than once or twice a day.

Older women may need to use cleansing creams and little or no soap. "The degree of natural oiliness should determine the frequency and type of cleansing procedure," he states.

Today, there are creamy liquid skin cleansers that dissolve dirt, grease, and cosmetics effectively and quickly. One of these, pHisoDerm, also helps preserve the skin's natural protection against dryness and irritation, has the same pH as normal skin, and contains gentle emollients similar to those produced by the skin itself.

A moisturizing cream applied at bedtime is recommended especially for dry and mature skin. A medicated drying, peeling cream such as pHisoAc can be applied to teenage acne or for blemishes at any age.

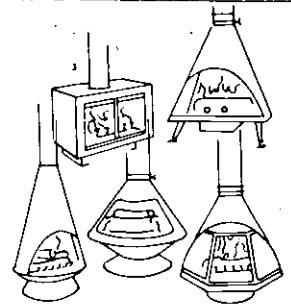
At the recent annual meeting of the Capitol Hill Choral Society, new officers were elected and committee chair-
