#### Delmar economy on upbeat: promotions and expansions

A flurry of business activity in Bethlehem's commercial district has turned local retailers' usual mid-summer trade slump into an anticipated sales pickup and has given local businessmen fresh optimism for the third and fourth quarters of 1977.

New businesses continue to come into the Bethlehem market, several existing businesses are announcing major expansions, new construction is underway in two locations on Delaware Ave., and at least three commercial facilities are undergoing major renovation.

Adding to the action is a series of special promotions by local retailers, notably the annual sidewalk sales coming up this weekend at Delaware Plaza and Delmar Four Corners. The net result is a new confidence on the part of local businessmen and a growing recognition of the Bethlehem-New Scotland area as a viable segment of the Albany metropolitan market.

At Delaware Plaza, 25 stores, the largest participation in two decades, are joining in the summer sidewalk sale this Saturday. Kenneth Schenkel, proprietor of Paul Mitchell's men's wear shop and president of the Plaza Merchants Assn., says the plaza will sponsor several special events this fall in an effort to "make the plaza a center of community service" for local shoppers. Among the events: several "dollar days," the anniversary sale in October, and major giveaway promotions. There will be pony rides

on Aug. 20 for the back-toschool sales, and possibly some showings of 1978 model cars later in the year. Plaza merchants recently sponsored a microwave-cooking demonstration and free blood pressure checks. "We are here to show the people of the community we don't have to push against the major shopping centers in Colonie and Latham," said Schenkel. "We are a familyoriented center, specializing in stores that are basically momma-poppa. We regard the growth potential of the Delmar area market as unlimited."

Other businessmen appar-

ently share his views. This week a demolition crew was scheduled to raze the building formerly occupied by Delmar Appliance, Inc., as part of a long-range expansion program. The site at 239 Delaware Ave, was recently purchased by Garth Hilchie. A spokesman at Hilchie's American Hardware next door said the site would be converted into a parking lot to serve a new commercial building near the rear of the property that will include two stores for rental purposes.

In the Four Corners area, contractors are rushing construction of the new Manufacturers Hanover bank facility opposite the Delmar

post office, and a major renovation is underway at 411 Kenwood Ave. adjacent to the municipal parking field. The two-story structure at the Kenwood Ave. address, a 94vear-old former residence, has been purchased by James J. Vogel, who will move his paint and wallpaper store into expanded quarters at the new location. At 392 Kenwood, Thomas Pulleo will re-establish his Golden Acorn Imports shop as the new tenant replacing Delmar Meat Market, whose proprietors have moved to Albany. Pulleo recently sold the historic building at 1526 New Scotland Rd., Slingerlands.

D.A. Bennett, Inc. has added a new business—insulation of commercial and residential buildings—to their air conditioning, plumbing and heating business. The moves by Vogel and Tri-Village Tailors to expanded quarters also opens up store space for other new businesses, both prime Four Corners locations that may not be vacant very long. Also available is a prime location at 414 Kenwood Ave., site of the former Rocking Chair Traveler gift shop whose owners recently retired for health reasons.

Two new restaurant facilities plan openings this month. In Elsmere, the new owners of Averill's Lounge have renamed their renovated facility the Terrace Restaurant and will feature a completely new dining format. In Glenmont, Arthur Fleahman has sold his Rt. 9W landmark, the Center Inn, to Rick Wilson, who hopes

to open in another week with a complete renovation and new restaurant format both upstairs and down.

# Driver jailed on 6 counts

A 37-year-old Albany man picked the wrong time to drive on the wrong side of an S-curve on Rt. 144 last Saturday afternoon. Charles E. Beverly, unemployed, allegedly forced several oncoming cars off the road at high speed on the reverse curve of the railroad bridge near the Niagara Mohawk power plant in Glenmont, and was stopped by Officer Frederick J. Beverly was remanded to Albany County jail in lieu of \$250 bond at his arraignment before Bethlehem Justice Robert Rice. He was later released on a bail bond for a hearing in Delmar, Aug. 18.

Robert A. Craig, 25, of New

Britain, Conn., was sentenced to 60 days in Albany County jail by Justice Rice. Craig was arrested on June 16 by Officer Holligan on Delaware Ave. in a car allegedly stolen the previous day.

# Cigarets heisted in station break

A break-in at a Glenmont service station last week netted burglars 151 cartons of cigarets valued at approximately \$750, according to a Bethlehempolice report.

The intruders broke a side window in the Sunoco station on Rt. 9W just south of the Normanskill viaduct early Wednesday morning. The station, usually open all night, had been closed at 11:30 p.m. when an attendant became ill, police said.

In an unrelated case, four Albany youths were apprehended on Delaware Ave., Delmar, shortly after midnight last Tuesday when Officer Ted Wilson noticed a passing car loaded with large leafy plants. The plants were reported stolen from the porch of the residence at 425 Delaware Ave., Delmar, by Mrs. Elizabeth R. Hill, who called police when she noticed three men running across her lawn with three of her large plants.

The quartet, Michael F. Spallane, Anthony J. Hulette, Peter J. Kubisch and Michael F. Norton, were released for an appearance in Bethlehem justice court tonight (Thursday).

#### Republicans pick campaign council

## Fire fighters fake fire for film

For more than five hours on a warm, hazy afternoon last week, Elsmere provided center stage and all the props and sets for a film production that could have a national impact.

If that sounds overdramatic, consider this scenario: a former Elsmere resident who was an officer of the Elsmere Fire Co. three years ago before moving to Boston is assigned to making a training film on community handling of an emergency involving hazardous materials. The project involves several dozen busy people. He is aware that Bethlehem's fire companies not only are widely recognized for their professional abilities, but are generous with their cooperation. The result: from 10 a.m. until well after 3 p.m. last Thursday, cameras, script writers and a cast of some 30 firemen and police were filmed in their specialties dealing with a mock disaster.

Directing the performance was Austin Sennett, manager

of educational technology for the Boston-based National Fire Protection Assn. His assignment: to develop a selfstanding educational "package" that will assist communities in dealing with emergencies arising from the transportation of flammable liquids, poisonous chemicals and the like-materials that could threaten a community if spilled from a railroad car or a tractor-trailer tanker. The film, a slide presentation with programmed script, will form. the basis of a 20-hour training course for police, fire and rescue units in communities across the nation.


Sennett lived at 49 Bender Lane, Elsmere, for four years while employed at the New York Bar Assn. in Albany. "When this assignment came up," he said on his brief reunion with former buddies at the fire station on Poplar Dr., "I knew how extremely cooperative these guys would be."

The large cast of men and machines included Paul Kleinke, Elsmere's fire chief John R. Cox Jr. and Theodore "Ted" Wilson of the Bethlehem Police Dept., Troopers J.T. Caulfield Jr. and W.J. Ropelewski of the State Police headquarters in Loudonville, and men and equipment from various units of the Elsmere Delmar, Selkirk and Glenmont fire departments. For a sequence on evacuating a dwelling, Sennett sent his cameraman to 1 Werner Ave. the residence of the Kirby Hannan family, where Mrs. Pat Hannan and her son, Ross, 3, served as models. Most of the photography was shot at the Elsmere fire station on Poplar Dr. and the Bethlehem fire training grounds off Center Lane, where a former highway tanker was set afire and doused

with foam.

The film's producer, also a onetime Capital District resident, is Callie McDowell, NFPA writer formerly of




# Town to ease tax for aged




