

#### Profile sites put the info out there

echnology has advanced greatly over the years, and 1 the Internet has often been the leader. According to The World Factbook put out by the Central Intelligence Agency, there are 203,824,428 Internet users in the United States. Since the country's population is estimated to be 298,444,215 by this July, it's rare to come across someone who doesn't have an e-mail account or some sort of Internet

Sending letters or messages by e-mail has evolved into rapidly growing trends such as Instant Messenger and chat rooms. Instant messaging allows people to communicate online in real time. In chat rooms, groups of people can communicate at the same time.

An influential, but less popular trend, was Livejournal, where people could post journal entries online.

A combination of all of these elements has surfaced in Web sites that let people publish online profiles of themselves, something that can be both fascinating and terrifying.

The most popular of these profiles are Facebook, Friendster and MySpace. These sites allow not only online profiles similar to the journal entries. # **Board** trims budget

Public will re-vote on June 20

#### By JIM CUOZZO

Over two nights last week, members of the Bethlehem school board cut \$802,000 from the \$73.3 million budget that district voters defeated on May

Voters will again go to the polls on June 20, where they will see a budget of \$72,450,816 for next year. School taxes would increase by an estimated 3.75 percent.

The majority of board members decided it would be better to work toward a second reduced budget that may get approval from the community instead of going directly to a contingency budget that would severely impact programming and services district-wide.

"The budget defeat sent a lot of messages, but it wasn't a vote for a contingency budget," said board member James Derring. "A contingency budget would be crippling for the district.'

The budget went down to defeat by 600 votes and was the first Bethlehem budget to be defeated since 1984. Cuts made by the school board during two meetings last week include two

# **Board seeks** funding for golf

#### Members approve hiring two officers

Over 600 residents throughout the Town of Bethlehem have signed a petition to keep Colonial Acres Golf Course in Glenmont forever green.

Randy Fisher of Glenmont is leading the fight to keep Colonial Acres free of residential development.

"There is a tremendous potential concern for development," said Fisher. "This is a Bethlehem-wide issue."

The petition asks for the Bethlehem town board to protect the 33 acres of land that encompasses Colonial Acres so that current and future generations may enjoy its natural

"We are eager to work with the town to preserve this without it being a tax burden," Fisher said.

Dan Driscoll, president of the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy, said preserving Colonial Acres fits into the town's comprehensive plan. Driscoll said landowners could work to purchase the property together or maybe a bond act could be set up to fund open space. Supervisor Theresa Egan said she has met

# RCS OKs \$39.1M budget for revote

The RCS Board of Education on Wednesday approved a \$39.1 million budget proposal to go before voters June 20.

The proposal is \$183,500 less than the 2006-07 budget voters defeated May 16.

Approval of the new budget proposal June 20 would mean a 7.2 percent tax levy increase for district residents. The defeated budget carried an 8.2 percent tax levy increase.

"We listened to the message the community sent to us on May 16 and at the public meetings we have held since the vote. The administration and board of education have worked very

diligently to reduce the budget proposal in a manner that respects what we have heard. We have attempted to answer the call for reduced costs while maintaining the level of student and community centered functions. It is now up to our community to determine what happens next," said board of education president John Bonafide.

School Superintendent Vicki Wright said approval of the budget proposal would:

## Delmar resident indicted for credit card fraud

Delmar, was arraigned and indicted by the U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of New York on a two-count felony indictment charging him with one count of credit. card fraud and one count of aggravated identity theft.


"It's awesome," said Margianna Benza. "We went to watch to witness this wonderful award in Washington."

# New Scotland residents receive assessment relief

With the town's informal grievance process complete, a property owner's assessment will rump on average 67 percent -10 percent less than was predicted - and it could go lower.

Town Assessor Julie Nooney said 256 property owners requested a formal grievance hearing in front of the assessment board of review, a five-member panel appointed by the town board.

More than 900 of the town's nearly 3,000 property owners filed for an informal review of the town's assessment of their property.

"During the informals we gained more information about each individual property and then adjustments were made accordingly," Nooney said, more formal grievances to be filed since this is the first revaluation in nine years. "If there were errors, we made adjustments.'

May 23 was the last day to file a formal grievance, but those still under-assessed will pay their fair unhappy with their assessment when the town releases the final roll on July 1 will have 30 days from that date to file a small claims assessment review with the county clerk for a fee of \$30.

"The low number of formal grievances was a surprise to everyone," said Supervisor Ed Clark. "In discussing it with the members of the assessment board of review, they said that it reflects the effectiveness of the process in which everyone was given the opportunity to schedule an informal hearing and were provided with the results of the hearing. Many were

and chose not to pursue it any further."

Never politically popular, a revaluation ideally spreads the tax burden in a more equitable manner so those that have been share of taxes and those overassessed — generally more recent property owners - will not pay more than they should.

The town's revaluation, when complete, will shift assessment to full market value. To accomplish that, Nooney and staff used the recent selling price of properties to assign a value to comparable properties.

It is not clear what the 10 percent reduction in the average assessment increase will mean to a taxpayer's pocketbook. Before the informal grievance process began, 54 percent of the property owners would have seen a tax increase of \$250 or more; just over 18 percent would have seen a decrease of \$250 or more; and 28 percent would have seen an increase or decrease somewhere

adding that she had expected apparently satisfied at the hearing in the middle. While the percentages remain the same, the dollar figure may shift slightly.

Such radical changes to assessments and taxes can be attributed to an increased interest in building in the town and the recent nationwide housing surge, which has shown signs of subsiding. To compensate for any downturn in real estate values, residents have the right to challenge their assessment annually.

To make the process smoother, and the changes in assessment and tax bills less radical, Nooney said the plan now is to do a revaluation every three years, which will also earn the town \$5 per parcel in state aid.

"I admire our residents' patience with and respect for the laws that govern the assessment process," Clark said. "I also hope... this effort has helped us discover ways to smooth out some of the rough spots in the process and upgrade the accuracy of assessments so that in the future it will be easier for everyone."



# Tough all around

In June, two of our school districts will hold a second vote on budgets that the public defeated once. Bethlehem and Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk have both pared down their budgets in the hopes of garnering the public's favor June 20 to avoid being forced to operate under a contingency budget.

School administrators caution that contingency budgets are bare-bones packages, which result in staff and program cuts. This, of course, will filter down to students. In Bethlehem, the problem was exacerbated by a town-wide reassessment that made

it difficult for voters to grasp just what their tax bills would be in the upcoming school year.

## Editorial

Although only two suburban budgets in the Capital District were defeated — Ballston Spa's results were delayed, but ultimately successful – we worry that this could be a continuing trend. With increases in property taxes and fuel costs, school budgets seem like the one thing we can control.

All of this is happening on the heels of demanding greater accountability from our students. We sympathize with the beleaguered residents who rightly are feeling "overtaxed," but also with the students who will suffer if contingency plans dictate next year's budgets.

It's too bad there's not an easy solution to this dilemma.

### Our error

The Spotlight made a serious mistake in the police blotter on May 24 — incorrectly identifying two community members, Donald Comtois and Terence O'Connor, as having been charged by the Bethlehem police, when in fact, they were only being good citizens and reporting improper activity in their neighborhoods.

It has been one year exactly since I graduated from college. I should probably stop saying, "I just graduated from Siena last May." At times, though, it really does seem like it was only yesterday.

I didn't realize that 12 months had passed since my graduation ceremony. That was a rainy day when our school made headlines

for moving everything indoors at the last minute, and shutting the doors on families and loved ones, resulting in all of the professors volunteering their seats so that these people could watch their graduates receive their diploma.

Graduating from college was surreal, a sort of deja vu from graduating high school but much more final. Instead of

going on to another school and having similar schedules of breaks and summers as we all did when graduating high school, graduating college put us all in very different fields, paths and locations.

The choices were start working or continue on to grad school. I was eager to work, I wanted to be on my own and out in the world, and maybe grad school would come later when I knew what I wanted to get a master's degree in. I had friends who pursued their education and went on to grad school, both nearby and some far away. Their continuation of all-night study sessions in the library and sitting in lecture halls I did not envy, but their educational drive I did.

I was lucky to get a job for the summer with a great group of people at Verizon Wireless. Yet I kept looking through the classifieds to find a writing job, and after a few months found one and I left my first job out of school for my first real job with a salary and benefits. I entered the world of journalism and met another group of unique individuals who can make me laugh just by entering the room. These people become your family in a way, stepping in where college friends had been, not as a replacement but as the new group interact with daily.

My first week on the job introduced me to a reporter with a food obsession, and another reporter who had an object he needed to twirl between his forefinger and thumb at all times. After getting comfortable

It finally hits you that you really are in the "real" world when your friends who are still in college talk about spring break and summer vacation.

The stress of a deadline melts into the stress of production days, where the final editing of a police blotter can be bloodier from the red pen than the actual content. The sinking feeling when your editor calls you over for a question is not quite the same as being handed a paper from a teacher after it has been graded.

following my graduation, it is amazing how much has actually happened in what seems like such a short period of time. I started watching the news out of interest, know how local towns get things done through planning and other board meetings, and I have almost perfected my phone etiquette.

Our income is set in stone. We receive no COLAs, no state aid, no federal grants. We must live on what we have now. 

# Town opens formal grievance period

Turnout was light the first morning that Bethlehem's board of assessment review held formal grievance meetings at the town hall auditorium on Delaware Avenue.

"I was expecting a line out the door," said Supervisor Theresa Egan on the morning of May 23. "But when I got here at 7:20 a. m. there were 10 people. We were prepared for quite a few more." Egan added.

Egan believes people who took part in the informal hearing process in March might have had many of their questions answered.

"I think the assessor's office did a phenomenal job going through the informal hearings, where over 1,900 took part in that process, Egan said.

The town is able to supply residents with a wealth of information to go with the grievance process.

No hearings are held by appointment. A numbered ticket is handed to petitioners when they are present, along with their grievance packet if have previously they

assessor's office. If you are submitting your information for the first time on the day of the hearing, it should be signed in by a member of the assessor's office staff.

Every property owner appearing at a hearing must have his or her completed documents ready submission to the BAR. Each new hearing session begins when the next number is called. Every applicant receives five minutes with the BAR to address concerns.

The BAR members are very knowledgeable," said Town Assessor David Leafer. "All three members have mortgage and real estate backgrounds and are very experienced." Leafer said many town residents took part in the informal hearing

"In seven weeks, 1,936 people participated in informal hearings and 60 percent of those received direct adjustments," said

As of Thursday, May 25, over 630 people had filed formal grievance applications and 250 had been reviewed.

"Doors have opened at 7 a.m. and people who have shown up have been able to get through," Leafer said. The deadline for filing a formal grievance with the town of Bethlehem has been extended to June 2. The BAR will hear more formal grievances on Wednesday, May 31, and Friday, June 2.

"It's been a long process and a tiring one but a smooth one," Leafer said. Staff has been working long hours for







proposed teachers at the high school, three new middle school teachers, one custodian, a technology specialist and the elimination of ice hockey, gymnastics, all field trips and six new extracurricular clubs.

Superintendent Les Loomis, assistant superintendents Michael Tebbano and Steve O'Shea. and Director of Pupil Personnel Services Rita Levay have voluntarily foregone their salary increases for the coming year.

"This district is lean," said Loomis. "It is not as though anyone is getting rich working in the Bethlehem school district."

The high school and middle school hold close to 3,000 students between them, and are led by just a principal and assistant principal in each building.

Many parents and teachers present at last Wednesday's meeting said the district should go back and vote on the same, defeated, budget that called for a 5.45 percent tax increase. They thought this time would get out the "yes" vote.

"I am here to urge you, to plead you, to go for a revote," said Angie Randles, Slingerlands Elementary School PTA copresident. "I am just not ready to give up, and I don't think the community is ready to give up."

"We will go and get the vote out," urged parent Lisa Allendorf, but not everybody in the crowd was ready to stand up and put the same budget back to voters.

"I really don't think you can send this same budget back for a revote without making some cuts," said resident Tom Brady.

"It's time to get back to the

basics, reading, writing, and arithmetic," said Norm Moran. "Stop offering a panacea of all kinds of subjects and teach what children need to further their education."

Board member Stuart Lyman said the community spoke clearly, and it is his belief they want a contingency budget to be presented on June 20.

"People who have voted 'yes' in the past have changed their minds dramatically," said Lyman. "I don't think you can change 300 or 600 people in three weeks.'

"Why don't we cut salaries of administration and clerical?" asked parent Pamela Dutcher. "Why do we go for the jugular instead and cut, music, art, teachers?'

Past board president and current board member Robin Storey said the board, the students and the staff should have seen this

"No matter what, we are going to educate our children," said Storey. "Bethlehem Central will survive this somehow.

Should the June 20 budget be defeated, the district would then have to go to a contingency budget, which means the district would have to cut another \$598,000 from its original proposal.

Under the new proposal, taxes would go up about \$122 on a house assessed at \$200,000. The original increase was \$178.

"In making these painful reductions, every member of the board spoke of their respect and appreciation for the commitment and performance of the BC staff in delivering an outstanding educational program for a reasonable expenditure," Loomis said.

# **Bethlehem residents** approve library budget

By JIM CUOZZO

Although Bethlehem residents voted down both the district budget and the bus proposition on May 16, they approved the library budget. The Bethlehem Public Library Budget passed 2603-

"The community has shown their support for the library year after year," said Library Director Nancy L. Pieri. "We are very grateful and very appreciative of their support." Pieri said this year's library budget vote was not as close as those of years past.

The approved library budget totals \$3.85 million, an increase of 3.24 percent over the current year's budget. Salaries and benefits make up \$2.59 million, a \$140,000 increase over this year's budget, with another \$300,000 for library materials. Gas and electric costs went up \$27,000 to \$115,000.

If the library budget were defeated like the school district's budget was last week, Piero said they would go to a contingency budget that would have resulted in reductions across the board.

"We would have reverted to last year's budget and that would have meant cuts," Pieri said.

Bethlehem's library is accessible to disabled patrons. It offers a community room, separate meeting rooms and public access TV programming for the community. It has community partnerships with several different organizations and has a program delivery service for residents with medical conditions who cannot visit the

"We are a very busy library all the time," said Pieri. "About 25,000 to 30,000 people on average come through our doors in a month."

Bethlehem's library offers programs for both seniors and adults, along with a number of children's programs including a new story hour in Clarksville. Another spring and summer project for the library includes the demolition of two houses along Borthwick Street.

The extra space will be used as a part of the library grounds for green space," Pieri said.

Tamra White and John Sobiecki were elected to new terms on the library board of trustees. White will serve a full term, while Sobiecki will serve a partial term.

June activities at the library includes the Delmar Writers Group meeting on June 9, and a Veterans Oral History project throughout the month. It finally feels like spring, and if that's giving you a hankering to get outside, The Mohawk-Hudson Land Conservancy has just the

ticket for you this weekend. This Sunday, June 4, is Bethlehem Family Day in the town of Bethlehem. Volunteers will be stationed at three of the conservancy's preserves in the town of Bethlehem, offering information about trails and refreshments to keep you going.

"We're hoping that people will come out and be aware of the preserves," the conservancy's Executive Director Jill Knapp said. "Most of the trails are easy, and we hope to have them all marked by the family day. They're really pretty properties, and they're close, so you save gas getting to them. We do allow pets, too.'

While the conservancy has 13 preserves throughout the Capital District with a total of 854 acres. Sunday will focus on three Bethlehem preserves, all accessed from Route 443, Delaware Avenue, one of Bethlehem's thoroughfares.

The preserves are the Phillipinkill, the Swift, and the Normanskill. The Phillipinkill and the Normanskill preserves are near the streams that give them their names.







"It was unbelievable," said Niskayuna boys lacrosse coach Mike Vorgang, one of several Cortland alumni now guiding Section II programs. "At first, I watched it as a lacrosse fan, but as the game remained close, the juices started flowing again.'

Vorgang is also part of a smaller local Cortland fraternity - Section II coaches who used to play lacrosse for the Red Drag-

ons. He - along with Bethlehem's Dave Rounds and Schenectady's Dave Trahan - are part of a proud past at Cortland that includes several Final Four appearances and an NCAA Division II title in 1975.

"Lacrosse was a little bit different back then," said Vorgang, who played at Cortland in the early 1990s. "We played a lot of Division 1 schools ... because there weren't as many teams."

Cortland's victory was significant on two fronts. Not only did the Red Dragons end a 31-year championship drought, but they also ended Salisbury's 69-game winning streak — the longest for any lacrosse team in NCAA history.

# Slow: danger ahead

Too much information on the Internet can lead to danger

MySpace, Friendster, Facebook, and AIM are great ways to update family and friends about what's going on in your life, but it can be important to limit the type of information that goes on these Web sites.

The online communities mentioned above give members a chance to define themselves, but the freedom to do so does not come with impunity. The consequences for posting inan-propriate material on the Internet can be as mild

as embarrassment, or it can create a legal liability. The worst case involves posting information that places people in

Even adults sometimes relax their vigilance and place personal information online that can have unpleasant consequences. Children often have difficulty understanding how dangerous it can be to reveal too much personal information about themselves, and parents are constantly warned to monitor their children's Internet activity to protect them.

"Ask your child to show you their site and you will be surprised that they do have one," said the University at Albany's Information Security

Officer Martin Manjak. "Try to engage in a conversation with vour child about what it means to have everyone in the world reading about you."

Parents may be shocked by some of the photos or language that their children have on the pages they post through online communities. Also of concern is the information that children



# Students get vivid lesson on drinking and driving

Gowns. tuxedos limousines are what most students think about when they plan for their proms. Last Friday, the Bethlehem police department put another thought into the minds of juniors and seniors: the potentially fatal results of drinking and driving.

Using two wrecked vehicles donated by Roberts Towing, student actors, and about 30 volunteers from the police department, the Delmar Rescue Squad, the Delmar Fire Department, Slingerlands Heavy Rescue and Applebee Funeral Home staged a re-enactment of an hour that would follow a fatal accident.

BC seniors Andrew Smith and Jacqueline Rosenthal, in dressy clothes and smeared with fake blood, played the students; Eric Kerr played the drunk driver who hit them. Bethlehem Sgt. Craig Sleurs narrated the incident in the parking lot on Van Dyke Road as

students in T-shirts, flip flops, and toting back-straining backpacks squinted into the sun.

After Sleurs welcomed the students. Messina's son Matthew

"You would have liked Matthew," Messina said. "He would have been 27 now. Think about what you love most, and think what it would be like to lose it because somebody got behind the wheel of a car when they were drunk. If you or a loved one is killed by a drunk driver, life changes, and it won't ever change back. Have the courage to not drive if you're drunk. Have the courage to not get into a car with somebody who is

After Messina spoke, Sleurs began the re-enactment, telling students that an accident had been reported. In the first real warmth of spring, the students chatted with each other until the sounds of a siren could be heard. In one car. Rosenthal screamed at Smith. "Andrew! Andrew!" as Smith lay inert against his headrest. Kerr stepped out of his car and wove between his and the students.

Two police cars arrived, and one policeman administered field sobriety tests to Kerr's character, and another talked with Rosenthal. Rescue trucks were next on the scene, and the fire department assessed and secured the vehicles. Police officers used pepper spray "and some force," Sleurs narrated, to subdue Kerr's character.

One assessment came quickly from the rescue squad. "Don't worry about the driver, he's dead," a paramedic announced. Volunteers put a yellow sheet over Smith, and rescue workers smashed in car windows to get to him and Rosenthal.

"At the discretion of emergency workers, the body can be taken to a funeral home or the hospital," Sleurs narrated as a hearse from Applebee's funeral home arrived. "Unfortunately, sometimes family members arrive too soon."

Lorraine Boyle of the high school played Smith's mother, screaming and practically collapsing over Smith, wrapped in a body bag and left on the parking lot ground, and eventually being led away by rescue workers as Peter Applebee oversaw Smith's conveyance into the hearse.

Heavy rescue removed the roof of the students' car and Rosenthal went into an ambulance. Students applauded as the ambulance pulled away, and cheered even more loudly as Smith returned under his own steam to the parking lot.

"This works better than telling the students the results of drunk driving in a lecture hall,' Bethlehem Lt. Thomas Heffernan said. The program is offered to juniors and seniors every two years. In Bethlehem, the junior prom has passed, but the senior ball is coming up.

Some of the students agreed with Heffernan about the effect of seeing a re-enactment. "It's better to see it played out than just listen," said senior Caitlyn Edmundson.

"It showed the bad effects," said senior Laura Marmulstein. "Drinking and driving is just stupid. Some kids say they will do it, so I just say that I'll drive." "It kind of freaks you out to see how long it takes rescue workers to get there," said senior Brian Storey.

"It was an interesting way to show it," senior John O'Brien-Carelli said.
