clerical staffFailed budget forces
restructuring of staff
to compensate

Everyone is sharing the pain of having \$802,000 cut from the defeated 2006-2007 Bethlehem School budget. Voters rejected the first \$73.3 million plan and a second vote with reductions is scheduled for June 20.

Secretarial staff in Central Office Administration has been diminished by one position and a restructuring and consolidation of

three positions will become two. Two new positions being proposed include a human resource and an accountant positions. The payroll and treasurers positions in the business office will be eliminated if the new budget is approved, along with a secretary's position in the director of education programs office.

"What we are trying to do with these clerical reductions is to be able to function at least as well as we did," said Superintendent Les Loomis.

Change of venue
still pending

Jury selection begins this week in the murder trial of 22-year-old Christopher Porco.

Porco is accused of killing his father Peter Porco at his Brockley Drive home with an ax in the early morning hours of Nov. 15, 2004. Peter Porco was found lying dead on the inside front stairs of the home.

His mother Joan Porco was found by Bethlehem Police lying in a pool of blood on her bed with the ax handle used to murder her husband sticking out of the bed comforter.

Defense Attorney Terrence Kindlon said in most murder trials jury selection would take no longer than one to three days. In the Porco murder trial, Judge Jeffrey Berry of Orange County is allotting up to 10 days for a jury to be selected. Jury selection begins Thursday, June 15, and could last until June 26.

Kindlon believes it will be next to impossible to find a jury in Albany County who does not have an opinion or who hasn't been 'tainted' by all the media attention surrounding the murder. With

Self-funded
sportsBooster clubs aim
to reinstate programs
cut from budget

A flurry of mail, e-mails and phone calls from sports boosters and school athletes along with a packed meeting of the Bethlehem school board has prompted the board to allow three sports programs to be self-funded in the 2006-2007 school budget.

Varsity hockey, gymnastics and cheerleading, cut last month by the school board after the first district budget vote in 22 years failed, will be reinstated under the proviso that the school boosters come up with the \$52,000 total to fund all three programs next year.

"I am deeply disappointed hockey was cut from the budget," said Maggie Royle, president of the Bethlehem Hockey Booster Club. "Hockey parents are passionate people, and I ask you to allow us to self-fund the program this year so kids in our district can play hockey with Bethlehem varsity jerseys," said Royle. Mike Hynes who has three children active in district athletics also advocated for self-funding sports the board eliminated.

"Their sole objective is not to score another goal, but to represent this school, this town, this community, like other athletes at

Two charged in robbery attempt at Glenmont Wal-Mart store

Bethlehem Police arrested two Albany residents following a robbery inside the Glenmont Wal-Mart store Monday, June 5. Police were called to the scene after receiving a call that a robbery was in progress. When they arrived, officers

observed one suspect leaving the store on foot with items, and the second suspect trying to drive away in a vehicle. Christopher J. Bowen, of 274 Livingston Ave., Albany, was charged with felony grand larceny and conspiracy. Inside the vehicle

he was driving were two television sets stolen from the store, police said. The second suspect, Lowell McGill, 37, of 107, 4th Ave., Albany was turned over to Albany police on a bench warrant.

Other arrests

Shane Edward Gorman, 2 Belmont Place, Wynantskill, was charged with DWI, driving with more than .08 percent blood alcohol content and operating with a suspended license, a felony. Bethlehem police received a call that a man was asleep in a vehicle off of River Road, in Glenmont, Saturday,

June 10. When officers arrived they found Gorman asleep and tried to wake him. He was still inside the vehicle that was parked off the road and on the grass. When Gorman awoke police had him take three different field sobriety tests which Gorman failed. He was subsequently charged and will appear in Town Court at a later date.

• Georgetta Michelle Jackson-Wilmot, 43, of 126 Ida Yarbrough,

Albany was charged with felony grand larceny and forgery. Wilmot was contacted by police after a victim reported having a wallet and credit card stolen from a company vehicle at the Glenmont Job Corps. Wilmot voluntarily came to the Bethlehem Police Station after being contacted and was charged. She will appear in Town Court at a later date to respond to the charges.

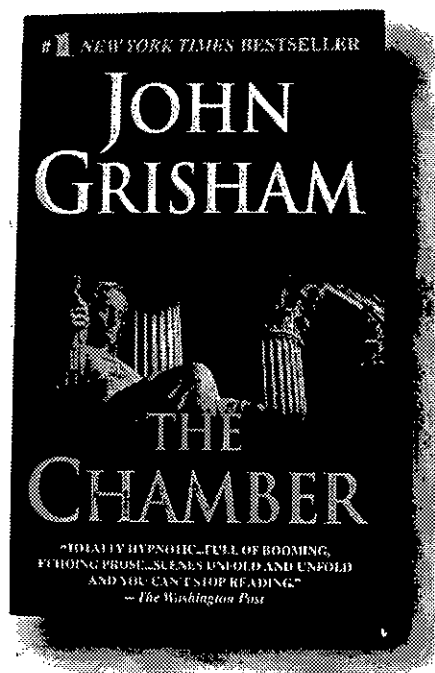

Resident to host assessment 'tea party'

A town of Bethlehem resident is asking his fellow citizens to revolt and protest over the town's new assessments by holding a Bethlehem Tea Party similar to the Boston Tea Party at the town board meeting set for tonight, June 14.

"Remember when our forefathers threw a 'party' for our former British masters for the levy imposed on tea imports?" asked Brendan Mooney of 38 Ten Eyck Ave. in Selkirk. "On June 14, bring your tea bags and your opinions and speak loudly and clearly on how this new tax

(reassessment) will affect you."

Mooney is asking residents to speak out at the public comment period of the next town board meeting and he will be distributing fliers around town reminding people to attend.

"I think it is important for the town to hear loud and clear the excessiveness of these increases," said Mooney.

After downsizing and moving to south Bethlehem, Mooney said his house was reassessed shortly after purchasing it for close to three times its market value.

"My tax rate jumped between 200 and 300 percent," Mooney said. His new home, which he paid

\$240,000 for, was once on the market for \$75,000 and reassessed at \$252,000 this past year.

"My wife and I both retired, downsized and got what we hoped was a house for less money and the tax man follows us all the way out here," Mooney said.

Like over 700 other town residents, Mooney has formally grieved his reassessment and has hired a lawyer because he does not

believe the town will change the new reassessment on his home.

"This assessment is way overboard, way out of whack and

we are getting nothing for it," Mooney said. "It's a pure pillaging of people here in this town."

Town Supervisor Theresa Egan said the

reassessments are not about taxation but about valuation. Several town residents filed a freedom of information law

requesting to see the new assessments of the supervisor, the town assessor and the members of the town board. "My taxes went up almost \$2,500 from the reassessments," Egan said.

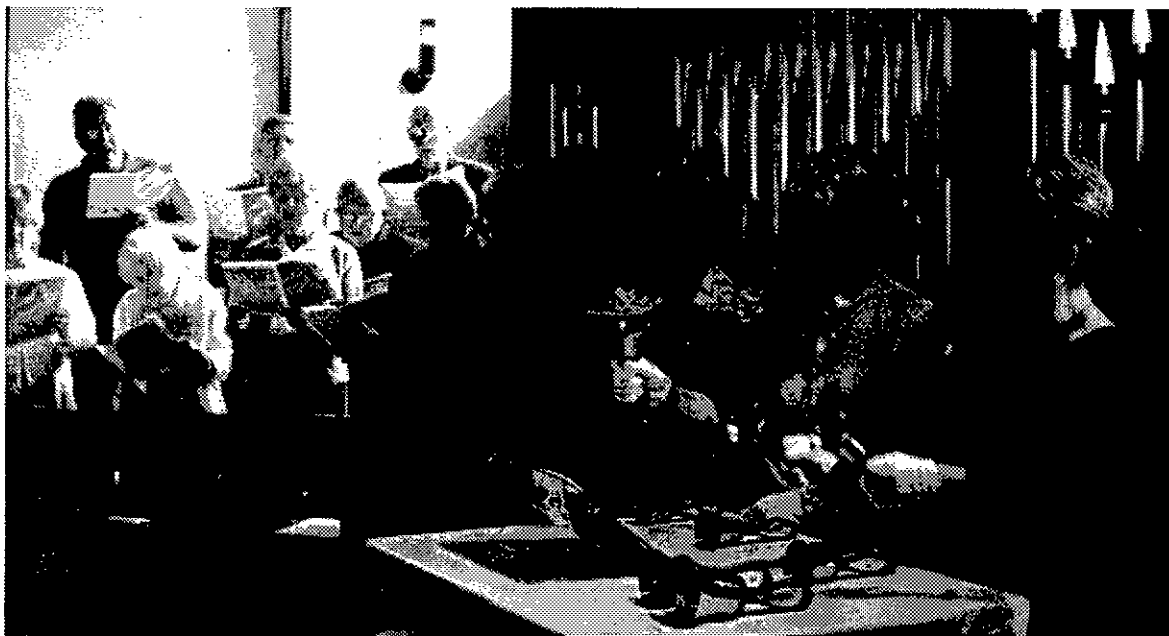
The Boston Tea Party symbolically represents how Mooney feels about the issue.

"I want the town board to either repeal, amend, or otherwise diminish the impact of this new levy on the citizens of Bethlehem," Mooney said.

When asked if he will be wearing a revolutionary outfit, Mooney said, "I only have a Scottish outfit."

Presbyterians to celebrate 50th

Summer, fall events to mark church's golden anniversary

Delmar Presbyterian Church is celebrating the 50th anniversary of the church that was formed on Nov. 18, 1956, with 76 charter members. In those 50 years, the mission has remained constant.

"Mission is the purpose of our church," reads the mission statement. "It is accomplished by loving witness to Christ wherever we are in our everyday lives, and by extending our commitment, through the church, in obedience to Christ, to our neighbors throughout the world."

From the founding pastor, the Rev. George H. Phelps, to current pastor the Rev. Larry Deyss who has been with Delmar Presbyterian over 25 years, every Sunday worship begins with the repetition of the two great commandments, "To love the Lord your God and to love your

neighbor as yourself."

"Our sanctuary is modern and informal and lends itself well to a sense of community," said Deyss.

Through the years, Delmar Presbyterian has helped the hungry and the homeless with donations to The Food Pantry out of First Church-Reformed in Albany. "Bread for the World" is another cause on a more global level the church supports to reduce hunger in the nation and world.

The church facility at 585 Delaware Ave. has expanded to meet the ever-growing and changing needs of today's congregation in this busy world. The church is now equipped with space for religious education and fellowship, a library, expanded kitchen and improved facilities for the handicapped. The fellowship hall was a part of the 3,000 square-foot addition built in the mid 1990s.

"I have seen the community grow and with that stress levels are higher for families," said Deyss. "We try to be a place to give and support individuals and families, so people receive strength and in turn so they can give."

Nancy Winn has been a member of the church since it was founded in 1956. Now 90 years old, Winn said she and her husband have enjoyed every moment of being parishioners.

"It certainly has been a family to me and my husband for all these years," said Winn. "They are the kind of people who are there, that you can enjoy, and will help when you need them."

About 200 members are the core of the church congregation, but each one is quite active.

"Everybody works here, we are a working congregation," Deyss said.

A strong sense of community has kept the church foundation steadfast.

"We sit back from the road, not terribly visible, we don't look like your traditional church with a steeple, but when people come they are very pleased with what they find," said Deyss.

Parishioners who leave the area and attend Sunday worship elsewhere still maintain their close ties to the community and to Delmar Presbyterian.

"People who go away still send us a gift because they still feel a sense of connection here," said Deyss. "We are a small church, but we more or less respond to one another."

Attendance went up at the church after the Sept. 11 attacks, and has remained high since then.

"People are looking for faith, which they can strengthen their lives, and we must not be undone by the things that happen in the world," said Deyss.

The church will be holding 50th anniversary events throughout the summer and fall at the church. On Nov. 18, there will be a dinner at Normanside Country Club. "This is a congregation with staying power," said Deyss. "We are very strong, committed people." Services are at 10 a.m. Sundays, and childcare is available.

GE volunteers bring good things to light

Twenty thousand General Electric volunteers on five different continents, including 180 volunteers from GE-Plastics Selkirk Plant, spent June 7, leaving the workplace and venturing out into their communities to participate in GE Global Community Days.

"We have about 22 employee volunteers clearing the trail, trimming, grooming and spreading wood chips to make a nice path," said Haskell. The trail will also have several picnic tables and the creation of several elements for a challenge course for kids using the YMCA's summer camp.

"Our summer camp lasts nine weeks and 100 kids weekly have already signed up to participate," said Matt Crudo, YMCA membership director. "This is the second year GE has come out on Global Community Day to help us with our summer camp, and all the work volunteers provide is greatly appreciated," said Crudo. "We like to have our kids outside as much as possible."

Other GE Global Community Day projects in Bethlehem include

refurbishing a nature trail at Five Rivers Environmental Education Center, landscape work at the Good Samaritan Lutheran Center in Delmar, and work at Bethlehem Soccerplex in Glenmont.

Another group of volunteers traveled to Ravena Coeymans Middle School and the Coeymans Elementary School to work on nature trails, create learning pods and other work for the "School Yard Habitat."

Spring rains started to fall again while many Bethlehem area projects were under way, but it didn't dampen the spirits of the GE volunteers participating.

"It's been nice working with everybody," said Haskell.

Hungary, Japan, and India are just some of the countries that GE workers participate in with Global Community Days. Projects worldwide range from free medical check-ups for senior citizens to building an orphanage for disabled children.

"These Global Community Days are a unified effort to demonstrate our commitment to volunteerism," said GE vice president of corporate citizenship Bob Corcoran. Nine different service projects were coordinated this year by GE Selkirk employees. Take me out to the ball game.
Take me out to the crowds.

Oh wait, it's raining, again. The game has been cancelled, again.

The first practice had been cancelled due to rain, but that was in April and everybody knows about April showers. But May showers? And June showers?

Enough already!

OK, I have to admit I didn't mope at the news of some of the rained-out games. But that was only because the cancellations removed the pressure from having to rush from one activity to another.

But after a while there were only cancellations and no games. And even the make-up games were rained out.

Then I started getting bummed. Thing is, my daughter Rachel was enjoying her first season playing softball. And, to my pleasant surprise, I was enjoying going to the games.

In fact, I view the time spent at the ball field as "relaxation with permission" time. You can't easily justify sitting in a lawn chair in your backyard for two hours on a Monday evening, but if you are at your child's ball game it's OK to just hang out.

Are there lots of other tasks that could be accomplished during those hours? Of course!

But at the ball games you can visit with other adults, you can

watch children learning and honing a skill, you can cheer and you can laugh. And you don't have to worry about cooking dinner if there's a concession stand!

Your kid needs to keep her eye on the ball. You need to keep your eye on your kid.

During the first game of the season I was standing behind the bleachers visiting with friends whose daughter was on the opposing team. I kept one eye on my daughter, straight across the field playing third base, so I had the perfect view when she caught a pop fly. A look of amazement and satisfaction spread across 9-year-old Rachel's face.

Meanwhile, I was jumping up and down, clapping my hands over my head. Then I noticed the people around me were cheering, yet I was standing among the families of the opposing team. For a second I thought maybe I'd gotten confused and we hadn't gotten anybody out. But then I realized the parents were cheering for the good play, because that's what these parents do. That's the kind of good sportsmanship the league seeks to promote.

Of course there is a degree of

competition and the girls are encouraged to "play to win," but in my daughter's age group, the pervasive spirit is one of learning and having fun.

The kids literally cheer each other on. When their team is up they chant to the batter: "We want a single, just a little single. S-I-N-G-L-E. Single, single, single! We want a double, just a little double. D-O-U-B-L-E. Double, Double, Double!" and so on.

The coaches rotate the players through the different field positions, allowing the girls to learn the game from the various vantage points. I felt nervous watching my daughter cover first base. My nerves turned to pride as she not only caught the ball thrown by the pitcher, but also remembered to tag the base with her foot.

I'm learning a lot about playing ball. For example, I never knew that you are considered safe at first even if you momentarily run past the base. Or that sometimes you can steal a base and sometimes you can't. Or that in certain instances you need to tag the player, but other times just catching the ball and tagging the base with your foot is sufficient.

I can't keep all that stuff straight, but it sure looks like fun.

So one weekend afternoon, when my husband was preparing to do yard work, I told him I wanted a turn at bat. Rachel was at a friend's house, so Jeff and I went over to the elementary school and he pitched to me. We

stood on the driest area of grass available, since there were puddles in the bases of the ball field diamond.

Jeff showed me how to hold the bat and line up my knuckles. It felt weird, but he convinced me it was necessary. He had picked up tips from Rachel's Uncle Dave,

bat, and follow through after you swing.

"Just pitch," I finally yelled, "I'm just trying to have fun. I'm not joining a league."

There's a great sense of triumph when the bat makes contact with the ball. You hear the sound, you see the ball fly away, and you think to yourself: Yessss!

I remember Rachel's first hit. She didn't make a single, because the pitcher got to the ball and threw it to first base before she got there. But she still derived satisfaction from just hitting the ball. It was a success in

its own right. A wide smile spread across her face. I understood how she felt.

The day Jeff pitched to me he eventually asked for a turn at bat. I relented but I didn't last long as the pitcher/outfielder. I wasn't too keen about trekking out into the muddy field to retrieve the balls that he hit way far out. Plus, my pitching skills are severely lacking, dangerous even, and he spent a lot of time jumping out of the way (I was not trying to hit him, honest.)

In the weeks that followed, it was just rain, rain and more rain. There was thunder and lightning and rain. There was also some sun, but never enough to allow the fields to drain and dry. The team coaches and managers even tried in vain to sweep water off the fields in order to make them usable.

If a non-athlete like me felt disappointed at the washed-out softball season, I imagine the coaches, and certainly the players, took it even harder. Kids playing soccer and Little League baseball faced similar situations.

So next season, "Take me out to the ball game" will need some new verses. We'll need to sing: "For it's root, root, root for some sunshine. If the kids can't play, it's a pain. For it's one, two, three strikes you're out if the fields don't drain!"

who coaches a high school team.

I'm a lefty and I tend to hit the ball directly to the first base. As Jeff got ready to pitch, I told him it seemed like I would be aiming right toward a puddle-filled area in the adjacent ball field. He told me not to worry about it. Clearly he didn't think I'd be able to hit the ball very far.

I surprised both of us as I hit ball after ball and he went running out to retrieve them into the muddy areas of the field, beyond the nearby puddles. Granted, he is an excellent pitcher, and he threw me nice, slow underhand pitches.

At one point my husband turned into a coach, offering various pointers. There was too much to remember: keep your knuckles in a row, line up with the pitcher, keep a firm grip on the bat, don't choke up too far on the

Hammering fraud

Summer time and the livin' is supposed to be easy.

But after you've called a dozen or so contractors with no luck on that bathroom, kitchen or other home renovation project, you're finding things aren't as easy as they are supposed to be.

Some contractors you've called are too busy, some don't work in your area and others could only schedule a job months in advance.

Neighbors, friends and even relatives are reluctant to give you a name because of their own horror stories.

This week, a press release from the state Attorney General's office cited a probe into unscrupulous home improvement contractors. Unfortunately, many people have found out the hard way. Some find themselves out of a considerable amount of cash with little or no work completed to show for it, and your "contractor" no longer answers his phone.

The Attorney General's office is currently investigating a number of complaints about home improvement fraud. If you believe you have a claim, call the consumer help line at 800-7755.

Chances are, though, you have likely been the cause of the conniving contractor's scheme.

Did you require references? Did you check the references? Insist on a contract? Get several estimates? If you answered no to any or all of these questions, your goose is cooked.

Sadly, we're prone to be too trusting to someone who has a glib line and smooth delivery. It's not just the older or naïve folks who get scammed; we're all vulnerable.

All homeowners should be on alert and here are some tips from the AG's office to consider before hiring a contractor:

- Never agree to have work done on the spot or by anyone going door-to-door.
- Shop around. Get at least three estimates that include specific information about the project.
- Never pay the full price up front.
- You have three full days to cancel after signing a home improvement contract, but all cancellations must be in writing.

It's heartbreaking to think your long-awaited home project could be spoiled by an unscrupulous contractor, but it's a fact that they are out there, and that many take the money and run.

Don't be a victim; follow the simple precautions recommended by the AG's office, and chances are you won't be bilked of your hard-earned cash.

I am greeted with "Where is my glove?" from 11-year-old J.W., and the sight of 6-year-old Joseph who clearly had found the largest, deepest pool of mud on the planet just 15 minutes earlier.

Julie greets me in the kitchen and rips off three commands.

"You have five minutes, get the water bottles and watch out for the pile of mud in the hall."

We are going to make it, at all costs.

Ward Cleaver never had it so good.

As the McIntyres strive to make life more like the '50s, the realities of modern living produce plenty of roadblocks.

Many of the roles played by the parents of earlier generations no longer apply in 2006. Fathers provide childcare, cook, and clean (although not well enough) as mothers work full-time, do the taxes and mow the lawn. This shift is not always a bad thing. It provides role models to our children that both men and women can perform the tasks, but we must also teach our children that these things have consequences.

For example, we do not believe that anyone can do anything that they want or can be anything they want to be without making sacrifices. This is the part that the big, purple PBS freak leaves out of his songs.

It is great to encourage our children to be the best they can be, but we must also teach them that the baggage may be heavy if you want to be on top. It is impossible to be the head of a multi-national company, keep a country club membership, hit all the PTA events, be a homeroom parent and still be on top of that elusive baseball glove on game night.

As parents, Julie and I have found that parenting is a full-time job and we cannot do everything, much as we might

Tearing from one event to another did not instill in the boys that any one event was very important, and it almost killed Julie and me.

This season it is hard enough with two in baseball at the same time.

Over the past 50 years, parents have wanted to do more for their children than their parents did for them. There is a point, though, where more is not always better. The question I ask is: "Was my life that bad without all this stuff?"

As a father, I force my boys to cut wood with me, come to the hardware store with me, help me cut the grass, make a family dinner together, go to baseball games, and, most important, to stay at home to play in the mud. I want them to see that my choices include them and a dad is more than just a ride to the next activity.

I acknowledge that we are very fortunate to have choices that many families do not because of financial restraints, structure or simply lack of time.

Modern fatherhood is evolving as motherhood has. We are doing things that our fathers would cringe at, and giving up things they would not or could not. It is a great time to be involved with your children, and nothing is more rewarding.

Making the best choices for your children is not always the most popular or politically correct thing to do. Those choices may make your children think that they are different from everyone else.

But isn't that the point?

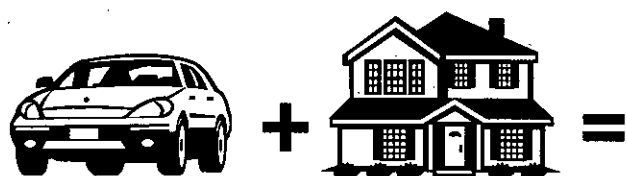

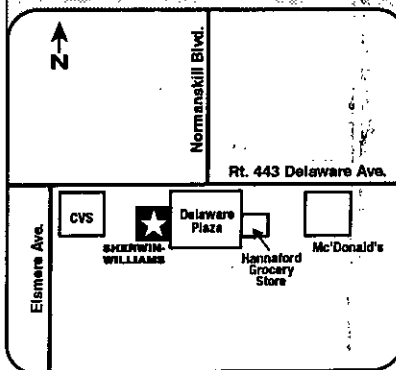

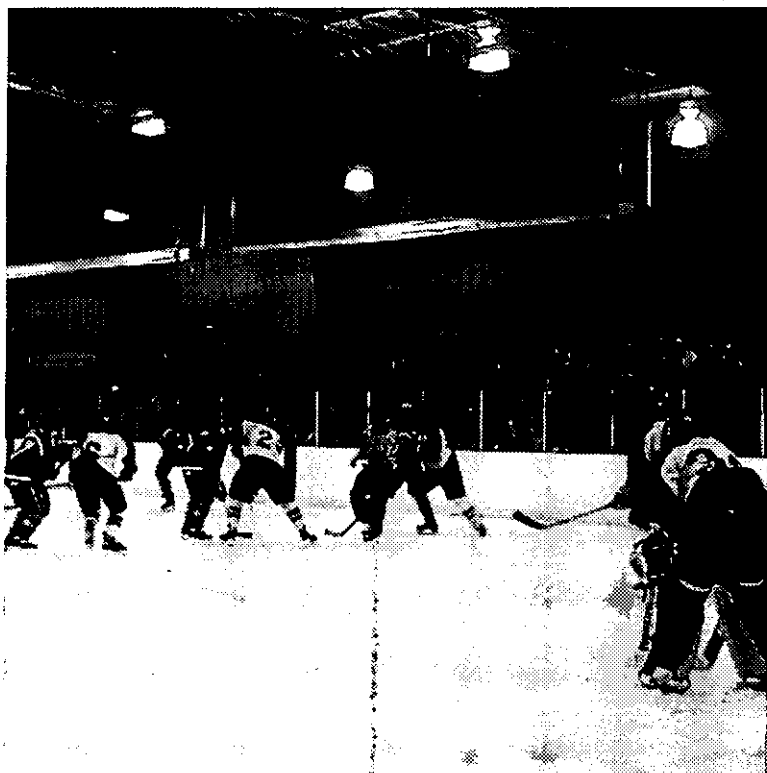

Bethlehem Central," said Hynes.

Gymnastics and cheerleading had their say too. "I speak as the father of three girls with one on the gymnastics team," said Jay Smith. "We remind you to keep us in your deliberations because we feel we can raise the money to cover expenses in the district," said Smith.

Over \$800,000 was cut from the failed \$73.3 million district budget whittling the tax increase from 5.45 percent to 3.75% for the second budget vote on June 20. "This \$800,000 reduction has affected every student in the district, over 5,000 students," said Superintendent Les Loomis.

Many parents complained that certain sports programs are being singled out for cuts without the input of the community. "Why do we have to beg to self fund these three sports while other sports go funded," asked Michelle Andriano, high school cheerleading coach.

"In better times, there would have been more opportunity for input," said board president Richard Svenson. "We're getting to the point now where our first budget was defeated, and we quickly need a revote," said Svenson.

Several board members questioned the legality of self-funded district sports and the liability involved for the district. "In the past, the district pays the funds, we bill the booster clubs, and they pay the cost for the rest of the season," said high school principal Chuck Abba.

Coaches of all three sports also said they would coach without taking a stipend for the work involved. "I would not want to have coaches work for free," Loomis said. The board unanimously agreed to self-fund the three sports but not without doubt.

"I have severe reservations about self funding," said board member James Lytle. "I am uncomfortable asking the community to fundraise for certain sports." Lynne Lenhardt recently re-elected to the board

A high school switchboard operator has been transferred to the Student pupil personnel office and a middle school telephone operator's position was cut. The district will now go to an automated attendant at the central office, high school and middle school.

Administrators opted against taking any pay raises in the coming year. That includes Superintendent of Schools Les Loomis; Rita Levay, director of pupil personnel; Michael Tebbano, assistant superintendent, and head of instructional programs, and Steve O'Shea, assistant superintendent in the finance office.

"Administration and others in the central office felt we should take the lead and show our

for a new three-year term along with Lytle also expressed uncertainty about the inequities of self-funding. "I am willing to do this for a year to save the program," said Lenhardt.

The first failed budget vote is causing other side issues in the district. The school bus proposition that also failed in May will not be brought back up for a vote. Central administration clerical staff has been cut back, and restructures due to the budget defeat.

"If a re-vote fails, a second defeat forces us into a contingency budget and for us means another \$590,000 in cuts and a tax rate reduction to 2.4 percent said Loomis. "If it goes down a second time it sends a very discouraging message," Loomis added.

The school district administrators also decided not to ask for raises in the coming school year. The second school district budget vote will be held June 20, from 7 a.m. to 9p.m. at the middle school.

"We are all going to wait and see what the community has to

concern over the budget defeat and do our part in keeping the budget reasonable," said Loomis.

One proposed high school teacher, one elementary teacher and 1.45 middle school teachers proposed for grades six through eight is eliminated. Sports booster clubs in the district will fund varsity hockey, cheerleading and gymnastics at a \$52,000 savings to the district. Chaperones have been reduced and six new extracurricular clubs will be cut.

"I think this community expects us to do everything possible to deliver high quality education but with a substantial cost avoidance," said Loomis.

Richard J. Harte is a Bethlehem School District resident who will be voting 'No' a second time around. "I am not opposed to funding education, but I do think budgets go overboard at times," said Harte. "Cut back on the perks," Harte added.

School board president Richard Svenson said taxpayers have been heard and changes have been made to the second proposed budget.

"We hope this data and analy-

sis will show the impact of these budget cuts," said Svenson. Loomis said people who support the district need to come out and be more active.

Even the town of Bethlehem will see a direct impact. The failed budget called for an increase of \$30,000 in the amount of funding the district pays for two school resource officers provided by the town through the Bethlehem Police Department. The district originally allocated \$30,000 annually for the SROs and increased that amount to \$60,000 for the new fiscal year. Since the first budget was defeated the board cut their total allocation at \$45,000 or a \$15,000 increase from the current year. These school resource officers provide a valuable service to the district and we know the Town is picking up a majority of the cost," said Svenson. A rally to support the new budget up for a vote on June 20, is scheduled to be held Thursday June 15, at 4:30 p.m. at the Four Corners in Delmar. Supporters will walk from the middle school to the Four Corners with signs asking the community to vote 'Yes' for the budget next week.

that in mind, Kindlon filed a motion last week to have the trial moved to another county. That motion is expected to be reviewed this week in the 2nd Judicial Department of the State Supreme Court Appellate Division in Brooklyn. Peter Porco worked as a law clerk for the 3rd Department of the Appellate Division. Kindlon believes the most logical place to change the venue for the Porco murder trial would be Orange County where Judge Berry lives. But Albany County District Attorney David Soares said there shouldn't be a problem finding a jury in Albany County that is not biased.

Meanwhile, Judge Jeffrey Berry has yet to rule on key pieces of evidence submitted during pre-trial hearings last month. That evidence includes a six and a half hour videotape of Bethlehem Police interrogating Christopher Porco inside the squad room of the department on Delaware Avenue, the night following the attacks. During that interview Porco's mother Joan was in critical condition at Albany Medical Center Hospital recovering from her wounds. John Polster, an attorney and family friend, was waiting in the hallway of the Bethlehem Police Department while Christopher Porco was being questioned. Polster said during pre-trial testimony he was acting as Christopher's

attorney at that time. Christopher Porco told police however Polster was just a friend of the family and not his attorney. Porco denied any involvement in the crime but refused to take a lie detector test when asked by police that evening.

Kindlon believes his client's rights were violated when Porco was not orally read his Miranda Rights, but instead initialed a statement prior to questioning that advised him of his rights.

Porco is currently out on bail and living with Elaine LaForte and her family in Glenmont. Porco is an employee of Bethlehem Veterinary Hospital owned by LaForte. Prosecutors believe Christopher Porco committed the crimes against his family because he was having financial problems while attending the University of Rochester where he dropped out in 2003 but re-enrolled in 2004. E-mails between Porco and his mother and father prior to the attacks show a very strained relationship. The e-mails made public in other media reports reveal that Christopher Porco was forging his father's name on loan documents and was delinquent on both his college tuition and car payments on his yellow Jeep Wrangler. It is the Jeep Wrangler that prosecutors believe Porco used to drive from the murder scene on Brockley Drive back to the University of Rochester undetected before police arrived on the crime scene the next morning. The Brockley Drive home was also the scene of two prior burglaries in 2002 and 2003, when computers, and other electronic equipment were stolen, but no arrests were made. After extensive legwork by police and prosecutors, they believe the items stolen from the prior burglaries on Brockley Drive were sold on e-bay, a large online, Internet auction house, and sold by Christopher Porco by using his e-bay online account. Although police took articles of clothing from Christopher Porco the night he was questioned along with fingerprinting him, there is little forensic evidence connecting Christopher Porco to the crime scene. The trial is expected to begin in a matter of weeks.

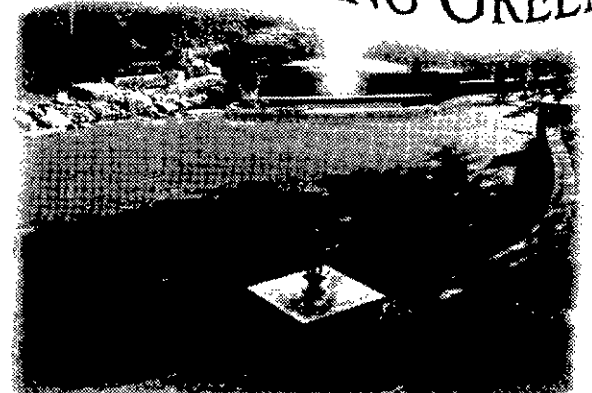

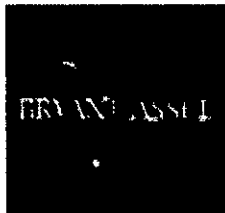

Voting 'no' does not mean lower taxes

Editor, The Spotlight:

I went to the school board meeting last week to hear the status of the school budget and what the impact of another defeat would be (leading to a state-mandated contingency budget). As Superintendent Les Loomis detailed the current cuts, as well as the potential ones, I was especially drawn to the chart that displayed the taxes for homeowners.

I know that many people have been affected by rising costs in nearly every area of our lives. I also know that many people are tying the rise in our assessments to the school vote. Several people feel that by defeating the budget, our taxes will decrease significantly, and vice versa, if the budget passes, our taxes will rise significantly.

I urge everyone to take a look at the actual figures. You can calculate your school taxes on the school's Web site: <http://bcsd.k12.ny.us>.

You will find that if you vote NO, your taxes rise approximately \$80-160 per year. A NO vote also leads to more cuts. I urge you to look at the list of cuts, and imagine all the people (mostly students) that are affected.

Several students spoke at the meeting, demonstrating the qualities that the district strives to nurture—respect, integrity, responsibility and civility, not to mention eloquence and passion.

If you vote YES, your taxes will rise approximately \$122-244 per year—\$10-\$20 dollars a month. The high end for homes is valued at more than

\$400,000. Again, I am under the impression that many people feel a NO vote will decrease their town taxes significantly.

Unfortunately, this is not the case. Our taxes are going to rise a bit, just like everything else, it seems. But, if we look at the actual figures and see the difference between a NO and YES vote ... the dollar amount is not too great, but the difference it will make to our town's kids, who are relying on us to show them what is important—I think that is immeasurable.

Knowing the growing uncertainties these kids face in their future, and how they can't help but take a budget defeat personally, watching these students speak, I couldn't help but think of how our extra dollars next year will be so

worth spending, no matter what we have to cut back on at home. They will see our values in action.

If the vote fails, we will have many, many more kids with far less to do to keep them happy, busy, motivated, etc.

Please vote on June 20.

a lesson in life

What do you get when you combine two outstanding performers, flawless stage direction, a wonderful set, great lighting and a script that makes you laugh and cry? You get "Tuesdays with Morrie" currently being presented at Curtain Call Theatre in Latham.

"Tuesdays with Morrie" by Jeffery Hatcher and Mitch Albom is the retelling of Albom's book about his relationship with Morrie Schwartz, Albom's sociology professor at Brandeis University, and his reconnection with Schwartz 16 years after graduation after seeing a story on him on "Nightline." Schwartz is diagnosed with ALS, commonly referred to as Lou Gehrig's disease, which is debilitating and always fatal.

The play is a story of living and not dying ... that is perhaps the greatest message that emerges from the show. The story traces Schwartz's decline and eventual death. The story centers on life, however, focuses on the things Schwartz has to do while those around him tend to want to focus on the inevitable end.

Schwartz is Albom's life coach; we see how the 30-something sports reporter who appears to have the world on a string, truly is the one spinning out of control. The 78-year-old Schwartz helps him put life into perspective.

The production, deftly directed by Curtain Call's Artistic Director Steve Fletcher, is seamless. He pulls the most

from his performers, making them walk a range of emotions without ever appearing unbelievable. Richard Lounello,

Paul Richer is without exception one of the Capital District's greatest theatrical treasures. He consistently manages to inhabit his characters completely with a focus rarely seen on the local stage. Morrie is no exception. We are taken by the sheer magnitude of his performance, not only the physical manifestations of the illness, but

the emotional journey his character endures.

Each character is on a journey and each journey has a different end. We watch Lounello reach his emotional peak in a riveting scene at Schwartz' bedside. The emotional catharsis of his character is complete. It is also the emotional peak for the audience. Richer brings his character to its peak when recalling the death of his mother. Together, the two performers present a near

perfect evening in the theater.

Dee Mulford's set design works remarkably well on Curtain Call's limited stage. John Miller's lighting brings a warmth to the production that rounds it out.

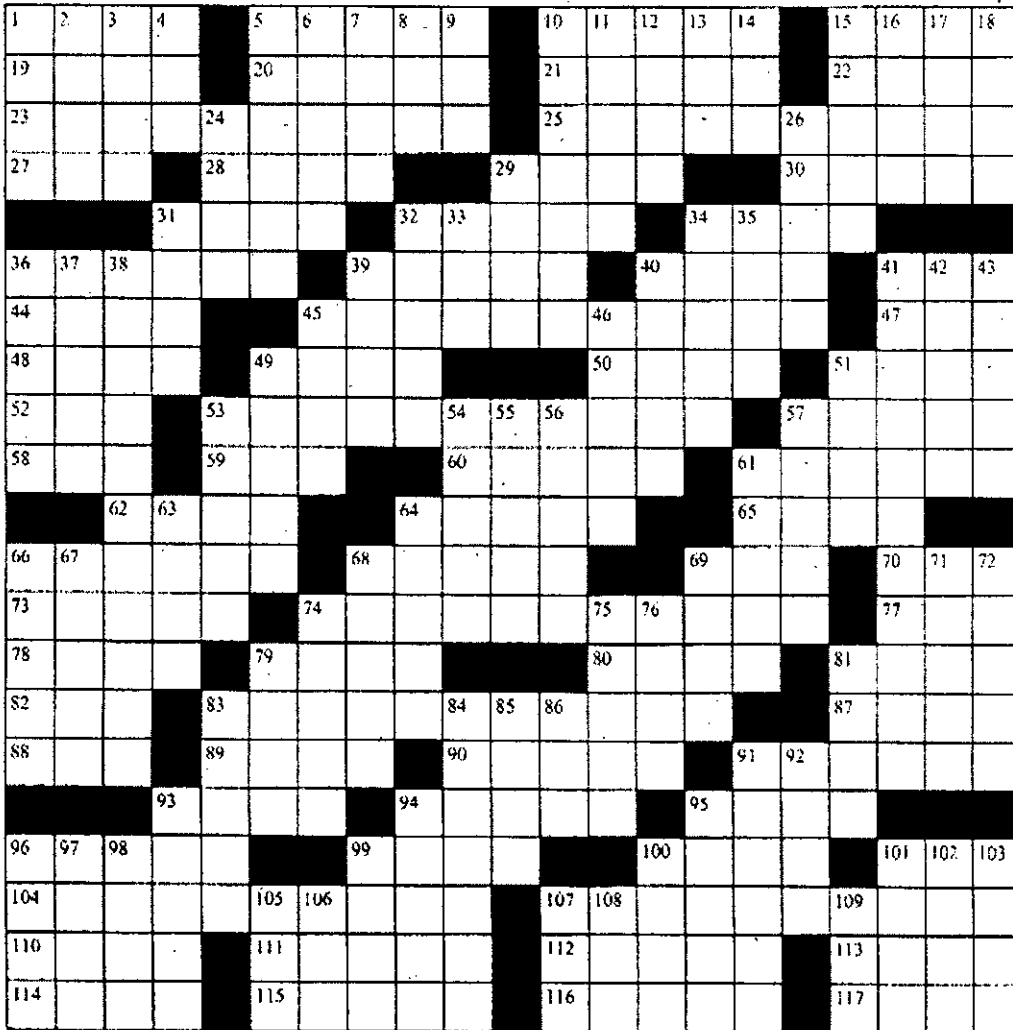

Brittany Dexter, Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake track — She capped one of the great track and field careers in school history by winning the state title in the high jump. Her school record of 5 feet, 8.5 inches may be tough to top.

Hunter Moffatt, Colonie baseball — The University at Albany-bound senior was a model of consistency all year on the pitcher's mound, winning virtually every

start in helping the Garnet Raiders reach the state finals. Moffatt also showed the heart of a warrior during Sectionals in throwing 131 pitches in a complete-game victory over Guilderland in the quarterfinals and tossing nearly the same amount in a nine-inning performance against Shen in the finals.

Noah Fossner, Niskayuna boys lacrosse — After five years, you almost came to expect some great saves out of Fossner. But in a season when he didn't always have the offensive support he had become accustomed to, he provided a spark with his play between the pipes. Fossner may be the Martin Brodeur of area high school lacrosse goaltenders.

• **Best team achievements:**
Colonie and Schalmont baseball — Two long-time powers ended two long championship droughts to represent Section II in the state tournament. Colonie ultimately went further than any other area baseball team, but both the Garnet Raiders and Sabres should be recognized for getting

out of a highly-competitive section. Shen also deserves recognition for reaching the class AA finals two years in a row.

Shen softball and Bethlehem girls lacrosse — They kept their dynasties going in the face of increased competition.

Bethlehem boys tennis — Once accustomed to winning Section II championships, the Eagles were the underdog against Guilderland in the class AA finals and came away with a hard-fought 6-3 victory. On top of that, the Eagles' two seniors — Robert Hoffman and Cory Gross — got an extra treat by qualifying for the state doubles tournament.

Schenectady Christian baseball — A team that has played at the varsity level for two seasons reaches the Sectional semifinals by knocking off top-seeded Germantown in the class D quarterfinals. That deserves a tip of the cap.

Finally, to all the senior athletes about to graduate, good luck in college. And to all the other athletes, see you in the fall.

to powerlifting. Naughton has assembled a team from his gym that goes out to regional and national tournaments sponsored by the Amateur American Powerlifting Federation — an organization that drug tests all of its competitors.

"We only enter drug-testing competitions," said Naughton. "With science, you can do better than you can with drugs. The science in strength training has come so far, you don't need drugs."

Like the gym itself, the team

has a diverse age range from teens to senior citizens.

"I started training here for ice hockey, and he (Naughton) told me about the powerlifting team. So, I'm doing it during the off-season," said Feldman-Reich.

Ultimately, it's the satisfaction of lifting a little more each time that drives these powerlifters.

"I went somewhere else (to work out) for 18 years, and I'll never go back," said Cannizzaro. "I love it here."

"I'm just enjoying the ride and seeing where it takes me," said Feldman-Reich.

All sessions are open to players age 8 to 18. Individual instruction, drills, skills and team strategies will be taught daily.

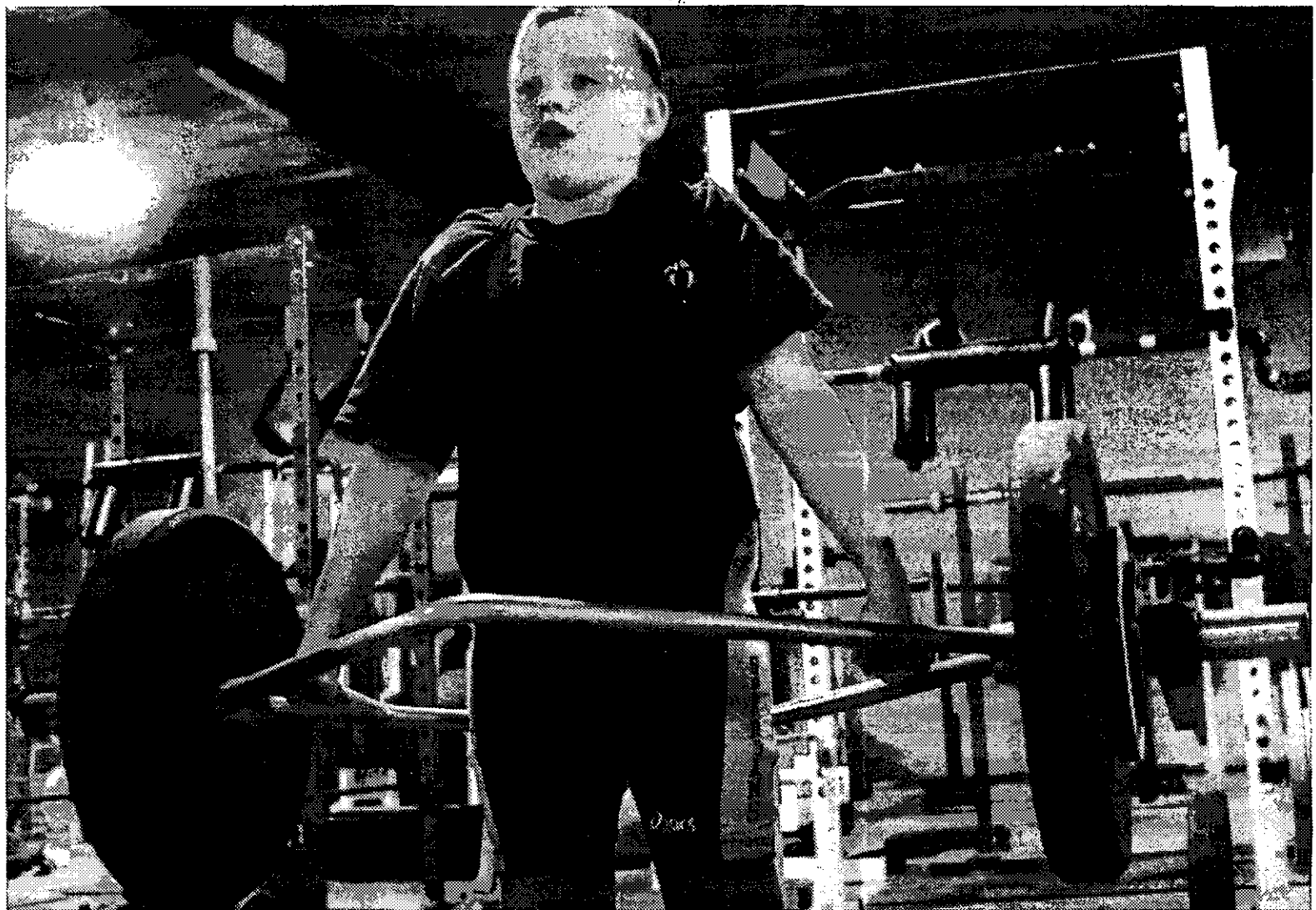
Sessions run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. during the June 26-30 camp and from 6 to 8:30 p.m. during the July 5-8 camps.

Exceeding their goals

Powerlifters aim to beat their personal bests

Say the word "powerlifter," and the image most people think of is a muscle-bound person in a tank top capable of lifting a small car with one hand.

Those people would be surprised to see who was competing at Saturday's in-house powerlifting tournament at Cutting Edge Sports and Science in Albany. Instead of people with biceps as big as car stereo speakers, there were young athletes, middle-aged adults and a 66-year-old man — all of whom looked like the aver-

age person next door.

Cutting Edge owner Dyke Naughton said that powerlifting isn't designed to build muscles. It's only purpose is to make people stronger.

"We don't make you look better, we don't make you look bigger," Naughton said. "We just make you faster and stronger."

The results can be pretty amazing. Burnt Hills resident Roz Warren dead-lifted 150 pounds at Saturday's competition, and he's only 10 years old. Albany resident Julia Cannizzaro, who joined Naughton's gym 16 months ago, lifted a personal record 185 pounds. Paul Burgess of Indian Lake, who only joined eight weeks ago, lifted more than 500 pounds.

"(The best part of powerlifting

is) just the personal satisfaction of doing something no one else can do," said Burgess, who drives with his son nearly two hours one way once a week to work out at the converted warehouse off Central Avenue. "At 50 years of age, you're supposed to be going downhill, not uphill, and I feel pretty good about that."

"It's a lot of fun," added 15-year-old Claire Feldman-Reich of Albany. "You get a huge rush afterward because everything you accomplished is right there on paper."

There are three disciplines in powerlifting — squats, bench press and the deadlift. Squats require competitors to hold the barbell at shoulder length behind their backs as they bend at the knees and get back up. In the

bench press, competitors push a barbell up from their chest while lying on their backs and hold it steady. In a deadlift, competitors pick the barbell up off the ground without bending their knees.

The goal is the same in all three disciplines — to lift more than your previous best.

"It's just a sport," said Naughton. "It's a very gratifying sport — 90 percent of the time, you're competing against yourself. But it's still just a sport."

"It helps in terms of motivation, as well as in terms of conditioning," said Kevin Warren, Roz's father and a fellow competitor at Saturday's tournament.

Beyond individual achievements, there can be a team aspect

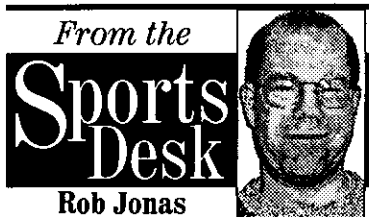

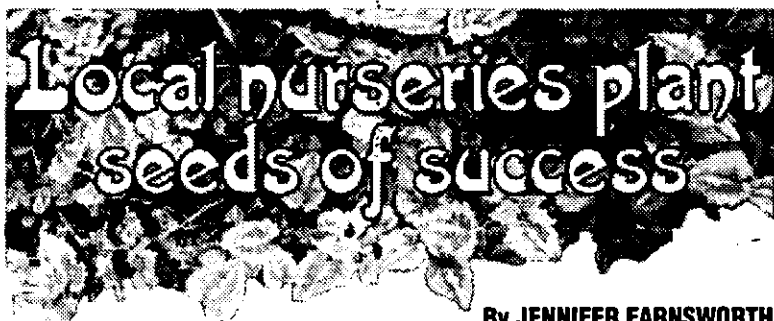

If you're still looking for the perfect summer plant, you're in the right state. According to the New York State Agriculture Commissioner Patrick H. Brennan, there are over 800 commercial greenhouses and nurseries in the state. Brennan said that New York ranks fifth in the nation for floriculture production, generating \$209 million last year.

John Kulak, of Kulak's Nursery in Rexford, says the key to good business is quality and service.

"We have a commitment to our customers to offer them a variety of products that are updated from year to year. People like to come and see fresh ideas, ideas that they can replicate at home," said Kulak.

Kulak's is about more than plants and flowers. The nursery has operated a landscaping business for over 20 years, which helped them establish a name before entering into the nursery business, now in its third season. Like many other nursery and garden centers, the industry has expanded and now offers 10 different types of mulch, stones, pottery, fountains and small trees. As many people look to do-it-yourself projects for their homes' interiors, they look to improve the exterior as well.

"The majority of our business is homeowners who live eight to 10 miles away, although we have had people come in from as far north as Lake George. We even had women from Connecticut buy a Christmas tree this past year," said Kulak.

Spring and summer is not the only time of the year you will find a crowd at places like Kulak's. Christmas time has also become a busy season where many nurseries sell a wide variety of fresh Christmas trees and wreaths. The gifts departments are filled with ornaments and seasonal gifts, which is just another "branch" of today's nursery.

"Christmas season has almost become as busy as summer," said Kulak. "People drive by and they see a crowd. People bring their whole family to pick out a tree. They see friends and neighbors and it is really a nice experience. We have Santa visit and serve hot chocolate, the customers love it."

At Price-Greenleaf, a longtime Delmar nursery where the fourth generation of family is now working, owner Jim Plummer said that although the business is by weather, they are still seeing many customers looking for that special something to plant this season.

"The business hits a lull when you have a week of straight rain, but as soon as the sun returns people get right back on track with their gardening," said Plummer.

One of the most requested items this year is the Knockout Rose, a form of shrub rose that is self-cleaning. Plummer says it reaches about 2-3 feet tall. He said the boxwood is making a comeback this year along with the dwarf Alberta plants which also get to be about 3-4 feet tall.

Another item growing in popularity is topiary plant art. Topiary, which is sculpted plants and hedges, originated in Williamsburg, Va. in the 1690s, according to "The Complete Book of Topiary," a book by Barbara Gallup and Deborah Reich. This year Kulak's has a variety of suns, moons, even a dog topiary.

Variety is really what seems to attract many gardeners. Karen Kulak, who works with her husband in the family business, said that patrons love to see new ideas and variety.

"If you have something in mind and we don't have it, we can get it for you. We always try to stay on top of what's out there and what people are looking for," says Kulak.

Both Plummer and Kulak stressed the importance of supporting local nurseries just as support is essential for local farmers. Plummer said that their nursery supports organizations like Little League, which helps remind people that the business is still there.

"Supporting New York's green industry does more than beautify your home or business; it generates economic activity on the local level and provides seasonal employment for thousands of New Yorkers," said Brennan. "Bring your family out to one of New York's many greenhouses and select your favorite foliage, and do your part in keeping New York green and gorgeous."

family-owned business, started 117 years ago, has changed to accommodate that type of clientele. Guernsey and Graves note that they offer personalized service such as delivery, designing, and installation for customers who prefer that the professionals be in charge of creating their beautiful home landscape.

Customers walking into Guernsey's establishment notice right away that he offers something different than what they would find at a large retail store. He said all of his products are in beds, as they grow their own flowers, plants, and shrubs. Guernsey noted that independent nurseries have been the people behind the growing business of horticulture. The things that set them apart from bigger retail chains is "service, quality and availability," said Guernsey.

"I offer individualism. I take time with people," he said. "I don't have one kind of maple tree. I've got five. There are different sizes and shapes and about 1,000 varieties. You get the unusals."

While Graves said they don't grow their own plants, the owners do "spend the winter going to seed places and asking growers to do contract growing." She said that is how their nursery is able to offer items that are different and unique to the area.

As for big box? Well, Guernsey admitted that the local, independent nurseries and greenhouses are affected by their presence. He said he spends a great deal of money on various forms of advertising to get people to come by the nursery. Guernsey

said customers should expect prices to be a bit higher than they might generally see at the big box stores.

"Prices are higher because the quality and material is better," he said. Along with the increased variety, local growers tend to

roadside presence," said Graves of Faddegon's. Most of their advertising budget is spent on an existing mailing list for preferred customers. With the list topping out at about 11,000 names, Graves said the mailings provide an opportunity to make customers aware of new products and technology as well as to encourage them to return to the store.

"We try to reward the customers we have," she said. "We depend on repeat customers. We can't compete with the big boxes. We don't even try. If we tried to do that, we couldn't stay in business."

Guernsey acknowledged that Mother Nature is his No. 1 competitor but did state that local nurseries and greenhouses need to be supported.

"Help support local farmers, we are a dying breed," he said.

"We're all very time poor, so we bring in varieties that are easy to grow and suggest plants people will be successful with."
