Anniversary of attacks will stir painful memories for some, but closure is possible

s the five-year anniversary of the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001, draws near, the images and memories of that day will most certainly weigh heavily on the minds of many.

Some will remember where they were when American Airlines Flight 11 struck the north tower of the World Trade Center or who they were with when the south tower collapsed. Some will recall the ensuing exodus from Manhattan. And others will recall President George W. Bush's address to the nation that night declaring that America would make no distinction between the terrorists who committed the acts and those who harbor them.

For some spiritual leaders and psychologists, this anniversary marks a milestone in how we as New Yorkers and Americans have come to terms, if any, with the events that transpired in September 2001. Those leaders, since that tragic day five years ago, have been working to resolve those feelings for many. On Monday, as municipal agencies and other organizations around the country remember the fallen, the images will stir pain, anger and fear in many.

"You can't un-do it. But you can encourage people to seek out the value in the experience. It can be a

Town's **finances** meet estimate

Seven months into the 2006 fiscal year, the town of Bethlehem finances are meeting estimated budget projections.

Town Comptroller Judith Kehoe said water and sewer revenues are in line with expenditures. The general fund saw a deficit of \$725,000 last year and will see another deficit this year of \$800,000. However, Kehoe said a healthy \$5 million balance in the general fund will be used to offset that deficit.

Town sales tax for the second quarter of 2006 totaled \$2.33 million, just under sales tax revenue for the first quarter of the year. Sales tax figures overall in 2005 totaled \$9.26 million and may increase this year.

"In a normal year, I would expect to see a \$200,000 increase in overall sales tax, but this year I am unsure due to the cap on gasoline prices," said Kehoe.

Albany County's 4 percent collection of sales tax is split 60-40 with the municipalities, with the county keeping 60 percent of the total sales tax revenue and the towns receiving the remaining 40 percent. Kehoe said Bethlehem usually sees about 10 percent of the total county allocation of sales tax revenue each year. Mortgage tax receipts for the town are also léveling off in 2006.

Prescription drug program held up in Senate

Passing a bulk prescription drug program in New York has become a struggle between some small lobby groups who support the bill and the heavy-hitting lobbyists that represent big pharmaceutical drug companies.

According to Mark Dunlea, associate director of Hunger Action Network, Senate bill S.5029A and corresponding Assembly bill A.6.336B would save New Yorkers billions of dollars by creating a comprehensive state program to purchase bulk prescription drugs.

The proposed legislation would allow the state to buy

drugs in bulk and pass savings on in the form of discounts to New Yorkers who buy medicines out-

of-pocket at full cost. A similar bill passed the state Assembly by a vote of 135 to 1. By the end of the state's legislative session in June, the bill did not get on the Senate floor for a vote.

"If it comes up to a vote it will pass," said Dunlea, who believes the biggest obstacle left is convincing state Sen.

Driver pleads guilty in fatal accident

Jon Allin Guilbault, 36, of 217 passenger. Gardener Road, East Nassau, pleaded guilty to manslaughter in the second degree, a Class C felony, and operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, a misdemeanor.

According to Albany County District Attorney David Soares, Guilbault admitted that on March 23, at approximately 11 p.m., on Route 9W in the town of Bethlehem, he caused the death of Stacey A. Teidman by speeding and driving in an imprudent manner while attempting to elude police while he was intoxicated. Guilbault's actions caused his vehicle to veer off the roadway and strike two utility poles, causing the death of Teidman, who was his

Teidman, 44, of West Sand Lake, was a friend and coworker of the defendant. She left behind a husband and a son

"This death, like so many other alcohol-related deaths, was as tragic as it was senseless," said Soares.

"Tragic because we have parents losing a child, a husband losing a partner, and a son losing a mother," he said, "This was senseless, because there is access to taxis, buses and cell phones. Jon Allin Guilbault did not have to drive."

Sentencing is set for Oct. 31 in Albany County Criminal Court. Guilbault faces three to nine years in state prison.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Mary Tanner-Richter.





News that Albany County will charge the town of Bethlehem \$267,424 for 2007 election costs, well above a previous estimate, has one town official calling for a better explanation of the costs.

In a recent letter, Albany County Executive Michael Breslin plained the charge, which is supposed to cover the town's share of the county-controlled election process..

"As I proposed for the 2006 fiscal year,

my executive budget for 2007 will include this charge-back to municipalities in proportion to each municipality's taxable property as provided for in the HAVA (Help America Vote Act) legislation," wrote Breslin.

According to Bethlehem Supervisor Theresa Egan, the \$267,424 price tag is \$177,000 more than what the town originally anticipated.

"The proposed charge back will have a significant impact on the town's 2007 budget and increase the tax burden on our residents," wrote Egan in an Aug. 29 letter.

Breslin's office has since scheduled a meeting between municipal leaders and county commissioners for Thursday, Sept. 7, to discuss the new system and associated costs, said Kerri Battle, county spokeswoman.

The new figures, according to the county executive's office, are based on the amount of assessable property within each of the county's 10 towns and three cities.

Other towns also face steep

charges. Colonie's costs will now rise to \$680,000. Guilderland's election costs will be \$275,000 in 2007, and the city of Albany's costs are estimated at \$390,000.

News of the increased election costs did not sit well with many Bethlehem officials at a recent meeting of the town board.

"The formula for financing

should change from property value to the number of enrolled voters as a fair way to distribute costs,' said Kyle Kotary, member of the Bethlehem town board.

Battle said a charge back formula based on population for the county election costs would not be legal.

"It has to be based on taxable property," said Battle.

New federal HAVA laws require all counties in New York to purchase new electronic voting machines and pay for the costs of storing and maintaining those machines. All election inspectors statewide will be paid by the counties and no longer the individual municipalities.

The purchase cost of the machines themselves will be covered by a federal HAVA grant,' Breslin said. The rests of the expenses are county costs, with most of those costs being charged back to the individual towns.

Egan said she also wants to find out how Albany County will place the new voting machines in each of the election districts.

"If the county intends to reduce the number of voting machines in some of the election districts, the effect could result in disenfranchised voters, which is contrary to the intent of the Help America Vote Act," Egan said.

Young violinist competes in Ireland

It's the final stretch of the backto-school countdown. Some parents are doing a summer survival victory dance. In our house I'm bracing for the back-tonagging mode.

We only took one trip out of town, but the entire summer was a vacation from those countless activities and deadlines that fill the school year. We still had the earlymorning challenge of getting off to camp and the office, but the evening pressures were limited.

Now it all begins again. All those routines, the homework, the sports, the school activities, the permission slips, the parentteacher conferences, open house night, Scholastic book-order forms, the fundraisers, more homework, remember the instrument, the concerts.

Do we have poster board? Did we save 2-liter bottles for a science project? Why don't they wear smocks in art class? Where is your lunch box?

I'm ready, really I am. And I'm more prepared than ever.

Over the years I've employed various organizational methods. Success has been marginal, but even slow progress is progress.

I started with a basic chart. In the very early years the chart had a short list: get dressed, make the bed, and brush teeth. Once I mastered that list I was ready to make a chart for my daughter's



activities.

When Rachel was in second grade I made my husband a chart. This is because I was tired of being the only one who knew when homework was due and what day

I do not like to be the sole nagger. This means someone else needs to be aware that the spelling QUIZ is on Friday, but the spelling ACTIVITY is due on Thursday. And that there is a choice of spelling activities, but none can be chart used to repeated in a single month.

The chart has columns for all seven days of the week. There is a row for activities that happen at school (library, gym, art, music, etc.). There is another row for what needs to be in the backpack and/ or brought to school (library books, spelling homework, lunch/ snack, instrument, etc.)

Next there is a section for what homework should be done or started that day. This section is useful for tracking standard items that are due on the same schedule, such daily or weekly math sheets and/or spelling sentences.

For example, Monday might "Review/begin math problems." This means to at least look at them. Thursday might say,



It will probably be a good thing in the long run, but sad nonetheless, especially for its graduates, faculty and parents who fondly remember their times at Doane Stuart.






Some students grew so attached to Doane Stuart they return to marry in the beautiful chapel or have their children baptized there.



If ethanol is the future. where are the stations?

Editor, Spotlight:

In Rob Irwin's interesting article on the new E85 ethanol/ gasoline mixture (Spotlight, Aug. 17) he states, "The renewable fuel provides a 10 to 15 percent reduction in gallons used per mile." This is incorrect. It should read, "The renewable fuel provides a 10 to 15 percent reduction in miles obtained per gallon." The heating value of ethanol is less than that of gasoline so more fuel is used.

This statement is true for today's FFV cars. However if the compression ratio of a car engine was to be increased to make use of the higher octane rating of the E85 fuel, then the miles per gallon could probably be increased. However such an engine would not be able to run on conventional gasoline. As such, today's FFV car engines are a compromise simply because they have to be designed to run on two types of fuel.

Incidentally, a Google search indicates that E85 fuel cannot yet be purchased within 100 miles of Schenectady. Hopefully that will change when this new state legislation starts to be implemented.

and the price of gasoline. We also claim to be concerned about the environment. Well, as the new school year begins, some of us are in a position to do something constructive about these concerns. One simple step would be to reduce a rather wasteful practice: high school students driving their own vehicles to school instead of using existing bus transportation.

This year, more than 200 vehicles are expected to be driven daily by students to the high school. While a portion of those cars are needed for work purposes, most simply serve as convenient alternatives to bus transportation.

Given the energy and environmental realities of today's world, this is a luxury that we can ill afford. As even a small proportion of every dollar spent on gasoline ultimately goes into the coffers of Ahmadinejab in Iran, Vladmir Putin in Russia, and Hugo Chavez in Venezuela - not to mention 'big oil' - we need to realize that we are unwittingly helping subsidize our own opponents on the world scene.

Even more significant is the impact that this and all unnecessary vehicle use has on our environment. In terms of air quality, the most damaging portion of the automotive engine-use cycle occurs during the so-called "cold start," the time when an engine that has been sitting for several hours is ignited. As a cold engine block operates inefficiently, the seconds involved in warming it releases the highest concentration of airborne toxins, including carcinogens. Our early morning joggers may

In a very short while we will have all been billed by the school districts for our 2006-2007 school year taxes. This will actually be based on the town of Bethlehem's new tax (AKA revaluation). In our case, this will result in almost a \$300/month jump in our monthly budget! The talking, the town meetings, the protests are over, and now we must pay. One has the feeling that the old refrain, "You can't fight City Hall," is true. Despite the outcry from the electorate, the town of Bethlehem plowed full steam ahead with a Marie Antoinette attitude of "let them eat cake."

Recently a letter appeared suggesting that the confusion about tax rates is somehow connected to school spending. The school system determines how much money to spend with community approval. The towns decide how much each landowner must pay.

The budget of the Bethlehem Central School system is the product of extensive planning and public discussion. The community is asked to approve that spending and accept the burden of paying the amount not covered by government school aid. This year the community rejected the first and supported a second reduced budget.

Tax bills are the result of dividing the local share of spending by the value of real estate that the towns of Bethlehem and New Scotland determine individual residents own. Revaluation has produced a confusing process making the changes to individual tax bills difficult to predict.

The spending that our schools do is very deliberate. I know the board values the input from organizations and individuals about appropriate spending. At the same time, we are ready to help everyone understand the spending proposals we make to our community for our community's schools.

On the plus side, Stageworks commitment to offering a place for emerging playwrights to get their works mounted in a professional setting with professional performers and technicians. A short drive from the Capital District, particularly as the fall season sets in, makes the trip worthwhile. Theaters such as these need to be supported and experienced. Even a bad show here might eventually be reworked and retooled to become an awardwinning production tomorrow.

"I expect we will be coming in at \$1 million to \$1.2 million, which is below what we had budgeted," Kehoe said.

A shortfall is expected in a line item cost for election expenses. Last year the town spent \$70,000 in election expenses. New budget estimates have this year's cost to be \$276,000. The extra election expense is due to the new Help America Vote Act.

Another town contract with Albany County for Advanced Life Support services is expected to increase from the current cost of \$370,000 a year.

"Bethlehem represents 60 percent of the call volume," said Supervisor Theresa Egan, adding, "a new bill will be submitted at increases of \$200,000 from the prior year."

"It's one of those things we don't have any control over," Egan

Board approves subdivision regulations

New subdivision regulations have been approved by the town board. The changes pertain to the amount of developable space within the town, as well as any primary and secondary uses of new proposed construction.

"We have responded to all comments, and it has been a meaningful process," said Egan.

The work to complete the new zoning changes has been a year in the making, and economic development director George Leveille thanked staff for their efforts.

"We have definitely taken the code and made it better," Leveille

An application for a planned 220-unit senior housing project also received approval from the town board. A planned development district is being considered for the 91-acre VanDyke Spinney project. Developers would like to construct 1,100-square-foot senior housing apartments that will cost anywhere from \$1,100 to \$1,300 to rent. The complex may include walking trails and a community center if approved.

"I am very pleased to see affordable housing being created," said town board member Tim Gordon.

The project will now go back to the planning board for review or recommendation.

buy these drugs because prices are through the roof," he added.

Similar bills have already been approved in Maine, Hawaii and Vermont according to Bill Ferris, legislative representative for the 2.5 million member state AARP.

"AARP was very disappointed the Senate didn't take this up before they left in June," said Ferris. "Thirteen percent of our membership in New York pays full retail for their drugs.'

Ferris believes many AARP members receive their prescription drugs through the Federal Governments Medicare Part (D) drug program, where there are many gaps in the program's coverage.

"Under Medicare Part (D) you are covered for up to \$2,250 in expenditures," said Ferris. "Then the coverage stops until a person reaches \$5,000 in expenses."

The proposed bill, according to Ferris, would set up a buying pool to purchase prescription drugs in bulk, saving money and allowing for a discount card to be offered to all New Yorkers for their prescription drug pur-

"Pharmaceutical companies have opposed this bill at every turn in the Legislature, and it is unfortunate," said Ferris.

Between 2003 and 2005, pharmaceutical companies and their allies spent more than \$8 million lobbying in opposition to the preferred drug list for New York, according to information released from the government watchdog group Common Cause. The preferred drug list was designed to save money by allowing the state to negotiate discounts from drug manufacturers who want their drugs listed among those that doctors are able to prescribe to Medicaid patients without preauthorization.

According to Common Cause, those same pharmaceutical companies lobbying against the

preferred drug list gave millions of dollars in campaign contributions, with Senate Republicans being the largest beneficiaries with \$850,000 in campaign contributions since 1999. The Republican party, including senators, Assembly members, the state party, and Gov. George Pataki, received a total of 59 percent of pharmaceutical industry contributions. These came from companies such as Bayer, Bristol Meyers Squibb, Ely Lilly and Co., Johnson and Johnson, 3M, and Allergan.

The same pharmaceutical companies are represented by a host of different lobbying firms including David Whitehead and Whiteman Osterman and Hanna LLP., who represent Bristol Meyers Squibb and Mercury Public Affairs representing Pfizer Inc. In 2005, Pfizer paid the firm of Mercury Public Affairs \$120,000 to lobby the state on their behalf. The partners of Mercury Public Affairs include Michael McKeon, former communications director for Pataki and Kieran Mahoney, who managed several political campaigns including those of Pataki and former Republican U.S. Sen. Alphonse D'Amato from New

An intense lobbying effort is under way by AARP to encourage state senators to include the bill in the special one-day session of the house Sept. 15.

"Our members are meeting with every senator across the state and with their Albany staff," said Ferris who, like Dunlea, believes the measure would easily pass in the Senate if brought for a vote.

New Yorkers spent more than \$16 billion in 2004 on prescription drugs, and the purchase price cost goes up 15 percent annually, according to figures released from AARP.

"Older people are cutting their prescription drugs in half to stretch out their allotment, and it defeats the purpose of taking the medication to better one's health," said Dunlea.

Mother's plight prompts marathon ambitions

Brain drain.

Figuratively, it's what students felt after Asta Roberts' toughest English exams.

Literally, it's a device that saved the retired Bethlehem Central High School teacher's mind from a fluid build-up that left her "out of it" for nearly four months last vear.

In honor of her mother, 1981 Bethlehem graduate Tomi-Ann Roberts will attempt her first marathon this fall to raise money toward helping those with hydrocephalus — a medical condition that used to be called "water on the brain."

"My mom is gradually healing, but it has been the most difficult challenge my family has ever faced," said Tomi-Ann Roberts, who grew up on Brockley Drive in Delmar with her parents and younger sister, Lisen.

A native of Finland, her 65year-old mother taught at Bethlehem high school from 1968 to 1995, before retiring to Chapel Hill, N.C., with her husband, Lowell.

Last summer, following routine overnight back surgery for herniated discs, an untreated infection spread through her whole body. She ran a fever and hallucinated. Fluid pressing on her brain sent her into a coma for a week, then into a semivegetative state for nearly four months. Finally, after intensive drugs and multiple operations cleared up her meningitis, neurosurgeons put a shunt in her head to drain the excess.

"The shunt was a kind of miracle," reflected Roberts. "Before that, she had no shortterm memory, so she was living completely in the present, and never knew from one minute to the next what was up. She had to re-learn how to eat, speak - and mostly --- how to walk."

Asta Roberts still suffers headaches and balance problems. She also needs special prism

However, her daughter said, "She is completely back, cognitively. We tell her stories of the hospital, but she doesn't remember any of it. A blessing, really. Now, it's just an adjustment to learn to live with the shunt."

While her mother was in and out of intensive care, Roberts used running as a way of dealing with the stress of flying back and forth between her Colorado home and the hospital in Durham, N.C.

"When I was back home. I hit the roads to kind of run off all the crazy emotions that being there would stir up," she said. "It was a good way to handle things. Then I just kind of kept going and thought I wanted to have more of a goal. Then I looked into the Hydro-cephalus Association to get more information about my mother's condition, and it made me think I'd like to raise money for them.'

Roberts resolved to take on the Marathon. with Chicago ambitions of generating \$5,000 for the cause. After years of jogging for fitness and pleasure, she plans to enter the 26-mile race on Oct. past year on trails in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, 6,000 feet above sea level.

> The hushed atmosphere of the exhibit speaks of the surreal sentiments of that day five years ago, when planes flew into both towers of the World Trade Center and the Pentagon in Washington, D.C., killing thousands of people. A fourth plane crashed into the

ground in Pennsylvania.

"I actually visited the site right after it happened. And it looked like that," said one museum visitor, emphatically pointing to photos of the wreckage at Ground Zero.

The authenticity of the exhibit has been known to inspire deep emotions in people.

"When we first opened, we had boxes of tissues out; and they were needed. Some people just cried and cried, it was still so fresh in their minds," Siegfried recalled.

Other visitors have found the exhibit therapeutic.

"Until they'd gone through the exhibit they hadn't faced it," said Siegfried. "Going through is sort of cathartic, allowing people to work through it."

He acknowledges that the timeline is especially helpful in this way because it shows exactly what happened and when.

The effect of the exhibit is

'Most visitors will give an exhibit 20 to 30 seconds of their time. The World Trade Center exhibit has had crowds of people coming in, standing in line, and viewing from beginning to end. To capture someone that way is rewarding," said Siegfried.

barrier, or it can be an opportunity for growth and change," said John P. Forsyth, associate professor of psychology at the University at Albany.

Forsyth is director of the department's anxiety disorder research program and the author of several anxiety self-help books.

The nervous system is additive, not subtractive, said Forsythe. Since the attacks, many people have gone through a series of emotional periods. After five years, whether or not time can heal all wounds will be put to the test this year.

It is never healthy to dwell in painful memories, said Forsyth, although he added that remembering on this anniversary and the next can be healthy step towards resolution.

Locally, people may travel to the Sept. 11 exhibit at the state museum. Others may head south to where the World Trade Center stood to reflect. Many will be faced with images or feelings they have not encountered in some

time. Forsyth encourages people to focus on the value of what they do this anniversary. It's not so much about remembering, but how one remembers.

It's the foundation for a "new normalcy" that Americans are currently facing after the attacks and the subsequent chain of events that continue to follow. New normalcy is the latest mission for Dr. Suzan Johnson Cook, 49.

Cook is one of seven New York Police Department chaplains who were on duty on the day of the attacks. From the time the planes hit, the towers fell and clean-up efforts began, Cook was providing moral and spiritual support to police officers, 911 operators, firefighters, families and strangers.

For her work, Cook became known as the "city's pastor." But, that work is far from over, despite some

light at the end of tunnel.

"We can never forget that it was a human tragedy. This anniversary, the trauma will be relived. But, for some, it will bring closure for the first time,' said Cook.

In the weeks after the attacks, Cook ran nondenominational services out of John Street United Methodist Church, in the heart of Manhattan's financial district, and two blocks from Ground Zero.

The first 60 days after the attacks felt like one long funeral, she said. Even after five years, the hurt, pain and fear are still very real. Like Forsyth, Cook urges mourners on Monday to acknowledge the pain but focus on the triumphs of so many people in the aftermath. People must remember the many heroes that gave their lives, she said. They also need to remember how Americans came together as a nation without regard to race and religion.

There is good to come from the tragedy of Sept. 11, 2001, and in some cases good already has, she said.

"People feel they have to go forward and be strong. If we go in fear, the terrorists win."

"Now, people are more committed to find out what they are passionate about. People are making more time for their families. They are asking themselves, who are the people that really matter?" Cook said. "People feel they have to go forward and be strong. If we go in fear, the terrorists win."

There is no question that memorial services and media reports will bring that September day back for many, said Forsyth.

This Monday, he encourages people to see things differently and be open to emotion. This anniversary, meet grief with compassion and focus on "what you really want to be about," he said.

This anniversary people can learn a lot about themselves, and what Sept. 11 means to them.



York City and Washington,
D.C., with a reading of a play
written by veteran journalist
Anne Nelson titled "The
Guys," followed by a
reception.

Nelson wrote the play because she said she felt the experience of collaborating with a fire department captain in an effort to craft eulogies for services of fallen firefighters was too personal to be expressed in newsprint. "The Guys" debuted at the 80-seat Flea Theater three months after the attacks. The theater is just seven blocks from Ground Zero.

The destruction of the twin towers of the World Trade Center had a serious impact on the Flea Theater, described as one of New York's leading off-off-Broadway repertory companies.

Before the terrorists struck, the theater hosted a repertoire of five plays, two dance presentations and a concert; after the terrorist attack, all activity at the theater ceased. When the theater reopened almost three weeks later, attendance dropped from 90 percent to 5 percent of capacity.

Dust and ash continued to hang in the air for weeks around Ground Zero, and theater owners said audiences were unable or unwilling to venture into the area.

They hoped the initial production of "The Guys" would help generate foot traffic and drop-in business in the lower Manhattan area, and they were not disappointed. At most performances, every seat was occupied.

Free admission was granted to firefighters and their families.

The play centers on a fire department captain, Nick, and a writer, Joan, and their experience during an afternoon recalling the virtues and foibles of fallen firefighters, in order to fashion stories of their lives into fitting eulogies.

"In that one afternoon, Nick and Joan discover the possibilities of friendship in each other and their shared love for the unconquerable spirit of the city, drawing on humor, tango and the enduring bonds of common humanity," said Capital Rep spokeswoman Nancy Laribee.

Richard Nagle, the academy director for the state office of fire prevention, will portray Nick. Before becoming the academy director, Nagle was a lieutenant in the New York City Fire Department.

His former company, Engine Company 26, in the

"There was little I could do at the time, other than mourn their loss," Nagle said. "However, when Anne Nelson's play opened, I determined that by playing the captain, I could help to

maintain the memory of those 343 brave men who were lost that day."

Nagle played the part of the captain on the second anniversary of the terrorist attacks at the Newman Theater, in Westchester County. Since then, he has recreated the role at the national fire academy, in Emmitsburg, Md., and the state fire academy, in Montour Falls. He has also performed the play for the Massachusetts Association of Fire Chiefs, the Virginia State Fire Chiefs Association and at the Consalati Theater, in Sheffied, Mass.

Playing Joan will be WNYT news anchor and health reporter Benita Zahn. In addition to covering health issues for the local NBC affiliate, she has performed many times in theater productions at the Albany Civic Theater, Schenectady Civic Theater, Schenectady Light Opera, and the Park Playhouse.
