Board OKs \$77M budget

New middle school administrator positions added after all


At the Wednesday, March 28, meeting, the Bethlehem school board adopted a \$77.16 million-dollar budget, which carries a 4.61 percent tax increase, after some

last-minute revenue revisions and an agreement to add two new full-time administrator positions at the middle school. The budget is subject to voter approval in May.

The agreement came just two days after the final citizens budget committee meeting. The 40-member committee was appointed to assist the school board in budgetary decisions and

Public money, Private schools



Budget proposal offers deduction for parents of private-school students, but opponents say it takes away from public system

One of the more controversial aspects of the roughly \$121.6 billion state budget passed last week is the offering of a tax deduction of up to \$1,000 per child attending a private or parochial school for families making up to \$125,000.

Proponents claim it will allow parents an alternative educational avenue for their children and does not go far enough, while opponents say it opens the door to a voucher system and

undercuts public school funding. This debate may be taken up again when the state Legislature returns after its Easter break.

In the context of the budget, it is relatively a small amount of money — between \$50 and \$80

\$20 billion school aid package. But, some say, symbolically it is huge.

"Many parents are unable to avoid failing public schools, particularly in the inner city, because they do not have the means to move to a good school district," said Dennis Poust, a spokesman for the New York State Catholic Conference who sends his children to St. Thomas the Apostle School in Delmar. "It will help everyone, but it certainly will not help anyone very much given the small amount of money we are talking

Teacher's death saddens region

Jeremy S. Klugman, a physical education teacher at Bethlehem Central Middle School and high school varsity basketball coach for the past four years, died unexpectedly on Friday, March 30, at his home in Albany at the age of 37. He leaves behind a wife and two children.

"The entire Bethlehem community was saddened by the news of middle school faculty member Jeremy Klugman's death," were the words posted on the Bethlehem district Web site over the weekend.

District officials did not offer any explanations surrounding the circumstances behind Klugman's death. Grief counselors were immediately made available at the middle school and the high school for students and faculty beginning Saturday morning through Tuesday.

"I knew Jeremy pretty well through all of his activities, and he was an exceptionally able teacher," said Superintendent Les Loomis. "He was a very popular, positive colleague who also had tremendous leadership ability."

Loomis was out of town tending to a family member's health matter when he heard the news about Klugman Friday morning. Assistant superintendents Michael Tebbano and Steve O' Shea assisted Loomis with preparations to work with

Bethlehem police arrest 3 on DWI charge

A Selkirk resident who was stopped initially for speeding on Route 9W has been charged with DWI.

Court gets new security scanner

Town made the move to improve courtroom safety

Those arriving at Bethlehem Town Court should be prepared to walk through the town's new Magnetometer security scanner before entering the courtroom.

With the \$4,100 purchase, Bethlehem follows Guilderland and Colonie as the latest Albany County town court to install a security walk-through system.

"This is a good move for the overall safety of the court," said Bethlehem police Chief Lou Corsi.

The push to purchase a new court security scanner was driven by town court clerk Barbara Hodom.

"Barb did a lot of work with the Office of Court Administration and took the lead on this," said Corsi.

All people now entering town court are subject to screening procedures and prohibited from carrying weapons in court facilities other than in an official capacity. The exception is court personnel, law enforcement personnel and attorneys.

"If they don't want to go through the scanner, they have a right to leave," said Corsi.

court is in session. Every police officer in Bethlehem received anywhere from four to eight hours of training about proper screening procedures.

"We would like to be consistent in our approach to how we use the scanner," said Corsi.

Since the courtroom gets crowded on court nights, the staff is urging people to get there early.

"We encourage people to arrive early," said Lt. Thomas Heffernan.

The chief is also warning people to leave pocket knives and anything that resembles a weapon behind before entering town court.

"A lot of people carry weapons and carry them legally," said Corsi. "We don't want them in the court room."



Spotlight takes seven prizes at statewide contest

Reporter, illustrator win first place awards

Cuozzo won first prize in the coverage of crime/police/courts category in the New York Press Association's Better Newspaper Contest. Prizes were awarded during NYPA's spring convention and trade show held at the Gideon Putnam in Saratoga Springs March 30 and 31.

Judges from the press associations of Oklahoma and New Jersey said Cuozzo's coverage "went well beyond on-the-record court proceeding to tell the behind-the-crime story."

Cuozzo spent the better part of July and August in Goshen, Orange County, covering the trial, filing 56 print stories and more than 100 pages of online coverage for *Spotlight Newspapers*.

"I was surprised at how much work and effort was involved in covering the story correctly," Cuozzo said. "It's a credit to the newspaper and staff more than the reporter, that it provided the time and resources necessary to cover the trial."

Cuozzo said the trial itself was "fascinating."

"It was at times mundane, believe it or not," Cuozzo said. "There was a lot of waiting; for the lawyers, for the jurors. It was a lot of work and intensity, and a lot of waiting."

McIntyre praised Cuozzo's reporting. "Jim's very involved in the community," he said. "He's active in gathering news, and it's wonderful to see him recognized."

Editorial paginator Brady Chapman upped his number of first-place wins over last year, when he took home one first-place prize. This year, his illustration of the front-page stories "Dangerous Gamble" and "Take a Hike" earned him two first prize spots in the graphic illustration category.

Of "Dangerous Gamble," judges called Chapman's work "great use of digitally manipulating a photograph of a spray can placed on a roulette wheel with danger symbols superimposed in slots."

Judges said they felt like taking a hike when they looked at Chapman's photo illustrations of the story about local hiking spots.

"I'm pleased," Chapman said. "I was happy with the work I submitted to the contest."

Chapman said the headline of a story usually dictates the artistic direction he takes.

"I like problem-solving and coming up with imagery," he said. In an increasingly visual world, he said, good artwork assists in drawing the reader into a story.


"When we made the decision to go with front-page packages about two years ago, I wasn't sure how it would go," McIntyre said. "It's great to put pictures with words, and Brady has made the pages come alive."

Sports Editor Rob Jonas also won second place for his sports feature story about the Super Bowl - told from the vantage point of the Tailgate Tavern in Guilderland.

"Rob does great work," McIntyre said. "Whether it's the championship game or previews of a modified game, he's in tune with the event, and just as excited. Rob loves sports, and especially community sports. It shows in his writing and photos."

Jury delivers quick verdict; Porco mom absent

It took an Orange County jury fewer than six hours to find Christopher Porco guilty of the murder of his father, Peter Porco, and the attempted murder of his mother, Joan Porco, during an overnight attack inside the master bedroom of their Delmar home on Nov. 13, 2004.

Jury deliberations began at 10:25 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 10, and by 4:12 p.m. on a warm summer afternoon in Goshen, Orange County, the juryperson handed a one to Judge Jeffrey Berry and the verdict was read.

"On the charge of second degree murder, have you found the defendant, Christopher Porco, guilty?" asked Berry.

"Guilty, Your Honor," said the foreperson.

A guilty verdict was read against the second-degree attempted murder of Peter's mother, Joan, and three accessories were at the four corners in Delmar: by 5:30 p.m. three TV's sporting news media were in the parking lot of The Delmar Marketplace, and two large vans' antennae reached to the clear blue, almost September-like sky.

"What happened?" one news anchor asked from a van. "Another driver," said only "Oh, thanks," when she heard the news that Christopher Porco had been found guilty of murdering his father, Peter Porco, and attempting to murder his mother, Joan Porco.

At 5 p.m. on Thursday, Aug. 10, only the regular commuter traffic and three accessories were at the four corners in Delmar: by 5:30 p.m. three TV's sporting news media were in the parking lot of The Delmar Marketplace, and two large vans' antennae reached to the clear blue, almost September-like sky.

Town Supervisor Thomas Fann called the day a sad one. "Peter Porco was a friend, and I will miss him every day," Fann said. "He worked in a petrie lab practice and was a warm leader before being elected supervisor," said at about 6 p.m. on the day the verdict came out.

"Despite the verdict, this is a tragedy for the family," Fann said. "My heart goes out to Joan, Christopher and Peter's family."

Johnathan Porco is Christopher Porco's brother. He is in the U.S. Navy and is stationed on a submarine.

Fann had high praise for the Albany County District Attorney's office and its chief prosecutor in the case, Nicholas McCormick.

Delmar bank robber still on the loose

Police say they have several leads

A bank robber who walked into the Delmar Bank of America branch on Tuesday, March 27, made off with several thousand dollars, and police are still searching for the suspect.

The robbery occurred at the 360 Delaware Ave. branch just before 2 p.m. Moments later, Bethlehem police received a hold-up alarm, which was confirmed.

According to reports, the suspect is a white male in his early 20s who approached a bank teller with a note demanding money.

The teller complied, and, according to police, the suspect fled on foot with several thousand dollars in \$100 bills.

Lt. Thomas Heffernan of the Bethlehem Police Department said town, county and state officers conducted a ground and helicopter search.

Evidence from police dogs from the K-9 unit and eyewitness reports indicate the suspect fled on foot in the direction of Adams Street.

"We have a couple of witnesses who saw the suspect running toward the area of St. Thomas school," Heffernan said.

By Monday, April 2, Heffernan said the police have received many tips regarding the robbery and are pursuing a few leads they feel are legitimate.

"We have been following up on numerous leads and have received many calls from the bank photo of the suspect," said Heffernan.

The suspect is described as 5-foot-8 to 6-foot tall with a slim build, dark-colored hair and was wearing a medium blue hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans, an off-white baseball cap with a logo on the front, athletic shoes and dark sunglasses at the time of the holdup. No weapons were displayed and no injuries were reported.

Andrew Sattinger, a Bank of America customer who lives on Delaware Avenue, said he tried to enter the bank around 1:45 p.m. the day of the robbery and could not get inside.

"The door was locked, and I thought, 'I'll just use the deposit,'" said Sattinger, but no employee

was available. "I thought it might be a holiday or something," Sattinger said.

Elsmere elementary and Bethlehem middle school were on lockdown the day of the robbery.

"We were constantly in touch with the Bethlehem police," said Superintendent Les Loomis. The all-clear signal was given to release students from school about 10 minutes after their normal time. The district notified parents of the reason through the new e-mail alert system.

The New York State Police Aviation and K-9 Units as well as members from the Albany County Sheriff's Department assisted at the scene.

Making Passover memories with friends

A friend approached me recently at my daughter's school. She told me that her young son had recently seen the movie "Prince of Egypt" and that it had sparked his interest in foods that are part of a Passover Seder. Although her family is not Jewish, she decided to gather some information to relay to him.

"So, how do you roast an egg?" she asked me.

I had to laugh. I used to wonder the same thing myself. Not only, "How do you roast an egg?" but also, "Why is there a roasted egg on the Seder plate?"

Passover, which began this year on the evening of April 2, celebrates the Jews' escape from slavery in Egypt more than 3,000 years ago. Holiday festivities include participating in a Seder, a lively hands-on religious ceremony recalling the exodus from Egypt.

The roasted egg on the Seder plate represents ritual animal sacrifice performed in ancient times. I've never actually roasted an egg. Instead I use the method used by my mother and my aunt: I hard boil an egg and create a "roasted" look by burning the shell with a lit match.

During the Seder, Jews read from a special book called a "Haggadah." The word *haggadah* means "the telling," referring to the obligation to tell the story of Passover to our children each year so the story will be remembered and relayed from generation to generation.

Each family has its own traditions and methods for relaying the story. Some families read the story straight from the Haggadah. Others may read the story and then add personal commentary.

When I began hosting Seders, I created a felt board story to help keep the interest of the youngest participants. In recent years we've gathered with friends

and participated in Seders during which the kids perform the story in a series of skits.

At a Seder two years ago, all the kids acted out the Passover story using a simple script that had been written by some of the parents a few years back. The kids got their scripts ahead of time and were invited to bring props and costumes, if desired. The kids were not required to memorize the lines!

The play started with baby Moses being retrieved from the river. The most memorable scene for me was the "cattle disease" scene, where the kids crawled around on the floor mooing, and then toppled over.

"Cattle disease" is one of the 10 plagues visited upon the people of Egypt when the hard-hearted Pharaoh refused to free the Hebrew slaves.

Last year my friend Judy added a twist to the presentation of the Passover story. Instead of using scripts, Judy prepared slips of paper listing various Passover story scenes. For example the slips included phrases such as "Moses and the burning bush," "Moses getting the Ten Commandments," and "Golden Calf: Moses squashes tablets."

After the guests arrived, Judy asked for two adult volunteers to gather the children and practice creating short skits. "I figured one of the volunteers would be you," she said to me.

How could I say no? After all, acting is my hobby. It will be fun, I thought to myself.

The slips of paper and the children's names were divided into two groups. The idea was that the two groups would alternate presenting the scenes.

Our friend Liz signed on as the second adult volunteer. We headed outside where the kids

were playing in the yard.

"Gather 'round kids, we're going to create a play," we yelled.

However, the kids on the play set just kept swinging and going down the slide. And the kids playing ball just kept pitching and swinging.

It was like the scene in the movie "The Ten Commandments" where everyone's having a good time worshipping the golden calf and Moses has to come and break up the party.

Outside all around me, the children were running and laughing and resisting any type of coordination.

Is this how Moses felt leading the Hebrews out of Egypt?

I looked enviously into the kitchen window and watched the adults inside mingling before the Seder.

Finally, we were able to command the kids' attention long enough to run through the list of scenes. Once we had them all gathered we decided there was strength in numbers. Rather than limiting specific kids to certain scenes, we eliminated the groupings and combined all the slips into a single chronological pile.

During the actual Seder, Liz and I took turns loosely narrating the story by announcing the next scene from the slips of paper. Ultimately, the kids improvised the scenes on their own.

They used a set of props that our hosts had gathered in advance. Really, they probably didn't need any adult intervention at all.

I liked watching the kids perform, but what I enjoyed most about the Seder was simply being together with the entire group. Although we are not related, we enjoy a kinship. Celebrating a holiday together helps keep us connected and gives us common memories to share.

While preparing for our Seder this year I wanted to do something different.

I have this idea for a "bag of plagues," I told my husband.

"Are you planning to capture your cough in a Ziploc bag?" he asked, bringing me a cup of tea.

"Very funny," I told him, "but no, this isn't related to my common cold."

I was talking about the 10 plagues from the Passover story. I had some thoughts on how to represent "hail" and "darkness," but there were still eight more

for which to account.

"If we want something different, why can't we just read the text in our Haggadah to tell the Passover story?" Jeff asked.

He was right. We never read those pages because for many years my home-made felt characters have been used to tell the story. And because I only made grown-up felt characters, we basically always skimmed over the part where the Pharaoh's daughter pulls baby Moses from the Nile River.

Gee, it would certainly have taken the pressure off to just read from the booklet. But what would a holiday be without stress and pressure? What better way to observe a holiday that celebrates freedom from slavery than by making oneself a slave to the occasion?

In other words, I enjoyed the freedom to make things as complicated as possible. At the same time, I tried not to be a martyr in my quest to add a creative twist to the holiday.

In the end I knew that my friends were coming to create memories and that we'd have a meaningful Passover celebration with or without a bag of plagues or an authentically roasted egg.


This week in weather

April 6, 1982 The Great Blizzard of '82 slammed New England, eastern New York, New Jersey and eastern Pennsylvania. The late season storm dumped 1 to 2 ft with winds locally topping 80 mph. 



Car woes can drive one to the edge

I love many things, but I do not love cars. Cars are transportation, nothing more. They're a way to get reliably from A to B, usually shuttling my three noisy children. I've never named a car, coveted a car, lusted after a car, or bought one to cheer myself up or prove my endless youth.

That said, this winter, I've come to realize how much my car means to me. It all started when I was pulled over by local sheriff's deputies about 5 miles from my house.

"Do you know why I stopped you?" asked the officer, who looked about a quarter of my age.

What's the appropriate answer to this question? Do I guess speeding, or running a light, thereby letting on I'm not only oblivious, but may have broken traffic laws? I had no clue.

"Your state inspection expired a month ago," he replied, as cars I was certain were all my neighbors slowed down to rubber neck the incident.

Who knew? Saying I was busy at Christmas didn't seem like a plausible excuse. I fumbled for my paperwork and waited while more cars passed by. My two sons laughed at me from the back seat as the officer completed a search of my criminal record. I considered telling him as a reporter for *The Spotlight*, I read the crime blotter weekly and I was quite certain I wasn't a dangerous criminal. Instead, I accepted the ticket and had a date to provide proof of inspection at the Malta Town Court three weeks later.

It took two days to get an appointment for the car check-

up, and I drove gingerly, waiting to be flagged down again. My 1999 Honda CRV passed the inspection, but the shop guys clicked their tongues in sympathy when I showed them my yellow ticket.

"Yellow, that's bad," they shook their heads. "That's a \$150 fine right there."

Rather than pleading guilty, I went to Malta Town Court to plead ignorance. I stood in the crowded hallway waiting my turn, feeling like I was headed to the principal's office.

Amazingly, the judge let me off with a stern glare, I think because my fellow driving criminals showed no signs of contrition. Here's a tip: If you're ticketed for trespassing on your snowmobile, don't stand directly outside the judge's quarters telling your buddies, "The 'No Trespassing,' sign wasn't even that big, and anyway, I didn't think it applied at night, and I didn't come more than 10 feet to hitting that old lady's house."

My car soap opera was far from over. One week later, in the icy, slushy winter mix blanketing the roads, again less than 5 miles from my home, a teenager fishtailed into my lane and smashed in the front of my car. She cried so much I took on a motherly role and reassured her she wouldn't be grounded for life. No one was injured, we were approaching a stop sign and going about 10 mph, all wearing seatbelts.

A bunch of paperwork later, as the teenager's mother arrived and indeed grounded her for life, I drove my now unsightly car home. A mountain of DMV and insurance paperwork later, I got into a body shop and was told the bumper and grille would take 24 hours to mend. In the meantime, there was a rental car waiting.

Let me tell you one thing about driving around three children. You need four doors. In fact, I'd like a conveyor belt to simply corral the kids into their seats.

I received from the rental dealer what my sons would call a "hot rod." It had two doors and was so low to the ground I had to step up to exit. It was so cramped, when I lifted a can of soda to take the last slurp in the driver's seat, the can grazed the ceiling. And I'm not a tall woman.

To my kids' delight, the mini clown car had bells and whistles. It had a thermometer that told the weather outside, and a CD player that scrolled the name of the radio station AND the song being played. I think it's a bad idea to build an entertainment system into the dashboard. I found myself sitting at traffic lights guessing the artist on the radio, a distinctly distracting trivia game.

I turned on the windshield wipers when I wanted my high beams, the hazard lights when I wanted rear defrost, and squirted wiper fluid only on the back windshield. I believed, if I was stopped for speeding, I could honestly tell the police I couldn't read my speedometer.

I began to lose organizational skills I hadn't known included my car. Where was my red Sharpie pen? The face powder that took away the winter pallor? My reporter's notebook with my notes on the last school board meeting? My hand sanitizer? All in my car.

More than 24 hours later, I received a call from my friends at the body shop.

"The parts we ordered don't fit," they began. "And there was more damage underneath when we took it apart. And now you need new headlights. It'll be another day and a half."

I begged the rental car man for a car that hadn't been miniaturized. I got a KIA whose panel controls I also couldn't decipher. I began to pine for my CRV.

Under the ruse of needing to collect my garage door opener, I stopped at the shop to visit my CRV. Abandoned amidst vehicles that must have been in a demolition derby, my car looked exposed. The front end was missing, and the cracked fender was tossed in the back seat. I could see the plastic jug for the windshield fluid.

"Can I help you?" asked a repair guy.

"No, I'm just visiting," I mumbled.

Over the next four days before my car came home, my kids asked me to pick them up from school (apparently, they've been embarrassed of my CRV all these years) and drive the back roads of Ballston racing the KIA's engine. I didn't drag race, but I found myself driving a bit faster and listening to the CD player a bit louder. In short, I became a different driver. The age of rental cars should be measured like dog years - people drive them with no sense of future repair liabilities.

Despite the rental guy telling me the car "wasn't thirsty" and wouldn't need gas, I had to pull up to the pumps. I didn't know where either the gas cap or the release was, and once I found them, I automatically filled the tank for \$30. About 20 minutes later, they called to say my CRV was ready. Had I been able to siphon off some of that gas in the rental, I would have.

Five days later and double the estimated cost, I drove my CRV home with its gleaming new front end. I have to re-learn all the controls, and I still reach for the wrong place to shift gears, but I have to say this: I am very fond of my car.

Family talks disability reform with Spitzer

Careys call meetings with governor, inspector general 'productive'

In the wake of their autistic son's death, the parents of 13-year-old Jonathan Carey are closer to their goal of reforming the system that they said ultimately failed their family.

Last week, Michael and Lisa Carey had a meeting with Gov. Eliot Spitzer and Inspector General Kristine Hamann. The family had previously sought meetings with the governor and the inspector general in the Pataki administration prior to their son's death.

Michael Carey said the meeting with Spitzer on Tuesday, March 20, was productive and lasted about 20 minutes.

"We felt that he really listened to our concerns," said Carey.

The Careys discussed the problems they believe exist in the state's regulatory agencies for facilities for the disabled, including the Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities and the Center for Quality Care.

The Careys and state lawmakers have called for an investigation of those two state offices, following the alleged mistreatment of Jonathan at the Anderson School in Dutchess County, which led to him being transferred to O.D. Heck, a Schenectady facility.

Jonathan Carey died Thursday, Feb. 15, after he was allegedly restrained inappropriately while being transported from the O.D. Heck Developmental Center to Crossgates Mall.

The Careys said they are

dedicated to bringing reform to the state regulatory agencies so there's genuine accountability regarding the treatment of the disabled and not an atmosphere of trying to protect the people involved.

In addition to his meeting with the governor, Michael Carey said that the meeting with the inspector general and her staff, which lasted nearly two hours, was also productive, and that the office has launched an investigation into the family's allegations.

The Careys contend that the system, as it is set up now, protects individuals, schools, facilities and even state agencies from being held accountable by the criminal justice system.

Carey said he is optimistic that Jonathan's Law, legislation intended to reform the state's mental health care system and toughen abuse laws, would come together soon. Carey said he and his wife, Lisa, have been

working with the legislators to draft a law that would be acceptable to everyone.

"So when it's ready to go, it can be passed in the Senate and the house (Assembly), and the governor can sign it," said Carey.

The Careys said they have received strong backing from legislators on the reforms they seek.

"New York state law does not provide adequate levels of punishment for those who knowingly place incompetent and physically disabled persons into danger," said Sen. Thomas Morahan, R-New City, chairman of the Senate Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Committee.

Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno, R-Brunswick, had previously called for an investigation into the regulatory agencies by the inspector general "not only regarding the possible mistreatment of Jonathan Carey at the Anderson School, but into the state agencies responsible for the

oversight of these facilities."

For the safety of the individuals that rely on the state's mental health care system for support, Carey said the quicker the law is passed, the better, so long as expedience doesn't diminish the law's original intent: genuine reform.

"Things are moving," said Carey. "And we're moving on some other avenues, too."

Carey said that they have asked Diana Jones Ritter, the new commissioner of OMRDD,

to look into changing policy to prevent mental health workers from working double shifts and limit the amount of overtime.

The Careys said they recently discovered that one of the workers charged in the death of their son had allegedly worked 10 consecutive 16-hour days.

The Careys had testified last summer at an Assembly hearing to address this issue.

"We felt that it was a recipe for abuse," said Carey.

"We felt that he really listened to our concerns."





Home at last: Crowds gather to celebrate family's 'Extreme Home'

"This part is really fun," said Eduardo Xol, one of five designers from the reality show "Extreme Makeover: Home Edition" minutes before revealing the new home he helped build in a week for one Colonie family.

For hours, thousands of spectators stood, lining the road leading to the cul-de-sac at the end of Fairway Lane where, for the last week, hundreds of volunteers worked day and night to build a new home for Debbie Oatman-Gaitan and her four sons.

They held signs reading, "Move that bus!" They had many opportunities to belt out the phrase as cast and crew amped the crowd for the arrival of the family.

After a run-through with a stand-in family, and three takes with the Oatman-Gaitan family, shortly after

3 p.m. on Thursday, March 29, host Ty Pennington ordered the tour bus to move.

It was Debbie's birthday, literally.

Tears streaked down the mother's face as her four sons gawked in disbelief at the new home. One son could only point in awe.

"Debbie and her kids really deserve to come home to a place that is safe and loving," said Xol.

The experience had been one

of the more rewarding builds in the show's four seasons on air, said Xol, who was joined by Paige Hemmis, another designer on the show. Both said they hope it will shed some light on, and help educate people about, HIV.

The show also sent a team to New Paltz while the family's home was nearing completion to renovate a room at Camp Heartland. The organization operates outreach programs for children ages 7 to 17 living with HIV or AIDS.

Almost 20 years ago, Oatman-Gaitan opened her home to an HIV-positive child and later took in the boy's biological brothers, also HIV-positive. The home at 23 Fairway Lane had become overcrowded as the three shared the limited space with Debbie's biological son.

Oatman-Gaitan's former raised ranch had been sinking into the surrounding wetlands. The failing foundation caused walls and joints to slip, break and crack. Mold and mildew claimed the home's basement long ago.

More than three years ago, Oatman-Gaitan wrote to the show's producers hoping to be featured as the next family to receive a home makeover. She was selected for a two-hour special to run 7 p.m. Sunday, May 20, on WTEN, Channel 10.

The building of the family's new, approximately 3,700-square-foot home, complete with pool and proper

drainage of its surrounding property, was a challenge for both the show and town of Colonie.

Typically, the show hasn't built on a cul-de-sac or dead-end road, said Colonie police Chief Steven Heider. At one point, as the plan came together for the family's new home, there were talks of whether it could be done. Lead builders on the project, Amedore Homes, insisted that it could be done.

"It's what we expected," said Heider, who with town Supervisor Mary Brizzell watched the unveiling from within the confines of barricades containing the crowd.

The volunteer turnout was a huge success, according to Amedore spokesman Peter Guidarelli. Donations amounted to tens of thousands of dollars for the family,

and the work of the builders kept the project on pace, he said. Around-the-clock builders put in many hours with little sleep to assure the breakneck pace was maintained so that five days after the home's demolition on Saturday, March 24, it would be completed for the "reveal."

Work on the site will continue for the next couple of weeks as crews patch together any damage done to the properties of the neighbors who loaned the space for storage and as a place for onlookers to gather.

Police will maintain a presence on Fairway Lane, north of Consaul Road, as many people are sure to visit the site to look at Oatman-Gaitan's new home, said Heider.





Calling in a road in ruins: Drivers can report potholes

Kablam!

That's the sound of a car hitting a pothole that has seemingly opened up overnight. The pothole lies in wait for an unsuspecting driver on the way to work to run over it - with the accompanying crunching sound of shocks, chassis and undercarriage, as well as shouted obscenities.

The state Department of Transportation is asking drivers who encounter potholes on any state road to call 1-800-POTHOLE, (800) 768-4653.

"The program has been in place since 1996," said Carol Breen, DOT spokeswoman.

By calling the hot line, motorists can help the department locate potholes caused by winter conditions, so workers can get them patched up promptly and maintain smooth and safe conditions on state roads.

As of late March, the hot line had received more than 20 calls.

"Last year, we received 55 calls to the phone line in New York," said Breen.

DOT oversees almost 5,000 miles of Capital District roads every year.

"We are committed to enhancing the mobility of New York's motorists by constantly working to provide safe, efficient and reliable trips through preventive maintenance and repair," acting Commissioner Astrid C. Glynn said.

The state Thruway Authority also participates in the call-in program.

"The Authority is glad to participate in this program again this year as part of its efforts to improve the customers' experience on the highways," said authority Executive Director Michael R. Fleischer.

Calls received by the hot line are directed to the closest DOT or Thruway Authority maintenance facility, from which a maintenance crew will be dispatched as soon as weather conditions and other factors permit.

Individuals calling the hot line will be asked to provide detailed information regarding the location of the pothole, including the name of the community or county, state route number or interstate; closest reference marker number; closest

exit number; the direction of travel and the nearest landmark or crossroad. People who report potholes and want to be notified of their repair should leave their names and addresses for follow-up.

"If a car is damaged by a NYS DOT pothole you can file a claim with our legal department who will investigate the claim," said Breen.

Just make sure when you call, you are using a hands-free cell phone with headset or that you pull over to the side of the road or a police officer might ticket you.

A pothole starts when a crack in the surface of the pavement allows water to seep into the road. Cold weather causes the water to freeze, creating a bulge in the pavement. When the temperature warms above freezing, the pavement surface returns to its original level. Subsequent freeze-thaw cycles weaken the pavement material and a pothole forms. Heavy traffic also contributes to the creation of new potholes and the worsening of existing ones.

V'ville OKs school budget

Board adds full-time social worker position

Voters in the Voorheesville School District will decide on a \$21,073,101 budget for the 2007-2008 school year that includes a move to hire a full-time social worker due to growing concerns about student behavior.

"What we have over the years is an explosion of kids not being able to handle our academic programs," said school board member C. James Coffin, who recommended the district hire a full-time social worker at the Monday, April 2, meeting of the board. The board had been considering a part-time employee for the position.

"There is a recognition in other schools that kids come to school with problems," Coffin added.

The board passed the budget unanimously but narrowly approved the addition of a full-time social worker, 4 to 3.

School board president David Gibson, one of the dissenting votes, questioned why the motion was not brought up until the night a budget was to be adopted.

"If this is the single most important priority, why didn't we get that information until

tonight?" Gibson asked.

High school Principal Mark Diefendorf said the need for a full-time social worker arose after further discussion with staff.

"This school worker is the single most important thing needed in the district," Diefendorf said.

Gibson said he is also concerned about the tax levy increase related to the budget.

"We have to pay attention to the tax burden we put on people here," said Gibson.

The board also voted to upgrade a half-time elementary teacher to full time at an approximate cost of \$32,000 and the addition of \$18,000 to pay the tuition for one student to attend the new Tech Valley High School.

The newly adopted budget raises spending about \$260,000 from the current school year with a proposed tax levy increase of around 5.4 percent.

The proposed budget would result in a tax rate of \$17.30 per \$1,000 of assessed value, or about an increase of \$219 on a home worth \$250,000.

The proposed tax rate increase was about \$20 less before the two new additions.

A number of residents at the March 26 meeting of the board's budget committee spoke in favor of the addition of a full-time teacher at the

elementary school to combat rising enrollment rates.

Tanya Hensel, president of the PTA, said that after speaking with students and parents, she sensed that they were overwhelmingly in support of the addition of a full-time teacher.

The full-time teaching position would keep class sizes more manageable, with around 20 students, rather than 25 or 26. Residents who spoke said that personal attention and teacher stress were the two main concerns with rising class sizes.

Gibson said that while he would like to see classrooms have the minimum number of students, the board had to consider whether or not the addition of a teacher was reasonable and whether or not the public would approve it.

Superintendent Linda Langevin stressed the important of keeping class size down.

"We've kept the class sizes smaller in this district and I think you can see that in our graduates," said Langevin.





Department of Motor Vehicles next month.

Deputy Supervisor Dan Plummer, who is a part-time town board member, will most likely assume Egan's duties immediately following her departure. However, at the Wednesday, March 28, meeting of the town board, Plummer said the town needs someone full time, and he is unable to serve in that capacity.

"I am in a position where I cannot devote full-time to the business of supervisor," Plummer said.

Plummer put forth a motion to meet and discuss the transition period between Egan and the next supervisor on April 12, with the intention of having the town appoint an interim supervisor to fill the position until the November election.

Cunningham, a Delmar resident and county legislator in the 34th District since 2004, is

"I am very interested in filling the vacancy when Terri leaves," said Cunningham. "Since I was a kid, I always wanted to be the town supervisor, but the hardest part for my family is the immediacy of all this."

If the town board were to appoint Cunningham on April 12, he would then have to resign from both his part-time county legislative seat and his full-time employment at Key Bank, where he serves as a technology project manager.

Town board member Kyle Kotary said no matter what the town board decides, the residents will see the same quality of leadership that Egan provided.

"We are losing a great supervisor in Terri, but the ship is headed in the right direction," Kotary said. "We will still have a smooth transition."

Kotary agreed that Cunningham would be a great supervisor.

"I support him both personally and professionally," said Kotary.

"This is a huge step for me, but I am excited about it," said Cunningham.

The town supervisor position pays \$99,000 annually. There are currently three Democrats and one Independent on the board who will make the decision about the interim supervisor.

Also at the Wednesday meeting, the board approved a measure allowing Living Resources to locate a group home for four developmentally disabled women at 61 Orchard Street. The board unanimously passed the measure just two weeks after tabling the issue to allow residents of the Orchard Street neighborhood more time to learn about the organization. Once again, a large group of residents were on hand to support Living Resources.

State Archives sponsors research Contest

To encourage students to use historical records, the New York State Archives, a program of the state Education Department, is sponsoring the 17th annual Student Research Awards. The 2007 contest is open to all New York students in grades 4 to 12 who use historical records in their research projects.

The awards are presented each year: grades 4 to 5, grades 6 to 8, and grades 9 to 12. The awards

consist of a framed certificate, a check for \$100 from an endowment established by Regent Emerita Laura Chodos and her husband Robert Chodos, an invitation to have lunch with the Regents in Albany and a behind-the-scenes tour of the state archives.

Eligible projects are computer-based entries, such as Web sites or PowerPoint presentations; exhibits; documentaries; performances; research for a historical marker, property or district; and traditional research papers.

Julie Daniels, coordinator of the awards program, explained that in order for an entry to be competitive, a substantial portion of the research should be based on historical records from archives, museums, historical societies, libraries, local governments, or other organizations.

convincing the public to support the fiscal plan during the May 15 budget vote.

Last year's first attempt at passing a budget was soundly defeated by voters.

The longest point of discussion this year was whether or not to replace four part-time teachers and house leaders at the middle school with two full-time junior administrators at a cost of \$85,000.

At its March 21 meeting, the school board eliminated the middle school proposal and cut back the time teachers would work as house leaders. That move created a minor uproar with both parents and house leaders at the March 28 meeting. They urged the board to make the switch back to two full-time administrators or at least bring back the part-time house leaders. House leaders Mary Blake and Robert Salamone defended the current structure.

"I would like you to think about going back to the original proposal," said Salamone at the meeting.

Blake said she believed in the house leader role as it now exists with part-time teachers performing the duties.

"We built it to what it is today

and we cannot do it with a reduction," said Blake.

One concern of the school board was the hiring of two new administrators in the district, but Superintendent Les Loomis said that administrators work more days than teachers in a school year and will be put to good use by the district.

"For each full-time administrator position, you receive 20

State have put themselves in deep trouble voting on aid assumptions that didn't come true," said board president Stuart Lyman.

Loomis said he was confident that there would be the case.

"There is a good chance Bethlehem may see an increase," Loomis said.

The new school budget also adds two new middle school teachers, three new custodians for the added school construction, one new technology position and a full-time payroll clerk. Several new positions were added in the area of special education, but the district is expecting a cost savings to offset the cost of those positions.

Several thousands of dollars were placed back in this year's budget to restore field trips, ice hockey, gymnastics and cheerleading.

"This budget restores those most difficult cuts," said Loomis.

Other highlights of the 2007-2008 budget include a new high school alternative education program and a proposition to purchase 15 new buses at \$1.13 million.

The next step in the budget process will be a public hearing for the community to speak on the new proposal. That hearing will be held in April.

more days of work or 40 more days of work for two administrators as opposed to part-time teachers acting as house leaders," Loomis pointed out.

Another factor in the school board's change of heart was news that the district would be receiving a minimum of \$100,000 more in state aid, essentially paying for the administrative posts without raising taxes.

Assistant superintendent for finance Steve O'Shea said he believes the estimate in increased school state aid is a conservative one.



"He was an outstanding coach and teacher who I really enjoyed working with," Abba said. "He had a great sense of humor and was a joy to work with."

A letter was sent home on Monday, April 2, notifying parents about Klugman's death and how staff members were working to help students cope. Klugman's funeral is scheduled for Wednesday, April 4 at St. Teresa of Avila Church, 435 New Scotland Ave., Albany. School activities will continue as planned.

"It's very important for students that the school day proceeds as normal," said Loomis.

Klugman is survived by his wife Diane, and two sons, Billy and Patrick. Memorial contributions may be made to an education fund that is being established for Klugman's sons.







Grief has many faces and they have come to life in Curtain Call Theatre's regional premiere of 'Rabbit Hole,' a story of a middle-class couple who are mourning the loss of their son, Danny. In its last week, the play will run Wednesday and Thursday, April 4 and 5 at 7:30 p.m. and Friday and Saturday, April 6 and 7, at 8 p.m. at the theater located at 210 Old Loudon Road in Latham.

According to theater owner and actress, Carol Max, 'Rabbit Hole' is an up-close-and-personal look at a family going through grief. Nothing seems out of place when the play begins; however, reminders of young Danny soon emerge. Becca, played by Max, and Howie, played by Steve Fletcher, try to move beyond their deep sense of loss in their own ways.

"It's a play about normal people going through abnormal things," said Max. In fact, Max said that many people who have seen the play have been in the same situation.

"Some said it was cathartic. Some said it was difficult," Max said.



Though the play may sound depressing, Max said that 'Rabbit Hole' is a moving play that has affected patrons deeply.

"We have received more letters, e-mails, and personal calls than any other production we have done in seven years," said Max.

Fletcher, who has been the theater's resident director for several years, stepped out from behind the scenes to play Howie and said that it provoked mixed emotions in him.

"It was terrifying. I hadn't acted in nine years," Fletcher said. "I really had to refine the process. However, I have enjoyed every moment of it."

Fletcher said that Howie's outbursts have been challenging, but that he has aimed to improve with each performance.

"You really have to put your

mind right," Fletcher said. "I try to be the best artist I can with each performance."

Max said that she was very moved after seeing "Rabbit Hole" on Broadway a year ago and thought that the part of Becca suited her well. The theater applied for the rights to do the play for the first time in the region and, according to Max, is only the eighth theater in the country to be given rights.

Though "Rabbit Hole" is rated R, Max said that is because

of strong language that occurs about two to three times in the play.

"There's really no adult content," she said. "However, it isn't really a play for children unless the family is into the theatre," Max said.





much tougher. After all, there's only so much Curt Schilling can do.

The Yankees don't have a lot to brag about with their rotation. Chien-Ming Wang may have won 19 games last year, but he made his defense work for every win because he can't strike anyone out. And exactly how much do Mike Mussina and Andy Pettitte have left in their tanks? I hate to say it, but Carl Pavano may wind up being the Yankees' ace, unless Clemens comes back to the Bronx.

Eventually, Clemens' choice will come down to which AL East team has the better chance of going to the World Series. That being said, my guess is he'll wind up joining the Yankees, which will put them over the top. At least, as far as the AL East is concerned. Wait until you see my World Series prediction.

• When will Barry Bonds break Hank Aaron's home run record? Some people probably figure it will happen in the middle of the season. I think the wait could go longer than that.

The problem isn't Bonds' health or his age. The problem is the lineup around Bonds isn't all that good. There isn't another true power threat on San Francisco's lineup card (Ray Durham may be a good hitter, but he isn't good enough to protect Bonds in the lineup). That means opposing teams are going to continue pitching around Bonds with little fear of severe consequences.

Bonds will still get his 22 home runs to break Aaron's three-decade-old record, but I think it will take him until September to get there.

• Will either of last year's World Series combatants reach the Fall Classic this year? Highly unlikely. St. Louis has too many questions in its pitching rotation this year and has to deal with a more competitive National League Central division. Detroit has the tools to get back there, but the Tigers must avoid a now common post-World Series letdown (there hasn't been a team that's reached consecutive World Series since the Yankees in 2000 and 2001).

Which brings me to this question:

• Who will be in the 2007 World Series? As much as I'd like to predict a Subway Series between the Yankees and Mets, I think there will be a Freeway Series between the Los Angeles Dodgers and the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim (a name I wish would be changed back to the Anaheim Angels). Both teams have solid pitching, powerful lineups and smart managers — the three ingredients needed to reach the Fall Classic. The Yankees and Mets can only boast two of those three ingredients right now.

In the end, I think the Angels will wind up winning the whole thing, but the beauty of baseball is it's still unpredictable. Well, unless you're the Washington Nationals, Kansas City Royals or Tampa Bay Devil Rays. They're the only sure things about baseball — they will occupy last place in their respective divisions.

on a third.

Marr's sales pitch to Schongar back then — bigger things lie ahead.

"He told me we'd be one of the top 10 teams in the country," said Schongar.

Coincidentally, Schongar's first season at Albany was the first one in four years where the Great Danes failed to win the America East title. UMBC took care of that by beating Albany 19-10 in the championship game.

Needless to say, the Great Danes were not about to let UMBC do that to them Saturday. Albany jumped out to a 5-1 half-time lead and never let the Retrievers get any closer than two goals the rest of the way.

"We talked about it right after we beat Colgate (last Tuesday)," said Marr. "We reminded them about last year's loss, and we definitely had motivation."

Leading scorers Frank Resetarits and Merrick Thomson played their usual roles for Albany in the victory. Resetarits registered three goals and an assist, while Thomson scored twice before leaving the game in the fourth quarter with a hip injury.

But the Great Danes proved that they are more than just a two-man show. Corey Small contributed two goals, while Jordan Levine supplied a career-high three assists to go along with a second quarter goal. Mike Ammann and Derek Dale each added a goal and two assists.

"The thing is we put eight kids, nine kids or 10 kids on the field who can score," said Marr.

Even goaltender Brett Queener tried to get into the act. He charged down field several times and carried the ball into the offensive third of the field twice looking for a shot.

That move came back to haunt Queener once, as UMBC forced him to turn the ball over and scored before he got back between the pipes. But Marr said he doesn't mind seeing him take that chance.

"He makes so many things happen ... but it makes your heart stop for a moment when he's running back," said Marr. "Fortunately, he gets back quickly."

It's that fearless style of play — whether it's a full-field charge by Queener or a rocket shot from

Resetarits or Thomson — that could propel Albany to the top of the NCAA heap. Unlike other major Division I sports such as football or basketball, lacrosse isn't dominated by large universities with multi-million dollar budgets. A smaller school like Johns Hopkins or Princeton can compete at the same level as a Syracuse or a Virginia.

The Great Danes — with an 8-0 record, a top-five ranking and wins against Johns Hopkins, Massachusetts and now UMBC — figure they're up there with the elite. And it's exactly what Marr envisioned.

"I imagined winning a national championship every day," he said. "You can't do it if you don't dream it."

2007: Year of the Dog

Great Danes set
sights on national
championship

Don't tell University at Albany men's lacrosse coach Scott Marr that winning a national championship is out of the question.

He's only been dreaming about the moment since he arrived five years ago, and now he said he has the team that can do it.

"We've got every position filled," said Marr. "We have a

goaltender, we have a good defense, we have a strong midfield and we have good goal scorers on the attack. It's just a matter of playing well."

The Great Danes have been playing well — well enough to be ranked second in the nation by Marr's peers in the coaches' poll and fourth by the media that follows the NCAA Division I world.

High praise indeed for a program that is only five years removed from being an afterthought on its own campus.

"It's a little bit (weird), but we don't care," said sophomore long-stick midfielder Chris Schongar

a Shenendehowa graduate. "We don't look at the rankings. We want to win the (America East) conference first."

Albany took a big step toward that goal Saturday at Fallon Field by beating America East rival University of Maryland-Baltimore County 13-9. The Retrievers had been a thorn in the Great Danes' side for the last three years, beating Albany four out of their last five meetings before Saturday.

"We needed this for home-field advantage (in the America East playoffs)," said Schongar. "We knew if we beat them today, we'd have an excellent chance of hosting the tournament."

The scene at Fallon Field — an overflow crowd of 1,225 including several hundred Albany students — was a far cry from what Great Dane home games were like when they jumped to the Division I level five years ago. Back then, there were more Albany players on the sideline than there were fans watching the games.

Even when Marr recruited Schongar out of Shen three years ago, the program was only beginning to forge an identity with the Capital District sports community, having won two consecutive America East titles and working


Five questions for baseball season

tion than Reyes, Paul Lo Duca, Beltran, Carlos Delgado and Wright. A little help from the likes of Alou, Shawn Green and Jose Valentin is all it will take for the Mets to put up a lot of runs.

- Will this be the year the Boston Red Sox catch the New York Yankees in the American League East? It all depends on which team Roger Clemens chooses to pitch for.

The Red Sox and the Yankees both need Clemens in their rotations if they have any hopes of going deep into the playoffs. The Red Sox are in better shape on paper with the addition of Daisuke Matsuzaka, but if he has a hard time adjusting to American baseball, it will make Boston's task of unseating the Yankees that



about.”

According to Poust, the 500,000 students across the state who attend private and parochial schools — 300,000 of whom attend the state’s 700 Catholic schools — save the state some \$7.5 billion a year because parents pay school taxes but do not get anything in return.

“It is in the state’s interest to have private and parochial schools be successful and be strong,” he said. “Every parent who sends their child to a non-public school is saving the state money. Why shouldn’t the state help them a little?”

For those in the suburbs, the growing number of charter schools scattered throughout urban centers like Albany are rarely an option for their kids. Instead, parochial and private schools are alternatives for quality education that have withstood the test of time. And while school districts throughout the state are required to



provide textbooks for parochial schools, parents can still face hefty tuition bills costing thousands of dollars every year. The question for many suburban families has become how to pay for the myriad services that are available.

On the flip side, New York State United Teachers Union President Richard Iannuzzi said if a person chooses to buy books at Borders, they should not have access to tax dollars earmarked for libraries, for example, to offset the cost.

“Government is obligated to provide certain services, and the citizen has a choice to use them or not use them, but the citizen should not be compensated for not using them,” he said. “It should not be a statement about parental choice. The option is there for parents if they choose to send their child to a private or parochial school, but they are the ones who should be picking up the tab.”

Iannuzzi added, “Giving tax breaks for private and parochial school tuition opens a door that should not be open.”

Fundamentally, he said, the idea of using public dollars to support private or parochial schools goes against the basic principle of separation of church and state. Similarly, while charter schools are technically public entities

funded with tax dollars, the population as a whole does not have a say in how its tax dollars are spent.

“Charter schools for the local taxpayers becomes taxation without representation,” Iannuzzi said. “Tax dollars are spent by a school board taxpayers did not elect. Look at how much time and debate is spent on how a school budget is put together every year and contrast that with charter schools — the majority of taxpayers have no say in what that budget looks like, yet they are paying for it.”

Many local parents echo that sentiment.

“To be honest with you, I personally don’t agree with giving parents a tax deduction because they decide to take their kids out of the local public schools,” said Mike Cleary, the parent of children in Niskayuna’s Eirchwood Elementary School. “It is their choice to put their son or daughter in a private school and there is a cost that comes with that decision.”

Others are waiting to see

how the state budget plays out in the coming days.

Mary Baker, co-president of the Bethlehem Central Community Organization, said Gov. Eliot Spitzer’s private-school tax break idea should be looked at as part of an overall education plan.

“I’d be interested to see all the details, but I do trust the governor to understand the educational needs of our young people, and to make this part of a comprehensive plan to improve educational achievement,” Baker said.

Vikki Durrick, co-president of a parent teacher organization in Niskayuna, declined to take sides on the issue until the details are fleshed out.

“Donations to organizations like the PTO already are tax-deductible because we are a nonprofit, so that helps some,” said Durrick. “Other than that, I’d rather not comment on this idea as I haven’t really seen how the whole thing would work.”

In his budget plan, the governor proposed raising the cap on charter schools from 100 to 250 but also offered transition aid for those cities, like Buffalo and Albany, that have a high number of students in charter schools.

Another of the governor’s proposals would demand public schools defend their performance and their use of tax dollars or risk losing funding.

Spitzer did attempt to divert some of the additional money from the more affluent districts, namely those on Long Island, to those more needy in the inner cities, but Senate Republicans, who successfully advocated for more funding across the board.

In the end, the tentative budget agreement spends nearly \$2 billion more on school aid than what was spent in the last fiscal year, which ended March 31.




