Undiscovered Summer

Capital District counties offer
little-known and low-priced attractions

The Capital District has no shortage of surprising and inexpensive attractions and events to take the edge off another summer of high temperatures and soaring gasoline prices.

Schenectady surprises

Wendy Hosking Glasser, the special events coordinator for Schenectady County, said there are many attractions in Schenectady that are either under-advertised or overshadowed by more prominent attractions in other counties.

She lists the Mabee Farm Historic Site, the oldest standing home in the Mohawk Valley, 3th Empire State Aerospace Museum in Glenville by the airport and Schenectady Heritage Area tours of the Electric City's Stockade historic district as attractions that people don't really know about.

Glasser said another little-known attraction may be one that people have seen a number of times but aren't sure what it is.

"I know people know it by sight, but the Nott Memorial is a

Vista hearing turns sour

Town officials deny
charges of unethical
behavior

A public hearing that began Wednesday, June 13, on the master plan for Vista Technology Park will be picked up again Wednesday, June 27, after ending with a developer who owns property next to the park accusing town officials of unethical behavior.

Constantine Kontogiannis, representing KKS properties, accused Supervisor Jack Cunningham and Economic Development and Planning Director George Leveille of unethical behavior after a private meeting inside town hall between BBL Development, the owners of Vista Park, and KKS the Friday before the public hearing.

"I was accused of being a greedy developer and greeted in an outright hostile manner," said Kontogiannis, about the meeting, which was held to try to resolve a dispute related to

Board readies full-day K proposal

District to decide if
program is a good fit
for students

A decision on whether to implement a full-day kindergarten program for Bethlehem students is expected at the school board's Wednesday, June 20, meeting, and any decision will likely have a lasting impact.

Bethlehem is currently part of a small percentage of districts across the state that maintain a half-day kindergarten program. Out of 696 districts in New York,

616 offer full-day programs and 38, or 5 percent, offer a half-day program.

Superintendent Les Loomis and district administration officials have said they would like to move to a full-day program for several reasons. Money is now available from the state for the transition, and there is a growing sentiment among school officials that full-day kindergarten provides 5-year-olds with a more structured and balanced educational day.

"I think I am leaning in that direction," said board member Lynne Lenhardt, who was one of three board members in 1997 who unanimously voted for the

Bethlehem police charge two in DWI arrests

A 45-year-old Delmar resident was charged with driving while intoxicated by Bethlehem police after driving past a school crossing guard on Delaware Avenue.

Lila Mae Woodgate was charged with DWI, driving with more than .08 percent blood alcohol content and driving with no front license plates. According to the police report, Woodgate allegedly drove past the Elsmere School crossing guards without stopping on

the morning of Friday, June 8. Her vehicle was stopped by police a short time later in Delaware Avenue Plaza. Woodgate told police she was stopping at Hannaford to get some doughnuts when she was pulled over. She also told police she was driving her boyfriend's car.

Woodgate was expected to be in Bethlehem Town Court Tuesday, June 19, to respond to the charge.

• Bruce Huni, of 60 Mansion Blvd., Albany, was charged with DWI by Bethlehem police.

Huni was driving along Delaware Avenue when police radar clocked his vehicle speeding. An officer from Bethlehem tried to pull Huni's car over near a red traffic light when the light turned green and Huni sped away, driving across the center dividing line into the other lane, according to reports.

He was pulled over a short

time later near 447 Delaware Ave. Huni told police he had a few beers.

He was placed into custody after failing field sobriety tests and was charged with speeding, failure to keep right and driving with more than .08 blood alcohol content. He will appear in Town Court on June 26.

• A Selkirk man was sent to Albany County jail for burglary after being arrested at his home in Selkirk.

Police apprehended David

Burghoffer, 45, of 27 Garden Circle, and charged him with petit larceny and burglary second degree, a felony.

Burghoffer was arrested at his home on Saturday, June 9, and surrendered to Bethlehem police without incident. He was placed into custody and sent to Albany County jail without bail due to having four prior felony convictions.

He will appear in Bethlehem Town Court, July 10.

Buckle Up New York finishes 21st wave

The New York State Police in G Troop completed the 21st wave of Buckle Up New York on June 3.

Troopers conducted pre survey compliance checks throughout the 10 counties of G Troop and found an 86 percent compliance rate with the use of seat belts and child safety restraints. After a 14-day blitz of road checks and dedicated patrols, the post survey compliance rates showed an increase to 92 percent. Much of this was accomplished with a two-pronged campaign of increased public awareness as well as an enforcement initiative.

The enforcement side of the wave netted the issuance

of 1,810 tickets; 1757 for seatbelts and 53 for lack of proper child restraints. These traffic violations were the combined results of the Buckle Up dedicated road checks as well as routine patrol during those 14 days. In addition to the safety restraint violations, 912 speeding tickets were given out as well as 51 driving while intoxicated arrests made. During this time period 274 collisions occurred with 86 people being injured and one death. Some of these injuries were directly due to lack of seat belt use.

These are local G Troop statistics only and not statewide ones.

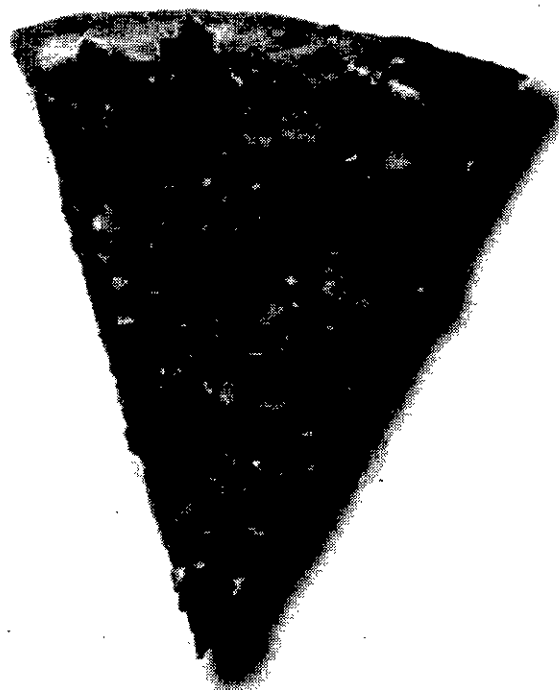

New owners jazz up java joint

Menu to stay the same, but products will be locally produced

The new owners and the previous owners of Java Jazz Café and Bakery may be different in many ways, but one thing they have in common is the passion to own and operate a small business.

Everett "Doc" Rivers, the former Java Jazz owner, has turned the Delaware Avenue business over to new proprietors Catherine Callan and Mary Alice Smith. For Rivers, beset by a series of health problems the past few years, the transition is bittersweet.

"It was a very difficult move for me, but I saw in these ladies the same sort of passion that I had for the business," said Rivers.

Callan and Smith, both from Delmar, are members of Bethlehem Neighbors for Peace. They started talking about their dream of owning a business six months ago while cooking for large Neighbors events.

"Mary Alice and I are both local activists, and our goal is to bring locally produced food to Java Jazz," Callan said.

The menu will stay the same,

with pita wrap specials like the Tijuana Tuna and the Hamolulu. The only change is that many dairy, bread and coffee products will be purchased locally.

"I am researching all the different sources of coffee and sampling baked goods from local bakeries and shopping at farmers markets," said Smith. "I really feel the local economy is the way we need to go to support each other on a business basis."

Another goal down the road is to promote the creativity of local talent.

"We will be promoting local artists, musicians, storytellers, poets and hope to incorporate all that over a period of time," Callan said.

Rivers and his family have assisted Callan and Smith through the ownership transition, and each is complimentary of the other.

"We realize this business was built with integrity and care, and we recognize and appreciate that and hope to continue in that manner," Smith said.

The three existing full-time employees have agreed to stay with the new owners, and Callan and Smith said the transition could not have been made without them.

The Rivers family owned Java Jazz for seven years and, Rivers said, from the first day to the last, the experience was rewarding.

"Everything we did, we did it from the heart," said Rivers. "We told the community by our actions we have more than food to offer."

Rivers believes one of the reasons the business is so successful is because of the low-fat, flavorful Middle Eastern style flat bread used in a variety of sandwich offerings.

"Two-thirds of our business relied totally on our sandwich selection," said Rivers, who has seen an upswing in his health after having a bout with pneumonia, osteoporosis, and back and stomach surgery that saw him confined temporarily to a wheel chair.

"I have another day to live, breathe, walk and feel proud of my accomplishment," he said, an accomplishment that he said could not have been achieved without his family.

The new owners of Java Jazz Café and Bakery will be holding a grand re-opening to meet with the community Sunday, June 24, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Local artist Joan Byalin will display her textile art. Java Jazz is currently open Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Saturdays 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Catering for all occasions can also be done on request by calling 439-1727.

Public works commish retires

Oliver Holmes used technology to improve efficiency

Bethlehem Public Works Commissioner Oliver Holmes is retiring, but not without first evaluating the department's multimillion-dollar assets and helping town fathers plan for the future.

"Leaving is always mixed," said Holmes in his office on the eve of his last day as commissioner Friday, June 15. "I have had so much I've tried to do."

Holmes became the town's commissioner in February 2005 under former Supervisor Theresa Egan after 20 years as director of campus planning and design at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and a year at Williams College working on sustainable design projects. "As a resident of the town, I paid attention to what was happening and began to talk with some officials when one conversation led to another, and the next thing I knew I was talking about a job," Holmes said.

Working in the public sector is different than being in the private sector, but Holmes said he has tried to bring some modern business practices into the public works department.

"We are using a lot more technology to be more efficient," said Holmes.

An asset management program and developing a plan to move the department forward over the next 30 years have been two facets of his work that Holmes is most proud of.

"People forget that public works alone has assets worth at least \$350 million," said Holmes. He said the many miles of water lines and sewer pipes along with equipment, plants and other inventory account for much of those resources.

"We think of these assets as lasting forever, but the clock is ticking all this time, and some of these assets are old," Holmes said.

One of the more recent projects the town has undertaken is the replacement of the main Dinmore Road sewer line that leads to the

sewage plant.

Holmes said there are seven water tanks in the town, some built more than 80 years ago, that also need upgrades.

"Town residents use 6.25 million gallons of water daily on average, and it peaks in the summer at 9.25 million gallons a day," Holmes said. "We take water for granted, as if it's always going to be there."

Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham called Holmes a "valuable asset for the town who will be missed."

"He has done a lot to improve the department and has brought a lot of technology into the system," said Cunningham.

When Holmes first started working as public works commissioner, he said it was difficult to assess the areas that needed the most attention because updated maps of the water and sewer lines or pump stations were not readily available.

"I would ask someone to show me a map where 39 pumping stations are located and nobody had that on a map," Holmes said. "Now we do."

George Leveille, director of economic development and planning, will be the interim public works commissioner until the town finds a replacement. Cunningham said the job has already been advertised.

"We're looking for candidates, but I don't want to rush into it," Cunningham said.

Whoever the new replacement is can expect to work a variety of hours because being a public works commissioner is not a 9-to-5 job.

"Some days I would come in early and others I would stay late," said Holmes.

Retirement for Holmes will mean possibly working part time and continuing as an adjunct teacher at RPI or working on sustainable building design projects.

"I've got to a point where I've done a lot here and have tried to turn the ship in the right direction," he said.

Kayaking, cross-country ski marathons and hiking are some of Holmes' favorite pastimes, along with biking.

"There are so many things in life I want to do," Holmes said.

Bethlehem school district beefs up administration

Four new school leaders hired

The hiring of two full-time high school deans and two full-time middle

school house leaders was announced at the Wednesday, June 6, meeting of the Bethlehem School Board.

Michael Pipa and Marna Meltzer will serve as high school deans, and David Zadoorian and Andrew Baker will join the administrative staff at the middle school.

"I am pleased and impressed with the quality of administrative leaders we have hired in these new positions," said Superintendent Les Loomis.

The four were selected after the school board decided to move away from part-time deans and house leaders and create four new administrative positions in the district. The former part-time deans, except Meltzer, will go back to their full-time teaching positions. Three of the new full-time administrators will be

paid a salary of \$65,000. The fourth, Michael Pipa, was hired at a \$70,000 salary because of prior teaching experience, said Loomis.

The main reason for the new administrative positions was to add program leadership.

"The new positions will enable us to more effectively support teachers as they work with the students and create a closer connection among students, school, staff and parents," Loomis said.

Pipa, the new dean at the high school, spent 18 years in the Guilford Central School District, serving as an English teacher at Farnsworth Middle School and Guilford High School. Meltzer was the 10th-grade dean at the high school and Spanish teacher before being appointed high school dean.

"These deans will be involved in supervision as kids get off the bus, in the homeroom and in the classroom," said high school principal Chuck Abba.

Observing teachers, taking parent phone calls and assisting in program initiatives are among Meltzer and Pipa's duties.

"We think they have a good understanding of curriculum instruction and have a good track record of working well with students," said Abba.

He said the new hires will help him direct his attention to other important areas.

"I'm hoping it will allow me to do more instructional leadership and continuous curriculum improvement," Abba said.

To prepare for the position as dean, Meltzer performed a 600-hour internship, receiving an educational administrator's degree from the University of Albany to go along with

her current 13 years of teaching at the high school and serving as 10th grade dean.

"Being a teacher for 13 years is a really key piece," Meltzer said. "The more time you have in a classroom, the more you are able to understand kids." Meltzer has already worked with the Bethlehem Central Community Organization to begin a speakers bureau for students. Some of her new duties will be to continue many of the programs she helped initiate and work on the district's new alternative education program as well.

"Everything we do is to support the kids," Meltzer said.

Zadoorian joins the district as middle school house leader after serving as a school counselor in Lansingburgh. Baker taught English at the middle school before joining as house leader.

The four new administrators will assume their roles on July 1.

I like the smell of New York City.

The odors of garbage, exhaust fumes, foods on the vendors' carts, and countless humans combine to form a special scent.

Mind you, I wouldn't recommend marketing the scent as a cologne fragrance. I don't find it pleasing in that sense. And I wouldn't want to inhale it on a regular basis. But when I make that rare trip to the city, I do find the smell appealing in an "I'm in New York City!!!" way.

I went to NYC on a business trip recently. My favorite part of the trip was the moment I emerged from Penn Station. All at once I smelled the smells, saw the crowds, heard the traffic, and craned my neck at the tall buildings.

The sights, sounds and smells momentarily made me forget my inexplicably heavy luggage.

I hadn't noticed the weight of the packed bag until I was carrying it downstairs at home that morning. The bag is a small expandable rolling suitcase with two outside pockets. I'd only packed a pair of jeans and a denim jacket for the evening, a single change of clothes for the next day, sleepwear, a few toiletries, a bottle of water, and a hardcover copy of Edith Wharton's "House of Mirth."

Other than being puzzled by the heaviness, I wasn't too worried because I planned to pull the bag, not carry it. At the Amtrak station in Rensselaer, I lifted the bag from my back seat and put it on the ground outside my car. It was then I discovered that the zipper pull was missing from the flap covering the retractable pull handle. The zipper was zipped shut. I couldn't pull the bag, because I could not get to the handle. I was worried about missing the train, so I resolved to just carry the bag.

This was easier said than done, because in addition to the suitcase, I also had a work satchel

flung over my shoulder. That bag had a folder of work papers, a large stack of meeting handouts, snacks, my train ticket, my wallet, my personal cell phone, my work cell phone, tissues, a deck of cards, sunglasses, a compact umbrella, a disposable camera, a couple Band-Aids, and the kitchen sink. Plus I was carrying a zippered sweatshirt.

I couldn't carry the bag more than a few feet, but found I was able to pull the bag using the carry handle. The catch was that I had to lean down close to the bag. Luckily I'm short and I wasn't parked far from the building.

Once inside the train station, I pried open the zipper on the flap covering the pull handle, and, walking upright, maneuvered myself and my belongings toward the train tracks. All was good.

Exiting the train at Penn Station, I ran into the co-founder of the improvisational comedy troupe with which I used to perform. I saw this as good karma as I was planning to go see a comedy show that night at a theater just a few blocks away from the hotel.

I was feeling uplifted when I emerged from Penn Station. I saw the giant marquee of Madison Square Garden, I heard the "vrooming" and honking vehicles, and I smelled the smells.

I wondered if the street vendor on the nearest corner was selling potato knishes.

Alas, there was no time to stop. My colleagues and I needed to get to the hotel, stow our luggage then take the subway downtown to the meeting location. The warm potato-filled square of dough would have to wait.

The subway was another adventure. I guess when you live in the city you get into a routine

and figure out the routes, but it looks very mysterious when you ride once a year or less.

Are we going uptown or downtown? On which track will the train arrive?

The Metro swipe card readers at the turnstiles are very sensitive and a bit bossy.

"Swipe card again" the display would read, or "Swipe faster."

There are doors on both sides of the subway car, but only one set opens. Sometimes you get on using the doors on one side of the train car, but get off on the other side. When I was inside the train I had no idea which set of doors was going to open.

While waiting for the downtown A-train we saw a rat running down around the tracks. Some of my co-workers looked a bit alarmed. One said she'd run screaming up the nearby steps if the rat came up on the platform.

I was more interested than afraid. I'd never seen a rat before. It looked like a squirrel with a very thin tail. I wasn't worried because I didn't think the rat could jump. If I'd seen an entire pack of rats mulling around the tracks, then I'd have been wiggled out.

The subway ride to the meeting was pleasant. I was standing initially, but a seat became available after a few stops.

The ride home from the meeting was a different story. It was rush hour and the train was unbelievably hot and crowded. There were no available seats, and very few of the people

standing seemed motivated to move down the car. As a result, there was a large group of people standing jammed in the spot by the doors.

So there I stood, packed in at armpit level, among a group of mostly strangers. I had nothing to hold onto, so I contracted my already aching feet in an attempt to remain suctioned to the floor. One of my colleagues had hold of a pole, so for part of the ride I clutched the strap of his work bag, hoping this would keep me from falling into other passengers.

In no time we were out of the sauna, I mean subway, and rushing through Penn Station toward the hotel. We weren't in any particular hurry, but if we didn't move fast, the

crowd would have knocked us down. I felt exhausted for the people who need to run for the trains every day.

After the long day at the meeting, it felt good to change into a pair of jeans and put my feet up. I never did get to that comedy show, but I did enjoy a slice of pizza covered with an enormous pile of broccoli, mushrooms, onions and tomatoes.

The next day, I slipped out of the meeting room and bought a potato knish from a street vendor on the corner outside of the building. Unfortunately, when I took my treat from its foil wrapper I discovered it was burnt on one side. I was tempted to return outside to the vendor for a replacement, but just didn't have the time or energy. I pulled away the burned dough and used a fork to eat the potato. Not what I had envisioned, but it would have to do.

Soon it was time to head back to Albany. To avoid missing the train home my colleagues and I decided to pick up lunch inside Penn Station. I would have preferred to linger longer at street level where I could watch the passersby, marvel at the skyscrapers, and smell the smells.

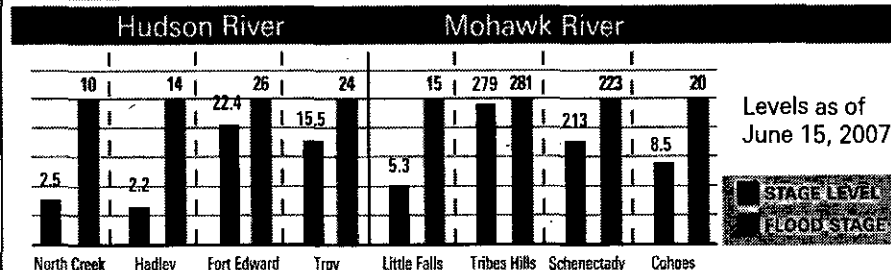

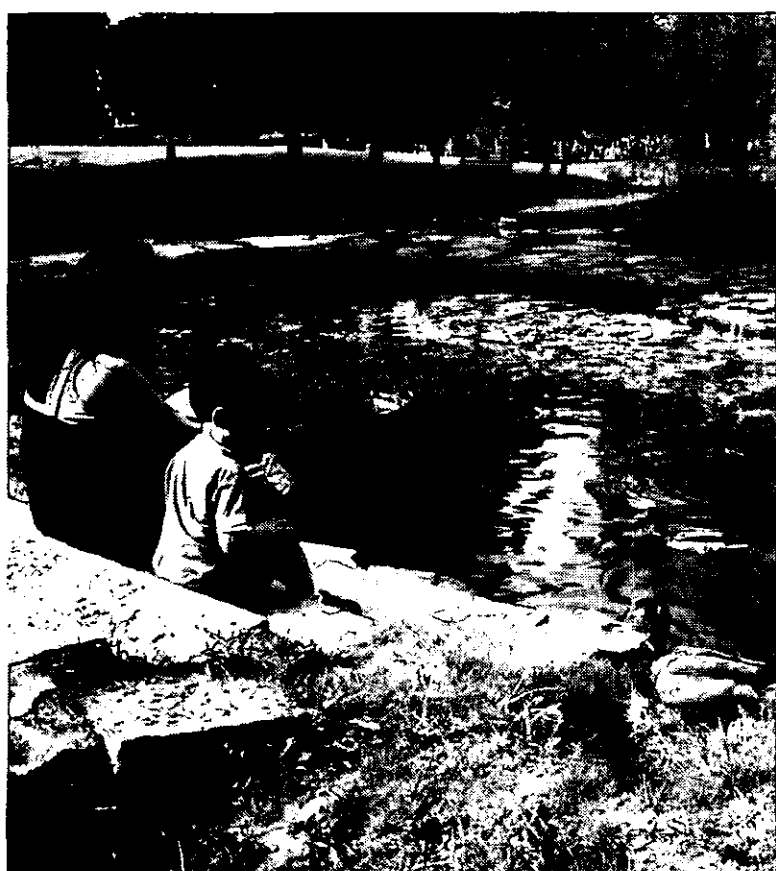
Safety course for boaters scheduled

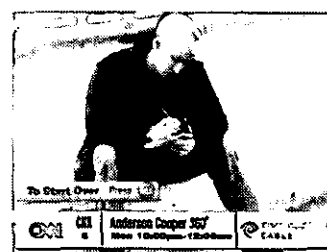

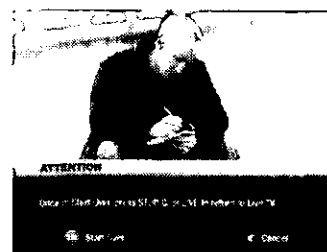

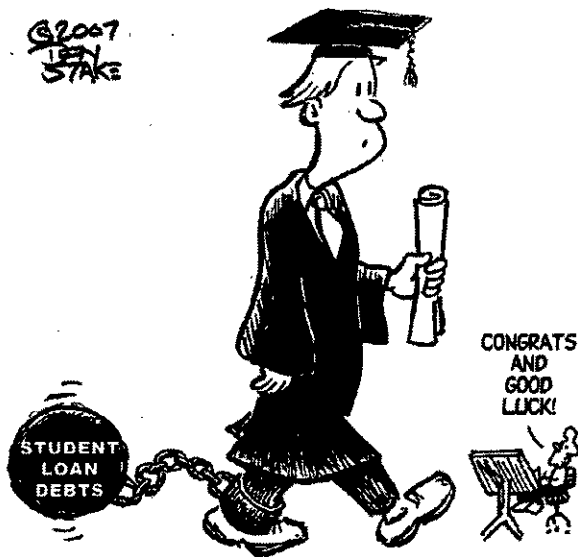
From his parents and from his brother Ian, he came to

Money in the walls: Use the equity in your home to increase its value.

In March 2006, college student Trista Wright spent her spring break in New Orleans gutting homes destroyed by the floods of Hurricane Katrina. She was peeling away molded sheetrock from a vent in a closet and raking through the debris when she saw a recognizable but weathered face staring back at her. It was the portrait of Benjamin Franklin on a \$100 bill.

Wright then peeled away the remaining sheetrock and discovered more than \$30,000 worth of the bills, which rested in a half-foot stack beside an air-conditioning vent. The owner of the house, which had been in her family for generations, said

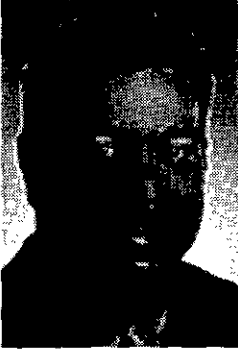
the money was most likely left there by her father, who had lived through the depression and didn't trust his money with the banks.

For most of us, we are much more accustomed to sinking money into the walls of our homes than finding "Benjamins" within them. In fact, according to the National Association of the Remodeling Industry (NARI.org), in 2007 Americans will spend nearly \$300 billion on home improvement projects ranging from simple updates to major renovations.

The reason? People want improved comfort.

However, unlike many other "com-

forts" that tend to be more luxury than need, home improvements, when done right and financed wisely, are not depreciating commodities. They can add value to your home.

They can even save you thousands of dollars, especially if the alternative to adding space or making an improvement is moving. Best of all, you can put money into your walls by first pulling money from your walls.

Borrow smart, spend smarter

Few people are in the enviable position of being able to finance home improvements — minor or major — out of pocket. That means that paying for the

added comfort we want in our lives comes down to borrowing money. In the case of making home improvements, here are the three most common ways people borrow:

• **Cash-out refinance** — If you have enough equity in your house, which is the difference between what you still owe on your house versus what you could sell your house for on the market, you can refinance and get the difference as cash. This is an attractive option if you still have a lot of years remaining on your mortgage, multiple payments that you would like to consolidate and the refinance will reduce your interest rate.

• **Home equity loans and lines of credit** — Home equity lending is like taking out a second loan on your house and is based upon the amount of equity you have in your house. Money is obtained as either a lump payment to a loan or as draws against a line of credit. These loans and lines often carry a higher interest rate but have a shorter term. They usually do not have closing costs.

• **Store credit** — It is now commonplace for retailers, home improvement stores in this instance, to provide direct financing to their customers. In many cases, these accounts have interest-free periods that are attractive to borrowers. However, interest rates on these accounts are generally much higher than bank-based loans, and the interest accrues. So if you cannot pay off the debt by the time the introductory offer expires, you should consider another financing option.

Regardless of how you decide to finance your improvement, never lose sight that any improvement in your house is an investment and that every dollar you borrow is being charged interest. So truly assess what needs to be done to your home and create a realistic budget. Ask yourself: what is the possible return on the project? What are the long-term ramifications of borrowing the money?

Managing the money in your walls

Beyond the value of honesty, returning property to its rightful owner, there are three important lessons that can be taken away from Trista Wright's experience of pulling more than \$30,000 from the wall of a New Orleans home:

1. It's important to have open conversations with your family about financial matters, from wealth management to estate planning.

2. You can find money in the walls of your house...if that's where you put it.

3. Your money will not grow when hidden in a wall. The best that can happen is that it will stay dry. The worst? It can expand and decay from water damage or be burned by a fire.

Therefore, to get the most from your home improvement project, make sure that you:

- Make decisions that are based on your family's needs, not the anticipated needs of the next family that will live in your house.
- Make improvements that add value to your home.
- Understand the cost versus value of the anticipated project.

turn on your improvement can help you make more informed decisions about how you choose to remodel.

If you watch a lot of the home improvement and "flip" shows on television you may believe that any investment in your home will add value. The truth is, improving for profit (flipping) is more about perceived value than real value. This is made evident by the results of Remodeling magazine's 19th annual cost vs. value report. Of the 25 common improvement projects covered, which ranged from major kitchen remodels to window replacements, none recouped the full cost of the work (labor, material, subtrades and gross profit) at resale. Fiber cement siding replacement, at 88 percent, had the highest percentage of cost recouped.

Here is a table showing how other common improvement projects fared in Remodeling magazine's 2006 Cost vs. value report.*

the hidden expenses, the unknown costs that seem to creep into every home improvement project — rotted floor boards, rusted pipes, mechanical and plumbing upgrades and/or, dare I mention, human blunder. It is a generally accepted reality that most home renovations exceed budget by 15 to 20 percent. So plan accordingly. It is better to scale back on a project and have the wherewithal to finish it than to be more ambitious, tempt fate and not be able to complete the work.

Understand the value of your improvement

Like any investment, having an understanding of the potential re-

This is not to say that remodeling is not a good investment. Remember, houses appreciate in value, and most improvements you make in your house will also appreciate and eventually exceed the full cost of the project. It's more to point out that there are many factors you should consider before thinking about borrowing for and beginning a home improvement project. Because if you're fortunate enough to be able to pull a few "Benjamins" from your walls, it's always good to be able to put them back in and let them multiply.

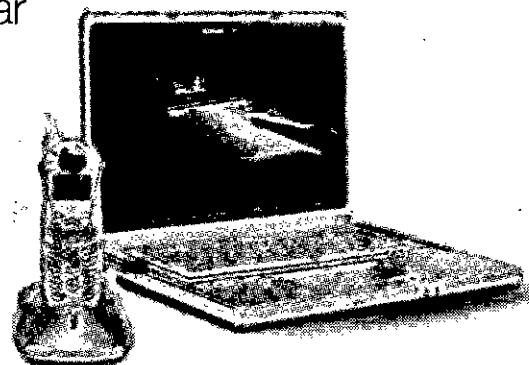

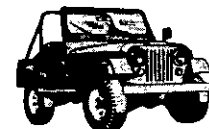

the location of a proposed traffic roundabout at the entrance of the development on LaGrange Road.

Kontogiannis said there was a verbal commitment by BBL Development to provide KKS with back access to that company's property, which at one point was contiguous to an earlier proposed roundabout location. But other issues such as a nearby gas transmission line, adjacent wetlands, and a sooner-than-expected completion of a Slingerlands Bypass access road have prompted the town to request a change in the Vista Park roundabout location to LaGrange Road.

"All we were trying to do was facilitate, and the meeting broke down last Friday," said Leveille about the meeting that Kontogiannis said was filled with outbursts and threats.

"Both George Leveille and Jack Cunningham threatened they would take my property through eminent domain," said Kontogiannis, who said the town is favoring BBL Developers over KKS.

"I strongly encourage the board to investigate this," Kontogiannis added.

Leveille said the town is under a timeline and called into

question Kontogiannis' impression of the closed-door meeting between developers.

"I don't remember anyone shouting or being hostile," Leveille said. "We agreed at the end of the meeting there was no agreement."

T.R. Laz of Krumkill Road, who also spoke during the public hearing, said the Vista Technology Park being proposed is the size of Disneyworld.

"It's a huge complex," said Laz. "I am more concerned about future problems like traffic safety impact, ground water, altering the terrain, water and sewer."

Vista Park is located on 450 acres of land in Bethlehem and New Scotland. Developers are hoping to build 1.4 million square feet of space on 150 acres that will house a mix of 80 percent technology-related enterprises and 20 percent retail. The project is expected to create thousands of jobs and millions of dollars in tax benefits to the school district and the town. Phase one of the planned Vista Park will develop 240,000 square feet.

Because the final master plan for Vista deviates from the original draft with the location of the proposed roundabout, the public hearing has been extended.

The planning board will review the change before the next town board meeting on Wednesday, June 27.

Seniors' swan song

Students end high school careers with a bang and a splash

Cigars, water balloons, firecrackers and fire alarms all went off during the last day of school Tuesday, June 12, at Bethlehem Central High School.

Seniors got a chance to let loose in a semi-controlled environment with Bethlehem police officers at every corner and a group of school staff watching at the front door.

"I've been planning for a few days," said senior Kate Kurtessis, who will be attending Roanoke College in the fall.

A surfboard, beach ball, umbrella, chairs, shovel and pail were just some of Kurtessis's props, which she spread out behind her vehicle along with a large plastic tarp and sand for a makeshift parking lot beach.

"We just like to have fun," Kurtessis said. "I've been looking forward to this."

At the other end of the parking lot, at around 2 p.m., Chaz Forman and friends were setting up a water slingshot command post on the top of a pickup with a cooler full of water balloons

waiting to be catapulted at opposition targets.

"I borrowed my neighbor's truck and blew up 300 water balloons," Forman said.

High school Principal Chuck Abba prepared the students for the last day by reading a morning announcement reminding all of them to maintain their discipline and focus in the classroom until the bell rang.

"We need to make the most of each class period," Abba said. "A lot of important information

arrive. The cause was a student with a lighter walking by the alarms and setting them off.

When the day ended, in the parking lot, both boys and girls were smoking cigars, tossing water balloons, standing on trucks and dancing while Bethlehem police looked on.

One student said the antics last "until everybody wants to go home."

Several senior girls donned blue T-shirts reading "Dunzo 2007," meaning high school for them is done forever.

As the parking lot party continued, firecrackers went off and the group applauded.

Bethlehem police Lt. Thomas Heffernan was at the scene, along with several officers of the department, and no incidents were reported.

"Nobody got hurt, but there was a little cleanup for school staff," Heffernan said. "We let them have fun for 15 to 20 minutes and then, with help from school staff and our school resource officers, we start to clear things up."

and instruction will be provided today as we prepare for all-important final exams."

Abba also warned students not to take up the annual ritual of smoking cigars inside the school on the last day. He said it was not only against state law to smoke in a public school but some students could suffer from asthma attacks, which has happened in the past.

"This created a frightening problem for all of us," Abba's announcement continued.

Smoke alarms did go off at the high school around 1:30 p.m., prompting two trucks from the Delmar Fire Department to

current half-day kindergarten program.

"There is a lot of concern out there about graduation rates within the state and the 'No Child Left Behind' legislation," said Lenhardt, who acknowledged that Bethlehem students tend to be high achievers.

School board member Richard Svenson was also a member of the 1997 school board that decided to stay with the half-day schedule.

"The research given by administration gives full-day kindergarten mixed reviews," said Svenson. He said he believes high-performing districts like Bethlehem, and others in Saratoga, Albany, Rensselaer, Monroe and Nassau counties also have many half-day programs.

"The question is, what is the

best fit for high-performing suburban districts," Svenson said.

All the board members said they agree now is the time to revisit the issue because the money is available to make the change.

"It's a topic that had to be discussed sooner or later," said board member Warren Stoker, who said the bigger question is where the full-day kindergarten program will be housed.

"We obviously can't put it all in one building," Stoker said.

Lenhardt said the district's Early Learning Center, which is where the kindergarten program is currently housed, was designed to meet growing enrollment, but the times have changed.

"We came up with the ELC concept where everyone would be together," said Lenhardt.

Lenhardt said that if the board decides to go to a full-day kindergarten curriculum, then

students should return to their home elementary schools.

"I feel pretty strongly about that," Lenhardt said. "Teachers really want to stay together, but I want to be comfortable that this is the best for kids."

Stoker said if teachers want to stay together, then the full-day kindergarten program would most likely be run in Slingerlands and the new Eagle Elementary School.

"That is the question we have to resolve, then everything else will fall into place," Stoker said.

If the board decides to move forward with the full-day concept, it could be implemented as early as the 2008-2009 school year.

Svenson said no matter what the decision is, the board will not likely be in unanimous agreement.

"We do get e-mails from parents that say, 'Keep things the way they are,'" said Svenson.

Albany Pine Bush Discovery Center opens

Facility to educate public about the area's ecosystem

Those who have long enjoyed

hiking, biking and other activities at the Albany Pine Bush Preserve can now learn more about its ecosystem at the newly opened Discovery Center.

"Before today, there was no starting point, no destination" for visitors of the preserve, said

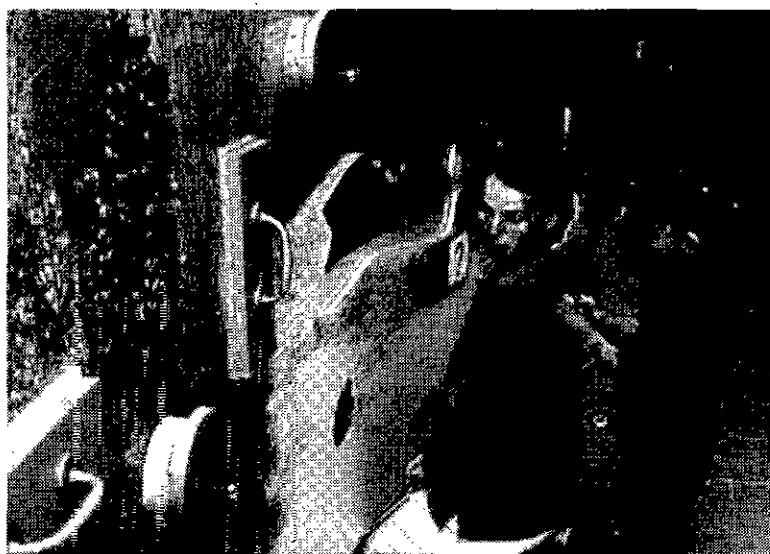
Christopher Hawver, executive director of the Preserve Commission, at the ribbon cutting ceremony Thursday, June 14.

The center, located at 195 New Karner Road in Albany, officially opened on Saturday, June 16.

It will offer a number of interactive exhibits, animal programs and other services designed to educate visitors about the 3,010 acres of the protected inland pine barrens ecosystem spanning parts of Guiderland, Colonie and Albany.

"It is just an absolutely fantastic structure," said Mary Brizzell, Colonie town supervisor, at the ceremony. "I just can't tell you what an excitement this will be for the schoolchildren who come here."

The first students to visit the Discovery Center were a group of Farnsworth Middle School seventh graders who have spent the year learning about the local

ecosystem and volunteering at the preserve.

"My sister is 6 years old, and I can't wait to bring her here," said Mike Dvorscak, 13,

of Guiderland. "I'll teach a lot of kids about what's here in the community, and it's fun."

The middle schoolers said they liked the interactive exhibits, such as the story recording area and a sand lab where visitors can explore different soil types and learn about sand creatures.

"I thought it was really unique here in that it's more hands-on," said Xingyu Wei, 13, of Altamont. "Museums always have those signs that say, 'Look, don't touch.'"

Teachers said the Discovery Center will make it easier to introduce students to the preserve.

"Now we have a place to start," said Alan Fiero, a seventh-grade science teacher at Farnsworth. "It's going to really help us to focus."

"It's great to have these young people from Farnsworth Middle School," said Albany Mayor Gerald Jennings. "We have to do the right thing and continue to grow and pay attention to what's happening here in the Pine Bush."

The project cost \$3.1 million in public and private funds, with most of the support coming from the state Environmental Protection Fund.

"This is a real enhancement for the preserve, and the fact that the project was funded through a working public-private sector, collaboration makes the achievement even more significant," said Ken Runion, Guiderland's town supervisor, in a statement.

Hawver said officials are hoping to raise another \$1.5 million to improve the outdoor portion of the center, which is located in the former State Employees Federal Credit Union headquarters, and to support other long-term plans.

The Pine Bush formed 12,000 to 15,000 years ago when the waters of a glacial lake drained, leaving a sandy bottom. Today's preserve represents less than 20 percent of the original ecosystem, and is home to more than 20 rare species of plants and animals, including the wild blue lupine and the endangered Karner blue butterfly.

Democratic legislator expands whistleblower bill

Lawmaker worries hot line could get cluttered with extra calls

A proposed law establishing an independent whistleblowers hot line for Albany County employees will encompass complaints from those working throughout municipalities within the county as well.

A last-minute amendment proposed by county legislator Paul Collins, D-Albany, made changes to the original bill, which was introduced by Paulette Barlette, R-Colonie. The bill was passed at the Monday, June 11, meeting of the Albany County Legislature.

The new confidential hot line will field the complaints, and an independent contractor will forward the comments about safety violations, workplace abuses, fraud and other ethics issues to several county offices.

The law expands on legislation from 1992 that protected county employees from retribution by employers for filing complaints.

Barlette contends that the last-minute amendment could clutter the hot line with complaints that should be fielded by municipal officers, not county officials.

"It's not a bad thing, but if we were to concern ourselves with what each local government does, it would be more effective for that government to have their own hot line," said Barlette.

Although the "complexion" of the legislation has been changed, she said, it would serve the same purpose as her original proposal.

Collins rallied support for the amendment by reminding legislators of the use of subpoenas in Colonie to obtain the sources of anonymous e-mails sent to Supervisor Mary Brizzell in 2003. Those e-mails were sent

by town employees who pointed out mismanagement at the hands of emergency medical service officials. The incident resulted in settlement awards to both whistleblowers who contended in court that their state and federal constitutional rights were violated when the town used the subpoenas to get at their records.

"We in county government have an obligation to protect our employees, and it seemed to be a wonderful opportunity to protect all county, town and village employees in the county," said Collins. "The need for this was demonstrated in Colonie several years ago."

His amendment provided the new law with a broader brush, Collins said. His goal was to make it similar to the hot line and protections Albany County District Attorney David Soares has extended to county residents for years, he said.

"I'm not sure how effective it will be," Barlette said of the amended law.

Barlette's bill was brought to life following a string of anonymous tips over the years to her and other legislators' offices, she said. In some cases, people were so afraid of retaliation by their county employers they used magazine print to cut and paste their messages, she said. The hot line is also needed to field recent

complaints about incidents at the county-run nursing homes, she said.

Under the law, an independent contractor will operate the hot

line. The complaints will be forwarded to the county executive and comptroller offices, as well as the minority and majority leaders of the Legislature.

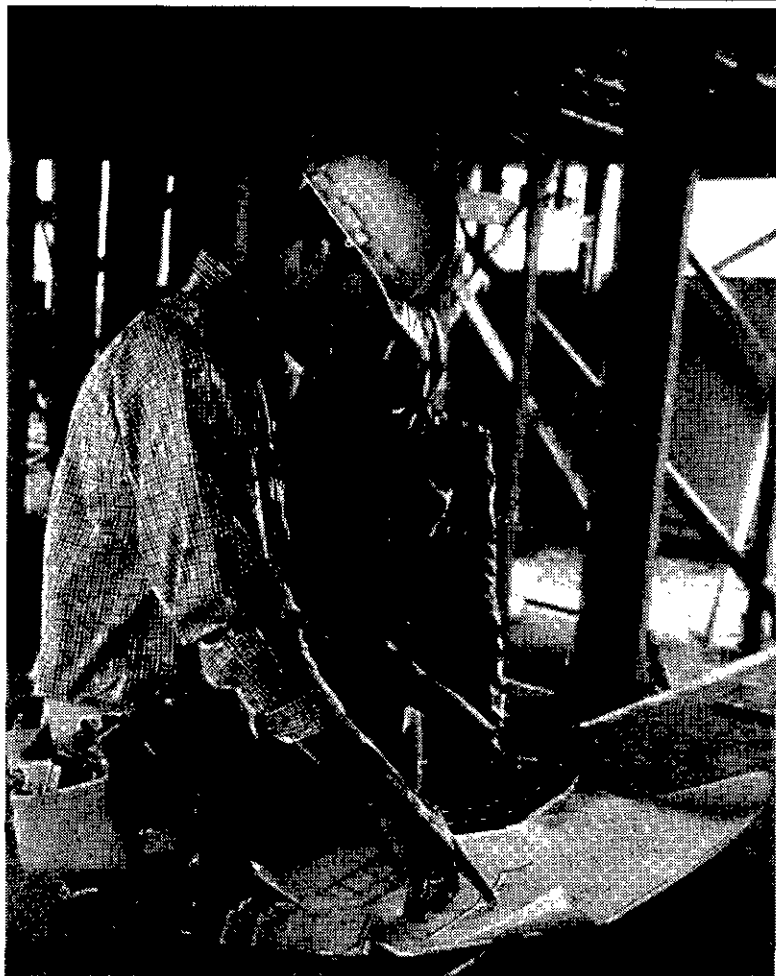

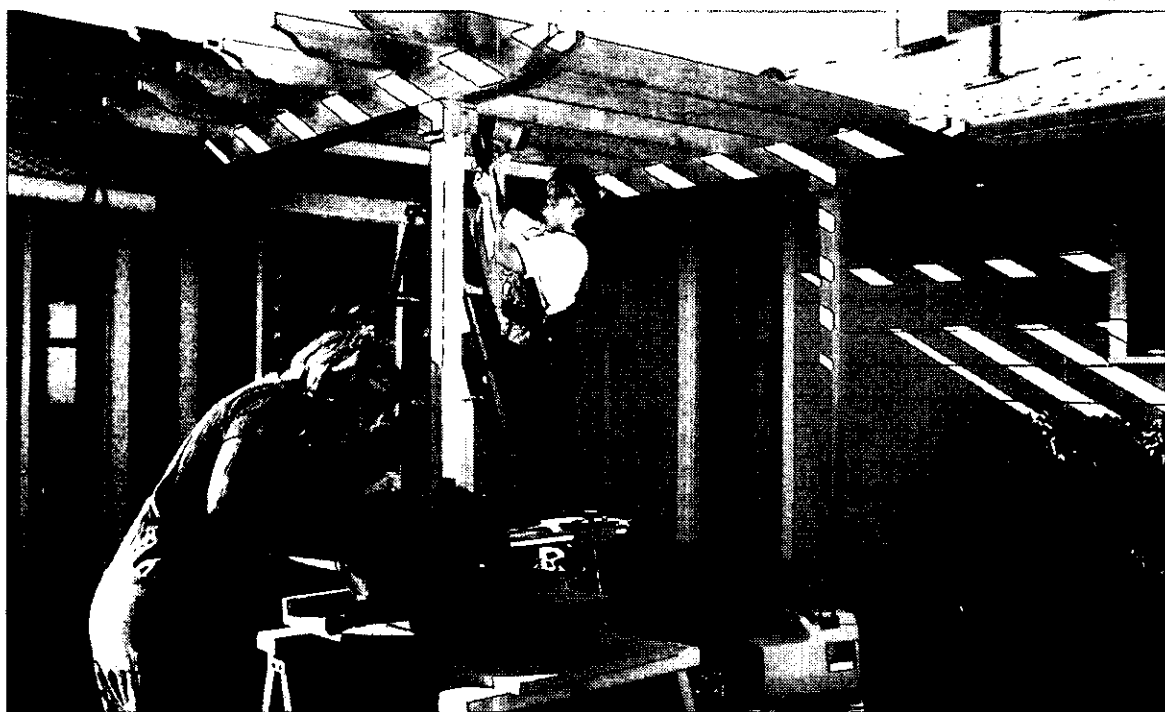

Trust them to provide correct information. At better rental stores, they will volunteer answers for questions you don't know enough to ask.

"We're investigating," says Ward Redman, assistant manager of A to Z Rental Center in Minneapolis, Minn. "We ask all types of questions to try to figure out what you're doing. That way we can recommend the proper equipment so you get the fastest, most efficient way to do the job."

The information they can provide is invaluable – so not only do you rent well-maintained equipment, but you rent it with the security of knowing you're doing it the best way possible.



Knowing which tools are right for the job and how to use them doesn't require watching hours of do-it-yourself shows.

Once you decide on a tool, they'll teach you how to use it safely.

"We really stress safety to the customer," says Redman. "If something doesn't seem right, call us. If we can't help you figure it out over the phone, we'll send someone over to help in person."

Plus, they'll give instruction on project preparation before taking the tool home.

Here are some examples of tool possibilities you can use and knowledge you'll get at a rental store:

• Paint Sprayer

Painting is one of the simplest,

most inexpensive redecorating projects. You can make it even more simple and faster with a rented airless paint sprayer.

Be prepared and you'll get incredibly fast spray painting. Cover, mask and tape windows; furniture and floors, and thin and strain the paint through a nylon stocking or paint filter. "You're going to have to thin the paint to get it to go through the sprayer," explains Redman. "We'll give general directions on how to thin it, but you need to carefully read the manufacturer's instructions on how to thin their paint."

Get these steps done before driving to the rental yard to pick up the sprayer. You'll save yourself the expense of time when you have the tool and aren't using it. Keep the paint supply clean and don't let the paint dry out to keep the nozzle from clogging.

If the nozzle gets clogged, don't put your hand in front of the spray. An airless sprayer can

severely damage flesh in seconds. The instructions will tell you how to unclog the nozzle.

"And don't point the sprayer at anything you don't want to paint – like the neighbor's car," he says.

• Nail gun

Use a nail gun to avoid the frustration and pain of hammering. Nail guns drive nails much faster and set the nails below the surface so the nails are ready for filling. A few tips for the first-time nail gun user: use manufacturer-specified nails to keep the gun from jamming.

Keep the nails clean – don't put nails into the gun that were just dropped into sawdust. Learn how to lubricate the head if you plan to use it for more than a day.

• Power auger

Another common do-it-yourself project is fence building. What can be a quick project becomes weeks-long if you have a lot of holes to dig. Rent a power auger to dig all the post holes for you, and your fence really can be a weekend job.

Two-person power augers are perfect for fence post holes. These machines drill holes for small-diameter uses and come with interchangeable 4-, 6- or 8-inch augers.

"It's important to know what kind of soil you're digging in," Redman suggests. "If it's rocky, you might need a bigger machine."

Other tools available for rental include a skid steer, walk-behind trencher, drywall hoist, cement mixer and tile saw to name a few. Some of which you may think "I couldn't really operate one of those." But in reality, you can. The rental store staff will make it easy for you to learn how to use the right tools for your project. With the right tools you get professional results without the professional.

your family's lifestyle when evaluating other possible home improvements. If you have more children than bedrooms for them or your dining room doubles as a family room and play area, an addition might make sense for you.

a much more expensive fix come resale time.

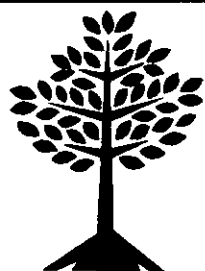
Be a wise borrower

Do your homework on financing options. A poor financing choice could mean you'll be paying high interest on your home improvement long after the last workman has left your house. Consider a cash-out refinance which allows you to refinance your mortgage for more than you currently owe, leaving cash on the table for you to put toward your improvements. The interest rate on a cash-out refinance is usually lower than what you would get from a credit card. Just remember to be responsible. You don't want

to take out so much cash that you put your home at risk. Also, remember to check with your tax advisor because the interest is likely to be tax deductible. Web sites like www.LowerMyBills.com can help you get competitive refinancing quotes. Even if you don't need to pull cash out, a refinance might still be a wise move.

"Interest rates are still near their lowest point in nearly 40 years," Wells notes. "Homeowners who bought their houses a few years ago may be in a good position to refinance at a lower rate and free up more cash each month to put towards improving their investment and their lifestyle."

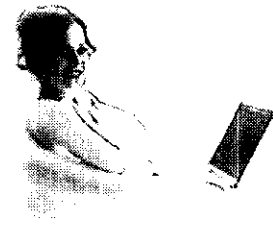

Home sellers yield high returns investing in curb appeal

When selling a home, it pays to perk up where you park.

"A remodeled kitchen and bath can help sell a home, but curb appeal is what gets buyers through the door," says Betty Jane Garrett, a licensed agent with Paradigm Realty in Oklahoma City. "If they don't like what they see from the street, chances are they won't waste time going inside."

An old, worn-out garage door, even on the cutest house, can change "Honey, stop the car," into "Keep driving," in an instant.

Realtors in a nationwide survey say replacing your garage door prior to listing your home can increase its curb appeal and the asking price – anywhere from 1 to 4 percent. That's no surprise considering homeowner demand for more storage space has made three-car garages an architectural standard not to mention a major design focal point.

If you are thinking of upgrading your home's garage appeal, you may want to consider something more than a standard steel panel door. According to "Professional Builder" magazine, designer garage doors are one of the "50 must-have features for today's



home buyers."

"We had a seller last fall who replaced existing '70s style flush panel garage doors with Clopay carriage house style doors and it changed the entire look of the house," adds Garrett. "It sold for full asking price the first day on the market and the owners made a profit. The interior had been upgraded, but it was the exterior that the buyers fell in love with at first sight."

Garrett offers these additional suggestions to help take your home from "for sale" to "sold."

- Paint the front door a bright color. Nothing says welcome

home like a cheerful front entry. It's an easy, affordable way to freshen up a paint scheme without having to repaint the entire exterior.

- Change outdated light fixtures – or add lights if you don't have some already. Light up your doorways, driveway and walkways. Better to have more lights at lower wattages than one, very bright one. Spotlights angled to highlight trees and bushes create a dramatic nighttime effect. Solar lights that charge during the day are easy to install yourself.

- Mulch. It makes landscaping and beds look tidy, crisp and well maintained, and helps minimize weeding.

- Plant flowers. This is always money well spent because it adds charm and life to any exterior. Even if you don't have a green thumb, invest in some planters and have a local nursery fill them with annuals that thrive in your climate and place them at major entry points.

- Re-surface your driveway. Instead of a black top or smooth concrete, consider stained or stamped concrete patterns. This can do wonders for curb appeal.

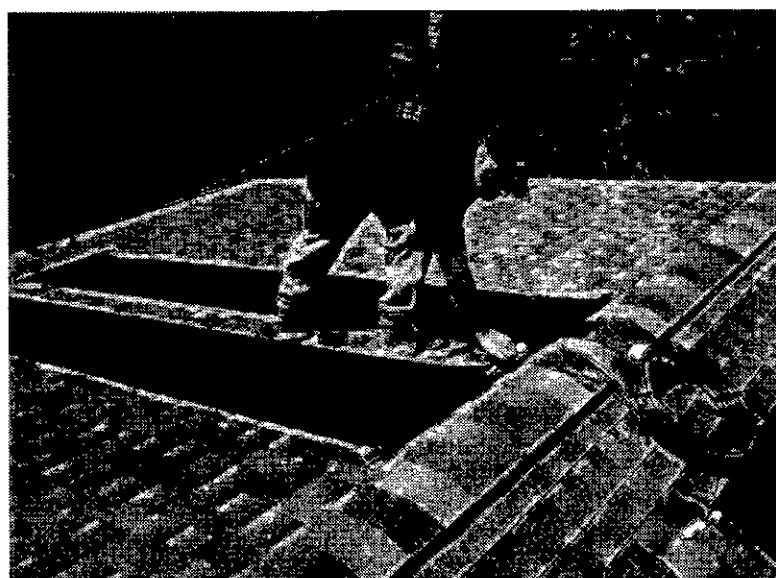

hemp, linen, wool or cotton, they come in a range of colors made from natural dyes. The Ethos Company uses a rubber backing made from recycled windshield wipers while the Bicicleta brand of carpeting has backing made from recycled bicycle tires.

• Wise walls

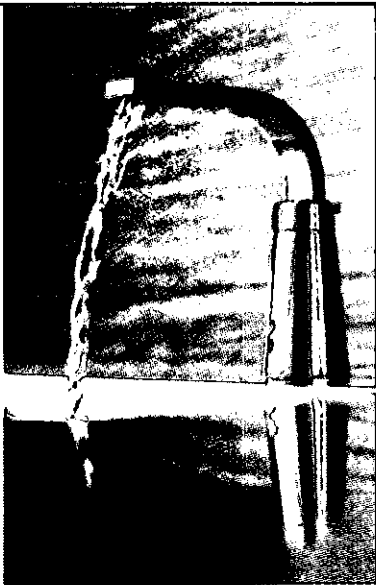
Sherwin-Williams and other paint companies have recently introduced water-based and low VOC paints such as the Harmony line with soft, nature-inspired hues, to combat the environmental hazards often caused by chemical-laden paints. In addition, wall paper manufacturer Phillip Jeffries is now producing alternative home wall coverings made from earth-friendly materials, like hemp, linen, bamboo, cork and recycled paper. Stylish, sophisticated and natural, these wall coverings are anything but ordinary.

But Segrete recommends something more adventurous.

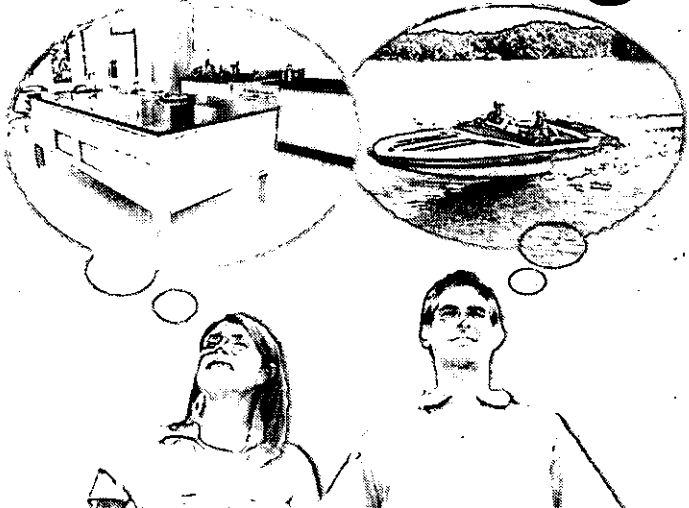

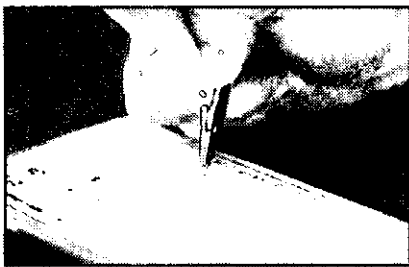

Tilting mounts, meantime, tilt slightly up and down for better viewing from the couch, bed or even floor. A tilting mount is recommended when reflections

from windows or lighting interfere with TV viewing or when multiple viewing angles are desired.

Low profile mounts attach nearly flush to the wall, making them the ideal choice for consumers who desire to maximize the sleek, thin look of their new TV. This type of mount is best suited for sets that will remain stationary 100 percent of the time.



• Ceiling mounts

If you don't have much free wall space, another option is to mount the TV right to the ceiling. This is a popular option in kitchens and dens.

• Recessed in-wall box

There's also an option for those who want to be able to give their entertainment rooms a custom look. Sanus Systems recently introduced a new recessed in-wall box that offers homeowners a number of options they didn't have before.

and the mix sets in approximately 10 to 15 minutes. Make sure your post is straight before the concrete sets. There's no need to brace because of the fast set. Approximate project time: less than one hour.

• Cracks in the driveway

Driveway cracks can become very unsightly if left untouched. Over time, they expand, weeds begin to grow out of them and they catch debris. Cracks provide an opening for water, and in regions with freeze-thaw cycles, water penetration will lead to deterioration of driveway surfaces. If you catch the cracks before they get too big, they're easy to repair.

Here's how you do it:

Use a household garden hose

to clear the debris from the crack. Moisten the crack and wipe away any pooled water. Using concrete or blacktop crack filler (depending on your driveway), squeeze the filler into the crack. It levels itself for a smooth, sealed finish. Approximate project time: one hour.

• Cracked and broken steps

Steps in disrepair are not only unappealing but can be unsafe. Repair cracks and damaged corners before the entire step needs replacing.

Here's how you do it:

Remove any loose mortar pieces of concrete, sweep the surface clean and dampen with water, then remove any standing water. Apply a concrete resurfacer and using a trowel, work it into the cracks and smooth it over. If the corner is missing, mold

the mix into the desired step shape. You can use a fast-setting cement patcher to get a faster set, approximately 20 minutes, and your trowel will act as a form to give the patching material the desired shape. If you wish to cover the entire surface, add water to the mix so it's the consistency of paint, and brush on with a paint brush. Approximate project time: 1.5 to 2 hours.

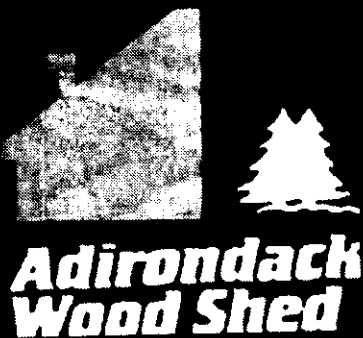
- Home theater seating

Women increasingly drive home improvement industry

Men have traditionally taken the lead on home improvement projects—in many cases at the insistence of the women in their lives. Today, women are not only involved in the decision-making process of what needs to be done and whether to do-it-yourself or hire someone, but are making the actual purchases. Women account for more than \$70 billion worth of purchases in the home improvement industry, up from approximately \$55 billion in 1995.

According to a recent survey by the Home Improvement Research Institute, within the first year of home ownership, women will authorize almost \$9,000 on home improvement projects. A growing number of manufacturers and retailers have focused more marketing efforts on women and are capitalizing on this trend. Women are also looking for women-owned construction companies for their home improvement projects. The National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) gets requests from across the country on a regular basis for local women-owned construction companies to do home improvement projects. Women make up about 12 percent of the construction industry, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.



Women make up 44 percent of do-it-yourselfers.

Women represent 44 percent of do-it-yourselfers and 51 percent of those who usually hire professionals for home improvement projects. Women account for more than half the sales of storage and organization products and almost half the sales of lighting, paint, kitchen/bath, lawn/garden, flooring and safety products.

Men still dominate when

it comes to purchasing tools and power equipment, but the number of men who are looking to hire women-owned construction companies for home improvement projects has increased.

"The perception is that a woman would be easier to work with on a home improvement project," says Sandy Fite, membership director for NAWIC.

"Some feel that women would be more organized and perhaps 'tuned-in' to the way the project should be done."

This is especially true when a woman is making the home improvement project decisions.

These projects provide a way for women to express their creativity, as well as their construction skills. According to a study conducted by Yankalovich Partners, 37 percent of women said they would rather work on a home improvement project than hit the malls, while 28 percent said they would rather work on

their home than cook.

"I find," says Jodi Bagwell, a member of the Simi-Conejo, Calif. chapter of NAWIC and co-owner of Bagwell Construction Services Inc., "that women tend to be a little more sympathetic to the concerns another woman might have when inviting a stranger into her home."

Bagwell has participated three times in the very popular "Extreme Makeover: Home Edition" television show by helping people with special needs make improvements to their homes.

She adds, "Home remodeling can sometimes be painful to the homeowner. I enjoy a special camaraderie when I have the opportunity to work with another woman. They also appear to appreciate being able to talk to me a little easier about the technical terms and aspects of the project."

Founded in 1953 by 16 women working in the construction industry, NAWIC's sole purpose is to be a support network for and to develop the success of women in the construction industry. With membership numbers at more than 5,500 in 179 chapters in nearly every U.S. state, NAWIC continues to grow internationally and has affiliation agreements with Australia, Canada, New Zealand, South Africa and the United Kingdom. Let the light shine down - literally

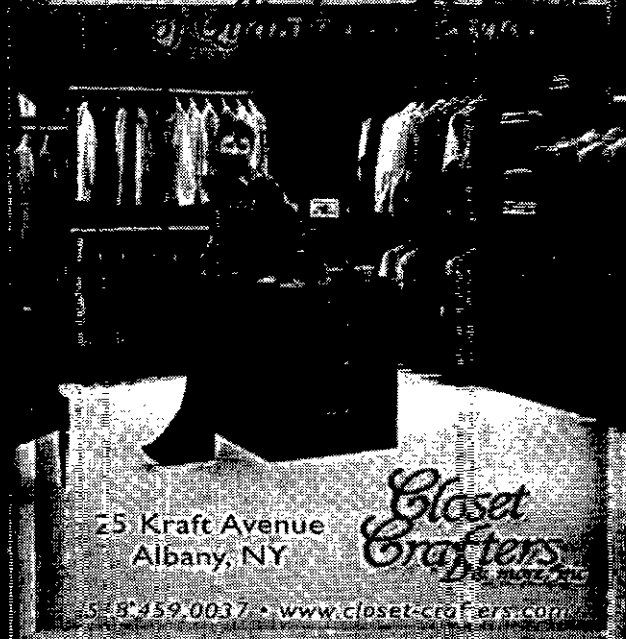

goes on a roof. Some of them are fixed (don't open) while others vent inside air through interior vent flaps or by opening slightly.

Roof windows are venting units, designed for in-reach applications, which open wider, as much as 45 degrees, for additional ventilation or emergency egress. They also have a sash that flips around so the outside glass can be cleaned from the inside.

Another important similarity between windows, roof windows, and skylights is in the glazing, or how the glass is manufactured. Patrick says that skylight glazing technology is among the best in the industry.

"Quality units control heat gain or loss, filter the sun's fade-causing rays and resist condensation," he says.

Independent research done in Denmark shows that skylights admit 30 percent more light than vertical windows in dormers, while providing the drama of a sky view that can't be achieved with vertical windows.

And skylights offer some decidedly high-tech features. Electric venting models are available with remote control

blinds, shades, awnings, insect screening and automatic rain sensors. And skylights are available with glass that can be tinted electronically by remote control while still providing the view of the sky.

"From an economic standpoint," Patrick points out, "venting skylights admit natural light from above and reduce energy costs. It's also a way to stretch dollars with a one-time purchase that pays long-term benefits by reducing energy bills."

According to Patrick, more natural light and ventilation can provide benefits in many areas of the home, but some rooms lend themselves particularly well to venting skylights.

"In bathrooms," Patrick says, "they provide privacy, reduce condensation build-up, and provide a sky view. In kitchens, they release hot air and odors while providing more balanced light for brighter days and more pleasant cooking and dining."

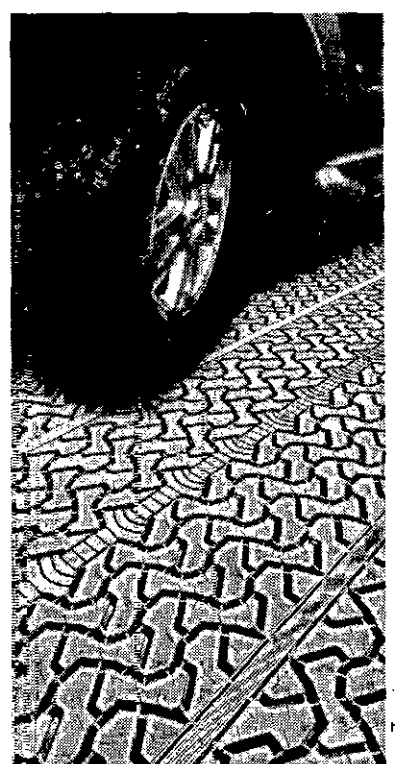

Some simple secrets for selecting outdoor statuary

You're not alone if you find that the piece of garden statuary that looked so elegant at the garden center just doesn't seem to fit your garden back home.

A common mistake gardeners make when buying a piece of garden statuary is one of size and quantity, according to Peter C. Cilio, creative director of fine garden accessories for Campania International. "Purchasers tend to choose pieces that are just too small for their space or they overload their garden with too many pieces," he says. "In garden statuary the guiding principle usually is that less is more."

Here are some simple guidelines that will help you choose the perfect piece of statuary for your garden.

Keep it in context

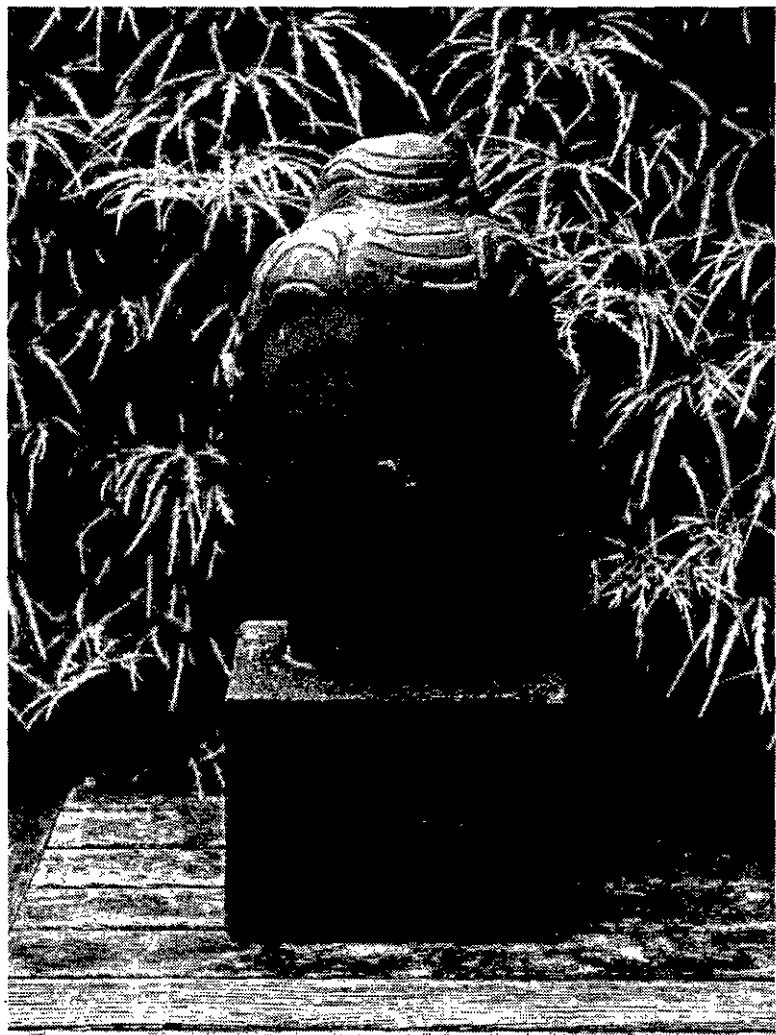
According to Cilio, the most important consideration to keep in mind when choosing the right piece of statuary is the overall style of your home and garden.

"Whether you have an urban, contemporary or country garden, the statuary you select should be compatible with the style and feeling of your house and garden," he says. "Most likely, you wouldn't place a classical statue in a contemporary-style garden. However, classical statuary makes wonderful features for a more traditional home or garden."

This is not to say that you can't mix it up a little bit. There is always the opportunity for personal expression. Eclectic mixes of styles can create original and exciting garden compositions, but Cilio believes that this is most effectively accomplished by the gardener with a sure sense of his or her own personal style.

Tres Fromme, planning and design specialist of Mesa Design Group in Dallas, suggests cutting a piece of statuary out of cardboard and placing it in different locations throughout your garden. "This will help you get a feel for where the piece looks its best," says Fromme. "It will also give you some time to think about why you want to add an ornament to your garden setting."

Cilio suggests thinking about your garden as a blank wall

in your living room. Before choosing what to hang on your living room wall, you take cues



from the style of the room. Think of your garden in that context, from the size of the space to the arrangement of trees, shrubs and flowers. These will be the cues used to choose and place your garden statuary.

Keep it simple

Fromme finds that gardeners trying to introduce too many pieces into their garden create too many distractions for the eye to absorb or enjoy. The

garden becomes complicated and cluttered.

"Under the 'less is more' principle," advises Fromme, "one well-suited piece will create a presence and a focal point, introducing harmony rather than chaos into the garden."

The 'less is more' principle does not mean you are limited to symmetrical arrangements of statuary in your garden. Multiple pieces and styles can work comfortably together if they are not part of the same compositional frame.

According to renowned garden designer, Jon Carloftis, each part of your garden may have a different mood or feeling and can provide an opportunity to incorporate different types of garden sculpture. Such pieces create interest year round and serve to animate and personalize

a space; a strong design element can even inspire the theme for the plantings.

"For example, the right type of statuary can look equally well in bold foliage such as elephant ears or hosta," says Carloftis. "A shady naturalistic area may be the perfect spot for a small animal figure or bench."

"I like to incorporate small cast stone pigs into my vegetable garden to give that particular area a sense of whimsy," adds Carloftis.

Statuary need not be placed front and center and often should not be. Nestled in among the plantings, they do not distract from the overall composition. However, discovering such pieces as one strolls in the garden brings a wonderful element of surprise and magic to the garden.

Create a frame

Just like a picture on your wall, garden statuary looks best with some kind of frame. A background of traditional clipped box, yew or a mixed border of grasses frames your statuary in the landscape. A stone wall or trellis covered with roses or even a simple wooden fence is all you need.

Personally, Cilio prefers the simplicity and versatility of garden containers such as jars and vases, but believes following the simple guidelines of style, color and proportion will lead you to a choice of statuary that will enliven your garden without overpowering it.

Boaters invited to certification course

The Northeastern New York Safety and Health Council, Inc. will offer the eight-hour boater certification course Mondays and Wednesdays, July 9 and 11, July 16 and 18 and Aug. 6 and 8. All run from 6 to 10 p.m. at 45 Colvin Ave., Albany. Participants are required to attend all classroom sessions (eight hours minimum with at least six and a half hours of instruction and one and a half hours for review and exam) and pass the final exam with a grade of 75 percent.

Get ready to tune your guitar and warm up your voice because the Old Songs Festival of Traditional Music and Dance is coming to town this weekend.

Now in its 27th year, the event will showcase performers of folk, Celtic and world music from as far away as Mali and as near as Saratoga Springs.

"It's not your normal festival in that it is not a one-day happening," said Andy Spence, executive director of Old Songs, Inc., the Voorheesville-based nonprofit group that organizes the event.

In addition to concerts on Friday, Saturday and Sunday at the Altamont Fairgrounds, visitors will have a chance to participate in workshops, take classes and listen to musicians performing in smaller groups.

"We feel a lot of the magic of the festival happens when [performers] interact with each other over the weekend," said Roger Mock, administrative assistant at Old Songs who has attended more than 20 Old Songs festivals.

In fact, it is this opportunity to sing and play with other musicians and to engage the audience that attracts many of the festival's performers.

Peter Davis, who has played at the festival eight times, said he enjoys the "more hands-on workshops and traditional music at this festival."

Davis, of Saratoga Springs, will go on stage with his band The Whippersnappers, playing the guitar, clarinet and piano.

"We need to preserve our traditions and celebrate them and keep them going," he said.

Other musicians to look for include The Arrogant Worms, a musical comedy group from Canada; Mamadou Diabate, a storyteller and kora player from Mali; and the Jeremy Kittel Acoustic Trio.

from Michigan.

But perhaps the most anticipated act will be that of the Magnolia Sisters from Louisiana, whom Spence calls a "big deal this year." The group will offer authentic Cajun music,

a genre Spence said is hard to come by these days, especially among female performers. The atmosphere at Old Songs resembles that of the 1960s and early 1970s folk festivals, Mock said, making it unique

in an age when most festivals have become commercial and performer-oriented.

"It becomes a kind of three-day village," Mock said. "A very friendly community is formed."

Visitors are welcome to camp at the fairgrounds, where plenty of

food and late-night dancing keep everyone entertained. Fiddle lessons, a puppet theater and other activities for children make for a family-friendly weekend.

"We have a lot of kids who've grown up with the festival, and

they come back," said Spence. "I think it's just one big package with one big bow on it."

The festival began in 1981, after Spence and her husband, Bill, had been involved with another folk festival in the area. Spence is not a musician, but she enjoys folk music and has a knack for organizing various events.

In addition to the Old Songs festival, the nonprofit serves 8,000 people a year, offering classes, concerts and other activities. Spence expects about 4,000 people this weekend, a fourth of whom will overnight at the fairgrounds. Visitors come from all over the East Coast, she said.

"This music is not commercial so we don't get the big crowd that follows pop music or rock music," Spence said. "A lot of people who come are people who like to learn and share music with other people."

The Old Songs Festival will take place Friday, June 22 through Sunday, June 24 at the Altamont Fairgrounds, located on Route 146 in Altamont. Tickets are \$30 for Friday night and Sunday, and \$50 for Saturday (visitors who leave by 7 p.m. on Saturday will receive a \$25 refund). Student tickets are \$20 per day; children under 12 are free. For information, contact Old Songs at 765-2815 or visit www.oldsongs.org.

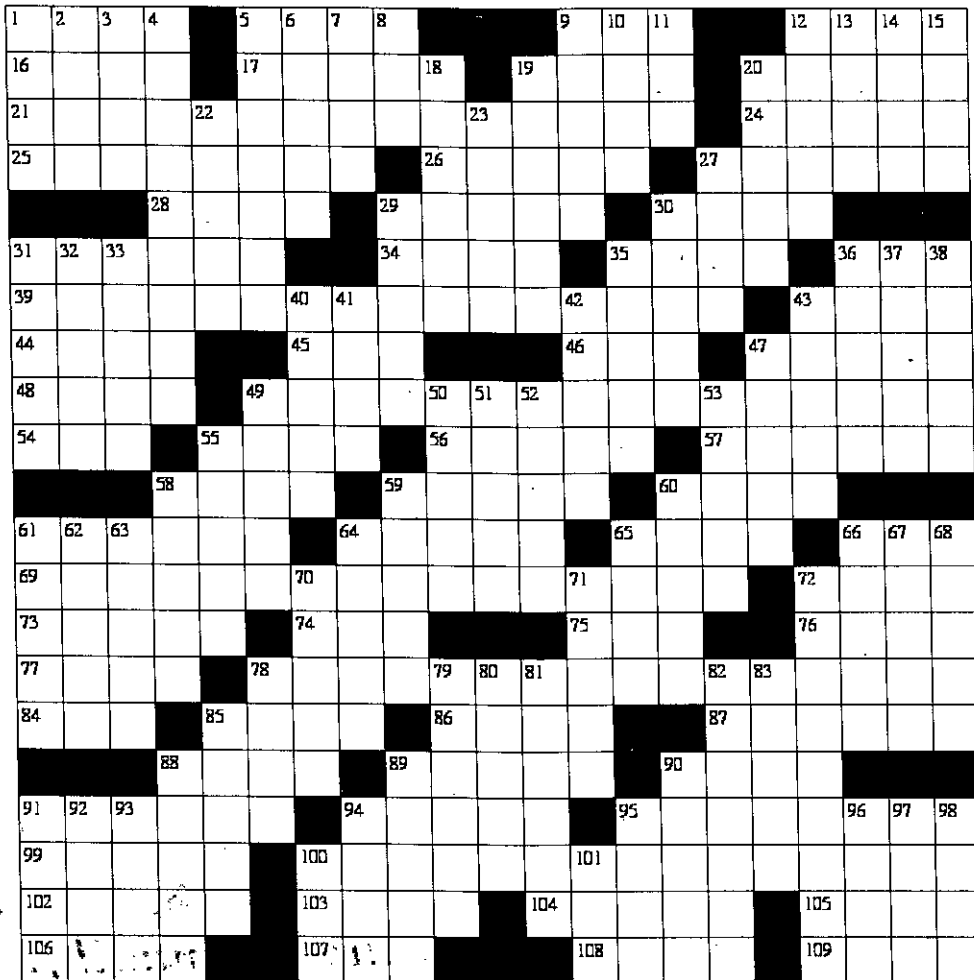

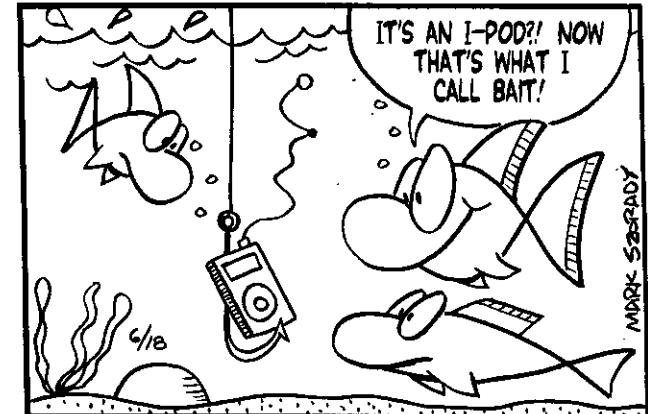

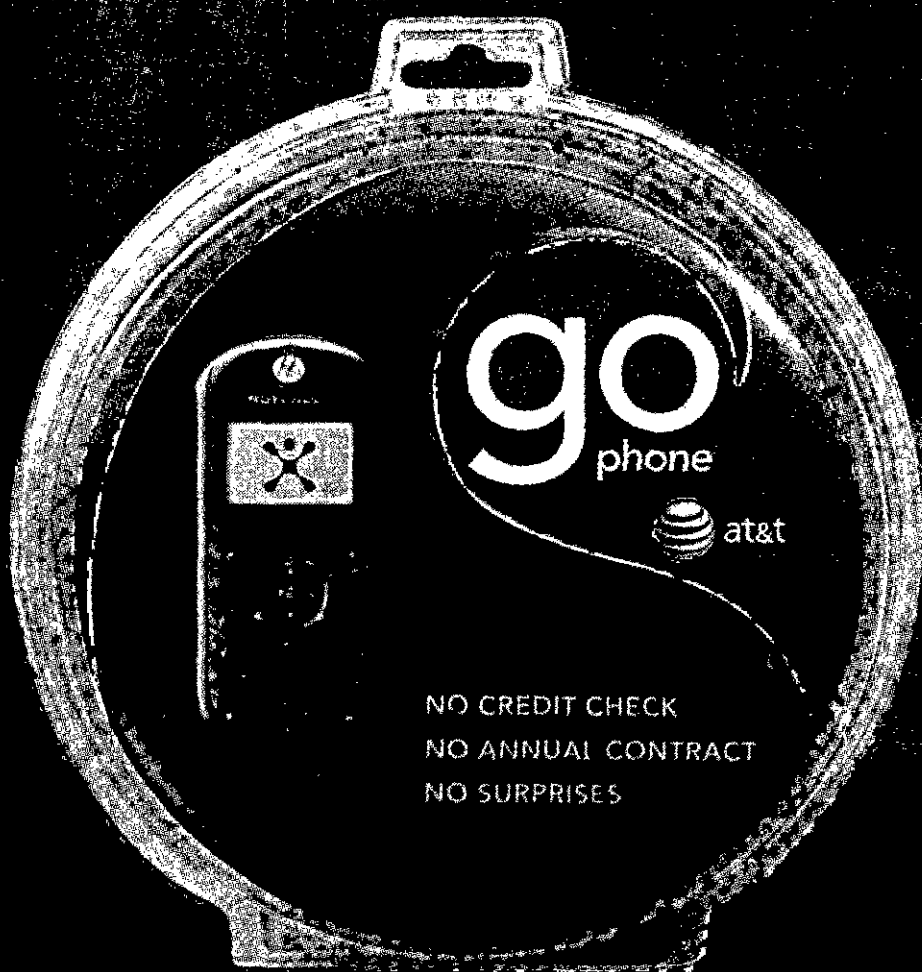

Sports *in the* Spotlight

Coaches are frequently family men, and their family lives often cross over into their professional lives when one or more of their children play sports.

Here are five stories about fathers who have had to walk the fine line between being a coach and being a parent.

John Furey Niskayuna

football/baseball coach

Furey has been coaching his oldest son Dan for the last three baseball seasons, and the veteran Niskayuna coach said it's been an enjoyable experience.

"It's the first time I got to see him play school ball," said Furey. "I missed his first three seasons (on the modified, freshman and junior varsity teams), so it's been nice to see him play."

Furey said working with Dan had its challenges, especially when it came to giving his son criticism.

"A lot of times, it's hard in a father-son relationship to give criticism, but he takes criticism well," he said.

To keep an unbiased opinion about Dan, Furey turned to his assistant coaches for advice.

"I always want to get feedback from those guys to make sure I'm making moves as a coach and not as a father," Furey said. "It's a lot better when you have assistants who can talk to your child and give them criticism."

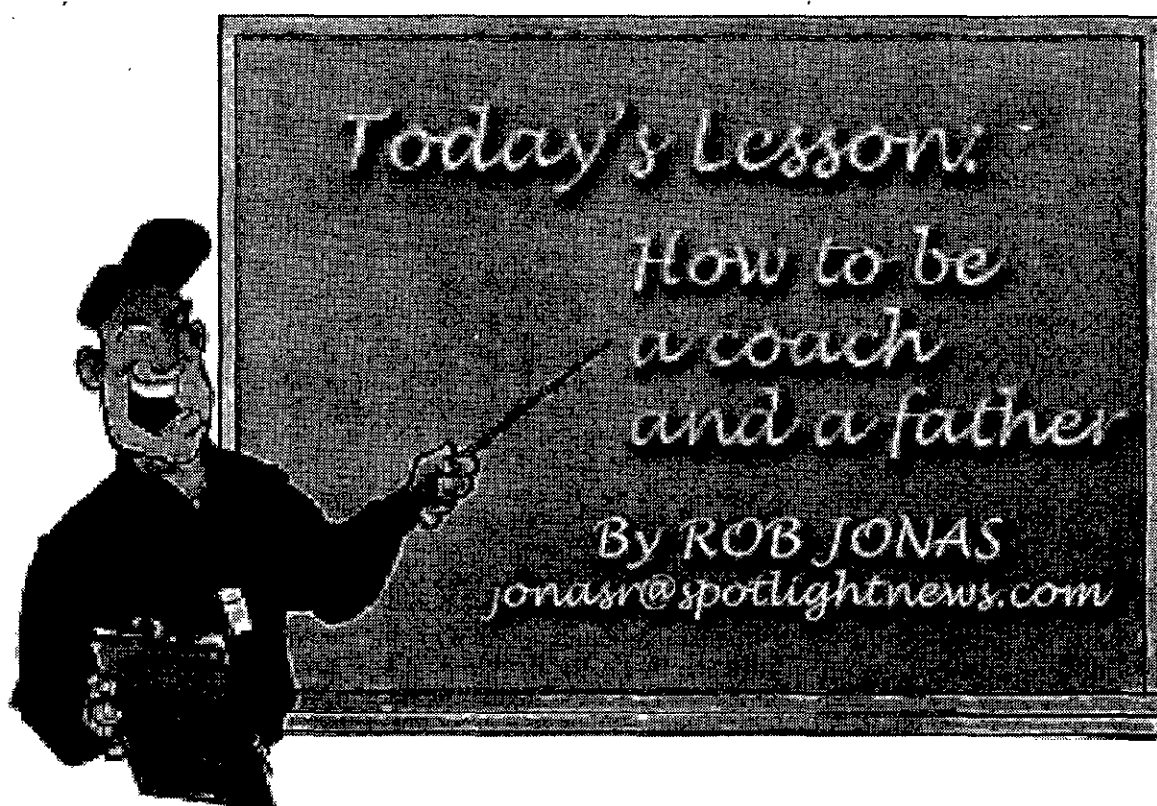
Furey added maintaining that balance between being a coach and being a father is the biggest challenge he faced with Dan on the ballfield.

"You've got to think about the situation and what's best for the team when your son is out there," he said. "You've got to treat him like anyone else."

Dan graduates in less than a week, but Furey has another opportunity to coach his children. His younger son Peter is set to join the varsity football and baseball teams next year as a junior. His daughter Kelly, a fifth-grader, also plays sports.

Furey said Peter's decision to play football was influenced in part by going to Niskayuna games when he was younger and watching such players as André Davis and Chris Nappi.

"He saw successful they were,



and he wanted to be part of that," Furey said.

Jim Smith Retiring CBA football coach/ athletic director

Smith knows all about coaching his children. His two sons, Jimmy and Packy, played for him at CBA in the 1990s.

"They got along with everybody," said Smith. "I've heard horror stories about other situations where coaches' sons didn't get along with their teammates, but I was fortunate."

Smith encouraged Jimmy and Packy to play a variety of sports. It just happened that they picked football when they reached high school.

"Growing up, I never pushed them into football. They never even played Pop Warner," said Smith. "Athletics were part of the family, but I never said, 'You have to do this.'"

When they reached the varsity level, Smith said he made it clear to Jimmy and Packy that there would be no special treatment.

"People always ask when you're coaching your kids, 'Is it difficult?' and I remember someone saying that if you coach all your players like they were your kids, it's not a problem. That's what I tried to do," said Smith.

Smith added that it wasn't always easy on his sons to be

on his team. "They see you interacting with other kids all the time, and I think it's more difficult on them than on you. You've got to be aware of that, but we were pretty open about it at home," he said.

Smith is retiring, but his son Jimmy is carrying on his coaching legacy. The former CBA tight end and defensive lineman is Bethlehem Central High School's running back and defensive back coach.

"He was more into football (growing up)," said Smith of Jimmy, who's been on Bethlehem's coaching staff the last three years. "Packy, he liked football, but he liked running more."

Gary Chatnik Guilderland girls lacrosse coach

There has been a Chatnik

playing lacrosse at Guilderland for nearly as long as there has been a Chatnik coaching lacrosse. Lauren Chatnik was a star goaltender for her father's team from 2003 to 2005, and Corrine Chatnik just completed her sophomore season with the Section II champion Lady Dutch.

"It's great," Chatnik said of coaching his daughters. "It's the reason I got into it in the first place. We've gotten closer because of it, and it's great to watch them and their friends get better (as lacrosse players)."

Unlike Furey and Smith, Chatnik has had to balance his coaching and his father duties with his job, which frequently takes him out of the region. Chatnik makes certain that he doesn't travel a lot during the three-month lacrosse season.

"It's not easy, but I make do

because it's important to the girls and myself," said Chatnik, who works for A Christmas to Remember. "You do the best you can."

The greatest benefit of coaching for Chatnik is having more time with his daughters.

"I get to see them every day, so you see what's going on with them," he said. "You have a role in how they're turning out."

Chatnik has two more seasons with Corrine. Then, he'll welcome his youngest daughter Leah to the varsity team. After that, Chatnik said he doesn't know if he'll continue to coach high school lacrosse.

I'd like to be involved at that point ... but that's a long way away," he said.

Harvey Staulters Ballston Spa wrestling/softball coach

Staulters' family ties run deep in the varsity sports he coaches. Not only does he work with his two daughters, Kate and Christine, on the softball team, but he also has four nephews on the wrestling team.

"It's a good thing for me," said Staulters. "I love what I do, and even though they're my family, they listen to my coaching. Plus, I get to see my brothers and my sister."

Staulters grew up the middle child in a family of nine kids. He and six of his brothers wrestled at Ballston Spa for another big sports family in town, the Johnsons.

"It was probably one of the greatest experiences for me," said Staulters. "We were all different sizes, but we challenged each other (to wrestling matches) all the time. We broke a few things in the house. We put each other

If it's Monday, then Pacman is in trouble

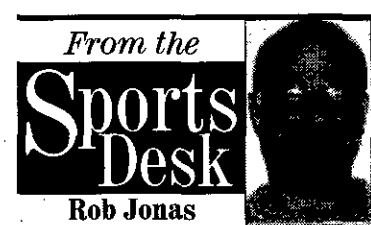
Let's get this right before we go any further: Tennessee Titan Adam "Pacman" Jones isn't being investigated for a shooting outside an Atlanta club early Monday morning. He's just being questioned about his friends' involvement — again.

Jones and some of his friends were allegedly involved in a fight at a club. After leaving in three separate cars, one of Pacman's pals shot at a car containing the other group that was involved in the fight.

Conveniently, Jones was long gone when his friend shot at the other car, which resulted in a return of gunfire and a bystander injury. But Atlanta authorities want to ask him about the incident.

If this is what Jones calls turning his life around — which he claimed he was going to do after being suspended for a year by the National Football League — then he isn't getting off to a good start.

In case you've been living under a rock, this isn't Pacman's first brush with the law. Counting the Atlanta incident, it's the 11th time Jones has either been investigated by the police or questioned by authorities about his friends.



It was also not the first time Jones and his friends have been involved in a shooting outside a club. A similar thing happened during NBA All-Star Weekend in Las Vegas back in February.

I'm not sure who Pacman's friends are, but by all accounts that I've read, I'm pretty sure they were never Boy Scouts.

Seriously, what was Jones doing at another club in the early morning hours getting involved in another fight? Did he forget that this was how he and his friends got into trouble in Las Vegas? Did he forget that he had been suspended by the NFL for that type of activity? And why hadn't he dumped his club-loving friends in the first place? Is he so loyal

to them that he's willing to risk everything he's worked for?

Certainly, this latest incident involving Pacman's friends won't sit well with NFL commissioner Roger Goodell. One can only imagine what Goodell was thinking when he heard about it. Probably something along the lines of, "Oh no, not again."

What this will likely lead to is another face-to-face meeting between Jones and Goodell, and it probably won't end well for

Pacman. Given that Goodell threw the book at him the last time, I'm guessing that Goodell will throw a dictionary at Jones for this

incident. Perhaps another one-year suspension without pay, or maybe an even longer ban.

Naturally, Jones can say he did nothing illegal. That doesn't mean he isn't culpable. The moment it was suggested that they go clubbing, Jones should have told his friends that given his current suspension, he'd have to politely decline. But he didn't, and now he may have a stiffer penalty to pay.

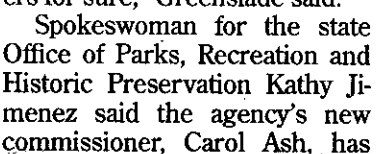

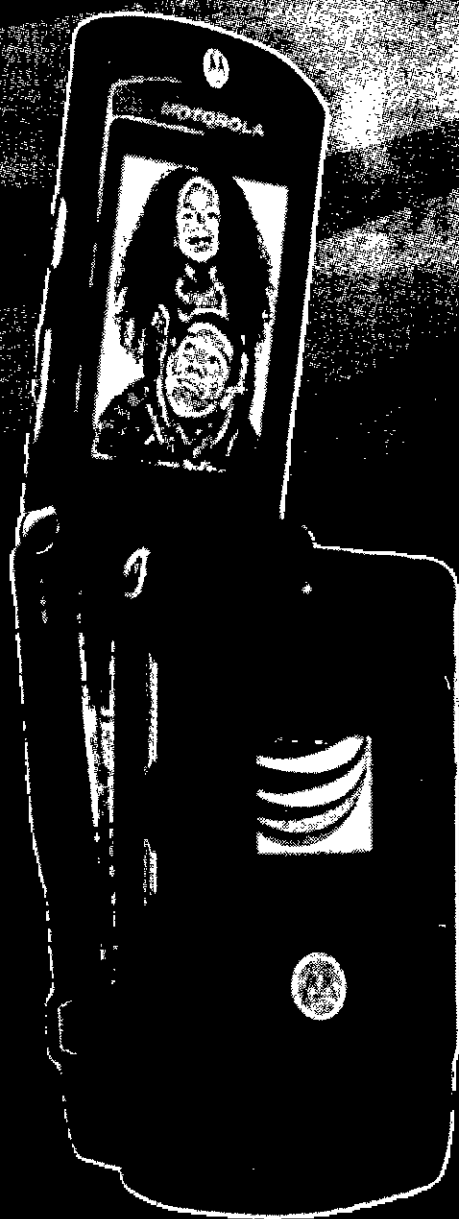

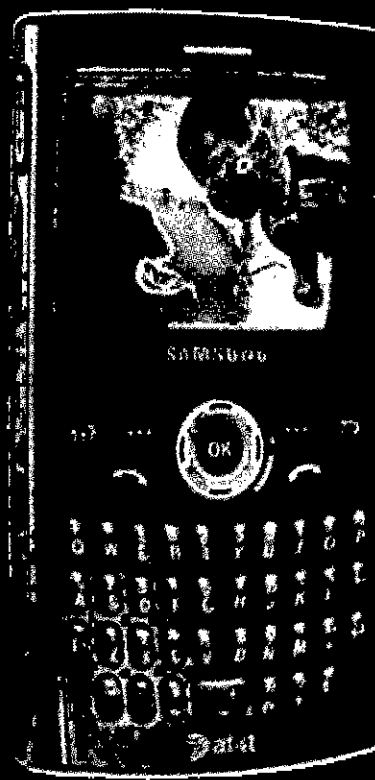
