



Area group embraces national challenge to eat healthier. promote local foods

espite the fact that oranges, olive oil, coffee and sugar are excluded, Capital District residents are embracing a national food movement called the 100-mile diet.

In 2005, Alisa Smith and James MacKinnon from Vancouver, British Columbia, started the diet when they decided to only eat foods that were grown or raised 100 miles from their home.

Since then, many grassroots organization have jumped on board starting their own 100-mile diet endeavors. One of those organizations is from the Capital Dis-

Cheryl Nechamen of Delmar began the local 100-Mile Diet Challenge last September. She challenged people from the Capital District to eat only local food for one month. She started a Web site to give participants more information and a collection of resources including recipes and information about where to find local products and sup-

New sergeants are sworn in amid accusation of discrimination

Bethlehem police officers James Rexford and Christopher Shunk were sworn in Monday, July 16, as the newest patrol sergeants in the department.

"I just want to say how proud" we are to have these two new sergeants on the force." said town Supervisor Jack Cunningham, who administered the oath to Shunk and Rexford inside town court in front of a crowd made up of family and friends.

Shunk has been in law enforcement for several years, working 12 years in the Albany County Sheriff's Department before becoming an officer with the Bethlehem force in 2003.

"This is a good department, and it's been challenging here,' said Shunk. "This is another step in my career."

Rexford served many years as an officer in the town of Coeymans before becoming an officer with the Bethlehem police department in 1998.

There are now six patrol sergeants on duty at any given time with the Bethlehem department, which oversees 22 road patrol

Moving wall rolls into town

Scaled-down version of Vietnam memorial to be set up in Elm Avenue Park

The names of more than 58,000 American men and women who died in the Vietnam War or still remain missing will be on display for three days in Bethlehem when "The Wall that Heals," a half-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C. enters Elm Avenue Park.

The 250-foot long wall will be on display Thursday to Sunday, Aug. 9 to 12 following a motorcycle escort from Interstate 88 through the state Thruway Exit 23, and down routes 32 and 9W.

The reaction is quite wonderful when we arrive," said Suzi Granger of Rolling Thunder, the organization that will be leading the motorcade escort into Bethlehem. "Such a large number of individuals were affected by the Vietnam War."

Around the County A different kind of tour

Catholic cemeteries are final resting place for many of the area's important people

The reasons for rural cemeteries were not as romantic as their architecture, artistic monuments and landscaping would lead one to believe.

They were created for health reasons and to remove congested burial plots from cities and away from the living out into rural surroundings. But they grew to become peaceful destinations for spiritual reflection.

In 1867, St. Agnes Cemetery was built in Menands to serve as a final resting place for prominent Catholics in Albany. In its 140-year history, the cemetery has interred many area historical figures, including U.S. Congressmen, Civil War soldiers, business leaders and two Medal of Honor recipients. In those 140 years the cemetery has only existed to serve their needs. But this summer, the Albany Roman Catholic diocese has opened the historic cemetery to tours.

"We are trying to return St.

Agnes to its original purpose as a park, a setting, not just for burial, for spiritual reflection, meditation and peace and quiet," said Molly Nicol, director of development for St. Agnes Cemetery. "At first I thought 'is anyone going to come and see this?'

The public turnout for tours has been overwhelming, she said.

The cemetery opened its grounds to guided tours in June. Visitors are coming for various reasons, Nicol said. Typically, they've come to visit relatives and friends but more and more

are utilizing the tours to better understand the area's history and the prominent members of its communities over the course of 140 years.

They come to see the architecture of the memorials, the artistic headstones and tombs. said Nicol.

They are coming to see the final resting places of notable historic figures such as: Times Union founder, John H. Farrell;

of subway systems and utility company Con Edison, whose wealth exceeded \$100 million at the time of his death in 1913. They are coming to see Martin Glynn, the state's first Catholic governor, 50-year chairman of the Albany County Democratic Party, Don O'Connell, and the first U.S. officer killed in Cuba during the Spanish-American War.

"There is quite a bit of history here. We are trying to highlight that historical aspect of the cemetery," said Rick Touchette,

> director of cemeteries for the Albany diocese.


The first tour on the first Thursday of June had one person, he said. Average attendance since then has been six people; last week, 10 people attended.



A ride to remember

Dad and daughter race to honor a mother lost to cancer

A father-and-daughter team from Delmar who lost their wife and mother to cancer, will ride from Wellesley to Provincetown in the Pan-Massachusetts Challenge on Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 4 and 5, as part of a fundraiser for the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.

"I do this to remember my wife," said Nathan Cohen, who has participated in the challenge for the past eight years. "To me it's special."

Cohen and his daughter Emily, will be two of more than 5,000 cyclists from all over the country riding in the 28th annual event, which is expected to raise \$27 million this year. Thousands of cyclists ride in the event because they have a connection to cancer. either as a cancer survivor, or they are remembering a loved one who died from the disease.

The first year we did ride for her while she was alive," said Cohen, referring to his wife, Mary Ann, who died in November 2002. "We ride for her now as well."

The Cohens have raised more than \$46,000 for the charity since 2000, and their team has raised more than \$163,000 overall.

"My daughter and I have friends in Boston who ride, and my wife's

college roommate also rides," said Cohen, whose team is known as Team Mary Ann. "My friends ride in this event because they were best friends of my wife." worthwhile.

There are several legs to the challenge, ranging from the two-day, 192-mile Sturbridge to Provincetown route to the 47-mile Wellesley Sunday loop. Nathan Cohen will be riding in the 163-mile leg from Wellesley to Provincetown. Emily Cohen will ride the 84-mile Wellesley to Bourne leg.

"I am 58 years old, and I do have to train for this," said Nathan Cohen, who averages about 100 miles a weekend on his bike when training for the ride.

The event runs through 43 towns across Massachusetts with food and water stops, mechanical and medical assistance, luggage transportation and lodging.

"In some of the small towns you go through, there are 300 to 400 people cheering you on," Cohen said.

Thoughts of his wife and the memories they shared travel with him during the emotional bike

Emily Cohen said the number of cancer survivors along the way holding inspirational signs reassure her the cause is more than

'The signs will read: I'm 6 today thanks to you,' or Tm 20 years in remission; keep going," said Emily. "It's just an incredible feeling to be a part of it."

Mary Ann Cohen was diagnosed with a brain tumor during Emily's freshman year at Bethlehem High School.

'She was just an all-around great person to everyone," said Emily.

Nathan Cohen calls the weekend of the event, "the toughest weekend I have every year." He added, "It's a motivation to ride because the cause is such a great cause."

Riders in the event have contributed more than \$171 million for cancer research and treatment at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute through its Jimmy Fund.

When they write the history of how cancer was conquered, the MC (Pan-Massachusetts Challenge) will be Chapter One," said Edward I. Benz Jr., M.D., president of Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.

Several Delmar and Capital District families are opening their homes and backvards this summer by hosting children from New York City for a week or two.

Forty-six children got off the bus in the parking lot of the Delmar Presbyterian Church on Wednesday, July 18,

after a long and rainy ride from New York City to meet their host families and to soak up some small-town living as part of the Fresh Air Fund's Friendly Town Program.

"Delmar has been great," said Veronica Cruz, chairwoman of the Delmar area Fresh Air Fund. they don't normally "It's one of our more responsive communities."

Delmar met the city bus to welcome the kids with open arms. Simple things like swimming in the lake or backyard pool, looking up at the stars, spending a weekend at the camp or just peaceful walks along wooded country trails are a few of the activities some of the families have planned. For some of the kids, it is the first time they have left the city, while others return to visit the same host family each summer.

Jackie Citriniti of Niskayuna

waited with anticipation at the drop-off area to see 15-yearold Enrique Cruz for the fifth straight year.

"He loves to swim in our pool," said Citriniti, who said her husband, Tom, and son, Luke, 16, also enjoy the time they spend with Enrique.

The Citriniti family has many activities planned for Enrique visit, including white water rafting, spending the day at a farm and hiking.

"We have had a good experience since day one," "Delmar has been said Citriniti.

The Fresh Air Fund began in 1877 as a way for New York City children to get some relief from a a lot about what they tuberculosis epidemic. The "fresh air" of the country was considered a cure for respiratory ailments.

from the experience. More than 1.7 million children have participated in the Fresh Air Fund since its inception. Last year, 10 Fresh Air children stayed with families living in the Delmar area.

"The families tell you a lot about what they learn from the kids and the kids get to see a different part of New York state they don't normally get to see," said Cruz.

Children range in age from 6 to 18 years old and visit two weeks or more.



School district audit comes back clean

Superintendents says sound financial practices pay off

Officials of Bethlehem Central School District are pleased with the state Comptroller's recent audit of the district's financial practices.

The audit, covering the period between July 2005 and December 2006, examined several internal controls of varying financial operations, and no improprieties were found.

"It's a good, clean audit," said Superintendent Les Loomis. "It affirms all of the sound, appropriate financial practices in the district."

Areas reviewed include segregation of duties over cash disbursement within the district along with the internal audit function. One area of criticism focused on a Capital Region BOCES employee serving as the internal auditor.

In the report, the Comptroller's office recommends the board end its internal audit relationship with Capital Region BOCES, and replace the position with an internal auditor who meets the requirements of state Department of Education guidelines.

understand in any way how sharing a service to save taxpayers money represents a conflict of interest," Loomis said, defending the practice.

The district shares the services of an internal auditor from BOCES because it is less expensive than hiring its own full-time internal auditor,

and the position is eligible for BOCES aid. The Comptroller's report indicated although no irregularities were found, the **BOCES** employee serving as the internal auditor would not be independent in performing the district's internal audit function.

"This current arrangement

is likely to put the BOCES employee in the position of evaluating significant district services or programs that are provided to the district by Capital Region BOCES, the individual's employer," wrote the Comptroller's office in its opinion.

In 2005-06, the district

spent \$3.6 million on services provided by Capital Region BOCES.

"It puts the BOCES employee in the position of auditing its own employer," said Emily Desantis, spokeswoman for the Comptroller.

Other Bethlehem Central School District officials disagreed with that assessment.

"We respectfully submit that there is nothing in law or regulation that would preclude this district and other Capital Region school districts from arranging for the provision of this service through an inter-municipal agreement in association with other districts and the Capital Region BOCES, wrote president of the school board Stuart Lyman at the time the audit was released to the

Lyman said the district's legal counsel and BOCES counsel also agree with the district on the matter.

Other recommendations of the audit committee were in the area of payroll and cash disbursements and the segregating of payroll functions. According to the report, the school district has made the appropriate changes in each of those areas.

"The report offered us good suggestions for appropriate checks and balances," Loomis said.

Bypass project to close portion of local road network

Motorists who travel Route 85 in the town of Bethlehem may have noticed substantive progress on the state Department of Transportation's Slingerlands Bypass project, awarded to Delaney Construction Company earlier this year.

As of 9 a.m. Friday July 27, a portion of the local road network will be closed to through traffic to facilitate the widening of the structure that carries Route 85/Blessing Road intersection.

After Friday morning's peak traffic flow. Route 85 will not be accessible from Blessing Road for approximately eight weeks.

A signed-detour route will be in place, providing guidance to motorists to follow Krumkill Road to access Route 85. The total detour length is 4 miles.

The department has coordinated this effort in recognition of the county's ongoing work in the vicinity of Schoolhouse and Russell roads, as well as another ongoing DOT project along Route 85 in the city of Albany, near the Harriman Campus.



Government needs audit committees

There are numerous large local governments in the Capital District that spend hundreds of million of dollars every year. Examples include the counties of Albany, Schenectady, Saratoga, and Rensselaer; the cities of Albany, Schenectady and Troy; and large towns such as Bethlehem, Clifton Park, Colonie, Guilderland, Niskayuna and Rotterdam.

School districts and other governmental entities also spend hundreds of million of dollars every year. Government finance professionals are advocating that all local governments have a special audit committee to oversee certain accounting and financial management aspects of local governments. This article strongly endorses the implementation of formal audit committees for local governments.

The Government Finance Offices Association (GFOA) is a national group of governmental accounting and finance specialists interested in implementing best practices for governments. The New York State Government Finance Officers Association promotes best practices in New York. Both of these important organizations are advocating the use of a formal audit committee for state and local governments. The GFOA recently published a document entitled "An Elected Official's Guide to Audit Committees."

This document outlines how an audit committee should be structured and the benefits it can provide.

Many local governments have a structure composed of chief executives (e.g., mayor, county executive or supervisor) and legislators (e.g., aldermen,

town board members, county legislators). In some cases there are formal comptrollers or accountants who manage the accounting and finance function. A question has arisen as to who actually oversees the accounting and finance function. For instance, if a mayor and a comptroller are managing the affairs of a city government, what checks and balances are in place to ensure that effective financial management is in place? Also, if a formal auditor is hired to review the accounting and finance operations, to whom should the auditor report?

The GFOA reports that if an outside auditor reports to the chief executive or comptroller of a local government, there is a problem because there may not be a candid review of management. Having local governments form a formal audit committee can solve this issue. The committee should be independent from management and can be made up of qualified legislators (e.g., county legislators, city aldermen, town board members) who have a good knowledge of accounting and finance principles.

It is worth noting that the GFOA is emphatic about having all local governments, no matter how small, establish a formal Audit Committee: "Accordingly, the GFOA urges every governing body, no matter how small the government, to establish an audit committee.

There are three basic goals of audit committees. First, they provide an independent review that internal control exists within the government. Second, the audit committee provides an independent check as to whether management is properly conducting its financial practices. Third, the audit committee oversees the annual outside audit that is conducted to ensure that it is properly conducted and that corrective action, if needed, is properly implemented.

The GFOA shows that there are two important benefits to be derived form forming an audit committee. First, the audit committee provides an independent check on establishing internal controls since the committee is staffed by legislators who should be independent from the management of the organization. Second, the audit committee provides an important vehicle for

regular communication between outside auditors and the local government. Third, the audit committee oversees the hiring of the outside auditor and the conduct of the audit.

There are a number of requirements for the individual members of the audit committee that must be considered when the committee is formed. First, some, but not all, members must have a good understanding of accounting and finance principles since they will be working with accounting and auditing professionals. Next, the committee members should all be members of the governing body such as the legislators associated with the government. No members of the management of the government should be appointed to the audit committee. This requirement is needed to ensure that the formal audit committee is independent from management.

The GFOA provides some important guidelines regarding how the audit committee should be established. First, it must be formally established and there should be documentation to illustrate that the outside auditors report to the audit committee and not to management. The audit committee should be properly funded so it can hire the outside services of a finance or accounting professional if needed. Also, the audit committee should properly document its activities to ensure transparency of the process.

Once the audit committee is established, it will have an extremely important role for the local government. It will conduct tasks such as hiring the outside auditor and overseeing the auditing program. The audit committee should oversee an internal auditing function if it exists, and they should review internal control processes. Other important activities include reviewing the government's financial statements, and examining potential consultant contracts in the area of accounting and finance.

The accounting and finance world has changed since the corporate scandals associated with firms such as Enron and WorldCom occurred in 2001 and 2002. Accounting and auditing firms are subject to closer review than before, and local governments should change their structure to account for this new reality. A formal audit committee composed of members of the government independent from management is an excellent tool to ensure that local governments are efficient end effective.


Does Bethlehem need an open space protection plan?

As a professional accredited planner, lecturer and instructor and a member of the Bethlehem Planning Advisory Committee: Katherine Daniels (letter to the editor, "Town needs open space plan." July 11) should recognize that the town of Bethlehem, through its employees, committees and consultants has worked hard to create the first master plan. Her recent letter seems to trivialize this.

This plan came about because the community worked together through compromise and understanding of each other's needs and desires. It reflects the uniqueness of our town, rather than the boilerplate plan of every other town. These ideals may not be exactly what Ms. Daniels personally feels is required, but the majority of people accepted the plan.

We need to stop the rhetoric, twisted facts and scare tactics that are again being used by some people. Let's stick with the facts and look at the full picture, not parts of it.

A quick search of other fastgrowing towns in the Capital District shows only one with an open space plan. Still, it is not a good argument that we need to rush into an open space plan because everyone else is doing it. Bethlehem is a unique town with needs that are different from the often quoted model towns such as Saratoga. We will never be a Saratoga because we don't have and never will have springs, arts centers, downtown, racetracks and casinos. We will never be a Clifton Park or Colonie because we don't have the business and shopping. We are Bethlehem, the good and the bad.

Every month we do not "lose opportunities." New major development proposals are not being submitted at a huge rate.

Just check the agendas for the planning board and development planning committee. It takes years for these proposals to go through the permitting and planning process in this town. Once these are developments are approved, the actual number of building permits issued in this town every year is fairly consistent. We have in place parkland set asides and fees. Developers are donating land and helping with new parks in everyone's best interest. The Maple Ridge Park is one example of this.

The commercial and industrial parcels contribute to green spaces and generate the tax revenue that helps to keep taxes lower. The Vista Technology Park alone will put more than 200 acres into trails and preservation. Nigro donated land for the Schiffendecker Farm Preserve as part of its development of Towne Center.

Privately owned open space may be a net tax generator for towns because it does not require services such as sewer. water and school, but there comes a point that large tracts of land cannot be privately owned because of the high taxes that must be paid. If a government or nonprofit buys the land, it generates no taxes and will actually require tax money to be paid for the maintenance. This puts more of a tax burden on everyone.

The comprehensive plan encompasses many new thoughts on land use, including zoning that allows for conservation

subdivisions and mixed economic development. Our town's plan still allows traditional subdivisions and that is because this is what many people desire and work toward. Many people enjoy traditional subdivision Editor, The Spotlight: living. As was indicated in the making of the Comp Plan, social engineering and forced conservation subdivisions are not what citizens in this town desire.

Everyone in town needs to understand that there are diverse ideas, desires and goals among its citizens. We need to support that. We need to take our time, look at our current needs and assess our current opportunities. Let's follow the comprehensive plan and take the time to work with the willing landowners. Cooperation goes so much further than legislation.

GOP contender vies to unseat Breslin

County Executive says opponent's charges lack vision

A Republican contender plans to put Albany County Executive Mike Breslin's 12 years in office under the microscope.

Roger Cusick, 57, of Loudonville, announced Tuesday, July 17, that he would make a second attempt at public office after a failed bid for county District Attorney in 2004.

As part of his campaign, he is directing a number of questions at Breslin, including: Where is county money going; what is being done to keep young professionals in the county; why are there such high tax increases; and why do county residents need to pay such a high price for a new downtown convention center?

"I've demonstrated the knowledge of the budget and providing services at a reasonable rate. He just provides services and signs the bills. What is Breslin's vision of the county? Is it more of the same?" said Cusick. "The only change in the 12 years he's been in office is the cost of government."

Breslin said Cusick's attacks offer no real solutions.

"Mr. Cusick's comments show a

lack of understanding of what county government is and does. His lengthy statement is wrought with errors and misconceptions, and yet he never once discloses details of his own 'vision' for county government," said Breslin in an emailed statement.

Breslin said property taxes were actually reduced this year by 2.3 percent. In 2006, Albany County had the fifth lowest property tax per capita in the state.

Cusick, an area lawyer and political science professor — most recently at the University of Richmond in Virginia — is calling for change and new and better ideas for Albany County.

Cusick has joined other Republican candidates running for several posts this election who are calling for slimmer county government.

According to Cusick, Albany County government is top-

As costs increase, Cusick said Breslin continues to just throw money at the problems — like \$77 million at the county-run nursing home Cusick said has

a bad reputation and low occupancy rates to prove it. He said that a combination of private and public funding to county elderly services is the answer. It is a trend that is happening across the country, Cusick said, but for some reason falls short in Albany County.

Cusick also lashed out at the proposed Albany Convention Center. Since its initial planning stage, the price tag has jumped by 50 percent. Because of increased building costs, the project will now cost closer to \$300 million. By the time the county designs and breaks ground on the downtown site, the price tag could reach \$500 million, Cusick said, adding that, financially, the project could rival the state plaza.



Pig's legacy lives on at the fair

Punkintown Fair is a chance for the community to gather

The New Salem Volunteer Fire Department is sponsoring its 63rd annual Punkintown Fair this Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 26 to 28.

The fair will feature the traditional games, rides, shows and great food that the community has always enjoyed. New this year, fireworks will take place on Saturday night shortly after dark.

Although the Punkintown Fair has been a family favorite in the town of New Scotland for many years, the history of the event is not widely known.

Legend has it that in 1832, New Salem residents decided to name a tiny hamlet where the

festival is now held "Punkintown," after they discovered a pig that had given birth to a litter of piglets in a giant pumpkin. In 1942, residents decided to raise funds to buy gifts for men and women serving in World War II by holding a local fair, which continued until the war ended. In 1947, the newly formed New Salem Volunteer Fire Department started sponsoring the fair.

Over the years, the fair became well known for the prizes awarded to winners of the raffle drawings. In the 1940s, the big prizes were food items, such as bushel baskets of peaches. In 1982, to mark the 40th anniversary of the fair, the top raffle prize was a live pig.

Midnight madness over Harry Potter

Quiet Delmar comes alive as fans wait for the final book's release

At 11:15 p.m., Rebecca Chambers, 18, was a few people down from the Folgers.

"I got here at 9:15," she said.

The big question on everyone's minds was best



expressed by the T-shirt that 13-year-old Megan McCurdy sported at Friar Tuck: "7-21-07: Who will die?"

"Draco and Voldemort," Justin Folger said.

"Harry might die," Chambers speculated. "But he might be a hoarcrux, too."

The bad guy of the series, Lord Voldemort, split his soul into seven pieces, revealed in the last book, and hid it in different places, each called a hoarcrux.

"Some of my friends have heard rumors that Harry will die because (author) J.K. Rowling doesn't want anyone else to write more Harry Potter books," said





FROM KING OF THE HILL TO LOOKING UPHILL: THE FINANCIAL TRANSITION FROM HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR TO COLLEGE FRESHMAN

In 2006, the Intercollegiate Studies Institute issued a report, "The coming crisis in citizenship," which documented that when it comes to preparing today's students to be informed and educated about America's political and cultural past—traits the authors considered to be key qualities of strong leadership—colleges are failing. So, too, are high schools.

The study is regarded as the largest of its kind, with a sampling of more than 14,000 students from 50 colleges, including the likes of Harvard, Yale and Princeton. What it highlights is that high school seniors, no matter their grades and class rankings, are often ill-prepared for the rigors of college. They just don't know the basic information they should know, and colleges, assuming they should come possess-

ing this core knowledge, generally do not give it to them. The result is that our colleges are graduating

well-qualified but not so well-rounded job candidates. In fact, 16 of the 50 schools studied had a negative learning, meaning that incoming freshman scored higher on the tests than graduating seniors.

When it comes to money, financial education, the same can be said. All a person needs to look at for evidence is the large amounts of debt today's college students are graduating with, which, on average,

is nearly \$20,000 in student loans and an additional \$3,000 in credit card balances. The fact is, high school graduates on their way to college are poorly equipped, rather they have not been provided with enough basic knowledge, to make responsible money decisions. The result is that colleges are not only

graduating students with higher earning potential, they are also graduating students with a sometimes overwhelming burden of debt.

Working with a blank slate

For high school graduates, the college experience is often referred to as a new beginning—a blank slate. Generally, it is used in social terms. However, for many students, college marks the beginning

of financial responsibility. For the first time, they are responsible for balancing a checkbook, managing credit decisions and sticking to a budget.

arrive on campus, "social networking" makes this difficult. Dinners with new friends (to not go is to risk being left out), enticing credit card offers and must-have music downloads all tempt students. This is why not making any assumptions about what a student does or does not know about managing money is so important. Because, in terms of credit, a blank slate is a blank credit history, and any mishaps can have very real consequences that extend well beyond the college years.

Making the "financial literacy" grade

Just as students have a checklist of what they need to do the summer prior to enrollment, as well as a checklist of what they should bring with them to campus, there are some money management basics that every student should understand and be equipped to handle.

1. Creating a spending plan: In a word: budgeting. Budgeting is at the core of financial responsibility, and it is an exercise that most financially independent individuals have mastered. At its most basic level, a budget is an accounting of how much money there is and the amount of money spent. It may take a month or two on campus to develop a good idea of what is offered around a school, so it's realistic to think that the budget may need to be adjusted. Still, having one, whether it is weekly or monthly, will help students control spending.

2. Staying organized and balanced: The key to staying under budget is organization. Students should be encouraged to create an easy to use filing system to track all of their expenses, transactions, insurance information and bank and credit card statements. They should also learn to balance a checkbook, which means log-ging every expenditure and not relying solely on online bank-ing and ATMs, because neither record checks that have not yet been cleared. As many previous college students can attest to, bouncing checks can be very costly, both in terms of dollars penalized and damaging credit.

3. Understanding their student loan obligation: As more students need to finance their education with private loans (government loans and grants account for only 60 percent of a student's borrowing needs) it is incumbent upon them to fully understand the terms of these loans, which can include origination fees (the fee you pay for taking out a loan), guaranty fees (what you pay to a third party to ensure that a loan is repaid), reduced interest rates for on-time payments and reduced interest rates for direct debit of payment. Students should also be aware of deferral options and the option of making payments on interest during the course of their education.

Making responsible credit decisions: Some bad credit decisions start with an application and a tee shirt or Frisbee. That's the hook. Entice students to apply for credit cards, send them a card then watch them begin making impulse purchases they can't pay off in full when the monthly statement arrives. However, because most students do have a blank credit slate, this access to credit can be a valuable way to begin building a strong

credit history. The main thing a student should know when applying for a credit card is this: not all offers are the same. Therefore, students are well advised to compare fees (e.g., annual fees, transaction fees, late fees and over-limit fees.) and understand how the card provider calculates interest.


- 5. Protecting their identity: Nearly 9 million individuals were victims of identity theft in 2006. College students can decrease their chances of becoming part of this statistic by following a few simple behaviors:
- monitoring their credit report;reviewing all bank and credit
- card statements;
 shredding all financial information before it is discarded, including all mailed financial offers (a cross-cut shredder should be on all students' bring to school list);
- ordering merchandise online only from secure Web sites;
- updating computer virus protections and never downloading files sent by strangers.

Anyone who suspects they are a victim of identity theft should immediately file a police report and notify all of their financial services providers, including banks and credit card agencies.

Creating a foundation for

This foundation for financial independence—the lessons parents impart on their children-is often laid before a student ever steps foot on campus. However, it is on campus where these principles are put to the test and where today's students must do better. With a little awareness and education, they can. And if they do, they will not be the only benefactors—the companies these students will eventually lead and the communities they choose to live in will benefit as well.





"There are still a lot of us who just can't face going to Washington, D.C., to face The Wall," said John Eisenhauer, Commander of the Sheehy-Palmer VFW Post, who also served in Vietnam. "It's just a hard thing to do."

The Wall That Heals will be open 24 hours a day beginning 10 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 9, and admission is free.

"A lot of Vietnam veterans will come in the middle of the

night because they don't necessarily want to be seen," said Eisenhauer, who said the country often overlooks veterans after a war is over. "They're still around when there is no war."

The main speaker for the local event will be Col. Samuel H. Johnson, who will be the next chief of staff for the Corps of Cadets at the United States Military Academy. He has also served with the 25th Infantry Division en route to Afghanistan as director for joint interagency effects at the combined forces command-headquarters in Kabul.

pervisors assigned to road patrol," said Lt. Thomas Heffernan, who leads the department's traffic safety division.

It's buyer beware in today's food market

toothpaste with anti-freeze, contaminated peanut butter, lettuce that causes e-coli and misbranded diet food products are just a few of the problems food safety experts have to deal with daily in the United States.

The problem is so widespread the U.S.D.A. (United States Department of Agriculture) has an entire Web site dedicated to the subject (www.foodsafety.gov).

Food irradiation, food-borne pathogens, and food away from home are just a few of the many topics you'll find. There is even a virtual representative named "Ask Karen," a 24/7 automated

response system,

who will walk you through any food-borne illness question you may have.

This hotline operates with staff daily from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and we answer questions about meat, poultry, seafood, any question you may have," said Archie Magoulas, one of the many food scientists, home economists and nutritionists answering the hotline in Beltsville, Md. Margoulas said in the last week alone there were recall notices of DentFresh Fluoride Mint Toothpaste made in China that contain DEG, a solvent used in anti-freeze that could cause liver disease.

'People have been asking about China food products," said Magoulas.

Rice products coming from China, Thailand and the Phillipines are now being detained due to filth. The U.S.D.A, in an import alert, charged that some of the rice products are "putrid and decomposed and otherwise unfit for food in that it contains insect, rodent, bird and other animal filth."

Other products produced in China and other countries are not being labeled properly.

"Make sure proper labeling in on a product," said Jessica Chittenden, spokeswoman from the state Department of Agriculture and Markets. "Look through these ingredients to make sure what's on a product and what you are consuming.

Sometimes, even with products made in New York, you can't always believe what you read. Take the case of Stay Slim Food Products out of Ozone Park in Queens. A consumer alert on these products was issued in 2005 because of misbranding.

"For example, a Stay Slim chicken with honey mustard pita sandwich said it contained 4 grams of fat when in fact it contained 46 grams of fat," said Chittenden.

That amounted to a 640-calorie increase in the product from 180 calories per sandwich to 820

Several other Stay Slim food products were also misbranded. A New York City TV station brought the Stay Slim issue to light, prompting the consumer alert. Fines can range anywhere from \$300 for the first violation to \$600 per violation.

"We do have the ability to fine them per unit," said Chittenden.

State Ag and Markets officials have seen more imports coming into the state, and an increased demand for these products.

We have a lot of people immigrating to the United States and with this come new consumers and new taste buds with new demands for products outside the United States," Chittenden said.

But the stringent laws that apply to food safety guidelines in our country are not necessarily as tough in countries like China.

We are fining these companies overseas because they do not have the same regulations we do," Chittenden said.

Peanut butter manufactured under the Peter Pan name and Great Value brand by Con Agra foods was pulled from store shelves earlier this year after people became

sick. When a food produced outside of New York but purchased inside the state is found to be contaminated, scientists at the state Health Department Wadsworth Research Laboratory in Albany go to work. In March the lab confirmed cases of salmonella in peanut butter and just recently confirmed salmonella cases in the snack food product Veggie Booty, also purchased in New York.

'Our lab is able to determine if New York state cases matched what was seen in the national outbreak," said Claire Pospisil, Health Department spokeswom-

Salmonella is an illness that can be fatal in young children and the frail elderly.

"There were 63 cases in 19 states with two of the cases here in Albany County," Pospisil said.

Lab testing is conducted through a relatively new process called Pulsed Field Gel Electrophoresis, or a DNA fingerprint that matches the outbreak strain.

"This technique is not something we did 20 years ago," said

Finding tainted foods is an allconsuming challenge with weekly, even daily news updates.

On July 13, Dent Fresh toothpaste was recalled. On July 17, the state lab found salmonella strain in the Veggie Booty snack product. One day later, the FDA recalled hot dog chili sauce under une brand names Casueberrys, Kroger, and Austex, due to possible botulism poisoning.

There are several Web sites and phone numbers that will keep you informed about the latest recalls and food warnings. The phone number for the FDA Help Desk is 1-800-216-7331. The U.S. Food Safety and Inspection Service issues a quarterly FSIS Magazine focusing on food safety behaviors and trends. fruits and vegetables. Other reasons to eat locally are to cut down on energy dependence, which is why 100-mile diet pioneers Smith and MacKinnon began the challenge. Also, eating locally grown foods supports local farms and the local economy.

For Nechamen, the hardest part of eating only local food was adjusting her lifestyle.

The biggest problem is convenience. You can't eat processed foods, so it took a lot more planning to get meals together. You have to be much more organized," she said.

Plus, she couldn't find a wheat producer within 100 miles, but finally decided that 119 miles was close enough and used products from a wheat farmer in the Champlain Valley.

"I wish I knew how to make crackers," Nechamen said.

Besides giving up wheat products, Nechamen gave up other favorites such as avocadoes and lemons. Nechamen said she did find products that she liked by participating in the challenge. She substituted her morning glass of grapefruit juice with apple cider and found that she preferred it.

Nechaman said about 78 people participated in last year's challenge and she's planning another for this September.

Nechaman's family participated in the challenge with her last year. Nechaman said her 16year-old daughter agreed to go along with it because she thought it would be healthier.

Tastes better

People on the 100-mile diet only eat foods picked at the peak of the season and often are consumed mere hours after harvesting. They find that food tastes better and hasn't lost its nutrients from traveling thousands of miles.

Denise Kolankowski, a registered dietician for the Cornell Cooperative Extension of Schenectady County, said nothing tastes as. good as the food that comes from her garden.

"If things are picked fresh and you buy them within one or two days, it's healthier than something picked and shipped across the country," she said. "You lose nutritional value and quality as it comes across.'

Kolankowski said a huge draw for many people who are thinking about participating in this diet is the exclusion of processed foods, which are so prevalent in our society.

Kolankowski acknowledges that this lifestyle would be very hard for some people.

"It all depends on what your living situation is," she said. "If you have a limited income, no vehicle and no good storage, that poses a problem unless you can get to a local market."

Also, Kolankowski said she was concerned about the health of 100-mile dieters in the winter months. Since citrus isn't a local product, getting adequate Vitamin C is a problem.

Aside from that, Kolankowski said the 100-mile diet is a great idea. People have to learn to eat what is in season and freeze or can foods for the winter.

"Everyone used to know their local farmers because everything that could be was local," Kolankowski said. "No one knew what a kiwi was 20 years ago, but now they are as common as ap-

ples. Variety is great, but you can sustain a good nutritional status with less variety."

Peak Oil

The desire to save energy and the environment was a big factor in Nechamen's decision to start eating locally. She was concerned that the world's supply of oil is reaching its peak production.

Agriculture is heavily dependent on crude oil, from fertilizers and herbicides to the gas it takes to transport food across the country. On average, food travels 1,500 miles before it's consumed.

Nechamen saw that by eating locally, she cut out the transportation aspect and by buying organic food she cut out the dependence on fertilizers. She found she could help prevent an energy crisis with relatively small effort.

"You can make a huge difference on energy consumption by eating local food and it's easy to do, compared to spending \$20,000 on solar panels," she said.

Local economy

The 100-mile diet supports the local economy by supporting local

Dale Baker runs the Don Baker Farm in Hudson. His family farm has been in business since the 1900s. He sells his produce (including the best, freshest cherries you'll ever eat) at local farmers markets throughout the Capital District.

He said the family farm is a dying institution and eating locally helps supports the ones left.

"It keeps farms in business. Local farms are struggling and few are going into farming," he said.

Baker said people don't eat locally enough because they don't want to put in the effort.

"It's not easy to eat locally and it probably isn't cheap. You are going to pay a few extra dollars for your meat and produce depending on where you shop," he said.

Roots and Wisdom, an agriculture community service program supported by Schenectady County, is doing its part to support local farming and raise awareness about the local food movement.

Debbie Forester is one of the program's directors. Roots and Wisdom, which is in its second year involves 27 youth. The students grow herbs and vegetables to sell at farmers markets and also donate food to the Inner City Mis-

Roots and Wisdom organized a "Be Vocal Eat Local" week, running from July 22 to 28. The event's goal was to raise awareness about the local food movement.

The group plans to encourage people to eat local foods by handing out informational flyers and encouraging local restaurants to buy food from local farms.

Forester said nine local restaurants have promised to buy more local foods for the week.

Forester said she agrees with the concept of the 100-mile diet, but also thinks people should do as much as they can to promote local foods.

"We raise awareness about the importance of eating locally and how easy it can become,' Forester said. "You don't have to have strawberries in December, but you can freeze strawberries in June so you can have smoothies in December.'

Internet phone provider hangs up on customers

SunRocket's closing leaves local provider vying to fill the void

The unexpected and unannounced closure of a Virginia-based voice over Internet protocol (VoIP) phone company left thousands of area clients without phone service last week.

When Internet phone carrier SunRocket closed its doors Monday, terminating its service, all clients heard when they called was "we are no longer taking customer service or sales calls. Goodbye."

Now, clients' money and phone numbers hang in limbo.

The national media instantly swarmed on SunRocket, the country's second-largest VoIP company, behind Vonage Holdings, upon news of the closing. And scores of clients who had spent \$199 on a year's service contract began shopping around for new phone service.

Calls have been non-stop to Menands-based VoIP company Voiceral. It, along with a slew of competitors, is vying for the business of more than 200,000 disenfranchised SunRocket Internet phone clients nationwide.

"It looks like they basically ran out of money. My guess is that there are about 2,000 SunRocket customers in the area. They're done. These people are literally without service," said Voiceral chief executive officer and company co-founder David Conboy.

To land former SunRocket clients, Voiceral is offering three months of free service, no activation fees and free overnight shipping of a VoIP device.

Attempts to contact SunRocket were unsuccessful.

Conboy said the company has been the talk of the industry for a while now. SunRocket was one of the service's lowest cost providers.

According to Conboy, SunRocket had allegedly been in negotiations with several potential buyers for a while. The company closed shop after final negotiations with a potential buyer failed, said Conboy. An Associated Press story stated the company headquarters in Tyson's Corner, Va., closed

Monday, July 16. A cardboard sign hung on the door read "Out of Business."

Voiceral entered the Internet phone business in November 2005. It's a business riddled with thin profit margins and highly competitive pricing, said Conboy. The company serves clients in New York, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and New Jersey.

Conboy and Voiceral executives expected that their company would see a profit after its first seven years. To keep costs to a minimum, the company pulled advertising and instead relied on word of mouth. A little more than two months ago, the company broke even.

With SunRocket's closing, the VoIP business has changed overnight, Conboy said.

The market's whole emphasis has been to have the best prices available. Now it's more than that. Now it is who is going to be

around and who is dependable, Conboy said.

"Price all of the sudden is not the issue," he said.

Voiceral has thrown its hat in the ring with the likes of large VoIP providers Packet 8 and TeleBlend — who both approached Sherwood Partners of California, the company liquidating SunRocket's assets — to get at the 200,000 to 220,000 disenfranchised customers, said Sherwood founder Martin Pichinson.

Sherwood specializes in liquidating the assets of defunct dot-com and telecommunication companies.

"Sherwood expects to enter into agreements with other service providers to transition the customers of SunRocket to such providers," read a company statement.


Pichinson's phone, like Voiceral's has been ringing off the hook as SunRocket customers look to recoup their losses and VoIP companies look to gain their business.

"We are telling them the company is out of business," he said

As far as getting new phone service, that is between clients and VoIP providers, Pichinson said.

For now, SunRocket clients have turned to one another, offering advice about replacement companies and listing alternative plans. Among many of the lists, Voiceral is popping up.

Bellevue Woman's Hospital strikes deal to stay open

Ellis will take over operations on Nov. 1

Bellevue Woman's Hospital has agreed to give up its operating license and allow Ellis Hospital to take it over, which will essentially keep Bellevue's doors open for the foreseeable future.

On Nov. 1, Bellevue Woman's Hospital will become Ellis Hospital.

Bellevue Chief Executive Officer Anne Saile said she views the decision as a victory for the hospital.

"I think this is a great outcome for Bellevue," she said. "We framed the debate of women's health issues and how important they are, and we had a great victory in making our voices heard. I'm looking forward to a good outcome for Bellevue."

Ellis Chief Executive Officer James Connolly said he wants to make it a smooth transition for Bellevue's patients and staff.

"Our goal from a patient perspective is to make the change transparent. Someone who came into Bellevue six months ago will see the same people, receive the same services and feel the same commitment to their needs on Nov. 1. They won't see any difference," Connolly said.

Connolly said he doesn't anticipate any loss of jobs when Ellis takes over in November, but at least one important figure will go. Saile said it is time for her to move on.

"My work at Bellevue is done," Saile said. "It was a for-profit when I came, I turned it into a not-for-profit and we have received national awards and financially made a remarkable turnaround. I am very proud of the work I've done here, and I'm very proud of this hospital."

Saile said she plans to work on the national level and is working on a book about women's health issues.

"I've had many opportunities, and it's time for me to choose one," she said. "I'm proud of everything I have achieved, and I'm confident for the future."

The Berger Commission, also known as the Commission on Health Care in the 21st Century, recommended that Bellevue give up its operating license in 2008. Its recommendations became law on Jan. 1.

The commission cited the hospital's increasing debt as a reason for its closure – a fact

that Bellevue supporters and administrators worked hard to prove false.

Bellevue's long-term future is still uncertain. Connolly has asked the Department of Health to conduct a feasibility study as to the impact three hospital campuses would have versus one or two.

The Berger Commission, which reviewed health-care institutions across New York, has also mandated that St. Clare's Hospital merge with Ellis.

Connolly said the outcome of that study would determine how long Ellis would be operating on Bellevue's campus.

Connolly said the staff at Ellis feels appreciative that something has been decided. He said his staff is looking forward to working with their colleagues at Bellevue.

Saile said the staff at Bellevue, who will soon become Ellis employees, are a bit stressed with the change.

"Change is stressful and does prompt questions, but they are happy that the hospital has been saved and our mission is achieved," Saile said. "They are now just waiting to hear from Ellis as to what the future looks like for them."

Since the Berger C o m m is sion's recommendations became public, Bellevue supporters fallied the community and political leaders asking that Bellevue be exempted from the recommendations.

The state Senate passed a bill exempting Bellevue from the Berger law, but the state Assembly bill never made it past the Health Committee.

Saile said she was disappointed that Bellevue administrators never received a personal meeting with Gov. Eliot Spitzer.

"For women's sake, I feel we should have at least been given a meeting with him so he could have heard first had about our issues," she said. "We deal with 100,000 women a year. These women want to know that full attention has been paid to this issue."

Saile is the most pleased that Bellevue's struggle has allowed for a discussion about the importance of woman's health issues.

"Many people view this as a real victory for women," Saile said. "In the last few months, we've spoken as much about women's issues was we did in 1920 when we won the right to vote."

Painting a brighter future for youth

Clifton Park woman sending art supplies to Africa

Kathryn Comstock wants to bring a little color to the hard lives of some of Africa's orphans.

Comstock, 46, is collecting donated art supplies to send to the Village of Hope orphanage in Ghana. She first heard about the orphanage on "Oprah" last year, and was inspired to action.

Earlier this month, Comstock organized friends and family to put up posters seeking donations in her Fox Run community in Clifton Park. So far, the four or five donations that she has received fill up half of her kitchen table.

"I'm disabled, I don't have a job, but I can organize other people to do things," Comstock said. "I have that time and I'm able to do that because of what's going on in my life, and if I weren't to use that time like that, what would I be doing? I feel a sense of obligation."

The orphanage was built by Christian missionaries in 1989 and currently houses 235 children. The group runs residential, educational, spiritual, and agricultural programs, as well as the Andrea Browning Clinic, which was built in 2004.

Due to its limited capacity, only 62 of the children are able to stay on the main campus. Forty-nine others are with foster parents in several towns and villages throughout Ghana, and are supported financially by the Village of Hope. The rest of the children are assisted through the orphanage's street program.

Adam Vinik, 21, got involved with Comstock's project when he started dating her daughter Amanda.

"Here we are sitting on a nice day enjoying ourselves, and that's what most Americans do," Vinik said. "Over there, what are they doing right now? Just sitting there, doing nothing, basically just trying to survive.

"Their world being so dark, you can bring some light into their lives by letting them enjoy themselves," Vinik added.

With all of the needs of the orphanage, Comstock could have chosen a variety of supplies to collect and donate, but she said art was important to her.

"I'm an artist and I know how important it is to get emotions out, especially for kids who have been traumatized," she said. "It will help them express themselves in different ways, and not only that, it will bring them color that they don't have."

Josiah Tilton is the executive director for Ghana West Africa Missions in the United States, the organization that backs the Village of Hope.

"Ghana is a very poor country ... so the people really struggle to find the help that they need. Our purpose is to help the children who are orphans or abandoned and to try and provide them with schooling, education, food, clothing: any

of those things that would make those lives easier," Tilton said. "None of us are able to do it by ourselves so we certainly need to help in every way that we can find."

Comstock said the next step in the project is to get local churches and businesses involved. She is no stranger to organizing charity events. Last year, she oversaw a Sept. 11 commemoration in Cohoes in which local businesses donated all of the materials for the event.

"I can't really do a lot of things, but I can get a lot of people to do a lot of things," Comstock said. "That is what this is going to be about. It's not about one person doing things, it's about everybody coming together and taking part in this."

Museum to show Revolutionary War artifacts

Arare display of Revolutionary War-era artifacts, recently on exhibit at the State Capitol, will

be open to the public again on Friday, Aug. 3, as part of the state Museum's First Friday event. "Freedom's Treasures," open from 5 to 9 p.m., features a collection from the New York State Library, Archives and Museum of some of New York's most important Revolutionary War-era artifacts.

The exhibition includes an original draft of George Washington's farewell address, which was sent to Alexander Hamilton for comment and revision on May 15, 1796. The document is part of the George Washington Collection at the state library and was rescued from the fire that ravaged the State Capitol in 1911.

"Freedom's Treasures" also will give the public the chance to see a pistol that was given to President Washington by the Marquis de Lafayette and one of General Washington's dress swords. According to Washington family tradition, the sword was presented to Washington by Frederick the Great, King of

Other artifacts included in this exhibition are a portrait of Gov. DeWitt Clinton and a writing desk he used; the original engrossed (large print) copy of the U.S.Constitution sent to New York State for ratification and the "spy papers" retrieved from British Major John Andreÿ's boot that implicated American Gen. Benedict Arnold in the West Point conspiracy. There also is a print of Andrey crossing the Hudson River (based upon his own drawing of the event).

The event is free and will include complimentary refreshments. Parking is available in lots on both sides of the museum and visitors can also ride the Albany City Trolley to and from the museum.




Tours highlight historic Shaker sites







Paddling their own kayaks

Community donates boats to camp for burn victims

Colonie town employees, with the help of local businesses and residents, bought and delivered four kayaks to a summer camp in Connecticut for burn victims earlier this month.

Colonie Fire Services Chief Peter Lattanzio and Joseph Contois, Colonie's building inspector, acquired the kayaks. On Thursday, July 12, Lattanzio and his wife drove the kayaks two hours to the Connecticut Burn Care Foundation camp.

The camp gives burn victims ages 8 to 18 the opportunity to enjoy outdoor activities among their peers.

For many it's the first time in their lives since suffering their injuries that they are able to enjoy such activities.

'Some have never swum in fresh water, never eaten a hot dog or have never had anyone care for them. It's a place for these kids to go where others have the same problems, mentally and physically," said Contois.

The children's' injuries are bad, he said.

Some have no fingers; some have had large skin grafts; some are missing limbs from injuries sustained in fires. They are victims of fire and in some cases abuse by caregivers, said Contois. They run the gambit of fire injuries and often suffer from limited mobility and need constant care to avoid infection.

They come from throughout the Northeast and the world. The children keep their distance from public pools and outdoor recreational facilities to avoid stares and gawking, said Contois. The camp is the only one of its kind in the northeast for children victims of burns.

Throughout the camp's 176 acres, children can also learn archery and golf, and they can camp out. Each summer the camp in Union, Conn., allow children to boat, hike and fish on the private lake.

"Their great, the kids love them and we can't get them out of them," said Frank Szivos, Connecticut Burn Care Foundation executive director. "It's a very kind gesture. I wish

we had more."

The camp relies on contributions like the kayaks to be able to host the kids, he said. This year, 67 children from throughout the world are paddling around in the donated kayaks and enjoying their summer, said Szivos.

Contois and Lattanzio decided to donate the kayaks after Lattanzio returned from a visit to the camp last year. Lattanzio noticed they had the lake but no kayaks to enjoy them.

Through the generosity of a lot of local businesses the two were able to donate the kayaks, he said.

The kayaks are designed so the boater does not recede into the craft, said Lattnazio. If the craft were to tip over the children would just fall out. And because they are perched on top of the craft, they are able to maneuver the kayaks.

The Latham Sports Authority sold the kayaks at a discount to Lattanzio and Contois. The money to purchase the boats and equipment was provided by Comalli Electric Inc., Bette & Cring, Hudson River Preserve-Lake Shore/Beverwyck Apartments, Joseph Contois Home



Bookstore hosts a day of Magic

Fans celebrate popular card game's latest release

On Saturday, July 14, the air was full of suspense at Flights of Fantasy Books in Loudonville as gamers from all around the Capital District took their seats and waited. Soon, cards from one of the world's most popular trading card games would be distributed, those assembled would build decks from scratch, and the tournament would begin.

Since 1993, Wizards of the Coast has been publishing "Magic: The Gathering. Simply known to gamers as "Magic," it is a trading card game in which players employ intricate strategies and rules to simulate a battle between two wizards.

According to the Wizards of the Coast Web site, "players take on the role of planeswalkerspowerful wizards who battle others for glory, knowledge and conquest. Each player's deck of cards represents the player's arsenal of weapons,

which includes spells and the Coast said in promotional creatures."

The cards feature text explaining the rules, and magnificent illustrations that complement the fantastic element of the game, adding to the game's

"We are the only new and used book store in the Capital Region for science fiction and science fiction-related games," said Perry. "Magic' accounts, I would say, for at least 18 to 20 percent of the business. 'Magic' was the first to come out with a card game that replicates role-playing in what I call a 'microwave' version. In other words, you don't have to cook it for three or four hours, you can actually just come up with a deck in a couple of minutes and play."

July 14 saw the worldwide release of Magic's 10th core set of cards in a special event known as Magic Game Day.

"Magic Game Day is the one event of the year that no Magic player, new or old, will want to miss," Elaine Chase, senior brand manager for Wizards of material.

Magic attracts an audience from all ages and all walks of life. Players are each attracted to something different about the game. Whether it's the social element, the elements of strategy and chance, the fantasy setting, or the unlimited variety, players make Magic one of the most successful trading card games there is.

Magic players found the day to be an event of fantastic thrills.

"I play just to have a good time," said Joshua Perrin, 20, of Stephentown. "I'm attracted to the fact that it is very socially rewarding."

Many players are longtime

Matt DiMauro of Colonie, 25, for example, has been playing for 13 years - nearly the entire history of the game.

"[I have] 90 percent of every expansion," he said, referring to the continuing production of cards. "I'm a collector as well as a player."

"I never worry about the price," said DiMauro. "If it's what I need for the deck, it goes into the deck."

Ultimately, the game of Magic: The Gathering is about having a good time.







Family, friends help student fight liver failure

Voorheesville boy has lived in hospital for two months

On Tuesday, May 29, Stephanie Pincheon, a mother of three boys from Voorheesville, met her own mother at a halfway point to pick up her son Jimmy, 12, who had spent Memorial Day weekend at his grandmother's.

When Pincheon first saw her son that day, he seemed playful and in good spirits as usual. However, Jimmy wears glasses occasionally, and when she asked him to take them off, she noticed the whites of his eyes were a strange yellow color. Slightly alarmed, Pincheon asked if Jimmy or Grandma had noticed them throughout the weekend, but neither of them had.

Although she didn't think the strange color of her son's eyes was anything too serious, she took him to Albany Medical Center.

"I figured with him being there for the entire weekend and mowing the lawn and what not. he probably just had an allergy and needed some eye drops,'

However, doctors at Albany Med suspected there was a bigger problem. At first, Jimmy had shown only small signs of jaundice, the yellowing of skin and eyes due to high levels of bile in the blood, yet by Thursday, according to Pincheon, his skin was almost fluorescent yellow in color.

After several blood tests, they concluded that he had liver failure. Though they didn't know exactly why Jimmy's liver was failing, they suspected he had contracted a virus, such as Hepatitis B or C, which can cause liver failure.

Yet Jimmy didn't test positive for any of these, and his INR, a measurement of how long it takes a patient's blood to clot, was off the charts.

Whatever the cause was, Jimmy's liver was failing, and he needed to be immediately transferred to Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City, where more resources could treat his condition.

Nearly two months later, still a patient at Mount Sinai, Jimmy, who friends describe as loyal, cheerful, and funny, is supposed to be attending seventh grade at Voorheesville Middle School this fall. However, his situation is unique, for better or for worse. According to Pincheon, Jimmy is not well enough to live outside the hospital, but he is also not sick enough to qualify for a liver transplant, because there are patients who are sicker than he and further up on the donor list.

Dr. Cary Qualia, a pediatric gastroenterologist at Albany Medical Center, talked about liver failure.

"Sicker patients with more concerning laboratory values (such as the INR) are placed higher on the list, and become the most likely patients to receive livers from the donor pool," he

Since Jimmy is too smallto accept an entire adult-sized liver, Qualia said Jimmy may be a candidate for a split liver transplant, where a portion of an adult liver is transplanted. A living person, typically a parent or sibling, can sometimes serve as the donor.

However, accepting a section of the liver is risky since there is the possibility that the body could reject it. The donor must be in excellent physical and psychological health and must undergo extensive evaluation prior to the surgery.

Pincheon said doctors are hoping Jimmy's liver will repair itself, and that he won't need a transplant. Qualia said this could be a possibility for him.

"In some situations, the liver can heal, depending on the underlying disease and how much of it is involved," he

At this point, for Pincheon and her two other sons, Justin, 19, and Jason, 18, dealing with the many unanswered questions about Jimmy's situation is the most frustrating part.

According to Pincheon, it is uncertain when Jimmy's condition will improve, and doctors still don't know what virus caused him to have liver

With 30 to 40 percent of the cases, they may not know what virus caused it," said Pincheon. "The whole family could have been somewhere, and it just chose to attack him.'

Pincheon also mentioned how hard it's been watching her ailing son at a hospital right across from New York City's Central

security systems company doing administrative work. However, she is currently not working, due to Jimmy's location and condition. Pincheon takes the train every week to Mt. Sinai, and then returns home to run errands and check on her son Jason, who is in college and living at home.

She says that Jimmy is never left alone at the hospital, and if she's not there, Jimmy's grandmother is.

Diane Ward, a Voorheesville resident who knew about the Pincheons from her son who was in the Marines with Justin Pincheon, reached out to help by starting The Jimmy Pincheon Fund, where donations can be made to help the Pincheons through their crisis.

Ward has a daughter in the second grade, and has been active in the local community as vice president of Blue Star Mothers of America. She didn't hesitate to help Pincheon when her son told her about Jimmy.

"I was like, what can I do

to help you, and just kind of snowballed from there, " she said.

Ward has already set up a few fundraisers for the Jimmy Pincheon Fund, including a music festival that took place at Voorheesville High School on Saturday, July 14, and a car wash at Nichols' Shop 'n' Save on Sunday, July 22, that raised \$1,720 for the Jimmy Pincheon Fund.

Many students and parents in the area have posted comments for Jimmy on CaringBridge.org, a nonprofit organization that

offers personalized Web sites for family and friends to keep in touch with a loved one during a significant life event. Ward says the response from the local community has been uplifting.

"Everybody wants to see him better. You can see all the good wishes on the Web site," she said. "It's good to see the community has given so much to Jimmy."

Ward recently visited Jimmy at Mt. Sinai, and says he is in good spirits.

"He always has a smile. He's really handling this so well," she



Agency to review senior records

Albany County has contracted a Delmar research firm to record the work of senior resource caseworkers who assist area seniors in enrolling in federal medical plans.

Golden Lane Associates in turn has made available \$1,250 to senior resources departments in Colonie and Bethlehem to assure that the records of seniors seeking help are made available.

Colonie and Bethlehem have both extended the free counseling to seniors in their towns for years. By keeping records of the work, Golden Lane and the county Department for the Aging are hoping the records can be used to secure future state and federal funding.

By funding municipal counseling services, like those provided by Colonie's Senior Resource Department, the county and state can better grasp what is going on with its "People still don't understand the oftencomplicated layers of prescription plans. senior population, said Christine Cary, department case worker.

"In order to get the picture of what's happening in the county, you have to have the numbers. This year we have counseled 200 individuals on Medicare and drug programs," said Cary.

For years, Colonie has been walking seniors and caregivers through the complicated process of getting proper and adequate health care and drug coverage under Medicare and its new prescription drug plan. Despite counseling hundreds every year and sponsoring informational sessions at area nursing homes and senior centers, many still have a tough time cutting through the confusion and red tape.

"There is still a lot of it out there. People still don't understand the often-complicated layers of prescription plans. Even caregivers who are experienced in helping their parents find it difficult to manage (prescription) plans," said Cary.

Although it's not a large sum, the grant money will help to continue getting the word out through counseling.

Golden Lane Associates chose Colonie and Bethlehem's senior resource departments because they have extended such services to senior for years, said Rose Golden, association president.

Golden Lane will review Bethlehem and Colonie's records and in turn will share that information with the county. The county will then share those numbers with state agencies that will vie for additional federal funding, said Golden.

"The state will get a better

picture of what is happening in Albany County. Albany has been doing much more than what has been recorded. If they (state and federal agencies) don't see the numbers, then funding gets questioned," Golden said.

Counseling will continue to review existing drug coverage, compare Medicare drug plans and help seniors choose and enroll in a plan. The sessions also discuss financial assistance for drug coverage and supplementing Medicare with state coverage plans.

"These services have always been available to our seniors. However, this is the first time we have received a grant to help fund them. The town of Colonie is known for great services and this grant will allow us to continue to provide exceptional services to the town's senior population," said Supervisor Mary Brizzell in a written statement.



ven Shakespeare doesn't seem so stuffy when it's performed in the open air and bucolic setting of Congress Park in Saratoga Springs.

Entering its eighth year, the Saratoga Shakespeare Company has established a tradition of

serving the community with free, professional outdoor Shakespeare productions. The company employs professional directors, designers and actors, with the cooperation of community volunteers in all areas. But it's far from a traditional

theater experience.

"It's wonderful because you can bring a picnic, you can bring your whole family, your dog," said actor Andy Place, who portrays Don Pedro in this summer's production of "Much Ado About Nothing."

"It's very casual. There's none of that stuffy atmosphere," he said.

Then the 10-year stage veteran reconsidered his choice of words. "Not that theater is stuffy — but this is very relaxed and casual. If you want to stretch out, or if you're with the kids and they get a little fussy, you can get up and take a walk through the park. It's a wonderful setting.'

Bill Finlay, artistic director and co-founder of Saratoga Shakespeare Company, agrees.

"There are nights when, as the production winds down, the moon will sit right above

the stage. You couldn't ask for better lighting," he said.





blueblood set only endeared them to horse racing fans — not to mention the casual sports fans who only pay attention to horse racing during the Triple Crown. When Empire Maker passed Funny Cide on his way to winning the 2003 Belmont and deny the gelding his Triple Crown, the collective groan from the 101,000 spectators in Queens was loud enough to be heard all the way back in Saratoga Springs. Many more were groaning across the country.

The disappointment was palatable again in August 2003 when Funny Cide became ill from the heat in Saratoga and couldn't

run in the Travers. While the at the big tracks. When the best crowd was still big for the annual Midsummer Derby, it might have been bigger had Funny Cide raced. There were even plans to put spectators in Saratoga's infield to accommodate the overflow that was expected. That's how big Funny Cide was.

Of course, Funny Cide doesn't quite have that pull anymore. His ability to win top-grade stakes races eroded soon after his Triple Crown pursuit, which pushed him farther out of the spotlight. Before winning the Wadsworth, Funny Cide didn't have a significant stakes race victory since the 2004 Jockey Club Gold Cup. When a horse isn't winning big-name stakes races, it's hard to keep the fans' interest.

Sackatoga Stables could do for Funny Cide this year was run him at Finger Lakes, it showed how far down he had fallen. You don't go from racing at Churchill Downs, Pimlico and Belmont to racing at a third-rate track that needs video lottery terminals to justify its existence without taking a big step down. Sadly, that's what happened to Funny Cide.

Fortunately, Funny Cide won't have to worry about running at third-rate tracks anymore. He's home in Saratoga, where he can live in peaceful bliss.

Sheppard grew up in a family that was involved in horse racing. His father was a racing official in Great Britain, and at a young age, Sheppard expressed an interest in being a jockey.

"I wanted to be a flat course jockey, but I was too big for that," said Sheppard. "So, I turned to riding steeplechase horses."

Sheppard moved to the United States in the early 1960s and rode for legendary steeplechase trainer Burley Cocks for two years. Then, Sheppard started training his own steeplechase horses. His first horse, Haffaday, posted several wins in its career including a victory in the 1966 Maryland Hunt Club - one of the biggest traditional steeplechase races in the United States.

"Not only was (Haffaday) my first horse and my first winner, he was my first big winner," said Sheppard. "He helped put me on the map."

It was the only time Sheppard won the Maryland Hunt Club, but it spawned a career that is still going strong today. He currently ranks third among steeplechase trainers in victories and second in money earned this season.

Sheppard said the secret to turning a horse into a champion steeplechaser is getting to know its personality before trying to teach it technique.

"You have to know your horse before you can train it so you know what you have to do," said Sheppard. "If it's the type of horse that requires positive reinforcement, you have to pat it on the behind and say it's doing a good job.

How quickly a horse learns how to handle the jumps that come along with a steeplechase course is not always an indicator of how quickly it develops into a champion, said Sheppard.

"Sometimes I've found that the ones that have a tough time early on ... turn out to be the better ones," he said.

Sheppard is hoping to bring some more championship-caliber horses to the six-week Saratoga

"I think (racing at Saratoga is) an opportunity for us to showcase our sport in front of a group of people who don't get to usually watch it," said Sheppard. "It's sort of the highlight of the year, really."

Any additional winners would be just another feather in Jonathan Sheppard's cap. He's already achieved more than he thought was possible.

Sheppard keeps winning

Hall of Fame trainer still among the best in the nation

Trainer Jonathan Sheppard sensed his horse He's A Conniver was in a bad position on the first lap of Sunday's second steeplechase race at the Saratoga Race Course open house.

"He's a little too close to the lead," Sheppard said as He's A Conniver sat in second place. "The pace is very slow, though."

Sheppard's concern didn't fade after He's A Conniver moved into a comfortable lead as the seven-horse field completed the first of two-and-a-quarter laps on the inner turf course. Sure enough, a group of four horses rallied from behind on the backstretch and passed He's A Conniver. More Fascination managed to pull out the victory by a nose over Most Bossest, while He's A Conniver wound up fifth.

Sheppard's disappointment over his horse's performance was tempered by his excitement over the way the race ended. "That was a great finish," he said.

The 66-year-old Sheppard has seen his share of great finishes in his Hall of Fame horse training career. And while not all of them worked in his favor, he accepts every outcome.

"You have to be able to have the type of personality to deal with disappointments ... especially with steeplechase racing," he said.


Sheppard has not had a lot of disappointments in his 43-year career. As a steeplechase trainer, his horses have helped him top the earnings list 23 times, including 18 consecutive years between 1973 and 1990. Six of his horses have been National/ Eclipse steeplechase champions, including four-time champion Flatterer (1983-86). He's won 12 New York Turf Riders Cup titles at Saratoga and three Breeders' Cup steeplechase titles. The Saratoga meet opens Wednesday.

"I guess you could say there's a lot of different ingredients that make up the whole," said Sheppard. "(Finding good horses) is certainly one of them, but you also need a good team around you. You need good jockeys, and you need an owner who has very deep pockets."

Sheppard has also had success with thoroughbreds. He has saddled numerous graded stakes winners, and he was the leading trainer at Saratoga in 1984 and 1985.

"Back then, the meet was shorter, and you had fewer races," said Sheppard. "In fact, I don't think I had more than 10 winners in any meet here, both steeplechase and flat (racers)."

Funny Cide retires at right time

This column is dedicated to my No. 1 fan, my mom Sonia Jonas, who passed away July 12 at the age of 79. May she rest in peace.

The plug has been pulled on Funny Cide's racing career.

At the age of 7, the "gutsy gelding" from Saratoga Springs is retired—healthy, happy and a winner after taking the July 4 Wadsworth Memorial Handicap at Finger Lakes Race Track outside Rochester.

While it was fitting that he won his last race (seeing as how he won his first race five years ago), it was kind of sad that Funny Cide's last race was at a two-bit western New York track instead of the grand stage that is Saratoga Race Course. After all, he was born here. He was raised here. He should have at least had a chance to race here one more time.

As it stands, we will see Funny Cide at Saratoga this summer — Aug. 10 for a special day in his honor. The rest of the time, he will be used by trainer Barclay Tagg as a stable pony, guiding other horses to the track for their morning workouts.

If the Wadsworth is any indication, breakfasts at Saratoga might be a bit more crowded now that Funny Cide will be there in the morning. With the exceptions of Smarty Jones and Barbaro, no horse in the last decade has been more popular than Funny Cide.

More than 12,000 people came to Finger Lakes to watch Funny Cide run two weeks ago. Considering that Finger Lakes usually draws more flies than people, getting more than 12,000 to show up for a day of racing is a minor miracle.

Then again, Funny Cide is a minor miracle of a horse. He had so much going against him at the 2003 Kentucky Derby (being a New York-bred horse, being a gelding, being owned by a group of guys who arrived at Churchill Downs in a yellow school bus instead of separate limousines) that when he won, the earth shook from all the thoroughbred bluebloods fainting from shock.

The fact that Funny Cide and his Sackatoga Stable crew were not part of the
