Projects snarl area roads

State, county and town construction leads to detours

Motorists traveling to and from Bethlehem have their hands full driving around a maze of county and state road projects slowing down major thorough-fares. Add to that the latest news that a four-mile stretch of Blessing Road will be closed for eight weeks due to construction of a roundabout.

The most visible road work is the Route 85 Slingerlands Bypass project, where three roundabouts are under construction by the state Department of Transportation with a fourth roundabout being built at the entrance of the new Vista Technology Park.

Roundabout construction is under way at the intersections of routes 85 and 140. Route 85 and Maher Road and Route 85 and Blessing Road.

Blessing Road is closing for two reasons, according to Peter Van Keuren, DOT spokesman.

"It is both the start of the roundabout work on Blessing Road and work on the bridge adjacent to Blessing Road, where the bridge will go to four lanes," said Van Keuren.

A signed detour route is now in place to help motorists follow

'willing landowners'

A Delmar resident asked members of the Bethlehem Town Board on Wednesday, July 25, to restate the role of the Citizens Advisory Committee on Conservation, or CACC, about 18 months after the committee's formation.

Nancy Neff and her family are eighth-generation farmers. She told members of the board it is her family who should decide what will happen to the 300 acres of farmland they own in the town and not a "vocal group of open space preservationists."

The open space plan allows those who do not own the property nor make their living from it to craft regulations that can devalue it," Neff said.

Because 4,500 acres of town land is in an agricultural district and much of the newly developed town land allows for more green space and recreational areas, Neff said an open space plan is unnecessary. She also questioned the ability

to obtain state or federal grants because the town has a specific open space plan.

"By reviewing the document on funding prepared by the CACC that was presented in January, I did not notice any of the funding sources necessitating an open space plan," said Neff.

It is not the first time a town resident has presented concerns to the board regarding the role of CACC.

CACC held several meetings last year, with some members urging the town board to ensure only "willing landowners" would participate in future open space plan opportunities.

Minutes of the CACC Advisory Committee in October stated that committee member Valerie Newell questioned the need for an open space plan.

The town board reassured Neff at the July 25 meeting



that taking private land from a property owner who has no interest in selling or giving the land away is not the group's purpose.

"It is not my intent to involve any farm or piece of private land owned by someone who does not want to participate," said town Supervisor Jack Cunningham.

Town board member Sam Messina said the committee still has work to do before conclusions can be reached regarding committee and town goals.

"Again, I assure you we have committed not to trample on the rights of landowners," said Messina.

Board member Dan Plummer said he will not advocate for any plan that takes land away from unwilling landowners but as a member of the town board, he did tell Neff future preservation of town land is important.

"If there is an opportunity to preserve land, we ought to do it," said Plummer.

Kyle Kotary, also a member of the town board, said CACC is designed to receive community input.

"The open space plan will allow us to better manage growth in the future and to set a plan or working order to get there," said Kotary.

Kotary agreed with his colleagues that it is not the board's intent to "infringe on anyone's rights or restrict what they can do with their land."

Fire department depends on Ollie

Desire to serve still burns in Elsmere volunteer

· When Oliver Palmer first joined the Elsmere Fire Department in 1953, Dwight Eisenhower was president of the United States, and the Yankees defeated the Brooklyn Dodgers in the World Series

As Palmer celebrates his 83rd birthday this month, he looks back on 54 years as a member of Elsmere's Fire Department with much pride and plenty of memories.

"This is the best bunch of guys I've ever seen," said Palmer, who has seen the department grow from 22 members to 80, with more joining. "I love them all."

Palmer was the main driver and pump operator for 35 years when the first Elsmere fire truck rolled out of the old two-story brick firehouse and responded to the now defunct neighborhood box alarms. The alarms would send a punch-code message back to the firehouse on a Teletype machine that would indicate where the fire was burning.

There were no Scott air packs with all the equipment back then," said Palmer. "You just kept down low and got the fire out the best you could."

Palmer rescued a 10-year old girl from a burning structure in 1999 on Delaware Avenue when the girl became trapped on a second story porch.

"I pulled her out with the

ladder and got her right off the roof," Palmer said.

Fire engines and equipment in a firehouse has changed over the years, but the heart and soul of a firefighter has not. Elsmere Fire Chief Iim Reagan said "Ollie," as he is fondly known, is an inspiration to his department.

Ollie is the strength of the community and his firehouse," said Reagan.

Palmer was there for his department in September 2001 when the firehouse was asked to transport members to the World Trade Center in New York City to help with the cleanup after the terrorist attacks. He quickly obtained a bus and, in just minutes, several firemen from Elsmere were driving down the Thruway to Manhattan.

"All the young guys gather tips through the knowledge he shares with them," said Reagan.

Local Delmar resident and artist Terry Rooney was looking for a fireman with several years of service when he came across Palmer, who became a model for one of Rooney's sculptures. The bust of Palmer designed last year was on view for several months at the Cooperstown Art Museum before being transferred to the Elsmere firehouse where it now rests.

With more than a half century of service under his belt. Palmer still attends weekly drill sessions and monthly meetings.

"He gives us something to talk about all the time," said Reagan. "The department depends on Ollie."


Bethlehem Food Pantry distributing school supplies

The Bethlehem Food Pantry is in need of school supplies. That's right, school supplies.

In addition to collecting and distributing food items, the 25-year-old, town-supported food pantry also runs an annual school supply drive. Bethlehem Senior Projects, Inc., oversees both the food pantry and the school supply drive collection for children in the Bethlehem Central School District and

"This is really a community food pantry," said outreach worker William A. Vail, who works with Sanders and others in the office keeping the six large cabinets of food and supplies full throughout the year.



Non-perishable food items such as cans of soup, pasta, peanut butter, cereal and crackers are a portion of what is collected. 'We served a total of 676 individuals last year and over 600 families in the town have used the food pantry since its inception,' said Sanders. I know you are not supposed to sweat the small stuff, but when the power went out a few weeks ago on a hot, humid evening there was nothing to do but sweat.

Sweat, and worry about the food in the refrigerator and go to the bathroom by candlelight and absentmindedly flip light switches to no avail.

We've lost power before, but usually just for a short time in the middle of the night when we were asleep or during the day when we're not home. The only inconvenience has been the need to re-set clocks.

But this time we had no electricity for just short of 24 hours.

My 10-year-old didn't want to go to bed because "it was too dark." Well, it was too dark to read, I reasoned, and that's something both she and I are used to doing before drifting off to sleep. But "too dark to sleep" didn't pass for a good excuse to stay up longer.


Now, if she had said it was too hot to sleep, then that would have made sense.

Even after the thunder and lightning storms ended, the humidity hung in the air. We couldn't cool the house by opening the windows, the oscillating fans on our dressers were unusable, and of course the air conditioner was silent.

We are clearly spoiled by having air conditioning. Many people live without air conditioning all the time. Not having it for a night was inconvenient and uncomfortable, but not the end of the world. Overall, for our family, the storm was no big deal.

I try to teach my daughter the importance of having a positive attitude. Sometimes it's a "do as I say, not as I do" type of lesson, but I mostly try to model what I preach.

Prior to her recent birthday celebration, I gave a pre-party pep talk. I said it was going to be a great party, and that she should concentrate on having a good time



and not expect everything to go a specific way. However it goes, it goes, we need to be flexible, I said. I was talking to myself as much as I was talking to her.

Then I went to pick up the cake and had my first lesson in remaining flexible.

The birthday cake was not decorated as I had requested. I had asked for at least eight flowers on the cake and the flowers were to be spaced out around the perimeter of the sheet cake. This was to avoid disappointment during cake distribution time when every child yells, "I want a flower."

A saner option would be to just make sure the birthday girl gets a flower and tell the other guests to just deal with it. That's been the historical strategy. Another option would have been to request no flowers. This was my daughter's original suggestion since she didn't want any of her friends upset.

I told her not to worry. I had a plan. I drew up instructions, I spoke to a bakery worker and explained what I needed and why. Every guest who wanted a flower would get one.

Then I went to pick up the cake.

There were only six flowers, in groups of three, at two corners of the cake.

This is not what I requested, I told the woman behind the counter. She came over and we peered at the cake through the plastic top of the box.

"There's supposed to be at least eight flowers," I said.

"We're only allowed to put six flowers on the cake," the baker explained, "because of the time it takes."

"I also wanted the flowers spaced apart, that is, on different parts of the cake," I persisted.

She stared at me blankly.

"Why didn't anyone call and let me know about the six-flower limit? What is the point of putting down special instructions on the order form if they are not followed? I would have paid for additional flowers."

"It costs \$1 per flower for extra flowers," said the bakery woman.

In the time it took to discuss the matter, I'm pretty sure the woman could've iced an entire garden on this cake. If the six existing flowers had been spread around I would've paid extra for two more, but at this point adding on to those corner bouquets was not going to fix the problem. I would still not be able to cut individual flower-topped slices.

If I'd had more time I would've spoken to the manager and asked for the store to provide the extra flowers at no cost since they did not follow the instructions, nor did they call to give me other options.

But time was ticking and there were 250 water balloons waiting to be filled.

I drove home thinking about how to break the news to Rachel.

"The store didn't do what I asked," I blurted to my daughter after I'd stashed the cake out of sight. I explained that the person who took the order didn't know there was a six-flower limit, but not to worry, every child who wanted a flower would get at least part of a flower.

"Oh, OK," she said.

With the cake crisis over, I focused on the water balloons.

This was our first time filling water balloons and I had fully intended to do a trial run before the day of the party. That would've been a good idea.

Another good idea would have been to heed the warning on the package that said, "Do not overfill."

This means don't try to make mango-sized water balloons when you've purchased the peach size. The balloons will stretch and fill, but then they become highly susceptible to breakage.

We found this out the hard way. Some of the balloons just spontaneously burst when we were nowhere near the container. I tried gently rearranging the balloons so that larger ones were on the bottom, but this was like moving through a minefield.

Tiny water-filled balloons are hard to tie, especially when your fingers are wet. Rachel was letting a bit of water out before tying hers. In retrospect, she had the right idea. She was doing it to make them easier to tie, but it was also a good idea because we were initially overfilling them (at my insistence!). One of the balloons got a tiny, tiny hole and became an itty-bitty fountain with its gentle spray. Another balloon fell under my lawn chair before it was tied. It danced around crazily as it deflated, and the water shot up through the chair's webbing and gave me a wet bottom.

Instead of getting upset, we just laughed. We also decided that we did not need to fill all 250 balloons in the package and that whatever quantity we had completed would have to do because guests would be arriving shortly and we still had to cut up the fruit.

That's when we discovered the bad melon. Let's just say it's a good thing we had back-up cantaloupe, because the one my husband sliced open minutes before the party started had an offensive odor and an unpleasant taste.

Despite the glitches, we still had chocolate cake, two buckets of water balloons, a large fruit salad, four pizza pies, sunny weather and functioning electricity.

Things don't always go exactly as planned, but if you find a way to keep your cool for minor problems, you can save your sweat for the beach.

Outdoor theater festival a scene setter

Helderbergs the backdrop for 'Othello' and 'Peter Pan'

If you enjoy local theater and the great outdoors, you may want to catch the Helderberg Theater Festival, the second half of which takes place at Indian Ladder Farms this weekend, with double-feature performances on Friday, through Sunday, Aug. 3, 4 and 5.

The festival is put on by Classic Theater Guild Inc. and features a little something for everyone with two well-known plays: William Shakespeare's "Othello" for a more mature crowd, and J. M. Barrie's "Peter Pan" for children.

Classic Theater Guild Inc., which is in its fourth year of production, typically puts on shows at the Hilton Center in Albany, including the production of "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" in March, which started at The Hilton Center and finished

up at WAMC in Albany for its last weekend. Previous shows at the Hilton include "Auntie Mame" directed by Glenn Read in March 2006, "The Brady Bunch" directed by Debbie Conti last summer at Voorheesville Elementary School, and the Shakespeare production "As You Like It," which was directed by Ed Bablin and took place outdoors in Voorheesville.

The Helderberg Theater Festival performances are not the first outdoor productions put on by Classic Theater Guild, according to Amanda Stankavich, a former director at the Guild and currently an artistic director. She said company president Ed Bablin had Indian Ladder Farms in mind for a more unique and scenic venue for the summer.

"Ed loves the country landscape, and he always had gusto for conjunction with them for a free, outdoor event," she said.

The event is the first of its kind

at Indian Ladder Farms. Though Indian Ladder puts on several festivals of its own throughout the year, this is the first theaterrelated event they've had on their grounds.

However, the setting offers an interesting variety for viewers: "Peter Pan" takes place on a semierected stage on a large lawn area outside an apple orchard, and "Othello" takes place in a round arena inside an herb garden.

Stankavich said another idea for the festival was to have two very different shows that would appeal to a variety of audiences.

It's been a great week and a half for anyone who follows politics as a spectator sport, as it looks like Gov. Eliot Spitzer may have gone too far in his investigations of state Senate Majority Leader Joe Bruno, R-Brunswick, and his use of state-funded transportation.

While Spitzer and Bruno attack and parry, we wonder if

this is how we want our elected leaders spending their time.

Spitzer's unprecedented mandate of nearly 70 percent of the vote came largely



because the electorate hoped he would put his reputation as a clean-up guy to work in Albany. His self-serving shot at campaign finance reform would have locked the potential coffers of donors to Assembly and Senate representatives while coming up with creative ways for his own donors to keep funding him.

While he may have gone too far in the Bruno investigation, let's not forget that Bruno took advantage of a far-too-loose law to continue to increase his coffers. Now there are press conferences, meetings with editorial boards, plans of investigations and staff fired or reassigned to give the illusion of proper action.

And while this happens, what work of the people doesn't get done? Has a franchise been chosen to keep New York's racetracks running? We love Saratoga in the summer; could political dallying put that in jeopardy?

What's the status of Luther Forest and nanotechnology these days? Is AMD meeting with leaders from more functional states and reconsidering its move to the Capital District?

In Schenectady County, environmental groups wait for the passage of revisions to New York State Public Health Law to increase the penalties for those found to have violated regulations pertaining to the protection and contamination of public water supplies.

Spitzer and Bruno say they are committed to continuing the work of the state. Let's hope so; there's too much at stake to waste time trying to bring the other guy down.

Remember, voters, you have the final say, even if it's a way off. We elected 'em, we can let 'em go.

I hear her tap on a keyboard for a moment. "Sir, our installation technician has already been to your house - you weren't home."


I knew it. I am dead.

Business Spotlight Never promise more than you can deliver





The roundabout construction includes 400 linear feet of a four-lane boulevard road, 2,900 feet of a two-lane boulevard road and 5,500 linear feet of sidewalk. New water mains, valves, hydrants and their connections to existing town water mains in Vista Park are expected to cost around \$1.1 million. A water and sewer district will also be formed.

"This is a large-scale public improvement and the borrower is responsible for everything," said George Leveille, town economic development director.

Vista developers will pay for public improvements to the tech park, and the town will take over the maintenance and upkeep of all improvements once they are made.

"The town is a conduit to help with public improvements," said Leveille. "These improvements have to be made."

The Vista Technology Campus LLC investment group is overseeing development. Attorney Bill Dixon, representing Whiteman, Osterman, and Hannah, offered the public a few details about the need for the creation of the special assessment district.

"The charges would go against any of the properties which benefit," said Dixon.

A bond anticipation note is expected to be approved at some point by either the town board or the town Industrial Development Agency, with payment of the capital improvements the burden of Vista Developers.

"The town will have no risk of any bonds," said Dixon.

Leveille said a potential funding mechanism will be created, bonds will be issued for improvements to the Vista site and the payment of the improvements will be made through a special assessment tax.

"At no point during any borrowing would town taxpayers face any risk," Dixon said.

Special assessment districts are a common form of financing public improvement projects within a municipality.

The assessment district includes property that will receive a direct benefit from the construction of new public improvements or from the maintenance of existing public improvements. The local agency that forms the assessment district may sell bonds to raise the money to build or acquire the public improvement. The agency could then levy a special assessment against each parcel of land within the district, in proportion to its share of benefit from the improvement. The owners of the assessed land would most likely repay the bonds over a period of several years through annual assessments.

Blessing Road in Slingerlands will be closed for eight weeks due to the construction of a roundabout by the state Department of Transportation. A total of five roundabouts are currently under construction from the Albany city line to Slingerlands as part of several ongoing summer and fall construction projects in the area.

A signed detour route is now in place to help motorists follow Krumkill Road to access Western Avenue.

"We are trying to improve traffic flow and to make it safer for travelers now waiting 35 to 40 seconds for the traffic light," said Van Keuren.

Once the Blessing Road roundabout is complete, the traffic light will be taken away. The only Route 85 traffic light that will exist when all roundabout projects are complete in Bethlehem will be the light at the T-intersection of Route 85 and New Scotland Road in Slingerlands just before the Slingerlands Price Chopper.

The town of Bethlehem, DOT and Albany County are coordinating their summer and fall roadwork projects to make driving easier for moSlingerlands Bypass project, including reconstruction of 1.5 miles of 85 between Cherry Avenue extension and Blessing Road, is \$15.2 million.

The Albany County Department of Public Works has two major road projects of its own in Bethlehem this summer, including the \$5.7 million County Route 204 project, which will affect motorists traveling along Schoolhouse, Krumkill and Russell roads in the towns of Guilderland and Bethlehem from the state Thruway to the Albany city line.

"The project includes full-depth reconstruction on most of Schoolhouse Road and a roundabout at the intersection of Schoolhouse and Krumkill roads," said Michael Franchini, Albany County Department of Public Works commissioner.

Sidewalks will also be installed along one side of the 2.2-mile stretch of road. The now 10-week old project will be complete in November, allowing time for the state

torists. The total cost of the Slingerlands Bypass project, Including reconstruction 85 Slingerlands Bypass work next year.

"Our goal is to get our section done and be out of their way when the state works on their realignment next year," said Franchini.

A second county project affecting Bethlehem motorists this summer will be the County Route 102 project along Old Quarry Roac and Star Road in the towns of Bethlehem and Coeymans.

"It's a very long road that runs along state Route 32 all the way to state Route 143," said Franchini.

Residents of Bethlehem and surrounding communities are welcome to attend a public meeting Thursday, Aug. 2, at 7 p.m. in town hall regarding the Route 85 Slingerlands Bypass construction project. DOT staff will be available to provide the community an opportunity to hear about what is to be constructed and what changes will affect travel patterns during the balance of the construction period.

One town powered up when power went down

When the mercury rises and the lights go off, Bethlehem town hall springs into action.

Much of Bethlehem lost power due to severe storms on Monday, July 9, at about 6 p.m., and many residents didn't regain power until late Tuesday evening.

Consequently, town hall was designated a cooling station on Tuesday morning. Residents were invited to come and bring lunch, watch television, take a nap on the cots in the auditorium, or just take a break from the extreme heat. Some utilized the power to charge their cell phones.

Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham said that town hall runs on a diesel-powered generator that can last as long the town continues to fuel it, and that the permanent generator is checked every Tuesday.

"I think that the residents of the town look to the town government to be available and proactive," he said. "In Bethlehem, we're really fortunate to have built an infrastructure that can respond effectively."

Karen Pellettier, the director of senior citizens services in town, said that the town has various lists of seniors it calls during power outages and heat waves to make sure the residents are safe.

Due to the extreme heat, Pelletier said between 200 and 300 seniors were called on Monday even before the power went out. After the outage, more calls were made to at-risk seniors.

"We can't tell residents what to do, but we try to provide them with some helpful options in a

situation like this," she said.

Additionally, about 75 Bethlehem residents are on a list maintained by the Albany County Sheriff. These residents, who can voluntarily be placed on the list, are called any time there is a power outage. If police don't get an answer, they drive to the Jim Cuozzo/Spotlight file

residents' homes to make sure everyone there is safe.

One older couple who live in a mobile home told Pellettier that they were "baking" in the stifling heat without power. so they came to town hall to cool off. The husband was able to take a nap while the wife watched television. Afterward, the pair went to dinner and returned home once their power had been restored.

"They came over, they were thrilled to have some lemonade and water and some cookies and just be where it wasn't stifling hot," said Jane Sanders, a social worker with the town's senior citizens service.

One person was transported to the hospital after being overcome by the heat. Another man, who was using a payphone in town hall to make some business calls, was allowed to come into town offices and use the phones there to finish his work.

"It's our role to look out for the welfare of the people that live in town. The system works," Sanders said. "Often times, people depend on their neighbors, but if their neighbors are in the same situation, who else would they look to?"

Cunningham said he drove around town on Monday night to make sure none of the many downed trees in town, including some on Delaware Avenue near town hall, had severely damaged any homes.

"As large as Bethlehem gets, we still operate in many aspects as a small community," Cunningham said. "I think that's advantageous to the people here, and I think it's one of the reasons that it's the best place to live."

or population when making this decision. What it boils down to, he said, is that National Grid proactively performs an outage so that greater damage doesn't occur and leave more people without power for a longer period of time.

However, area officials are saying that it's not the practice of controlled outages that has them upset, but the lack of communication regarding them.

The city of Troy, which was hit hardest by controlled outages, has filed complaints with the state Public Service Commission, asking for an investigation into the July 10 power outage.

Troy Mayor Harry Tutunjian said the outage came without warning and that there was no communication about the

damage to our own infrastructure and customer damage."

PSC Spokeswoman Ann Dalton said an investigation was forthcoming, regardless of the Rensselaer County Legislature's action. "The basis for it was the number of customers," she said. "Any time the service is interrupted we investigate. We track every outage in the state."

The PSC will examine National Grid's restoration procedures and priorities, the sequence of restoration, and how and when the company announced an outage was pending, she said. National Grid said it was not possible to say if it would reimburse municipal losses associated with the outage, including \$15,000 the city of Troy reportedly spent on police overtime during the blackout.

Residential users will not receive credits, Stella said. but National Grid has sent a letter out to 21,000 customers with their current bill apologizing right thing, and I believe that for the outage and explaining the reason for the controlled outage. In the letter, the vice president of business services says the utility was trying to make repairs from a severe storm on July 9 and the extra demand caused by hot temperatures could have caused even more outages. Stella said National Grid's policy calls for reimbursement only in cases where an outage is due to accident and not a controlled outage. He could not say, however, if customers would be reimbursed for the outage, saying claims are considered on a case-by-case basis.

of nature," Stella said, but the company has a process in place to review claims.

Hours after the power was out in Saratoga County, National Grid told Saratoga Springs police at 8:30 p.m. that they hadn't even identified the cause of the outage. Saratoga Springs Public Safety Commissioner Ron Kim said he thinks communication between the utility and municipalities will get better.

"We hope and believe that the communication with National Grid will continue to improve. We've made our concerns known to them that there are important steps that we need to take if, in-fact, there is a controlled outage," he said.

Kim cuts the utility a little slack.

"I know that they're a convenient whipping boy for a lot of people if something does happen, but I've always felt that they have a desire to do the going forward, that will hap



situation for nearly five hours.

'We would have liked to have known something was happening, so we could do some planning," Tutunjian said.

Rensselaer County lawmakers voted to request a state investigation that same week and said the PSC should force the power company to notify officials about controlled outages before they occur.

Bianchetti said there isn't time to make these notifications.

"It is done, really, on a moment's notice," he said. "The system sees stress right away, and the longer we delay in making the decision to do a controlled outage in an area, the greater the potential is for

pen," he said.

There were a number of emergency services calls in the area due to the outage.

In Greenfield, an elderly woman had to call for an ambulance after the respirator on which she depends to breathe failed because of the power outage. A similar occurrence happened to a 90-year-old man living on Ballston Avenue in Saratoga Springs.

Bianchetti said he realizes that explaining the process for controlled outages is small consolation to those who are affected by them, but added. "There is nothing to say that those people wouldn't have been without power had we not done the controlled outage."







Advanced care plan is important

he United States population is rapidly aging. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), by 2030, the number of Americans aged 65 and older will more than double to 71 million older Americans, comprising roughly 20 percent of the U.S. population.

Many chronic diseases unfortunately can eventually exhaust all reasonable medical approaches and the patient and family must then navigate this final but important stage of life. Heart failure is one of those chronic diseases, which can lead to the need for end-of-life discussions including an advance care plan. The Heart Failure Society of America (HFSA) has put together information on advance care planning to provide not only grace and dignity for the patient, but to help ease the burden of the family.

A good place to start is with an understanding of what such a plan entails. It is basically a written document that helps you ensure that your health care is customized to reflect your personal preferences and health needs, as well as meet your social, cultural and religious requirements. Important things to consider include:

• Whether you want to be resuscitated if your heart stops beating;

If you want to be placed on a ventilator if you can't breathe on your own; and

 How you want pain relieved if it develops.

"Discussing end-of-life issues is not exactly something any of us wants to bring up, but telling people what you want before you become incapacitated ensures that your wishes will be carried out, and protects your family from having to deal with the burden of second guessing whether or not you'd agree with their decisions," says Barry H. Greenberg, MD, president, Heart Failure Society of America (HFSA), a nonprofit organization of health care professionals and researchers who are dedicated to enhancing the quality and duration of life for patients with heart failure and preventing the condition for those at risk.

The HFSA has put together a booklet (Advance Care Planning) focusing on end-of-life is-

sues. This information, which targets heart failure patients, can also be applied to other chronic medical conditions. The booklet explains, in easy-to-read-and-understand detail, the various components of an advance care plan, and how to put one together.

These include:

 An advance care directive – This document will provide clear evidence of your wishes regarding treatment and can include a living will, a durable health care power of attorney and a statement about organ donation.

 A do-not-resuscitate order - This directive made by you or your family in consultation with the doctor, tells doctors, nurses and other rescue personnel what they should or should not do when a person stops breathing or when their heart beats so irregularly as to threaten life or stops beating entirely. A do-notresuscitate order can include instructions on whether to use different types of methods to revive a person.

• A living will - This legal document lets people unable to participate in decisions about their medical care to express their wishes about life-sustaining treatment. A living will is usually used during a terminal illness when a person is unable to communicate; it lets you set limits on what is done to you regarding the use of medical treatments such as CPR, blood transfusions, mechanical breathing, surgery, antibiotics, kidney dialysis and invasive measures to provide nutrition and fluids.

• A health care power of attorney - This allows someone you designate to make all heath care decisions for you, including the decision to refuse lifesustaining treatment if you are unable to make the decision for yourself. You can give someone a general power of attorney or you can limit their decisionmaking to certain issues by including instructions about your care. For example, you can specify preferences regarding particular treatments such as tube feeding, intravenous fluids and organ donation if you have not covered those subjects in a living will.

• A financial plan – You and your family may have concerns about paying for medicines, doctor and hospital bills and other types of health care. A financial plan can help you deal with these issues and also provide for your family.

Once you've pulled these materials together, you may wish to consult a lawyer to help you ensure that the plan meets your individual wishes and state legal requirements. And be sure that your family knows and understands your wishes for care.

Telehealth helps patients recover at home

Very day at 8 a.m., the Rev. Robert Graves sits down in his kitchen and a pleasant female voice greets him with, "Good morning. It is time to take your vital signs." However, his nurse is several miles away.

The 70-year-old Baptist pastor, who had triple heart bypass surgery in March, is one of 24 St. Peter's Home Care patients using the telehealth monitoring system.

The telehealth monitoring system expands and improves the care offered at home, thanks to a \$150,000 grant from the state Department of Health. Graves steps on a scale for his weight. He slips on a blood

pressure cuff over his right bicep and waits for the machine to inflate it. Then he puts a small cup similar to a thimble on his middle finger to read blood oxygen saturation. He records

LoraWebster, RN, who manages the project, checks her computer screen at the Home Care offices on Wolf Road in

Colonie. The readings

the readings in a log that he from the patients are compiled in a list. If any patients have exceeded their pre-set limits for the conditions, they are flagged in red on the screen. By clicking on any name, Webster gets more information about that patient and can alert the patient's nurse to follow up promptly.

"It gives us valuable information on a daily basis, instead of once a week," Webster said. "For the patient, it's a selfmanagement tool for people to learn how to take care of themselves."

All patients receive regular weekly visits from a Home Care

nurse. Additional visits can be made if medically necessary.

St. Peter's began the telehealth project in 2006. A particular focus is to see how the program helps patients with congestive heart failure (CHF) and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

The system uses Honeywell HomMed monitors. The project aims to improve patient care and lower overall health costs by reducing the need to take Home Care patients to the hospital for emergencies.





Besides their wonderful taste, blueberries provide excellent benefits for the brain. One cup a day, fresh or frozen, can lessen the effects of both Alzheimer's disease and damage from a stroke. This fruit, rich in antioxidants, is easy to eat as a snack or as part of a healthy breakfast.

Tomatoes

Although fresh tomatoes supply many benefits, it is actually cooked tomatoes that provide our bodies with the most of the cancer-fighting antioxidant, lycopene. Canned tomatoes, ketchup, tomato paste and tomato sauce are all good sources of lycopene.

Wild salmon

A delicious source of omega-3 fatty acids, wild salmon helps reduce blood pressure, lower cholesterol and prevent heart disease. 

Heavy wheelchairs, walkers hinder caregivers

s baby boomers continue to gray and medical science extends life, many 50- and 60-somethings are caring for their parents at a time when the boomers themselves are slowing down from age-related ailments. Mobility issues become even more challenging when caregivers find it difficult to meet the physical demands of their roles.

The heft of many modern assistive devices is a good example of the kind of obstacles facing both seniors and their caregivers, experts say.

"The average wheelchair weighs around 38 pounds," notes Richard Derks of Medline, a leading manufacturer of wheelchairs and other assistive devices for seniors. "Putting most wheelchairs in a car trunk means you have to lift that 38 pounds from the ground and up about 3 feet an average of four times per trip.'

Walkers can create a similar problem for seniors who are ambulatory with the aid of the assistive device. Most walkers weigh 16 pounds or more. "That may seem light, but for seniors with mobility issues lifting that much weight into a car can be a

real challenge," Derks says. Caregivers looking after an aging parent at home may be reluctant to take seniors out on non-essential trips because of this weight issue. Yet, that type of trip – to a restaurant, salon, visiting friends, - greatly enhances the quality of life for an otherwise home-bound senior.

"The sheer difficulty of man-

aging a wheelchair often means caregivers run all the errands alone and don't take their loved ones out as much as they might like to," Derks says. "There is a physical and cognitive impact for the elderly."

Physically, mobility issues slow rehabilitation after a health setback. The more homebound seniors are, the less exercise they get. Cognitively, the senior may begin to feel increasingly dependent, falling into a more dependent role than they might want.

The good news is manufacturers of assistive devices are addressing this problem by producing lighter weight wheelchairs and other accessories. Aluminum transport chairs cut the weight down to about 23 pounds. And Medline's Freedom Transport chair weighs less than 15 pounds, a full 25 percent lighter than other transport chairs and 60 percent lighter than a standard wheelchair. Its convenient features – cup holder and seatbelt for the user, bottle holder for the caregiver, and key ring, cell phone pocket and identification holder - all speak to the designers' efforts to create a wheelchair that is practical and functional for both the caregiver and patient.

about the risk factors to begin protecting ourselves and our loved ones.

The widespread lack of knowledge about bone health is evident from a survey conducted by Opinion Research Corporation in 2006, for GTC Nutrition. This survey found that most Americans underestimate the percentage of young women who are not getting enough calcium during the peak bone-building years. Studies show 90 percent of girls ages 12 to 19 are not getting enough calcium, and more than two-thirds of all respondents to the survey weren't aware of the extent of this shortfall, including 66 percent of the respondents with children in their households.

Additionally, more than half (55 percent) of the 1,031 survey respondents were unaware that the body absorbs only about 30 percent of the calcium consumed through diet. 





Boomers looking at living to 90+

Boomers can take heart in some surprising news released in recent weeks by Eons.com about the longevity of 50-plus Americans. Their research, which examined the projected lifespan of Americans who have already celebrated their 50th birthday, showed that the roughly 450,000 people who completed the Eons Longevity Calculator will live to age 90 or more.

That's good news for those who've bought into other statistics that place the average life expectancy in the 70s. What makes the results of Eons Longevity Calculator different is that only Americans who have already passed the 50-year mark were studied, meaning they've survived the childhood accidents and diseases and the early onset forms of cancer, heart disease and other ailments that can shorten lives.

Developed by Dr. Tom Perls, a longevity expert for Eons and founder and director of Boston University's New England Centenarian Study, the Eons Longevity Calculator comprises 40 short questions about health, history, attitudes and behaviors. Visitors over the age of 50 can take the Longevity Calculator and, in about 10 minutes, discover their projected age.

While sifting through the results of the 450,000 completed questionnaires, Perls uncovered some interesting trends by state. For instance, Hawaiians 50-plus will, on average, live longer than residents of any other state, 92 years. Residents of Colorado and New Mexico were close behind. On the other end of the calculated longevity spectrum, 50-plus West Virginians are statistically likely to live the shortest lives, about 89 years.

The Longevity Calculator is one of the most popular features on Eons.com, the 50-plus Web destination that is the brainchild of Jeff Taylor. Taylor, who previously founded the online career site Monster.com, says, "Baby boomers are going to live, on average, 20 years longer than their grandparents did. But living well – not just living long – is crucial. Our 50-plus Longevity Calculator is a catalyst for this, providing users with some very simple steps that can make a real difference in the ultimate length and quality of their lives."

No matter what a person's calculated longevity is, Perls suggests a number of ways people can add real years to their lives.

• Change your attitude: Maintaining a stress-free, optimistic outlook on life can have more longevity benefits than you think. By staying positive and not dwelling on negative aspects of your life, you can add five years to your life.

• Exercise: Everyone understands the benefits of exercise, but its relationship to longevity is largely overlooked. By maintaining a modest but steady exercise regimen of at least 30 minutes a day, four days a week, people can add 10 years to their lives and enjoy a fit physique.

• Eat healthier: Similar to exercise, a well-balanced, healthy diet can have a dramatic impact on longevity. By incorporating plenty of fruits, vegetables, whole grains, fish and lean meat, while limiting trans fats and simple carbohydrates, the average American can add seven years to his life.

• Put out that cigarette: Even if illnesses related to smoking – lung cancer, mouth cancer and emphysema – don't send you to an early grave, a life of smoking can still shorten your life span by up to 15 years.

• Train your brain: New studies have shown that the strength and vitality of your brain have a direct correlation to the strength and longevity of your body. By engaging in sustained and challenging brain activity, people can add five years to their lives. This can be achieved by simply playing games like Sudoku or crossword puzzles for 20 minutes a day.

Take care of aging skin

aring for aging skin involves far more than fighting wrinkles and age spots. Skin health, from protection against UV rays to proper wound care, plays a vital role in overall health for senior Americans.

Skin is the body's first line of protection against harm. It shields us from infection, impact and the environment.

"Age brings a number of changes that can compromise the skin's ability to protect us," says Cynthia Fleck, a registered nurse and vice president of clinical marketing for Advanced Skin and Wound Care at Medline, which manufactures skin care products and educational resources for seniors.

Fleck offers the following advice on how to care for aging skin:

• "Drying is the single largest skin problem among the aged," says Fleck. She recommends avoiding a daily shower or bath, which can contribute to dry skin. Instead, opt for gentle cleansing with soap and surfactant-free (detergent-free) cleansers of the kind that do not need to be rinsed. These cleansers do the job of removing dirt and natural oils, but do not impact the natural acid balance of mature skin.

• Moisturizing on a daily basis is essential since older skin cannot retain moisture as well as young skin.


"There are new, advanced skin care products that actually nourish the skin from the outside in, delivering amino acids (proteins), vitamins, antioxidants and ingredients that are gentle and soothing, making the skin more resilient and strengthening it," says Fleck.

• Take care to avoid bumps that can tear the skin, or caustic substances that can disrupt the skin's ability to protect. Immobile seniors who must use adult diapers should have special care taken to keep them clean and free of irritants.

"Barrier products that contain protectants like dimethicone and other silicones, as well as zinc oxide, can help protect the skin from these issues," Fleck says.

• Continue to protect your skin from the sun. Melanocytes, the skin cells that protect us from the sun, do not work as well as we age. As a result, older skin burns easily. Stay out of the sun as much as possible, and when out wear protective clothing, wide-brimmed hats and sun screen.



There are many different treatment options for those with hereditary hair loss. Here are some examples:

• Finasteride, a pill, claims to stimulate hair growth by blocking the formation of the active male hormone, dihydrotestosterone (DHT).

•Hair transplantation involves removing healthy hair follicles from one area of the scalp and transplanting them to the bald areas.
