Superintendent to retire

Search process for Les Loomis' replacement already under way

Les Loomis, who came to Bethlehem Central in 1987 and has guided it through a period of significant growth and enhanced academic performance that ranks statewide, will step down at the end of the 2007-08 school year.

Loomis announced his retirement in his welcoming remarks during the district's annual Opening Day events, which kicked off his 21st year as superintendent of the district.

"BC has given me the opportunity to do important work - work that I wouldn't trade for anything," he said. "It has been an honor and a privilege to work with our students, the community and parents, faculty and staff and the board of education for the last two decades. Bethlehem Central is a great school district, and this has been a great place to raise a family."

Loomis holds a doctorate in education and a master's degree

in business administration from Harvard University, came to Bethlehem from the Andover, Mass., school district, where he was an assistant superintendent. Prior to that, he was principal of Fayetteville-Manlius High School near Syracuse.

During his time in Bethlehem, the district's enrollment grew by nearly 40 percent, and Loomis oversaw the passage of four bond issues - including the historic \$93 million referendum in 2003 - to accommodate future growth. As part of that 2003 bond act, the district will open its sixth elementary school, Eagle Elementary School, in September 2008.

Under Loomis' management, the district's finances are in good health, as evidenced by Moody's recent continuation of the district's top quality bond rating. Also during his tenure, many new educational initiatives took root, the latest of which is the full-day kindergarten program, set to begin in September

On course for the future

Open space group and town preserve greens at Colonial Acres

Colonial Acres Golf Course is Bethlehem's newest asset. Through the combination of a \$375,000 grant from the state and \$525,000 from the Open Space Conservancy of New York, the town will lease the golf course from the Conservancy for \$1 a year and pay for the day-to-day operations.

"As you can see, this course is a true treasure to our community," said Bethlehem town Supervisor Jack Cunningham on Monday, Aug. 27, overlooking the clubhouse and course that has held a long history in the town.

"It means no housing; it means a golf course; it means a lot of hard work to make it a special kind of golf course," said Peter Strand, president and one of the founding members of the nonprofit Colonial Acres Golf

Course.

Colonial Acres began as a four-hole golf course 50 years ago, and with the assistance of course superintendent Pat Bloom, it now has the highest environmental ratings of any golf course in the country.

"He has been the superintendent, and he has been dedicated to this whole process," said Strand, referring to the work Bloom has performed over the past 13 years.

Bloom will now become an employee of the town and continue to oversee the course operations.

"The original owners were great, and the town hasn't missed a beat," said Bloom.

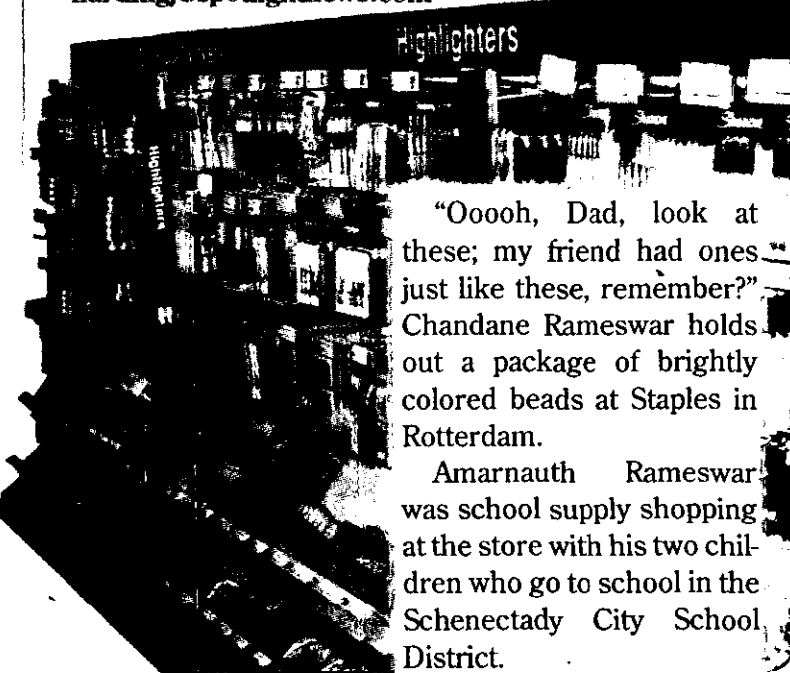
Colonial Acres now has 85 trees compared to 25 trees when Bloom was first hired, with more than 38 species of birds making their homes on the course, including the eastern bluebird, catbird, cardinal and Baltimore oriole. Bloom said the reason he has dedicated so much effort into upgrading the natural

Buying back-to-school supplies is greeted with mixed emotions

"Ooooh, Dad, look at these; my friend had ones just like these, remember?" Chandane Rameswar holds out a package of brightly colored beads at Staples in Rotterdam.

Amarnauth Rameswar was school supply shopping at the store with his two children who go to school in the Schenectady City School District.

Chandane, 12, is going to Central Park Middle School for the first time. She needs a bunch of supplies, including a dictionary, notebooks and even clothes for gym class, which she can't find at Staples.

"It's fun to look around at the different stuff," Chandane said. "The start of a new school year is like having a clean slate."

Rameswar said buying the supplies can get expensive, but he doesn't mind spending money to further his children's education.

For anyone with school-aged children, school supply shopping is an annual event signaling the end of summer and the beginning of a new school year. Teachers send

home long lists of required supplies - from binders and folders, pens and markers to tissue boxes and toilet paper.

Some parents breathe a sigh of relief when it's time to go school supply shopping, knowing that soon, their children will be back in school and busy for eight hours of the day. Others dread the added burden it puts on their pocketbooks.

For students, school supply shopping can be a daunting

task, making the approaching school year a reality and reminding them of the summer reading they forgot. For some, the act is made less tedious by the brightly colored binders, crisp folders and stiff clean erasers still in their packaging.

Lori Galea has three children who all go to school in Duanesburg. She shopped recently with her two daughters, Emily, 12, and Alyssa, 14, both of whom were not enthusiastic about school supply shopping.

Lori Galea said she is used to school supply shopping by now so she doesn't stress out about it. Going back to school for her children also means going back to school for her because she is a teacher's aide.

"I like to see everyone come back," she said.

On her list of school supplies to buy this year are flash drives for her children to store and transfer digital files, something she has never had to buy in the past.

"Everything is technological advanced now. With the flash drive they can do their work at school and take it home with

Voorheesville teen charged with sex abuse

The Albany County Sheriff's Department has charged a 17-year-old Voorheesville teen with sexually abusing two young boys.

Michael T. Hallenbeck, of 12A South Main Street was arrested on Wednesday, August 29, following an investigation conducted by Sheriff's investigators and Albany County Child Protective Services.

The complaint alleges that Hallenbeck engaged in sexual conduct with two boys ages 7 and 11, on several occasions between December 2005 and April 2007. The

abuse occurred at the victims' residence in within Kissel's in the town of New Scotland, where Hallenbeck lived. The two victims are younger relatives of Hallenbeck.

Hallenbeck was charged with one count of sexual conduct against a child, a second-degree felony, two misdemeanor counts of endangering the welfare of a child and misdemeanor second degree sex abuse.

Hallenbeck was arraigned in New Scotland Town Court before Judge David T. Wukitsch and sent to Albany County jail without bail.

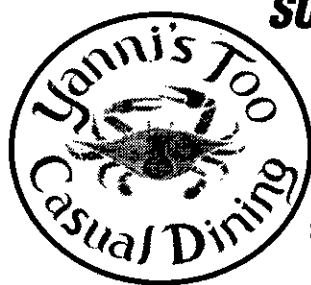

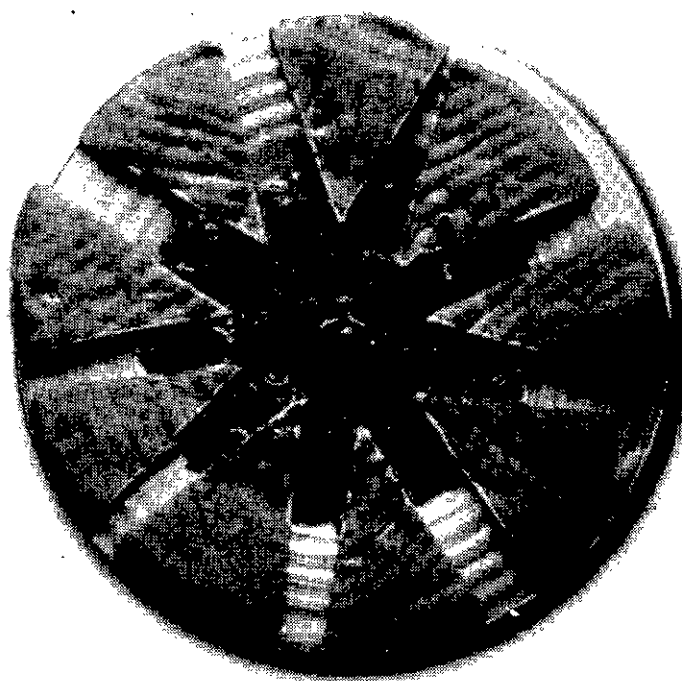

Festival highlights local food

Indian Ladder Farms will host local growers and producers at event

In celebration of the local food movement that has sprouted up within the past few years, Indian Ladder Farms will host a Local Food Festival on Sunday, Sept. 16, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Numerous food producers from the area including farmers, brewers, chocolatiers, cheese makers and vintners, will be offering a tasting of their goods and merchandise for sale. There will also be chefs from popular area restaurants providing cooking demonstrations using locally grown ingredients.

"We are really excited about the attention local food is getting. People are starting to acknowledge how healthy it is to buy it," said Liesl Bailey, special events coordinator for Indian Ladder.

For the past few years, Indian Ladder Farms, along with several other farms in the area, has been a strong advocate of the local food movement, which encourages people to purchase mostly all natural and organic foods that have been grown and manufactured within a 100-mile radius. Commonly known as the 100-mile diet, the goal is for people to eat fresh foods regularly that have traveled short distances

or have been preserved at their seasonal peak.

According to the 100-mile diet organization's Web site, www.100milediet.org, it is estimated that most ingredients in the average North American meal have traveled more than 1,500 miles, something the organization says depletes the food of its nutritional value.

"Local food isn't shipped, so you're saving money not having to truck things as far and putting money back in to our local economy," said Chris Holcomb, owner of Brown Cow Ice Cream, an all-natural product that is produced at his farm in St. Johnsville in central New York. Brown Cow Ice Cream is sold at Indian Ladder Farms and other health food stores and samples will be provided at the Local Food Festival.

Holcomb advocates buying local food because, for one thing, people can stop by the local farm to get an idea of where the food is coming from.

"You can see the animals and the people making it. You can see what's going on," he said.

Some restaurants are also getting in on the local food trend by incorporating as many locally grown foods into their dishes as possible.

One of these restaurants is Marche at 74 State Street Hotel in Albany. It features a menu made up of a blend of contemporary American beef, chicken and fish entrees. At the food fest,

Executive Chef Brian Molino and his team will be putting together one sweet and one savory dish using all locally grown products, including apples from Indian Ladder Farms.

"We would just like to show people the quality of using fresh local ingredients instead of overly manufactured goods," Molino said, adding that it can be expensive and difficult to get local farm-raised meats, but that 80 percent of the produce they serve at the restaurant is from local markets.

Every month, Marche hosts a seven-course "interactive farmers dinner" at Indian Ladder Farms, where local farmers and chefs talk about the dishes being served and answer questions from guests. The next interactive dinner will be held Friday, Sept. 14, at 7 p.m.

For Laurie Ten Eyck, general manager of Indian Ladder Farms, a main reason to put on a festival like this is to "establish a gathering spot for those interested in the local food issue, and the synergy of getting all those people together in one place."

Town considers pool upgrades

Parks administrator says filtration system in dire shape

The pool at Bethlehem's Elm Avenue Town Park on is in desperate need of improvements, including a new filtration system, said town parks Administrator Nan Lanahan at a recent budget workshop.

"It's falling apart," said Lanahan. "We aren't going to get through another summer with this." There is currently \$700,000 in the town's general fund capital reserves that could pay for the cost of a new system, which carries an estimated price tag of \$350,000 to \$400,000. The new pool filtration system will also have to be designed with ultraviolet light, a new state requirement to disinfect public swimming pools.

Town Supervisor Jack Cunningham and board member Dan Plummer urged Lanahan to make sure the town conforms to any new state Department of Health requirements for a new filtration system before going out to bid on such an expensive project.

"I'm not going to come to the board and ask for capital reserve money until we know how much that costs," Lanahan said.

The kiddie pool was built just before the state mandated an ultraviolet disinfectant system.

"We want to start looking at

changing the filtration system but not without knowing what all the state Health Department codes will be," said Cunningham.

Vandalism at Elm Avenue Park is another growing concern for the town. Lanahan said between \$5,000 and \$8,000 of vandalism has occurred over the summer by teens getting into the park during the overnight hours, causing damage to restrooms and other areas.

"Vandalism is a constant problem," Lanahan said.

In one case, someone took picnic tables out of the pavilion and placed them in the softball field. Fires have also broken out in the restrooms.

The department has staff at the park until midnight, but the vandalism is occurring in the middle of the night. Video cameras could be the next step for the town.

"My thought is to look at a security system inside the pool area," Lanahan said.

Cunningham agrees something needs to be done to curb the onslaught of vandalism at the park.

"I have been talking to the police chief about the possibility of improving patrols and better monitoring in the park area," said Cunningham, who also agrees that extra security measures like installing video cameras could also be a positive move.

"That's a possibility," Cunningham said. "The school district has used it and it has been successful for them."

RCS appoints two interim high school principals

District to hold special election for open board seat

The Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Board of Education appointed two interim ninth- and 10th-grade

principals during its Monday, Aug. 20, board meeting.

The principals will split the school year, with one serving from August through December and the other serving from January until the end of the school year.

Frank Barone will serve the first half of the school year, after serving for several years in administration in Cohoes, Oswego County BOCES, Hartford Central School District and Rensselaer High School.

Superintendent Vicki Wright said Barone "enjoys being with students, families and staff members. He is a visible principal who walks the halls, listens and responds to the needs of staff."

Michael Norelli will start his

term Jan. 2.

Norelli served in the administration of the South Colonie Central Schools for 24 years prior to retirement. Following his retirement from South Colonie, he has served as director of education for the Neil Hellman School, Parsons Child and Family Center.

"His passion for leading teachers to greater student achievement is inherent in his belief system and desire to come out of retirement and begin his career all over again," said Wright.

While Norelli is unable to start full-time at RCS prior to Jan. 2, he will have a presence in the district throughout the first part of the

school year. Wright said he plans to attend opening day meetings with high school faculty and staff and will schedule weekly meetings in the building. Norelli also plans to attend faculty and staff meetings during the three-month period.

Special election

Nominating petitions for candidates seeking to run for the RCS board of education seat available during the Oct. 9 special election are now available at the District Office at 26 Thatcher St. in Selkirk.

The vacancy on the nine-seat board was created by the June 30 resignation of board member Beth Hazelton.

Petitions containing at least 45 signatures of qualified district residents must be submitted by 4 p.m. on Sept. 10 for a candidate to appear on the Oct. 9 ballot.

The special election for the term is a non-binding vote; however, the board has expressed its desire to appoint the top vote recipient.

The reason the vote is being conducted in a non-binding manner is that the district - under state law - would have to conduct the election within 90 days of Hazelton's resignation, which would be by the end of September. Under state law, the board's other options are to not fill the vacancy or appoint a person to the position without conducting an election.

To give district residents a say in who should fill the seat and save taxpayers the cost of two separate votes by aligning the board election with the proposition vote, the board of education decided to conduct the non-binding vote.

Whoever is appointed to fill the vacancy will serve until June 30, 2008.

Greasing the wheels of conversation

In January, my then 10-year-old daughter invited a friend to our house for a sleepover. They picked up the movie "Grease" at the library. I hadn't seen the movie since I was a young teenager. I have the soundtrack (on vinyl!), and I love the music.

Almost from the start I wanted to hide my head under the afghan. The movie is filled with the sort of boy-girl stuff that you want your young daughter to avoid. I kept slipping sidelong glances at my husband.

Most people know the story: Boy and girl have a summer romance. Girl unexpectedly enrolls in the boy's high school. Boy is involved in "tough-boy" group, smokes cigarettes, drinks and rumbles. Boy blows off girl for fear of looking "un-cool" in front of his friends. Girl gets involved with a group of girls who drink and smoke and say things like "you still care about what your old man thinks?" referring to listening to their dads.

I was in junior high when "Grease" came to the movie theaters. I saw the movie several times and played the album over and over. One of my then-neighbors wouldn't let their elementary-age children see the movie because there was inappropriate language used in some of the songs. At the time I thought the parents were overly strict, but now I understand their concerns.

When we watched the movie with Rachel and her friend, I felt compelled to offer commentary: "This story takes place in the 1950s and that was before people knew how terrible cigarettes are for your health." "They're drinking alcohol at a slumber party? That's definitely a bad idea. You learned about that in school with the DARE

officer, right?" "Real friends don't pressure you into drinking and smoking."

Then there's the scene where John Travolta puts his arm around Olivia Newton-John at the drive-in movies, only his hand extends a bit too far down her shoulder and she jumps away.

"What's he doing?" the girls asked, their eyes glued to the TV screen. I made like I didn't hear the question, then I stole a look at Jeff. "He's trying to kiss her," Jeff said, without missing a beat. "Oh," the girls replied.

A few months after watching the movie, we went to see the local high school perform the show. It was a fun show and the young actors did a great job, but watching actual teenagers perform just magnified the negative themes in my mind. The actors in the movie are all adults (playing teenage characters) and the movie version seems less realistic and somewhat comical (when viewed as an adult). Still, the messages are the same, regardless of the age of the actors.

The story does reflect certain realities of teenage life: raging hormones, racing emotions and peer pressure, but the overall message is not a positive one, especially for girls.

"Grease" is full of kids with self-esteem issues. Rizzo, the leader of the girls group sings about how she has emotions and can cry, but feels that crying in front of other people is "the worst thing she could do." And all the girls seem to measure their worth by whether or not boys like them.

meant to entertain. It's not a documentary. And I didn't take it to heart as a kid, nor remember it as a racy movie. But watching the movie with two young girls cast a whole different light on the show.

How do I know how much my daughter will view as mere entertainment versus how much she will internalize as literal truths about the way relationships work?

I used the movie as a springboard to discuss the issues of self-confidence and self-respect with my daughter. I told her that I didn't like the way the main character, a nice, smart girl decides to dress in revealing clothes to get the attention of the boy she likes.

They say the third time is a charm. First we saw the movie, then the play at the high school, and then this past summer we saw "Grease" performed at the Park Playhouse in Albany. There seemed to be a lot more smooching in this version, plus the Sandy character punched the cheerleader character, but the choreography was spectacular and it was hard not to sing along ("We go together like ramma lamma lamma...").

There were two musicals performed that evening. The first was "Bye Bye Birdie," also a show about teenage romance ("Did you hear about Hugo and Kim? Did they really get pinned?"), but one that is more wholesome. Although the teenage girl swoons over a celebrity crooner, she never does kiss him.

But both "Bye Bye Birdie" and "Grease" present "going

steady" as some essential part of life. As if you can't be a whole person unless you are part of a couple. And that's simply not true, especially during one's school years.

"But Hugo, I'm wearing YOUR pin," Kim tells Hugo when he expresses jealousy of the celebrity singer with whom she's going to appear on TV.

On the other hand, Sandy returns Danny's school ring after he gets too grabby at the drive-in.

I want my daughter to understand, as Sandy did, that accepting a ring (or a pin or any gift) does not give the giver the right to disrespect you or make you feel uncomfortable in any way.

I also want her to understand that people must respect you for who you are and not for the way you look or dress. Unfortunately, the Sandy character felt pressure

to "loosen up," when she really just needed to find a new group of friends.

Grease is certainly no "High School Musical." In the latter show, there is also teenage romance, but the kids are well-rounded and stay true to themselves.

Plus, "High School Musical" promotes ideas like girls can excel at science and math, and boy athletes can enjoy being in drama club. As the characters sing, "We're all in this together."

It's nice to have the whole family sit together and watch a movie that can maintain the parents' interest while not embarrassing them. Sometimes it's relaxing to just say "pass the popcorn" without needing to mention contraception or drug abuse prevention.

Still, it's important to keep the lines of communication open. That's why I don't mind discussing the concept of romance with my child. The more I teach her, the wiser she'll be when she gets my permission to start dating, at age 30. And since her dad will be tagging along on those dates, he'll be able to answer any questions I didn't cover.

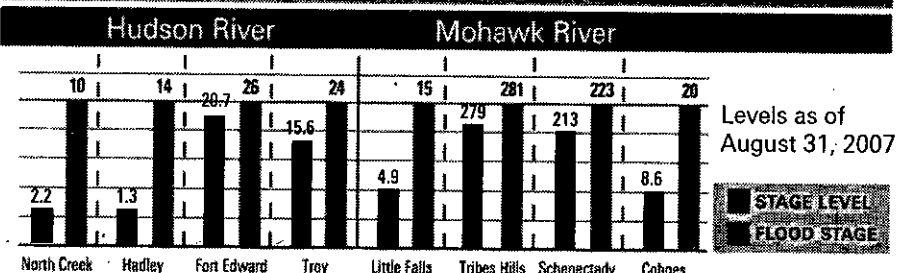

Many of the festival's most

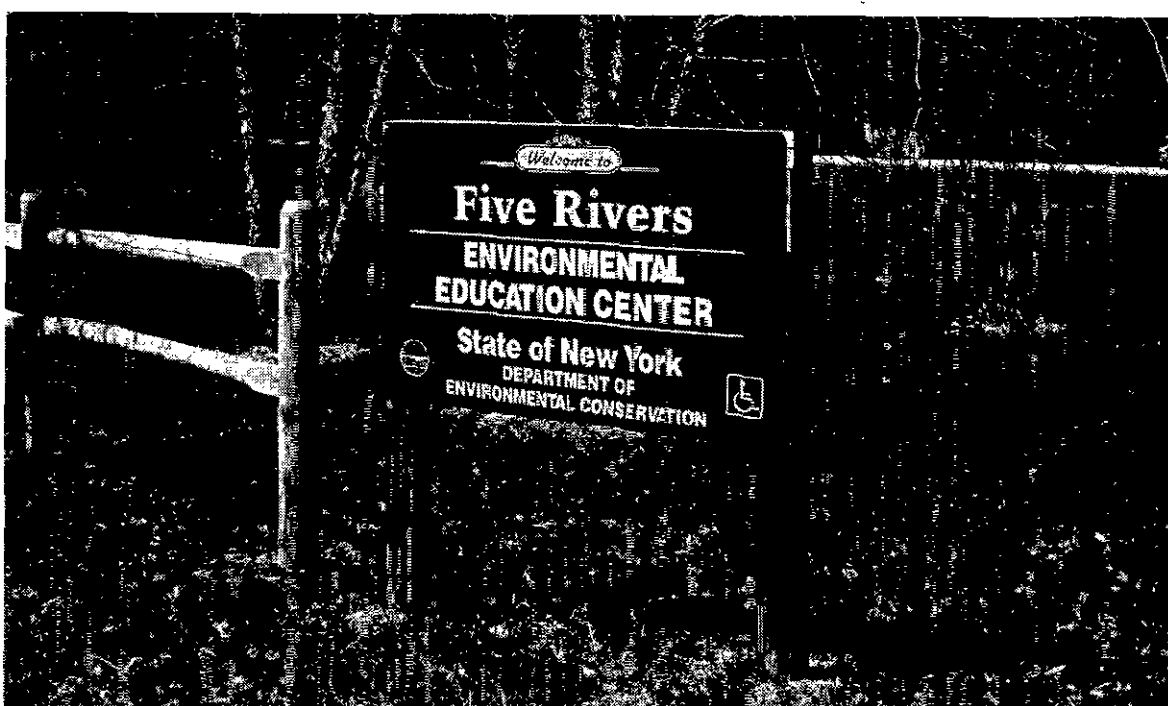

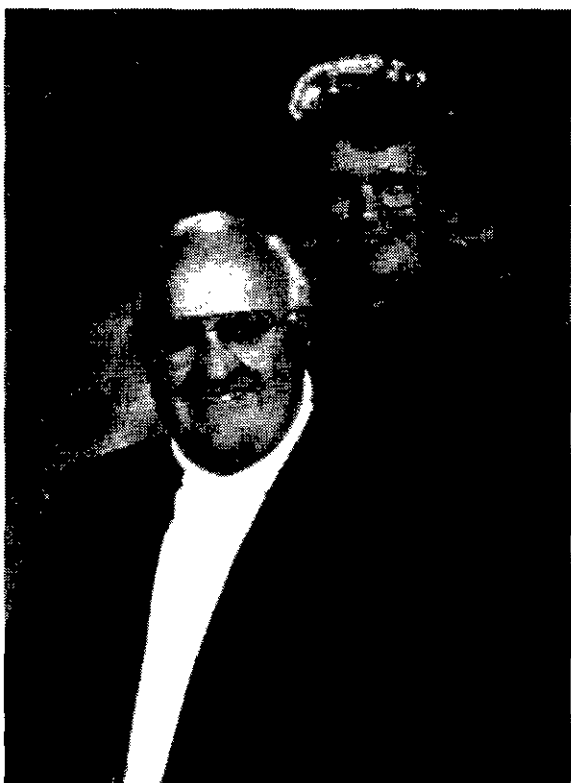

Month marks summer's end

There's a Green Day song with the melancholy refrain, "Wake me up when September ends." I really hate this song, probably because it rings so true.

When I was a child, as soon as the Montgomery Ward and Sears catalogs arrived with back-to-school sales on Levis and corduroy shirts, I started the theatrical process of crying over another summer's end. My sisters and I spent our summers swimming until we were pickled, popping tar on the streets and sneaking out our bedroom windows to play Kick the Can with our gang of equally insubordinate neighborhood friends. We sat on our back step and peeled white grapes with our teeth. We sharpened Popsicle sticks by scratching them on the cement to give each other fake injections. We inked tattoos on our Barbie Dolls. We practiced our gymnastics routines on monkey bars and scored one another (I remember making my younger sister cry when I gave her a 4.5 out of 9).

My mother always took us to the Altamont Fair, a bittersweet event where we rode the Ferris Wheel and then drank our first plastic cup of tart cider, officially signaling the onset of autumn.

As a kid, come mid-August, when the sun slanted differently in the trees, and a few stray orange leaves drifted into the grass beneath our tire swing, I would climb the willow tree in our backyard far above our rooftop and wish to have September banished from its relentless march into our lives. Ironically, we lived close enough to our elementary school, and later,

Shaker High School, that I could squint and see the squat brick buildings that would soon swallow me up.

It's been a few decades since then, and although it's now my three kids that are heading back to school this month, I still can't give up the notion that September is the cruelest month of all. I start having nightmares about not being able to find my school locker, dropping my tray of spaghetti in the cafeteria, losing my way in the hallways, losing my homework, losing my mind. Even as a working adult, part of me believes my editors might start grading my newspaper stories; will I ever earn the coveted A+? I like flip-flops more than loafers, veggie burgers on the grill more than hot winter soup, pony tails that don't require a drop of hair gel, and are soggy with chlorine water half the time anyway.

But when it gets right down to it, the reason September really bums me out is that my three kids will board the school bus and life will feel serious once again. As a writer with a non-traditional work schedule, I was home for all of my kids' early days. I wrote while they napped, then as they played beneath my computer desk, then as they ran outside with their friends and only came home for Band-Aids or lunch. Those three kids, my constant companions, are now going into 4th, 7th and 12th grade, and if anything, our summers have become more precious.

My sweet husband put up a pool for us last year, warmed to a balmy 80-degrees with a solar cover. We went to every single movie at the Malta Drive In, even the dumb ones that involved mostly car chases or jokes about bodily functions. We stayed up all night in our backyard, keeping mosquitoes at bay with tiki torches, candles, and strings of palm tree lights reflecting pink and green in the pool water. I can't count the number of bags of marshmallows we toasted, or, as my sons prefer to do, set on fire and tried to use as weapons. We spent six days and nights at the Saratoga County Fair, rode the Comet a dozen times at the Great Escape, went to the libraries, went to the parks, went to the races. We walked the beach in Maine and ate enough salt water taffy to stuff a moose. My mom and stepdad celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary, and I saw friends I hadn't seen since my own wedding 20 years ago (yes, they still looked great; only the children have changed). We got a new puppy named

Miloh, and walked her at the Woods Hollow Nature Preserve, where we fished off a pier, swiped at tadpoles with a net, and got so lost we considered marking a trail with our shoelaces, and talked about which of us we'd eat if a search party never found us.

Best of all, we lost track of the days, and every day felt like the first Friday of summer. We never had to use the dreaded sentences, "is your homework done?" "did you pack your lunch?" or my personal favorite, "don't you know it's a school night? Get in bed before I count to five."

Still, as soon as the crayons and notebook paper began showing up on store shelves that once held sunscreen and snorkels, my kids began to bicker incessantly. Like the drone of crickets that becomes a roar once you tune in, the volume of arguing, name-calling and tattle-tailing rose like the heat off a cracked sidewalk. I faced the timeworn question of how to punish kids: separate them, or force them to sit in the same room? Either way, there were three kids telling me I was doing it all wrong.

Also, if we had the whole summer to do over again, we'd have to repeat the low points, and this summer held a few. My husband had an unexpected job change, and although he's now happily a financial advisor for Wachovia Securities, switching jobs is right up there on the list of top stressors in life. My daughter Sasha also left her first job, also for the best, since she now works at the Coffee Planet, the hippest spot in Ballston Spa to get chai tea and chocolate lava cakes. Still, being between jobs is tough, and finding one is a solitary pursuit in a family that likes to face everything together.

And once we successfully navigate the choppy waters of September, we plunge into October, one of our favorite months of the year. We set up a graveyard on our front lawn, complete with tombstones, dead roses, bones and rats. We'll spend a weekend in Salem, Mass., taking midnight tours of haunted piers and hotels, shooting lots of pictures and looking for lurking orbs. We'll suck down a whole lot of homemade applesauce. Sasha will turn 17. There will be other reasons to celebrate, because good things don't only happen in summer weather.

Even though there's no school bus rolling in with an open seat waiting for me, I still feel like the tomboy who tried to hold on to the fading sun of August. If you're looking for me, check the high branches of the nearest willow tree. Or better yet, just wake me up when September ends.

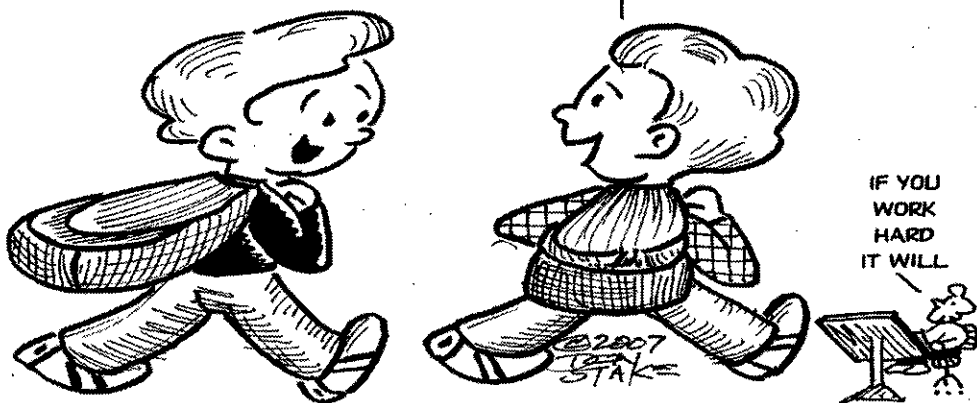

Understand your options when voting Sept. 18

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

I want to thank all of the voters who signed my Republican, Conservative and Independence

party petitions. The Web site I told many of you about, www.jaredking.org, is up. Please review it to find out more about

me and the way I think, which you'll find is about 90 percent consistent with the Independence Party platform set forth at www.ipny.org, and my work for previous Independence Party candidates.

On Tuesday, Sept. 18, we in Bethlehem have four primaries created by candidates filing opportunity-to-ballot petitions:

the Conservative nomination for town justice and county legislator for the 36th District and the Independence Party nomination for county legislator for the 34th and 36th districts. It might be helpful to review what opportunity-to-ballot petitions are and the procedure used to vote for a write-in candidate.

Either members of a party (e.g. Jim Grady, Dan Persing and Rich Mendick) or nonmembers who have received the party's endorsement (e.g. Jack Cunningham, Tom Cotrofeld and Pat Dorsey) circulate designating petitions. Nonparty members who wish to contest a party's nomination who have not received the party executive committee's permission to circulate designating petitions may only circulate opportunity-to-ballot petitions.

Those who have filed a designating petition will have their name appear on the primary ballot; an opportunity-to-ballot petition merely provides a blank space in which to write in the name of any resident of the election district. A voter who wishes to write in a name on the ballot looks for the column on the ballot that represents the office for which he or she is voting.

On the ballot itself will be the name of the designated candidate; above the ballot, however, there is a sliding door that corresponds to that column. Open the sliding door and there will be slot with a large roll of paper behind it. Use the pencil that should be hanging inside the election booth to write in the name of the candidate of your choice. If there is no writing instrument in the booth itself, ask a poll inspector to provide one for you.

Polls are open from noon to 9 p.m. on Primary Day.

Family dinner at the track

Potluck picnic given in honor of backstretch workers

"How do you say 'ice cream' in Spanish?" Mary Beth Delarm yells as she scurries back and forth behind a horseshoe of folding tables.

She tries a quasi-pidgin-Spanish that sounds like a joke Italian accent "Ice-ah cream-ah," she says. "I need to work on rolling my R's."

A family of 1,000 comes to Saratoga Springs every August. Mary Beth Delarm decided to throw them a picnic. Those thousand are the backstretch workers that come to Saratoga Springs every summer for the meet at the Saratoga Race Course.

One of the workers walks up to the tables and says one word to Delarm: "helado."

Delarm recognizes it as the word for ice cream that she was looking for.

"I just love these people," she says.

Delarm, a Saratoga Springs resident who works as a freelance photographer, disaster relief assistant and substitute

teacher, is at the track every morning at 5 a.m. to take pictures. "I know what it's like to be on the other side of the race course. I don't work with these people, but I see them every day. I see the hard work and the long hours that they put in."

So Delarm decided to give them a potluck dinner on Tuesday, Aug. 28, at the recreation center at the Omaha track. Workers were treated to salads, fresh fruit, bean dishes and Ben & Jerry's *helado*. About 100 workers came for dinner, said Delarm. The evening was capped by the backstretch workers annual "championship" soccer game.

Saratoga Springs County Su-

pervisor Cheryl Keyrouze donated goods to the event.

"As everyone is very much aware of all the successes we enjoy from the Saratoga Race Track, it's important to take a step back and see who is on the frontline and working incredibly hard at all hours for our community. The backstretch workers are the behind-the-scenes people that help in making the racing season what it is and this is a chance for us to applaud them," she said.

Backstretch workers put in long hours, sometimes in a number of jobs during the six-week meet.

Juan Angel, 35, has been a backstretch worker at New

York's racecourses since he was 18. He is a groomer from 5 a.m. to noon, and then washes linens from 5 to 11 p.m.

"I sleep during the day," he says. "Or whenever I can." Angel sends the lion's share of his \$1,200 a month salary back to his large family in Oaxaca, Mexico.

"My mother is old and sick. My family has 10 people in it. I help out with what I can," he says.

And Nick Caras helps the workers. Caras, the activities coordinator for backstretch recreation at the New York Racing Association Saratoga Race Course, ensures the backstretch workers are taken care of to the best of his ability. This includes recreational activities like foosball, ping-pong and pool, dinners like the one Delarm coordinated, or gathering school supplies for backstretch workers' children.

He walks to a room adjacent to the recreation facility off of

Union Avenue and points out boxes of fruit and vegetables stacked chest-high. The produce was donated by Saratoga Springs Pastor John Rice.

"Tomorrow we'll box these up and bring them out to the workers at the barns," he says. He notes that the facility does not receive many monetary contributions, but points to a stack of apples and says, "This is money. Because now we don't have to go out and buy it. We can use the money for other things they need."

Delarm is thinking of holding another potluck dinner in October, when about 200 backstretch workers will still be in Saratoga Springs. She said she hopes to have better involvement from the community that enjoys the track every summer — out of 100 requests for donations, Delarm said only 10 came through.

2009.

"There is no job more difficult or important in a school district than the superintendent's job," board of education president James Lytle said. "We have been very fortunate to have two decades of Dr. Loomis' dedicated service. The school district he will leave is even better than the

beauty of the course is for his daughter Samantha.

"It's her future," said Bloom pointing to his daughter. "The song garden I built for my daughter."

Open Space Conservancy has preserved thousands of acres of land across the state, including 10,000 acres in the Adirondacks and 3,000 acres in Moreau State Park.

"The open space here is every bit as improved as those open spaces in the Adirondacks," said Joe Martens of the Open Space Conservancy.

Martens and everyone involved in the project agreed the golf course would most likely have become the newest town housing development if the residents of the town had not stepped forward to let govern-

ment know their feelings about preserving it.

"If we did not save this today, you would never be able to recreate it," said Albany County Executive Mike Breslin, who has played on the course several times with his son. "It's worth saving and will be a tremendous asset to the community."

A petition drive to save Colonial Acres began a few years ago, with more than 600 residents signing up to save the course.

"I believe this land adds enormously to the quality of life to this town," said former Colonial Acres neighbor Randy Fisher, who started the petition drive.

The partnership between the Conservancy and the town will allow 33 acres to be preserved for environmental protection.

"It's just great for the community," said town board member Dan Plummer, who is credited with keeping the project to save Colonial Acres in the forefront.

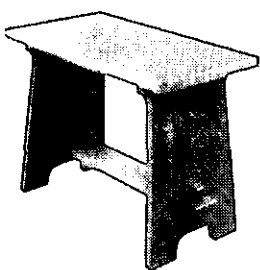

Switching to school mode

Districts provide lists of needed supplies, but back-to-school gear can go beyond the basics

Pens, binders, crayons, glue sticks, highlighters, composition notebooks, metric calculators and scissors – the ever-growing list of back-to-school supplies can get costly. And that doesn't even include backpacks, lunch boxes and other back-to-school clothes or outerwear kids "need" before the first day of school arrives.

"The first day of school is exciting, and the level of energy is just amazing," said Michael Johnson, assistant superintendent of the Mohonasen School system in Rotterdam, a district of more than 3,000 students. "We try and make sure the kids are comfortable and want to come back to school the second day."

Most educators believe communication between the district and parents and students is essential to make sure a child begins school with the proper supplies.

"Many of the students get a list sent home prior to them leaving school in June," said Dave Ksanznak, Hamagrael Elementary School principal, in the town of Bethlehem.

Many districts also post the supply list in early summer on their Web sites.

"We do that so there is not a mad rush at the end of August," Ksanznak said.

The average cost to purchase the items on Hamagrael's supply list is \$50 for the basics.

"If families need help, we offer assistance at the school," Ksanznak said.

Bethlehem Senior Services offers a back-to-school supply drive, where members of the community can donate school supply items for families in need.

The South Colonie School

District, like Hamagrael and Mohonasen, prepares parents and children early in the process by informing them what supplies are required for the first day.

"Very early on, prior to the end of the last school year, some teachers are already making arrangements to send supply list homes before kids leave school," said John Noetzel, district spokesman.

He said if there are students in need of financial assistance, help is available.

"Supplies become more expensive at the high school level when having to purchase special calculators for specific courses," said Noetzel. "There are a few students in need that

are concerned about the environment, National Geographic offers an Eco Checklist Green Guide back-to-school newsletter and Web site with information on eco-friendly school supplies.

"Our recommendation is a hemp bag that is fiber-grown with no pesticides," said Paul McRandle, deputy editor for National Geographic's Green Guide. Its e-mail newsletter reaches 370,000 people and its Web site, www.thegreenguide.com, has 300,000 hits a month.

McRandle recommends the Eco Body Wear backpack made with hemp for \$34.99 or the Sierra Club's organic cotton Cinch Sak for \$34.

There are plenty of other green friendly school supplies, including recycled plastic medium point pens, recycled notebook binders, recycled cotton canvas lunch sacks and much more.

"People should stay away from vinyl lunch pails since they have been known to release lead onto their surface," said McRandle.

He said more major back-to-school manufacturers are beginning to offer environmentally friendly products as the public becomes more "green" aware.

"Kids in particular can get tuned into these issues and get very involved," McRandle said. "It's one group we feel will speak to their parents."

In the end, however, it's about learning and creating the most positive learning environment for students on their first day of school.

"Making sure they are ready to learn is important," said Ksanznak, who recommends a good night's sleep, along with helping a child switch from summer mode to school mode.

"Parents need to talk with their child and ask them, 'What happened today?'" Ksanznak said. "It's about keeping the line of communication open from the home to the school."

borrow calculators at the beginning of the school year that the district purchases and return them when the course is over."

The core list of supplies for a third grader at Pinewood Intermediate School in the Mohonasen School District includes a box of No. 2 pencils, two blue pens, a box of 24-count crayons, a highlighter, one zipper pencil pouch, a dry erase marker, two glue sticks, a marble composition notebook, scissors, a smock (labeled with child's name), \$2.25 for a National Geographic Children's Magazine, \$5 for an assignment notebook, \$2 for a Mohonasen folder and \$5 for a recorder for music class.

"Parents love the school calendar and assignment notebook because it's a very effective communication piece," said Johnson.

Backpacks also figure in to the financial equation when purchasing school supplies, and prices can range anywhere from \$15 to as high as \$50 or more.

For children and parents who

them," she said.

Although their shopping cart was filled with brightly colored binders, pens, pencils and folders, both Emily and Alyssa Galea were less than enthusiastic about supply shopping and going back to school.

"It's wonderful," Alyssa said sarcastically.

"It's OK, I guess," Emily said.

These days, school supplies come in many different colors, usually bright ones. Many teachers believe a good way to teach organization is to require each subject be given a designated color. The same is true for Shane Horan, 13, an eighth grader at Farnsworth Middle School in Guilderland.

Horan has a large list of school supplies to buy for this year, including binders, folders, index cards, a compass and a protractor. Everything is color-coded depending on the subject. Social studies gets a green binder; English a blue one.

"It makes it so much easier

because you reach into your locker and know exactly what you need," Horan said.

Horan's sister Sierra Horan, 15, is going to be a sophomore at Guilderland High School. She doesn't get any school supply lists from her teachers and is forced to be organized on her own. Sierra Horan said she doesn't like school supply shopping, but the brightly colored binders and pens makes it somewhat interesting.

For younger children, school supply shopping can feel like toy shopping.

Arianna Rivera, 9, and her brother Nicholas Rivera, 7, go to school in the Mohonasen School District.

The Riveras both got school supplies that either had superheroes on them or pretty designs. For them the act of school supply shopping makes them feel as if they are getting new toys, but both said they really liked school supply shopping because it means they get to go back to school.

"I love school," Nicholas said.

Program aims to alleviate fear of eastern hognose snake

Naturalist discusses slithery Pine Bush native

It's fair to say that most of us would be pretty frightened at the sight of a hissing, flat-necked snake with an upturned nose that likes to fake strike, roll over and play dead.

If you are in the Albany Pine Bush and you come across one of these rare snakes, known as the eastern hognose, don't be afraid, area naturalist Kenneth E. Barnett said.

"They don't bite or possess any danger. Some people think they are venomous and mistake them for puffers, but they only have very mild venom for the toads they eat," he said.

Barnett, who works under a permit with the state Department of Environmental Conservation, has been studying the eastern hognose snake, which makes its habitat in the Albany Pine Bush, a globally rare ecosystem outside Albany in Guilderland and surrounding areas, using radio telemetry and DNA sampling.

On Saturday, Sept. 1, he introduced a 2-foot male eastern hognose snake at the Albany Pine Bush Discovery Center. Barnett's goal is to educate people about the snake, which is frequently killed on roadways by cars and scared residents, and is listed as a species of special concern.

He said the best way to identify an eastern hognose is by its upturned nose, since it is the only snake that has this characteristic.

The eastern hognose coloring can be in varying shades of brown and grey with black spotting, or completely black, and the snake can reach a maximum size of about 40 inches.

MaryAnn Perry, an education program assistant at the Pine Bush Discovery Center, said, "They

have very particular responses when they are disturbed: They spread out their head and neck and look very fierce."

Although the eastern hognose are of no danger to humans, Barnett said they are bad candidates for pets and are extremely hard to keep since their diet relies primarily on toads and frogs.

"The best thing to do is not harass the animal," he said. "Get your camera out and take photos of one of the most unusual and infrequently seen vertebras."

The Pine Bush Discovery Center, where the hognose

will make his home, opened in Guilderland in June. It features outdoor and indoor interactive exhibits, native plant and butterfly gardens, a universally accessible "Discovery Trail," participatory greenhouse, classrooms, and gathering space for Pine Bush Preserve programs. The goal is to teach the story of the Pine Bush through first-hand experience and discovery-based learning.

Perry, who helps to run the children's education programs at the Discovery Center, said programs like that about the eastern hognose are especially

directed toward children, who she believes do not receive enough education about local environmental issues.

"It's funny to work with kids and realize they know more about the Amazon Rainforest than they do about a globally rare ecosystem that is literally down the road from their house," she said.

The Albany Pine Bush represents one of the best remaining examples of an inland pine barrens ecosystem in the world, a gently rolling sand plain that is home to a unique diversity of species including more than 20 rare species of animals and plants and two rare natural communities.

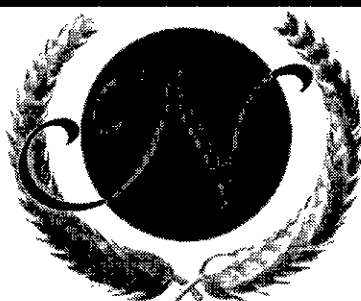

Delmar studio inspires song in students

Magic of Music has offered lessons for more than two decades

Not everyone possesses a musical gift, but for 30 years,

Margarita Khaitov has been sharing her love of music with the local community by teaching people the skills they need to make music an enriching part of their lives.

A piano teacher who received a bachelor's degree in music education and a master's in piano

education in her native Ukraine, Khaitov is the now the owner and manager of The Magic of Music Creative Arts Studio in Delmar, celebrating more than 25 years in business.

"We're very proud to be in business for this long. We have the best teachers from Europe and Russia, and we're happy that we can give the best music education," she said.

Khaitov, 52, who started as piano teacher at the Magic of Music, is the third owner of the studio. Once a small studio with only a few teachers who taught basic piano, it has since grown to employ 15 teachers who have master's degrees from top music schools.

Khaitov's instructors teach only private lessons in piano, voice, violin, and guitar to the more than 100 students the studio at 318 Delaware Ave. serves, and they specialize in a variety of styles, from classical to contemporary.

The lessons are open to people of all ages and experience levels,

including the disabled. As a rule of thumb, the lessons are always one on one, so that the students can receive individualized attention.

Khaitov said the key to a successful lesson lies in the teacher's ability to stay focused and keep the lessons relaxing and enjoyable, especially with children.

"You have to be very patient and creative, and we use instruments, toys and puppets to keep their attention and interest," she said.

Veronica Roddy of Delmar, whose children Connor, 7, and Taylor, 5, are piano students at the Magic of Music, said her children look forward to their lessons.

"I couldn't teach my children how to play music, but I've always wanted them to enjoy it," she said. "Sometimes at home they put on a little concert, and everyone has a blast."

Along with the private lessons, the Magic of Music students also perform in various recitals throughout the year, sometimes accompanied by their teachers.

In June, four different recitals are held at the Academy of Holy Names that all the students participate in, and the

best students are chosen to perform at a big holiday concert. Advanced level Magic of Music students also have opportunities to participate in high-level music competitions, such as the Chopin Competition and those put on by the New York State School Music Association.

Roddy said her children's participation in the Magic of Music recitals has boosted their confidence and public speaking abilities, especially since they never feel pressured. "They're playing and performing; it's relaxed and natural," she said.

With such easy-going lessons, one would think it might be hard for a student to practice the discipline needed to learn music.

Julia Martens, a Bethlehem High School student who has been one of Khaitov's students for 12 years, doesn't think so.

She said because the lessons are fun and relaxed, "It makes you want to push yourself harder; you want to practice more and keep going with it."

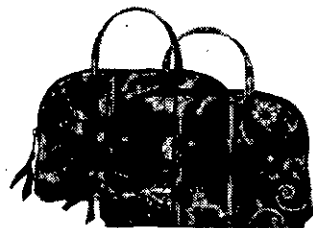

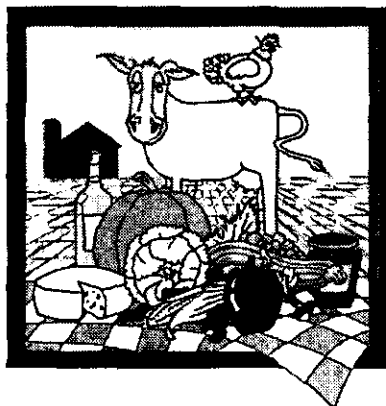

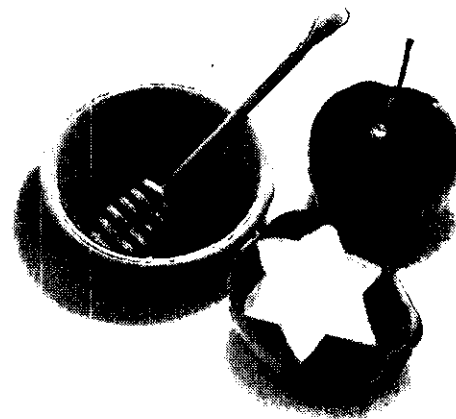

Going into its fifth season, CR Productions is scheduled to perform "Chicago" at the Cohoes Music Hall during the month of September.

CR Productions was founded by Cohoes native Jim Charles and Tony Rivera in 2002. The pair have been producing four shows a year for the past four years. This season (with the installation of air conditioning) the company plans to put on six shows.

"Going into our fifth season is huge. I feel like we can relax now," Rivera said.

With a cast of 16 actors and actresses, the producers say the show is sure to please any crowd.

The consensus among the cast and crew is the dancing will rock anyone's boat.

Jessica Costa, 27, who plays Roxie Hart, said the dancing in the show is what people will remember.

"The opening scene alone is worth the price of admission," she said.

Charles and Rivera hired a veteran of theater productions, Trelan Doler, 29, as the show's director and choreographer. This is Doler's seventh show at Cohoes Music Hall.

"I've been coming to Cohoes so much I almost feel like a citizen," he said.

Doler said "Chicago" is an interesting production because its themes will never get old.

"Criminals as celebrities and crime as entertainment – no one ever gets sick of that," he said.

Doler agrees that the dancers cast for "Chicago" are top notch.

"It pushes me as a choreographer to work with these folks," he said.

The hardest part about directing and choreographing this production is doing it justice, Doler said. The show's original directors had such an influence on him that he wants to put on a good show, while still keeping it his own.

"This is a classic piece of theater that somehow has hooked in with audiences. It's interesting, it's sexy – it's all things that we love," he said.

The actors and actresses in "Chicago" are professionals, most of whom have come to Cohoes by way of New York City.

"This is real small town fun," Jennifer Davis, who is playing Velma, said. "But this is a good group of people and a great place to work."

Paul Kelly, who is originally from Florida but now lives in New York City, said he likes coming to Cohoes to perform because it is so close to his home.

"I like the fact that Cohoes is close to New York. I've known Jim and Tony since before they formed the entertainment company. Getting a theater off the ground is hard, and this theater has grown enormously," Kelly, who plays Amos Hart, said.

The Cohoes Music Hall in the heart of historic Cohoes was built in 1874 as a vaudeville theater, so it is the perfect setting for a performance of "Chicago."

When Charles and Rivera set their sights on the theater in 2000, the stage hadn't been used for musicals in years.

"Having this gorgeous

theater go unused, it just wasn't right," Rivera said.

The active theater has enhanced the community, and the community has helped to enhance CR Productions.

"Our motto is: Revitalizing Cohoes one show at a time," Charles said.

CR Productions is involved with the theater program at Cohoes High School and works with local children and in the community whenever possible. The company also has a close relationship with the local dance school Spendwood Dance and Gymnastics.

"I know what the arts can do for an economy and this has been a great fit," Rivera said.

Doler said he was apprehensive to be in Cohoes

during CR Production's first season, but now he has seen the difference within the city.

"The arts definitely contribute to the community. All great societies have thriving arts," he said.

The community has also been supportive of the theater. In its first year there were 250 sponsors, Rivera said. For the fifth season, there are more than 1,000 sponsors.

"Chicago" premieres Friday, Sept. 7, at 8 p.m. Performances will run through Sunday, Sept. 30, every Thursday through Saturday at 8 p.m. and Sunday at 3 p.m. There will be one Saturday matinee on Sept. 29 at 3 p.m. For tickets, call the box office at 237-5858 or visit www.cohoesmusichall.com.

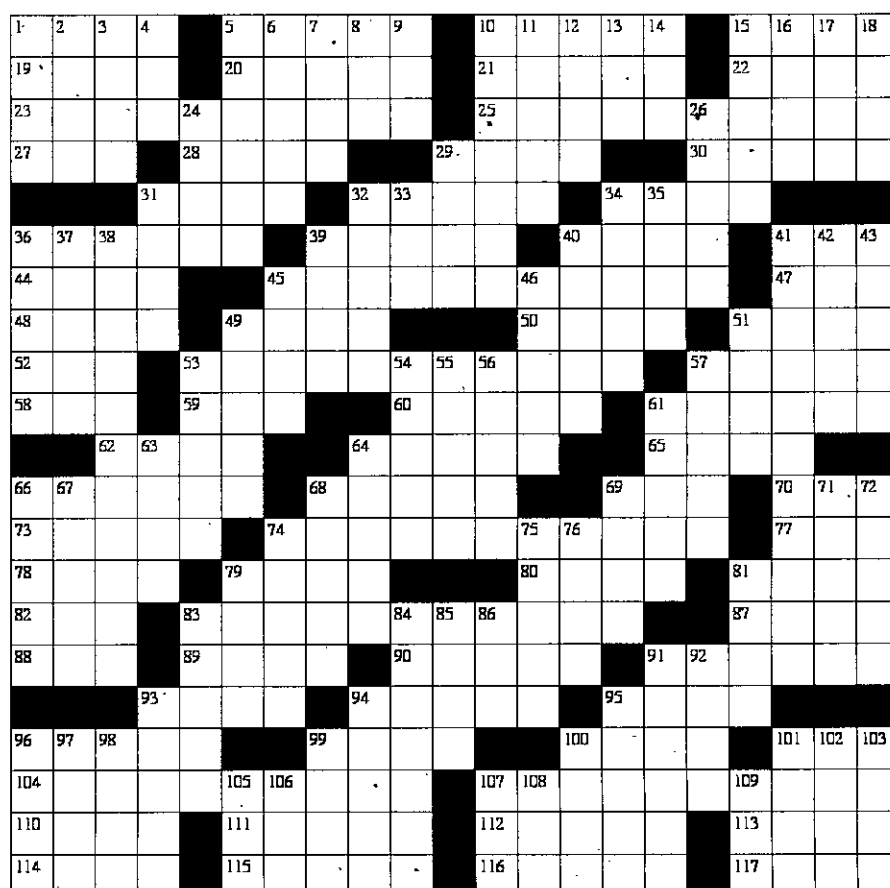

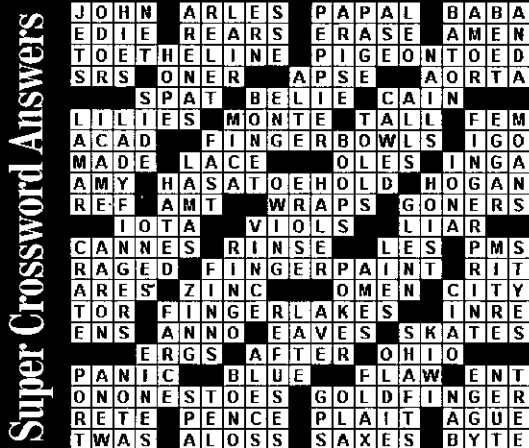

for a 79-yard touchdown run that put Queensbury ahead 20-6.

Berquist got Bethlehem back in the game again — this time on offense. The senior tailback found a big hole in Queensbury's defense and ran for a 41-yard touchdown. Sam Smith added the extra point to pull the Eagles within seven points with 8:53 left in the third quarter.

Just as it did when Bethlehem scored in the second quarter, Queensbury's offense responded with a long drive. This time, Myhrberg capped the series with an eight-yard scoring run, and

Todd Clear added the extra point to put the Spartans ahead 27-13.

The Eagles had several opportunities to cut into Queensbury's lead in the fourth quarter. Junior quarterback Randy Bowers saw a wide-open Mike Agneta in the end zone one minute into the period, but his pass sailed past Agneta. Bethlehem's drive stalled on the next play, giving the ball back to Queensbury.

Spartans run past Eagles

Dropped passes foil Bethlehem's comeback bid

The Bethlehem football team couldn't stop Queensbury's punishing ground game.

Ryan Woodard rushed for 200 yards and two touchdowns, and Dominic Marino and Jared Myhrberg added scoring runs to lead the Spartans past the Eagles 27-13 in Saturday's season opener in Queensbury.

"We knew it was going to be tough coming in here," said Bethlehem coach Ron Smith. "They're a team that if you can't

physically match up with them, then you're in trouble."

The Eagles (0-1) knew they were in for a long day against Queensbury before the opening snap. Senior offensive/defensive lineman Cameron Felitte was sidelined with a partially torn Achilles tendon in his right foot he suffered in a preseason scrimmage, leaving Bethlehem without its biggest front line player.

Not that the 6-foot, 2-inch, 245-pound Felitte could have completely countered Queensbury's line by himself. With five linemen weighing 260 or more pounds and a 6-2, 230-pound fullback in Marino, the Spartans were a handful for Bethlehem to deal with.

"You have to be sound, and you have to be physical to play a team like Queensbury, and that's not our style," said Smith. "We can't counterpunch. We have to use our speed and our finesse."

Bethlehem's offense didn't do any favors for its defense. The Eagles fumbled on their first series, which allowed Queensbury to turn around and march more than 60 yards for its first touchdown — a 20-yard run by Woodard. Andy Kaier added a two-point conversion pass to Zach St. Andrews to give the Spartans an 8-0 lead.

Bethlehem's defense did a favor for the offense in the second quarter, though. The Eagles forced Kaier to fumble the ball at his own 32-yard line. Peter

Berquist scooped up the loose ball and scampered the rest of the way for a touchdown to pull Bethlehem within two points.

Queensbury's offense recovered from its mistake, though. The Spartans went on another long drive, and Marino capped it with a seven-yard touchdown run through the heart of Bethlehem's defense. The two-point conversion failed, but Queensbury still had a 14-6 lead heading into halftime.

Things went from bad to worse for Bethlehem in the third quarter. On its third play from scrimmage, Woodard took the handoff from Kaier, found a seam in the Eagles' defense and took off
