January

• A Krumkill Road man wanted for crimes in Florida held police at bay outside his home for nine hours on Thursday, Jan. 4, before several rounds of tear gas forced him to give up.

Paul Harris, 44, was charged with resisting arrest, criminal possession of a weapon and being a fugitive from justice. Harris was wanted on several outstanding warrants from the state of Florida, including resisting arrest, escape, and assault and battery. He pleaded not guilty to the charges.

• Joann Dawson replaced Tim Gordon on Jan. 10 as a member of the Bethlehem Town Board. Dawson, an Independence Party member, was unanimously selected by the board to fill the seat left vacant by Gordon who won the 108th District state Assembly seat.

"People are looking for leadership, and I'm here to provide that," said Dawson following her appointment.

Ten candidates had applied for the post.

• Several new businesses along Route 9W in Glenmont held grand openings in January and early February, including Panera Bread, Staples and Cingular Wireless. PetSmart and Marshall's clothing store planned to open by the spring.

"The new retail development along 9W is exciting," said then-Bethlehem Town Supervisor Theresa Egan.

Town officials continue to work toward ways to create hamlet-type, pedestrian friendly development in many areas of the town.

• Continued community planning initiatives highlighted Bethlehem Supervisor's Theresa Egan's 2007 State of the Town address delivered Jan. 18, at the Bethlehem Historical Association's Little Red Schoolhouse.

"I am proud of the public involvement," Egan told a group of civic and business leaders. "We have more volunteers involved in our advisory committees than the town ever has."

Egan said marketing Delmar and the Bethlehem to outside parties is another one of her goals.

• Delmar native and convicted murderer Christopher Porco was transferred from Fishkill prison to the Clinton Correctional Facility in Dannemora on Jan. 22.

Porco was convicted in August 2006 of murdering his father Peter Porco and attempting to murder his mother Joan, during an ax attack inside the family's 36 Brockley Drive home in November 2004. Porco was sentenced in Albany County Court to two consecutive 25-years-to-life prison terms. Porco's case is under appeal by his lawyer Terence Kindlon.

School board draws the line

Officials approve redistricting scenario following months of discussion

A five-month redistricting discussion in the Bethlehem Central School District ended with a whimper instead of a bang with the unanimous approval of a final boundary scenario that will affect 399 elementary students in the 2008 school year.

The fifth scenario was the unanimous final choice of the school board, which approved the change with two slight alterations.

"I move that we adopt scenario five," said board member Warren Stoker in front of the remaining group of interested parents who have followed the redistricting

Two charged with DWI after driving car in snow banks

A Duaneburg man is charged with felony DWI by Bethlehem police after driving his car into a snow bank outside of PetSmart in Glenmont on Tuesday, Dec. 18.

John F. Durrant III is charged with operating a motor vehicle intoxicated, second degree, a felony along with several other traffic violations.

When authorities arrived at the scene, they observed an Oldsmobile deep in a snow bank and a man behind the wheel of the vehicle with a shovel next to him.

Durrant told authorities he was traveling from Slingerlands and heading to Troy, trying to avoid the Interstate. He then told authorities he pulled over to urinate toward the rear of the building when his car accelerator stuck, causing

him to run into the snow bank.

Durrant also reportedly told authorities he had not been drinking any alcohol since the prior evening. Officers reported a strong odor of alcohol with slurred speech.

After placing Durrant in custody, it was discovered the car Durrant was driving had license plates belonging to another vehicle owned by the defendant.

He was sent to Albany County jail in lieu of \$5,000 cash bail and will appear in Bethlehem Town Court Jan. 22.

• A Rensselaer woman is charged with DWI by Bethlehem police after driving her car into a snow bank.

Joelle Bishop, 21, of 129 Third Ave., Rensselaer, was charged with misdemeanor

DWI and driving with more than .08 percent blood alcohol content.

Police patrols noticed a vehicle off the road in a snow bank along Elsmere Avenue, Sunday, Dec. 16. Witnesses who tried to help get the vehicle out of the snow bank told police Bishop went to get a shovel.

When Bishop returned, she told authorities she drove from Delaware Avenue to Elsmere Avenue and failed to negotiate the turn. Police report Bishop had bloodshot eyes and alcohol on her breath.

She was placed in custody and her vehicle was towed from the scene.

Bishop will appear in Bethlehem Town Court for arraignment, Jan. 8.

Tech Valley High taking applications

Applications for the 2008-09 ninth grade class at Tech Valley High School are now available, and the deadline to apply is Friday, Feb. 1.

The school, which opened in September with a class of 40 freshmen, focuses on math, science and technology, and is a joint venture of Questar III BOCES and Capital Region BOCES. In cooperation with 48 school districts in seven counties, the BOCES have created this new school to expand the range of opportunities available to more than 124,000 students.

The school is being shaped and sustained by an unprecedented partnership of K-12 educators with leaders from business, higher education, organized labor and government. It is initially housed at Pitney Bowes MapInfo in Rensselaer Technology Park, Troy.

The incoming freshman class will have up to 40 students who will be selected from 48 school districts in seven counties.

Tech Valley High is seeking students who are: Ready for a challenge; open minded; curious and willing to explore their creativity; willing to work in collaboration with others; ready to pursue a new opportunity; likely to thrive in an environment that is diverse; ready to learn by doing and interested in real life learning experiences; curious about discovering what Tech Valley and the world have to offer; and open and motivated to share his/her learning experience with all those interested in the new school and ready to take responsibility for one's own learning and

the learning of others in a rigorous academic program.

The curriculum at Tech Valley High School is deeply enriched by the school's connection to area businesses and institutions of higher education working on the cutting edge of science, math and technology. Students should be open to a learning experience in which these subjects will play an integral role.

Applications are available in the offices of middle school counselors and online at www.techvalleyhigh.org. To apply, students must complete a simple one-page application form, discuss their interest in Tech Valley High with their school counselor and submit their completed form to the middle school counselor by Friday, Feb. 1.

Students must currently be enrolled in, and on track to meet all requirements for a successful completion of, the eighth grade; and both parents and students must attend a parent-student information session.

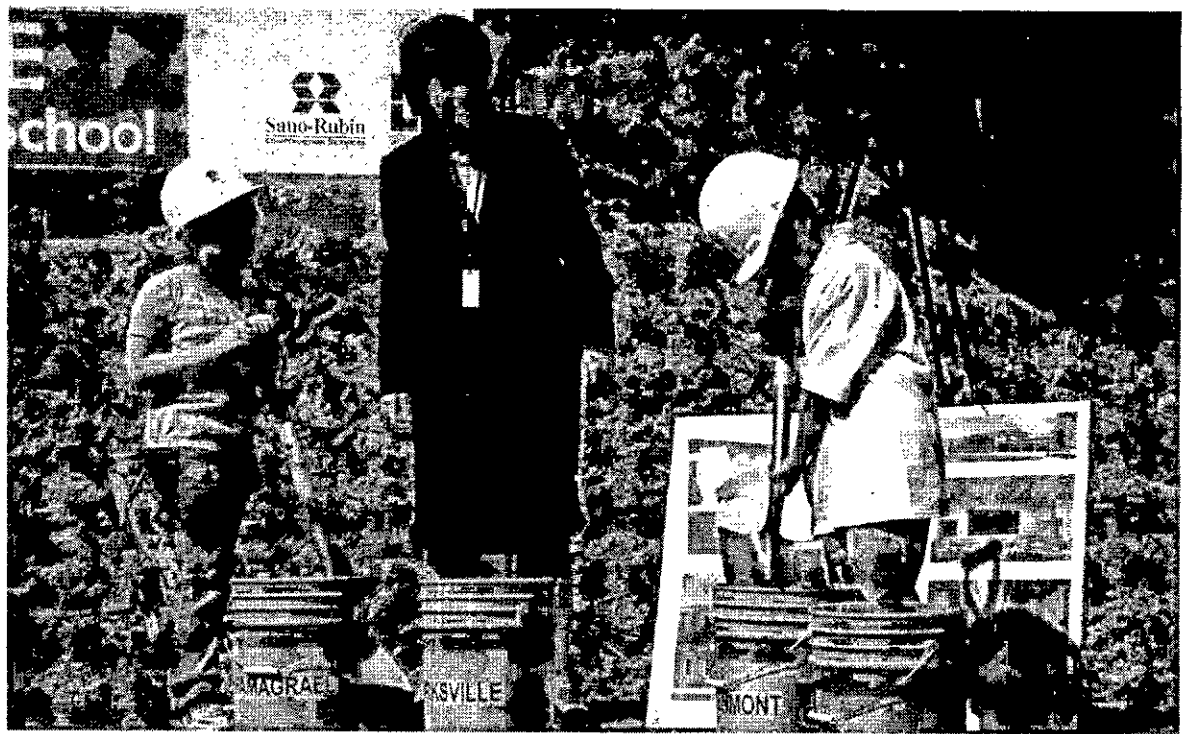

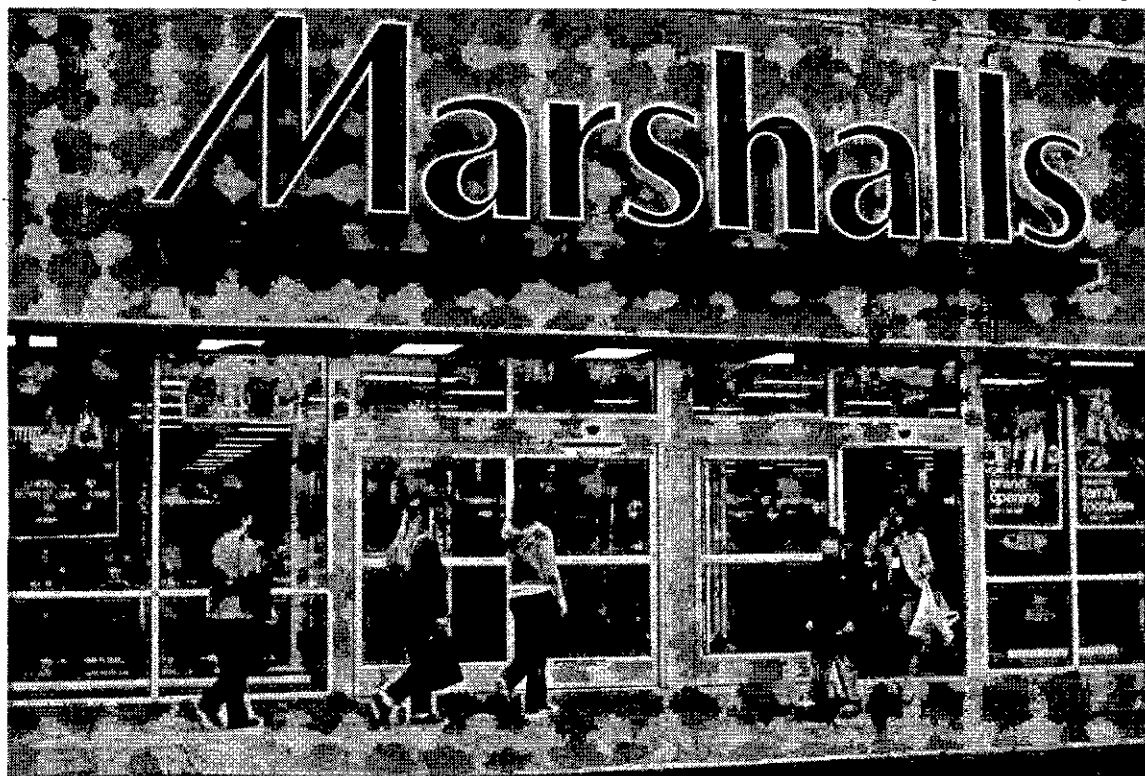

Where is the frankincense when you need it?

Editor's Note: There were no travel questions for The Travel Guy this week, so we asked Bill to reflect on the holiday season. This isn't your Norman Rockwell Christmas morning story, but one that may make each of us appreciate our families a little bit better.



Ask the Travel Guy

My Uncle Henry floated in and out of our lives when we were growing up. He was a contractor in New York City and was constantly making and losing windfalls of money. When he was rich, all was well with the world and his gifts were plentiful; he was a very generous man. When he was flush, he spent most of his dough on booze and beautiful women, and he liked the horses at Saratoga. The rest of his money he just plain blew. But he was our Uncle Henry and we loved him.

When he was broke, he called my dad. That's what he did one year about a week before Christmas. My dad hung up the phone and started singing: "Uncle Henry is Coming to Town" which wasn't the holiday song my mom wanted to hear. My brother and I, on the other hand, were happy to hear the news. We were 8 and 12 years old

and my dad acted like a kid when his brother was around.

My uncle was a guy's guy, who we thought was hilarious; my mom didn't. My father tried to placate her by mentioning my uncle was just getting over a divorce, had no other family and shouldn't be alone at Christmas. My mom sarcastically asked if this was the third or fourth divorce — she didn't like Uncle Henry the way we did.

So on Christmas Eve, Uncle Henry arrived in a long, fancy car, his back seat jammed full of big presents with even more in the trunk. He wrapped them himself so I just knew there were B-B guns, baseball bats and a lot of bottles that were labeled for my dad. The inside of the car smelled of pipe smoke and Henry smelled of whiskey when we hugged him.

As kids, Henry was a great guy to hug. He was huge like a giant Santa or a behemoth marshmallow: He almost suffocated you. My mom always tried to shake his hand, but Henry would just ignore her hand and engulf her with one of his hugs.

Christmas morning never came fast enough, and in our house it was worse. We had to have Christmas breakfast before we could open our presents. My mother tried to keep Christ in Christmas so we had to gather around the manger with the three wise men and place the baby Jesus in the hay. And that was the centerpiece for our Christmas breakfast table. It took forever, then my mother would read from the Bible's book of Luke, "presented unto Him gifts; gold, frankincense, and myrrh." There was more, but I could barely listen at the time.

At 8 years old it was torture to wait, but that was the price we had to pay for the Christmas presents that were in the next room ready to be torn apart.

After breakfast, my uncle said he had to go to the bathroom

upstairs. That meant we had to wait longer because we had to open our presents together, which I thought was some rule from the Bible. Five minutes, 10 minutes, I finally yelled up the stairs to remind Uncle Henry that it was Christmas and we were waiting. He yelled from behind the closed door that he wanted me to come up stairs ... Now.

Through the closed bathroom door I could tell that he had successfully completed his task, but he wanted me to come into the bathroom and I didn't want to get any closer than I had to.

Me: "Hurry up, we can't open the presents until you come downstairs. Everybody is waiting."

Him: "I can't stand up."

Me: "Why?"

Him: "I cracked the toilet seat."

Me: "That's OK, Mom won't be mad."

Him: "Just come in here, you have to help me."

Me: "I'm 8 years old. I can't help anybody."

Him: "Just come in here!!!"

So there I was, sitting on

the side of the tub, breathing through a towel talking to my Uncle Henry who is 6' 3" and weighs 270 lbs.

He explained to me he was not concerned about cracking the toilet seat but when he tried to stand up, the crack in the seat pinched him. He asked me to slip a piece of cardboard between him and the seat.

"I don't think I can do that," I said, trying desperately to hold my breath.

"I'll give you \$20 if you do it and don't tell anybody," he replied.

We sat there looking at each other in silence, staring into one each other's eyes as I considered his offer.

Finally he said: "Hey Kid, where is the frankincense when you need it?"

That did it. We joined our family, presents were opened, and it turned into a great Christmas.

Now when I hear "Silent Night," I still smile when I think of how my silence was bought. And never has there been a Christmas morning when I haven't thought warmly about my Uncle Henry.

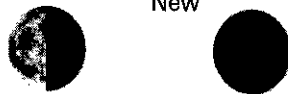

EMS costs on the rise

Town to pass much of the increase on to insurance companies

A \$500,000 increase in the cost of emergency services throughout the town of Bethlehem is forcing providers to look at alternative sources of revenue to fund the program.

Judy Kehoe, town comptroller, reported to the town board at the Wednesday, Dec. 12, meeting that 2008 costs for the Delmar, Elsmere, Slingerlands Ambulance, Bethlehem Volunteer Ambulance, and Western Turnpike Ambulance Company — the town's three main emergency service providers — would increase from \$1.27 million to \$1.76 million.

The volunteer ambulance providers offer basic life support while paid paramedics through Albany County Sheriff's Department account for the town's advanced life support service.

"The increase is from their need to supplement volunteer staff with paid EMTs (emergency medical technicians)," said Kehoe.

As a result of the cost increase, Kehoe said these same volunteer ambulance companies will begin billing insurance companies for the emergency services they provide. This new revenue recovery program, being endorsed by town Supervisor Jack Cunningham, is expected to result in even greater savings in 2009 to local EMS providers.

"There should be a savings, and it should be significant," said Kehoe.

In January of each new year, the emergency service tax is a separate item levied

on a homeowner's tax bill. Each homeowner is billed by one of the three town providers. Those bills should remain fairly consistent, with much of the additional costs being passed on to insurance companies.

Delmar, Elsmere, Slingerlands Volunteer Ambulance service accounts for 68 percent of the total service to town residents. Bethlehem Volunteer Ambulance makes up 26 percent and Western Turnpike Ambulance the remaining 6 percent. The idea of billing third-party insurance companies for emergency services to residents is something Western Turnpike Ambulance has been doing successfully for a few years.

"Western Turnpike funds 95 percent of their operating budget through insurance billing," said Kehoe.

Minimizing the tax impact to residents is the main reason why all three EMS providers are now making the switch.

"Revenue recovery is taking place all around us and we are very much in support of this," said Cunningham. "The long-term plan is to get revenue recovery to a point where we receive enhanced services at no cost to the taxpayer."

The town will also receive some indirect savings with the new billing procedure by rolling a portion of their 9-1-1-dispatch service cost over to the EMS providers. The move is expected to save the town \$240,000 next year.

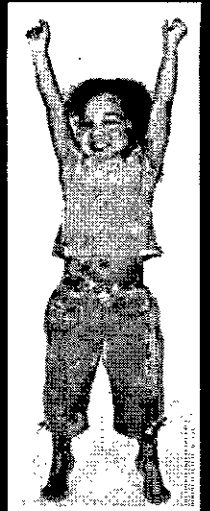

Stay sane and sober on roads

As we approach the end of another year, with the hustle and bustle of all the various holiday celebrations and the rituals surrounding them, I find myself focusing not on what needs to be done today. Rather, I begin thinking about my New Year's resolutions and the goals and objectives that I will strive to accomplish in the coming year. I ponder just how simplistic or elaborate they will be and if they will have any meaning and be understood and accepted or simply pooh-poohed and thrown out right away like the shiny wrapping paper from the holiday's gifts. What can I do in 2008 that will actually have an impact on people in a way that really makes a difference and, more importantly, saves lives?

Boy, is this too deep a thought when I haven't even started my shopping yet? In recent weeks there have been examinations of two of the major holidays of the season, Hanukkah and Christmas, in *Spotlight Newspapers'* point of view column, written by two well-respected clergy members of the Jewish and Christian faiths, Rabbi Dan Ornstein and the Rev. David Corlett. What do the writings of these two similar but separate stories have to do with me and my reflections for the coming year? Basically everything.

You see, no matter who you are or what you believe in, each and every one of us can make a difference in people's lives by simply slowing down and taking the time to reflect on what is truly important to us, knowing that with faith,

hope and perseverance, we can gain the strength to deal with anything that we might face in our daily lives. As the administrator of the Albany County Stop-DWI Program, my job is to analyze trends and statistics, review accident and crash data and look to implement new and innovative programs and initiatives that will help Albany County residents reduce accidents, crashes, injuries and deaths on our county roadways.

Basically, it comes down to empowering our neighbors to help save the lives of their fellow man. What better way to celebrate the holiday of one's culture or faith than for each of us to give the gift of life by not drinking and driving or promoting underage drinking and helping to prevent incidents of extreme/aggressive driving from occurring?

No matter what race, creed, color or age you may be, rich or poor, hawk or dove, we all face the grim reality of witnessing the loss of far too many lives on a weekly basis to drunk drivers, youths overdosed from alcohol or other substances and drivers who choose to make the roadways their personal playgrounds and insist that they at all times have "the right of way." When will we collectively say enough is enough, slow down and remember just what is important to each of us? The lives of our friends and families should certainly top that list. We must stop allowing our society as a whole to waste the precious gift of life that has been given to us all.

Maybe now you see why it is no easy task to come up with goals and objectives for our program for the coming year. How simplistic an idea — save lives — how elaborate a task, to get everyday people to change their behavior to not drink and drive, drive aggressively or to extremes. Just how can we get our young people to not start drinking at an early age, putting themselves at risk for much more tragedy than just

getting caught for DWI? Failed classes, lost friends, jobs, sexual assaults, injuries and yes, even death result from drunk driving.

On a day-to-day basis, you can find members of our program out in a variety of settings throughout the county trying to get the message out about the dangers of drinking and driving, underage drinking and about the need to follow and obey the vehicle and traffic laws. We host a Victim Impact Panel bi-monthly in Guelderland. We have roughly 200 to 250 offenders attend each panel without fail, even after we show these panels on public access television to thousands of people who say they've seen it but somehow didn't "get the message." We serve notice on our fellow citizens that we will be following DWI blanket patrols, seatbelt and cell phone enforcement activities during set periods of time, advertised in newspapers, via radio and television reports, and we still wind up with staggering numbers of people who just "don't get it."

Why is such a simple task turning out to be so difficult to understand and so hard to follow? I still haven't figured that out yet, and my time is running out. I need new ideas and new visions for 2008 so that I can find the answer, make a difference and save lives. Can you help me? This is way harder than I envisioned and way more difficult to solve, and it doesn't appear that it is going to be any easier in the future without your help.

Now, I know that there are those who will read this and say, "He's nuts," or "I don't have time to deal with this right now." But as a 28-year concerned member of the law enforcement community and a parent who lost a child just six short years ago in a one-car, alcohol- and speed-related crash, I know the value of life and the importance of trying to make a difference in people's lives, even if it is only one person at a time. I know that through faith, hope and perseverance I have the strength to deal with the issues at hand, and at this holiday time, all I can ask for is your help preserving the gift of life.

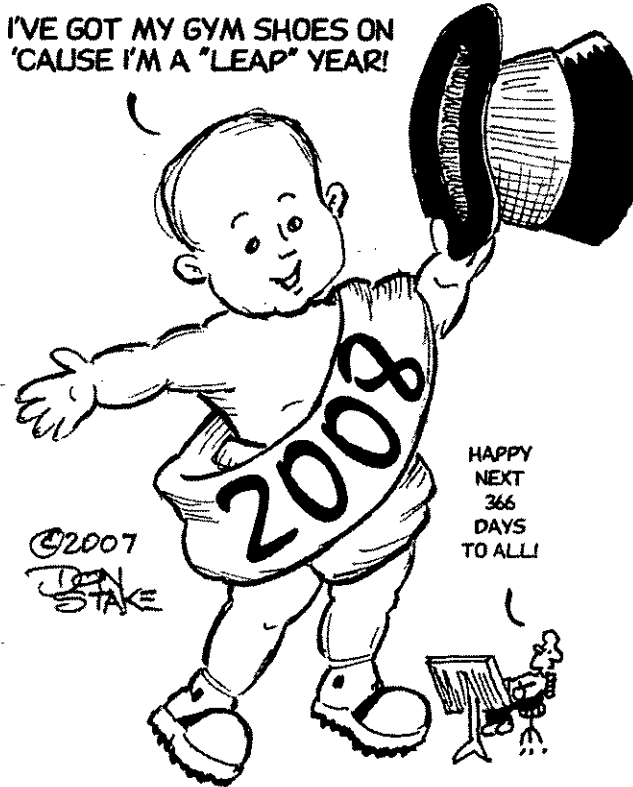
Two years ago, as a representative of the American Red Cross, I too served a tour in Baghdad in the same location

Authorities warn of candle fires

Police and firefighters are bracing for a surge in house fires this winter as people use candles for light during power outages. When people use candles for light, they're igniting a leading cause of home fires, according to the National Fire Protection Association.

The NFPA says people were using candles for light in more than 30 percent of all fatal candle fires and 75 percent of all catastrophic fires where five or more people died. "The risk of a fatal candle fire appears higher when candles are used for light," said NFPA officials.

To help prevent fires, the American Red Cross has developed a home emergency kit that includes SnapLights for safe light. SnapLights turn on with a bend, snap and shake, safely mixing two chemicals to create instant light. There is no spark, flame, heat, battery or bulb. The U.S. military, police and firefighters also use SnapLights

for safe, emergency light. The rate of candle fires doubles in December and January, with 40 percent of all candle fires happening in the winter. Candle fires killed 350 people and injured nearly 3,000 people in 2004 and 2005. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security says there are 23,600 candle fires each year, one every 34 minutes.

Authorities recommend SnapLights because there's no risk of fire. Candle fires, meanwhile, typically break out when people forget about them or simply fall asleep.

"Candles can cause serious safety hazards. Candle fires tripled in the U.S. between 1990 and 2002 and the result can be tragic. The widespread popularity of candles means candle fires, too many of them," according to Consumer Reports.

process since late summer.

The new Eagle Elementary School, which is slated to open in the fall of 2008, will be the district's largest elementary school with 440 students, followed by Slingerlands with 430 students, Hamagrael with 382 students, Glenmont with 349, Elsmere with 286 students and Clarksville - the smallest - at 219 students.

"I think the advantage to scenario five is that the fewest number of students have to be moved," said Lynne Lenhardt, board member.

The main redistricting criteria were to affect the fewest families, and achieve more rational boundaries that accommodate the district's commitment to offering neighborhood schools.

The first of two board-approved modifications to scenario five allows three homes on the south side of Kenwood Avenue between Maywood Road and Pine Street to remain

in Elsmere while five homes on New Scotland Avenue and Mason Lane will stay in Slingerlands.

A 24-member redistricting committee has been meeting since August, and working with VersaTrans consultants hired by the district to create the new boundaries that allow for the proper enrollment of Eagle Elementary School. The board also decided to allow fifth graders changing to existing schools, the option of being grandfathered for their final year before entering middle school. Students set to move to Eagle will not have this option. Fourteen students are affected by the decision, costing the district an additional \$35,000 in transportation fees to accommodate grandfathering fifth graders at their current school.

The only other outstanding issue is the size concern at Clarksville School. Clarksville parents met with Superintendent Les Loomis to air their concerns about the size of the school and ask if it will affect the school's performance and quality.

"I want to assure everyone in the community our commitment to make this transition smooth on smaller schools so they remain strong," said Loomis.

Clarksville is reduced in size by 42 students, giving it an 84 percent school capacity for the 2008-2009 school year.

"We really will do all we can to welcome these students into their new schools and to make that transition as positive as possible," said James Lytle, school board president. Lytle and the board will now be able to address other important issues, including an upcoming school budget, superintendent search process and school curriculum issues.

"It's hard to imagine we can put this issue aside for a while," said Lytle.

Doug Hamlin, president of VersaTrans Solutions, commended the school district for making the process so accessible to the community.

"Of the work I have done in this arena, this is the most open process I have ever seen," Hamlin said.

Longtime planning board member steps down

Daniel Odell credits town officials past and present for setting down a vision for town

Daniel Odell's 12 years on the Bethlehem Planning Board have given him an unexpected education, including learning that Delaware Avenue was once Delaware Turnpike and where the only lake in town is.

Odell is leaving his position with the board this month after serving two terms.

"I got to know corners of the town I never knew existed," said Odell, looking back on his tenure, which began in 1995 after he was appointed to fill a seat left vacant by Gary Swann.

Odell recalls working on the land use management plan in the early '90s and how that plan was a precursor to the comprehensive plan developed almost a decade later.

"The major difference why we have a master plan now is due to the change in parties," said Odell, who commended the leadership of former supervisor Terri Egan, who hired Economic Development Director George Leveille and how their efforts moved the town comprehensive plan forward.

"The two were very skilled managing the process of the master plan and getting stakeholders into the discussion," Odell said.

According to Odell, heavy industrial users and environmentally unfriendly businesses tried to locate in Bethlehem before the comprehensive plan was developed.

"The town needed to set a standard or a pattern to encourage certain kinds of development and to hold the line on development that can be viewed as negative," Odell said.

The 450-acre Vista Technology Park, located in Slingerlands,

is close to becoming a reality. Odell said Vista falls more in line with the proper development a comprehensive plan can bring to the town.

"When you look at a tech park, you have a tax base increase without a strain on the school system," said Odell.

Odell called his colleagues on the planning board "highly motivated" and respectful of each other and the people who come in front of the board. His advice to people who are interested in serving on the board is to be prepared for an educational experience.

"You will learn about pollution, surface water drainage, and the history of the town," said Odell.

Planning board Chairman Parker Mathusa said Odell was a board member who brought great enthusiasm to his work, and

he will be missed. "His comments were very constructive, and he interacted well with board members to advance the comprehensive plan."

Mathusa said.

Odell believes much of the future work of the board will be to follow through on the master plan concept and ensure new development fits well aesthetically.

"The new standards give the board far more authority to enforce a vision for the town," said Odell.

And for those still wondering - Frothingham Lake is located near the Glenmont Job Corps and is the only lake in Bethlehem.

314 jobs and pledges to add 50 jobs in the next three years, according to an Empire State Development press release.

"The \$8 million investment tied to incentives will allow us to retain (and add new) workers," Mark Steven, the company's general manager said.

Atlas Copco Comptec has agreed to a series of project milestones under which it will be eligible for a total of \$700,000 in incentives from ESD, a \$500,000 Manufacturing Assistance Program capital grant to be used as partial reimbursement for costs associated with the purchase and installation of machinery and equipment, and a \$200,000 capital grant to be used as partial reimbursement for infrastructure and site work.

Under the agreement, Atlas Copco Comptec will receive

the full amount upon reaching project targets set by Empire State Development. The targets must be reached before Jan. 1, 2011.

"Atlas Copco Comptec is very pleased our company has been granted these incentives for expansion in New York. The improvements as a result of this grant and our investment will contribute to the company's competitiveness to business development and growth," Steven said.

Voorheesville Mayor Robert Conway said he also is pleased with the expansion.

"It gives a tax advantage to Atlas Copco Comptec, and we want to encourage them to remain in the area," Conway said.



an autistic 13-year-old who as a resident at O.D. Heck.

Carey died while being transported in a van during an outing. Twin Tirado and Nadeem Mall were arraigned in Colonie Town Court on manslaughter charges and sent to Albany County jail.

"Total shock," is how Carey's father, Michael Carey of Glenmont, described the news of his son's death.

Carey's parents believe Jonathan was the victim of abuse in 2004 when he was a resident at the Anderson School in Dutchess County. Jonathan's alleged abuse is the focus of a civil suit brought against the school by the Careys, who are also trying to work with the state to craft legislation giving parents more access to medical records with state regulatory agencies.

Albany firefighter and Slingerlands resident Theodore Abriell died in the line of duty Feb. 19 after responding to his second fire call of the day. Abriell collapsed inside the hallway of a burning high-rise apartment at 2 Lincoln Square.

"Our entire city grieves today as we have lost one of our bravest," said Albany Mayor Jerry Innings.

The 44-year-old Abriell was a member of Engine Company 20 located in Arbor Hill. He is the 48th Albany firefighter to die in the line of duty. Abriell's wake was attended by hundreds of mourners on Feb. 23 at Albany's Palace Theatre. Abriell left behind a wife and four children.

A five-decade-long discussion to build a new highway along state Route 85, known as the Slingerlands Bypass, became a reality on Feb. 21 when state Department of Transportation officials announced that a \$15.2 million dollar contract was awarded to Delaney Construction of Mayfield to perform the work.

"We are here today to announce a milestone in the Slingerlands Bypass," said Thomas Werner, director of the Capital Region DOT.

The bypass project includes constructing 1.5 miles of Route 85, widening the Normans Kill bridge and placing several new roundabouts to ease traffic congestion. Approximately 25,000 motorists travel the Slingerlands bypass daily.

Bethlehem Democratic chairman Matthew Clyne is selected to replace James Clancy as the next Albany County Democratic Election Commissioner.

Clyne narrowly defeated Karen Shea, deputy election commissioner, for the post voted on by the county Democratic committee. The position pays \$30,000 annually. Clancy accepted a new position in the Spitzer Administration.

March

Bethlehem resident Blair Horner is selected by new state Attorney General Andrew Cuomo to become a special advisor on policy and public integrity. Horner left his position at NYP-IRG (New York Public Interest Research Group) after 24 years to take on the role of heading up "Project Sunlight," aimed at

building a comprehensive Internet database for public information on elected officials.

"He brings invaluable experience, and I am proud he will be bringing his dedication to the Department of Law," said Cuomo.

A 49-year-old state Office of Mental Health employee, James Leggiro, is under investigation by the Attorney General's office on charges of money laundering, grand larceny and defrauding the government of more than \$1.2 million. Leggiro, a Guilderland resident and Slingerlands property owner is accused of forming a fraudulent company called VIP (Very Important Properties) and submitting vouchers to himself for billing as a state agency auditor for work that was never performed.

"This troubling incident clearly reveals weaknesses in some areas of internal financial management at the Office of Mental Health," said Jill Daniels, OMH spokesperson.

On Friday, March 23, Bethlehem Supervisor Theresa Egan announced she would be leaving her supervisor position to accept an appointment as deputy commissioner with the state Department of Motor Vehicles.

"This is a very difficult decision because I love what I'm doing here," said Egan.

Her last official day on the job as town supervisor was April 11. The community expressed surprise and sadness to hear Egan was leaving her supervisor job.

"I think everybody was in shock," said town Comptroller Judith Kehoe.

Egan served as supervisor for three and a half years after being the first Democrat elected to the position in more than 150 years.

"I will miss these people I worked with and the initiatives I started," Egan said.

Stuart Lyman, president of the Bethlehem school board, and past president Richard Svenson, announced they will not be running for re-election in May. Both veteran board members made their announcement at the March 21 meeting.

"It's been an honor and a privilege to serve this community," said Svenson.

Both men agreed it would be good for the community to have new people serve on the board. Lyman served 13 years on the school board and Svenson nine years.

A bank robber walked into the Delmar Delaware Avenue branch of Bank of America Tuesday, March 27, and ran off with several thousand dollars. The suspect was described as a white male in his early 20s, who was wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and a baseball cap. No weapons were displayed and no injuries reported.

April

James Leggiro pleaded guilty April 10, to fleecing the state of \$1.2 million through his position as senior auditor for the state Office of Mental Health.

The 50-year-old area resident, a 27-year state employee approved 80 fraudulent vouchers over a nine-year period and charged the agency for work never performed.

Bethlehem officials announced the town will become the new operator of Colonial Acres Golf Course. The Open Space Institute will purchase the privately run, nine-hole neighborhood golf course in Glenmont and then lease it to the town for the fee of \$1 a year.

"This will preserve a beautiful area that is nationally Audubon-certified and will keep the area forever green without development," said Supervisor Theresa Egan.

April 11 was Theresa Egan's last day as Bethlehem supervisor as employees said their goodbyes at a gathering in town hall.

"Thank you very much for what you have done these past three-and-a-half years," Egan told employees. "I leave full of pride in accomplishing a great deal, and without you we couldn't have done it."

Albany County Legislator Jack Cunningham replaced Egan as interim supervisor through the end of the year.

Glenmont resident Jim Grady announced he will run for Bethlehem town supervisor in November. Grady, a lifelong resident and self-employed hedge fund manager, said the town is at a crossroads, and a businessman is needed at the helm. The race for supervisor now has two candidates with recently appointed interim town Supervisor Jack Cunningham stating his intention to run for the seat in November.

Marshalls, the clothing retailer many Bethlehem residents have been anxiously waiting for, opened its doors to customers at the new Glenmont location April 18. Store manager Kitty Bidwell said customers continued to pour in several hours later. Marshalls promotes itself as one of the leading off-price family apparel and home fashion retailers, with more than 750 stores in the United States.

May

Several thousand mourners, including a large contingent of state troopers and Gov. Eliot Spitzer, came to Bethlehem's Lutheran Church on May 2 to pay their respects to fallen trooper David C. Brinkerhoff, who was killed searching for a shooting suspect in Delaware County.

Brinkerhoff lived in Delmar for a period of time and maintained his ties to the local church and community. He was killed trying to apprehend 23-year-old Travis D. Trim, who was hiding out in a secluded farmhouse just one day after wounding another state trooper, Matthew Gombosi. Trim was killed when the house he was trapped in by police burned to the ground.

Brinkerhoff was an eight-and-a-half-year veteran of the state police unit's Mobile Response Team. He is survived by his wife and 7-month-old daughter.

Developers of Vista Technology Park cleared a major hurdle May 9 when the Bethlehem Town Board unanimously accepted the project's 300-page final environmental impact statement.

"This is a major milestone for them," said town Economic Development Director George Leveille.

The technology park will be located on 450 acres of land encompassing the towns of New Scotland and Bethlehem. The project at full development is expected to employ more than 4,000 people and generate millions of dollars in tax revenue to the town and school district.

The state Department of Transportation is currently undergoing a \$15.2 million transportation project in the same area, known as the Slingerlands Bypass, to ease the growing traffic congestion in that area.

Voters in the Bethlehem school district overwhelmingly approved the new \$77.2 million school budget. More than 5,000 residents turned out for the vote. Last year's school budget was defeated for the first time in more than 20 years. Board president Stuart Lyman credited the PTA and parents for getting voter to come out. Two new school board members were also elected. Lisa Allendorph and Diane Giaccone Stever will replace Lyman and Richard Svenson, who decided not to seek another term.

The first new school construction in 50 years begins in the Bethlehem school district with groundbreaking ceremonies May 22 for the new Eagle Elementary School.

The school will be located across from Bethlehem High School on Van Dyke Road and is anticipated to open in the fall of 2008. The \$7.4 million project is part of the district's overall \$93 million bond that included expansion of the high school and new classrooms in each of the elementary and middle schools.

June

June 12 was the last day of school for Bethlehem High School seniors as cigars, water balloons, firecrackers and fire alarms marked the occasion.

"We just like to have fun," said Kate Kurtessis, who will be attending Roanoke College in the fall.

The celebration outside the high school in the parking lot lasted for about two hours under the watchful eye of Principal Chuck Abba and several officers from the Bethlehem police department. There were no major incidents. Graduation day for Bethlehem seniors is June 22.

Full-day kindergarten for the Bethlehem Central School District was approved June 20 by the school board after a month-long discussion involving staff and parents in the community.

"It is inconceivable to me that teachers and students would not be better off," said school board president Stuart Lyman regarding the change.

Students in Bethlehem's full-day kindergarten will now stay in school six hours and 10 minutes as opposed to the current two-and-a-half-hour half-day program.

Fifteen new staff members will be hired when the move to full-day kindergarten is complete by the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year.

Sgt. Shawn Martin, a former Elsmere volunteer firefighter and eight-year veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps, was killed June 27 in Iraq by a roadside bomb. Martin was diffusing a roadside bomb when a second bomb exploded nearby.

The Delmar native, who had been living in California, had been in Iraq for five weeks when he was killed.

Martin is the third Bethlehem native who has died in Iraq. Bethlehem resident Capt. Timothy Moshier was killed in Iraq in 2006 when he was shot down piloting an Apache helicopter. Sgt. Thomas Robbins, a 1994 Bethlehem High School graduate, was killed in Iraq in 2004 near Mosul when a mortar exploded.

Tend of year revelers will have their pick of festivals in the Capital District this year.

Saratoga Springs will host its 13th annual First Night celebration just a few days after their neighbors down the Northway host the second Albany WinterFestival.

The events offer something for singles, couples and families, say coordinators, but are different enough to warrant going to both.

"People are starting to recognize that our event is a different one from First Night," said Melli Rose, public relations coordinator for the City of Albany. Albany's last First Night was in 2005; WinterFestival started in 2006, geared toward children and families.

In its inaugural year, WinterFestival's approximate 10,000 in attendance topped the crowd gathered for the last Albany First Night, said Rose. A pass or button isn't required and most events are free.

Held on Saturday, Dec. 29, WinterFestival kicks off at 11:30 a.m. with the "Jingle Jog" Fun Run for children ages 5 to 11. Each child receives a goody bag filled with great surprises, plus an official race T-shirt, said Rose. Registration is \$3 per child. Refreshments and a drawing for prizes follow.

Beginning at 1 p.m., the streets will come alive with magic, music and performers. Vaudevillian performers The Flying Karamazov Brothers will headline at the Palace Theatre.

The professional BMX riders of FreeCycle Action Sports Team and America's Best Frisbee Dogs will perform on Lodge Street. Albany City Hall will host the beginnings of a scavenger hunt. Amusement games, pony rides, a rock-climbing wall and a giant bonfire will await visitors in Academy Park.

At 5:15 p.m., there will be fireworks on the east lawn of the state Capitol.

The 11th annual "Last Run" 5K Road Race kicks off with an anticipated 1,000 runners. The U.S. Track and Field certified route heads up State Street through Capital Holiday Lights in Washington Park. The registration fee is \$20. Runners are encouraged to register at www.active.com to reserve a spot in the race.

Two days later, those diehard runners can begin their First Night Saratoga with another 5K run.

For the 10th year, the evening

will begin with a 5-kilometer run through Saratoga Springs.

"It's a family affair," said Jeffery Allen, who has coordinated the run for the past decade. "Parent, kids—they all run together. How many times do families get to run together, under the stars with 1,000 other people?"

Registration for the run can be completed at www.ymcasaratoga.org. There is an entry fee of \$20.

Events at First Night Saratoga begin at 6 p.m. and end with fireworks at midnight. Admission buttons to all events are \$13, but Event Coordinator Maureen Duda said the price is worth attending the

largest First Night celebration in the state and "the biggest New Year's celebration outside of Times Square."

Buses will be on hand for this year's First Night Saratoga to take what is expected to be the festival's largest crowd — close to 14,000, Duda estimates — to expanded venues.

First Night Saratoga has expanded beyond the city center and First Night coordinators have partnered with CDTA. Buses will run every 15 minutes on seven routes around the city and to new venues that include the YMCA of Saratoga, the Saratoga Springs High School, and the National Museum of Dance.



"Park at the YMCA, park at the high school, hop on a bus and it'll take you anywhere you want to go," Duda said.

All bus service will be free from 5 p.m. to 1 a.m., but officials said if there is a need for transportation after that time, they'll stick around.

Performers will be located up and down Broadway, down Lake Avenue, and along many side streets. This year, more than 400 artists will perform at 35 venues. Musical artists represent an array of styles, including pop, orchestral, country and opera. The Celtic rock-band Seven Nations will be headlining what Duda calls

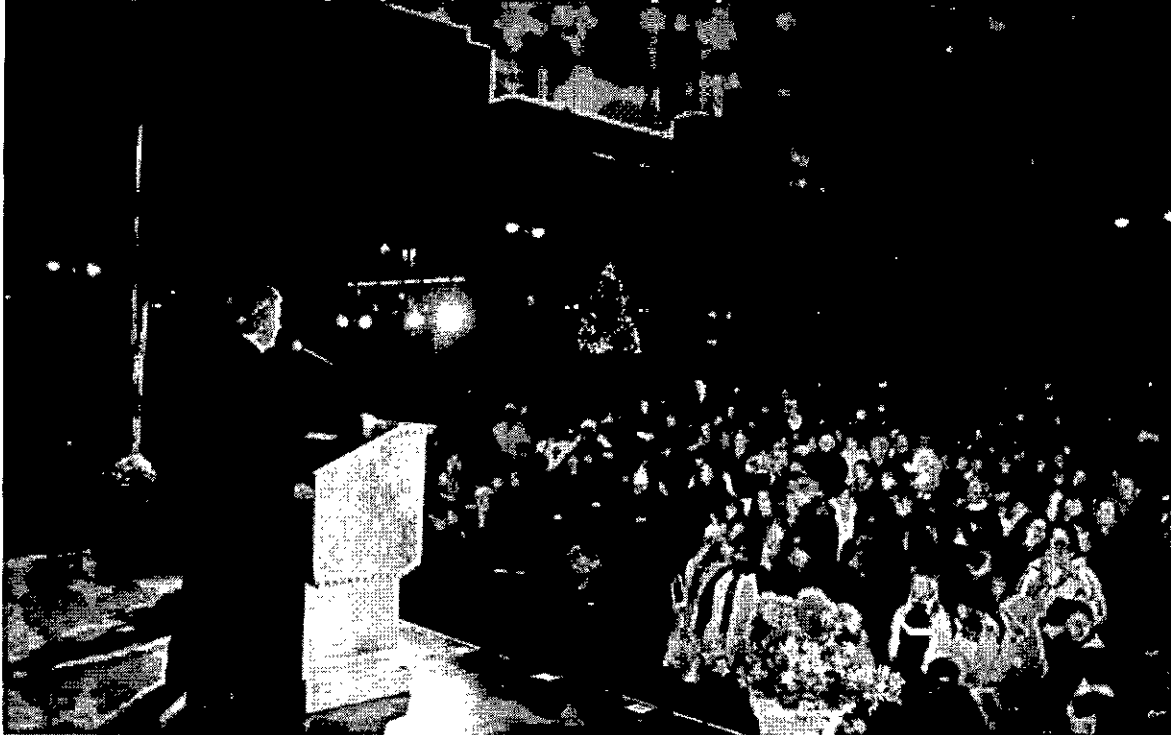
an "Irish extravaganza" in the Saratoga Springs City Center.

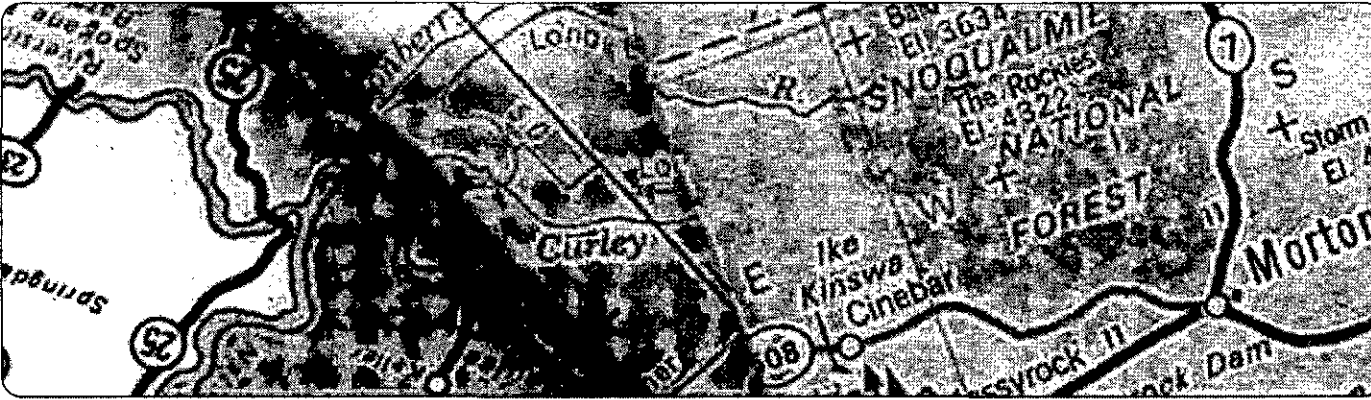

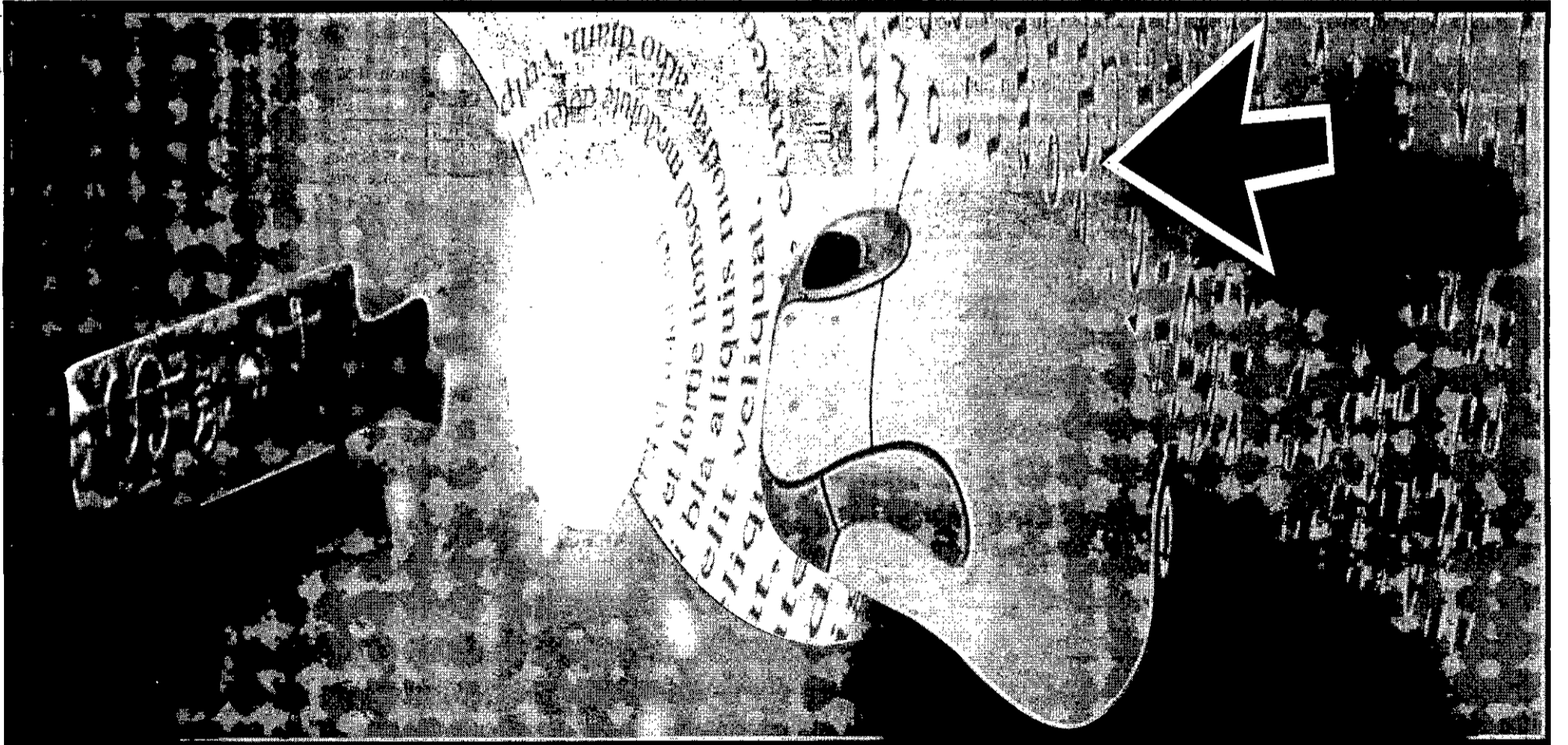

Sports *in the* Spotlight

Graham's state title highlights 2007 season

Before we take down the 2007 calendar and hang the 2008 edition, let's look back at the year in Capital District sports season by season.

January through March

Topping the list is Section II's banner day at the New York State Wrestling Championships in Albany, where one team dominated the competition and three area wrestlers took home individual titles.

Let's start with Shenendehowa's weekend, where thanks to the efforts of the Meys and Popolizio brothers, the Plainsmen won the team title in the large school division.

"It feels great to get it at home," said Shen coach Rob Weeks.

Hunter Meys led Shen - and, for that matter, the Section II team - with a breakthrough performance in the 171-pound weight class. Meys pinned all four of his opponents in a combined time of 6:54 to win his first state title in three attempts and earn the Most Outstanding Wrestler award.

"My goal coming in was to win (the state title)," said Meys. "I didn't expect this to happen."

Luke (96 pounds) and T.J. Popolizio (112) nearly joined Meys at the top of the podium. The two lightweights reached the finals of their respective weight classes before losing. Meys' younger brother Austin finished fifth in the 140-pound division.

Two more area wrestlers needed overtime to win state titles. Christian Brothers Academy's Michael Chaires was pushed into an extra period before defeating Spencerport's Bryan Bourne 5-1 for the large school 160-pound title, and Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk's Nate Graham defeated two-time state champion Colin McDonald of Waverly 8-5 for the small school 171-pound title.

"It feels good," said Graham, who became R-C-S's first state wrestling champion. "I get my name on the mat."

Chaires - a Scotia native - became only the eighth Section II wrestler to win two state titles with his championship bout victory over Bourne.

"I'm just happy to win two," said Chaires, who now wrestles for the University of Virginia. "To win two is a great accomplishment for me, and I'm glad I did it here in Albany."

In other sports, CBA's three-year run as class AA Sectional

basketball champions ended with a 48-43 loss to Bishop Maginn in the finals. The Brothers, who had won 23 consecutive games before the finals, led 32-19 in the second half before Maginn closed the game with a 29-11 run - a good chunk of which came while CBA's top two forwards, Greg Holle and DeAndre Kennedy, were on the bench with foul trouble.

"I was very proud of some of the things we did on defense," said CBA coach Dave Doemel. "We just had difficulty getting in our offense."

While one boys basketball dynasty ended, another one may have begun in Scotia. The Schenectady Christian School Falcons won their first Sectional championship by beating Argyle 75-54 in the class C-CC final. And with Jake Bowman, Bryan Bishop and Kelsey Collins returning to the flock in November, the small private school occupying the former Scotia-Glenville High School building is off to another strong start.

In girls basketball, Colonie returned to the top of the class AA heap by beating Guilderland 41-34 in the Sectional finals. The senior-dominated Garnet Raiders used the disappointment of a semifinal loss the previous season to fuel their run to the Sectional championship.

"I wanted this for them, and

for the fact that they have worked so hard for us every single game all season long," said Colonie coach Karen Bonitatibus.

In hockey, Shen continued its dominance by winning its fifth straight Section II large school division title with a 4-1 victory over CBA. Goaltender Greg Hitchko stopped 32 of the 33 shots he faced, and four different Plainsmen scored goals to put the finishing touches on another championship.

"It's the kids. Every year, you've got a fresh new crop of faces coming in, and that's really what it's all about," said Shen coach Juan de la Rocha.

April through June

A new era in girls lacrosse began when Shaker eliminated eight-time Sectional champion Bethlehem with a thrilling 16-15 double overtime victory in the semifinals. That meant for the first time in Section II girls lacrosse history, neither Bethlehem nor Saratoga Springs would play for the title. Instead, Shaker met Guilderland on May 31 for the title.

"What I love about this year's final is you have two brand new teams, which is nice," said Shaker coach Carrie Britt following her team's semifinal win. "And you know it's going to be a close game."

Britt's words proved to be

prophetic, though the outcome wasn't what she hoped for as Guilderland defeated Shaker 9-7 for its first title. Danielle Tetreault tallied five times to lead the Lady Dutch.

"She was smart enough to get the right match-ups," Guilderland coach Gary Chatnik said of Tetreault. "On three of her goals, she made some great cuts to get to the net."

On the boys' side, Niskayuna's Sectional championship streak continued as the Silver Warriors knocked off Guilderland 11-9 in the class A finals. It was the third consecutive year that Niskayuna defeated Guilderland for the title, but this one was much closer as the Silver Warriors rallied from an early 3-0 deficit, built an 11-5 lead and then fended off a late Dutchmen charge.

"I think it was really important (to win this title)," said Niskayuna coach Mike Vorgang. "We only had a few guys coming back who played a lot last year, so we needed some of the newer players to step up."

Guilderland had better luck in the baseball playoffs. The Dutchmen won their first Sectional championship in 30 years when they defeated Troy 5-2 on the strength of Andrew Simpson's third inning three-run home run.

"Somebody always steps up. That's what good teams do," said Guilderland coach Doug LaValley.

Saratoga Central Catholic also earned a Sectional baseball title after edging Hudson 3-2 in the class B championship game. Pitcher Zach Carlson worked out of several jams to pick up the complete-game victory, and Vince Farfaglia scored the go-

ahead run on an error in the bottom of the fifth inning.

"He (Carlson) didn't have his best stuff, but he's gutty," said Saratoga Central Catholic coach Phoneysey Lambert. "I don't know how he did it, but he has so much guts."

In softball, Shen picked up its fifth consecutive class AA Sectional title with a come-from-behind 2-1 victory over Colonie in the finals. Kayla Hines' RBI double in the bottom of the fifth inning proved to be the winning hit for the 22-1 Plainsmen.

"Each (title) is different, and I take it one at a time," said Shen coach Dan D'Amboise. "I've had good fortune, good players and a little good luck."

Track and field had its share of state champions. The Shen boys 1,600-meter relay team of Tyler Fogarty, Patrell Brown, Chris Campoli and Tyler Riberdy edged Newburgh Free Academy with a winning time of 3:18.50 - third best in Section II history. Shen's 3,200 boys relay team of Corey Clavet, Ryan Jones, Zach Predmore and Zac Suriano claimed the public school title with a time of 7:51.05, half a second ahead of the Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake quartet of Cody Buell, Zach Goodrich, Andrew Jess and Drew Houghtalen. Colonie's Steve Crouse won the Federation triple jump title with a distance of 46 feet, 10 inches, and Guilderland's Brian Rhodes-Devey claimed the public school 800 title with a time of 1:52.37.

July through September
As always, Saratoga Race Course dominated the summer sports scene. For six weeks, some of the best thoroughbreds in the United States called the Spa City's historic track their home, and in the case of Street Sense, actually ran there, too. Street Sense won both the Jim Dandy

and Travers to highlight a strong season for the 3-year-old. Curlin was also at Saratoga, though trainer Steve Asmussen elected to run his horse at the Haskell at Monmouth Park and the Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont.

Baseball was also on the minds of Spa City residents, as the New York Collegiate Baseball League's Saratoga Phillies made another run at a title. The defending champion Phillies finished second to Glens Falls in the East Division with a 25-14 record and reached the divisional finals, where they lost to the Golden Eagles in three games.

The Phillies also made news in late July when they hosted the Russian national team at East Side Recreation Field. The Russians gave it all they had, but the Phillies pulled away for a 10-0 victory.

A group of five Capital District residents - Bethlehem brothers Mark and Jeff Bryant, Guilderland resident Tom Fashouer and Voorheesville residents Mike Brennan and Tom Marker - climbed Mount Kilimanjaro in September, the highest peak in Africa.

"Everybody was single-minded in getting to the top. Nobody wanted to be the one not to make it to the top," said Markert.

October through December
Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake sports fans will fondly look back at this time period as when their school dominated Section II. The Saratoga County school claimed Sectional titles in eight sports - boys soccer, boys volleyball, field hockey, girls cross country, girls soccer, girls swimming, girls tennis and girls volleyball - and nearly won a ninth when its football team pushed Lansingburgh to the limit before losing 28-25 in the class A finals.

Of the eight Sectional champions from BH-BL, four went on to compete for state titles. The girls cross country team dominated the competition at the public school meet outside Potsdam to win its second consecutive state title, while the boys volleyball team swept Section VI power Orchard Park in three games to earn its first regional championship - the equivalent of a state title.

"I have never played with a group of kids at the top of their games like today," said Mike Bynon, one of several seniors on the boys volleyball team. "To finish it off like that is great."

The boys soccer and girls volleyball teams fell short in their state title bids, though. Bryam Hills defeated BH-BL 1-0 in the class A boys soccer tournament, while the girls volleyball team fell to Hendrick Hudson for the second year in a row at the state tournament.

Just getting to the finals was an accomplishment for the BH-BL girls volleyball team. The Spartans needed to defeat Section V champion Victor in a one-game playoff to advance to the title match - \$5,495 Hawkeye 300.

"The team has done a great job," said Syracuse University-bound senior Erin Little, who led the Spartans in the tournament with 50 kills and 19 blocks. "Everyone has worked really hard."

Shen also won a Section II girls soccer title, as Ashleigh Barone's late goal lifted the Plainsmen past Niskayuna 2-1 in the class AA championship game.

Niskayuna had better luck in the boys soccer final, as Tyler Gansfuss tallied in overtime to give the Silver Warriors a 1-0 victory over Bethlehem. It was the Silver Warriors' first Sectional championship in 23 years.

"It's a 400-pound gorilla off our backs," said first-year Niskayuna coach Jeffrey Ormsbee.

Other Sectional titles went to the Saratoga Springs field hockey team, the Shenendehowa and Voorheesville boys cross country teams, the Saratoga girls cross country team, the Bethlehem girls swimming team and the Niskayuna, Voorheesville and Unionville Christian School girls volleyball teams.

Three area football teams came close to winning Sectional titles, but none closer than Guilderland. Appearing in their first-ever class AA championship

game, the Dutchmen had a 17-0 lead on LaSalle with 10 minutes left before the Cadets rallied for a 28-17 victory.

BH-BL engaged Lansingburgh in a seesaw battle for the class A football title before Kenny Youngs scored on an 8-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter to give the Knights a 28-25 victory. Kyle Vuillaume raced 48 yards for a touchdown with 3:30 left to put the Spartans ahead 25-20.

Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk reached the class B Super Bowl for the third time in four years, but its offense couldn't break through Cobleskill-Richmondville's defense in a 14-3 loss.

"The defense was terrific. We just didn't do enough things offensively to keep us in the game," said R-C-S coach Gary VanDerzee.

Area sports fans didn't have much time to recover from the fall sports season. Winter sports began the final week of November, with a whole new group of athletes hoping to bring Sectional titles home.
