Breeding for bucks

Activists say lax oversight has allowed 'puppy mills' to flourish in state

An ongoing battle to weed out mass dog breeding operations in Pennsylvania has crossed state lines into New York's Finger Lakes region, moved east on Interstate 88 and come into the Capital District.

Not long ago Lancaster County, Pa., was ground zero for a grassroots campaign to eradicate the practice of mass dog breeding.

Residents there formed groups and pleaded with state and federal Humane Societies, animal rights activists and state lawmakers to put the pinch on "puppy mills." They won.

Now, nearly three years after the Pennsylvania nonprofit group United Against Puppy Mills waged its campaign in Lancaster, the practice is rapidly becoming a problem in New York.

"Even though they are in the Finger Lakes region, they're huge operations. It's affecting us, and the animals are coming here," said Mohawk Hudson River Humane Society Executive Director Brad Shear of the growing number of mass dog-breeding operations in the state. "They're here; just not as big."

The so-called "puppy mills" have always been out there, but activists and humane society officials say the problems associated with them got worse when Pennsylvania, once known as the puppy mill capital of the Northeast, began strengthening laws and regularly enforcing them, pushing the mas-

sive profit-driven breeding operations of the Pennsylvania Dutch areas into New York, as Amish and Mennonite breeders sought loopholes and a lack of oversight.

Those loopholes are vast, activists say. They even allege that in some instances, breeders are receiving tax dollars through the state Department of Agriculture and Markets to continue "farming" operations in the state.

State regulations exist to crack down on the poor living conditions in the mass-breeding operations, but those violations are nearly impossible to prove, said Mary Anne Kowalski, an animal rights lobbyist

and consultant.

"The New York state program has enough holes in it to drive a truck through," she said.

Kowalski decided to take on puppy mills in February 2002 after purchasing a dog with numerous health problems from a Finger Lakes breeder at an Interstate 88 rest stop for \$950. She named the purebred miniature schnauzer Barney.

Barney has kidney problems and is the only known miniature schnauzer with an under bite, similar to a Shih-tzu, said Kowalski. His incisors poke into his upper jaw.

Barney is from New York's "puppy mill capital. The new Lancaster County, Pa., is Yates County, N.Y.

Kowalski keeps clippings of local classifieds ads for puppies, all with Yates County phone numbers. She keeps state Ag and Markets reports on local breeders, some with - and many without - permits. She believes what is happening is the same chain of events that led to the confiscation of hundreds of dogs in Pennsylvania last year and recently prompted Pennsylvania Gov. Ed Rendell to again toughen health and safety standards of the more than 2,000 licensed kennels there.

In New York, if breeders sell publicly, they need a breeding license. If they sell more than nine dogs or cats in a year, they are required to be licensed as pet dealers and are subject to inspections warranted by complaints. If they sell

An Albany woman has been charged with felony assault after throwing hot chocolate in another woman's face at the Glenmont Dunkin Donuts.

Afeisha Rivers, 20, of 117 Phillips St. Albany, was also charged with criminal possession of a weapon, a third degree felony. Bethlehem police responded to the Route 9W Glenmont Dunkin Donuts following a report of a fight involving two females.

When they arrived, the victim reported that Rivers threw a cup of hot chocolate in her face. Police report that two witnesses also observed the altercation.

Rivers was taken into custody by police and sent to Albany County jail with bail set at \$1,500. She has a return date in Bethlehem Town Court Tuesday, Feb. 5.

The victim was transported to Albany Medical Center and

treated for burns to her face.

Other arrests

Bethlehem police charged a Selkirk man with misdemeanor DWI.

Martin Brozowski, 27, of Old Ravana Road is also charged with driving with .08 percent blood alcohol content and speeding.

Reports indicate Brozowski was stopped by officers after traveling over the state speed limit of 55 mph near River Road in Selkirk. After being stopped, police report that an odor of alcohol was detected and a 12-ounce bottle of beer was behind the driver's seat in plain view.

Brozowski was placed in custody and will reappear

in Bethlehem Town Court, Tuesday, Jan. 22.

John McNally, 23, of 632 Kenwood Ave., is charged with misdemeanor DWI, driving with more than .08 percent blood alcohol content and aggravated DWI. Police report that McNally's eyes were glassy, his speech impaired and an odor of alcohol was detected. McNally was placed into custody and will appear in Bethlehem Town Court Tuesday, Jan. 22.

Students raise money for youngsters in need

Sixth graders gather nearly \$2,000 to pay for schooling for children in impoverished nations

On Tuesday, Dec. 18, a group of sixth graders presented a check for \$1,994 to Cindy Schmehl, director of the local nonprofit World's Window Inc., to send a total of 250 students to primary school in Zimbabwe and high school in Belize.

The group, known as "ambassadors," consist of 20 students who, during a social studies unit on the disparity between rich and poor around the world, convinced their schoolmates that action was needed on the part of local students to improve the lives of their counterparts thousands of miles away.

"I think it's a great opportunity to help kids just like us to get an education," said sixth grader Bethany Caldwell.

Raising the money — and collecting items such as toothbrushes, medical supplies and soccer balls — was a schoolwide effort. Throughout November, students held a can drive, in which every BCMS student was encouraged to give what they could. More than 8,000 coins and dollar bills were donated, for the total of nearly \$2,000. Students were also encouraged to donate personal care items, which will also go a long way in Zimbabwe and Belize.

"There are children who don't even get to brush their teeth," said Gunnar Zemerling, another ambassador. "This is our chance to help them."

Earlier this year, all of the sixth grade social studies classes completed a "Haves and Have

Nots" unit. They discovered that a third of the world's population lives on less than \$1 a day, and that children in many places do not get to go to school, the impetus for the ambassadors' project.

"It's a chance for our students

to learn they can have a true impact on the lives of other children by providing them with an educational opportunity that they would not otherwise receive," said sixth-grade social studies teacher Bill Reilly, who also coordinates the Global

Coalition Project at Bethlehem Central Middle School. The Global Coalition is an organization of more than 30 schools around the world whose mission is to serve as an international exchange of culture, ideas and projects to promote education and understanding.

The sixth grade ambassadors focused their efforts on Zimbabwe and Belize because of the direct connection that has been established between BCMS and schools in the two countries through the Global Coalition. Many of the sixth graders have already communicated with children in the two communities their donation will help through the Global Coalition.

They chose to donate the money through World's Window because it is a local non-profit with extensive connections in Zimbabwe and Belize that sends the money and supplies along with volunteers directly to the communities that they are assisting.

"We are very proud to work with Bethlehem Central Middle School students," said Schmehl. "We see many great leaders in this school. The children in Zimbabwe will be so very happy to see these donations and know that someone on the other side of the world cares about their education."

There's a lot of attention when you first join a gym, but very soon you'll be left alone to navigate the torso rotator machine, invisible to the 20-somethings with their sweat-wicking designer sportswear and flat abs.

Really, just stay home and do sit-ups while you listen to your child practice his or her musical instrument.

In January, you are on the rebound from December's sedentary, overeating, holiday-laden lifestyle. So, save your

money, save your gas, and save your self-esteem. Be sensible and have your interim fitness fling at home.

Who will be at the gym in January? Other people in their rebound fitness relationship stage. Sure, many of those people made New Year's resolutions about "getting in shape," but most of them will be unable to follow through. They may be nice people with good intentions, but why run the risk of developing attachments to new gym members who aren't in it for the long haul?

Save yourself the heartbreak. Rent an exercise video, do bicep curls using canned soup for weights, run in place while watching your favorite TV sitcom.

You'll know when it's time to join the gym. It'll be when you're ready. It won't be because of a shiny flier that states "Only \$10 per month. No contract."

Why wouldn't you want a contract at the gym? Don't you want to commit to getting in shape? Don't you care about your health? Don't you want to be at a fitness center that has a guaranteed source of revenue?

A lot of people fall for that kind of marketing, even if it's only subliminal. They don't know it, but these people are also the most prized members. They contribute financially to the infrastructure without ever adding to the waiting line at the elliptical machine.

As luck would have it, my membership term was about to expire and I had not renewed. I didn't lose out financially, but my fitness routine suffered.

Sure, there were other gyms in town, but none were as convenient. By convenient I mean "on the way to other places to which I often travel." I could pass my old gym on the way home from work. I could walk to my favorite café for quiche and hot chocolate after a

grueling workout. I could drop my daughter at dance class and still get to the cardio kickboxing class.

Sure, there were other gyms within 2 miles of my home, but not on routes I often traveled. Plus I knew those other gyms were popular and would be crowded. My only recourse was to take eight months off from regular exercise, a sort of unofficial grieving period for my former gym.

I had many excuses for not joining a new gym. Here's what I told myself and others: I don't want to have to pay to

exercise. I can just dance in my living room. It's too cold to drive to the gym. It's too nice outside to be inside the gym. I'm too tired to go before work. It's too crowded after work. I'm too hungry to exercise before dinner. I'm too full to exercise after dinner.

I was simply not ready to commit to a new fitness center.

Then another birthday rolled around and I decided it was time to move on. I joined a new gym the very next day.

My new gym is much larger and it's co-ed. The fitness director is very friendly. When I explained that I just had a birthday, he said, "How young are you?" What a great line!

Luckily I'm at an age where I don't feel self-conscious about using only 5-pound free weights or my sloppy hair falling out of its ponytail holder or my unshaven legs. If this image leaves you shaken, then consider installing a treadmill in your basement. For even in January, I'll be visiting the gym.



Alternatives take sting out of high oil prices

It happened. One hundred dollars for a barrel of oil. Apparently, we are going to need to take matters into our own hands, because our government is dragging its feet on regulating the costs of fuel and making alternative energy available at affordable prices.

It's time to make some noise and take some action. In our free market society, let's change what we're demanding, so the supply does too.

Start locally. We applaud the previous Colonie administration with energy policies like replacing light bulbs with energy efficient ones. It may be a small step, but it's a step nonetheless.

Call your town hall; ask what energy saving measures are being taken around your town. How about hybrid vehicles for the town code enforcers as a start?

Go to the state level. Write to your Assembly member, your state senator. Get their phone numbers (or find out who represents you) on their Web sites: www.assembly.state.ny.us; www.senate.state.ny.us. Ask them what energy policies they're initiating in your district. Have them push Gov. Eliot Spitzer on the "15 by 15" policy he promised last year. By 2015, he wanted to decrease the demand for power by 15 percent from forecasted levels through efforts to improve energy efficiency, and increase the supply of energy in an environmentally sustainable way.

Go national: find your Congressman on www.house.gov. Let him know, we're serious about finding different energy sources.

It's also time for serious investment in alternative fuels. Enough with dependence on foreign energy sources. How can we wage an effective war on terror when we're hamstrung in our own energy production? Ask your representatives for tax breaks now for those who invest in the future by buying or producing alternative fuels.

Visit National Grid at nationalgridus.com and find out about getting home heat from alternative sources. A lot of us have put this off because it seemed more costly than fossil fuels. But at \$100 per barrel, the gap must be closing.

Check out public transportation: www.cdta.org will give you local bus schedules. CDTA, here's a big opportunity for you. Be on time, be courteous, and you could benefit the most.

And, consider your vehicle. If you're still driving a gas guzzler, shame on you. Check out the latest batch of hybrids.

It's time to speak up about this \$100 per barrel cost. Make the loudest sound be, "No thanks."

Get smart about nutrition

It's that time of year again when thousands of Americans make promises to make a positive change in the coming year. You probably won't be surprised to read that one of the top resolutions is to lose weight. It may shock you to know that 55 percent of the population is considered overweight (National Institute of Health).

So, if you have determined that you need to lose weight, then you are not alone. To help you make your weight loss a long-term success, you need to set realistic goals. You should also make a plan and stick to it. To help you do this the Eat Smart New York program in Schenectady County has come up with the following top 10 ways to help make weight loss a successful venture.

- Determine your calorie needs by using the individualized plan available at www.mypyramid.gov.
- Burn more calories than you take in. Eat less, exercise more or better yet, do both.
- Keep calories from fat less than 30 percent of all calories.
- Choose foods and beverages with little or no added sugars.
- Get moving. For weight loss it is recommended to get at least 60-90 minutes per day of physical activity.
- Choose a variety of vegetables and fruits each day.
- Try to make at least half of your grain food choices whole grains.
- Consume three cups per day of fat-free or low-fat milk or equivalent dairy products.
- Read the nutrition labels to make informed choices.
- Set short-term and long-term

goals. If your long-term goal is to lose 20 pounds, concentrate on the first three pounds as a short-term goal. By setting short-term realistic goals, you will be less likely to push yourself too hard or too long.

Overall, it is important to get the nutrients that we need by eating a variety of foods. After figuring out your calorie needs at mypyramid.gov, you can compare what you are currently eating to your personalized recommendations. Eating vegetables and fruits, the ultimate fast food, will not only help you feel fuller throughout the day, but they will also give you many needed vitamins to keep you healthy. Vegetables are naturally low in calories so they can really help satisfy that craving for something crunchy. Switching to 100 percent whole wheat bread and pasta and adding brown rice is an easy way to incorporate whole grains into your diet. Make smart choices from every food group including low-fat dairy products and lean protein sources. Use the United States Department of Agriculture's Dietary Guidelines for Americans and MyPyramid.gov to learn more steps to a healthier you.

Your body uses fat from foods for energy, to cushion organs and bones, and to make hormones and regulate blood pressure. Some fat is also necessary to maintain healthy skin, hair and nails, so you shouldn't cut all fat out of your diet. But consuming too much fat can lead to heart disease, obesity, diabetes and many other health problems. Look at the food label to determine how many calories from fat are in some of the foods you eat. Choose foods that have less than 30 percent of the daily value for total fat.

Apples and oranges and melons, oh my! The calories you get from fruits are considered nutrient dense; they have vitamins and minerals and the calories come from natural sugars. These are good choices. Empty calories are found in foods that have added sugars and no little nutrients. Sweetened drinks like soda, fruit punches and coffee concoctions can derail a weight loss plan. Choosing water or low fat milk instead of soda can cut out extra calories from added sugars. You can also choose 100 percent fruit juice but be sure to look at the serving size on the food label. If sugar is one of the first three ingredients for a food or beverage, it has a lot of added sugar.

People look at food labels for different reasons. Whatever the reason, many consumers would like to know how to use this information more effectively and easily. One of the most often overlooked pieces is the serving size. Look at the serving size for the package and decide how many servings you will

consume. If it says a serving is 1 cup and you are going to eat 2 cups, then you would double the calories, nutrients and the percent daily values. You can use the nutrition facts label not only to help limit those nutrients you want to cut back on, but also to increase those nutrients you need to consume in greater amounts. As a guide, 5 percent daily value or less is low for all nutrients, those you want to limit (e.g., fat, saturated fat, trans fat, cholesterol, and sodium), or for those that you want to consume in greater amounts (fiber, Vitamin A, Vitamin C, calcium, and iron). Twenty percent daily value or more is high for all nutrients.

Finding the right balance between food and physical activity is an important step toward good health. The recommended 60-90 minutes per day of physical activity might seem impossible, so take it one step at a time, literally. If you are starting at zero don't aim for 60 minutes right away. Start with 10 minutes a day and gradually add more. Taking some small activity breaks throughout the day will also add up quickly. Here are some of our favorites:

- Turn on some great music and dance around. The Macarena gets your heart pumping and you will be all set for the next wedding; add some of your favorite music and boogie down.
- Take a walk. Go for some alone time or take a friend or family member. It is a great time to catch up on the daily happenings and there is a built-in support system.
- When you do your housework, make it count. If you do at least 10 minutes of high energy cleaning it counts towards the 60 minutes.
- Aim for fitness by doing stretching, cardiovascular, and resistance exercises.

In addition to the above list, remember to eat slowly and always take small portions. If you wait 10 to 20 minutes before going back for seconds, you may find that you don't want seconds after all. Finally, no plan will work if you don't commit to it. Don't give up! Even if you have a few setbacks, the long-term result will be worth it if you persevere.

If you need help with meeting your weight loss goal you can visit www.mypyramid.gov and review the 2005 Dietary Guidelines. You may also be eligible for a free six-week program from Eat Smart New York (ESNY). 

High School gets new Steinway

Bethlehem High School students returned from their holiday break to a new concert piano, two years in the waiting.

In October 2005, a team from the Bethlehem music department traveled to New York City to select a new Steinway concert piano. They chose a 7-foot, model B piano, which District Music Supervisor Dave Norman said is "an excellent size for a high quality grand."

The piano was delivered on Thursday, Dec. 27.





Puppy love breeds questionable practices

Demand for purebred pets has caused a boom in mass breeding

Many people travel to Lancaster, Pa., for a chance to view the simple life. Observing the idyllic environment of the Amish, devoid of modern conveniences like electricity and telephones, is a magnet for curious tourists. People flock to Pennsylvania to buy Hershey chocolate, quilts and charming handmade wooden crafts like birdhouses.

But there's a growing awareness among animal rescue groups about the enormous number of unlicensed dog breeding facilities, commonly known as puppy mills, in Amish country. The exact number of puppy mills is not known, since offenders often fail to register their operations with the government, as required by law. According to reports by animal welfare activists, in some areas of the United States where Amish have settled, there is a startlingly high concentration of the mills.

The Pennsylvania Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement lists 243 kennels in Lancaster County, Pa. Activists estimate that 200,000 puppies are bred and sold each year in Lancaster County alone.

According to the Animal Welfare League, Pennsylvania now breeds more dogs than any state on the East Coast, and the concentration of puppy mills in Lancaster County is unparalleled anywhere in the country. In the heart of Amish and Mennonite country, thousands of puppies are crowded in locked buildings such as former barns, chicken coops or trailers that have been crudely converted into kennels.

There are also an alarmingly high number of puppy breeding operations in Ohio, Kansas, Missouri and Arkansas. Animal welfare activists now say unlicensed breeding is a multi-million dollar industry, supporting at least 5,000 puppy mills found across the country.

According to the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to animals, a puppy mill is a large-scale, substandard commercial breeding operation, usually housing dogs in overcrowded and often unsanitary conditions, without adequate veterinary care, food, water and socialization. The breeding stocks at puppy mills are bred as often as possible in order to increase profits. Females in particular are maltreated, being bred continuously after the age of six months. The dogs are bred primarily for profit, to offer puppies on a no-wait basis, and also to provide so-called exotic breeds that may not be easily available to

the public.

Google "dogs for sale" and you'll find thousands of Web sites. These sites offer dogs shipped directly to your home in one day, including popular toy and tiny breeds with high price tags. There are mini schnauzer puppies for \$850; American bulldog pups for \$1,250; Shih Tzu and Chihuahua pups for \$1,000. The photographs show the sweet, happy, healthy faces of pups, with no pictures of their living conditions.

Mass breeding also leaves its legacy on future generations of certain breeds. Dogs produced in puppy mills have contributed to deterioration in the inherent qualities in many breeds. In a puppy mill, no genetic testing is done to detect serious hereditary conditions such as hip dysplasia, dislocated kneecaps, liver and heart diseases, auto-immune disorders, and seizures. Inbreeding can lead to temperament problems, aggressive behavior or can magnify aggressive inherited personality traits. Most breeders do not properly vaccinate puppies for such fatal diseases as distemper.

Rescuing dogs one at a time

One of the national rescue organizations for dogs at puppy mills is Lucky Star Cavalier Rescue. Ruth Tietz, who works as a public relations and development director for a nonprofit senior citizen's care facility in Scotia, re-

cently adopted a dog through the organization.

"She came from an Amish puppy farm in Ohio, where she had lived with her sister in a cramped cage and been bred several times," said Tietz, who has another dog, Kiernan. "Voices and noises startled her terribly at first."

"Izzie" is a lovely, thriving dog, but still shows signs of timidity. Tietz brings Izzie and Kiernan to work. Izzie spends some of her time in her crate, where she can look at visitors but avoid close contact.

Tietz said she had never heard of the Amish puppy mills, but wants to spread the word to other animal lovers.

"People need to know more about the horrors of these puppy farms," said Tietz. "When they think of the Amish, with their religious lifestyle and no electricity or modern conveniences, they would never guess dogs could be nothing more than a product for them to raise and sell."

Mary Coyne is one of nine board members nationally running the nonprofit Lucky Star Cavalier Rescue who helped Tietz adopt Izzie.

"People are always surprised to hear about the Amish breeding dogs, because they are known to be peaceful," said Coyne. "They keep dogs in the barns and consider them livestock. The Amish don't have electricity or cars, but they have this breeding down to a science. They bring so much to tourism that I think the authorities just leave them alone."

Coyne said rescue organizations could not even begin to take on the goal of eradicating puppy mills, and instead, look at what steps they can take to change the life of any dog they can locate.

"There is such a lack of enforcement about these mills by authorities, and it takes years and years to shut them down, and in that time, thousands will die," said Coyne. "There's no medical care given, and often, the dogs are shot after they're too old to breed. The plight of dogs just isn't a hot topic high on the priority list."

Rescuers attend puppy auctions, where dogs are offered for sale with no questions asked. Coyne said she knew about one illegal breeder in Virginia who had more than 900 dogs removed from his property, and two weeks later, Coyne saw him at an auction buying more dogs to breed.

Lucky Star representatives bid on the oldest and the sickest dogs to bring them to a safe home for their remaining months or years.

"We save one dog at a time," said Coyne.

The organization has rescued about 800 dogs since its inception in 2000. Coyne urges people to

only buy dogs from people where they can see their living quarters, and avoid buying dogs from a store.

"Almost all the dogs in stores are coming from a mill," said Coyne. "We need to outlaw selling dogs and cats in a retail setting. They even advertise on the Web, and people will never know the real story of how that puppy was born."

Finding a reputable breeder

One of the most reliable ways to not support the illegal puppy breeding industry is to research a dog's lineage through accredited American Kennel Clubs. Locally, the Mohawk Valley Kennel Club offers a listing, by breed, of dogs and their breeding and medical history.

Nancy Scholz, president of the Mohawk Valley club, said by law, all clubs registered with the national organization must supply people with the means to contacting reputable breeders.

"All dogs have different potential health problems, and the registered breeders have had the dogs checked and given clearance for healthy hips, eyes and elbows, among other checkpoints," said Scholz. "Professional breeders use DNA testing to rule out things like eye afflictions that could cause blindness."

Scholz offered other advice for buying a dog:

- Trust your instincts. Don't buy a puppy if you have any reason for hesitation.

- Visit the breeder's place of business.

- Ask to see the puppy's mother. The father could be in another state, since dog sperm can be shipped, but the mother should be healthy and well cared for.

- Always ask for and receive the dog's papers listing its lineage. Many breeders actually know the ancestors of a breed going back several generations.

- Be sure you're ready to raise a puppy. Scholz, who breeds Labrador retrievers, said she has had calls from parents looking for a puppy for their child's first birthday. "I tell them, unless they're ready to raise two babies at once, wait for the child to be older before they take on a puppy," said Scholz.

Scholz strongly cautions people from believing the cute pups on Internet sites have been born in a healthy environment.

"Anyone can advertise on the Internet," said Scholz. "You should also beware of pet stores. There's a chance you might get a good dog, but then again, you could be financially contributing to the poor welfare of future generations."

more than 25 animals in a year, they are subject to annual inspections, according to state law.

Those inspections are few and far between. The complaints are not, said Kowalski. On paper, the state's pet dealer law looks complete, she said, but the fact is, it is not protecting the animals or consumers.

"I've seen things like dogs that do nothing but spin in circles. They spend their whole life in a cage. There was once a pug that stood in one place; it had never walked," said Shear of the animals that come from unscrupulous breeders.

Kowalski said her research has uncovered practices of breeders offering multiple litters at one time, and complaints in western New York for as many as 30 dogs kept in unsanitary conditions, and there turned out to be 77.

It happens everywhere, she said.

Recently, the Mohawk Hudson River Humane Society adopted out seven Chihuahuas, of the 28 rescued from unheated and filthy conditions at a Coeymans home.

According to Humane Society officials, in Yates County, those situations are common and on a larger scale.

"There are a lot (puppy mills) in Yates County," said Don Cass, executive director at the Humane Society of Yates County. "I think it's been worse since Pennsylvania cracked the whip. It's getting worse and worse and worse, and it's terrible because our hands are tied."

Yates County's population is approximately 24,600. The county spans roughly 338 square miles. Cass estimates there are more than 40 puppy mills in the area.

County officials have pleaded with the Amish and Mennonite communities to come to the table and discuss options. Every time, Cass said, they refuse, and by word-of-mouth, the message is that they have the right to farm their cash crop - dogs.

Without question, they know what they are doing is wrong, Cass said. They've taken to not placing classifieds in local papers anymore, and instead place them in outside papers, including many in the Capital District. Their numbers usually start with 607 and 315 area codes, and many will ask not to be called on Sundays. Also, many of the ads will not have the pet dealer license number required by law.

"That's the law," said Stacy Wolf, attorney and legislative director for the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

Wolf had a hand in the passage of the state Pet Dealer Licensing Law of 2000. She is currently working to patch holes in that law and other state laws that allow breeders and dealers to slip through the cracks.

"There are two components here. One is animal welfare, and the other is a consumer protection component," she said.

The issue of strengthening the state's law is currently being looked at on the state level by several legislators.

Researchers with State Assemblyman Jack McEneny, D-Albany, have been looking into what can be done.

"It's a matter of what makes something a puppy mill or whether it is just a place where dogs are bred," said Joe Galu, McEneny's researcher. "I think there are a lot of people that realize it's an ongoing problem."

A state Assembly task force is looking into Pennsylvania's laws and enforcement, Galu said, but no report on what to do has been

issued yet.

In the meantime, activists and the ASPCA will have to rely on existing animal cruelty laws to try to crack down on unscrupulous breeders.

But, animal cruelty is difficult to prove, said Shear. It's illegal for SPCA officers to enter private property, and for Ag and Markets inspectors, if the breeder isn't registered, then essentially they don't exist. Also, Ag and Market staff is sparse, especially in remote areas like Yates County, said Cass.

To crack down on puppy mills under the pet dealer laws, the state needs to prove that a breeder sold 25 dogs in a year to the public and that conditions in the kennels are poor. Almost all of the dogs sold, including Barney, are cash only, and the supposed AKC papers or records of breeding are non-existent, said Kowalski.

As for conditions, there are reports of ad-hoc Caesarean births and anesthesia for purposes of tail and ear cropping. You have to be a licensed veterinarian in New York to perform those, said Shear. As all this goes on, backyard breeders and smaller puppy mills are beginning to spring up nearer to the Capital District, said Kowalski. More dogs are coming from breeders in counties abutting Lake George.

As local shelters and regulatory agencies find themselves nearly powerless in New York to act, Pennsylvania is again looking to strengthen laws.

In Pennsylvania, Rendell is pushing for additional legislation to require larger cages and 20 minutes of daily exercise for the dogs. The legislation would also require breeders to keep records of exercise, sanitation and feeding.

To avoid oversight and cost, not the mention thousands in potential fines, more puppy mills are sure to cross the border, said Cass.

New supervisor for New Scotland

Newly elected Supervisor Thomas Dolin took his oath of office during Town of New Scotland swearing-in ceremonies held on Tuesday, Jan. 1, at town hall.

Deborah Baron and Richard Reilly also took their oaths to serve alongside Dolin as town board members for four-year terms. Diane Deschenes, who was re-elected town clerk and Deputy Town Clerk Carol Cootware were also sworn in, as was Darrell Duncan as highway superintendent. Town Justices Margaret Adkins and David Wukitsch also took the oath of office.

The town board at its organizational meeting made several reappointments, including Robert Parmenter to a five-year term on the zoning board of appeals.

Lorraine Tuzzolo was reappointed to a new seven-year term on the town planning board. Jo-Ann Davies will serve a one-year term as alternate member of the town planning board. L. Michael Mackey was reappointed town attorney and Louis Neri was reappointed to a one-year term as council to the zoning and planning board.

"It's an exciting time for me," said Dolin, whose other duties as supervisor include the day-to-day operations of the town, and serving as budget officer and a voting member of town board. Dolin served as town justice in New Scotland for 14 years before retiring and then deciding to run for supervisor.

Dolin replaces outgoing supervisor Ed Clark, who retired at the end of 2007.

rian homes along Kenwood Avenue and in Slingerlands," Leath said.

She has written essays, book reviews and articles regularly for many publications including *The New Yorker*, *The New York Times*, and *The Washington Post*. She has taught at Yale University, and is now on the faculty of the Bennington College MFA Program and The New School.

Cheever will be reading from her latest book, "American Bloomsbury," a nonfiction work that delves into the personalities and relationships of the great American thinkers and writers living in and around Concord, Mass., in the 19th century — among them Thoreau, Emerson, Hawthorne, Margaret Fuller, and the Alcotts.

Cheever has been nominated for the National Book Critics Circle Award and has won a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Winship Medal, and an Associated Press Award. She is a director of the Yaddo Corporation and a member of the Author's Guild Council.

Donald Westlake, a master of the comic mystery, also a Grand Master of the Mystery Writers of America, and a three-time Edgar winner will appear Sunday, April 6, at 2 p.m. and will read from his latest book, "What's So Funny."

Westlake, who grew up in Albany was an Academy Award nominee for his screenplay "The Grifters," which starred John Cusack and Angelica Huston. Westlake also wrote screenplays for "Cops and Robbers" and "The Stepfather." Westlake's numerous honors also include the 2002 Ian McLellan Hunter Award for Lifetime Achievement from the Writers Guild of America and the 2004 Private Eye Writers of America Award for Lifetime Achievement.





In the glitzy world of Hollywood, it is often easy to forget that behind the performers is a whole world of creative minds that write, arrange, direct and conduct all the parts to make an even greater final product. Enter Rogers and Hart. Richard Rogers and Lorenz Hart formed a songwriting partnership that lasted for a quarter of century during Hollywood's Golden Age.

Known for penning such memorable songs as "My Funny Valentine" and "Blue Moon," the songwriters forged a place in the history of entertainment.

Beginning Friday, Jan. 11, the Schenectady Light Opera Company will bring those songs to life once again with their performance of "Beguiled Again: The Songs of Rogers and Hart."

"It's not considered a musical," said director Barry Corlew, "It's being looked at as a stage review covering the 24 years of their partnership together."

Though not arranged chronologically, the nearly 50 songs in the show will span the songwriting duo's entire career.

"There are some lesser-known pieces in there. Three or four pieces I had no idea they wrote," said Corlew.

The performance is done in what Coordinator of Publicity Dave Dixon calls a "cabaret style."

"People will be at small, intimate tables of six to eight," he said.

In fact, the Schenectady Light Opera's performance of "Beguiled Again" is the first time that a community theater has taken on the challenge of this show. It is a new addition to company's regular season. "We usually don't do a production in January. We close in November or December and then do a show in March," notes Dixon. With only seven performers, the show offers a new twist on what theater-goers might expect. The review is arranged in nine small vignettes. "As opposed to having people sing a song, we've staged it in

vignettes to fit what's going on - the songs are grouped accordingly," said Corlew.

"The music is staged in kind of a frantic way so people could understand how things were just going from one film to the next one in Hollywood," he adds.

Take the song "Blue Moon," which was written and rewritten several times. The final song was placed in a film, but "Beguiled Again" reflects the hectic process that music was written in, introducing the song in segments.

"The music is the big draw here. There are parts in this thing that have six-part harmo-

ny," adds Corlew, "I was so proud of this cast. I was going to stage a quartet singing four different songs at the same time, and in an hour they had it."





10-team field that also included three Suburban Council schools - Ballston Spa, Bethlehem and Saratoga Springs.

It should be noted that Ballston Spa looms as Shen's closest challenger in the class A field. The Scotties have several strong wrestlers including middleweights Alex Steciuk, Eric Simmons, Cameron Staulters and David Staulters. All of them are capable of placing in the top four of their weight classes at

Sectionals along with lightweights Spencer Thomas, Tony Barnes and Cody Staulters, as well as heavyweights Kevin Taormina and Kris Ohnsman. That should be enough to keep Ballston Spa in Shen's radar.

Guilderland also appears to be in line for a top three finish at Sectionals. 



BC plays to its strengths

Eagles drain 14 three-pointers in victory

The Bethlehem boys basketball team's perimeter shooters proved to be too much for Colonie last Friday night in a pivotal Suburban Council showdown at Colonie High School.

The Eagles had the hot hand from beyond the arc, hitting 14 three-pointers on their way to a 76-67 win.

"This is a great win for us," said Bethlehem coach A.G. Irons. "We were hot tonight. We hit a lot of threes. It's something we practice a lot and we run. It's our game."

"We played pretty much how we have been playing," said Colonie coach Doug Kilmer. "There's times when we look very good on the floor, and then we lose a little focus and effort."

The Garnet Raiders (4-2 league, 7-3 overall) took an early 6-2 lead after converting on a couple of Bethlehem turnovers. Colonie still had a 9-8 advantage with 3:45 left in the first quarter, but wouldn't hold the lead again until late in the third quarter.

Back-to-back three-pointers by Connor Muncil (12 points) and Gleason Judd (17 points) helped Bethlehem (4-2, 7-3) build a 17-16 lead after the first quarter. The Eagles then extended their lead to 46-33 at halftime after scoring 29 points in the second quarter behind more perimeter shots from Muncil, Judd and Joe Kane (17 points).

"We've got some guys that can shoot, and when they all get hot at the same time, it's fun to watch," Irons said.

"Going into the game, we wanted to take their three pointers away, and they only had 10 at halftime. So, we did a great job with that," Kilmer said.

BH-BL - arguably the best Suburban Council team not named Shenendehowa - claimed its tournament title this season, beating Oneonta by 38 points over its nearest competitor, Bainbridge-Guilford-Afton. The Spartans had five individual champions, including heavyweight McGrew, who claimed his

varsity title by beating Oneonta's Victor Mercurio 6-3 in the 285-pound finals. Kyle Vuillaume (135), Paul Martin (145), Ethan Wilson (152) and Spencer Miller (215) also won their weight classes.

BH-BL has been one of the top tournament teams in Section II this season, having won the Morsen Tournament outside of its own Lee Van Slyke Memorial Tournament. The Spartans' success has been their depth. They have placed eight place finishers at the tournament with a collection

of talented grapplers including Vuillaume, Martin, Wilson, McGrew, Brandon McKeown, Evan Burchhardt and Max Miller.

BH-BL's path to the Section II, class B title would normally be clear with so much talent, but Foothills Council power Queensbury looms as a potential road block. Queensbury sent eight wrestlers into the Saratoga Tournament finals, with half of them winning their weight classes. Overall, the Spartans had 12 place finishers, more than any other school in the
