State passes new cigarette tax to discourage habit and bring in revenue

Love it or hate it, now that the smoke has cleared on the state budget a new cigarette tax is here to stay.

With a state deficit looming at around \$5 billion, the New York State Legislature passed a budget nine days late using fees and some specific tax increases to help close the gap. One of those tax increases included in the \$128.7 billion spending plan is a \$1.25-per-pack increase on cigarettes.

Earlier in budget talks it was proposed as a \$1.50-per-pack increase.

Overall, state spending will increase 4.9 percent, according to the governor's office, but the estimated revenue from

the cigarette tax increase varies greatly from \$200 million all the way up to nearly \$500 million a year.

However, the way the tax is being perceived depends on whom you ask.

Long before the U.S. Surgeon General issued the first health warning against cigarette smoking in 1970, the adverse health affects have been well-known and have since been scientifically linked to a variety of cancers and health complications involving the heart, lungs, brain, throat and mouth.

Health organizations like the American Heart and Lung Associations and the American Cancer Society have lobbied hard for the increase, citing the public health concerns of smoking and drawing a correlation between higher

Memorial race slated for weekend

CNN Humvee to make appearance at Capt. Timothy J. Moshier 5K run

The race is on.

The Capt. Timothy J. Moshier Memorial 5K Run/Walk is gearing up with festivities scheduled to begin on Friday, April 25, and races for kids and adults to be held the next day on Saturday, April 26. And the runners themselves will be joined by the former CNN Warrior One Humvee.

Warrior One was the Humvee used by the international cable news outlet to report on the war in Iraq, and it will take part in both days of the memorial run events. The nationally recognized Humvee will lead more than 600 expected runners at the start of the race.

If the weather is clear, Warrior One is expected to be the pace car for the run/walk.

Moshier died a little more than two years ago while serving in Iraq when his Apache helicopter was shot down by enemy fire. He was an Army captain and a Bethlehem High School graduate.

His widow, Katie Moshier, has

Glenmont restaurateur goes to trial

Owner faces jail time for violating zoning code with banner

Zoning violators in Bethlehem may want to take notice: Code infractions may end up costing you hundreds of dollars or more, or even worse — land you in jail.

Alteri's restaurant owner Harvey Quinn said he has been singled out along busy Route 9W in Glenmont for having a lunch

buffet banner outside of his business. He is now scheduled for a jury trial on May 14 and may be facing up to a year-and-a-half in jail for his violation of the town's zoning code.

The town said Quinn was given several opportunities to clear up the matter and that he was the one who requested the jury trial. Officials said banners are illegal in town without a variance, and Quinn was cited for being in violation, adding that he was never arrested and is not being targeted.

Bethlehem police confirm that Quinn was not arrested and that he was cited for violating town

code by Bethlehem chief building inspector Gil Boucher.

Quinn, however, said he is convinced Boucher is unfairly attacking him and pointed to numerous other illegal banners throughout town that go unchecked. He claims local and independent businesses are put to a different standard than the national chains popping up along 9W.

"I want to represent myself, but [town officials] don't want that. ... They sent me to a public defender," Quinn said. "The public defender said he thought it was one of the top five stupidest cases he's ever heard of. ... He said he only handles criminal

matters."

However, according to the town attorney, James Potter, who cited section 128 of the town code, violations can carry a sentence involving jail time for repeat offenses. Quinn is being cited for zoning offenses for every day he kept the banner up, and subsequent offenses can carry increasingly stiffer penalties.

The issue started in early 2007, according to Quinn, after Chili's Restaurant moved into the area and Quinn's usual lunch crowd began to dissipate. He then decided to put up two banners advertising a lunch buffet spe-

Police make aggravated DWI arrest

Paul R. Benson, 27, of East Amherst, was arrested Monday, April 14, for aggravated DWI, operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of 0.18 percent or greater; DWI; and operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of 0.08 percent or greater — all misdemeanors.

Bethlehem police responded to a call about an intoxicated driver on Route 9W in Glenmont, who left Applebee's Restaurant in Towne Center Plaza and returned a short time later, according to the police report.

When police arrived, they discovered Benson parked in the northern side of the Applebee's

lot with the engine running and his keys in the ignition while he was sitting in the driver's seat of the vehicle, according to the arrest report.

Police said the complainant from Applebee's reported that Benson came into the restaurant and ordered a beer, at which time he "became loud yelling obscenities," and he was told to leave by the complainant.

According to the report, Benson "then displayed his middle finger" while leaving the restaurant and got in his car and drove north on Route 9W before driving back to the parking lot.

When interviewing Benson,

police said he smelled of alcohol and displayed signs of intoxication, and, when asked if he had been drinking, Benson allegedly told police, "I had a lot."

Benson was then given a field-sobriety test, which he failed, and he was taken into custody and arrested for DWI, according to police.

While being processed, Benson refused to sign any paperwork during his booking, and, when a family member called police about the incident, the report states, they were informed of the situation and Capitaland Taxi was contacted to transport Benson home.

Other arrests

• James M. Casey, 44, of Albany, was arrested by Bethlehem police on Thursday, April 3, for felony grand larceny and two misdemeanor counts of issuing a bad check and aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle.

Police said Casey was pulled over on Vaughn Drive and Schoolhouse Road on signed complaints against him, and, during a check of his driving record, police discovered that his driver's license had expired and was revoked due to insurance lapses.

Casey was taken into custody

and processed before being arraigned in front of Bethlehem Town Justice Paul Dwyer. He is scheduled to reappear in town court on May 6, according to the arrest report.

• David P. Wood, 19, was arrested on March 31 for DWI, a misdemeanor, and two infraction counts of driving while ability impaired and driving on the shoulder of a roadway.

Police said they saw Wood during a routine patrol, driving south on Route 9W near the Towne Center Plaza, and pulled him over near Bender Lane after he drove onto the shoulder of the roadway.

When interviewing Wood, police said they smelled alcohol and observed him display signs of intoxication, according to the arrest report. Wood told police that "he had three Heineken beers at a friend's house in Delmar approximately one hour before the motor vehicle stop," the report states.

After failing several field-sobriety tests and testing positive for alcohol, Wood was transported to the police station for processing where he consented to a chemical test, according to police. His vehicle was towed and he was given a "courtesy transport home" inside of a police vehicle, the report states.






Cash key in Congressional race

Dems crowd race, primaries expected in both parties

It is said that money isn't everything, but in the 21st Congressional race to replace outgoing Democratic Representative Michael McNulty, candidates say it is certainly necessary to compete.

The first quarter financial statement has been released for the eight Democrats and two Republicans competing to represent the counties of Albany, Schenectady, Schoharie, Montgomery, and parts of Saratoga, Rensselaer, and Fulton counties in U.S. Congress.

With 10 candidates vying for a seat traditionally held by Democrats, whose enrollments outnumber Republicans nearly 3-to-1, the congressional contenders are doing everything they can to stand out from the pack.

That includes getting as much money as possible.

The financial filings for the race were made public Tuesday, April 15, and detail the fundraising and expenditures of candidates up to Tuesday, April 1.

Here are the stats:
Democrat Tracey Brooks reports a total of \$178,373 raised. She's spent \$24,875 leaving her \$153,498 in cash on hand. Brooks has reported no personal loans or gifts to her campaign.

Democrat Phil Steck reports a total of \$205,807 raised. He's spent \$51,942 leaving him \$153,864 in cash on hand, \$50,000 of which comes as a loan from Steck.

Republican Jim Buhrmaster reports a total of \$107,600 raised. The disclosure statement said Buhrmaster has only spent \$492 leaving him with \$107,108 in cash on hand. But, the candidate said the report is misleading because he announced his candidacy on Wednesday, March 19, leaving him fewer than two weeks to make expenditures. Buhrmaster also provided a \$100,000 loan to his campaign.

Democrat Gary Mittleman reports a total of \$104,352 raised. He's also loaned his own campaign \$100,000. Mittleman has spent \$52,743, leaving \$51,608 in cash on hand.

Democrat Darius Shahinfar reports a total of \$83,212 raised. He's spent \$354 leaving him with \$83,108 in cash on hand, \$51,742 of which comes as a loan from Shahinfar.

Democrat Lester Freeman did

not file with the Federal Election Commission because he failed to raise \$5,000. The FEC does not require a disclosure in a Congressional race if a candidate has not raised a minimum of \$5,000.

Democratic candidates John Aretakis, Craig Burrridge and Arthur Welsch haven't started fundraising yet. Republican candidate Steven Vasquez said he began raising funds after Tuesday, April 1, and was not required to file a disclosure.

The candidates

John Aretakis, D-North Greenbush

Aretakis, 47, an attorney and longtime advocate for people who claim Catholic priests molested them, said he thinks his name recognition will play to his advantage in the primary.

"I've been in hundreds of newspapers and on television for my work fighting the sex abuse of children," said Aretakis. "It's thrust my name into the media."

Aretakis said that with eight candidates now announced, the winning Dem may only need 25 percent of the vote to win the primary.

Aretakis, who announced his candidacy late last month said he is beginning a major fundraising effort. He said his family would loan his campaign approximately \$200,000.

According to Aretakis, he's working toward launching a Web site and making campaign T-shirts.

While sexual abuse will be the central issue in his campaign, Aretakis said he's not a one-issue candidate.

"I have an agenda and a platform on every issue A to Z," said Aretakis.

He said he has a plan to save Social Security for baby boomers and is strongly against the war in Iraq.

Aretakis, who is a graduate of Georgetown Law School, said he also thinks that his experiences living in Washington, D.C., could play to his favor.

"I know that city," he said.

Tracey Brooks, D-Coeymans

Brooks, 37, an attorney who worked as regional director for Sen. Hillary Clinton, campaigned in all seven counties of the district in seven days a week after she announced her candidacy in February.

Her top priorities are the economy, the war, health care, and the cost of living.

"The economy is getting scary. It's getting to the point where people are losing their homes, but it's not just that," Brooks said. "Where people may have adjusted at the pump and home heating costs, they weren't expecting it to hit them in the pocketbook at the grocery store."

She is close to the top in fundraising thus far, and said she knows how important the

Internet is to her campaign. More than 200 donors, about half of all her 450 donations, have made contributions online, she said.

"For us it's been wonderful that we have hundreds of online volunteers," said Brooks. "It has given us a wonderful way to connect with busy people at all times of the day when they are available and engage more voters in the process."

She is calling for an end to the war in Iraq and wants to rein in federal spending.

"The Bush administration has been absolutely horrific. ... We are fighting a war on credit and the futures of our kids," she said. "There has been no fiscal discipline, and that has to change."

Jim Buhrmaster, R-Scotia

Buhrmaster, 62, head of Buhrmaster Energy Group and a Schenectady County legislator, said that ever since he announced his candidacy in mid-March, he's been juggling a busy evening schedule.

"I've visited five of the seven counties in the district, and I've appeared before many parties including Independence Party members, Conservatives and Republicans," said Buhrmaster. "Things are really taking off."

Although Buhrmaster has not spent much of his campaign fund to date, he said an update to his Web site is in the works.

Buhrmaster, who has a history of breaking party rank with his fellow Republican legislators, has said he will vote in the interest of his constituents, regardless of party affiliation.

Buhrmaster primarily views himself as a businessman who wants to put an end to a "dysfunctional" federal government.

"I'm not a career politician," said Buhrmaster, who said he will continue to balance politics with business acumen.

Craig Burrridge, D-Waterford

Burrridge, 52, the executive director of the Pharmacist's Society for New York State, and the 21st District's newest candidate, said he's a fundraising veteran who hopes his knowledge of the health-care industry will lead to reform.

Burrridge announced his candidacy on Friday, April 18.

"I delayed my announcement because I was testifying on the budget for the Pharmacist's Society," said Burrridge. "Waiting was the ethical thing to do."

Burrridge said he plans to begin fundraising immediately. A lifelong resident of the district who currently lives in Waterford, Burrridge also said he'll knock on doors to get the word out on his campaigning and to find out what his neighbors think are key issues.

Burrridge cites health-care reform and the housing crisis as two of his platform issues.

Delmar house fire ruled accidental

Plastic can of cigarette butts may be culprit

Area fire companies contained a house fire in Delmar on Wednesday, April 16.

Bethlehem police have ruled that the fire at the 34 Darnley Green home near the Route 32 bypass was unintentional.

"Right now it's not ruled suspicious," said Lt. Thomas Heffernan of the Bethlehem Police Department, who added that no one was hurt.

Delmar Fire Chief Gregg Gould said the fire was contained in about 45 minutes, but that because of a brush fire in Slingerlands during the same time, teams of firefighters were spread thin throughout the town.

Gould said it appeared the fire began on the back porch and that there was extensive damage to the back of the house as well as the roof and attic.

"They disposed of cigarettes in a plastic Folgers coffee can," Gould said. "There was a grill with a propane tank next to it, the tank was on and the gas lines burned."

Gould said the tank did not explode, but the propane accelerated the fire, which he believed might have been caused by the cigarette can. The cause is still under investigation.

Elsmere, Delmar, Slingerlands and North Bethlehem fire departments all responded, as did the Delmar Rescue Squad and a Westmere FAST team, which is a firefighter assistance and search team.

Gould said that in addition to the ladder truck from Westmere's team, area fire crews had four engine trucks and a ladder truck on the scene.

The house is listed as belonging to Betty A. and Michael Harrison. The American Red Cross was not contacted as area family and friends are said to be taking care of the family's needs, according to Gould.

Local soldier hurt in Iraq

Army Spc. Jeffery R. Moody, of the 101st Airborne Infantry, was wounded after an improvised explosive device hit the Humvee he was riding in southwest of Baghdad, but he has recovered with minor injuries.

A 2005 Bethlehem High School graduate, Moody has been serving his first active tour with the 101st since October 2007, according to his father, James Moody, an Army veteran.

"We consider ourselves very lucky," Moody said. "He was on a mission and was hit by an IED, which destroyed the vehicle they were driving."

The attack occurred on April 12, when the vehicle that Moody and two other soldiers were in was hit. Moody received "fairly minor abrasions," according to his father, as well as some bruises and a possible concussion. He was watched overnight and returned to duty west of Baghdad after recovering. The two other soldiers also suffered only minor injuries.

The Department of Army listed Moody's injury as head trauma.

"They're keeping an eye on him because of all the shockwaves

and brain injuries that occur," Moody said. "A lot of people have been calling and asking about him. Somehow it got out that he was in serious condition, ... but we wanted to let people know that's not true."

Moody said that people have been thinking of his son, and he and his wife, Kay, both appreciate the thoughts and care that everyone has expressed.

Training in Georgia after joining the Army, Jeffery Moody went to infantry school in Kentucky. He is expected to finish his tour of duty in January.

Moody has a wife, JoBeth, who lives in Kentucky, where she just returned after living with James and Kay Moody. She has returned to "set up house," said James Moody. The couple has been married for just over a year, with their anniversary on April 7, less than a week before the attack occurred.

Moody said he is relieved that his son's injuries were minor, but he still worries about him.

"I have a beard and every gray hair in it I attribute to him," he joked.

Fatherhood means lying through your teeth

In the interest of full disclosure, I should point out that I am not a ninja.

I am not a super-powered robot, a deep-sea adventurer or a starship commander.

I say this to you because, well, my son may be under the impression that I am all of these things and more.

I lie to my kids. I stretch, bend and in other ways manipulate the truth on a regular basis when it comes to my children. I do it very well (mostly because they are very young), and I do it for their own good.

Like it or not, we lie to our kids to keep them safe, whether it's a little white lie to keep them from some sort of trouble, or a whopper to stave off an explanation of something children may not yet fully comprehend.

Parents do it more than they think, and I'm sure there are a few of you out there that are outraged. I would even consider calling all parents liars. But tell me if this sounds familiar: My 5-year-old, Kevin, has been very concerned with the concept of dying lately, and he asked me if he was ever going to die.

"Not for a long time, bubba, and it's nothing to worry about now," I told him.

If you think about it though, that's more of a hope than any statement of fact. If I was truthful with him, I would have said something to the effect of, "You definitely are, Kevin. When I don't know. You may be hit by a meteor tomorrow, so I'd stay up late and eat ice

cream if I were you." In this case, the lie helped both of us.

We use many euphemisms when we lie to our kids — we don't so much lie to them as much as we protect them from a hurtful truth or a consequence they may be moving toward if it weren't for the lie — but it's deception through and through, no matter what our intentions are.

And if you're still getting all high-and-mighty on me, ask yourselves how many times you've used the phrase, "If you don't behave, Santa won't bring you anything." Sometimes you tell your kids the truth, and it doesn't seem to have the same effect that a well-placed lie would have.

The other day Kevin was amusing his 7-month-old brother by dancing around like a fool and spinning a bungee cord around over his head. Dancing is always welcome in the DeVoe house — I've been known to do it myself when no one is looking — but twirling around some big rubber band, with hooks at either end of it, dangerously close to an infant is somewhat frowned upon.

"Kevin, you've got to stop that," I said.

"But, Dad, he likes it."

"He won't like it if you smack him with the end of

that thing, so stop it." "I'll back up so it won't hit him," my son said, proud that he found a solution that satisfied us both. Or so he thought.

"Kevin, it's not just your brother I'm worried about. What if that hook hits you? It could take your eye out," I said.

"Oh my god. Really?" he said. This was not the "Oh my god. Really?" that I wanted to hear. I wanted to hear concern, and perhaps a little fright, in his voice. What I got was way too cheery and excited.

"Kevin, it's nothing to be excited about. You could lose an eye swinging that thing around, and then you'd have to wear an eye patch."

This, as far as I know, was only part lie. I can't say I'm as well-versed in optical surgery or prosthesis as I should be. For all I know, they can dust off a perfectly good, albeit misplaced, eye and pop the thing right back in. I think he sensed that I was on shaky ground, so I added, "You'd have to walk around daycare wearing a patch and everyone who has two eyes would make fun of you."

He looked at me for a moment.

"No they wouldn't," he said.

"Why not?"

"Because if I had an eye patch, then I'd be a pirate," he said, and started to dance again.

"I can't fault your logic," I said, "but I still want you to stop twirling that bungee cord around."

Over the weekend, I asked Kevin if he'd like to camp out

in the backyard now that the weather is getting warmer. Though he gets very excited about setting up "camp" in our living room, he was a little hesitant to move the production into the great outdoors of our fenced-in lot.

"It's going to be dark," he said, "and Bigfoot will come and get us."

Now, I could have told the truth here and tried to convince my son that Bigfoot doesn't exist and therefore could not come and get us, but once a little boy has an irrational fear lodged in his brain, only an irrational solution is going to suffice.

I looked around and then leaned in close to his face, as if I were sharing a secret.

"Bigfoot can't hurt us, Kevin, because I have Dad Power," I confided.

"What's that?" he asked. "You're not that strong," he added for good measure.

"Dad Power," I said, "is a power that kicks in when a Bigfoot, a dragon or any other mythical creature tries to mess with any part of a dad's family."






Scouting Eagle

Lopsided local politics

Human beings fear change. We hate to see colossal swings in the economy; we're bombarded with doomsday accounts of changes in the environment; and most of us will drive a mile out of the way to drink the coffee we're used to or see a familiar cashier.

Politically, however, we're strange animals. Individually, most voters are party-loyal, although Democrats are more likely than Republicans to vote outside of their party for a candidate they favor.

As a group, however, as has been evidenced in some local elections, voters are a reactionary bunch. When one party controls a municipality for some time, and they fall out of favor with the electorate, some voters seem to swing to the other side of the aisle rather than take in all candidates on their merits.

Some of this can be accounted for by the normal number of swing voters in an election, some of it to the stigma that attaches itself to the out-of-favor political party. But some of it has to be the desire by the voters to distance themselves as much as possible from a failing system and embrace what they think will be a successful one.

That is, until the next round of elections.

What we're left with is usually a town or city government that is heavily lopsided in favor of one party, if not comprised solely of that party.

The Town of Colonie is a wonderful place to work, live and raise a family, and for years, it was a Republican stronghold.

This past November, as town employees were accused of providing services to a private sportsman's club, and a then-reported \$8.5 million deficit, a Democrat won office in the town for the first time in decades.

While no one has (yet) levied any charges of malfeasance, one has to wonder if decades of single-party rule didn't lead to a lax atmosphere surrounding town business and official conduct. It most certainly led to a lack of oversight at the very least, or a willing disregard for the consequences at the very worst.

In the Town of Bethlehem, a town board member, one of two members of the Independence Party on a Democratic-controlled board, contested the board's policy of job posting for town committees, saying that too many Democratic Committee members were being appointed to town positions in the stead of other equally qualified applicants.

"Sour grapes," some would say. "To the victor go the spoils."

The only problem with that, however, is that when single-party rule clouds the workings of a municipality, the people are not victorious and the politicians become spoiled.

Smokers cough up more taxes

I have a confession to make: I smoke.

Now, before you throw down the paper and storm *The Spotlight* office with pitchforks and torches, hear me out: This isn't a pitch to glorify a bad habit.

I understand the logic in play here. I just don't agree with it. If we raise the taxes on cigarettes, people won't buy them, right? Now, this may happen to some degree, but for the majority of people, I think they will simply cut back on other things and continue smoking.

I don't expect taxing smokers will stop smoking any more than taxing gamblers, drinkers, strip-club patrons or fast-food eaters will stop those vices. However, I will bet that the black market for cigarettes will skyrocket, as well as Internet sales and over-the-border sales for communities on the outer fringes of our great state.

Now, instead of coming back from vacation with a trunkload of fireworks, Uncle Vinny just may have a cigarette carton crammed into every crevice of his car. Not to mention the out-of-state students who will be selling cigarettes en masse on SUNY campuses when they return from each semester break.

I want to be clear that I don't condone smoking whatsoever, but I also don't condemn it.

Adults legislating what other adults do with their free time and money just doesn't sound right to me. Especially coming from New York politicians who are doing things way worse with their free time and money than smoking a legal product. Last I heard prostitution was still illegal here, and although adultery isn't, I bet a spouse would rather catch you sneaking a late-night smoke than, well, you get the point.

Point of View

I'll make a deal with the lawmakers: If you stop legislating morality. I'll stop reading tabloid accounts of your sex lives while I'm on my cigarette break. Sound fair?

The state balancing its budget on sin taxes is terrible fiscal policy, especially considering we are betting on making money from something we're discouraging.

Quite simply, it's another tax on the poor and working poor who are by and far the largest consumers of so-called "sin products," and we already pay too many taxes.

I don't like the practice of target taxing on any level, whether it's taxing the rich (although they should be taxed proportionally like any other group and stop getting tax breaks), or a sin tax.

I can't help but wonder, as the tax takes effect and New Yorkers begin to shell out another \$1.25 for a pack of cigarettes, will they really quit? Or will they simply cut back their spending on things like that dollar or two we drop in a Salvation Army red kettle or dinner at the local bistro?

If you want to talk civic duty and taxpayer money, that's a whole other issue.

In fact, I have a little proposition of my own for state lawmakers as they celebrate another late budget.

If we want to balance our state's budget, which is already one of the most taxed in the union, instead of balancing it off the so-called sinners of the state, why don't we make cuts where there's inefficiency? Maybe the salaries of the lawmakers who can't pass a budget on time or balance it effectively.

If our representatives really care about their constituents as they say and want the best for the state during these times of "economic crisis," why not take a pay cut? In the private sector, it is not uncommon for companies to ask for voluntary pay cuts before people are forced into a layoff.

Now, I'm not suggesting that we start laying off legislators. Our country is founded on the principles of representation and free democracy, and nothing can be better than more representation. But, realistically, we cannot afford such representation at the expense of the taxpayer, especially at current "living wages" that legislators get.

The current poverty level for a family of four is roughly \$17,000 a year. Would legislators be willing to take a symbolic \$17,000-a-year pay cut? Would they be willing to be penalized \$17,000 each year that they fail to do their jobs and pass a comprehensive on time budget?

New York legislators get \$79,500 a year, which doesn't include any committees or other titles they may hold that bumps up the pay. This is well above the poverty level for part-time work,

even though legislators will tell you it's a full-time job, which it is (I call them all year long), but they still have plenty of time to seek other revenue sources.

With 150 assembly members and 62 senators, a \$17,000 cut would be an annual savings of \$3.6 million dollars alone.

And that would be a modest cut if you looked at the pay rate for state legislators nationwide. Although we are not the highest at nearly \$80,000 a year and a per diem (California lawmakers make \$113,098 plus per diem), we are certainly not the lowest (Alabama lawmakers get \$10 a day plus a healthy per diem, and New Mexico legislators don't get paid anything, but get a nice per diem).

As far as the smoking itself, I understand the health-care community's concern and commend the American Heart Association and the American Cancer Society's vigilant and unwavering work on educating the public and helping those who want to kick the habit.

However, just as the government has no right to pry in our personal lives or legislate what goes on in our bedrooms, it shouldn't place financial barriers on social behavior. Like all things in life, moderation is key and there are those of us out there who practice moderation in our vices and should be able to live our lives as we see fit.

The argument about adverse health effects is a valid one and known all too well. But when do we as a society stop this slippery slope of legislating health? Will legislators start taxing any and every risky or potentially unhealthy behavior? Where does it end?

As health organizations know, you can't force someone to lead a healthy lifestyle, one only has to look at the obesity "epidemic." Leave that work to Alcoholics Anonymous, smoking cessation programs and the local gyms for people who want to better themselves and not be legislated or taxed into it.

Smokers have already been moved outside and are increasingly treated like second-class citizens (I was pointed to a smoking designated area behind a Dumpster this week), but now we are going to try to close a budget gap caused by poor fiscal management and out of control pork barrel spending by passing the buck to them.

Although I may not have as much money to take my vacation in Tahiti this year as a result of this tax, I betcha I will be coming back from Vermont or Canada, or wherever one week's paycheck will get me, with cigarettes.

In short, legislators, I ask you this: Have you hugged a smoker today? Because I don't think they will be hugging you anytime soon.

Remember that when the smoke clears come Election Day.

Time to correct myth BOU a benefit to Bethlehem

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

The town of Bethlehem should correct the myth that in 1609 Henry Hudson sailed the Half Moon up the Hudson River to the northern limit of the city of Albany. The myth caused former Town of Bethlehem Historian Raymond Houghton to declare in the Dec. 20, 2006, *Spotlight* that "Henry Hudson did land north of Albany in Mechanicville, and did meet American Indians there trading beads and other items."

Historians agree that Henry Hudson ordered his First Mate Robert Juet to take soundings upriver. On the morning of Sept. 22, 1609, Juet and four other crew members left in a rowboat and returned that night. "They found our ship could go no further, for they had been up 24 to 27 miles in which there was only seven feet of water and unconstant soundings," Juet reported. The draft of the Half Moon was 8.5 feet. On Sept. 23, 1609, Henry Hudson started his return trip to Europe.

The first falls encountered while traveling north on the natural Hudson River was at Troy where the Federal Dam and Lock are today. If one measures 24 miles south, that places the maximum northerly limit of the Half Moon at New Baltimore, 14 miles south of Albany.

Benjamin Wright, the chief construction engineer for the Erie

Canal, thought that Juet would have turned around in the Town of Bethlehem after the river widened and became filled with numerous shoals. In 1609, there were no dykes to maintain a straight narrow channel; the river at Selkirk-Castleton was three times as wide as it is today. This places the Half Moon at what is now the city of Hudson, 29 miles south of Albany.

The monument in the Henry Hudson Park and publications by the Town of Bethlehem support the myth that the Half Moon reached the northern limit of the city of Albany and that for some unknown reason Robert Juet's crew carried a rowboat over four falls to reach Mechanicville and failed to report that fact to their Master, Henry Hudson. The town's monument and publications should be changed to give the correct historical facts, not a myth.

The town of Bethlehem should also stop referring to trading in "beads" because it is derogatory to all Native Americans. Wampum, a string of sea shells, was the official currency of Native Americans. The number of shells and the color of each shell specified the value of the string of shells. The Dutch, English, French and Swedish settlers all accepted the wampum as the official form of currency when trading with Native Americans.



Police Taser parole fugitive during pursuit

Bethlehem police arrested a parole fugitive from Schenectady after he was spotted walking the wrong way up Route 9W in Glenmont. During questioning, he fled into the woods and was Tasered before being taken into custody.

William D. Terry, 32, of Schenectady, was arrested Tuesday, April 15, on a felony parole warrant. He was also charged with false impersonation, resisting arrest, and criminal trespassing — all misdemeanors, as well as failing to walk facing traffic, an infraction.

Police said they spotted Terry, while on routine patrol, walking southbound on Route 9W in Glenmont with his back facing oncoming traffic, and, when the patrol car turned around, Terry "abruptly changed direction and crossed four lanes of traffic and again began walking south."

When the patrol car turned around once again, Terry "again changed direction and began to walk across the lawn of" a towing company, according to the arrest report. Police said they then followed Terry and stopped him

in the driveway of the towing company and requested to see his identification, at which point, Terry stated he didn't have any and identified himself as "Teron Davis."

When asked why he was going to the tow shop, Terry said that his girlfriend's car "had been towed there last night with his ID in it," and then Terry and police officers went inside and requested information about a Honda from the towing personnel, according to the report. A representative of the towing company denied picking up a Honda the night before, but said the company had towed a similar car that morning.

Terry was taken to the Honda and searched it but was unable to locate his ID, according to police, and when police contacted the owner of the vehicle, she denied knowing a Teron Davis.

Terry then allegedly told police he received an ID card from the Glenville Police Department, but they too denied knowing the name given by Terry, which also failed to match any searches on the Bethlehem

Police Department's database, the report states.

Police said that after several more calls failed to confirm the identity Terry gave, he was asked for the name of a relative and a telephone number.

While calling the number Terry gave police, according to the report, Terry "ran through a cut in the impound fence," and down a large embankment, where police pursued him.

During the pursuit, police said they "ordered [Terry] on numerous occasions to stop, but he continued." When officers were able to gain on Terry, they again verbally commanded him to stop and he responded by shouting expletives and saying, "You'll never catch me."

Police then deployed a Taser gun on Terry, "but the prongs did not penetrate," his clothing, according to the report, at which point he ran into a "large entanglement of brush," allowing officers to catch up to him and

force him into the ground, where he was secured and taken into custody.

Once in custody, according to Bethlehem police, Terry told police that he was wanted on an active parole warrant, did not know the owner of the Honda vehicle, and that he was really walking to Wal-Mart when police stopped him.

Police also discovered a Visa check card in Terry's possession belonging to another individual who reported the card lost.

Terry complained of chest pains and difficulty breathing after the pursuit concluded, and medical personnel were called to the scene and transported him to Albany Medical Center Hospital. Officers stayed with Terry until he was turned over to the Albany County Sheriff's Department on the active parole warrant.

Police said that the Taser cartridge was recovered from the scene but the Taser prongs were lost in the heavily wooded area.



"I'm not like other politicians with preconceived positions though," said Burrige. "I want to listen, modify and move forward."

Lester Freeman, D-Albany

Freeman, 40, Albany's Equal Employment Opportunity coordinator, said he is bringing the district's urban poor into the discussion, and he isn't swayed by the big names in the race, even though Albany's mayor has endorsed Brooks for Congress.

"It's tough when your boss is endorsing Tracey Brooks," he said. "It's been slow as far as the money goes, but as far as shaking hands, I think we're doing a hell of a job."

Freeman did not file with the FEC, because he hasn't hit the \$5,000 mark. He is getting donations, he said, but most of them are in denominations of \$20 or \$30.

Freeman's proposals include a flat tax, which would exempt filers who make under \$50,000 a year from paying taxes on their income and what he calls "change of 20 plan."

The change of 20 would make 20 the standardized adult age, which would include increasing the age at which one could legally purchase cigarettes to 20, lowering the drinking age to 20, and increasing the military service age to 20.

"At 18 you can go into porn and you can fight in the military," Freeman said, "but we should be protecting our young people better ... 20 is an appropriate adult age for young people."

Gary Mittleman, D-Latham

Mittleman, 52, the former Plug-Power CEO, said professional politicians spend all their time raising money, but businessmen analyze and solve critical problems.

Instead of knocking on doors and leveraging campaign donations, Mittleman is using part of his own \$100,000 campaign loan to send mailings and develop video for his Web site. Mittleman said he'd consider spending more of his own money if it would help him win the election, but he said he won't occupy much of his time asking for donations from potential constituents.

"Congressmen spend 80 percent of their time raising money," said Mittleman. "No wonder there's such bad decision making."

Mittleman said he desires true campaign reform and wants to put an end to pork barrel projects and member item earmarks.

Mittleman is also banking on his expertise in the energy field to resonate with voters.

Mittleman said that if he wins the election, he'll work to stop Congress from over spending.

"Cutting back spending is what business people do every day," said Mittleman. "If no one like me gets into office, that's when we know something's wrong."

Darius Shahinfar, D-Albany

Shahinfar, 41, an attorney and former regional representative for Congresswoman Kirstin Gillibrand in the 20th District, is a backer of "A Responsible Plan to End the War in Iraq."

The plan is being supported by a coalition of congressional challengers and retired generals and other military leaders, and calls for the passage of 17 Democratic-sponsored bills aimed at ending the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. If passed, it would shift military efforts to diplomatic, humanitarian and economic efforts.

Shahinfar is the only candidate in the 21st race to support the plan.

"It's time to bring our troops home. And when our men and women in uniform come back to American soil, we must support them and their families in every way possible as they re-adjust to civilian life," said Shahinfar. "I will fight to bring about real change and to renew America's promise to our soldiers, our citizens and the rest of the world."

Shahinfar said it's hard to pick a topic that is most important to him, but he said the war, health care and the economy are some of his top issues. As for the number of candidates in the race, Shahinfar said he welcomes the challenge.

"The more the merrier, really. It may be a little difficult for voters at this time, but choice is a good thing. It's an open seat and open seats tend to provide the opportunity for many candidates."

Phil Steck, D-Loudonville

Steck, 48, an Albany County

legislator, attorney, and Democratic chair of Colonie, says he's the only Democrat in the race who holds an office.

"You have people in this race that are just showing up and saying, 'I want to be your congressman,'" he said.

Steck said his campaign is all about grassroots politics and that he will continue fighting for voters locally in order to fight for them nationally. He pointed to his party defeating the Republican-controlled Colonie government, even though the town has a high enrollment of Republicans, as a credit to good grassroots campaigning.

Steck said he would push for single-payer health care in Washington, which, he says, "is not posturing," because he has pushed for it in the Albany County legislature. He said 85 percent of his donations came from within the congressional district and he has accepted no PAC funds or lobbyist money. He did donate to himself.

"I committed \$50,000 of my own resources. I am not a wealthy person, though, and cannot support this campaign by myself," said Steck. "But if I expect others to invest in me, first I have to invest in myself."

Steck said his Internet donations didn't pick up until his second month of campaigning, and he criticized Brooks earlier in the campaign for "cybersquatting," or buying up the domain names of other candidates' Web sites.

Steven Vasquez, R-Ballston Lake

A self-declared fiscal conservative, Steven Vasquez, 33, said he'll begin to focus on fundraising for his campaign this month. One of the first orders of business for Vasquez is to update his Web site.

"A Web site is most important in deciding the reputation of a candidate and to learn a candidate's position on the issues," said Vasquez.

Vasquez, who lives in Ballston Lake, just outside the boundaries of the 21st District, said he would move into the district if elected. He said he doesn't think that living outside of the 21st will hurt his chances.

"I lived in the district for 10 years, and I know the people there," said Vasquez. "It's not a big concern."

Vasquez, CEO and founder of the Tech Valley company ReQuest, said he hopes to take the attitude of a business person to Congress. He said he'll focus on putting an end to raising taxes if elected.

Vasquez's campaign manager is Warren Redlich, a Guelderland Town Board member and the Republican who lost to Mike McNulty, D-Green Island, in the previous two elections in the 21st District. Vasquez said that having Redlich in the fold would give him an advantage.

"He's worked with a lot of the constituents before," said Vasquez.

Arthur Welser, D-Latham

Welser, 55, a real-estate broker and ex-farmer in Jefferson County,

is making his first run for Congress and campaigning on "getting rid of the drugs and the thugs."

He said education is a key priority, as well as asking the UN for help in Iraq and keeping the National Guard at home instead of as a standing army on foreign soil.

"I would like to see the U.S. first in education again," Welser said. "I would also like to ask the UN for help in Iraq, and if they turn us down, leave."

Questioning whether governors command the National Guard, or the president, Welser suggested that after 60 days, each state should retain control of their troops from the federal government.

Critical of the current administration in Washington, Welser said, "I was surprised that George Bush got re-elected."

Welser is running as a "citizen for Congress" and has a Web site up and running, adding that getting the word out will translate into votes when the time comes.

"I have around 3,000 hits on my Web site," Welser said. "When I have 300,000, I'll win this election."

Ravena publisher dies

Richard Bleezarde was 'the voice of the community'

Richard G. Bleezarde, 56, a third-generation newspaper man who loved his community and covering the people in it, died Tuesday, April 15, at the Hospice Inn in St. Peter's Hospital.

Raised in Ravena, the son of the late George and Beatrice Bleezarde, he was the publisher and owner of the *Ravena News-Herald*, *Greenville Local*, *Coxsackie-Athens Courier* and the *Mid-Hudson Valley Health*.

Mr. Bleezarde was also a member of the New York Press Association (NYPA), serving as a district director for the Hudson Valley Region, as well as a member of the New York Newspaper Publishers Association.

"He really was the voice of the community. ... He was a great guy," said Dick Ahlstrom, a former *Spotlight Newspapers* publisher. "As a small community weekly publisher he did everything. He was the publisher, a reporter, an editor, a salesman, and production and he also did commercial printing."

Ahlstrom said Bleezarde was a born-and-raised newsman.

"His father, George, and his mother ran the paper before him, and he grew up in the business," said Ahlstrom. "I met

him when I first got to Delmar in 1980, and we worked together at the publisher's association."

Another associate from NYPA, Michelle Rea, said Bleezarde will be missed by the newspaper community as well as the communities he served.

"He was a great guy and a third-generation publisher. His grandfather, Fredrick, worked as a pressman for the *Ravena News-Herald*, and bought it in 1921," Rea said. "His father took over and added the Cairo paper, which is no longer around, and the Greenville paper in '65."

Bleezarde took over as publisher in 1987 and added the Cossackie-Athens paper to the family business.

"We met in the early '90s when I joined the company and he was a district director for NYPA," said Rea. "He particularly loved the production end of his work, and he loved coaching his daughter's team. ... He was very, very passionate about family and about his community."

Mr. Bleezarde attended the rank of Eagle Scout as a member of Boys Scouts of America. He graduated from Ravena-Coymans-Selkirk High School in 1970, and then graduated from Rochester Institute of Technology in 1974.

He was a former member and past president of the Greater Ravena Lions Club and a communicant of the Congregational

Christian Church, where he served on the Board of Deacons and Finance Committee, as well as chairing various fundraisers.

Enjoying many sports including bowling, golf, and New York terms like the Yankees and Giants, Mr. Bleezarde also coached his daughter's basketball team.

He loved gardening and had a passion for photography.

"But most of all, he loved his family," according to a tribute written by his family.

Survivors include his wife, Debra A. Johns Bleezarde; daughter, Lauren E. Bleezarde, both of Glenmont; two sisters, Joanne (Tom) Vilaghy

of Philmont, and Linda (Richard) Carpenter of New Jersey; mother-in-law, Fran Johns; sisters-in-law, Michele (Kevin) Grady, and Donna Johns; and brother-in-law, Jim Johns.

Many nieces, nephews, aunts, cousins and friends survive him.

Services were held Saturday, April 19, at the Congregational Christian Church in Ravena, and arrangements were by Babcock Funeral Home, also in Ravena.

been a strong advocate for veterans and helped found the race in her late husband's honor last year.

"This race is a tremendous opportunity for us all to come together and remember Tim," said Katie Moshier. "We are excited to welcome Warrior One to our race and join it in supporting our troops."

Proceeds from the event will go to the Fisher House and the BC Endowment Fund for a scholarship in memory of Moshier. Last year, the event raised \$16,000, according to Moshier, and on May 29 she will be giving out the \$1,000 scholarship to the graduating Bethlehem High School student selected.

The receipt's name has not yet been released.

In addition to being on hand for the run and walk, Warrior One will be making appearances in support of the race at the Bethlehem Town Hall in Delmar from 7 to 9 p.m. on Friday, April 25, and at the Bethlehem Middle School from 7 to 11 a.m. on Saturday, April 26.

"My dad and my mom work at RE/MAX," Moshier said of getting Warrior One at the event.

The CNN Warrior One went on a national tour after being overhauled to raise awareness about the Jan. 20, 2007, auction to benefit the Fisher House Foundation. Barrett-Jackson Co. auctioned the vehicle for \$1 million to Dave and Gail Liniger, founders of RE/MAX. Dave Ressler, the party the Linigers were bidding against at the auc-

tion, donated another \$250,000 to the auction proceeds, which generated a total of \$1.25 million for the benefit of the Fisher House Foundation, a national organization that provides free or low-cost lodging to families of veterans receiving treatment at veterans hospitals.

cial underneath his permanent businesses sign. Quinn said he got the lunch crowd back as a result.

"We took lunch back from Chili's ... people were parking on the grass, it was so busy," Quinn said. "Then Gil told me to take down the banners, and we got into a little argument over sign violations."

Continuing, Quinn said that

Boucher is a friend of a Chili's manager and that he eats there several times a week, but when he confronted Boucher about the conflict of interest Boucher allegedly responded, "Don't discuss Chili's. ... I eat there three times a week."

Quinn also contends that Boucher told him he filed the complaint against Quinn after photographing the sign violation, and that Chili's did not file the complaint.

Quinn said he is "fighting to survive" as a businessman.

Chili's declined comment, but when *The Spotlight* asked to speak with a manager, a man who would only identify himself as "Jason," said he was unaware of the situation, but there are four managers at the restaurant.

"Nobody's friends with anyone here, we're friendly with all of our customers," the manager said. "It's called hospitality; that's why people like coming here."

Boucher could not be reached for comment, but Supervisor Jack Cunningham said no comment on the building inspector's behalf, saying the matter was currently under litigation.

"He had a banner in violation of the zoning code. ... We do enforce our codes," Cunningham said of Quinn's citation. "I've heard these wild accusations before, and it's not germane to the trial."

Cunningham also said it was "extraordinarily uncommon" for a zoning violation to end up in a jury trial, saying, "My understanding is that it's not criminal."

The supervisor said that the town's building inspectors act as code enforcers and hand out citations for violations.

"Most of the owners comply before they are cited for a violation," Cunningham said.

Cunningham did not respond to a request before publication of *The Spotlight* for records detailing how many businesses have been cited for town code violations in the past year or how many businesses were warned in lieu of a citation.

Nanci Moquin, the town's zoning board of appeals administrative assistant, said Quinn

did come to the zoning board to request a sign variance, but did not provide information requested of him for his application and his request was ultimately denied.

"When he first came in, he stated that he lost business and we asked for documentation showing this," Moquin said. "He never brought it in, and he never came back."

Moquin said the board left the case open, however, and that Quinn can re-apply "at any time" if he provides documentation showing his lost revenues. Quinn was issued a letter stating the reasons of his denial and the request for documentation, according to Moquin, but she said Quinn called and said he was un-

able to provide the documents due to "personal problems."

Quinn said he sent a letter to the town asking for dismissal saying there is no basis for his banners being in violation, and he said he couldn't provide documentation at the time because the previous owner of the restaurant had just died and his restaurant had lost "several employees."

"All signs must be constructed of a durable material that doesn't move," Quinn said of town code. "When the winds blow, my permanent sign moves ... the code is supposed to prevent moving mechanical signs and flashing lettering or a strobe, not banners."

Cunningham said Quinn is wrong, and town code specifically outlaws freestanding banners not attached to a building, without a variance. Quinn was offered a deal instead of going to trial, which included a fine and his acknowledging he was in violation of the code.

Quinn rejected the offer.

"They offered me to plead guilty and pay a \$350 fine and whatever conviction they give me. ... I'm a restaurant that has a liquor license, that's not acceptable for me," said Quinn. "This restaurant has had banners up for 20 years straight."

The idea of possibly being convicted or sent to jail doesn't scare Quinn, but what would happen to his daughter does.

"I'm a single father with a 5-year-old girl that stays with me," Quinn said. "That means she'll be sent to foster care and this place will be closed down without a doubt, but the worst part would be to my daughter."



HEALTH AND FINANCIAL IMPACT OF NOT PAYING CIGARETTE TAXES

New York smokers avoid paying cigarette taxes by purchasing cigarettes from Indian reservation stores, over the Internet, and from other out-of-state sources. The health and financial impact to the state of New York of not collecting this tax include:

- Thirty-seven percent of New York smokers report purchasing cigarettes from low price (mainly untaxed) sources "all the time" or "sometimes."
- Purchase of lower price cigarettes is associated with reduced intentions to quit smoking and fewer attempts to quit smoking.
- If all smokers paid the average retail price for cigarettes (including the excise tax), the current prevalence of smoking would be 2 to 3 percent lower, representing between 51,026 and 76,539 fewer adult smokers in New York.
- Revenue lost to the state as a result of purchasing low price (mainly untaxed) cigarettes is estimated to be between \$436 million and \$576 million in 2004.

prices and people quitting.

Doctors say it's the smart choice and legislators say the state could use the money.

"We think it's great," Russell Sciandra, director of the Center for a Tobacco Free New York. "This will prevent a quarter million children from becoming smokers."

On the other side of the argument, the Association of Convenience Stores has said the tax will be "disastrous" for local economies as smokers turn to black markets and find ways to evade the taxes by purchasing outside of the state and on Native American reservations. And, of course, smokers themselves say the tax is unfair, but some concede that the tax may help them kick the habit. Groups like Citizens Lobbying Against Smoker Harassment say they are being discriminated against and that the government is singling them out.

"It's not going to get people to quit smoking; it's going to get them to stop coming to our stores to buy cigarettes," said James Calvin, president of the Association of Convenience Stores. "It's a lose, lose, lose situation."

Health groups that lobbied for the tax increase said it would encourage 168,000 adult smokers to quit, and that out of them, 45,000 will quit in time to save their lives from eventual tobacco-caused death.

In addition, they said, the

measure would discourage 291,000 children under age 18 from becoming smokers.

They argue that in every state that significantly raised its cigarette tax, sales have sharply decreased.

The American Cancer Society has released a study that states, "According to economic studies, every 10 percent increase in cigarette prices reduces overall cigarette consumption by about 4 percent and reduces the number of teenage smokers by

ers supported the tax increase.

"We really didn't get that much resistance about the whole thing. ... I think they (legislators) get the public health element," Sciandra said. "The biggest effect will be all those kids who won't end up as smokers ... but we will have to wait a generation to see that effect."

State Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, agreed saying it made sense for the health-care community and makes sense fiscally in year with large deficits.

"I approved it," Breslin said. "I think absolutely there has to come a time when people will say 'I'm paying too much for this stuff.'"

Although health care was one of his primary concerns, the senator said possible tax evasion issues may have to be looked at more closely, and added that taxing reservations may also have to be looked at.

Sciandra agreed that cigarette tax evasion could be a problem and said he lobbied the state government to include measures that deals with it, but that it was not added to the proposal.

"We think the \$265 million revenue figure is extremely conservative, the question is how much tax evasion is going to occur. Some seem to think that this will double tax evasion ... but we believe the state will actually generate \$430 million in a full year," Sciandra said.

"We do recognize tax evasion is already a problem and this is going to obviously continue," he added. "We urge the government to take firm action."

Julianne Canfield, New York's director of advocacy for the American Heart Association described the tax passages as "great."

"This is the single most effective action on public health the Legislature could have taken," she said. "There was a lot of grassroots activities. ... We were very involved in pushing for this."

Canfield said children are more "price sensitive" than adults and that the new tax will prevent thousands of potential smokers. She also agreed with Sciandra and said her organization met very little resistance from legislators when talking about the tax increase saying that they saw it as a public health measure and not a tax increase.

Calvin, however, fired back saying the numbers being used are skewed and the "mom and pop shops" will become the true victims of the legislation.

"Someone attached a fictitious revenue figure to this proposal, and they went with that," Calvin said of the Legislature passing the tax increase. "We showed them it could be a net loss in revenues."

Calvin said the \$265 million figure is completely made up, and the tax will cost a "mass exodus of smokers to other areas."

"Business owners will suffer at no fault of their own. Not because they are bad business people, not because they run bad stores ... but just because of a stupid tax policy on the part of the state of New York," said Calvin. "This will just fuel and intensify a tax evasion situation already out of control."

When asked what the effects will mean for business lying in border areas, Calvin said, "It means at a minimum, having

to lay people off and then potentially be forced to close their stores."

As of Jan. 1, per-pack cigarette taxes in border states break down as follows: \$1.35-PA.; \$2.575-NJ; \$1.79-VT; \$2.00-Conn.; \$1.51-MA; and the new tax in NY will be \$2.75 (and an additional \$1.50 in NYC), according to the Federation of Tax Administrators. In Ontario, Canada, cigarettes are taxed \$2.47-per-pack in Canadian currency. Cigarettes sold on reservations are not taxed.

Assemblyman Timothy Gordon, I-Bethlehem, said he supported the tax increase but had his own concerns about it.

"It was in the budget that I voted to support," Gordon said. "I have some reservations about it. ... I think it's a kind of regressive tax."

Gordon said that he hopes people quit smoking but shouldn't be punished for being addicted to nicotine, and he added that he was wary of some of the revenue projections.

"For me it's part of a larger issue. ... It's kind of weird that we're encouraging people to quit smoking, but at the same time, we're relying on smokers for revenue," said Gordon.

Gordon questioned the tax increase's true purpose.

"Hopefully people will quit smoking," he said. "Is the measure to raise revenues or to decrease smoking?"

The American Cancer Society and the American Heart Association say the answer is both: \$5.4 billion per year is spent in Medicare on smoking-related illnesses.






Rain harvest

Specialized gardens can help improve water quality

A rain garden may look like a typical garden, but it differs in function in that it manages storm water.

While all gardens function to allow water to permeate the soil, a rain garden does this exceptionally well because it is designed and sited specifically to receive storm-water runoff from driveways, patios and roofs. The water is naturally filtered as it enters the existing ground water. It's a simple concept that really works well.

Although rain is a natural event, storm water is not. Government studies have found that 70 percent of the pollution in streams, rivers and lakes gets there by storm water that has picked up pollutants such as motor oil, fertilizers, pesticides or bacteria from pet waste and litter. Most storm water is not filtered before it enters a waterway, and with the amount of paved surface increasing, rainwater is becoming a storm-water pollution problem. Rain gardens are a way to let nature help to solve a man made problem.

The benefits of rain gardens are many: They provide wildlife habitat, are an attractive alternative to other types of landscaping, use fewer fertilizers and other chemicals, and help reduce the storm drain overload and flooding potential if adopted on a community or neighborhood scale. However, increased water quality is the most important benefit of a rain garden.

Location

The first step in deciding if a rain garden is right for your location is to watch what happens when it rains.

How does the water get from place to place? Does the house have gutters and downspouts, and where does the water go? What is the soil texture — sandy or clay?

The second important consideration is drainage, so dig a hole about 6 inches deep, fill it with water and check that it drains well in a 24-hour period.

If you are having trouble deciding what your soil's

texture is, consult your local Cooperative Extension staff or a Master Gardener for help.

Next, keep these points in mind:

- The rain garden should be at least 10 feet from the house or foundation, and the runoff should ideally flow through the grass before it enters the garden, thus removing the silt.

- Do not site the rain garden over a septic system. It can be placed 35 feet from a septic system or 50 feet away from a well.

- Call before you dig: (800) 962-7962, Dig Safely, New York will alert all utilities.

- Site the garden in full or partial sun.

- A flat area or a slight slope works best.

- Do not site a rain garden in a wet area — the rain garden must drain in a 24-hour period for the health of the plants and to limit mosquitoes. A rain garden is NOT



a solution to a wet area.

Residential rain gardens range in size from 100 to 300 square feet and are often irregular in shape. The ultimate size will depend on how much water is draining into the garden, but it should be about twice as long as it is wide. The garden must have a flat bottom, and the greater the slope, the deeper the garden. The soil that is removed can be recycled into a bermed edge that keeps the water in the garden. Two inches of compost is a good addition to the level bottom area. It is also important to plan for the heavy rain event that may provide more water than the garden can handle. This overflow should move to the nearest area and not to a septic field or the neighboring property.

Plants

Native plants are the best choice for a rain garden because they are tough, adapted to the local environment, hosts for wildlife and need less maintenance overall. Tasks such as weeding and deadheading are less with an established rain garden, plus fertilizing and spraying are not necessary and in fact defeat the purpose.

It is easy to plan for consistent color in your rain garden by following the guidelines in the free CCE fact-sheet, "Installing a Rain Garden" available by calling 756-3500.

The Great Lakes states have been rain gardening for many years and are sold on the benefits. The slogan there is: "Saving the Great Lakes one rain garden at a time." If you are looking for a way to be a better environmental steward, consider planting a rain garden so that we can be saving the Hudson River, one rain garden at a time.




A PASSION FOR POTTERY

Pottery Trail helps with growing interest in local wares

For years, Liz Vigoda had a pottery studio in downtown Albany where she would regularly host open houses for customers and the curious alike to check out her work.

But the building was eventually sold, and Vigoda now works out of her home in Delmar. She doesn't have room for a showroom there, so she decided to take some of her pieces to her friend Ulla Sattinger's studio in Slingerlands, which is one of the featured stops on this year's Albany Saratoga Pottery Trail.

The trail is really open year round; anyone is welcome to visit any of the studios on the trail whenever time permits. But for the last five years, the potters who take part have come together on a common weekend to showcase their pottery and offer demonstrations and refreshments, all for free.

"We want people to stay and talk and look around," said Nancy Niefield, who owns Two Spruce Pottery on Jay Street in Schenectady.

The studios will be open on Saturday and Sunday, April 26 and 27, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. There are seven stops in total, ranging as far north as Schuylerville and including two studios in Troy. A map and directions are available on www.albany-saratoga-pottery-trail.com; visitors can also download

a coupon to use at the studios during the weekend.

Niefield has been part of the trail since its inception and said she and the other potters who founded it wanted to grow it slowly. For the first three years, they offered a studio "passport" that visitors could have stamped at each of the five studios taking part. Those who visited every studio were entered into a raffle, with the potters supplying pieces and prizes.

"There were more than 100 people who did all five stops," Nieman said.

Because the trail has expanded, organizers opted for the coupon this year instead of a raffle, thinking it might be tough (although certainly not impossible) for people to visit all of the stops. Each studio determined how much the coupon would be worth and to what it would apply.

Vigoda likes the idea of the coupon and the trail attracting new people to see her pieces. At her studio downtown, she had a "big group of loyal followers," but she didn't often see new faces at her open house.

"That's one of the reasons we joined," she said.

Jim Sankowski, who owns Ballston Lake Pottery and like Niefield has been part of the trail since it began, thinks newcomers will be surprised at the quality and quantity available in the area.

"Everyone is talking about buying locally," he said. "This is a way to get people to come out and

see what's in their area."

He said the trail highlights the "personal connection" that the local potters offer, as opposed to shopping at nationwide chains.

"We're trying to bring back the joy of shopping," he said. "People get to see right where the work is being done."

Sankowski, who has entertained visitors from as far away as North Carolina and Boston in years past, has been making pottery for more than 30 years. He went to art school and did studio work in clay, which turned into a lifelong passion.

He's grateful for the chance to share that passion with the other potters on the trail and said they're not a competitive bunch. They figure that sharing exposure and visitors is only going to pay off for everyone in the end, he said.

Niefield and Vigoda embrace that community spirit, too. Vigoda teaches classes at her studio in Delmar, including classes geared to kids. Niefield teaches at Union College, where she enjoys offering students the kind of respite she felt when she was in school and got to spend time working on pottery instead of writing papers.

"I find it very relaxing," she said.

The funny thing is, Niefield balked when told she had to take a pottery class in college, noting that she'd already taken one in high school. But soon she was a regular in the pottery studio.

"I just fell in love with it and spent all my time there," she said.

She's eager to share that love with visitors this weekend, showcasing her functional (dinnerware, lamps, mugs) pottery as well as decorative pieces known as Raku. She's also looking forward to introducing people to the guest potter at

her studio, a Swiss man named Juergen Meier who now lives in Schenectady and builds vessels that stand several feet high.

"He'll be making some vessels here in my window," she said.

Other studios will also host guest potters for the weekend. Details can be found on the Web site.





The competition is only going to get tougher for Guilderland, as it still has to face the likes of Shenendehowa, Saratoga and Columbia. But if the Lady Dutch


continue to hit the ball well, they have a shot at making some waves in the Suburban Council.

“Overall, the girls team is stronger than the boys team,” said Relyea. “The boys are smaller (in

numbers), but there's greater quality.”

That quality was evident in the 4x800 relay, where Voorheesville's team of Lloyd, Ryan Allison, Nathan Bub and Ian Powell placed second to Section II power Shaker by 1.1 seconds. Shaker finished with a winning time of 8:11.8, while Voorheesville finished in a time of 8:12.9.

“We had a really nice first 400 with Ryan Allison, Nathan Bub and Macky both ran very well, and Ian Powell had a strong final 400,” said Relyea.

Josh Glover added a victory in the boys pole vault for Voorheesville. The senior cleared the bar at 11 feet, 6 inches to take first place.

Caitlin Ableseth led Voorheesville's girls team with a pair of second-place finishes in the 100 and 200 dashes. In each case, she finished behind Ihechi Ohia-Enyia of Saunders.



Lloyd comes up big at meet

Senior from small school beats large school field

In 3,000 meters, Macky Lloyd proved he is one of the best distance runners at any Section II school, large or small.

The Voorheesville senior built a sizeable lead midway through the race and cruised to a 5.8-second victory in the boys 3,000 at Saturday's Warrior Classic in Niskayuna.

Competing against a field that included runners from Niskayuna, Shaker and Ballston Spa, Lloyd took the lead on the first lap and never looked back in winning the event in a time of 9:19.8. Ballston Spa's Mike Lyons was second in a time of 9:25.5.

"It's nice when a kid from a

smaller school can run with the big boys," said Voorheesville track coach Steve Relyea.

Lloyd was so tired after crossing the finish line that he didn't realize he had met his goals for the race.

"I wanted to win, and I wanted to go 9:20," said Lloyd. "But we

had a really good 4x800 (relay), and that took a lot out of me."

Running the third leg of the 4x800 relay didn't take everything out of Lloyd, though. He had plenty to put together a series of bursts during the middle portion of the 3,000 that effectively sealed his victory.

"I had a little bit of a lead, so they could have caught me (early on)," said Lloyd. "So every straightaway, I tried to sprint it."

Lloyd's win in the 3,000 highlighted a strong day overall for Voorheesville at the Warrior
