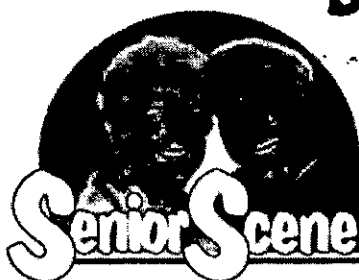

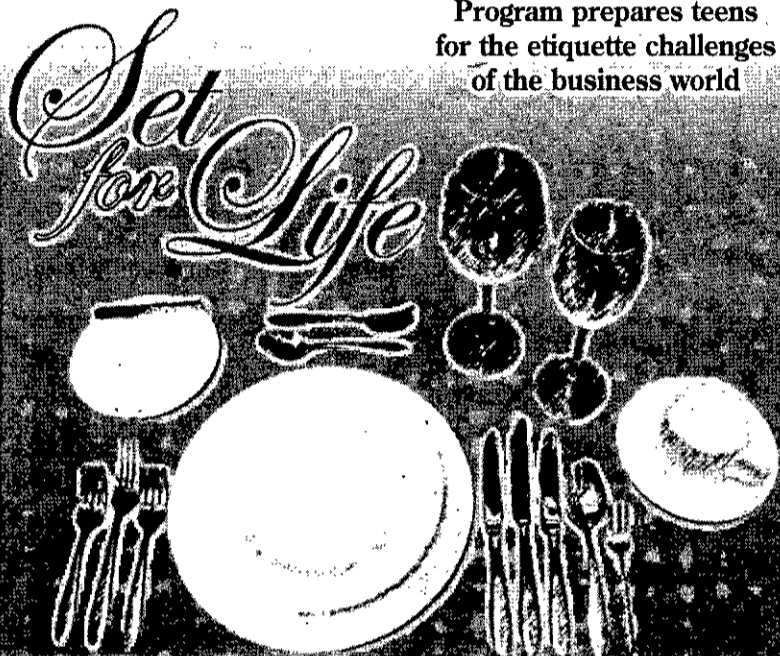

Program prepares teens
for the etiquette challenges
of the business world

"I'm motivated to do it because there's a need," said Owens, who graduated from Albany Academy and doesn't have any children of his own. "I'm just trying to pay it forward."

Rain doesn't dampen racers' spirits

Turnout strong at second Capt. Timothy J. Moshier Memorial 5K

Single raindrops slowly fell from the sky as runners and community members on Kenwood Avenue in Delmar listened to the national anthem. They stood silently holding flags and their hearts and remembering one of their own before embarking on a race in his honor.

The second Capt. Timothy J. Moshier Memorial 5K Run/Walk was held Saturday, April 25, at

the Bethlehem Middle School. And although the race was held on a damp, chilly morning, there weren't any tears, there wasn't any grief, and there wasn't any forgetting of why everyone was there.

Instead, the streets of Delmar were filled with smiling faces and an undeniable sense of pride and honor. Fellow soldiers and veterans, as well as children, wives and husbands, saluted and celebrated the ultimate sacrifice that Moshier had made for everyone of them who had gathered there in his name.

Moshier died while serving in Iraq two years ago when the Apache helicopter he was flying was shot down. He was a Bethle-

State funds help lower BC tax rate

Boost comes as residents to see a reduction in STAR benefits

The projected tax rate increase in the Bethlehem School District budget proposal has dropped about a-third of a percent as a result of state funds secured by the area's assemblyman, but STAR benefits are being cut in town for the year.

The projected tax rate increase went down from the original 4.14 percent to 3.79 percent for Bethlehem residents and lowered

from 5.24 percent to 4.24 percent for New Scotland residents.

Bethlehem School Board President James Lytle lauded the extra state funding as both good for the school and good for the taxpayer.

"We very much appreciate our legislators' efforts on behalf of Bethlehem Central," Lytle said. "It provides district taxpayers with some tax relief, while also allowing the district to equip Eagle and conserve \$325,000 in capital construction funding."

The news of the increased state funding comes as Bethlehem residents who receive a STAR exemption are being told they will see an increase to their

Police arrest suspects in early-morning robbery

Bethlehem police have arrested four people in connection with an armed home invasion that occurred at 59 University St. in Selkirk early in the morning on Wednesday, April 23.

James M. Kennedo, 25, of Albany; Derek E. Galvin, 21, of Albany; Clare P. Brady, 25, of Castleton; and Jessica R. Galasso, 20, of Troy, were all arrested and arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court on Thursday, April 24, according to police.

Two male suspects, believed to be Kennedo and Galvin, allegedly forced their way into the home with a handgun at 5:20 a.m. and made away with electronics from inside the home in a white, mid-sized sedan, according to Bethlehem police.

Lt. Thomas Heffernan of the Bethlehem Police said the owners of the house met Brady and Galasso in Albany earlier on the night of the robbery, and that the women allegedly went to the house later with the two men charged with the crime.

"A couple of the victims were out earlier in Albany, and they met the two women for the first time that night," Heffernan said. "During that time, they had some conversations about cash and other property."

Heffernan said the two women allegedly went to the home in the morning, around 5 a.m., and while inside, Kennedo and Galvin forced their way in with a gun.

"When the two men entered the

home, the females disappeared," said Heffernan.

Police said that the residents reported that two men wearing hoodies had forced their way into the home by displaying the handgun.

Police moved quickly, collaborating with the Albany and Watervliet departments, and Brady and Galasso were arrested about 16 hours after the crime at 10 p.m. by Watervliet police officers.

Albany police arrested the two men, Kennedo and Galvin, about 20 hours after the crime at 2 a.m. Thursday, April 24, in Albany.

Kennedo and Galvin are charged with felony counts of burglary, criminal use of a firearm, robbery, criminal possession of a weapon, grand larceny and conspiracy.

Brady and Galasso were charged with felony counts of conspiracy and criminal possession of stolen property and misdemeanor criminal facilitation.

Kennedo and Galvin were sent to Albany County jail without bail and Brady and Galasso were sent to the Albany County jail in lieu of \$15,000 bail.

All four are scheduled to reappear in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, April 29, at 4 p.m. for a preliminary hearing. Investigators from the Albany and Watervliet police departments assisted Bethlehem detectives with the investigation.

New York State Division of Parole was also contacted due to Galvin being on parole for assault charges, and police say a majority of the stolen property has been recovered, but no gun was found.

"Due to the nature of the crime," Heffernan said, "our detectives were working around the clock until the arrests were made."

reported burglary at the Subway store in Delaware Plaza, at 159 Delaware Ave.

Anthony J. Lozano, 37, of Albany, and Melissa L. Pigliavento, 38, of Delmar, were arrested in connection with the burglary. Lozano is charged with felony burglary, and criminal mischief, conspiracy and petty larceny — all misdemeanors.

Pigliavento is charged with misdemeanor counts of petty larceny, criminal facilitation and conspiracy.

According to the arrest report, the two suspects are charged with entering Subway on Thursday, April 24, just after 3:30 a.m., where they allegedly damaged and stole property.

According to police Lt. Thomas Heffernan, Pigliavento was an employee at the restaurant and allegedly brought Lozano inside of the store without breaking into it.

"We had an idea of what we were looking for," Heffernan said of the burglary investigation. "The business people discovered it the next morning and reported it."

The two allegedly made off with "a couple hundred dollars," said Heffernan, and damage to the shop's cash register was reported. The money was not recovered.

Both were arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court, where they were sent to the Albany County Correctional Facility.



Selkirk home destroyed by fire

Investigators point to cigarette disposal as possible cause of blaze

A large structure fire at 700 Bridge St. in Selkirk kept several fire companies busy the evening of Monday, April 21.

Fire crews began arriving at the home around 4 p.m. and battled the intense blaze for hours. Crews had to shut down the road, according to Bethlehem police.

Investigators are ruling the fire accidental and believe it most likely began from a cigarette disposed in a trashcan outside the rear of the house.

Two firefighters were transported to an area hospital for heat exhaustion but were not seriously injured. They were released a short time later, according to Lt. Thomas Heffernan of the Bethlehem Police Department.

"There were numerous fire companies from the area and surrounding areas that responded to the fire and acting as mutual aid," Heffernan said. "They were using

pumper trucks because there was no fire hydrant accessible."

Police say the damage was extensive, and family members were home at the time, including a father, three children and two grandchildren.

"I would say it was a total loss," Heffernan said. "They believe it began with a cigarette in the garbage."

The American Red Cross of Northeastern New York was on the scene that night in order to provide for the family during the ordeal. They reported that they were

"assisting one family, representing seven people, displaced by this evening's severe fire on Bridge Street in Bethlehem." The Red Cross disaster team volunteers are with the family and are working to meet their immediate post-disaster needs, according to spokeswoman Siobhan Gallagher.

"Volunteers are providing

the family with temporary shelter, as well as financial assistance for food and clothing," said Gallagher. "[We] will continue to provide support for the family in the days and weeks ahead to develop a recovery plan to help return them to pre-disaster conditions as quickly as possible."

The Selkirk Fire Department was the lead agency handling the

emergency, and besides the two firefighters who were transported by ambulance for heat exhaustion, police say no one else was injured.

Several Bethlehem Fire Departments, as well as fire crews from Greene County and the Town of New Scotland assisted with the Bridge Street fire, according to Heffernan.

Subdivision proposed near Five Rivers

Landowner wants to divide property into seven lots

The Bethlehem Planning Board heard a plan to build a small subdivision next to a state preservation landmark at the Tuesday, April 15, meeting.

Carol Richards is proposing to divide her property off of Fisher Boulevard into seven lots next to the Five Rivers State Preserve. Developers say they want to keep the lots fairly small so as to keep the density of homes on the property low.

A portion of the property is to be donated to the Open Space Institute, according to Teresa Bakner, who represented Richards at the meeting.

"It's taken us a while to get here ... and there are no subdivisions that we are aware of on the history of this property," Bakner told the board. "The land could have been divided into dozens of lots if they wanted to develop it. ... While the wetlands on the site are in several locations, it in no way inhibits the development."

The wetlands have been inspected by the Army Corps of Engineers and other surveyors, according to Bakner, and are not connected to any Department of Environmental Conservation designated wetlands.

All seven lots, she said, would be built on with the exception of the third lot, which has an existing home on it. One of the lots will be set back from the others, according to the plans, and may be "more desirable" to a potential buyer.

"We're not putting in any roadways at all, it will just be driveways and accesses," said Bakner. "We think it's a good thing. Typically a developer comes in and wants to know how many lots they can get out of it."

Chairman Parker Mathusa said, "It's a nice community gesture on her part" of Richards' plan.

Howard Johannessen of Boutelle, Edward W. & Son, a Delmar firm that

provides surveying and other services, said that most of the infrastructure is already in place.

"We don't see any difficulties to providing water services," Johannessen told board members. "Our initial review of the lots ... is we think dry wells are the way to go."

There was some board discussion about when Five Rivers closes, which board member John Smolinsky pointed out was dusk but that the main building closes at 5 p.m., and Bakner said she would contact the state-run preserve.

"I think most people who move in here will respect the open land," she said. "It's going to be a great place to live ... you don't have to pay taxes on what's behind you, but you get to enjoy it."

Smolinsky said he was concerned about what type of disturbance would occur on the land during construction and asked about sidewalk easements along Fisher Road, saying, "Five Rivers is one of the destinations that is very desirable to connect with for pedestrians."

"They need to tell us how wide it needs to be, and we'll work with that," Bakner responded, "that's fine by us."

The DEC will own the land to be donated by Richards, according to Bakner, and the Open Spaces Institute is essentially acting as holding company and transfers the deed to the state to remain as open space indefinitely.

"Her plan is to sell the lots. We fully expect to sell them individually," said Bakner. "The lots themselves will sell for a lot of money."

"It's a beautiful addition to the community," Mathusa said of Richards' plans, "and we hope to move it along."

The planning board accepted the plans and tabled a vote on the subdivision until the board and town engineer reviewed the plans and made final comments and suggestions.

The board also set a public hearing on the Dowerskill Village, section 2B planned development district number 4, for Tuesday, May 6, at 7 p.m.

Tonko resigns from NYSERDA, moves closer to candidacy

Paul Tonko, D-Amsterdam, has resigned from his job as head of the New York State Energy

Research and Development Authority, a clear sign that the former state assemblyman will seek a seat in the 21st Congressional District.

A NYSERDA spokesperson said that a memo announcing Tonko's resignation was circulated on Friday, April 26.

By the week's end, Tonko's picture and a short biography of the Spitzer appointee had been removed from NYSERDA's Web site.

In a statement, Tonko said he informed Gov. David Paterson of his resignation from the

approximately \$144,000-a-year position.

"After a long career in state service," Tonko wrote, "I am looking forward to a new challenge."

Tonko became president and chief executive officer of NYSERDA in July.

Vice President Robert Callender will serve as NYSERDA's interim director.

Tonko talks

On Saturday, April 26, Tonko,

58, appeared in front of the Albany Democratic Committee's screening committee, according to Chairman David Bosworth.

During the interview, a party official asked Tonko if he would enter the race. Tonko said he would.

While Tonko was not immediately available for comment, his appearance at party headquarters this weekend was his first direct link to the 21st District race.

Tonko's candidacy has been rumored for months.

As of Monday, April 28, Tonko has not made an official announcement, nor has he filed papers with the Federal Election Committee.

Tonko represented the 105th Assembly District, including all of Montgomery and part of Schenectady counties from April 1983 to June 2007. He was chairman of the Assembly Committee on Energy.

Tonko would be the eighth Democrat to enter the 21st Congressional race and the 10th candidate overall.

Spring break is but a memory. Spring fever, however, is here in full force.

No one is immune to spring fever. Kids in school have it. People working in offices have it. It has even affected my laptop computer; the first warm day I tried to use my laptop outside, it absentmindedly went into hibernation mode without a single warning about diminishing battery power.

What? I should have been mindful about the need to recharge the battery?

Maybe the computer could sense my lack of focus. Maybe it felt my fingertips on the keyboard but knew that my thoughts had drifted to the chirping birds and the desire for a cold drink.

It's hard to concentrate when sunny skies and grassy fields are beckoning us to come outside and play (read: sit on the deck with a good book).

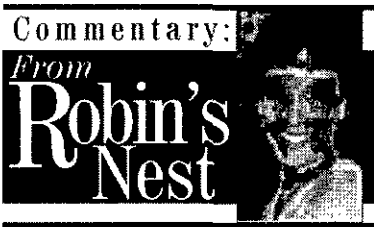
And so, what is to become of all the clutter I couldn't harness during the winter? Now that I can escape the piles of paper by stepping through the sliding door and slipping into a lounge chair, is there any hope of seeing my kitchen counters again?

I'm hoping to pick up a tip or two from my daughter. She's taking a study skills class, required for all sixth graders. The topics include organizing your locker, tracking assignments and time management.

I wonder if the teacher talks about filing papers and backpack maintenance.

Over the years I've been unable to decipher my child's filing system. A sheet of loose-leaf paper decorated with doodles arrives home neatly stored in a pocket folder whereas a permission slip for a field trip is discovered only after smoothing the crumpled sheet found next to the half-eaten snack-size bag of chips.

Which reminds me: It's essential to do frequent backpack food sweeps. Fermented peanut



butter and jelly sandwiches are not a pleasant discovery. Luckily, my daughter usually buys lunch.

School lunch menus are a source of paper clutter. There was a time when I had several months' worth of menus hanging on my refrigerator. Only when the magnetic clip dropped to the floor would I remember to purge the outdated sheets.

In elementary school, the school lunch menu came home attached to the weekly newsletter, another source of paper clutter, but one I coveted.

The McGuffey Reader was something I needed hot off the presses. I'd greet my daughter on Friday afternoons with much anticipation: "Hi sweetie, did you bring home the McGuffey Reader?" When her answer was "No," I'd feel my anxiety rising.

She didn't bring home a McGuffey Reader? How will I know what's happening next week? What if there is a sign-up form for some important event? What if there is information about upcoming standardized tests?

My daughter would say, "I'll get one on Monday." But I'd be thinking: "Monday may be too late. Something may be happening on Monday. Something may be due on Monday."

I wasn't alone in my obsession with this newsletter. There were times when other parents would call and ask to borrow my copy. And there were times when I'd borrow one from a neighbor.

I must be in the know. I must not miss a deadline. I must not let my child miss any opportunity.

But there are just so many papers, so many sign-ups, so many deadlines. It's so hard to track.

The papers all require action:

Register for sports, register for the music festival, buy a book for the author's visit, reserve a copy of the yearbook, send a check for the school spirit T-shirt, submit a Scholastic book order, bring in a non-perishable food item, bring in money for a fundraiser, get tickets for the play, collect pledges for the Hoops for Heart program, chaperone a field trip, cook for the cultural fair, and on and on.

My wise friend Claire once advised me that the world would not end if I missed a sign-up. She reminded me that it was not necessary for my child to participate in everything.

I have come to realize that kids need to share the responsibility of tracking events and deadlines. If the kids want to participate in a program then they shouldn't fold the informational flier into a one-inch square and shove it into the bottle holder attached to their lunch box.

My daughter recently told me she needed to get organized. She used her own money to purchase a fabric carrying case that is part three-ring binder and part accordion file. She can also store a few folders between the two sections. Everything is zippered up and held inside.

Normally, I provide the funding for school supplies. However, in this instance, I wasn't convinced that this new contraption was the key to getting organized. I saw it as just another place to shove more papers. And she already had three successful marking periods behind her. Why in the last quarter of the school year was a system change needed? What was wrong with carrying the folders on top of a separate binder like she'd been doing all along?

I thought of all the perfectly usable abandoned binders scattered throughout our house and wondered if this new case

would soon join them. Still, I didn't want to discourage Rachel from becoming more organized, so I took her to the store and she made her purchase.

Recently I asked her how the case was working out. She gave me the thumbs up signal.

"How exactly does it help you stay organized?" I asked.

"There's a certain spot for your pencils," she said.

"What about that three-ring zippered pencil pouch I bought you?" I said. She explained that the new place to store pencils was better.

"So, you bought that thing to keep your pencils secure?" I questioned.

"This way I don't lose pencils," she said.

There had been no mention of pencil storage when we had been shopping.

I said, "So the new case keeps you organized because you have a certain spot for pencils?"

"Not just pencils, there are spots for other things too," she answered. "My graph-paper notebook and my assignment

notebook clip in and my folders fit in and everything can be carried together like peas in a pod."

"What about the accordion section with the pockets? What do you use that for?"

"Oh, I use the pockets for papers that need to be signed, like tests. Also, even a small book will fit in one of the pockets," she said smiling.

"I'm glad it's working out for you," I told her.

She only started using the new case the week before spring break, so it's still a bit of a novelty. As the days grow warmer and spring fever intensifies, it's entirely possible that stray papers will be found outside their designated locations. A pencil might even go missing.

Or maybe Rachel will remain organized and I'll follow her example. I have a lot more bags, backpacks and folders than she does. Plus, I have loose papers, coupons, newspapers and catalogs all over the house. I really should go through my stuff, file the important items and discard the rest. But weekends are short and it just seems more inviting to go for a walk around the block and then take a nap in the hammock.

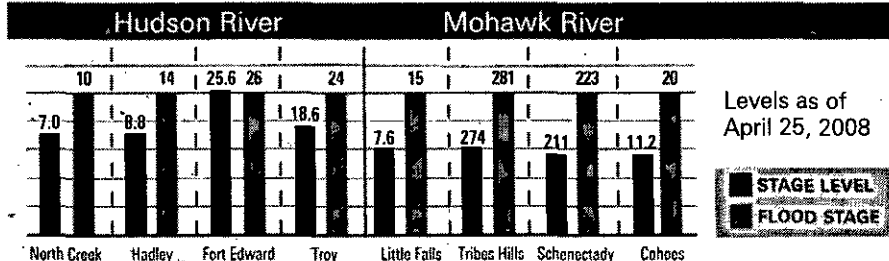

Those darn kids

Look around you.

They crept up on you and you never even knew it.

Those darn kids — the ones you disparage for chatting incessantly on their cell phones and never falling out of touch with one another by means of texting, IM-ing, Facebook and MySpace — are now working in your office, own their own businesses or are otherwise climbing their way up some economic ladder.

But don't think they've outgrown the poor social etiquette that some people believe comes with being constantly connected to some, and constantly disconnected from others. Somewhere along the way, connectivity became a cheap substitute for interaction.

And as the gadgets get smaller and faster and easier to use, the gap between socializing and social etiquette will get wider and wider. In short, technology isn't the problem in this equation, people are, and the technology that people are using these days is maturing faster than they are.

One local employer has launched a program called "Menus, Manners and Mentors" to combat this decline in etiquette. The program gives teens etiquette lessons and provides them with networking opportunities and information about colleges.

The program's founder, Anthony Owens, said he thought of the class after he found himself panicking at a fancy business dinner because of his lack of etiquette knowledge.

While Owens' program has its roots in table manners, he also makes it a point to teach young people things like chivalry and simple human kindness and respect.

You know, the basics.

But the basics have seemed to change, and if the youngsters of today are poised to take our places at our desks, on our school boards and in our public offices, and if stellar social etiquette isn't a trait they choose to carry forward, we could be seeing a permanent shift in not only how people socialize, but also in what is acceptable social protocol.

The case could be made, on paper and with pencil, of course, that it isn't the tech-crowd that needs to raise their standard of social etiquette, but the courteous and considerate amongst us that need to realize we are facing a new set of rules for discourse.

One hopes that a balance can be struck. That we can somehow stay connected to the many people we must communicate with during the course of our waking days, while still interacting with others face-to-face, the way human beings were meant to.

Teachers aim to close gap

Something remarkable happened in Albany not that long ago and its repercussions continue to be felt throughout the state.

It was six months ago that New York State United Teachers sponsored a groundbreaking conference that focused on the most pressing issue facing New York schools today: an achievement gap that leaves too many of our children behind.

"Every Child Counts: A symposium dedicated to ending the gap" included the voices and ideas of more than 400 community leaders and key stakeholders in education, government and business and put the problem of the gap high on the agenda of every participant and the constituencies they represent.

I am so very proud of how NYSUT — leaders, members and staff — have stepped up to enthusiastically embrace closing the gap as a long-term commitment. At the same time, others in education, health care and government have come to realize that ending the gap is vital to spurring an economic and social resurgence in New York state.

While most of our public schools are very successful — independent sources such as The Education Trust and "Education Today" bear that out — there are students in communities across the state who are struggling even

before they start school. They start out behind and very often never catch up.

This gap in achievement is most pronounced for students living in poverty, and too often that means children of color. It is a gap found not only in urban schools, but in rural and suburban settings as well. Other factors including inadequate health care, poor nutrition and limited access to early childhood education are consistently present. At stake are the very futures of our most precious assets — our children — as well as the future of New York state.

NYSUT has just released to the public a report generated from our symposium. Not only does this report summarize the conference discussions and presentations, it also spells out in simple terms the key themes that we believe are essential to providing the foundation for action to end the gap once and for all and ensure educational equity for all our children.

Those themes are:

- Expanding pre-K and other early childhood programs and encouraging more school districts to take advantage of funding for such programs

- Creating high — and consistent — expectations for all students

- Doing away with the No Child Left Behind Act as we currently know it to make assessments more meaningful and improve instruction

- Pursuing partnerships with parents by welcoming them into our classrooms, encouraging two-way conversations and accommodating their schedules wherever possible

- Investing in school-based

health clinics to address health problems that can prevent children from learning

- Continuing an open dialogue about the gap with all stakeholders

- Using research-based educational reform programs to sustain and replicate student achievement

- Being open to bold approaches, including restructuring, school choice and re-examining the school day

- Recruiting and retaining high-quality teachers and administrators, especially in those districts that are traditionally difficult to staff

- Using NYSUT's continued activism and commitment to promote change and spur progress.

This is a challenging and, in some ways, controversial agenda. Many of these points have been championed by NYSUT and other education advocates for years. Others make good common sense. And still others will force all of us to take a second look at some long-held positions. They will require flexibility and creativity.

But, we really have no choice. This is our mission and we must be open to bold, innovative solutions. To be champions of the status quo would be irresponsible — not in the best interests of our students and their families.

In my opening remarks last fall, I challenged symposium participants — in the words of Eleanor Roosevelt — "to do one thing every day that scares you," and to consider "what might work instead of what doesn't work."

We have stepped up. Now it's time to move forward.

The State Comptroller's office has the responsibility to audit every local government in New York state, from school districts to cities to libraries. Our audits are targeted toward improving fiscal management and accountability at every level of government.

A few years ago, the Comptroller's office made national news by uncovering an \$11 million theft at a school district on Long Island. As a result, legislation was passed requiring our office to audit every one of New York's 834 school districts, Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) and charter schools by 2010. We have completed 400 school audits and approximately 200 audits are under way.

We also provide an extensive range of services to help local governments, particularly for those showing signs of fiscal stress.

We also promote government reform by presenting research and information on important local government policy issues to state leaders, local government officials and the public.

Towns should be in agreement on moratorium

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

Members of the Town of Bethlehem Board deserve recognition and thanks for their role in informing a decision of the Albany County Planning Board, which recently recommended in favor of New Scotland's adoption of a moratorium on large-scale development in New Scotland's commercial zone.

The county's findings strongly support New Scotland Supervisor Tom Dolin's early leadership on this issue.

Bethlehem Town Supervisor Jack Cunningham endorsed the need for a moratorium in correspondence sent to the County Planning Board last week. Board members Mark Hennessey and Kyle Kotary have also been responsive to concerns raised about Sphere Development's plans to site

500,000 square feet of regional-scale retail, including a "big-box" Target as an anchor at a New Scotland site.

As a growing number of Bethlehem residents recognize, Slingerlands and the Route 85 corridor would face significant traffic impacts and no direct benefits should this proposal move forward.

There remain concerns in New Scotland that a majority

of our Town Board is not willing to vote in favor of the moratorium proposal. A strong public turnout is needed at key meetings ahead to demonstrate the degree of public concern for "big-box" development in our rural community, and the need for better planning and zoning in New Scotland's commercial zones.

On Wednesday, May 7, at 7 p.m., at Voorheesville High School, there will be a public hearing on the proposed moratorium.

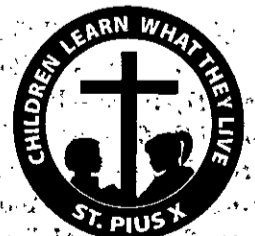

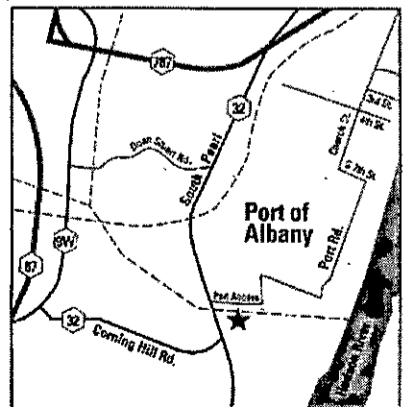

Mixing business and recycling

Arbor Day business event a chance to network, collect paper

Arbor Day is a time for reflecting and rejoicing over those life-sustaining plants called trees. For area businesses, it apparently was also a day to drop off 500 or so pounds of paper in Glenmont to be shredded and recycled.

About 80 people attended Melody Burns' and Lisa Giruzzi's monthly business breakfast mixer at Panera Bread in Towne Center Plaza off of Route 9W. The mixer on the morning Friday, April 25, brought in business people from as far away as Ulster and Columbia counties not only for a cup of coffee, but also to drop off up to 50 pounds of paper to be recycled.

"I do this every month ... starting back in December, and now I average about 75 or 80 people each time," said Burns, proprietor of Idea Practitioner. "I always thought Earth Day was kind of a marketing thing. ... Arbor Day is the real thing, and we're going to shred this paper to recycle it all."

Her business mixer partner, Lisa Giruzzi, owner of Transformational Conversations, said that each

month the business breakfast has a different theme.

"Between the two of us we bring in a lot of businesses. Every month, I'm so happy to about the number of people that come out," Giruzzi said. "Each [mixer] has a theme. This is Arbor Day so we had Omega shredding paper ... and we even named one 'The Greatest Mixer on Earth,' in honor of the Barnum & Bailey Circus."

Omega Secure-Shred, Inc., an on-site document destruction company, was on hand to do the shredding while business owner mingled inside of Panera's nibbling on breakfast goodies and passing out business cards.

"We probably shredded about 400 or 500 pounds this morning," said Michael Hastings, the company's president. "We recycle the paper, and it gets turned into new office products."

The company, which started last year, is a locally owned business that serves the Capital District and charges per-pound with bulk rates available. They have a large truck that will come to a place of business.

Omega also offers secure shredding for sensitive documents that cuts paper in several different directions in a process they call "document destruction." The confetti remains are then bailed up and shipped out for recycling.

The shredding was done for free for those who went to Burns and Giruzzi's business

mixer on Arbor Day.

"I saw a big line out there when I got here," Giruzzi said about the shredding truck parked outside of Panera's. "Lots of paper and lots of shredding."

Good old-fashioned networking is what the monthly breakfast is all about, according to Burns, who used little seed packets for nametags in the spirit of the themed event. Business owners who donate a gift to be raffled off are allowed to give a "30-second commercial" or plug about their business each month. It's all about businesses helping business, said Burns, who is also the town's Republican chairwoman.

"So everyone can increase their local business," she said. "When I first started doing this, some of these people have never even heard of Glenmont before ... and we're bringing everyone together."

Even Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce President Marty DeLaney was seen in the midst of pastries, caffeinated beverages, seed packet nametags and business pitches.

"Members of several local chambers, business owners and managers, meet, greet and make connections," DeLaney said of the mixer. "The decibel level is always high, the coffee flows and business cards fly."

pursue a career in the medical field. At Siena, she sat between a doctor and a pharmacist.

"I was kind of able to learn what makes them successful," Christie said. "They told me a little bit about what they do each day."

Raisi Mobeles, a Guilderland senior whose college choice was between Ohio State and the University of Massachusetts-Amherst, rubbed elbows at Siena with the manager of KeyBank and other businesspeople. Mobeles is thinking of doing his undergrad work in international business before eventually going into corporate law.

Owens didn't want the networking to stop when everyone went home. So the teens had

their own business cards printed, and they exchanged them with the adults at the event.

"We e-mail once a week," Mobeles said. "They check in to see how I'm doing."

Many of the "Menus, Manners and Mentors" participants don't really know any potential career contacts, Owens said. He believes it teaches the students an important lesson to have the professionals take a genuine interest in them.

"There are people out there who will help you. If you do your part, someone will help you," he said.

The night at Siena also included an etiquette lesson taught by Norman Kvam, general manager of Sodexo USA. Participants were served several courses with full place settings of cutlery, glassware and dishes.

Again, Owens didn't want

the experience to end there. So every Monday, he takes a male and female in the program out for a formal dinner. Eight area restaurants (La Serre, Jack's Oyster House, Scrimshaw, Yono's, Longfellows, The Stockade Inn, Glen Sanders Mansion and Paolo Lombardi's Ristorante) agreed to pay for the teens' meals, and KeyBank picks up the tab for Owens and a female companion.

The fact that a young man and a young woman are paired up for the dinners isn't an accident. Owens wants to impart lessons not just on what piece of silverware to use, but how young people should treat each other. He's a big believer in chivalry, and he insists that the male walk up to the female's door, ring the bell and introduce himself.

"You're not going to call her on the cell phone or beep the

horn to let her know you're here," he said.

Once everyone actually sits down to dinner, Owens has a long list of topics to cover. He likes to talk to the teens about academics, finding out what their favorite subjects are and why. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, he tells the program participants that college will be the best four years of their lives but stresses that they need to take their academics seriously. To that end, he has a foolproof plan for pulling a GPA of at least 3.0.

"Go to class every day," he said. "Sit in front. Make sure the teacher knows your name. Study. Go for extra help."

He is careful not to make the students feel like he is talking "at" them. He encourages them to ask questions: "I want this to be very engaging," he said.

Christie, who had roasted duck at Yono's, said the experience was "wonderful."

"What I learned really helped me," she said.

In fact, not long after dining with Owens, Christie had to attend an awards dinner at the Albany Marriott, where she was able to draw on the etiquette lessons she's gotten through the "Menus, Manners and Mentors" program.

Mobeles, who joined Christie at Yono's, figures his new knowledge will come in handy, too.

"It was really helpful," he

said. "I learned a lot about dining etiquette, like where the forks and knives go."

That's just what Owens wants to hear, hoping that the teens will be more comfortable in formal situations than he was that night in New York City nearly two decades ago.

As for the future of "Menus, Manners and Mentors," Owens isn't sure what direction the program will take, as he can't see himself devoting as much time to it as he did this year.

"It's a lot of work," he said.

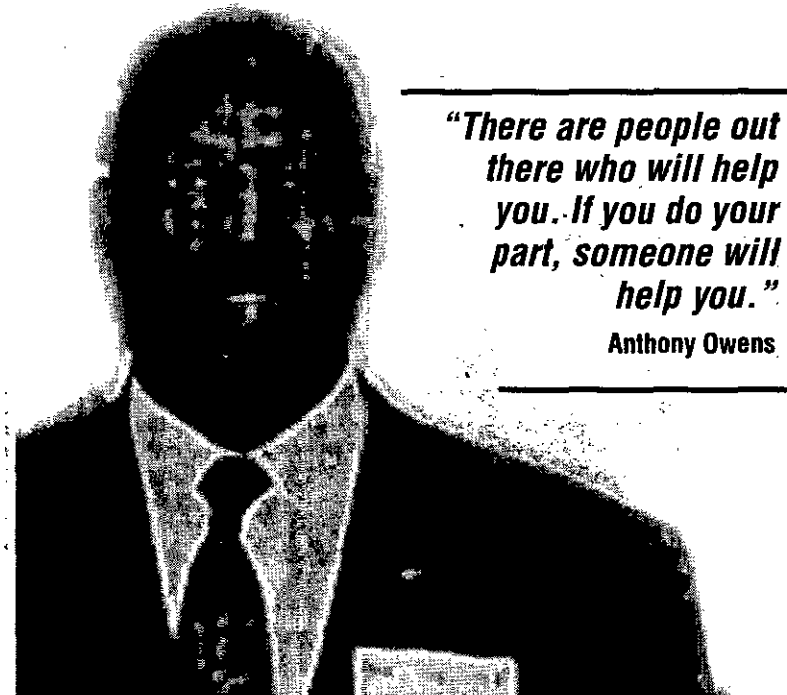
But he's confident it will go on and that he and KeyBank will continue to play some role. He had high praise for everyone who has taken part: KeyBank, Siena, the YMCA, the restaurants, the businesspeople and the students.

"No one loses in this situation," he said.

Owens' ultimate hope is to have the 16 teens in the program do something similar for another crop of teens, who will then reach out to more teens, and so on. Mobeles and Christie are both on board with that idea.

"I'd really like to help others get that advantage," Mobeles said.

"I just don't like to see our generation struggling," Christie added. "I think (the program) is amazing. I don't think words can even describe how wonderful it is."

school tax bill of \$72.68.

"I feel it is important to notify residents about this change to the New York State STAR program because I am very concerned about the impact on our seniors with this adjustment," said Bethlehem Town Supervisor Jack Cunningham.

Assemblyman Tim Gordon, I-Bethlehem, secured \$500,000 for the district from the state budget, which was supported by Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, and subsequently passed in the finalized state budget in April. The funding was secured after the district's Board of Education adopted the tentative budget on March 18, which in turn lowered the original projected increase.

"Bethlehem schools are known for the first-rate education they provide to our kids. However, sustaining that quality education for our kids should not further burden local property taxpayers," Gordon said. "I could not sit by and let Bethlehem lose funding. Cuts lead to one of two outcomes — either a program would be lost or property taxpayers would face an additional tax burden."

A statewide budget vote for local schools and libraries will be held May 20, when residents

will also vote on school board members and library trustees. In Bethlehem, this year's vote will take place at the high school off of Delaware Avenue.

The proposed \$84.8 million spending plan for the district will remain the same, according to school officials, but the additional funding will take some of the budget's burden off of the local taxpayers. Out of the \$500,000 netted by Gordon, \$175,000 is being used to lower the estimated tax rate and the other \$325,000 will take the place of capital construction funding to help equip and furnish Eagle Elementary.

The new school, the district's first in more than 50 years, will be open in the fall, and an open house with guided tours will be held on Saturday, May 10, from 2 until 3:30 p.m.

Newly adjusted projections show that the school tax rate for Bethlehem will be \$18.78 and \$18.46 for New Scotland, which is down 6 cents per \$1,000 of assessment from earlier projections.

This means that the owner of a \$200,000 home in Bethlehem can expect an increase of \$138 in their school taxes, and the same homeowner in New Scotland will see an estimated \$172 increase.

The extra funds and lowered tax rate come at a time when STAR benefits are being reduced for the district.

Seniors who participate in the Enhanced STAR exemption will see an increase of \$137.40 in their tax bill. STAR benefits change from year-to-year based on a state formula, but, according to Cunningham, the exemptions can now be adjusted at a rate of up to 10 percent instead of the previous 5 percent limit that was in place.

The basic STAR exemption is being decreased from \$40,160 to \$36,140, with Enhanced STAR, which is awarded to seniors with fixed income, being reduced from \$76,020 to \$68,420.

Matt Leon, communications director of the Bethlehem Central School District, said the STAR rates do change from year to year, and that the increase is not a permanent rate.

The state's Department of Real Property Services sent out a release on the matter.

"After nearly a decade, the amounts of the exemptions vary due to several factors, including whether the municipality has reassessed its property, the level of assessment of the individual municipality, and other aspects set forth in state law," the release stated. "In addition to changes in the exempt amount, the amount of STAR savings may vary based on the amount of taxes being collected by the given school district."

Chamber holds awards dinner

Local businesses, residents honored for community contributions

The saying goes that all politics is local, and businesses in the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce said the same applies to them, as they honored one another on Thursday, April 24.

The annual awards ceremony recognizes local business leaders and residents who enrich the community through their various endeavors, and it is well attended by local lawmakers and politicians who describe the chamber as "the heart of the community."

Chamber President Marty DeLaney hosted the event at New Visions on Krumkill Road, formerly known as the Albany ARC, a chapter of the New York State Association for Retarded Citizens.

Channel 13 News anchor Jim Kambrich served as the master of ceremonies for the event and read introductions for each of the award winners. Kambrich himself lives in Bethlehem and has been an emcee at the event before.

"Everything I saved in gas money from traveling to Wolf Road," Kambrich joked, "my wife can spend right here in Bethlehem."

He also thanked New Visions

for hosting the event, saying, "Every day, 600 people come to New Visions, all of whom live and work in Bethlehem."

Each of the award winners is a visible part of the community, according to DeLaney, and although they did not ask to be recognized, the chamber took it upon itself to do so.

"Mickey is a role model for other business people, by supporting local organizations for over 10 years," Kambrich read at the ceremony. "He sees the value in giving back to the community that supports his business, and responds to so many requests from his customers with cheerfulness."

influencing hundreds of children through her community involvement. For over five years she has served as faith formation teacher for the Church of St. Thomas the Apostle," Kambrich said. "She has been a Girl Scout Troop Leader for many years and also trains future Scout leaders. Kathleen is now becoming a Cub Scout leader as well. Kathleen balances her life by working part time at Albany Medical Center as a Radiation/Oncology nurse."

Kalmer is the chair of the volunteer grounds and beautification committee at Slingerlands Elementary School, and patients benefit from her compassionate care. She and her husband have also set up a scholarship fund at the hospital.

VanDeloo accepted his award last of the three, joking, he would try to get his speech short, something he isn't known for.

"Joe is a Vietnam-era vet, honorably discharged from the U.S. Air Force. He is the epitome of all that the Post stands for," Kambrich read. "Besides assisting with planning for the huge Bethlehem Memorial Day Parade, every year Joe voluntarily organizes and presents a thank-you meal at the Post for the hundreds of parade marchers."

VanDeloo serves in many capacities at the Post, including cleaning, building maintenance

and handling the finances. Over several years as a post member, VanDeloo has served as the Commander and the chairman of the board.

Appearances at the award dinner by prominent community members included: Cunningham; Councilman Kyle Kotary; Sen. Neil Breslin; Albany County Executive Michael Breslin; Assemblyman Tim Gordon; and Bethlehem Schools Superintendent Les Loomis, who was given the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Peter Applebee, from Applebee Funeral Home; Val Newell, from the Board of the Bethlehem Cemetery Association; and Rick Ryther from the Board of the First United Methodist Church, were all given awards.

Ryther was the last to give his acceptance of the three, and joked, "I think you got us mixed up, the church comes in between the funeral home and the cemetery."

Other businesses over 100 years old in town included Delmar Reformed Church; Callanan Industries; Community United Methodist Church; First Reformed Church of Bethlehem; and AAA Hudson Valley, according to DeLaney.

hem graduate and the father of a newborn daughter. His widow, Katie, helped organize the event and was on hand with their daughter Natalie, now nearly 3 years old.

"It was great," Katie Moshier said after the races had finished. "I think overall it was a huge success and the community support was tremendous, and it was a good way to celebrate Tim's life." Money raised in the race is

earmarked for the Fisher House, a Bethlehem Central scholarship fund, and the Gold Star Family Support Center at Fort Hood.

The big winner of the race was Geoff Decker of Brooklyn, a 26-year-old runner and an original organizer of the event. Decker helped to create it last year in honor of his friend, and he finished the race at 15:38, which was a little less than 2 minutes before the second place winner.

"What the race is really about for me," said Decker after posting his impressive time, "is that it's a chance for people who grew up

with Tim to come back together again. ... Hopefully I'll be running in this every year."

Claudell Washington, 26, of Albany came in second for the men with 17:17 on the clock, and Chris Dewalt, 29, of Queens took third with 17:44.

The first-place runner on the women's side was Erin Boyle of Queens, Katie Moshier's former college roommate. The 28-year-old crossed the finish line at 18:18.

"I told her on Friday, 'I expect you to win this race tomorrow,' and she said she would try

and give her best performance," Moshier joked. "And the next day, she won."

The second-place female was 42-year-old Eileen Leavitt of Delmar, with 20:14, and third place went to Katie Hodge, 36, of Delmar, who came in at 20:29. Moshier herself crossed the finish line at 30:18.

American flags lined Kenwood Avenue throughout the event as veterans, current service members, police, and even the Patriot Guard Riders all paid homage to a fallen comrade.

However, they weren't the only ones enjoying the spring run.

Local politicians, business owners, residents, runners, friends and family, all made an appearance at the event, some participating in the run and others just enjoying the scene as spectators.

The first-place team winner was Team Bethlehem, headed by Town Supervisor Jack Cunningham.

"I did well; I was happy with my time," Cunningham said about his 23:47 finish. "I'm a runner. ... I usually go running every day at lunchtime; that's why I try not schedule any appointments between 12:30 and 1:30."

Cunningham tied Mark LaVigne's time and the two were the first Team Bethlehem members to cross the finish line. Other team members from Town Hall included: Bethlehem Deputy Police Chief Tim Beebe; Councilman Mark Hennessey; Keith Siliman, planning board attorney; Mary Tremblay-Glass, human resource manager; and Robert Leslie, senior planner.

The second-place team was the Albany Police Department, whose members all crossed the line in a military-style marching formation between 29:41 and 29:45.

Albany County Michael Breslin, himself a Vietnam War veteran, also made an appearance and

helped hand out awards.

"We all remember him and what he did for us," Breslin said of Tim Moshier. "Katie, thank you for making all of this happen."

Josh Merlis, of Albany Running Event Productions, who timed the runners, said it was an honor to be a part of the community event.

"I know Geoff Decker, who created it last year, and the family asked us to be involved. ... This was a race we definitely wanted to do," Merlis said. "The race takes on a new dimension when it's in honor of a fallen soldier."

Merlis described the experience as "very rewarding," and added that he himself was a runner but couldn't participate in the event because he was timing it.

"If I'm not running in it," he said, "then I'm timing it."

Along with the main race were the children's race and the Tot Trot, which Katie Moshier said was very successful and a great part of the event.

Her daughter ran in the Tot Trot, although she didn't win — she was too caught up in the fun of the moment to worry about the nuances of competition.

"She did exactly what I thought she'd do," Katie said of Natalie. "She made it about halfway and saw all her friends and stopped and started smiling and giggling."

Natalie ran in the 26.2-yard race with many of her friends from the Corporate Woods Children's Center, which is managed by Bright Horizons, Family Solutions, who sponsored the Tot Trot.

Even though an American hero has been laid to rest for more than two years, with 502 runners finishing the race and hundreds more watching, Bethlehem residents made it clear that the memory of Capt. Timothy Moshier will live on.

The Jefferson Awards is a program established through the American Institute for Public Service.

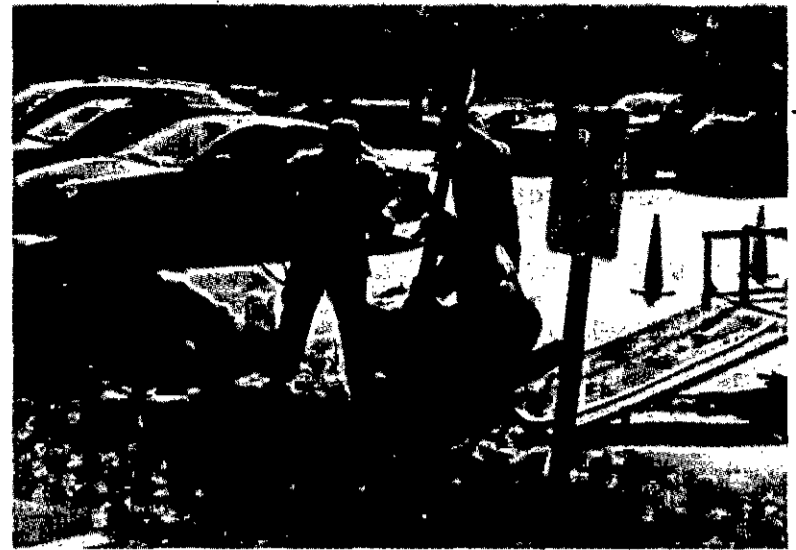

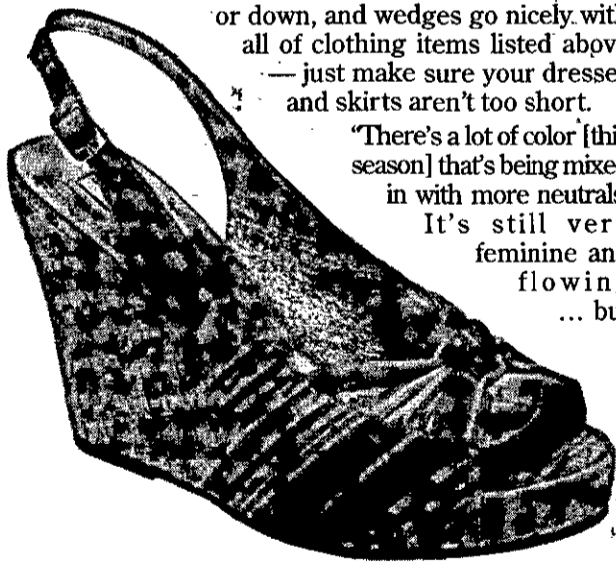

As for you men, don't worry — we haven't left you out. You guys are in luck because this season the trends look comfortable.

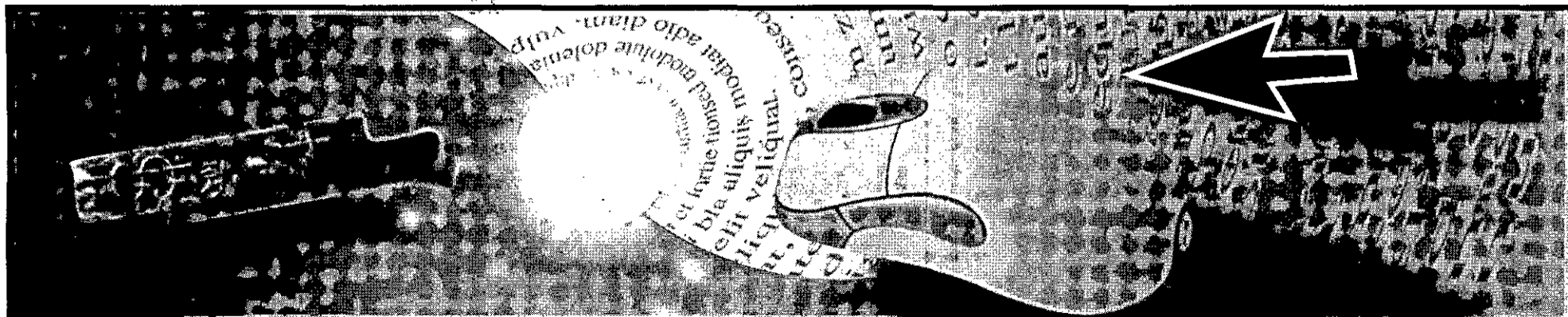

Michael Cee dreams big.

Wanting to raise awareness of AIDS and HIV, the virus that causes it, he decided to hold a fundraising concert in Lake George.

The event's Web site touts it as "the greatest four-day event in HIV/AIDS' history."

"We're going to try to do what Willie Nelson did for Farm Aid," Cee said, referring to the concerts the country singer organized to highlight the loss of family farms and to raise funds to keep families on their land.

Beyond the concert, Cee envisions building a hospital for HIV and AIDS patients, similar to what Danny Thomas did with St. Jude, an internationally known pediatric treatment and research facility. He wants to award college scholarships to people across the country infected with HIV and AIDS. He envisions bringing celebrities on board to support the cause.

It's a personal mission; Cee lost a friend to HIV and knows a 26-year-old woman who has fought it all her life.

"HIV is our most serious problem," he said.

The issue may be serious, but Cee hopes the concert will be a light-hearted, good time. Set for Thursday to Sunday, May 1 to 4, at the Lake George Forum, the concert will feature nearly 40 bands, all of whom donated their time.

Cee is quick to note, "We don't have any Grammy winners," but he's excited about the lineup.

"We have some great road acts," he said, rattling off

names like Big Frank and the Bargain Bingers, the JCF Group and Bobby Dick and the Sundowners.

Multiple genres will be covered: The schedule includes country acts, rock and rollers and some punk and heavy metal, Cee said.

"I'm trying to get something for everyone," he said.

There will be plenty for night owls, too: On Thursday and Saturday, the last band takes the stage at 2 a.m. On Saturday, the Mickey Cee Road Show will perform at 3 a.m.

Sunday wraps up relatively early, with the last band slated to go on at 10 p.m.

Bring Forth Ragnarok is part of Sunday's Battle of the Bands, featuring local groups.

"We're looking for a big high school and college draw on Sunday," Cee said.

Overall, he thinks the concert will be fun for all ages and encouraged families to attend. Tickets are \$25 per day.

"It's a little high, but we had to do it," Cee said, noting that sponsors for the event have

been hard to find.

The proceeds are earmarked for the scholarship fund as well as for securing venues for future concerts. Cee's grand plan is to hold concerts every month or so, but those will be one-shot deals rather than multiple-day extravaganzas.

Many home and garden products contain potentially dangerous chemicals that must be disposed of safely. These are usually found in basements, kitchens, garages, storage sheds and bathrooms.

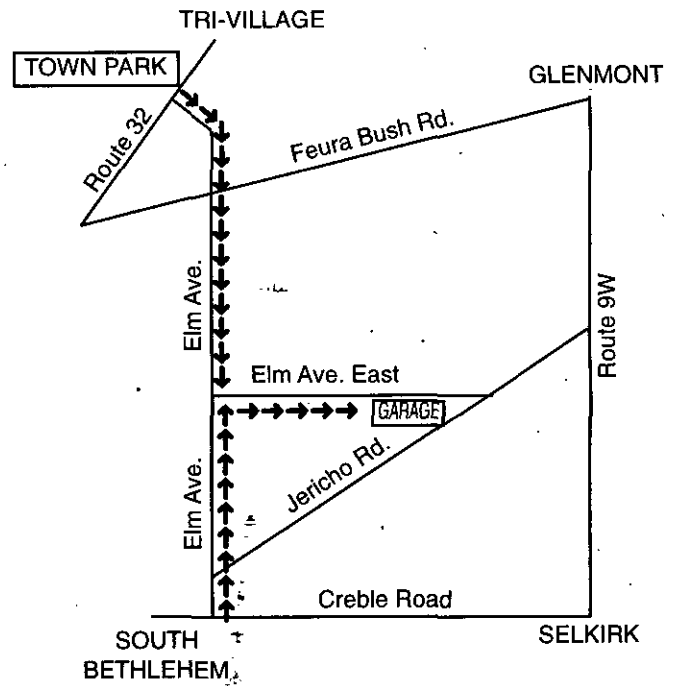
WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Only residents from the Town of Bethlehem and other pre-approved municipalities can participate and only home generated hazardous wastes are acceptable. A valid New York State driver's license or current Town of Bethlehem tax bill is required as proof of residence. Residents from other participating municipalities must have a special coupon for admittance.

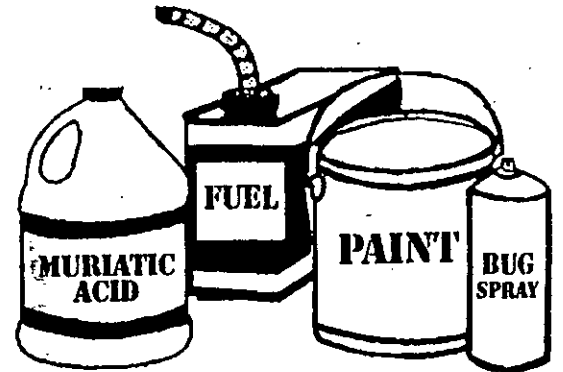
HOW TO PARTICIPATE?

- All hazardous wastes must be in their original, labeled containers. Tighten caps and lids.
- Sort and pack materials securely in a sturdy cardboard box; use newspaper or cardboard to keep items from tipping or hitting each other.
- Wrap leaking containers in newspaper and place in plastic bags or a larger container.
- Place chemicals that may react with each other in separate parts of the car.
- **DO NOT** smoke near chemicals or leave product in a hot, unventilated vehicle for an extended period of time.
- For your safety, please stay in your car. Workers will unload the material.
