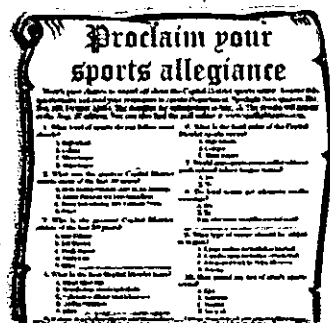

## School board begins new year

### Superintendent Tebbano takes over the reins as new members seated

Even though it's summer, it was like the first day of school for the Bethlehem Board of Education as it kicked off its 2008-09 year and introduced its new members and new superintendent.

At its Wednesday, July 9, meeting, the board unanimously voted to reinstate James Lytle as its

president and James Dering as its vice president. The meeting also marked the first for Michael Tebbano as the district's new superintendent.

Tebbano was the district's assistant superintendent and took over the spot from longtime superintendent Les Loomis, which in turn created an opportunity for several Bethlehem administrators to move up the ranks. The district has also recently named former Middle School Principal Jody Monroe as assistant superintendent to fill Tebbano's vacancy and Assistant Middle School Principal Sandy Morley to fill Monroe's.

Newly elected board of education members Laura Ladd Bierman and Matt Downey were sworn in and introduced at the meeting as well. Both were elected in May when they ran unopposed for two open seats on the board.

Bierman is self-employed in a home business providing consulting and financial management services for a national membership organization. She first moved to Delmar in 1982, and has lived in the district for a total of 11 years, recently returning in 2005.

## 21<sup>st</sup> District race narrows

### Candidates drop out as petition-filing date passes

And then there were seven.

Five Democrats and two Republicans remain in the hunt for a congressional seat in the state's 21<sup>st</sup> District after four candidates were forced to drop out of the race because of either their inability to collect the state-mandated number of petition signatures or raise sufficient funds to continue.

Candidates were required to submit 1,250 signatures to the state Board of Elections by Thursday, July 10, in order to remain in the race.

Democrats Arthur Welser, Craig Burrige, John Aretakis and Lester Freeman all dropped out of the race earlier this month.

Welser and Burrige cited their inability to collect enough signatures as their reason for exiting the race. Welser, a real estate agent, said he thought his campaign came to a halt when he failed to gain an endorsement from local Realtors.

"I had trouble getting people to get out and petition for me," said Welser.

Burrige echoed Welser's sentiments.

"People made promises that they didn't keep to carry my petitions," said Burrige.

Aretakis, an attorney, said he withdrew from the political showdown to concentrate on clergy sexual abuse litigation and activism.

"I'm balancing a lot of things," said Aretakis. "My real message has been changing the laws re-

# Police Blotter

## Police charge man with stealing painkillers from CVS

Joshua P. Garrett, 22, of Delmar, was arrested by Bethlehem police on Thursday, July 3, for fourth-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance; fifth-degree attempted criminal possession of a control substance; fourth-degree grand larceny — all felonies — and attempted petty larceny, a misdemeanor.

Police said an investigation by the state Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement found that Garrett is suspected of taking 2,200 Hydrocodone 10/325 pills from the CVS Pharmacy in Delmar.

Hydrocodone, a generic narcotic painkiller similar to Vicodin, is a schedule III controlled substance.

The larceny was said to occur

between Feb. 21 and June 24, according to the arrest report.

Garrett “did provide a statement to members of the New York State Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement implicating himself in said incidents,” the report said.

In addition, pharmacy personnel observed Garrett attempting to steal a 100-count bottle of Hydrocodone 10/325 pills from CVS on June 24.

Garrett turned himself in to the Bethlehem Police Department with his attorney, and Justice Paul Dwyer set his bail at \$20,000 during his arraignment in Bethlehem Town Court.

Garrett was scheduled to return to court on July 15.

### Other arrests

- Barbara E. Kubisek, 37, of Albany and listed as homeless by the Bethlehem police, was arrested Thursday, July 10, in Glenmont, for felony second-degree forgery, second-degree criminal impersonation and petty larceny.

Bethlehem police said they received a call from the Glenmont Wal-Mart’s loss-prevention officers reporting that a shoplifter had fled the store, and, while patrolling the area, police saw a person matching the description walking on Glenmont Drive.

Kubisek was detained by police and later identified by a Wal-Mart representative as the suspect in question, according to the arrest report. She was asked for her name after being advised of the consequences of criminal impersonation, the report states.

Police said Kubisek gave them a false name and was brought to the Bethlehem Police station where shortly thereafter her real identity was discovered and the documents she signed a false name to were taken as evidence.

Photographs were taken of the stolen merchandise and Kubisek was arraigned in front of Justice Paul Dwyer and sent to Albany County Correctional Facility on \$30,000 bail, according to the report.

Police said an active felony warrant for Kubisek’s arrest was discovered out of the Rensselaer County Sheriff’s Department, who were notified of Kubisek’s status.

- Mark W. Sitts, 26, of Delmar was arrested on Wednesday, July 9, in Glenmont for felony first-degree aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle; DWI; operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of 0.08 percent or greater; unlawful possession of marijuana; insufficient turn signal; and driving on the shoulder of the roadway.

Bethlehem Police said Sitts was seen turning right on Corning Hill off of River Road “failing to give [the] appropriate signal,” and, when officers continued following him, he was seen driving on the shoulder of the road.

Police attempted to stop Sitts in front of a convenience store when “the operator jumped out of the vehicle in an attempt to go in the store,” but officers told him to return to his vehicle, according to the arrest report.

Sitts told police, “My license is suspended,” and produced a photo identification card, the report states. Police said Sitts smelled like alcohol when interviewing him and that he displayed signs of intoxication.

After failing several field-sobriety tests, Sitts was taken into custody, and during an inventory of his vehicle by police “a small

baggie of marijuana was located,” according to police.

His vehicle was towed and Sitts was transported to the Bethlehem Police Station, the report states, where he consented to a chemical test, and it was discovered that he had 11 suspensions, one of which included a DWAI, on his driver’s license from five different dates.

The report also states that Sitts was released from police custody on \$500 bail.

- Jeffery J. Thomas Jr., 36, of Amsterdam, was arrested by Bethlehem police on July 1, for DWI; operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of 0.08 percent or greater; speeding; unlicensed operation of motor vehicle; failure to keep right; and for not wearing a seatbelt.

Police said Thomas was observed driving north on River Road going 78 MPH in a 55-MPH zone and that he crossed the center line of the road way near the Albany city line.

When interviewing Thomas, police smelled alcohol, according to the arrest report, and after failing a field-sobriety test and testing positive for alcohol on prescreening device he was taken into custody.

Thomas’ vehicle was towed and he is scheduled to return to Bethlehem Town Court on July 15, the report states.

# State park to see array of upgrades

Thacher renovation will feature new summer, spring and fall attractions

Plans to improve a local summer hotspot were unveiled on Monday, July 7, accompanied by assurances of multi-seasonal athletic fun for a wide range of patrons.

Capital improvements to John Boyd Thacher State Park are expected to be completed by 2010, according to information provided by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

Officials stated that the improvements will total \$7 million and will feature a new recreation area in addition to a "sprayground."

"A new sprayground will have over 40 spray features, including tumble buckets, super soakers and water cannons. There will be distinct areas for different age groups, surrounded by a shaded deck as well as sunbathing, eating and open lawn areas. In addition, the bathhouse will be reconstructed," according to a statement from the parks office.

Legislators and officials gathered at the aquatic facility in Thacher Park to unveil new plans.

"I have a feeling that this is really going to put the park on

the map," said Assemblyman John McEneny D-Albany, whose district houses the park. "It is important that we take our obligation of stewardship seriously, as we bring this wonderful resource up to all that it can be."

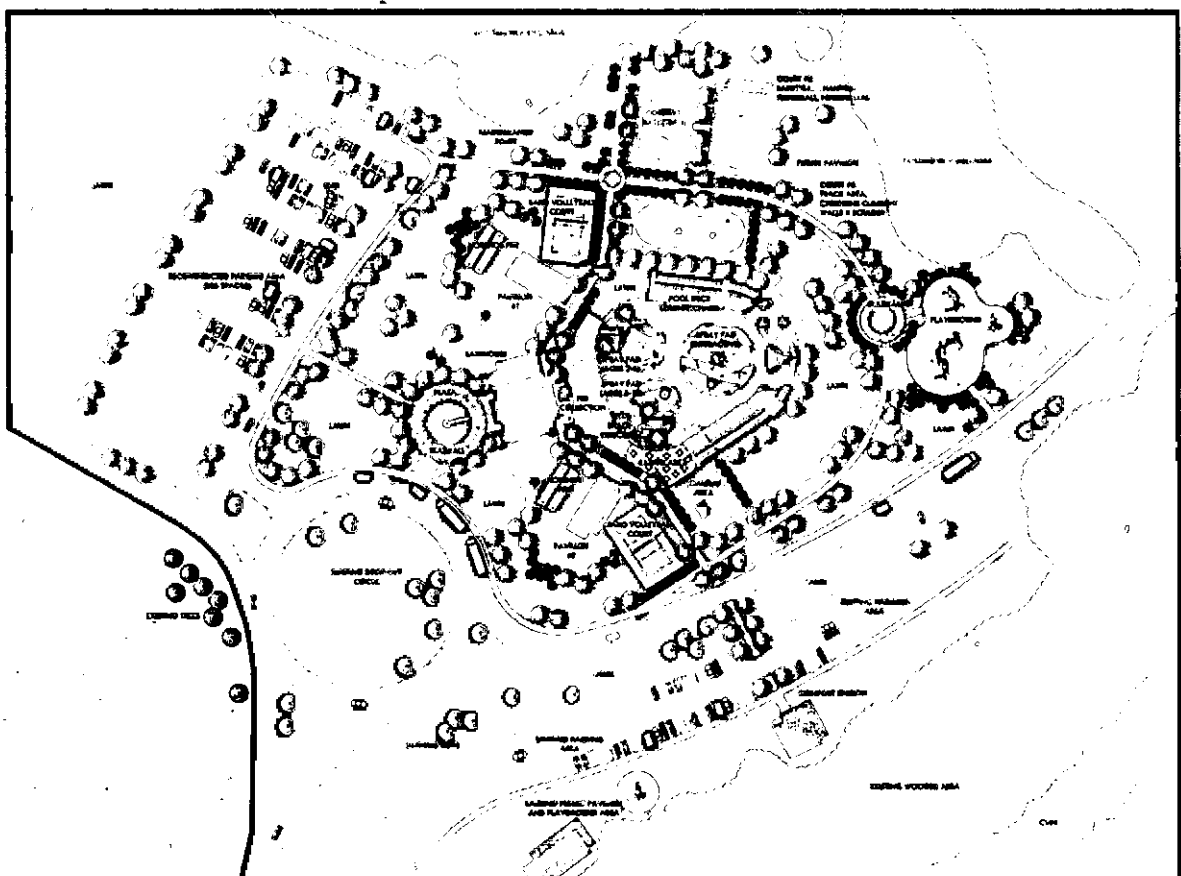
McEneny said he has a 3-year-old grandchild and will frequent the park with his family.

The parks office stated the recreation area will be expanded and will include two picnic pavilions. The pavilions will have sand volleyball courts and horseshoe pits, as well as a basketball court and games court. The park will also be installing a 250-foot track, a climbing area, and several new playgrounds. Other improvements include paving four new parking lots and improving the drinking water system.

"While the main attraction of this recreational area will be the sprayground, we are also excited that all of the other features will be three-season, providing great play opportunities from spring through fall," state parks Commissioner Carol Ash said in a written statement.

The recreation and climbing area will provide opportunities to enjoy the park outside of the summer season, said park spokesman Dan Keefe. He also said the park will provide locals with an inexpensive outlet to have a good time.

The projects are being funded through a \$132 million statewide initiative to revitalize New York

state parks and historic sites, along with federal funding and a grant from the Environmental Protection Fund.

The investment will be the largest in the New York state park system, but will only dent the estimated \$700 million needed to upgrade the New York's 178 state parks and 35 historic sites, according to information provide by state parks office.

"A first-class parks system provides families with the opportunity for healthy recreation, protects the state's unique natural resources, and attracts residents, tourists, and private investment to communities around our state,"

Gov. David A. Paterson said in a statement. "The investment in John Boyd Thacher State Park and others across the state will enable state parks to continue nourishing the quality of life in New York State, while preserving and improving local economic assets."

Thacher Park used to have an on-site pool but it closed in 2005 due to infrastructure problems. A plan for new pool was discussed in 2006 but ultimately squashed. Officials will not replace the 55-year-old pool, but instead use the money to improve the recreation area and create a sprayground. The pool saw a drop in attendance in the decade

before it closed, according to the Office of Parks. Attendance fell from nearly 30,000 in the beginning of the 1990s to 12,369 in 2005.

According to information provided by the Office of Parks, Thatcher Park is 1934 acres and brings in nearly 300,000 patrons each year. State parks and historic sites entertain more than 55 million visitors per year.

"The renovations come at an absolutely perfect time," said Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Albany. "It is a great day destination. There are more than 1 million people with in a 20-mile radius of the park."

# Glenmont Fireman's Fair still a hot weekend event

Community staple trimmed to one weekend instead of two

After 52 years, many things in the Glenmont community may have changed as businesses have sprung up along busy Route 9W and the community has grown, but the annual Glenmont Fireman's Fair continues to be a community staple.

Starting on Thursday, July 17, the Selkirk Fire Company No. 2 is once again inviting the community to a weekend of entertainment, games, food and fun. The event is held at Selkirk



Fire Company No. 2, which was founded in 1953 and is still housed in its original location at 301 Glenmont Road, off Route 9W.

There were some changes this year, according to Assistant Fire Chief Doug VanApeldoorn. This year's event is being held on a single weekend instead of two. The Glenmont Fireman's Fair will take place for three days on Thursday, Friday and Sturday, July 17, 18 and 19, from 6 until 11 each night.

The annual flea market, which will have full kitchen services provided by the ladies auxiliary and more than 100 vendors, will be held the following week on July 26.

Families can expect the same great community event as they do every year, VanApeldoorn said.

"It's a safe and fun event for the entire family. ...We're just giving back to the community," said VanApeldoorn. "This is our annual fundraiser, and it all goes to the community."

The MacBoston 18 Truck was inspired by the line-of-duty death of firefighter Paul MacMurray from Hudson Falls. "Mac" was from MacMurray, Boston, where the truck originally served, and 18 was his badge number. In addition, the truck was used to memorialize Brian Myers Sr. from Schuylerville, and Chief Thomas M. McCormack of Watervliet. Most recently, the MacBoston 18 Truck was dedicated to the memory of all firefighters who have died in the line of duty or as a result of a line-of-duty accident.

There will be a cook shed with everything from fried dough to buckets of steamed clams and clam chowder, as well as games with prizes for the kids. There will be an inflatable bounce house and face painting on site, and of course, ice cream and snow cones.

The Bethlehem Volunteer Ambulance Company will also be on hand to give people free blood pressure readings.

On Saturday, July 19, the MacBoston 18 Truck will be rolling onto the scene, too. The truck, which is membership-owned and was incorporated as the MacBoston Truck Boosters Inc., on April 4, 1997, provides a rolling memorial for firefighters who have died in the line of duty.

The proceeds from the event help the fire department

donate to area food banks and organizations such as Families in Need and Blue Star Mothers, as well as hold community programs such as Fire Prevention Week.

The Glenmont Pioneer Bank and Elk Sign Shop owner Rodger White help the fire department put the event on.

Part of the reason the Glenmont Fireman's Fair is so important and draws such a crowd each year, besides being a sort of homecoming event for area firefighters, is that it's the only one in the area besides the New Salem Pumpkintown Fair.

"We're like the drive-ins," VanApeldoorn said. "There's not many of us left."

Selkirk Fire Company No. 2 Fire Chief Bill Asprion said the fair brings the residents of community together each year.

"It's a hometown fair. It kind of brings back the signs of yesteryear," said Asprion. "As the years have changed, and I've been at the department 32 years, you used to know everybody by their first name, but now you don't see that anymore. ...This helps change that."

The Selkirk Fire Company No. 2 serves the 8,500 people living in a 30-square-mile area in the Town of Bethlehem. It is one of three companies that form the Selkirk Fire District.

"Come on out," Asprion said. "Eat some good food and have a good time."

# Window treatments deserve second opinion

I hesitate to sound like Amelia Bedelia, but could someone please explain why windows need treatments? Is it to prevent window sickness?

Maybe windows have a self-esteem issue. They feel like they are being looked at all the time. Other times they feel like people just look right through them as if they are not even there. It's tough not knowing whether you'll be scrutinized or ignored on any given day.

I'm guessing that a group of interior designers, fabric manufacturers, and scientists came up with the concept of window treatments.

Before window treatments there were "window coverings," also known as curtains. Some window coverings included bed sheets slung over a rod. These primitive sheet-based window coverings are still used in modern times by college students, people who have just moved into a new home and anyone who does not want to go into debt.

Window treatments are expensive and they are not covered under any insurance plan.

I cut down on costs by waiting for other people to tire of their window treatments. This can take years.

When we bought our house the sellers were kind enough to leave shades or mini blinds in all of the upstairs rooms, shades in the living room and dining room, and drapes in the family room. A few days later my sister updated her living room and passed along the lovely valances that now hang in my dining room.

The valances in our master bedroom also came from my sister's house, along with a matching comforter/dust ruffle set I had coveted for some time. Though her bedroom windows had been well treated for many years, they did not survive a renovation. Alas, the old valances did not fit the replacement windows. Meanwhile, my windows, untreated for nearly a decade, finally received some decoration.

Aside from the expense, picking out window treatments is daunting because there are so many choices: Valances, balloon valances, sashes, drapes, curtains, panels, tab-top panels, and scarves. Or you can do blinds, mini blinds, vertical blinds, horizontal blinds,

plastic shades, fabric shades, or accordion shades that look like mini binds.

In our house we have mostly valances and shades. We also dress our windowpanes with vinyl decorations that cling to the glass. Depending on the time of year the clings are in the shape of autumn leaves or snowflakes or tulips. So if we can't get close enough to actually look out the window, at least we have an idea what season it is.

Some people have seasonal window treatments: one set for spring and summer and another for fall and winter. That's probably a good way to avoid getting bored. Also, once the curtains are down you can clean them. For me, that's another reason to keep them hanging.

Poofy valances (ones stuffed with paper) and pleated curtains are a real challenge to maintain. They never look exactly like they do in the catalogue or the photograph on the front of the package. If you wash them they may not look right when you hang them back up. I think some people have their curtains dry-cleaned, which is like treating your window treatments to a day at the spa. Those people need to hope their window treatments don't get lost at the dry cleaners.

Dusting mini blinds takes forever, especially when you do it

infrequently. If you use the brush attachment to your vacuum, be careful; blinds are delicate. One wrong move and all the slats will be forever misaligned. The little pull string that raises and lowers the blinds gives out over time and loses control of the slats. Eventually, only one side of the slats will move at a time, resulting in a slanted window covering. Or, the slats will insist on unrolling their full length until the entire window and the wall underneath are covered down to the floor. Operating blinds is mighty tricky.

I like plain old shades, although they can be as sensitive as the mini blinds. You need to learn the assorted secret "tugs" that signal the shade to go up or down a notch. Apply the wrong amount of pressure and the shade either refuses to go up or violently snaps out of your hand and quickly rolls into a tube.

I've had good luck with my living room shades. Usually I just leave them alone. I like the shades up so that sunlight can stream into the room. I only pull them down to avoid subjecting passers-by to my aerobic exercise routines. Those are infrequent, so neither my shades nor I get much of a workout.

I had a difficult time figuring out what to do with my living room windows. I looked through countless catalogues, spent hours in the department stores, and examined the window treatments in other people's houses. I even went to the fabric stores with my sewing sisters-in-law (one local, and one in from out of town) who have the talent to create curtains.

After much research I determined I could get sheer panels that would block the view but allow light through. The sheer panels would be hung under curtains. The curtains would be tied back to reveal the sheers. To darken the room the curtains would be released.

Each of the four windows would need two sheer panels and two curtains plus the rods, tiebacks and miscellaneous hardware. Oh, and a valance

for the top. Or two valances for each window if I wanted an extra poofy look. Or four valances per window for a layered, poofy look.

Although I thought I had come to a window treatment decision, I realized that I really didn't want to cover the windows. I liked the look of the windows and I enjoyed having the ability to look out the entire window. I also didn't need yards of dust-collecting fabric.

Also, there was the matter of the green shag carpeting that came with the house. Not the type or color carpeting I would have selected myself, mind you, but one that was still in good shape. And after the expense of the new roof, new siding and new windows, replacing functional carpeting has never been a high priority. Plus, it's the kind of carpet where you don't need to worry about spills or dirty shoes.

Ultimately I decided to hang a simple floral pattern valance over each window. I was able to find reasonably priced valances with a similar color scheme to the wallpaper in the adjacent dining room, thus providing a sort of continuity of design.

Recently a friend and I were talking about window treatments. I told her the history of my living room valances. She said, "With that carpeting you've got, I couldn't have even told you if there was drapery in the room. No offense, but you walk into that room and it's like it's 1973."

Boy was I relieved that I didn't spend a bundle dressing each window only to have them rendered invisible by "that '70s carpeting." I guess I could have skipped the valances too.

With my shag carpeting and vinyl window clings, I'm not worried about Better Homes and Garden stopping by for a photo shoot.

And unlike the storybook Mrs. Rogers, if I hired Amelia Bedelia to "Draw the curtains when the sun comes into the living room" I wouldn't be upset to come home to an illustration of my window treatments.

# RCS Board of Ed elects new leaders

The RCS Board of Education elected Sarah Hafensteiner as president and Cindi Elliot as vice president during its reorganization meeting on Monday, July 7.

Hafensteiner is returning to a post she held before and Elliot is remaining in the same position she held last school year.

Hafensteiner, a Coeymans resident, is in the third year of her sixth non-consecutive term on the board. She previously served on the RCS Board of Education until 2003, holding the posts of chairman of various board committees as well as serving as president and vice president.

She is treasurer of the First Reformed Church of Bethlehem, a playground consultant for Children's Playgrounds by GORIC and a former commercial banker. She has also worked as a substitute teacher in all four RCS schools and has been active in both parent and sports associations.

Elliot is serving her second year on the board.

She is a member of the New Scotland ZBA/Planning Board and has volunteered in the RCS schools, teaching land surveying/mapping in the A.W. Becker Reach Program and assisting the Drama Club.

The district's new interim superintendent, Michael Johnson, has also begun working

in preparation for the start of the school year.

Johnson, who joined RCS following a yearlong stint as interim assistant superintendent in the Mohonasen School District, succeeds former superintendent Vicki Wright.

"My overall goal is to continue to move educational programs forward; always focusing on the best interest of our students," Johnson said.

As a 32-year veteran of the education system, he has served in a host of roles in Capital District schools, from superintendent of the Averill Park schools to assistant principal, principal, counselor, dean of students, department chairman and alternative education teacher.

Johnson was unanimously appointed to the interim post by the Board of Education on Monday, June 2.

# District names middle school principal

The Bethlehem Central Board of Education has appointed middle school Assistant Principal Sandy Morley as the school's principal.

Morley was appointed at the Wednesday, July 9, board meeting. She is filling the vacancy created by Jody Monroe, who was named assistant superintendent for educational programs and instruction last month. Monroe has filled the spot of Michael Tebbano, who was chosen to replace former superintendent Les G. Loomis.

"I am pleased to announce that Sandy will be the principal of the middle school," Tebbano said. "She is a respected member of the school community who always puts kids and their academic achievement and growth first."

Morley was selected for the post after an interview committee screened candidates from across the country and conducted two rounds of interviews.

"She brings to the job a track record of educational leadership, including six years as assistant principal at Bethlehem Central Middle School," the district said in a release.

Prior to coming to the Bethlehem district in 2002, Morley was a physical education teacher at Farnsworth Middle School in the Guilderland Central School District for two decades.

I am looking forward to working with them in this new role." The search for a new assistant principal is under way and is expected to conclude in August, according to the district.

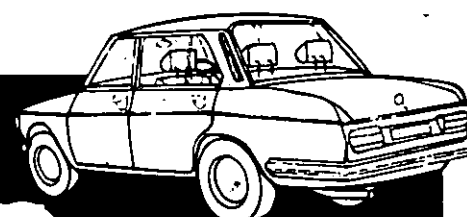

## Middling school

Let's get one thing straight: If your job responsibilities change, but your salary, benefits and work hours are, by all accounts, the same, you have not been demoted.

On Monday, the Guilderland Board of Education decided not to overturn Superintendent John McGuire's decision to transfer high school social studies teachers Matt Nelligan and Ann Marie McManus to Farnsworth Middle School in a 7-to-2 vote.

## Editorial

Nelligan and McManus, whose department was the subject of some arcane (and apparently very limited in scope, as no other department took part) "cultural climate inquiry," are accused of creating a "locker-room mentality" and a "boys' club" within their department.

Nelligan and McManus have characterized the board's decision to move them to the middle school as a demotion — if we subscribe to their argument, then apparently high school educators are, indeed, part of some "boys' club" that fosters this thinking.

Many educators have made a career of teaching at the middle school level, and it's not feasible to imagine that all of them think of middle school as the minor leagues for teaching high school.

As a reader pointed out last week, "The teacher who views middle school as a demotion should make a career change."

School Board President Richard Weisz said the cultural climate inquiry showed there was a hostile work environment in the high school social studies departments. The question now is, with all the public kicking and screaming that Nelligan and McManus are doing regarding their move to the middle school, have they already cultivated that same environment in their new positions at Farnsworth?

There is no doubt that the issue at heart is the inquiry and its findings, but as Nelligan and McManus continue to mischaracterize the board's actions a demotion, the role of the middle school educator takes a drubbing. Nelligan has said he will take legal action to "clear his reputation." Surely most parents would like to think that people with questionable reputations do not teach at all, not that they are relegated to teaching middle school.

By most accounts, Nelligan and McManus are very good social studies teachers who positively shaped the lives of countless students, many of whom have come to support them at recent board of education meetings. They should view this change, as hard to swallow and as unjust as it may be, as a chance to positively influence a different set of students at an earlier stage in their educational development.

To do any less would be a disservice to the children that sit before them, whether it is in a high school or a middle school.

a clash of ideas and morals that could be seen as logical only on the Internet.

Does this mean the Umbro logo is connected to the imperialistic values of the early 1900s? The Nike symbol to Marxist revolutionaries in South America?

The logo is really top notch if you think about it, just like the soccer club. Now, I'm not cheerleading when I say this since every bit of soccer I ever played was in the heat of the Arizona desert, but the Bethlehem Soccer Club has been known to help mold great soccer players who go on to create very solid high school soccer teams. ## Salary comparison unfair

Editor, The Spotlight:

The letter from Peter Xeller in the July 2 edition of *The Spotlight* (*Salary talk shouldn't be limited to teachers*) uses the "average total police officer salary, 2007" for a Bethlehem police officer to compare with the salaries received by Bethlehem Central School District teachers.

While I heartily support the opinion that teachers should be well paid according to their abilities, I feel that the comparison with a police officer's salary is not an appropriate comparison in this situation.

Having been a member of the Bethlehem Police Department for 24 years, I know first hand where the differences lie between the teacher's job and the police officer's.

The average police officer's salary of \$80,514 quoted in Mr.

Xeller's letter included overtime. The teachers, I don't believe, earn overtime. Thus, to earn this \$80,514 amount, the police officer has put in many more hours than most teachers.

Additionally, the police officer salary is for a 12-month job, not just for the school year.

Hopefully the teachers in BCSD do not have to risk their lives and safety daily. Our police officers do.

During the last half of my career with the Bethlehem Police Department I was in a command officer position, therefore not a member of the police union. Thus, I think that I can be objective about the negotiations and resultant salaries and benefits that the police officers' union has achieved throughout collective bargaining with the town.

Our police officers in Bethlehem earn comparable pay with other fine police departments in the region, but by no means are they overpaid or at the top of the scale of police salaries in the area.

They earn every penny that they're paid. I hope our community supports them.

# Area offers a breath of fresh air

**Local families welcome city kids into their homes for the summer**

They may not have been around for all the birthday cakes, first days of school or scraped knees, but in a way, Karen and Tom Dwyer of Latham are like a family to 11-year-old Khaalig Ford.

Every year, for the past five years, Ford has traveled with other children and teens over two hours by bus to greet his "summer family" as part of the Fresh Air Fund.

By definition, the Fresh Air Fund is a not-for-profit program that grants inner-city children the opportunity to breathe "fresh air" in a country/suburban community for two weeks during the summer. But by experience, the program means so much more for the children and families they stay with.

"This will be his fifth year staying with us," said Tom Dwyer. "This is really great, we look forward to it every year."

While the Fresh Air Fund has two programs, one that brings children to a camp outside of the city and one that brings them to host families, children can request to return to the same family year after year if they had an enjoyable time.

Holding up balloons and "welcome back" signs, the Dwyers

eagerly waited on the afternoon of Wednesday, July 2, in the front yard of St. Francis DeSales Church, in Loudonville, for their young friend to get off the bus.

As he rubbed his eyes and made his way down the steep bus stairs, Ford was approached by the Dwyers, who beamed with large smiles and held out their arms.

"Hey, buddy!" said Karen Dwyer, hugging Ford, introducing him to family friends and a friend's small dog, Biscuit.

Later, Ford stood by a black suitcase filled with summer essentials wearing a green nametag with word "Latham" written on it so that program coordinators could ensure that he left with the correct family.

Ford, however, already knew all about the family he was leaving with.

"[Last year] we went underground," said Ford, describing a day trip the family took to a cavern in Schoharie. Ford also spent time last year swimming at the town pool, playing outside with the Dwyers' three children, going to Great Escape in Lake George and catching fireflies.

"We have fireflies in the city, too," interrupted Ford.

While the Dwyers, and the Fresh Air Fund, are nothing new for Ford, for other families, this year was the first time participating in the summer program.

"We've known about this program for many years, but this is the first time we are participating," said Kathy Dutch, of Delmar.

Dutch and husband Hayward, who do not have children of their own, anxiously waited for their summer guest, 10-year-old Diamond Martin, to arrive. According to the couple, this was Martin's first time going away for the summer with the Fresh Air Fund as well.

Hayward Dutch explained the process that the host families and child's parents have to go through to match up the child with the perfect family.

"The mom looks through our paperwork and makes a match based on what we like to do," he said.

According to Kathy Dutch, they "are outdoors people."

Her husband went on to say the host family can choose what sex and age they would like the child staying with them to be. Finally, a match is made, and that is how Martin ended up with the Dutch family.

Kathy Dutch said that Martin will have another companion to spend the two weeks with as well: their chocolate lab.

# Full flavor, hold the cost

**Celebrity chef says eating right doesn't have to be expensive**

If there's one true necessity of life that has been impacted by high fuel prices, it would have to be food. High prices on the grocery shelves shouldn't justify reaching for less healthy alternatives, though.

According to celebrity Chef Jason Roberts, it's possible to eat healthy on a budget with just a little planning and creativity. Roberts was showing moms and kids from Franklin Community Center some ways to do just that, in addition to demonstrating a healthy snack recipe, on Saturday, July 12, at the Saratoga Hilton.

Cutting costs starts at the grocery store. In regards to meat, Roberts recommended that the cost-conscious should move away from the choicer cuts. Instead, braise \$8 of fresh ground chuck with potatoes and tomatoes for a cheap entrée capable of feeding five.

Also, look for spinach in a bag. Roberts said that he saved money on a trip to a local Price Chopper by buying the bags on sale. "They can be very affordable, and a quick way to add color into your lifestyle," he said.

Roberts prefers to use the word "lifestyle" over "diet." "The first three letters are D-I-E and it ends with a cross," he said.

New Zealand born, Roberts discovered his passion for cooking in the kitchen of a boarding house

where his grandmother worked. He also grew up on a dairy farm; he attributes that background to his emphasis on locally grown foods.

"Especially in regards to social and economic factors, it's important to eat locally," he said. "I keep it as local and as fresh as possible."

That was his plan for Tuesday, July 15, when Roberts was scheduled to cook for a Key Bank invitation-only dinner. In the meantime, he toured sheep and berry farms and still found time to whip up smoothies at Key Bank's Latham branch.

The creation he shared with Franklin participants was "Almond and Apricot Energy Balls." With the help of the kids present, he used dried fruits, nuts and orange juice to mold the tasty treats, though he was quick to note that you can be creative when

choosing ingredients for your own energy balls.

"It's a healthy alternative to a chocolate bar or candy," said Roberts. A big part of consistent healthy eating is breaking away from quick fast food solutions, which are often loaded with sugar and white flour products. "There are ways to incorporate food that's fast and healthy as well," he said.

The Franklin Community Center, located on Franklin Street in Saratoga Springs, is a nonprofit organization that works to improve the quality of life for Saratogians through a variety of programs.

Jennifer Loeffler, coordinator of development at Franklin, said that Roberts' tips and recipe should come in handy for those who attended. "Everything in our food pantry is non-perishable, and everything in his recipe was non-perishable," she noted.

## Guilderland board sticks with transfer

**Social studies teachers threaten legal challenge**

The Guilderland Board of Education decided on Monday, July 14, not to overturn Superintendent John McGuire's decision to transfer social studies teachers Matt Nelligan and Ann Marie McManus to Farnsworth Middle School in a 7-to-2 vote.

"I believe Dr. [Michele] Paludi's investigation and reports fairly and credibly establishes that inappropriate behavior occurred between and among adults and that there was a hostile work environment in our high school social studies department," said board President Richard Weisz, who voted not to overturn the transfer.

Paludi was hired by the district to conduct the "culture climate" inquiry that led to the transfer decision.

Nelligan said legal action will follow the decision.

"We will see them in court," Nelligan said. "We are going to take every legal step we can take to make sure our reputation is cleared."

Nelligan reiterated that his transfer is a result of his critical comments of the board and the teachers union.

McManus said her name does not even appear in the inquiry and this transfer will hurt the students the most.

"These reassignments are joined with expanding teacher training and adopting other recommendations in Dr. Paludi's report. Not all of these changes were intended or need to be permanent," Weisz said.

Prior to serving governors Paterson and Spitzer, he served as deputy attorney general for the State Counsel Division of the attorney general's office from 1999 until the end of 2006. He also worked in the attorney general's office from 1979 to 1994, holding a variety of positions, including counsel

to the attorney general and first assistant attorney general. From 1994 through 1998, Rifkin was the executive director of the New York State Ethics Commission.

Rifkin received his undergraduate degree from Washington and Jefferson College, and his law degree from Yale Law School. He was appointed counsel to the Bronx Borough President in 1973 and served as staff counsel to Assemblyman Leonard Stavisky from 1970-1973. Rifkin worked in private practice for seven years after he was admitted to the New York State Bar in 1966.

The 74,000-member New York State Bar Association is the largest voluntary state bar association in the nation. Founded in 1876, the association's programs and activities have continuously served the public and improved the justice system for more than 130 years.

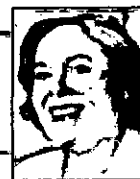

Trooper Brinkerhoff exemplified these principles while serving his state and community," said Paterson. "This highway will help keep his memory and his heroic actions alive. Trooper Brinkerhoff will always be remembered as a man who made the ultimate sacrifice for the well-being of all New Yorkers."

Brinkerhoff, of Coxsackie, was a member of New York State Police's Mobile Response Team. He was killed on April 25, 2007, in the line of duty while trying to capture fugitive Travis Trim near

the Village of Margaretville.

Brinkerhoff was an 8 1/2-year veteran of the state police, and is survived by his wife, Barbara, and daughter Isabella.

Sen. John J. Bonacic, R-Mount Hope, said, "Designating this portion of atate Route 30 is not only a token of our appreciation, it will serve as a reminder to us all, the selfless act of heroism and courage Trooper Brinkerhoff has shown. He was taken from his family much too soon while valiantly protecting New Yorkers. The Trooper David Brinkerhoff Memorial Highway will help to keep his memory alive."

Assembly member Clifford W. Crouch, R-Guilford, said, "The dedication of this section of state Route 30 to the memory of Trooper David C. Brinkerhoff will serve as a reminder of his heroism and dedication in protecting our community."

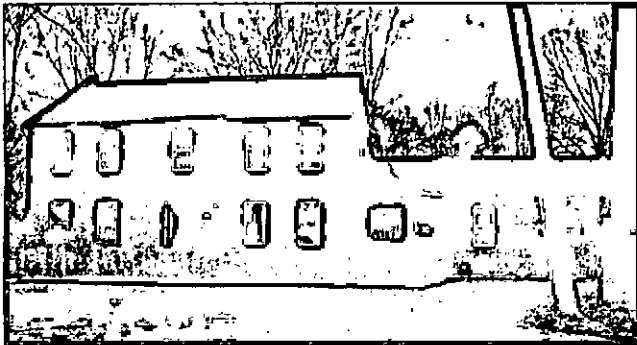
New York State Police Superintendent Harry J. Corbitt noted that Brinkerhoff made "the ultimate sacrifice."

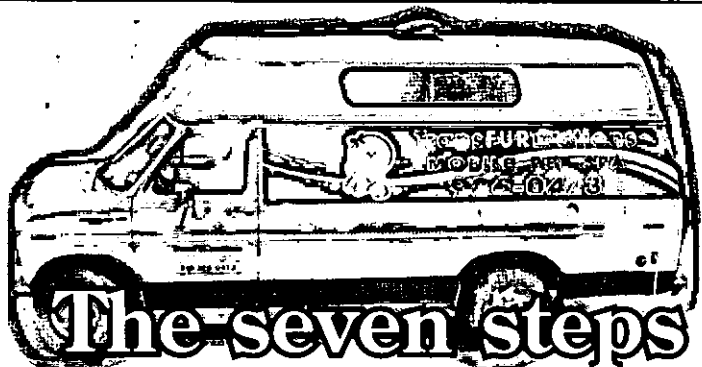

and that they could only put a peripheral line in [to feed from], which they said just isn't going to work with dogs walking all over you," she said.

Campbell realized this would be a huge problem, as Yum Yum and John Wellington spend every night in bed with her. So what did she do?

"I stayed in the hospital for 12 days," she said. When asked why she chose not to restrict the pugs from sleeping in bed with her for the period of time she needed the peripheral IV, Campbell simply replied, "I would never do that."

She referred to her bed as the pug's nest.

There is no question that Campbell goes to great lengths to keep her pugs happy, but she is also on a mission to keep her pugs healthy.

"We take Wellington to a chiropractor every three weeks," said Campbell. Each time John Wellington's doggie bones—and not the ones he chews on—are massaged, it costs the Campbells \$50.

But that is only one of Wellington's expenses. He also has seen a neurologist in Boston to examine a medical condition he has, at which point the pooch received both an MRI (magnetic resonance image) and CT scan.

To keep up their health, John Wellington, Yum Yum and Campbell's cat are all on several vitamins per day, including flax seed oil, salmon oil, vitamin E, and vitamin C.

While most of the money the Campbells spend on the pugs is for health reasons, Campbell said that other than a few outfits she dresses the duo in on occasion, they don't pamper the pets too much.

But for other pet owners, the

appearance of their companion means much more.

"I have one client who gets her cat groomed every three weeks," said Melissa Francisco, of Schenectady, owner of Transformations, a mobile pet grooming company.

"My vehicle is fully equipped," she said. "I got my tub, my table, and I'm able to drive it to the person's home. I plug it in and then I'm able to groom their pet!"

According to Francisco, Transformations, which has been up and running since March, is attractive to pet owners because they can have their pet groomed, literally, without having to leave their own back yards.

"I have one client whose dog has never been outside," she said.

Whether for their own convenience, or because they would rather have their pets groomed without being in a cage, a few of Francisco's clients epitomize how far a person will go for their pets in monetary value.

"I have a lady who comes to me every three weeks just to bathe [her poodles], and when I give them a full hair cut, that's about \$200. My normal fee is based on about \$45 to \$50 per hour."

Francisco explained the amount of work involved in grooming a large dog, but emphasized that the hardest jobs she does involve felines.

"I know people who have lost fingers because a cat scratched them so bad while they were grooming them," she said.

To groom a cat, Francisco said she charges \$95, including bathing and grooming. One client of hers has nine.

But according to Paula Gaies, of Cohoes, grooming her cat Pippen is not only for appearance, it is essential to her health.

"Especially right now with the season, she is shedding like crazy. There are dust bunnies going all over my floors," said Gaies.

"In addition to which, when she grooms herself she gets hairballs. Once I had to pay \$1,800 to have one surgically removed."

Pippen, a longhaired calico, now gets groomed twice a year by Francisco.

"I only do it twice a year in the summertime and sometimes in the winter," said Gaies. "It took me a long time to do this, because I thought shaving a cat was quite bizarre."

When Pippen, 8, gets shaved, her whole body is buzzed, but Gaies said that's all that changes of her appearance. "She's very low maintenance. I don't really do much fussing with her. Melissa asked if she could put a bow in her hair and I said, 'No way! No bow in her hair!'"

Francisco said that cat grooming has become such a rarity in the area that some owners have offered to pay her more money than what she already charges because they know how much work is entailed.

"The cats are usually calm for about 15 to 20 minutes into the grooming. After that, they figure out what is going on, and they don't like it," she said.

While the costs of grooming an animal can be pricey for the average pet owner, for the pet pampers, it is simply a part of the game. Another part, and perhaps that which people spend the most money on, is the area the pet spends time in at home.

Sara Ellis, owner of Dawgdom in Saratoga Springs, said that she has regular customers who come in to buy special products for their dogs.

"Especially because of how we live with our dogs, we have a big focus on big dogs. For people who like to do things outdoors, we have backpacks, vacation packs, reflective vests—for when you go hiking, we have floatation devices and sneakers for them for when they go out West. The sandstone can really ruin their

pads," she said.

Ellis said there are even novelties for people who like to accessorize their pet.

"Because people who love dogs and love pets, love things, we have necklaces, T-shirts, bags and other stuff that you're just going to like for your dog," she said.

But aside from the novelties and décor for the pets, Ellis said some owners are willing to spend a fortune on dog beds. When asked the cost of the most expensive dog bed the store carries, Ellis said they have one model that sells for \$185.

"But, then, again," she said, "You and I would say, 'Wow!', but there are people that buy dog beds for over \$6,000."

Ellis said one day a custom-

er walked into Dawgdom and walked out with over \$1,000 worth of merchandise for a dog.

"It's unbelievable how much people will spend for their pet," she said.

Ellis, who opened her business nearly five months ago, said that there was a need for a pet boutique of Dawgdom's nature in the area. As long as there are dogs, she said, there will be owners who want to buy things for them.

But at the end of the day, when the dogs remove their sweaters and the cats lick themselves clean, they really do not need a \$200 bed or expensive toys. All they need is the love of the people who are devoted to them: their owners.

# Finance *in the* Spotlight

## Midyear economic outlook and market strategies Asset allocations should follow trends

The following midyear economic analysis offers important guidance for businesses and consumers, based on Key's assessment that the short-term economic outlook seems brighter than many predicted, but the long-term outlook remains uncertain.

Beneficial tax rebates, interest rate cuts and a rapidly growing money supply are colliding with inflation. Rising energy costs, especially, are sapping consumer and business morale while dampening the 2009 economic outlook.

**Consumer Spending:** Lifted by tax rebates, consumer spending remains resilient but not robust. Many worry the economy will slide back toward recession after the rebate spending boost, but employment is the real key to spending. Consumer confidence could weaken even more if worries about jobs begin adding to worries about rising energy prices and declining home values.

**Real Estate:** Home valuations may be nearing the bottom, declining less rapidly in some areas and rebounding in others. Unfortunately, even after housing values bottom, housing may appreciate more slowly than it has historically for a number of years.

**Businesses:** Businesses have good reason to remain wary. Relentless pressure on margins keeps businesses cautious about spending, hiring and inventory. Raw materials costs have been rising at an annualized rate of 41 percent with energy prices up sharply. Were it not for slower increases of labor costs, businesses would face even more pressure. Competitive pressures have kept many businesses from raising prices so they must struggle to offset cost increases with improved productivity.

**Overseas Factors:** Growth has been stronger overseas than here, but weak leading indicators, declining real estate values, weakening consumer spending and the deterioration of overseas equity markets all suggest that international economic growth is slowing, particularly in the industrialized world.

**Inflation:** Energy has been a primary driver of inflation, but high energy prices are encouraging people around the world to find ways to reduce energy demand. Even developing economies, which have caused most new net energy demand, are beginning to reduce subsidies, spurring higher energy use. The price of oil will most likely retrace at least part of its sharp run up this year. China has been responsible for about half of the world's net new demand for oil, swelling diesel oil imports over recent months to levels 30 times higher than last year. This may be short term, however, to build a strategic reserve, stockpile for the Olympics or compensate for coal shortages. If China's demand

for energy products moderates, fundamental pressures on energy prices should ease, reducing the pressure of energy prices on the overall inflation rates.

**Interest Rates:** Interest rates will almost certainly rise. The Federal Reserve probably will not reduce rates, but will probably not raise rates quickly, either. Overseas central banks have raised rates or taken other short-term steps that should slow global economic growth. The Fed may also have to raise rates if inflation pressures remain high.

Rising shorter-term rates and high (or increasing) inflation threaten to provoke increases in longer-term interest rates.

**Market Strategy/Asset Allocation:** Investors need to monitor the economic trends carefully, but current prices may be offering some good investment options.

**Equities:** Equities have dropped to the lower end of their trading range since January, presenting opportunities. The longer-term economic outlook has become less clear, but, shorter-term, equities could rally later this year since the main economic effects of higher inflation may not be felt until next year.

**Domestic or Overseas?** Leading indicators for many overseas areas point to slower growth. Many overseas equities markets are underperforming the U.S. equity market, which suggests that the economic and market prospects are poorer overseas. For nations raising interest rates to reduce inflation, economic growth may be even slower. The European Central Bank's (ECB) rate hike demonstrates that inflation concerns override concerns about economic growth in many other parts of the world. Even the fast-growing emerging economies face increased difficulties. Those economies face reduced demand for their exports as developed economies slow, while energy and food costs comprise a larger share of overall expenditures than in developed countries. Given the high prices that have been paid for emerging-markets securities, equity markets in the emerging economies remain particularly vulnerable to global economic slowing.

**Small-Cap, Mid-Cap or Large-Cap?** Growth will most likely remain below average in the months ahead, so companies that can grow faster than the economy become increasingly valuable. Mid-cap companies, particularly mid-cap growth companies, have shown better earnings growth than small-cap companies. This suggests that the recent leadership of the mid-cap growth market segment will continue once the market finishes this correction.

**Growth or Value?** Growth stocks remain more attractive than value stocks due to their earnings-growth edge and the fact that they are undervalued relative to value stocks by historical standards.

**Fixed Income:** Rates have risen as economic and credit fears began to subside. Shorter-term maturities will be better investments than longer-term bond holdings if interest

rates continue to rise as we think they will.

Treasuries have become less attractive than other high-quality bonds, as agency bonds and high-grade corporate bonds offer better yields. We would avoid the bonds of financial companies and investments in lower-grade corporate debt.

Municipals remain more attractive than other bonds, but some municipalities may have financial difficulty as housing values decline and economic contraction spreads. Stick with issuers whose finances remain solid.

This is not a good time to invest in commodities. Oil drives much of the return from commodities, and the

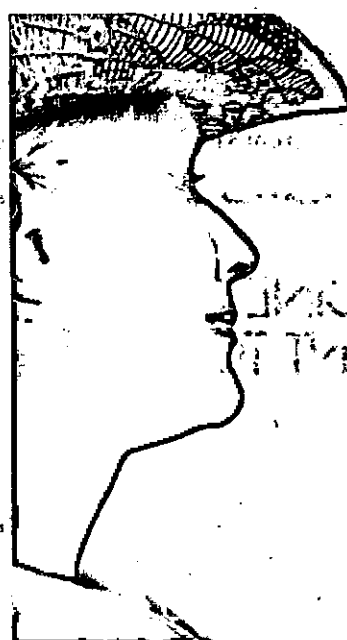
The 2008 and 2009 fiscal-year estimates for the S&P 500 remain optimistic, calling for almost 8 percent growth for 2008 and 7 percent growth for 2009. The quarterly estimates for the S&P 500, however, reflect more-reasonable projections. The quarterly estimates may still be optimistic, with almost 8 percent growth projected for the third quarter and almost 20 percent growth for the fourth quarter, but the revisions

suggest analysts are becoming more realistic. Larger companies have fared better than smaller companies, and companies with strong overseas exposure have done better than companies that are restricted to domestic markets. Although growth rates within the large-cap segment have declined, large-cap and mid-cap earnings growth rates look substantially more attractive than the growth rates for the small-cap and micro-cap companies.

current price of oil seems vulnerable to a selloff.

Overall, this is a time to be cautious but to be watching for the opportunities that always emerge when uncertainty and fear grips the markets.

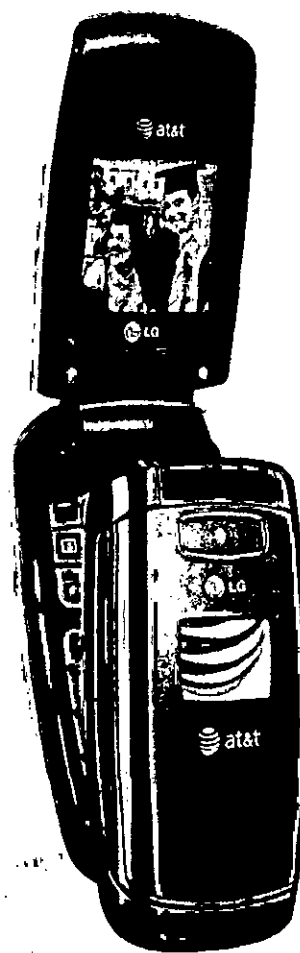

# Keeping things in check

## Chess camp teaches kids life skills

Shaune Sundown, 11, is simply hoping to survive.

His black knight is his only piece on the chessboard and his opponent, Keeshma Singh, 9, is on the attack.

She has only one piece on the board as well — a queen.

Sundown knows he can't win, but his goal is to keep Singh from taking his knight in fewer than six moves.

Sundown and Singh aren't engaged in a real chess match. Rather, they're engaged in an exercise created by Grandmaster Maurice Ashley, who brought his unique brand of chess to Proctors last week for the first MATCH Chess camp.

Where the usual summer camp has kids fishing, swimming and playing kickball, the 27 campers at Proctors spent long afternoons considering the moves of pawns, bishops and rooks.

The players, ages 8 to 14, display varying levels of skill. Some are beginners, and some, like Singh, have won trophies in local and regional tournaments.

Singh and 19 other campers were awarded a full-tuition scholarship to the camp, which costs \$420.

Private contributors the Golub Corporation, the Schenectady Police Athletic League, the City Mission and others donated scholarship funds.

The City Mission provides lunches to campers.

Ashley, who's coached three national championship chess teams and one individual national champion in New York City, says he hopes the camp will bring a general interest in chess to Schenectady. He says the value of chess goes far beyond the game's rules.

"I want chess to be used for other reasons. It teaches critical thinking and problem-solving skills," says Ashley, a former ESPN chess commentator. "I want to translate these chess skills into life skills."

Ashley has been coming to Schenectady for several years to do chess demonstrations at both Proctors and the Hamilton Hill Arts Center's Juneteenth Celebration. This is his first-ever chess summer camp.

Camp organizer and chess enthusiast Marshall Tucker, of Schenectady, urged Ashley to run the camp after watching nearly 100 area children participate in monthly chess tournaments at Proctors.

Tucker hopes that the camp will become an annual event.

"We've already had discussions to get Union College on board as well as continuing our relationship with Proctors," says Tucker, who hopes to increase the camp's enrollment next year by moving to a bigger facility. "It's all in the planning stages."

Caitlyn Foley, Proctors' education program manager, says she too hopes the program will continue next year. Proctors hosts several arts-based camps as part of its Summer Adventures series.

"Like all of our summer programs, the chess camp continues to create hands-on experiences for kids who are excited about learning," says Foley.

Foley noted that campers don't sit in a room and play chess all day. Ashley's students will also participate in improv acting workshops with the Mop & Bucket Company's Brenny Rabine, watch movies in the GE Theatre, go rock climbing at the Electric City Rock Gym, and make an instructional chess video for SACC-TV, Schenectady's public access station.

Ashley says he thinks these activities help with team building, an important and often overlooked

aspect of chess.

"Chess is an extremely social game," says Ashley. "You're not sitting in a room by yourself, you're talking to a person and having fun."

As Ashley speaks, the room is abuzz with young chess players excited at the prospect of putting their opponents in check. They're excited to make their skills a little better.

"I'm here to learn new moves about how to capture pieces," says Singh, of Schenectady, who captured Sundown's knight after a few moves. "Today I learned how to trap a knight with a queen."

The five-day camp ran through Friday, July 11.

# Ravena Cement plans upgrades.

**Manufacturer wants to have better emission control starting in 2013**

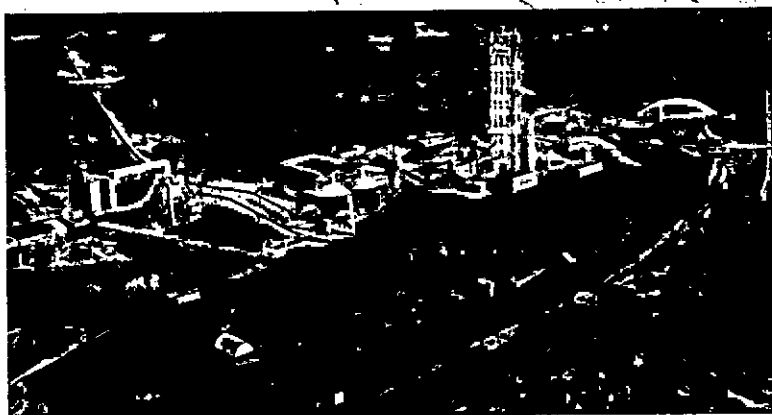
Lafarge North America, Inc. announced major plans to upgrade its cement plant in Ravena in order to "modernize" its upstate facility.

The announcement, made Wednesday, July 9, comes on the heels of a federal Toxic Release Inventory report released in February that stated the Route 9W plant across from the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk school released 400 pounds of mercury in 2006.

It is the first of many steps that Lafarge is taking in the New York regulatory permitting process, according to company spokesman Saleem Cheeks, which could result in an investment to modernize the Ravena cement plant. As it's currently proposed, the modernization project would replace the existing 46-year-old cement plant's equipment with state-of-the-art cement manufacturing technology.

"Today's action represents just the first step in a series of steps necessary to bring more modern manufacturing technologies to the Ravena plant, which would enhance emissions controls and environmental performance as well as improve industrial efficiency and reduce production costs," Joe Goss, Lafarge United States East Cement Business Unit President said at the announcement. "Lafarge is committed to continuous improvement in our operations to meet world-class standards, and this study is a further demonstration to our commitment in upstate New York."

Lafarge submitted its Environmental Assessment Form

to the state's Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). The form, which initiates the permitting process, outlines the nature of the project and the rationale behind the move.

Cheeks described the project as an investment into the community and a commitment to the employees at the plant.

To move forward, the proposed project requires regulatory approval at the state and federal levels in addition to conducting advanced studies necessary to receive approval from Lafarge's board of directors.

The DEC has openly stated it is currently considering rules to limit mercury from cement plants, as the state has already required that coal-fired power plants reduce its emissions 90 percent by 2015. In a release, Lafarge said the proposed project at the Ravena Cement Plant, which has been making construction materials since 1962, would include several environmental and economic

The company stated the upgrades would include the use of state-of-the-art technology to improve fuel efficiency and enhance environmental protection; help ensure the long-term future of the Ravena plant in Albany County; provide a "significant economic

benefit to the local community"; use modern processes to allow Lafarge to maintain highly competitive positions in terms of safety, product quality, operating efficiency and production costs. If approved and confirmed, the project would start in 2013.

Once the environmental assessment form is accepted by the DEC, Lafarge's proposed project will enter the State Environmental Quality Review process. During the process, the project will undergo further study, environmental impact assessments and public comment periods. Aside from its recent mercury woes, Lafarge continually points to several environmental initiatives it has undertaken such as partnering with the RCS and community youth groups to provide the Deer Mountain Nature Trail, a 150-acre wildlife learning and habitat development center.

The Lafarge Group is an international building materials manufacturer, creating products such as cement, aggregates and gypsum. The company reports that it has 90,000 employees in 76 countries and that the Lafarge Group posted sales of 17.6 billion Euros and net income of 1.9 billion Euros in 2007.

Lafarge North America Inc. is a subsidiary of French-based manufacture Lafarge SAA.

garding sexual abuse of children."

Freeman cited financial difficulties as his reason for bowing out, despite collecting 3,000 petition signatures.

"It was simply financing the campaign. We had the support, we had the voters, we had more than enough signatures to run, we had all of that," Freeman said. "We made it to the ballot, but then we asked if we had the money to bring this puppy home."

Much like this year's presidential race, the race to fill the seat of outgoing Congressman Michael McNulty, D-Green Island, began earlier than anticipated.

The race began in December when Phil Steck announced his intentions to run for office.

As many as 11 candidates competed in the race at one time.

Paul Tonko, Tracy Brooks, Darius Shahinfar, Steck and Joseph Sullivan continue to seek the Democratic nomination. Tonko led all Democrats, obtaining more than 7,000 signatures with the aid of more than 300 volunteers.

Jim Buhrmaster and Steven

Vasquez will continue their quest for the Republican nomination.

Buhrmaster collected more than 8,000 signatures, the most of any Republican.

Because there is a period reserved to file objections, according to the state's board of elections, no one is officially on the ballot as of yet. However, the board of elections did confirm with *Spotlight Newspapers* that Republicans Buhrmaster and Vasquez are officially filed with the state, and that Democrats Brooks, Shahinfar, Steck, Sullivan, and Tonko have all met the petition requirement to run in the 21st.

On the third-party lines, Tonko has filed for the Working Families Party, Steck filed for the Independence Party line, and Buhrmaster filed for the Conservative line, according to the state board of elections.

Two former candidates threw their endorsements behind current candidates after they dropped out of the race. Freeman endorsed Tonko, and Burridge has not only endorsed Brooks, but has now joined her campaign.

The seven remaining candidates will seek a spot on the ballot for their respective party primaries in September.

Bierman and her husband, Luke, have three children, a college senior, a college freshman and an eighth-grader at Bethlehem Middle School.

Downey is currently acting director of audit and quality assurance with the New York State Higher Education Services Corporation. He has been a district resident for 17 years, and he and his wife, Debra, have two children at Bethlehem Middle School.

"Thank you for charging Jim and me with the responsibility of serving the board as its officers," Lytle said after being re-elected president.

In his first superintendent's report, Tebbano told board members that the Bethlehem Class of 2008 contained 378 graduates, out of which 133 received Advanced Regents Diplomas. Tebbano said it represented a 95 percent graduation rate, and the district expects the rate to jump up to 100 percent by summer's end.

"It is very challenging thing to do, and it's one of the highest numbers in the Capital District,"

Tebano said of all the Regents degrees earned in Bethlehem.

The board discussed a number of appointments for the next school year and also had a brief discussion on substitute teacher pay, which was recently raised in order "to remain competitive with neighboring districts."

Bethlehem substitutes are paid \$85 a day, which is bumped up to \$90 a day if they serve for five consecutive days, according to Assistant Superintendent for Business Steven O'Shea. In extreme cases, if the substitute is covering a classroom for one month or more they are automatically moved up to a base salary pay.

All teachers are required to create backup plans and outlines for substitutes and emergency situations, according to Tebbano.

"It's got to be more than a video tape," he said. "We frown upon that."

The next board of education meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, Aug. 13, and the first day of school starts one day early this year for grades 1-12, beginning on Wednesday, Sept. 3.

Kindergarten begins on Monday, Sept. 8.

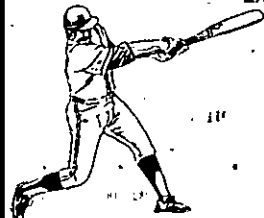

My friend, it's time to take kindly the counsel of the years and gracefully surrender the things of youth.

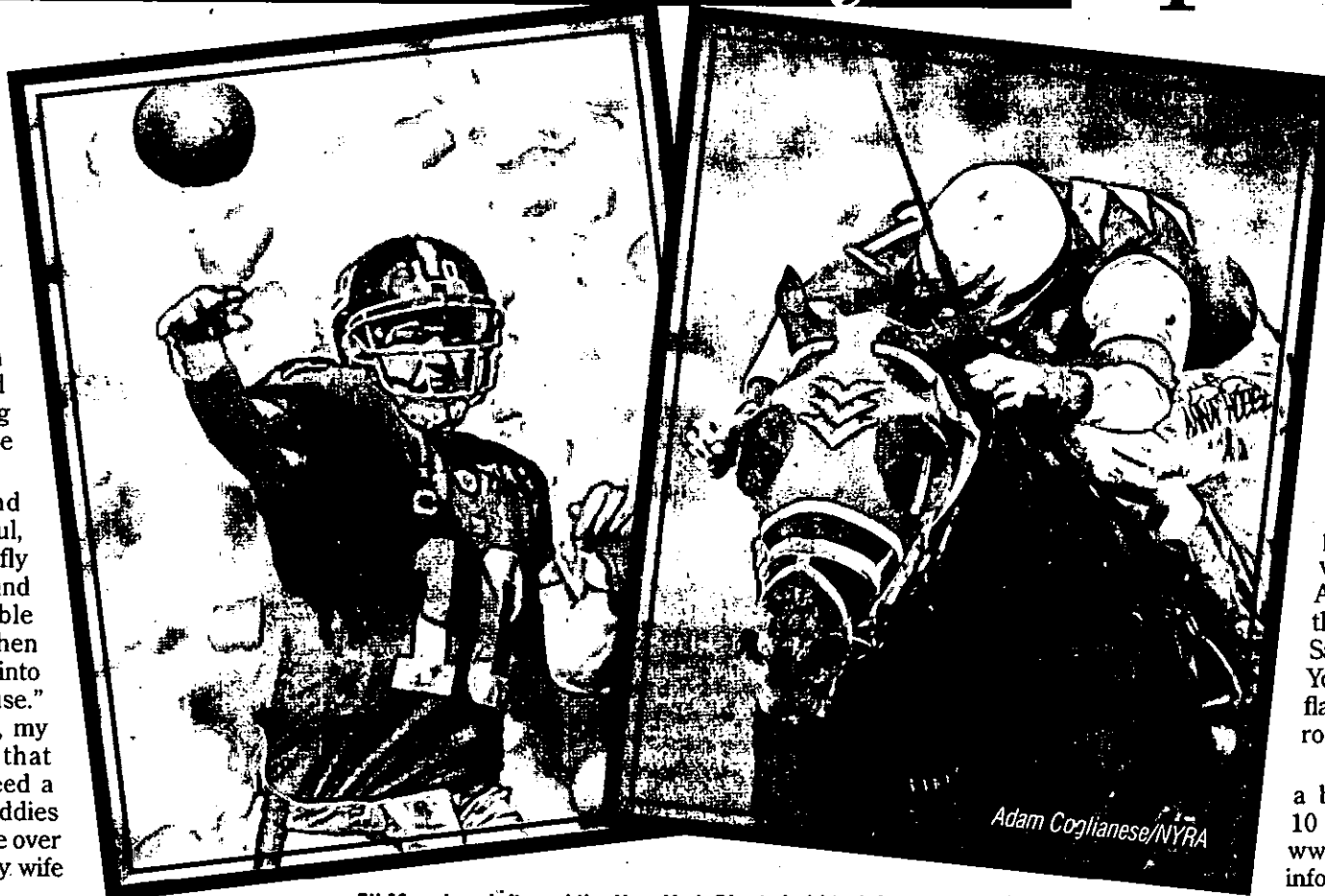

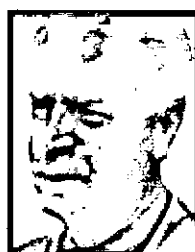

A few years ago, Shawna Thompson and Kathy Boyle were kayaking together when they had an idea to use their hobby to raise money.

The women both belong to the Alplaus Ladies Auxiliary of the Alplaus Volunteer Fire Co., which had been looking for community service projects. Out on the water, Thompson and Boyle had a brainstorm: How about an event where people paddled on the Mohawk River, pledging donations for the American Cancer Society?

"We both had people important to us die of breast cancer," Thompson explained.

So, in 2006, the auxiliary hosted the first Paddling for a Cure, inviting kayakers, canoers and people with rowing shells to enjoy a scenic 5-mile trip down the Mohawk to Llenroc, the 30,000-square-foot mansion in Rexford, and back. This year's event, the auxiliary's third, is slated for Sunday, July 20, with paddlers leaving the Capital Region Maritime Center in Alplaus at 9 a.m.

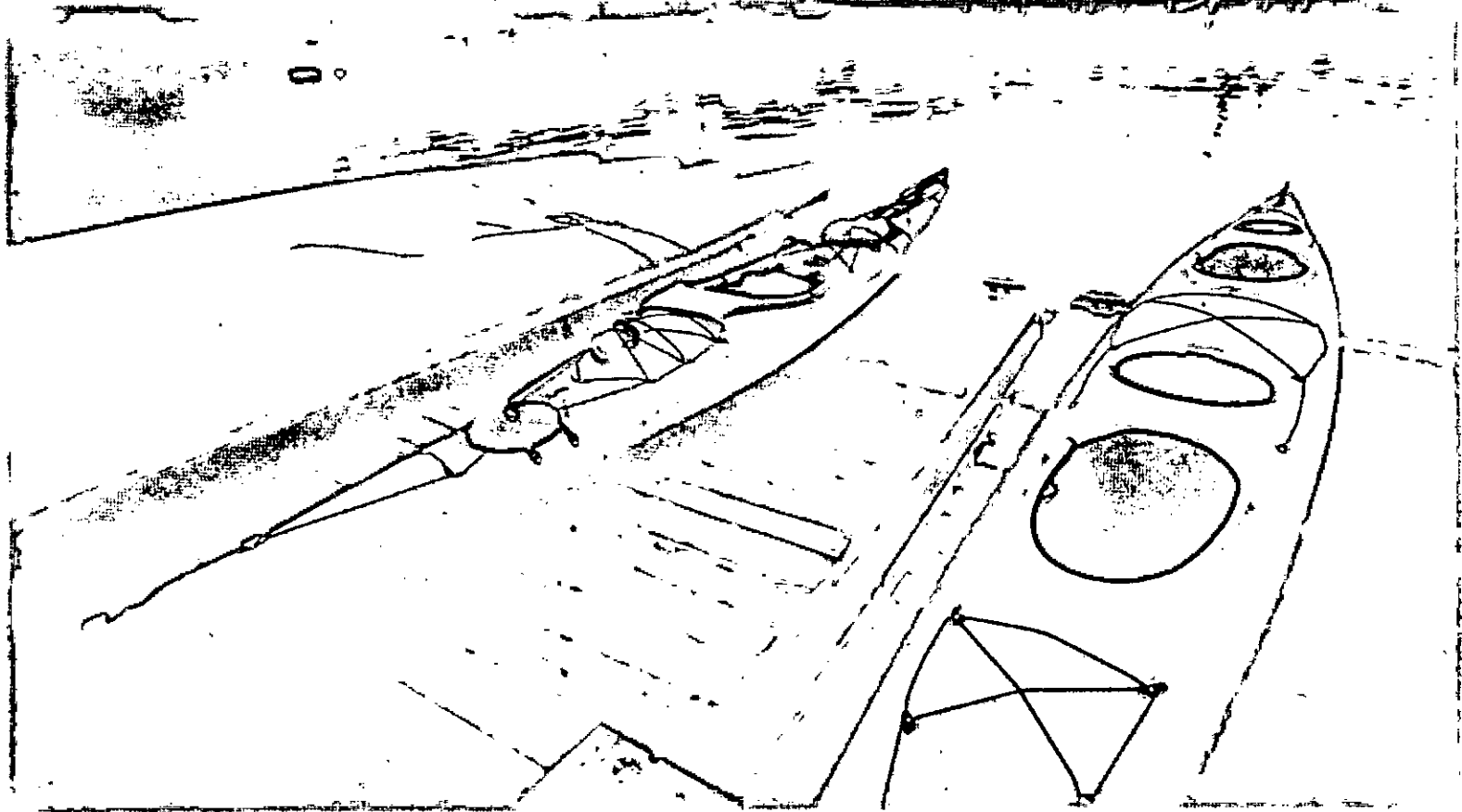
That first year, Thompson and Boyle, the event coordinators, had hoped to raise about \$5,000 for the Cancer Society, which would be earmarked for breast cancer research. Instead, the 63 paddlers who took part brought in \$12,000. Last year, 85 paddlers combined to raise \$14,500.

"The money just kept rolling in," said Thompson, who hopes to draw 100 paddlers and raise \$20,000 this year.

"They have done a phenomenal job," said Anthony Marino, the regional vice president of the American Cancer Society. He noted that while his organization has a decent-sized staff, "There's only so much that we can do day in and day out," making events like the Paddling for a Cure invaluable.

For Thompson, it's a great way to mesh a sport she loves with a worthy cause. Thompson used to be an avid canoer, taking frequent trips with her husband.

"I like being on the water," she said.

Her husband, however, wasn't as enthusiastic. Since it's hard to maneuver a canoe with just one person inside, Thompson eventually decided to try taking her large dog out with her.

"He didn't like that," she said with a laugh.

So then she bought a kayak and tried to steer the canoe with it, sitting in the middle. When that still proved a challenge, she decided to just invest in a kayak, and she's spent hours on the water with it ever since.

"It's just become my passion," she said.

It's a passion that is shared

by many in the area. Thompson said most of the people who participate in Paddling for a Cure are from Schenectady County, but everyone is welcome.

"We had a whole family that came from Fultonville last year," she said. "It's really spreading by word of mouth."

People who turn out this year can enjoy the baked goods the auxiliary sells, along with prizes in a variety of categories and raffles, including one for a new kayak.

Beyond that, they can enjoy a festive atmosphere while honoring people who have battled cancer. There will be a memory board where people can write the

names of loved ones affected by the disease.

"The event turns out to be a really wonderful day of celebration," Thompson said. "It's not a gloomy day at all."

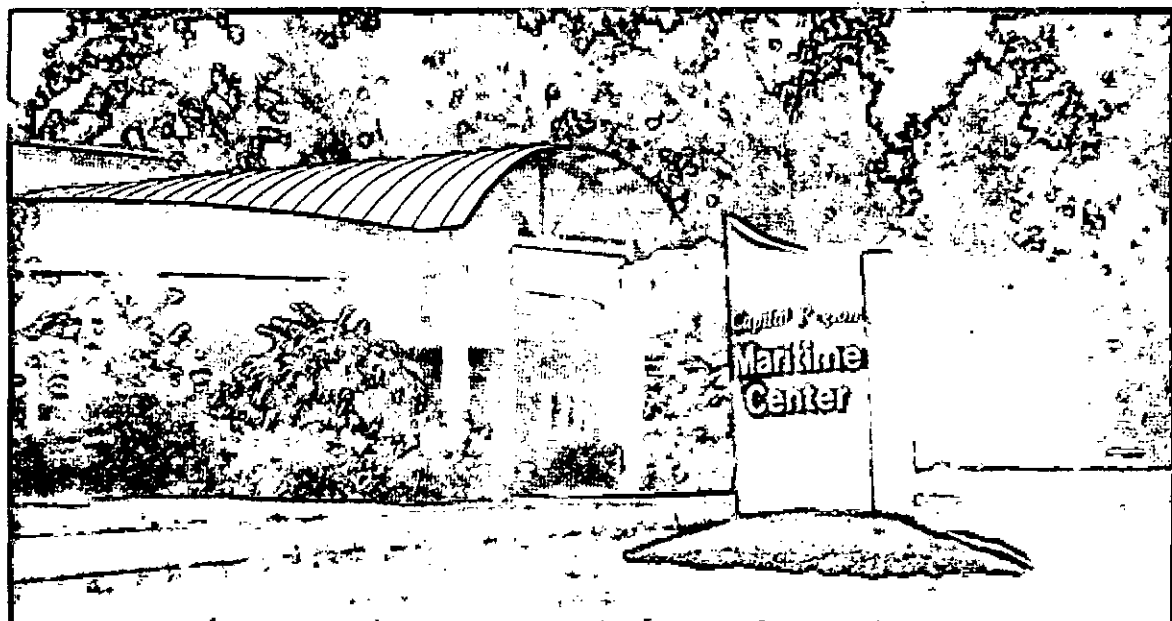
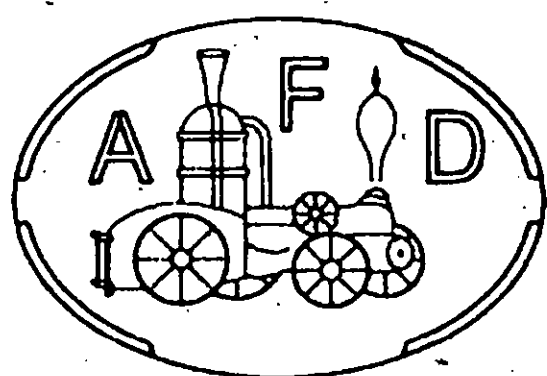
She hopes the event can also provide some inspiration for people to help their own fundraisers, noting that the auxiliary has only 25 members but has raised more than \$25,000 through the event in the past two years.

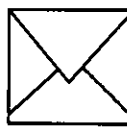

# A safer fishin' hole coming soon to Halfmoon

## New pier to better accommodate disabled anglers

Anglers have something else to flip for besides fish.

Construction on a fishing pier that would provide access for the physically disabled began Monday, July 7, under Crescent Bridge in Halfmoon.

"This is a nice project where a community group worked with town and state officials," said Nelson Ronsvalle, grant coordinator for the Town of Halfmoon.

Ronsvalle worked with the Town Board and the Capital District Fly Fishers to secure funding for the project, which has an estimated cost of \$48,900.

The town received a spot-improvement grant from the state Department of Transportation in the amount of \$40,000, and the town will contribute an additional \$8,900 to complete the project.

"This is a unique asset not only for Halfmoon, but neighboring communities," said Ronsvalle.

The project, which took three years of planning, is slated for completion Tuesday, Oct. 7, according to Ronsvalle.

Construction will be completed in three phases, beginning with the paving of a path to the pier for wheelchair access followed by placing a railing on the front of the landing and a concrete wall with curb to prevent fishers from falling on the bank.

In addition to preventing accidents, the railing will also give people a place to rest their arms while fishing.

Parking for the fishing pier is available on Terminal Road in Halfmoon.

The Capital District Fly Fishers presented plans to the Town Board to upgrade the fishing pier for people with mobility issues. The group modeled its plans off another fishing group's "Project Access," which sought to make waters in the Catskills more accessible to older individuals or those with disabilities.

Halfmoon resident Rodney Prittel, who is a member of the Capital District Fly Fishers often fishes from the pier. "I thought in my mind that it would be a great place for people with mobility problems and people who cannot be exposed to direct sunlight," he said.

He also said the spot is ideal because it shelters fishers from the rain.

"The space was underutilized," Prittel said.

According to Prittel, there are similar fishing accesses in the Catskills.

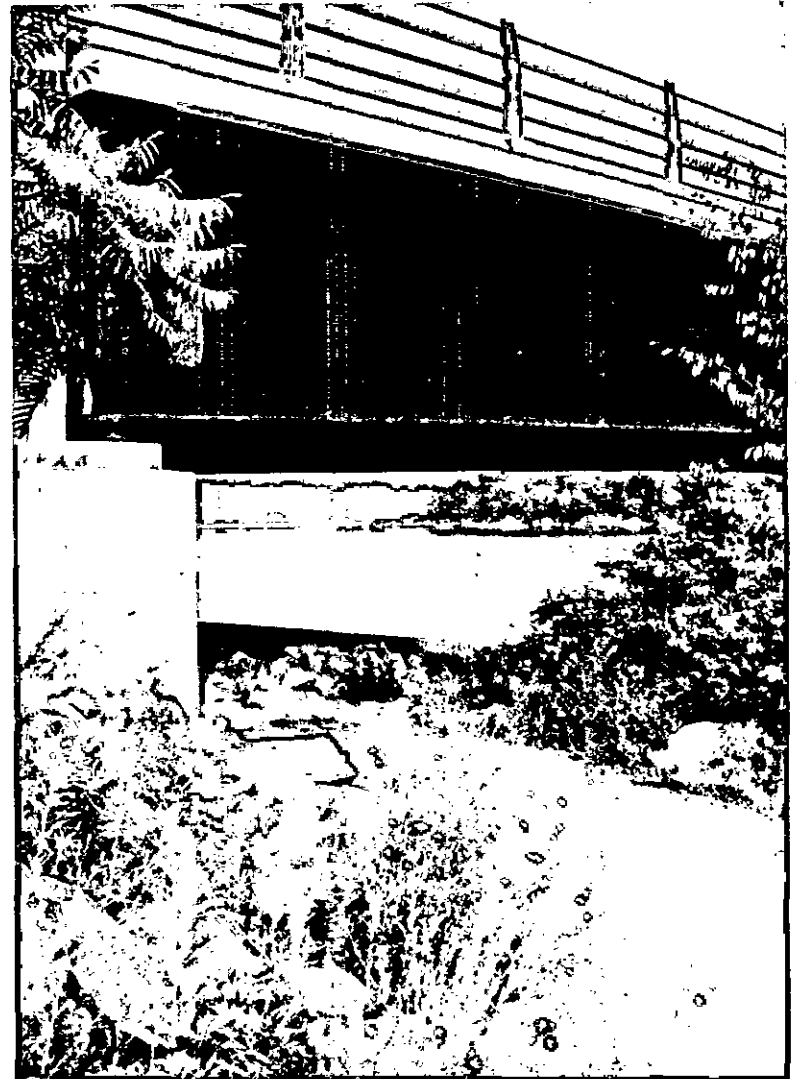
"You could say it is a warm and fuzzy feeling," Prittel said of the feeling he received when he found out the project was actually coming into fruition.

Prittel along with the Capital District Fly Fishers initially brought plans to the Halfmoon Town Board for approval, and with their support was able to take the project from concept to construction.

Prittel attributes the success of the project not only to the town and its officials, but the help of local companies who offered a helping hand. Prittel said Myers Engineering of Clifton Park completed design work for the pier and Bast Hatfield provided cost estimates based on the design at no cost to the group.

"Those people stepping forward early on helped get the project off the ground," Prittel said. The town requires a site design and cost estimate when evaluating a project for town approval.

The Capital District Fly Fishers meet monthly throughout the fall, spring and winter at the Veterans of Foreign Wars post 1019 in Colonie. For information on the Capital District Fly Fishers, contact Prittel at 664-3509.

you would be playing with the big boys and then it would be your turn to kick the young boys off the court. It was about respecting your opponent's game but never backing down until you got your respect.

Going to wherever your sport took you to tighten up your skills, sometimes doing it by yourself, hours on hours. Practicing the same Oscar Robinson moves – the jump shot, a slight lean back with your elbow in your opponent's face. The Elgin Baylor drive to the bucket as he breaks to the basket after giving that little hurky jerky head fake. How about the Jerry West pull-up jumper – the fastest "jumper" in the land? If you took a moment to blink while guarding him, you were done.

When was the last time you saw the Connie Hawkins's "big finger roll"? That shot is a lost art today. Who still remembers Jerry Lucas's sweeping hook shot? Or how about Archie Clark's no-frills crossover with the pull-up jump shot at the end from the foul line? Little parts of the game that made you a legend on the court, yet they were so simple and effective for many years.

Practice, practice, day after day, didn't need anyone to go with you – just needed a Voit, Spalding or Wilson. Get to the park early and leave late, you and your crew. Talk smack? Absolutely, and as much as you can. It was all in fun.

After the game was over, you went home and waited to do it

again. During the school year you couldn't wait for the end of the school day. You'd get your homework done, and then fly out the house. If you got to the courts too late, you might never get a "run." Hey, if you got there too late, you might have to run to another court and hope the line for "next" wasn't too long.

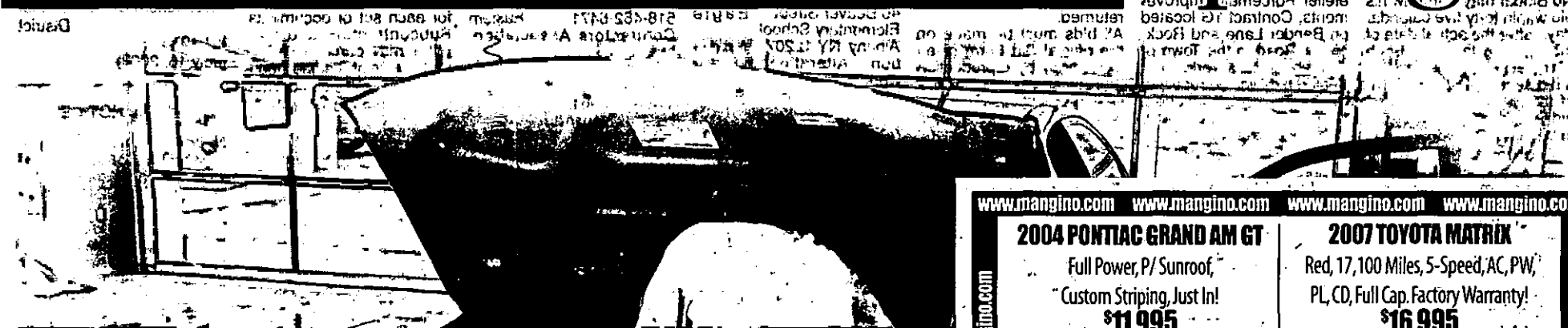
In the winter, you'd get a shovel and move the snow just enough to get a half court. No one complained, "I'm not going to do that. It's somebody else's job," or, "I don't want to play that bad," etc. There was no crying. If you got there first, you started to clean the court if it wasn't already clean. There was no claim to a court, even if you cleaned it. If you lost it in a game, you waited until your "next." Respect was a natural on the court.

Sometimes there were arguments, but very rarely did someone want to fight over a basketball game. The rules of the court were the rules, and everyone knew them from park to park. Some parks had their own rules, but you familiarized yourself with those rules prior to going to that park. It was never looked at like a guide or rulebook, but one could interpret it as such. You had to do your homework.

We called it the "city game" and it was fast, fun and competitive. You had better bring your so-called "A" game every day. We loved it and did it all for the "Love of the Game."

Where is that love today? Whether it's basketball, baseball, football, soccer, etc, where's the respect for the game? Where's the love?

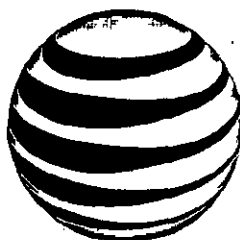
