## Builders won't go Dutch on project

Van Dyke Spinney retirement community moves forward with new proposal

Dropping its original Dutch design, Van Dyke Spinney developers have opted for a "Craftsman look" for their proposed 216-unit retirement community.

Updated plans for the project, which is slated for construction off of Van Dyke Road and Meads Lane, were presented to the Bethlehem Planning Board at its Tuesday, Sept. 2, meeting.

Developers say they removed three buildings from the plans, as requested by the town, have made changes to the style and design of the proposed units, and are creating a multi-use pathway along Van Dyke Road as part of the new plans.

"Our main goal here was making sure the planning board was

## Connecting the Capital District

Local initiatives to provide pedestrian paths spring up in Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties

The Capital District is on the right path.

Connecting local municipalities together along with parks, riverfronts and other recreational areas by means of trails, bike paths and pedestrian pathways has become the norm in the area.

Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties all have initiatives to provide residents with walkable communities and have even started creating countywide pathway programs and inter-county pathway exchanges.

Pathway proponents say they improve the quality of life and provide affordable recreational opportunities, especially during an economic downturn when recreation

often takes a backseat to heating one's home and putting gas in the car.

However, critics lament who exactly is going to pay for public pathways, especially during the same economic downturn when pedestrian works often take a backseat to paving municipal roadways, water plant upgrades, and other essential infrastructure projects.

Many local officials seek out grants, not-for-profit organization donations, and work with neighboring communities and county government to bring their pathway priorities to fruition.

Public safety has also been a concern with the local trail and bike paths, not only

# Police Blotter

## Man sleeping in car charged with DWI

Bethlehem police arrested a Slingerlands man on DWI charges after he was found "slumped over the steering wheel" of his vehicle inside of a parking lot on Blessing Road, according to the arrest report.

Paul R. Malone, 38, was arrested on Saturday, Aug. 30, for DWI and operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of 0.08 percent or greater, both misdemeanors.

Police said they saw a vehicle

parked with its headlights on, the engine running, and its male driver asleep. When officers woke Malone, he told them he was lost and on his way home, according to the arrest report.

Police said they observed Malone display signs of intoxication and could smell alcohol on his breath while interviewing him.

When Malone was first asked for his identification, the report stated, he originally gave police a

credit card before handing over his driver's license.

After an additional patrol officer arrived on the scene, police said Malone told the officers he "drank approximately five whiskey drinks at multiple Albany Lark Street bars," and that he drove from Lark Street to Blessing Road but was unsure how long he had been there.

However, Malone was "adamant that he drove with no other vehicle occupants and that he had no alcoholic beverages since leaving the bars," the report stated.

After failing three field-sobriety tests and testing positive for alcohol, Malone was taken into police custody and transported to

the Bethlehem Police Department, according to the report.

Malone submitted to a chemical test that revealed his BAC was nearly double the legal limit, the report states, and the situation he was discovered in "did meet the criteria under New York State Vehicle and Traffic Laws" to charge him with DWI.

### Other arrests

• Susan A. McCoy, 43, of Albany, was arrested on Friday, Aug. 29, on New Scotland Road for DWI, first offense; speeding; and failure to keep right.

Bethlehem police said they saw McCoy driving east on New

Scotland Road going 49 mph in a 40-mph zone and then observed her fail to keep right on the roadway.

When officers asked her where she was going, McCoy said she left work and had driven to a friend's home before heading home, according to the arrest report.

When asked if she had been drinking, she told police she had one beer, the report states, but officers observed her displaying signs of intoxication and said they smelled alcohol on her breath while interviewing her.

McCoy failed a field-sobriety test and tested positive for alcohol on pre-screening device, according to police, and was transported to the Bethlehem Police Department where she was asked to submit to a chemical test.

According to the arrest report, McCoy eventually agreed after being read her DWI Miranda rights. She attempted the chemical test twice but the results were "incomplete" and "invalid" and she was "determined to be a refusal to the chemical test," and police secured two mouthpieces used in the test as evidence.

McCoy's husband was contacted and transported her home and she is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, Sept. 16.

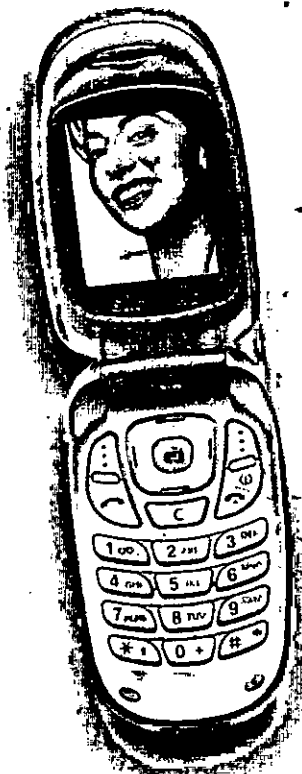

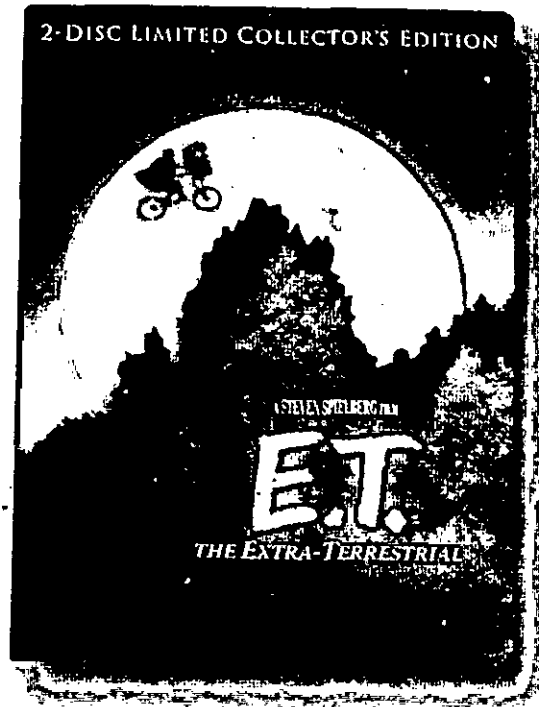

# Local church ties into history

**Silk tie commemorates Hudson's 1609 journey**

Two area women have teamed up to tie in the area's history and make a celebration that has been 400 years in the making.

Judy Selkirk and Man Ann Shubert have designed a silk tie and are selling them for their church in order to help pitch in for next summer's quadricentennial events that will be celebrated up and down the Hudson River in New York and neighboring states.

Although locally there has been some controversy over exactly where and how far Henry Hudson and his crew on the Half Moon traveled up the river named in his honor, celebrations around the area will be held marking the historic 1609 voyage.

In addition to Hudson, the celebrations will also commemorate the travels of Samuel De Champlain's and Robert Fulton's first steamboat voyage, from New York City to Albany in 1807.

Selkirk and Shubert, congregants of the First Reformed Church of Bethlehem, said they came up with the idea while brainstorming with their church group for fundraising ideas.

"Our church was looking for ideas," Selkirk said, and after she showed them a tie she found in New Hampshire commemorating that state's heritage, she said she thought, "Why can't we do a tie like this."

She brought the idea to Shubert, who used her artistic

talents to bring Bethlehem's heritage alive on silk.

"I did the painting," said Shubert. "First we tried to put it down on paper and ... then we tried to glue the patterns down so that we could move them around."

Eventually the artwork was electronically scanned and silkscreen onto the ties by a company after the women put their own money into the project. But the end result is something the entire town can be proud of and can wear with pride.

The tie has a background with an old elevation map of the town as a background. The symbols included on the tie are the church with a 1763 date stamped below the picture; a barn and animals acknowledging the area's rich agricultural roots; a picture of the Half Moon with the date 1609 stamp on its hull; the famous 999 Train; and topped off with the town's official seal.

"Our church is one of the oldest in town, and the 999 Train was the fastest of its time, so we thought they should be included," Selkirk said.

The ties are going for \$30 each and can be bought at the town clerk's office at Town Hall and at the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce in Delmar. The women had 100 ties made to sell, but can order more if they sell out.

"We want to make sure we sell these first before we order more," Selkirk said.

In addition to individual events, the town is kicking off its fundraiser on Saturday, Sept. 20, at the Mansion on Cedar Hill on River Road in Selkirk from 6 to 8 p.m. The Bethlehem Quadricentennial Commission has announced that the dinner will be \$100 a person and the proceeds will go to funding events around town.

# Dinette proposed for Route 9W

**Restaurateur wants to covert garage into 'corral-themed' restaurant**

A local businessman wants to convert an old garage and construction site at 182 Route 9W in Selkirk into a corral-themed dinette with additional retail space for local businesses.

Ken Gonyea gave an initial presentation about the project to the Planning Board during its Tuesday, Sept. 2, meeting.

"I kind of want to make it a much nicer building," Gonyea told the board. "It will be a theme type of thing," he added, saying the theme would be corral related. He said there would be retail space in the back of the building, possibly a barbershop.

The restaurant will have limited hours, operating from around 6 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., he said.

"It's an existing structure and we're not eliminating anything," Gonyea said of what he described as a dilapidated building. "We're only going to be moving the inadequate stairs to the back."

The building will be completely renovated, and has water but no sewer, according to Bethlehem's assistant Economic Development and Planning Director Michael Morelli.

Gonyea said a 1,000-gallon septic tank currently serves the site, but quickly announced that he was willing to work with

the Albany County Planning Board's recommendations for the project.

"It's up to them," Gonyea said. "Whatever they want me to do, I'm going to do it."

Morelli said the project would fit well into the Rural Hamlet zoned area, and that the county's department of transportation has been pushing for less curb cuts along Route 9W and that Gonyea's proposal would reduce the current curb cut by about 35 feet.

"It's an old construction site and it's an adaptive re-use of an existing site," Morelli said of Gonyea's plans. "He's also looking for some retail uses on the site."

Morelli said the project calls for completely renovating the existing structure and also making it handicap accessible.

Planning Board member John Smolinsky asked Gonyea about the landscaping in front of the building because of the limited green area to work with. He asked if there would be adequate room in which to work.

Gonyea admitted that there was limited green space but assured the board that whatever planting could be done will be and that some lawn added as well. He also told the board that there is 3.8 acres of land in the back of the property.

The Planning Board unanimously tabled the project until it returns from review from the county's planning board with recommendations and said Gonyea would have to return to the board for an environmental review.

# Ride for Life in Glenmont

**Event to benefit bone marrow testing, a child at Albany Med**

The third annual Fearless Ride for Life and Bone Marrow Drive, to be held Saturday, Sept. 13, at the Eastern New York Laborer's Training Center in Glenmont, will benefit Link to Life Bone Marrow Testing and a local child in need at Albany Medical Center.

Free bone marrow testing (normally \$45) will be provided at the event, which will put possible donors on a registry.

The event began with Anthony Hill's struggle to find a bone marrow match and was carried on by his mother Jacqueline Hill and several other community members who were inspired by his life.

Anthony Hill died at age 17 after a search for a suitable match proved unsuccessful.

The event will also include a 100-mile scenic ride open to all modes of transportation that will begin and end at the Laborer's Training Center in Glenmont. There will also be a raffle for a 2008 Harley Davidson Anniversary Edition Soft-tail Deluxe and several theme baskets; a dunking

booth; games and prizes; face painting; airbrush and Henna tattoos; and other organized activities.

Live music will also be on hand with Playing with Fire headlining the event. The band is made up of Elsmere Fire Department members, and they are playing at the event for free in order to help raise money for Hill's cause.

Tickets for the event and for the Harley Davison raffle can be purchased at CynderElla's Subs, on the corner of Delaware and Kenwood avenues; or at Spitzie's Harley Davidson, 1970 Central Ave., Albany.

Pre-registration for the ride \$30 for drivers on the day of the event (\$20 in advance), and \$15 for passengers (\$10 in advance). General admission to the event, which includes food, music, and entertainment, is a donation of \$10 for adults and \$5 for children under 10.

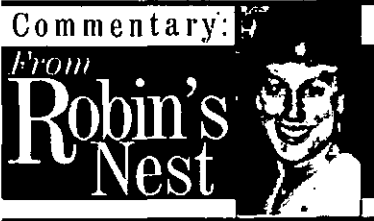

# Looking for jeans with flair, but not flare

In early August I was helping my daughter pack for a camp overnight in Lake George. The kids would be spending the day at The Great Escape, having a barbecue dinner, walking around in Lake George Village and then sleeping in tents at a campground.

"It may get cool in the evening," I told Rachel.

She said, "Oh, by the way, my jeans don't fit anymore."

"Since when?" I asked, certain that I had seen her in jeans fairly recently.

"I tried them on while we were on vacation last week," she answered.

I explained that last week would have been a better time to tell me she needed new jeans. Or even last weekend. Or yesterday. Or that morning. But telling me the night before she was heading out of town left no time to remedy the situation.

Unconcerned, she threw extra sweatpants into her bag, including a pair with pockets. I thought to myself, "those will keep her legs warm, but won't everyone else be wearing jeans?"

A few days after she returned we went searching for jeans. Not just any jeans. We were looking for straight-leg jeans or boot-cut jeans, no flare bottoms allowed. Also, the jeans must be unadorned. That means there must be no words, no beads, no rhinestones, no extra stitching designs, no appliques and no funky belts.

We managed to find a single pair of unadorned boot-cut jeans in her size. One was better than none. I told her we would keep searching in the coming weeks.

Less than two weeks later, we hit the mall again. One store was so crowded that I thought it was December. Then I found out there was a sale on jeans: Seven dollars for girls' jeans and 12 bucks for adult sizes! The place was mobbed. You could barely get to the shelves. Please let there be boot cut, I thought. Flare is more popular, so I felt hopeful that a boot-cut pair might still be waiting for

a buyer.

"What are you looking for," said the sales clerk who had a rolling cart and was refolding and stacking pawed-over pants that had been passed over by other shoppers. I told her what we wanted. "I haven't seen that size in over an hour," she said, then walked away to collect more discards.

Once the cart was unattended, I started looking through the piles she had just straightened. Maybe she was mistaken or maybe we could try one size smaller. My daughter is sort of in between sizes. Another mom started looking through the same stack. The girls with her looked much younger than Rachel, so I didn't worry that we would be vying for the same size. But suddenly I saw that she had in her hand the pair that I wanted.

I looked over at Rachel and whispered, "I wanted those." The other mother was talking to her daughter, "Do you want these? They look the same as those other two you're holding, but just in a different shade." I held my breath hoping the daughter would concede that she didn't need a third pair just like the other two. But no, the kid wanted that one too.

In my hand I had a pair the same size, but with flare bottoms. I jumped in hoping to make a trade. "Are you looking specifically for boot cut?" They say that they don't have a preference. So I ask if they'll swap for my flare pair. Alas, the pair the mom is holding is also flare bottom.

I ask the salesclerk if the store expects to get more jeans. She said the store receives shipments on Monday and Friday.

Three days later, on Tuesday evening, I return to the scene, expecting the store to be restocked from Monday's shipment. I was sorely disappointed. The section of shelves that held the "boot cut" jeans was actually covered by a large denim curtain. I peak behind the curtain and see the emptiness. The adjacent "flare bottom" shelves are nearly bare.

I began surveying the various salesclerks within the same store. My question was: "When do you expect a shipment of girls' jeans?" The person staffing the dressing room said, "Maybe this Friday, but you should check up front." The first person up front said, "Next Tuesday or Wednesday," and then checked with a colleague who said "a denim shipment will arrive this Thursday." The woman behind the customer service desk told us more won't arrive for another two to three weeks. I asked why the other guy thought a denim shipment was due this Thursday. The answer was that although some denim was coming this Thursday (or next Wednesday or on Mondays and Fridays or the first Tuesday after the autumnal equinox), the kind I wanted would take longer because it isn't shipped from a local place. Since the store just had a huge sale three days before, I'm inclined to believe that more jeans are not coming any time soon,

if ever.

On to the next store, where again the shelves did not contain the size I was looking for. For reasons of which I am unsure, the sociable salesclerk shared with me his use of the phrase "Bob Saget" (a television actor) in place of inappropriate language. He gave an example, "Say a teacher tells me that I just received a 62 on the exam and will not be passing the course. I say to the teacher, "Bob Saget!"

Then he looked on the computer to see if there were any more of the particular size in inventory. He said, "You're not going to like this news, but I'll read it to you using my announcer voice." Then he proceeded to tell me, in a deepened voice, that no store within 50 miles had the desired item in stock. I asked him if the store was going to order more. He looked at the computer and said that the item wasn't available on-line. I explained that I wasn't planning to place an order, but rather wanted to know when the department store might be expecting a shipment. He said he had no idea. He said, "I just show up at the store when they tell me to and do what they tell me to." I came close to saying, "Bob Saget" but instead told him, "Thanks, anyway."

This shortage of boot-cut jeans must be payback from the time when Rachel shunned jeans. In those days I had to hunt around for leggings. Then the leggings gave way to what I refer to as glorified sweatpants. Pants made with soft material, roomy legs, and an elastic waist with drawstring closure. Those pants were so comfy that even flare-bottom versions were accepted.

So maybe my daughter will change regarding flare-bottom denim. Of course, by then the stores will be overflowing with only boot-cut jeans.

Place, 19, a fan of the Jonas Brothers and first-year student at the College of St. Rose, had tickets to see the teen-pop band, made up of Kevin, Nick and Joe Jonas, perform at the State Fair in Syracuse, but she wanted to do more than just see them in concert — she wanted to meet them.

So, over a month ago, she entered the Chevy Rocks the Road with the Jonas Brothers contest, a contest sponsored by the automobile manufacturer to promote its energy-efficient automobile line.

"I had heard about it online," Place said. "If you make a poster promoting the Chevy [hybrid] car — you have to have the Chevy logo on it — and you brought it to whichever concert you were going to, they would pick the winner who would meet [the Jonas Brothers]."

Contest guidelines stated that a contestant should create a poster about what Chevy's gas-friendly campaign means to them, as well as the importance of thinking and living green. The winner would get a Jonas Brothers "VIP experience," with VIP tickets, parking and a meet-and-greet with the band.

According to her mother, Deborah Place, Stephanie Place worked tirelessly on her poster for over a month. Stephanie's poster depicted the 2008 Chevy Tahoe Hybrid, a large tree and the Jonas Brothers' faces in the sky above the tree.

"I hand drew everything," Place said.

A few moments later, Stephanie noticed all the posters

being hung on the fence for the crowd to see. All of the posters except hers.

"I was really nervous because the girl who was right behind me in line, I thought hers was amazing, and they hung up all the posters, but they never hung mine up," Stephanie said. "I was trying to figure out why mine wasn't up there."

Suddenly, it all made sense. "They called my name, and I was like, 'Mom, what name did they say?'" she said. "All the girls around me were like 'Why aren't you screaming?'"

Deborah Place said she was also shocked when her daughter's name was called.

"It was a combination of surprise and thinking that they got it right," she said. "I thought hers was so good, but you never

know what they're really looking for. It was kind of funny because everyone in the audience was her competition."

After her name was announced, Place was called to the stage, but she was not the only one. Shortly after, Deborah Place was called to the stage, too.

On stage, contest representatives exchanged the Places' tickets for front-row seats, and invited them to meet the Jonas Brothers before the show began.

After a few photos and a performance mother and daughter will never forget, the two returned home with smiles, satisfaction and appreciation. They also returned home without the poster. According to Place, the Jonas Brothers got to keep it.

## More rails, more trails

It's slow, time-consuming, strenuous for some, exhausting for others; frustratingly inefficient, if you're inclined to think about it in those terms; and was outdated as a form of transportation the moment man laid eyes on a camel.

It's walking, and we should be doing a whole lot more of it. For our health, for the environment and for the towns and cities we live in, we should be putting one foot in front of the other a little more often.

Most of the municipalities in our coverage area seem to think so, as well. Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties all have initiatives to make communities a little more pedestrian-friendly, and have started creating countywide pathway programs and inter-county pathway exchanges. Most of the paths planned in individual municipalities focus on recreational uses, but some towns, such as Colonie, Clifton Park and Niskayuna, are aiming to reduce vehicle traffic within the towns by creating pathway plans that allow residents to walk to nearby amenities and local businesses.

Many of the proposed pathways are so-called "rail-trails," a term for a trail that makes use of a railroad right-of-way.

Critics of rail-trails complain about the cost of converting old rail beds to viable pathways. Their criticism is not unfounded. The purchase of railway property usually becomes entangled in a web of decades-old deeds and multiple property owners, as tracks were often laid on land bought piecemeal or accessed through a series of government-granted land or easements.

Other detractors say the rails should stay in place, in the advent of such transportation developments as light and commuter rail, which would also address the congested streets and highways that proponents of the trails are also concerned with.

We at *Spotlight Newspapers* ask, "Why not have both?"

Rail-with-trail, popular in many European countries where both are used more frequently than in the States, is a trail adjacent to a functioning rail line. Some of the economic issues are still present, but at least tracks are still in place to support what we believe to be an extremely underdeveloped and underused transportation resource: our nation's railways.

But a trail right next to train tracks sounds dangerous, doesn't it? It's not.

A study done in 1996 by Patrick Kraich of the Rails-to-Trails Conservancy, funded by the National Park Service, found that 36 of 37 rails-with-trails reported no train/trail user accidents. Rails-with-trails are "no more dangerous than rail-trails alone or [trails] next to a busy street," wrote Kraich.

We tend to think that, with a little supervision of our youngsters, navigating a rail-with-trail may be a lot safer than trying to cross Wolf Road or Route 9.

## Never too early to learn about college admissions

I'm not going to feed the college admissions frenzy by telling you that if your child is not a straight-A, left-handed fencing champion who has published poetry while climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro, their chances of getting into one of this country's elite colleges are slim. On the contrary, the following is information that will likely give your student more options in the college admission process while minimizing some of the stress.

Nothing can take the place of hard work... ever. Not only does hard work pay off on the high school transcript, but it can come with a host of other benefits, such as college scholarships and job opportunities. When you are known for working hard in whatever you do, people will know that you bring a tremendous work ethic with you that will benefit whatever community you decide to join... it's an unbeatable selling point.

Do what you love and do a lot of it. At some selective colleges and universities, the majority of students who are denied admission fit the school's academic profile, but there simply isn't enough room for everyone. The school will "build a class" from among qualified applicants. It will be difficult, if not impossible, for you to know exactly what they're looking for, so don't try to outguess the system. You might be the gifted bassoonist in the year that they desperately need an oboe player. You may be a talented point-guard at a

time when a college's bench is already two-deep at that position. Since you're not a mind reader, just do what you love and do lots of it. Your enthusiasm and drive will be of value to some schools out there.

Show that you see the world beyond yourself. Volunteering isn't important because it bolsters your resume, but because of what it says about the content of your character. If you love baseball, volunteer to coach T-ball or learn to umpire. Volunteer with Special Olympics -- nothing will be more gratifying. Is bike riding your thing? Bike for a cause -- stretch your own limits and help someone in the mean time. Students who can contribute to the world around them will, no doubt, enhance the sense of community at a college or university.

Depth is more important than breadth. You could involve yourself in a laundry list of activities at some cursory level or you could choose a small handful of activities about which you are truly passionate and where your contribution can make a difference. College admission officers will unanimously tell you that they'd rather see the latter.

Challenge yourself academically and socially. You could do a minimal amount of work and get A's or you take a higher-level course and challenge yourself to stretch and grow. The most important factor in the college admission process is your transcript and that means both the grades you earn and the quality of the coursework that you've taken. Stretch yourself socially as well. Try a new activity/club; you may find a new interest, or you may discover something you'll never touch again -- either way, you'll have learned something about yourself.

Be an active participant in your education, not a passive recipient. Do you learn as much sitting in the back of the classroom with a soft fixed gaze out the window as you do when you're involved in class discussions? Do you learn entirely by listening, or is that learning enhanced when you involve yourself in the discussion? If you waited for the food in the serving bowl to throw itself onto your plate, you'd be mighty hungry. Instead, reach out and grab what you want.

Take your teachers'

comments seriously. Improving your ability to communicate will serve you well. How many times has your teacher handed back a paper in which you see nothing more than the grade at the top? If your teacher has taken the time to help you refine your work, embrace their constructive words. The few minutes you spend pondering their wisdom in the short run will truly benefit you in the long term.

Knowing yourself will help you identify what characteristics you want in a college. Parents and counselors will often ask students to define the characteristics they deem important in a college, yet it seems counterintuitive that, as a teenager you know definitively whether you want a big university or small liberal arts college, an urban environment or a rural setting, or other choices you've never been faced with. Start thinking now about how you work best, how you enjoy learning, what's important to you, and then visit a wide variety of schools to see what environments seem to allow you to fulfill your potential as a college student. You don't have to wait until your senior year in high school to schedule college visits. Instead, visit a variety of different campuses -- you'll be surprised to learn how campus reality matches up with your perceptions.

Don't roll your eyes at your parents. They will support you through your educational ventures, and they want what's best for you. Remember to appreciate them along the way. Imagine the shock if you looked your parents right in the eye and uttered, "Thanks for your help." Think, too, about how much more willing they will be to go out of their way knowing that you appreciate what they've done. You'll need them on this haul, so be kind -- it'll come back to you in multiples.

When it comes to college, it's not all in the name. Did you know that George Lucas, the producer of the *Star Wars* and *Indiana Jones* movies went to community college (as did a retired U.S. Supreme Court Justice and the first female space shuttle astronaut)? Did you know that the vast majority of fortune 500 CEOs did not graduate from Ivy League Institutions? Did you know that students who graduated from Harvard did not earn more money than their counterparts who were accepted to Harvard but chose to go to other, often lower-cost institutions? Don't let perceived prestige drive you; let happiness and fit motivate your future choices.

## Bike/hike trail best for old Hudson-Helderberg rail

Editor, The Spotlight:

I read Albany County's announcement of the progress of the Hudson - Helderberg rail trail in the Aug. 27 Spotlight with enthusiasm.

The project will be a great recreation, commuting and regional open space amenity. The trail will also hold this important right-of-way for underground utilities, and will take advantage of private funds available through the Scenic Hudson organization.

The letter from Paul Marsh (*Tourist-rail option deserves second look*) about this right-of-way in the same publication arguing for a tourist rail line requires a reply. In contrast to Mr. Marsh's insinuation that all but he who have worked on this project since 1996 were paid officials, I suggest he look at the meeting notes to see how many supporters working for the trail concept were volunteers.

The rail trails in the region have been popular, so there was, and will be no shortage of people offering their time to help advance the projects. Before the rails were abandoned and removed for salvage by the line's owner, the discussion of the potential availability and public use of the property were not yet fully begun. A misalignment of the bridge

over the Normanskill made any rail operations improbable without great expense, thus speeding their abandonment of rail service and their removal of the tracks. Thus, a "commuter" connection, even so far as the south fringe of Albany, required a major bridge project.

The proposal was further complicated by no ready route through railyards and the busy freight track into downtown, and no downtown terminal. Thus, commuter uses were unlikely.

Consequently, Mr. Marsh's proposal, as he states, was for a tourist-rail operation. There are four of these operations available within about an hour of Albany, and even more within two hours. Operations of these tourist lines are often sporadic, and visitors come to the "amusement ride" by car, travel slowly on the train for about an hour one way, then the train returns to the same parking lot, adding cars to regional transportation loads, rather than solving traffic problems.

Additionally, significant transportation funds are funneled off to maintain and reinforce bridges and culverts, restore rails and secure rolling stock.

Many of the trail costs Mr. Marsh complains about, such

as the removal of lead paint on bridges, would have to be solved for any use of the line, sometimes with significantly more work needed than a bike/hike route requires. While development costs of trails are by no means negligible, they are a scale of magnitude less than that needed for a railroad.

A lot of agencies and volunteer effort helped CDTC review the options available for the use and preservation of this rail line. I hope their, and the county's, decisions to advance a trail project can now move ahead to acquire and build a facility that the region can be proud of.

# County sweep nets New Scotland set for soccer meeting parking offenders

## Project Access cracks down on illegal use of handicap spaces

Project Access, an initiative to cut down on drivers parking illegally in handicap spots, resulted in \$6,260 in traffic fines during a one-day sweep on Friday, Aug. 29.

Albany County Sheriff James L. Campbell announced that a total of 35 parking summonses were issued to individuals parked illegally, according to information provided by the Albany County Traffic Safety Board.

First Sgt. Leonard Crouch, with the Albany County Sheriff's Department, said the sweep showed a decrease in violations where private security agencies have taken the lead on preventing violations.

"People seem to be getting it at the malls because there has been some increased activity by mall security," Crouch said. "People are getting the hint."

Crouch did comment, though, that in urban areas, such as the City of Albany, people are still using handicap spaces too often.

The Albany Police Department issued 26 summonses, the Colonie Police Department issued seven and Crossgates Mall and Stuyvesant Plaza security each issued one summons, according to the report.

Crouch said the seven in Colonie were primarily at the Colonie Center Mall, Latham Circle Mall and Latham Farms.

The program has been in place since 1994 and a total of 38 sweeps have been conducted since that time. A total of 1,864 summonses, totaling \$195,210 in fines have been collected since the program's inception, according to the report.

The funds go toward educational programs to prevent handicap parking abuse.

Crouch said the next sweep has not been officially scheduled, but it might land some time in October.



with the pedestrians taking advantage of them, but also with neighboring residents whose properties may border them.

Most of the paths incorporated by individual municipalities focus on recreational uses, but some towns, such as Colonie, Clifton Park and Niskayuna, are aiming to reduce vehicle traffic on busy roadways by creating pedestrian-friendly pathway plans that allow residents to walk to nearby amenities and local businesses.

Town officials contend it improves traffic flow and quality of life, but at the same time supports local businesses and promotes economic development.

Colonie drafted a pathway plan in March, which was prepared by the town's planning and economic development department and identified multi-use pedestrian paths as an important goal for the town.

According to the report, "It very quickly became apparent that sidewalks are only one component of how people move about in the town without the use of a car. Children are bicycling to school, the trails of the Crossings of Colonie have become an important connector between Wolf Road and the neighborhoods to the north, south and east of the park, and workers use the Mohawk Hudson Bike Hike Trail to bicycle to work."

The report concluded, "Multi-use paths, bicycle lanes and striped shoulders, which are all pathways, should be all included in an integrated plan to address alternative modes of transportation."

In the town of Guilderland, Supervisor Ken Runion said the town created its own Pathways Committee in an attempt to connect its sidewalks and pathways around town.

Runion said it servers areas "across the spectrum in town," by cutting down on traffic, adding recreation and helping business.

"The original plan was to have a walking path from the Crossgates Mall area to Tawasentha Park," he said. "Tawasentha has a total of 600 acres ... and probably 6 miles of trails."

The park is also linked to the town's municipal golf course and has small kiosks throughout the park trail system that display color-coded maps for pedestrians. The town keeps the maintained cost down by having "mowed trails."

However, Runion said, the town is looking to increase its number of "hard paths" for baby strollers and other accommodations. The town also has a network of sidewalks, bike paths and multi-use pathways, he added, and is always looking to expand and interconnect the network. The town recently applied for a grant with the state Department of Parks and Recreation to aid its efforts.

"Everything I've heard has been very positive, and a number of people frequently use the trails," said Runion.

Albany County has been involved with several pathway and bike path projects, most notably the Mohawk-Hudson Bike-Hike Trail between Albany and Schenectady counties, and most recently the Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail from Albany to Voorheesville.

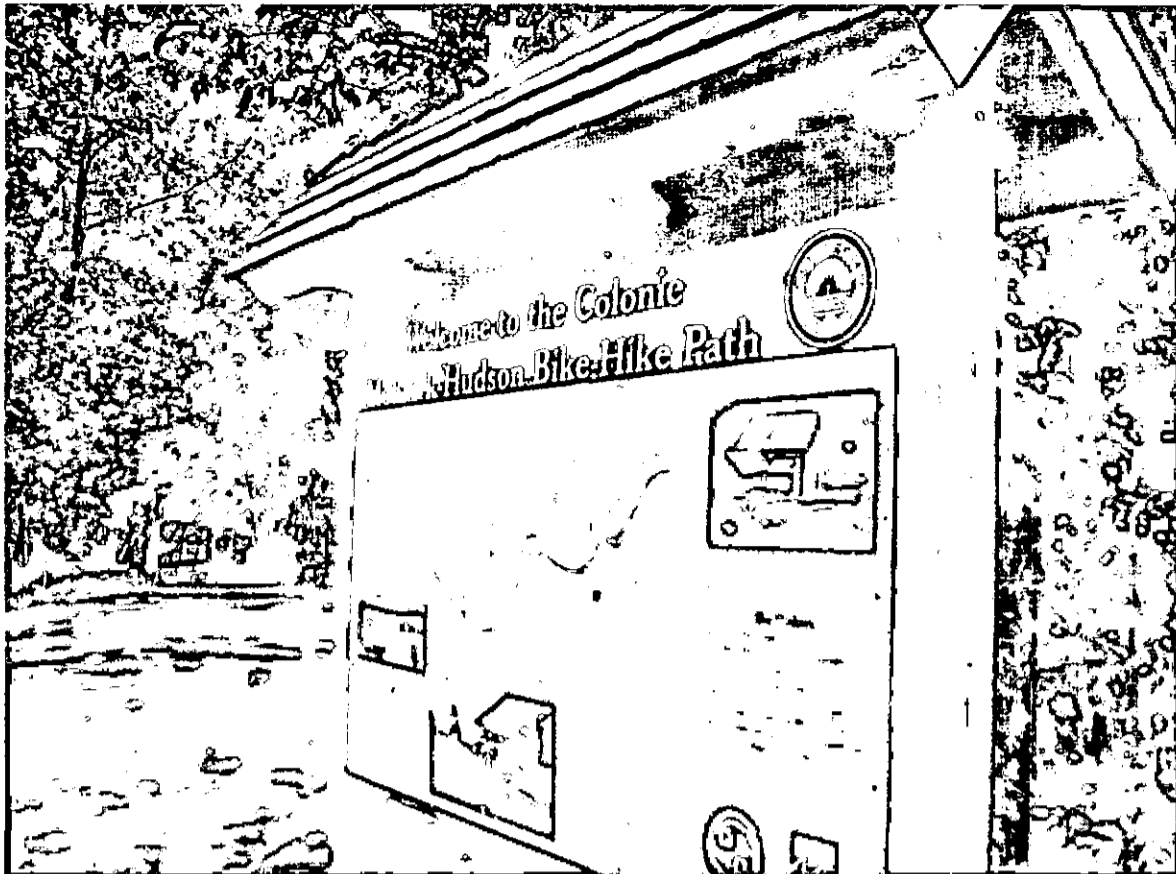
County Executive Michael Breslin made the announcement in the town of Bethlehem in August that he was asking the county Legislature to enter into an agreement with Canadian Pacific Railway and purchase more than 9 miles of right-of-way in order to build a rail-to-trail path.

The county was given \$70,000 to purchase the property from the not-for-profit Scenic Hudson organization and the state's Department of Parks and Recreation.

"There are a number of rail trails right here in the Capital Region," said Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham. "The Corning Preserve path is an old rail bed."

Cunningham said the proposed Helderberg-Hudson trail would be able to link Bethlehem to various parks, sidewalks and pathways around town and offer a possible commuting options for locals.

"It is my belief the more that we create in terms of safe pathways as an alternative to motor vehicle use, the more likely people are to use them," Cunningham said. "More people

from project to project.

"The Hudson-Mohawk trail starts in Albany and goes west ... but there's different entities that actually own it," Franchini said. "The state purchased the property and has municipalities maintain it. That's one model we use. ... That municipal agreement has been in place for 25 years, and it's worked out pretty well."

Albany County maintains some of the off-road sections of the path in Menands and Cohoes, he said.

"We haven't worked it out with the Helderberg-Hudson trail yet," Franchini said. "We'll probably be looking for partners to help with maintenance."

Cunningham said he has a verbal agreement with Breslin that once the Helderberg-Hudson trail is completed, ownership would shift to the town, which would be responsible for maintenance.

Cunningham said nothing is in writing at this point.

In Niskayuna, the Mohawk-Hudson trail covers roughly 10 miles, stretching from the Colonie town line to the Schenectady city line, while offering access to several parks and natural areas along the way.

The town recently took part in a new state pilot program called the Canalway Trail Ambassador Program, which uses "trail ambassadors" to assist and inform trail users, offer directions and details about the trail, and monitor the trail and the conditions around it and

other benefits to the pathway.

Niskayuna Supervisor Joe Landry said he was "very pleased and honored that the town of Niskayuna will be the first community in New York state to have trail ambassadors assisting the users of our bike-hike trail."

Some communities, like those in Saratoga County, also use economic development to promote open space and pedestrian pathways, citing it as a balance to offset commercial and residential sprawl.

Matthew Veitch, supervisor of Saratoga Springs, announced his intention to push for \$250,000 to be included in the 2009 budget for a new trail grant program for Saratoga County.

Saratoga County has always been about growth. Job creation, new economic development and residential developments, and other economic incentives are a part of what has made Saratoga County a great county, Veitch said. I support these types of initiatives, but believe we need to balance our development with open space preservation and trail building

initiatives. A trail program that can assist the City of Saratoga Springs, and the towns within the County with their trail projects, is something that will improve the quality of life for all residents.

Bethlehem Councilman Sam Messina, an early and vocal advocate of the Hudson-Helderberg Rail Trail and other Capital District pedestrian pathways, said municipal cooperation is key for regional recreation and economic development initiatives.

"Counties working with local municipalities for certain functions works well for meaningful regionalization," Messina said. "I'm really pleased with Michael Breslin taking the lead in this [regional project] as both a councilman and a resident."

Messina said grants and organization donation would continue to be a viable solution to creating such projects as local municipalities constantly struggle with "the competition of our town's resources."

In the end, Messina concluded, "This is a win-win for the entire region."

- Gas prices.

Real-time gas prices are reported by volunteer price spotters at [www.albanygasprices.com](http://www.albanygasprices.com). The site is searchable by town and grade of gasoline.



It contains national and local averages and links to price information for other localities. It provides a good sample of prices across chains and areas.

- Common prescription drugs.

The Web site [rx.nyhealth.gov/pdpw/index.jsp](http://rx.nyhealth.gov/pdpw/index.jsp) is the state Department of Health site that collects retail pricing information for the 150 most commonly prescribed drugs in their most commonly prescribed dosages and quantities. Information is collected from pharmacies participating in the Medicaid program. It is searchable by city, county, or zip code. Prices are not verified by the health department and are posted as they are submitted, so you should check with your own pharmacy for current pricing.

- Real estate.

For national real estate information based on public records, go to [www.zillow.com](http://www.zillow.com). Search by specific address, street name, city name, or zip code. The site provides an estimate (the "Zestimate") of worth for a particular property based on sale prices of comparable properties in the area; includes recent sales history, photos, and property descriptions. A good

starting point for research.

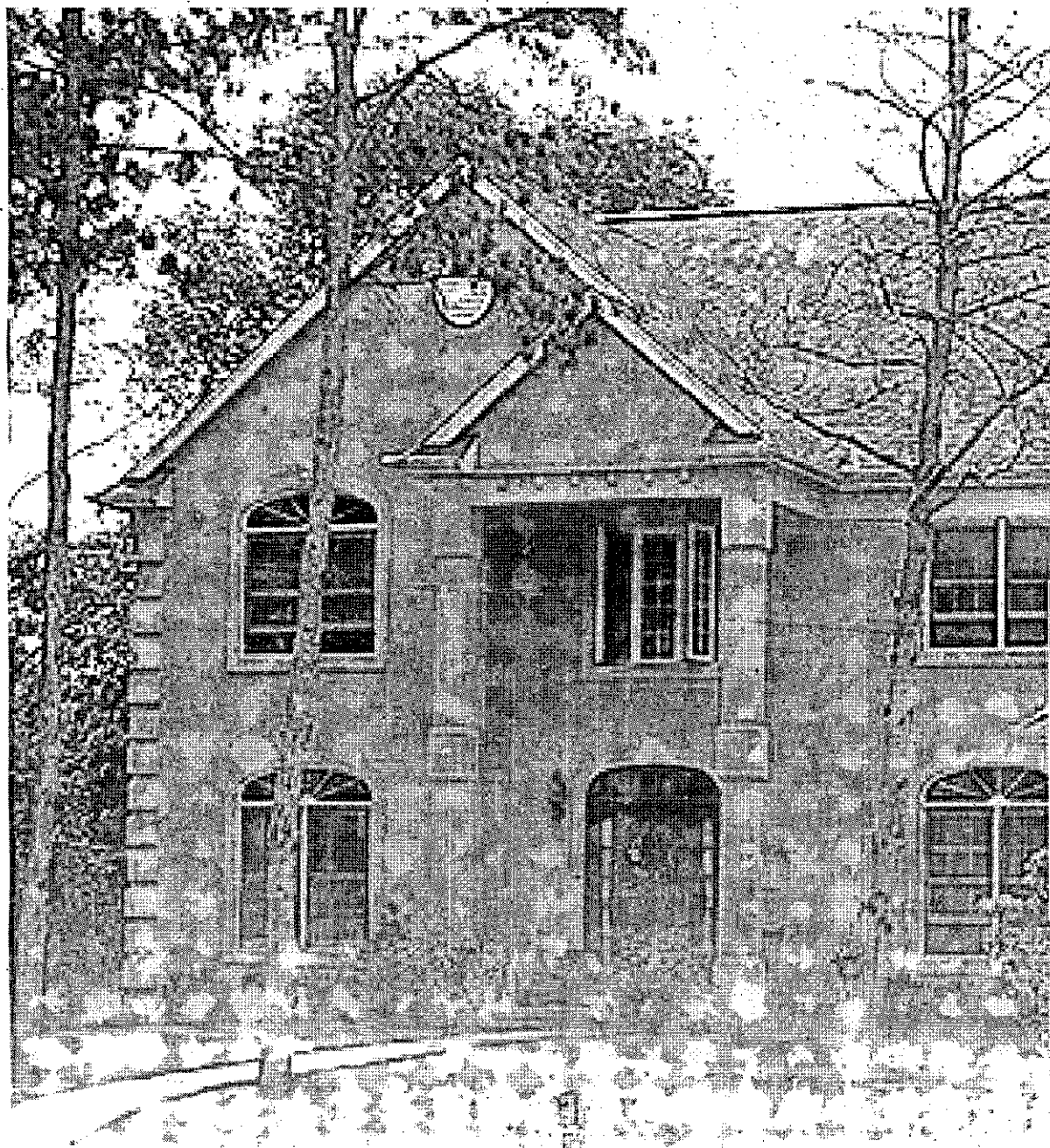

# Candidates dispute election filings

## A July legal battle over signatures spawns new controversy

Congressional candidate Steven Vasquez and his campaign manager Warren Redlich have filed a complaint with the Federal Elections Commission claiming that James Buhrmaster, Vasquez's opponent in the 21st Congressional District, failed to report a portion of his campaign expenditures.

Josh Hills, a spokesman for Buhrmaster, said the candidate has appropriately reported his

expenses.

The FEC does not have the ability to remove a name from the ballot, but it can impose fines if a candidate does not follow election law, said Mary Brandenberger, a spokesperson for the FEC. She said the complaint, dated Tuesday, Sept. 2, had not yet been processed as press time.

The complaint states that Buhrmaster failed to report the expenditures of his attorney, Tom Marcelle, in a legal battle the two candidates had in July.

Marcelle said he has not yet billed the Buhrmaster camp and will not due so until primary day on Tuesday, Sept. 9.

"I've done hundreds of election cases. The litigation in-

volved was 'ballet access,' which will go out on primary day," Marcelle said. "I don't know what the costs of my services will be."

Marcelle represented Buhrmaster in a mid-summer legal battle where the candidate sued to knock Vasquez off the congressional ballot in a signature dispute. Vasquez won the case, and the two will faced off in the Tuesday, Sept. 9, primary to determine who will represent the Republican Party in the race against U.S. Rep. Michael McNulty, D-Green Island.

"Buhrmaster filed a frivolous lawsuit, wasted everyone's money and time, and then decided not to report the expense," said Redlich in a written state-

ment. "He had better be ready to explain this deficiency to the FEC."

Hills said Buhrmaster has not received a bill from Marcelle and has not dodged any expenditure filings.

"We never got a bill from Marcelle. We haven't paid him anything," Hills said. "The campaign has requested an invoice, but that's not been billed as of yet. That's all there is to this nonsense. I don't know of any organization that pays a bill before they receive it. ... This is clearly a last ditch effort. It is just a Hail Mary on Redlich's part to get some last-minute [publicity]," he added.

Brandenberger said the FEC requires that all debt be report-

ed as such, until it becomes an expenditure, unless the debt is less than \$500.

However, Hills said that since Buhrmaster does not know how much the bill will come to, there is no way to report the debt.

"The reality is that there is a debt. He owes Tom Marcelle money," Redlich said. "The people are entitled to know how much [he] spent."

Hills said under the circumstances, there was no way to determine the debt owed, and there was nothing to file.

"We operated under the assumption we would get a bill," Hills said. "We told him to send us a bill when he was ready."

Local lawmakers and school officials were also on hand to commemorate the district's first new building since President Dwight D. Eisenhower roamed the halls of the White House.

The event began with a group of high school students singing the national anthem followed by the school's alma mater.

Appropriately, the district's new superintendent, Michael Tebbano, gave the opening speech to the large crowd of family members, politicians, and reporters waiting anxiously outside to get their first peak at the new school.

"We're all very, very excited," Tebbano told the crowd. "Eagle is a special place with a very special name. Eagle was decided on by consensus of the whole school district."

Next up to the podium was state Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, who lauded the Bethlehem School District as one of the best around and the town itself as a great place to live.

"It gives me enormous pride to be here," Neil Breslin said,

adding that his children are BC alumni. "If you don't already know, this is the best town to live in and the best school district in the Northeast. It's a terrific place to raise kids and to live, and I look forward to many more years here in Bethlehem."

Next in line was Assemblyman Tim Gordon, I-Bethlehem, who stated the brand new building would be home to some of the area's, and possibly the world's, future talent and will be the springboard to greatness for thousands of students.

"It's wonderful to see the dedication of the faculty here," Gordon said to a large applause. "We can only imagine ... what students will come through these doors and what impact they will have on the community."

Albany County Executive Michael Breslin spoke next.

"Mrs. Reagan, boy are you lucky," Breslin said referring to the Eagle's new principal Dianna Reagan. "The place looks great and I'm proud to be a part of this community."

Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham followed the Breslin speech by talking about the symbolic nature of opening the new school.

"I am a graduate of Bethlehem Central," Cunningham said to a cheering crowd. "I think this is a great symbol for the investment we've made into our community and to our children."

Bethlehem Board of Education President James Lytle followed up the line of politicians with a few jokes and a little historical trivia.

"You know, if it were up to a man named Ben Franklin this would have been called Turkey Elementary," Lytle said referring to Franklin advocating the turkey over the eagle for the national bird.

"Somehow that doesn't sound the same," he quipped.

The biggest applause of the evening was reserved for Principal Reagan.

"I, too, am a graduate of BC and am very much an Eagle," Reagan said, poking her own fun by saying it wasn't fair to have to speak after so many officials who frequently speak publicly.

"I would like to thank everyone at BC, the community and the board of education," Reagan said, before thanking her own family for supporting her during long preparation hours to get the school up and running. "This is

the day we've been waiting for. ... Welcome to Eagle."

The crowd packed into the school as rock and roll tunes played on the loud speakers and were treated to shakes and refreshments in the Eagle Cafetorium and given tours of Bethlehem's newest building in 51 years.

"Come on in — it's your school," Tebbano announced just before the crowd dashed into the building.

At a board of education meeting the next evening on Wednes-

day, Sept. 3, which was also the first day of school, the board complimented Reagan and the district's faculty and staff for putting on a "phenomenal opening."

"It made us all proud to be a part of the school. We had a phenomenal opening day of school today," Lytle said at the meeting.

"Dianna Reagan had everything under wonderful control," Tebbano added. "Eagle is fully operational and is now running."

happy with our plans," said senior principal of the project, Mark Dempf. "The original theme was more of a Dutch look ... but they felt like it looked too Disneyland for the project."

Dempf said the new style would give each building a more unique look.

"They were tired of that other look," Dempf said. "The Craftsman look is more of the look of old Delmar."

Each unit will have a different style door and have large overhangs and porches to give the project a "comfy home feel," according to Van Dyke Spinney architect, Jamie Copeland of Hudson Design.

"It's a very buildable design with welcoming appearance of deep overhangs and porches," Copeland told the board. "They're [units] for seniors, and we are trying to make it easier for them to live alone. ... If everything looked the same, people could get lost."

Planning board members in general seemed pleased with the new design scheme, but Bethlehem's assistant director of economic development and planning, Michael Morelli, said they board is now waiting for a more detailed look of the project including grading, infrastructure needs, water and sewer designs, landscaping, and other details from developers.

"The board had asked them to scale back on the northern end of the site, and they took out three of the buildings closer to Van Dyke Road," said Morelli. "This allows for more wooded property in the project and minimizes a potential impact on wetlands."

He added that some trees

would inevitably have to be removed during construction in order to implement the pedestrian pathway slated for project. Currently, he said, the project is going through site plan review and that the next step is to look at infrastructure.

"The idea was to get the design down," Morelli said. "They're going to get in more of the site detail next because they're going to extend water and sewer to the project."

Copeland told the board that a "community house" was planned to be the centerpiece of the design for the proposed multi-unit project.

The development proposal has been stalled several times over the years but was recently granted a proposed planned development by the town board and has been moving forward since. There have been some concerns from neighbors regarding infrastructure and the size and scope of the project. Some of the residents expressed concerns that they were not adequately involved in the project's planning process and were not given ample time to speak publicly.

There have been public hearings held on the project at Town Hall, but, Morelli said, it is unlikely that there will be any more.

Planning board member Kate Powers said she like the new style and added, "It appears to be well-done."

Planning Board Chairman Parker Mathusa joked with fellow board member John Smolinsky about moving forward with plan details.

"I think I'm ready," Smolinsky said.

When Mathusa interjected, "To move in?"

"No, not yet," Smolinsky said to a round of laughter. "But I'm ready to move forward."

Police said they smelled burned marijuana inside of Deluca's vehicle, and when asked about it, she told officers "her boyfriend smokes cigars."

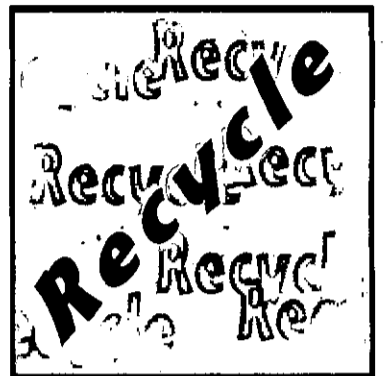
Officers also smelled alcohol on Deluca's breath when interviewing her and she admitted to "drinking in Albany with her last drink at 2 a.m.," the report states.



He's even a good sport when his sisters put him in a tutu and make-up. Elliot is also the one who hangs around the kitchen, whisking salad dressing and tasting the sauce.

Among the hikes and carefree afternoons were many memorable meals. Nothing fancy - just a lot of fresh vegetables, simply prepared.

One dinner in particular that stands out was made while camping in July. We ate cheese quesadillas, refried beans and steamed veggies. I added a few extra touches like homemade salsa and fresh herbs on the vegetables. That evening we lit torches around our picnic table and watched the sun set over the lake while we ate. Of course, we ate toasted marshmallows until our bellies ached.

A few weeks after camping, we had just sat down for lunch on a warm, sunny day. It was one of those days when I wanted to spend as much time as possible outside. So I wasn't taking any lunch orders. It was going to be pasta for one and all. I chopped tomatoes, picked basil, and tossed in some olive oil and sea salt. The effect was very fresh and summery. This sauce was poured over penne pasta and set in a big bowl.

We all sat in the shade, serving ourselves when we heard a familiar voice over the fence. "Hey, what are you guys doing?"

It was PJ, our charming 6-year-old neighbor. Part Dennis the Menace, part Curious George, he is loved by everyone in our house. And he can sense when a meal is being served. So after a phone call to his mother, who swore he'd eaten lunch already, I served him up a bowl of pasta. He entertained us, chatting about Pokemon, his dog, and his father's tractor. It felt like what summer dining should be: fun, casual, shared with friends.

Our family also spent a week in Cape Cod this August. There was one night that I spent a little extra time

preparing dinner. Instead of the usual cod or haddock, I bought a piece of tuna. We made pretty memorable tacos using the tuna, cabbage from the farm stand and fresh corn cut from the cob. We toasted the tortillas on the grill for a minute or so, and then stuffed them with slices of the meaty tuna, crunchy corn and cabbage slaw and spicy salsa. Unfortunately, my husband couldn't join us on the Cape this year. And when I called him that evening to talk about our day, it wasn't the ocean, the beach or even the kids I talked about. It was the tuna tacos.

This tomato soup recipe is great late-summer eating.

### From a Caterer's Kitchen

It really is like summer in a bowl. Right now is the best time to make it when the tomatoes are fat and ripe. Crushed tomatoes in a can are an OK substitution. We almost always serve this soup with grilled cheese: thick sliced multigrain bread brushed with a little olive oil and muenster cheese cooked in our grill pan.

The chicken recipe I created in attempt to prepare something at home that resembles the chicken parmesan my kids love to order in Italian restaurants. They love it, but the fried chicken, sweet thick red sauce and loads of gooey cheese just doesn't cut it for a healthy dinner in my house. Lucy and Zoe will tell you that this isn't at all what you get in a restaurant, but pretty good anyway. And it's another place to use some of those glorious ripe plum or heirloom tomatoes that are hanging around right now.

With school starting this week, and all of the busy activities that go along with it, my thoughts turn from creating impromptu meals to share with friends. Now it's all about planning weekly meals and healthy lunch boxes. It is still the harvest season here in New York, though. At the farmer's market and farm stands everywhere are juicy, ripe tomatoes, fresh corn, melon, berries, lettuce and so much more.

Last week Zoe asked me, "Who do you eat lunch with when we are all in school?"

I told her that I usually eat a quick sandwich or salad while checking e-mail or paying bills. Occasionally I meet Paul or a friend for lunch.

"Oh," she said, "it sounds kinds boring."

The truth is, it is a little boring. Most days, there won't be any little bodies running around here, asking when lunch will be ready. But I'll look forward to next summer, when the sun warms our backs, and we eat lunch together on the deck. We'll talk about where we'll hike, or swim, or bike that day. And we'll wait for PJ, with his pasta bowl.

#### Cream of fresh tomato soup

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, sliced
- 5 large, ripe tomatoes, chopped
- 4 cups low-fat milk
- 1 tablespoon sea salt

Fresh basil, for garnish  
Heat the olive oil over medium heat in a large saucepan. Add the onions and garlic, and cook for a few minutes, until soft but not browned. Add the tomatoes and cook for a few minutes. Slowly add the milk, stirring, until it is heated through. Allow to cool down, and puree in batches in a blender. Serve warm with grilled cheese sandwiches.

#### Homemade chicken parmesan

- 5 chicken breast halves, each sliced horizontally into two thin pieces
- 1/2 cup red wine
- 1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
- 3 sprigs fresh rosemary, leaves removed and chopped
- 1 teaspoon sea salt
- 2 large tomatoes, sliced thin
- 4-5 ounces Asiago cheese (or other Italian style hard cheese), sliced thin

Light a grill to medium heat. Combine chicken with wine, vinegar, rosemary and sea salt. Allow to marinate for 1/2 hour. Cook for 4 minutes on one side, flip and place tomato and cheese over each. Cook for another 4-5 minutes. Serve with a green salad.

*Event showcases the site's importance through the ages*

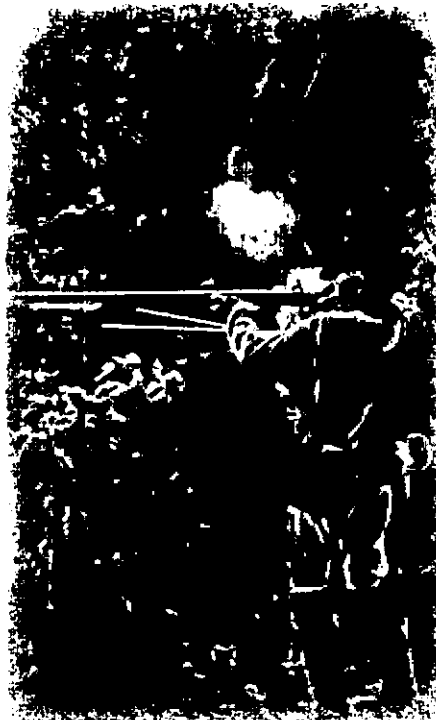

Those interested in the history of New York state and the Capital District will have the perfect reason to head to Mabee Farm Historic Site in Rotterdam Junction on Monday, Sept. 14, as the farm hosts its second History Fair from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The event brings together a number of speakers from across the state who are well-versed in a variety of historical disciplines.

"We're very happy with our lineup" said Site Manager Pat Barrot. "We were able to get some tremendous speakers this year."

Featured speakers include author Janny Venema, assistant to the state translator of historic Dutch documents, who will give a lecture titled "Beverwijck; A Dutch Village on the American Frontier." "They're there to talk with the people about what they



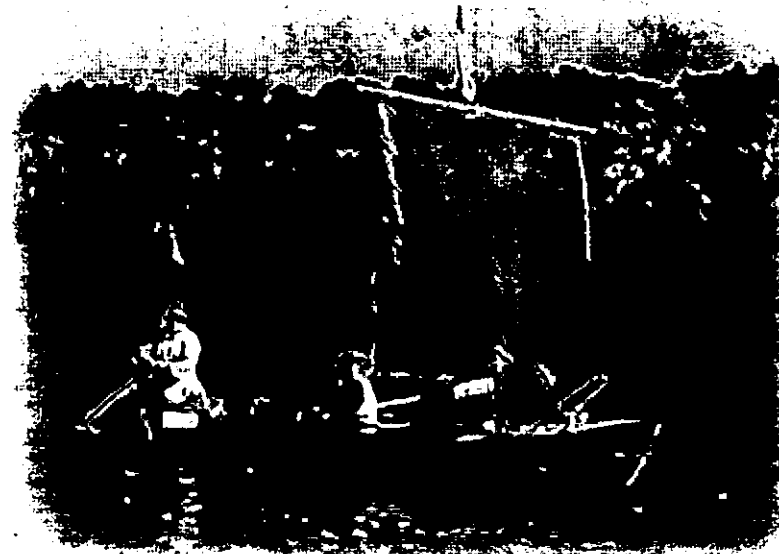
offer and their expertise" said Barrot.

The property has served numerous purposes throughout history, becoming an inn in the early 1800s, and its grounds once included four gardens and a slave quarters.

two or three extra yards after the initial contact," said Smith.

The Eagles defense also came up big. Guilderland gained only 74 yards on the ground and didn't have a first down in the first quarter. That, plus a 90-yard interception return for a touchdown from Kyle Niehaus, put a smile on Smith's face.

"The thing that pleased me was that we were more physical than Guilderland," said Smith.

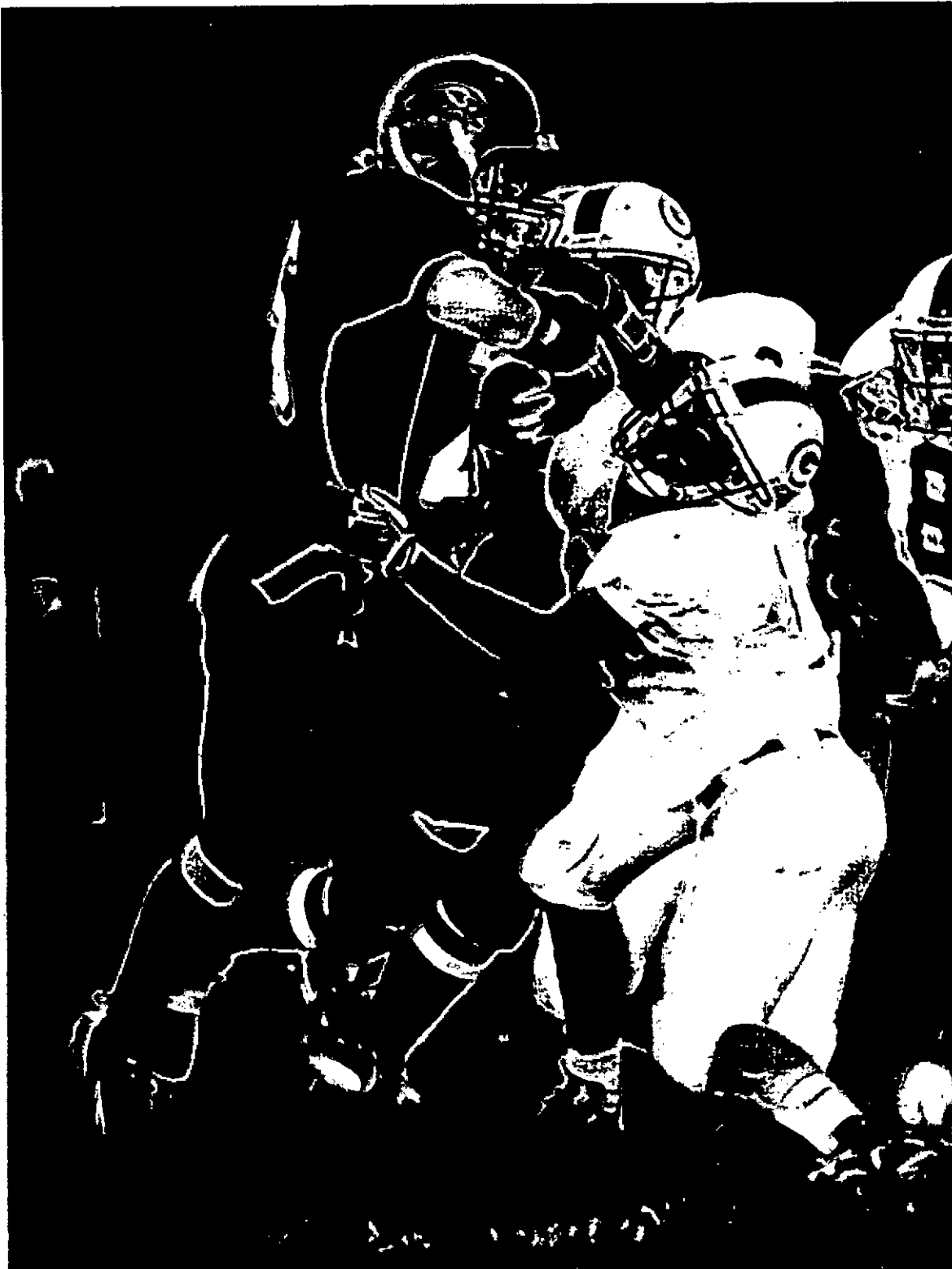

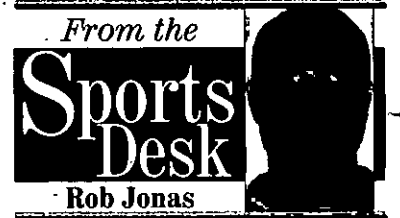
## LaSalle, CBA prove they are contenders

When it comes to making Section II football preseason predictions, I should stick to one simple rule - don't do it.

Granted, not all of the predictions I made in my "Sports Scraps" blog went down the drain in Week 1 (to see them, go to [www.spotlightnews.com/blogs/rjonas](http://www.spotlightnews.com/blogs/rjonas)), and it's still early enough that some teams could still do well after some bad losses. But, there are some predictions that I'd like to take back now in my column.

For instance, in the Class AA Liberty Division, I had LaSalle pegged for last place. Then, the Cadets defeated Colonie 25-14 with a potent passing attack led by the combination of quarterback Mike Murray and receiver Lou DiNovo (six catches, 204 yards, three touchdowns).
