## No time to be a kid

Too many extracurricular activities are leaving children with little downtime

Those ubiquitous soccer mom stickers on the minivans, the ones that are essentially saying, "Get out of my way, we must make it to practice on time," may not do justice to the schedules of today's busy families. A number of parents are no longer just soccer moms and dads, but more like multi-sport, multi-club, multi-lesson parents.

The number of sport and club opportunities for kids these days has even shifted the focus off academics for some. It's a phenomenon that one educator fresh out of college said she was not up to speed with.

The student then said she would most likely not have time for homework that night, either, because she had some sort of lesson. Rocco said her thought was, "Is this now acceptable?"

"For many children, it seems as though schoolwork is not a priority," said Rocco. "As a child, I was always taught schoolwork first - then the extras. I thought that was a basic principle in parenting."

## Open budget meetings on tap

Bethlehem Central expands budget schedule and lets public in on process

With a new administration at the helm, the Bethlehem Central School District is changing the way it does business.

Superintendent Michael Tebbano, a former assistant superintendent who was named to the post last spring, said the district plans to begin the budget process in January and will hold a series "town hall"-style meetings to allow residents to ask specific questions about academic programs, district spending and, of course, the all-important tax rate.

Tebbano said there was nothing wrong with how the school previously created its yearly budget, but that he wanted to make the process as transparent as possible while engaging the public at the same time.

"What we're trying to do is to get the school district involved in the budget process earlier than they have in the past," Tebbano said. "We want to put out specific information ... put our programs up front and analyze what they're all about."

## Vista developers update initial building plans

Ground breaking soon on Bethlehem's biggest development deal

The biggest development deal and the talk of the town for quite some time in both Bethlehem and New Scotland is getting ready to break ground, according to plans from the developers of the Vista

Technology Park in Slingerlands.

Developers say they have pieced together a plan for the first phase of construction after three years of preparation and visits to Bethlehem and New Scotland town, planning and zoning boards.

Developers told the Bethlehem Planning Board at its Wednesday, Sept. 16, meeting that construction on Vista Boulevard will begin this fall and that ground breaking

# Police Blotter

## Police: Obama assault report 'baseless'

Bethlehem police said the women who reported being attacked after leaving a Barack Obama fundraising event at Belf's restaurant in Delmar and said her attacker used a racial slur before assaulting her, lied to police about not knowing her alleged attacker.

Following the initial report of the incident, police confirmed that it took place outside of St. Thomas's Church on Delaware Avenue Friday, Sept. 5, and that an investigation was underway.

This week, *Spotlight Newspapers* obtained the police report, which stated the woman "did in fact know her attacker," but "did not originally state to officers she knew [him]."

"This supplemental report [states] that the incident originally reported to this department was found to be baseless and untrue," the report continued.

Local law officials, including Albany County District Attorney David Soares and Bethlehem Police Chief Louis Corsi, held a meeting Thursday, Sept. 18, regarding the incident.

"After discussing the case, it was agreed by all parties attending the meeting that no criminal charges will be pursued at this time due to many inconsistencies in the stories by all parties involved and lack of supporting evidence/witnesses," the report stated.

In a release issued by police, the department stated the incident was reported at 3:10 a.m., about three hours after it allegedly occurred, and that it "is considered to be an isolated incident, not a random act of violence."

In the original complaint to police, the woman said that just before midnight on Friday, Sept. 5, she was wearing an Obama campaign button when she was assaulted from behind, verbally accosted, and then hit in face once before falling to the ground.

The incident was first reported on the Obama campaign Web site on Saturday, Sept. 6, at 1:35 p.m. by Delmar resident Richard Reeves-Ellington. As of the afternoon of Monday, Sept. 22, the story remained on the Web site with no updated information pertaining to the case.

Bethlehem police said that the "case remains open pending new information."

### Other arrests

Janeen N. Collins, 38, of Delmar, and David L. Downer, 23, of Albany, were both arrested for DWI after police discovered them driving on Delaware Avenue one car length apart without any headlights on.

Collins was charged with DWI, first offense; operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of 0.08 or greater — both misdemeanors; and operating a motor vehicle without headlights.

Downer was charged with DWI, second offense; operating a motor vehicle with a BAC of 0.08 percent or greater — both felonies; and following too close, an infraction.

Bethlehem police say they saw Collins driving a tan SUV with only her running lights on and that another SUV was following her approximately one to one-and-a-half car lengths behind her.

When an officer on stationary

patrol activated his emergency lights, Collins stopped but Downer continued driving, according to the arrest reports.

Police said they could smell alcohol on Collin's breath when interviewing her, and, when asked who was driving the other vehicle, Collins responded, "I'm trying to hook up with that guy."

The report states the other vehicle was driven by a black male who was later discovered to be Downer after he returned to the scene "somewhat reluctantly."

Downer rolled down his passenger-side window when talking to officers and was discovered to smell of alcohol and show signs of intoxication, the reports state, and told officers "he had a couple of beers watching the football game ... in Albany."

A background check revealed that Downer was convicted of DWI in the village of Menands on July 19, the report states, and he is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Oct. 7.



# Board requests changes to layout

With a sizable agenda during its Wednesday, Sept. 17, meeting, the Bethlehem Planning Board heard several plans and requested Brookside Meadows developers change their site layout on Clapper Road.

Some of the developments heard throughout the evening included the Glenmont Mobil proposal to build a drive-through coffee shop; a 28-lot subdivision on Russell Road called Millwood Estates; the eight-lot Carol Richards subdivision near Five Rivers (see related story, page 8); plans for a medical office building on Route 9W; and the presentation of the first building phase of the Vista Technology Park (see related story, page 1).

Although it is unknown at this time what exactly were the changes the board is asking of Brookside Meadows, Planning Board Chairman Parker Mathusa indicated it might have to do with a CSX railway deal.

"Economic opportunities only comes once in a while and have to ride that train when it comes," Parker said, specifically mentioning CSX.

Planning Board member Howard Engel has been openly critical of the residential impact and potential implications of the project.

"I think I've made myself clear ... I'm very skeptical of this project," Engel said, adding that he has seen nothing in writing.

"While we may be reluctant to do this, the overall town may benefit from it," Parker said.

The Glenmont Mobil was granted special-use permit for its plans to put a drive-through Dunkin Donuts at its Route 9W Glenmont location by a vote of 4-to-1. Planning Board member Nicholas Behuniak cast the dissenting vote.

The owner plans on installing an "electronic staking sign," to help ease traffic at the busy Feura Bush Road intersection, which is the site of a possible future roundabout.

In other applicants heard, the Millwood Estates was unanimously granted conditional final approval for its 28-lot subdivision; and the Richards subdivision was tabled; and a public hearing for the 9W medical office building was set for Tuesday, Oct. 7, at 7:15 p.m.

Board members John Smolinsky and Kate Powers were absent from the meeting.



The first day of school, I walked Kevin upstairs through the hallway and out to the schoolyard where his kindergarten class lines up every morning.

At the entrance to his new elementary school, the assistant principal, who warmly welcomed Kevin and assured him that he was going to have a blast in this new and exciting place, greeted us.

When he took his place in line out in the schoolyard, in between a girl so tall she looked my age and a shorter kid with a spiky Mohawk, I hugged him goodbye and started to walk away. I got about 5 feet before I had to turn around and look at him. Kevin, usually the biggest kid in his preschool classes because of his late birthday, seemed so small in that schoolyard full of children.

I've seen my boy in so many ways before that day. I saw him learn to talk, to run; I've seen him naked in the bath and frightened in the middle of the night; I've seen him laugh, cry, angered and curious; but I'd never seen him like this — never in a group of kids so

big and in a place so foreign to me.

I realized then that Kevin DeVoe may be my son, but he does not belong to me. He belongs to the world, and I'm only taking care of him for a short while until he realizes this, too.

It didn't take Kevin long to realize I was watching him. He didn't stop talking to the girl and the Mohawk-headed kid he made fast friends with. He simply held up his hand and motioned me away.

I've never felt so sad in my life.

On my way out, the assistant principal told me, "Don't worry, it'll be fine." She was kind and sincere, but her words really didn't help me much.

The next day was the same. I walked Kevin outside, we hugged goodbye and he started talking to his new friends while I backed away, wishing he'd miss me more. Once again, on the way out,

the assistant principal, who had put three children of her own through this very school, I learned, looked at me and said, "It'll be fine."

By the end of the week, Kevin asked if he could say goodbye to me in the hallway — he didn't need to be walked outside, he said.

"Are you sure, bubba?" I asked.

He just nodded "yes." I wish he'd have changed his mind.

That weekend brought Kevin's first soccer game. We made a Friday night out of shopping for the "coolest" shin guards and soccer socks, while his mother worried about whether or not they would protect him adequately.

Kevin and I were in the soccer aisle of some sporting-goods mega store, when my wife, Jess, rounded the corner holding these monstrous, Black Knight-type armored leg guards.

"What about these?" she asked.

"I'm pretty sure those are for a baseball catcher," I told her. "And I'm also pretty sure they're for a 6-foot tall adult."

"Do you think he'll need a cup?" she asked.

"I'm not sure," I said. In all honesty, I didn't know if soccer players wore cups, or if a 5-year-old soccer player needed to be concerned with one. In my younger years, I had only played lacrosse competitively. I was a goaltender, and in a sport where a quarter-pound rubber ball is hurled at your body, a cup was necessary. But for soccer? I had no idea.

Then I thought of whether or not I wanted grandchildren.

"Better safe than sorry," I said, and threw a cup in our shopping cart.

Saturday came and Kevin took the field. Other than kicking the soccer ball around in our backyard, he'd had zero exposure to the game. Or any organized sport, for that matter.

I was about to learn that youth soccer is far from an organized sport. After the kick-off, all 5-year-old hell broke loose. A mass of kindergarten elbows, heads and kicking feet followed the ball until someone made contact with it and the storm of soccer players changed direction to follow it. Every once in a while a stray kid would be left behind to chase a bug or try to make eye contact with his or her parents.

"Why can't they focus on the ball?" I wondered aloud.

"Because they're 5," came a chorus from several soccer parents beside me.

At some point, one of Kevin's flailing legs made contact with the ball and he broke free from the pack.

"Go for it Kev!" I screamed like the overzealous soccer parent I vowed never to become. "Kick it again!"

Kevin ran toward the ball, his stubby 5-year-old legs working overtime. I was grinning from ear-to-ear until he ran right by the ball and directly to me.

"What did you say?" he

asked. "It's hard to hear out there."

Monday came and back to school. Kevin fought me tooth and nail on his choice of lunch. I packed him a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, a fruit cup and a juice box. He wanted marshmallows and an entire slice of Ritz crackers.

We compromised, and by compromised I mean I packed him the lunch I wanted him to eat and told him he better eat it.

I have to admit, that Monday I dreaded dropping him off at school; worried that he wouldn't want me to walk in with him at all, that maybe he wanted to jump out of the car as I drove around the drop-off area without stopping at all.

I was close to being right! On the way there, he asked if he could walk in by himself.

"You can walk me to the door," he said. I could tell by his voice that he was granting me a small concession. "I can go upstairs by myself."



## Retail development the target of zoning concerns

**Some residents say public hearing too short to make headway.**

At a public workshop regarding town zoning laws, some New Scotland residents suggested rewriting the laws altogether, while others said additional workshops were needed to come up with a viable plan.

The Commercial Zone Advisory Committee held the meeting Wednesday, Sept. 17, at Clayton A. Bouton High School in Voorheesville to discuss progress toward drafting a revision of the zoning laws, including a possible size cap on retail businesses.

"I hope they preserve the rural nature of the town of New Scotland," said resident Allan Bausback. "I hope the changes [in the zoning law] reflect that."

A temporary moratorium on new buildings larger than 30,000 square feet has been in place since May to allow the town time to address its zoning laws. The moratorium was enacted in response to a commercial development proposed by Syracuse-based Sphere that would include a 137,000-square-foot "anchor" store. It is set to expire Nov. 12.

At the workshop, the public's comments ranged from suggestions to rezone the commercial district, to requiring a financial commitment from developers, to constructing a botanical garden on the site Sphere is hoping to develop.

Members of the advocacy group, New Scotlanders for Sound Economic Development set up a display at the high school and handed out literature supporting a size cap on commercial retail buildings of 50,000 square feet.

Resident Peter Burde said he was concerned about how the sheer amount of information gathered in the evening would be drafted to provide a meaningful and useful tool for the CZAC.

"How is it going to be brought together?" Burde asked.

He said he supports a 50,000-square-foot size cap on commercial buildings but would favor an appeals process.

Mike Welti, a senior planner at Behan Planning Associates, which facilitated the meeting, laid out some of the more complex and confusing aspects of the comprehensive plan, such as the definition of "regional draw," and the definition and location of the "hamlet" of New Scotland.

Welti said that a size cap for commercial buildings has not been agreed upon, but discussions have included proposals of 50,000 to 60,000 square feet.

"It's no one's intention to handcuff [businesses]," he said.

He also discussed creating a mixed-use development, including residential, office and commercial buildings.

Attendees were asked to get into groups of 25 to 30 in

classrooms at the high school to have smaller discussions about CZAC's progress.

After some dissent from the crowd, with residents yelling from their seats asking why the group needed to be divided, the crowd dispersed to their classrooms.

During one discussion, some residents said they were unhappy that the workshop was only one night and said the discussion would be better served played out over several days, or even a week.

"This really is a sham," said Marian Mudar of the meeting's brevity.

Mudar also advocated for extending the moratorium on commercial development and possibly even rezoning the commercial district entirely. She recommended using the land for local agriculture instead.

Robert Stapf, New Scotland planning board chair said he is

unsure what could be done with the property and is concerned with several factors limiting its development.

"There is no public water or sewer available," he said.

Stapf said he is in favor of having developers hire independent parties to conduct environmental impact studies and a financial analysis. The results would then be turned over to the town to review.

He also said the developer needs to be financially responsible for the roads and infrastructure to go along with the development.

If the independent review and town review show the

development is a bad idea, then it is up to the town to put a stop to it.

Stapf said he is in favor of developing the land, but acknowledges the restrictions, and realizes a substantial amount of money will be needed to provide the sewer and water.

"There are a lot of factors out there that are unknown," Stapf said. "I support commercial development of that property... [it] lends itself to a blend of uses."

Stapf also added that the entire commercial zone should be addressed, not just the 200-acre lot Sphere is planning to develop.

## Web changes reflect growing reader use

Visitors to the *Spotlight Newspapers* Web site, [www.spotlightnews.com](http://www.spotlightnews.com), may have noticed that some changes have taken place recently.

In an effort to produce an online community that promotes interaction and discussion of the local news we report, we've added a login feature for posting comments to our stories.

This non-invasive login simply asks that you submit a name and valid e-mail address to post comments to our stories. We at *Spotlight Newspapers* feel that this quick login procedure will add a level of accountability that wasn't present in our previous comment system.

The new comment system has some other benefits as well. Readers can now not only post to particular stories, but also reply to particular comments other readers have made. Visitors to the site can also rate other readers' comments and see what other comments a reader has posted on the site.

These features promote the exchange of ideas, rather than a "fire and forget" style of posting comments. Picture less of a graffiti-strewn wall, and more of dinner-table conversation.

Some of our online readers have noticed that the comments that were posted prior to this transition are now gone. Please be assured that these comments were not removed intentionally, but merely as the byproduct of transitioning to a more accountable, user-friendly comment system.

Censorship in the media has been a hot topic in the digital age, more so than in any other, simply because of the fluidity of the medium and ease with which it can be altered. What was on a Web site once may not be the same as what appears minutes later.

For the most part, we alter our Web content only when we are factually incorrect or when a considerable update in the story warrants the change.

Likewise is the case with the comments that our readers leave. The staff at *Spotlight Newspapers* does not edit them for length or content, withstanding a few exceptions: Posts containing vulgarities are flagged automatically, as are posts advertising goods or services, or so-called "spam" posts.

If you've been visiting [www.spotlightnews.com](http://www.spotlightnews.com), don't let these minor changes dissuade you from posting comments and joining the local community that has developed around our coverage.

If you haven't been visiting [www.spotlightnews.com](http://www.spotlightnews.com), what are you waiting for? The conversation taking place on our Web site can only serve to better our news coverage and better keep our readers informed on all the local news that affects you.

## Rail-trail a county milestone

Editor, Spotlight Newspapers:

As chair of the Albany County Legislature's conservation and improvement committee and lead sponsor of the resolution we passed unanimously Monday, Sept. 8, I am both exhilarated and relieved to have reached this milestone in making the trail a reality. Many of our towns' citizens have long wanted access to this recreational gem and non-motorized transportation corridor. We have worked so hard for so long with County Executive Mike Breslin to make this happen.

Legislators Herb Reilly, Tom Cotrofeld and Bill Alyward in particular have devoted their energies to this project over many years. We are gratified that our colleagues unanimously supported our resolution.

Frankly, at times we feared the worst or prematurely thought we were about to achieve our goal only to have our hopes dashed, but we stuck with it. This is the kind of achievement that makes all of the time and work we put into it worthwhile and the very reason I ran for public office in the first place.

Our towns' citizens will soon be able to look forward to biking, running and walking, cross country skiing and snow shoeing, birding and even commuting along the trail. It will link with the Hudson-

Mohawk Trail running all the way to Schenectady and beyond.

My resolution Sept. 8, in which I was joined by many of my colleagues, gave authorization to the county executive to enter into a contract with Canadian Pacific (D&H) Railway to acquire the abandoned 9-mile section of railway running through the heart of Bethlehem with \$700,000 of donated funds from the state and Scenic Hudson.

Between now and the legal closing on the property a few months from now, there are a number of important steps to be taken to protect our taxpayers and direct our future efforts.

These include surveys and engineering studies of the bridges and topography, and also, importantly, environmental testing.

Should any major contamination problems be found, and thus far that seems unlikely, we can rescind the contract. I am confident, however, that we are close to realizing our goal. I encourage the town and our citizens to continue weighing in on their vision for the trail and linkages with other assets like the Landslide (Normans Kill) Preserve.

Almost \$3 million is already set aside in the county capital plan, primarily from federal

funds, for the improvements that will be needed.

Additional grants will also become available to the county once we are the legal owner of the trail.

So, while much remains to be done, we have come a long way, and I think we are on the verge of a green ribbon cutting ceremony by next spring, if not sooner.

# Five Rivers development still in the works

## Proposed eight-lot development revisits Planning Board

Making its way back to the Bethlehem Planning Board, a small eight-lot subdivision near Five Rivers State Preserve has yet to get approval because of concerns of having "landlocked property" donated to the town.

The Planning Board last heard plans to build mini-development next to a state preservation landmark at its April 15 meeting.

Carol Richards is proposing to divide her property off of

Fisher Boulevard into seven lots next to the Five Rivers State Preserve. Developers say they want to keep the lots fairly small, so as to keep the density of homes on the property low.

A portion of the property is to be donated to the Open Space Institute, according to Teresa Bakner, who represented Richards at the meeting.

"It's taken us a while to get here ... and there are no subdivisions that we are aware of on the history of this property," Bakner told the board in April. "The land could have been divided into dozens of lots if they wanted to develop it. ... While the wetlands on the site are in several locations, it in no way inhibits the development."

The plans call for transferring 24.63 acres from Richards' property to the Open Space Institute and eventually to the Delmar Wildlife Conservation, which is owned by the state.

Planning Board Chairman Parker Mathusa said there was some confusion over the

Mathusa asked for a 20-foot easement on both sides of a potential access point near one of the proposed lots.

"I want 20 feet on both sides, that's 40 feet," Mathusa told Bakner. "I don't mean to be heavy on this, but I want to be sure."

of what the property would be worth to a developer and on behalf of Richards expressed frustration over the delays in approval.

"She's quite frustrated with the process here, not with the board, but with the process," Bakner said. "She's being given \$60,000 for 24 acres and she could turn around tomorrow and get \$300,000. ... At some point, you hit a tipping point."

Concluding, she said, "I will ask her, that is all I can do."

All seven lots, she said, would be buildable, with the exception of the third lot, which has an existing home on it, according to the plans. One of the lots will be set back from the others, and may be "more desirable" to a potential buyer.

"We're not putting in any roadways at all, it will just be driveways and accesses," said Bakner said in April. "We think it's a good thing. Typically, a developer comes in and wants to know how many lots they can get out of it."

Bakner said Richards is only putting eight lots on property that could easily accommodate 30 lots.

Mathusa said of Richards' plan at a previous Planning Board meeting that "It's a nice community gesture on her part."

Bakner said it was an "oddly shaped parcel," and that she was unsure if they could



# Students tip 'class cap' □ Budget

## Redistricting blamed for pushing student-teacher ratio up; panel formed to address issue

Families in the Bethlehem Central School District come in all sizes, and when the children are school age, there can be temporary surges at the elementary level that result in classes being at, or sometimes exceeding, the maximum number of students allowed, also known as a "class cap."

The school board voted unanimously at the Wednesday, Sept. 17, meeting to create a new class-size committee to re-evaluate its cap sizes and the situation in general.

The school has a general sliding scale for its elementary class caps, which starts at 23 students in first grade; 24 in second; 25 in third; 26 in fourth; and 27 in fifth, according to district spokesman Matt Leon, who said that Bethlehem tries to keep kindergarten classes around 20 students.

"Recognizing that class sizes are one element that contributes to student success, the district strives to keep class sizes reasonable and balanced," the school said in a release. "To do this, the district has developed 'class size caps.' These caps should not be seen as hard and fast, but rather guidelines that allow the district to develop its elementary configurations in any given year as it strives to provide the most supportive learning environments possible for all students."

During its Wednesday meet-

ing, the Bethlehem Board of Education heard two residents speak about the situation currently affecting a couple of the elementary classes.

Resident Scott Banano thanked the board for their hard work in the community, but referring to his daughter's situation in one of the elementary schools, he said he wanted to address the issue of having classes at or above cap.

"I don't think we here in the town of Bethlehem want just acceptable. ... I think we expect a little more," Banano said. "I'd just like to see this addressed."

Banano said classes that are too large could prove "counterintuitive" to education in the district.

Darcy Hines spoke after Banano and asked the board to "think about next year," and not make any hasty decisions, calling the large classes in a few of the elementary schools a "unique" situation.

"On a personal note," Hines said, "I would hope you would not go back to multi-aged classes."

Superintendent Michael Tebbano told Hines that the district does not plan to have multi-aged classes.

Tebbano said that, following a redistricting of students, the problem arises when new families move into the district and there is no way of knowing how many children will be going into each grade level.

"In light of last year's redistricting, in which the community went through a significant process to enhance neighborhood schools," Tebbano elected to go one over cap in five elementary classrooms this year, Leon said.

The larger classes in the district include one class of the Glenmont fourth grade;

three Hamagrael third-grade classes and one Slingerlands first grade class and the district reports that the five classrooms are out of a total of 85 classrooms in the district for grades one through five.

The average class size of these 84 classrooms is 22 as of mid-September, Leon said, adding that the data will be finalized in the district's "Long-Range Planning Report," due later this fall.

Vice President of the Board of Education James Dering said he understands the difficulty of the situation.

"I'm sort of in the unique position of having a child in one of the large classes," Dering said. "I have concerns on whether the cap sizes are reasonable. What's the difference between 20 kids and 27? ... To me, seven kids seems like an awful lot."

Dering said just 10 minutes with seven students would take over an hour of the teacher's time each day.

Dering also expressed his financial concerns with the situation.

The board voted to create a new classroom size committee made up of PTA members, parents, teachers, principals, board members and administrators. Tebbano said there are times when exceeding the cap is unavoidable, but teacher aides are added to the larger classes whenever possible.

The school had a company come in during the redistricting process to estimate family sizes and population trends in the school district.

"The one thing they couldn't predict was how many houses were on the market at the time and how many families moved in," Tebbano said. "There are going to be times when you have to go above the cap."

sible," Tebbano said. "The economy is bad right now ... and because people are focused on the economy, this will be a good opportunity to discuss what we are doing."

"We're going to be transforming the entire year into a budgetary process," Tebbano said at the Wednesday, Sept. 17, board of education meeting before the board unanimously adopted his recommendation to create the new public forum meetings.

Tebbano said he expects that Giordano will participate in the public budget forums and Giordano told Spotlight Newspapers earlier in the year that his conversations with the school on his suggestions appeared to be well received.

Giordano said his major complaint was that the citizen's budget group was not able to listen in on contract discussions and that teacher raises may be out of step with other professionals in the area.

The school has tentatively scheduled budget meetings for Jan. 26, Feb. 2, and Feb. 9 to be held at the district's main offices, 90 Adams Place, at 7 p.m. However, Tebbano said the school would move the meetings to the high school if there was enough interest in the meetings.

The superintendent also wants topics of discussion from the public for the meetings and said residents can e-mail suggestions to him at [tebbano@bcasd.nyc.ny.us](mailto:tebbano@bcasd.nyc.ny.us).

In the meantime, the district will also be holding various department budget hearings at various board of education meetings leading up to the May 2009 budget vote. A complete list can be found on the school's Web site, [bcasd.k12.ny.us](http://bcasd.k12.ny.us).

"With the economy the way it is, we wanted people to understand that we don't get some kind of pass," Tebbano said. "My oil bill is more expensive, too."





the term "hyper-parenting" to describe parents micro-managing their children. He writes that parents, who may have the best of intentions, have a fear of their children not living up to their expectations. Those parents try to manage a child's social life by overbooking activities, leaving little free time for just being a child. In his book, Rosenfeld writes that this type of parenting leads to stress for everyone. He also writes that while we as a culture tell parents the best thing they can do is to sit and have a family dinner at night, it is virtually impossible when you have multiple children involved in multiple activities.

"Once, children were to be seen and not heard; today, parenting is America's most competitive adult sport. Kids are showcased. We often hear of a child's accomplishments, but rarely the simple praise, 'He's such a good, or good-hearted, kid,'" said Rosenfeld in a 2007 address to fellow pediatricians. "One hundred years ago, work ended when the sun set. Today, electric lights allow homework to be done until midnight and ice hockey practice to begin before the sun rises. As children's activities have become the center of family life, adult needs have been subordinated."

Rosenfeld has said that while he believes extracurricular activities have many positive aspects for children - it helps them learn a sense of belonging and fosters self-confidence, he is worried about kids "running ragged."

Clubs and sports teams are increasingly opening up to younger age groups than ever before. It is not uncommon to see a 3-year-old involved in several different groups or teams.

Scotia-Glenville High School Guidance Counselor Kimberlee Shartrand said that for many students, sports and music gives them a sense of belonging that is crucial to a successful school career. She said, especially at the high school level, these types of activities keep kids focused and do not allow for too much free time, when kids can easily be lured into unhealthy activities. Shartrand agreed, however, that parents must follow their kids' lead on how many activities are too many. She said for many children, excelling at one thing they love is what works best. Shartrand said her best advice for parents is to listen to children and let them choose what they are comfortable with.

"One of the greatest gifts a

parent can give is not putting pressure on children to do what they want them to do as far as extracurricular activities. Follow their lead and ensure that they have time to just be kids while they still can," said Shartrand.

A busy extracurricular life has some positives, though. The Center for Disease Control released statistics in 2000 that showed that drug use and teenage pregnancy rates have steadily decreased since 1976, which some experts attribute to children focusing on being part of a team or organization. The question for some teachers and doctors does not lie in whether or not these activities are positive but more of when they are simply too much.

Guilderland mom and soccer coach Tara Camardo said that she has had children on her team who play more than one sport, and scheduling practices is not always easy because of conflicts.

Camardo said she feels that for her 8-year-old daughter, one sport or activity at a time is what works best.


"Kids need downtime, time to just be able to be free to choose something, or even nothing to do," said Camardo.

As a school counselor, Shartrand said she believes there are many good reasons for finding healthy outlets like sports and music for children. She said that she feels the trend is becoming more balanced and that parent participation is part of the reason.

"You see more and more parents staying for practices and lessons, they are becoming more of a part of the process, which is good in that it makes it more of a family experience. Parents and children have become much savvier at scheduling," said Shartrand.

Shartrand also said she feels part of the success of extracurricular activities is keeping out the stress. She said that when the parents know how to create a schedule that everyone can live with in the family, it keeps harmony and the focus remains on the fun aspect. She said that scheduling allows for prioritizing, which keeps kids in check with schoolwork and other responsibilities.

"My own personal philosophy is that people feel good about themselves when they find something that they are good at and comfortable with. It's great for parents to expose their children to new things, but once you see what direction your child wants to go in, follow their lead. The positive reinforcement will help them build many opportunities for success," said Shartrand.

for the technology campus' first building can commence in the spring.

The last update the planning board received from Vista developers was on June 19, 2007, but revised plans were presented to the Town Board earlier this year.

No wetlands will be disturbed during the construction of Vista, which is slated to eventually build out to 1.4 million square feet when completed, according to the current development plans.

The initial phase of construction is expected to see 250,000 square feet of construction, as well as the construction of Vista Boulevard.

Dan Hershberg, of Hershberg and Hershberg in Albany, told the Planning Board the Vista project will begin on the property by grading the entrance to the eventual technology park and installing a sewer pump station.

"We propose to move a significant portion of soil here and move it to the other side of the site," Hershberg said. "We're going to be installing the entire Vista Boulevard and a pump station."

The new road will connect to

the roundabout off of the Route 85 extension that was built last year, according to plans. It is to be heavily buffered and have a wrought-iron fence and gate at the entrance to the campus.

Hershberg said finalized plans are hard to create at this point because not all of the space available have tenants ready to move onto the site.

"We certainly don't have complete plans, but we're working on them," Hershberg told the board.

The plans also show a "paper road" on the map which has the potential to eventually create a new road from the back of the site heading toward Voorheesville, but would need significant engineering work to complete because of the valleys and uneven topography involved.

"We'll let our grandchildren work on that one," said Planning Board Chairman Parker Mathusa, who said he was glad to see the plans designed land for future infrastructure if it was needed.

Planning board member Nicholas Behuniak asked about plans for any pedestrian pathways.

Hershberg said there are currently plans for a shared bike lane on the road and footpath for possible hiking around the site.

"We have committed to putting one in," Hershberg responded.

ed to Behuniak.

There were some concerns by potential tenants about security and protecting "trade secrets" that could arise from having public pathways around the site, according to the developers, but that more details would be coming as the project progressed.

"Those are concerns I can certainly respect," Behuniak said when told about the security issues.

Developers also told the board that, although it had been considered originally, there would be no cell phone towers constructed on the site.

Assistant Director of Economic Development and Planning Michael Morelli said that although Vista has "an aggressive schedule" slated for construction, the infrastructure and planning are in place to make it "very doable."

The developers also denied some concerns about a possible "big box store," as one Vista representative said, "A big box building was never in the plans for Vista. I know that there are rumors that there are. ... It's not suited for that purpose."

Developers say they want to begin the work on the boulevard this fall and begin construction on the first building by spring.

## Easing into fall chores

Prepare for the next growing season by winterizing your yard and garden



From a gardener's perspective, the fall is the ideal time for many garden chores. In the Capital District, the fall is usually a long season of bright sunny days and cool nights. Good outdoor work weather provides the perfect time to divide perennials and replant.

Starting in mid August and extending through the end of September, conditions are excellent to plant grass seed and establish a lawn.

Many trees and shrubs tolerate fall planting as long as there is six to eight weeks for roots to grow out into the surrounding soil before the ground freezes, thus lessening the likelihood of the new plant heaving out of the ground as the soil freezes and thaws.

The same applies to container perennials that become "irresistible" at the fall sales. Many of the container perennials are pot bound by the end of the summer so tease out the roots a little before planting to encourage faster rooting out into the soil.

Fall is the time when a gardener is very aware of the cycles of nature, and it is the wise gardener who taps into that rhythm to accomplish his own tasks.

To make the process of fall cleanup a bit less taxing, use the following guide as a checklist for your fall gardening chores, and you will be well prepared for next spring.

- Test soil for pH and amend the garden soil if

indicated. Your county Cooperative Extension office will do this for you at a very nominal fee.

- Harvest, glean and clean all material from the garden, field, etc.
- Dig, clean and store tender bulbs, corms, and tubers (keep cool and dry). Contact your local county Cooperative Extension if you need specifics on storing these summer bulbs.
- Check houseplants that have summered outside; repot if necessary but check and treat for unwanted "houseguests."
- After frost, cut back herbaceous (non-woody) perennials to about 3 inches.
- Recycle garden debris and leaves by composting material that is not diseased.
- Practice a key step in integrated pest management — sanitation — remove and discard diseased foliage to reduce future inoculants.
- Consider planting a cover crop (such as winter

rye) to enrich the organic content of vegetable garden soil.

- Recycle your raked leaves either into the compost pile or use as mulch in the perennial beds. It is important to have them as small as possible so go over them with the mower to chop them up.
  - Plant fall bulbs now for spring color. Remember to add bulb fertilizer at planting time. If Bambi visits your garden, concentrate on daffodils.
  - After the first hard frost, mound additional soil around the crown of hybrid roses to a height of 10-12 inches. Pruning is best left to the early spring unless plants are exceptionally tall. Secure canes of climbing roses.
  - A late season (November) application of a lawn "winterizer" product ensures good early spring growth with no early application of fertilizer until Memorial Day.
  - Do not add mulch or cover perennials until very late in the season when the ground freezes — depending on the weather, this can be Thanksgiving or later.
  - Enjoy this lovely time of the year!







# Entertainment *in the* Spotlight

**F**ans of the theatre will have reason to check out the New York State Theatre Institute (NYSTI) this fall, as the theatre group will be performing one of stage's greatest dramatic thrillers, with their production of "Twelve Angry Jurors" at the Schact Fine Arts Center on the campus of Russell Sage College in Troy. The production is based on the original play, "Twelve Angry Men" by Reginald Rose, and is being directed by stage veteran Ron Holgate.

"Twelve Angry Jurors" is basically identical to the original version of the play, with the exception of women being a part of the jury. The version being done for NYSTI by Holgate actually takes aspects from many different scripts since the story debuted on television in the 1950s. "They did a version for all women called 'Twelve Angry Women', so we kind of took that," said Holgate. "I kind of moved a few lines around from the other scripts and adapted that." Other subsequent versions, such as the 1970s movie starring Peter Fonda and its theatrical adaptation, recently on Broadway, go more into the juror's personal lives, but Holgate decided to stick to the original for NYSTI's production. "I preferred this version, because in this version you only know them as jurors."

that they will have plenty to be excited about when the curtain rises. "It's a terrific show...and

NYSTI's main emphasis for their productions has always been driven toward families and children, and Holgate feels a great lesson in the law and how it works, especially the meaning of 'reasonable doubt'... the show also deals with racial prejudice to a certain degree," said Holgate.

"It's a great, entertaining way of learning something about the law and how prejudice can influence your decision in something like a jury." Holgate also considered updating the show for a modern setting, but decided against it for several reasons. "We thought about updating it, but decided it was impossible to update. Why? Because of two reasons: DNA - everybody watches CSI on television knows about DNA, and there's a big thing with a knife and they would have gotten DNA off of it," said Holgate. "The other thing was, again with the knife, Juror No. 8 comes in with an identical knife to the murder weapon - you could never get into a courtroom with a knife in your pocket today."

Holgate, a native of South Dakota, has been in theatre his entire life, starting out in opera, and performing on-tour. He then transitioned to Broadway, finding

himself touring the country, as well as London. He has also directed shows for 10 years, including several with NYSTI. "Twelve Angry Jurors" runs

Oct. 3 through 15, and tickets can be purchased online or at the Schact Fine Arts Center. For information, contact NYSTI at 274-3256.





truly benefit, and he or she will have the best chance to succeed.

Now, that is a great deal of work by everyone and maybe a little idealistic, but I believe, it presents the best possible scenario for success, if handled properly.

For a basketball player or any other kid involved in sports, the summer is a very important time to work on skill development; and it doesn't always have to include AAU. Personally, I would rather the athlete get a summer workout program from his or her coach, or maybe even a trainer who is familiar with the sport of choice. The athlete should commit him or herself to the workout program and measure results weekly. If the athlete is dedicated to this, there would be some very noticeable and positive results.

All that it would cost parents and the athlete is time and effort. Parents would spend no more than it costs to join the YMCA or a similar gym with all the apparatuses needed for a workout outlined by the coach, trainer, etc.

For example, several young men whom I coached dedicated themselves to the concept I just mentioned. They worked out everyday and played some AAU, but never at levels played today - not until they were ready. While it might have been a coincidence, they all ended up playing NCAA Division 1 basketball and had what most would consider good college careers. I must not forget, another important fact: they were all pretty good high school students to boot.

You don't have to pay for your son or daughter to play, and they don't have to play all over the country to have opportunities to playing at the next level. They do, however, have to want it and work at their game on their own. I once worked with a young man who never played AAU and never went to a basketball camp. He would work on some part of his game everyday and played as often as possible. He'd go to the parks that had the best competition. Whenever possible, he found himself at the local Y. He turned out to be a very good player in spite of not spending a cent to play other than what he paid for his Y membership.

If your child must play AAU, then I would have her or him play on a team that is competitive and also stresses the fun of the game. I wouldn't spend a great deal of money, nor would I want to go too far to play. Boston, New Jersey, Washington D.C., Atlanta, etc. are possible places for tournaments, but too far away and unnecessary. Why not

ask, "Will playing in those faraway venues help my child get better, or will it make him or her tired and frustrated?" Remember that they could play locally and get the same benefits.

I once knew a "local" team that epitomized a successful "local" AAU team perfectly. The team was comprised of local players - almost all were from the same neighborhood (a real AAU concept). This team would practice several times a week and played amongst themselves at the local Y or in a park when they weren't practicing. They were, for the most part, friends on and off the court. They liked being around each other, and it showed when they played. They laughed most of the time and really didn't get "crazy" when they lost. However, they didn't lose too much.

From my standpoint, they were successful because they worked hard, they liked each other and the coaches were committed to the welfare and well-being of the kids. Their parents also played a major role in the success of the team. They showed up to support their kids, but never to put down another kid. These kids were fun to watch. I had to laugh sometimes watching them beat some teams that, on paper, outmatched them; but when the other team got on the court, they

never knew what hit them. So now, you're probably asking yourself, "What about those camps you mentioned somewhere in the heading of this article?" Okay, let's take a look at camps. While I'm mostly referencing basketball camps, I believe the same thoughts can easily apply to other sports camps.

Camps are good for some things, but not for the majority of the reasons parents send their kids to them. They provide structure and competition on a daily basis, usually lasting a week. Most camps today run for no more than three days or so at a cost of anywhere from \$150 to \$200. There are some overnight camps that charge a little more and last a little longer.

Camps can be put in different categories and should be. There are the beginner camps that teach the fundamentals to a younger group of campers or campers with little skills. These camps are less competitive during the week. I classify these sports camps as "teaching camps," and depending on the quality and expertise of their personnel, these types of camps are worth attending.

Then there are those camps that are geared toward the older, more accomplished players. While

there is still some basic instruction offered at these camps, they have more competitive games during the week and usually attract some college coaches. Many of these camps have college assistants and high school coaches as counselors. These counselors are usually knowledgeable and are always willing to help with individual skills. While some camps can't allow college coaches to attend, the assistants usually act as scouts for their respective colleges.

All camps, no matter the level, should make it a fun experience. Readiness is a good common-sense consideration when deciding on sports camps. Avoid sending a kid to the so-called "elite camps" if he or she is not ready for that high level of competition. If the camper isn't really ready, he or she could experience disappointment and lose confidence in his or her game.

I'm not sure how much all that has been written in this article pertains to those parents or players presently involved in AAU or camps.

I hope it will give some insight that might not have been there before and help in making some crucial decisions that will save time, money and, for some, frustration...

This article is not meant to cover every situation, nor should it be used to take the place of good parental common sense. I hope all who would consider making changes in the present way they approach AAU basketball and summer camps would consider every possible scenario applicable to their on circumstances before making that all-so-important decision to participate at whatever level and at whatever cost.

Remember, just as you would with the stock market, research, research and then research some more. Be very critical in your evaluation, and if you are too close to the situation and you can't be truly unbiased, then seek advice from someone you trust.

The bottom line: AAU, as well as sports camps, should be an enjoyable experience for all. If not, something is not right. Good luck.



## Dutch end Eagles' streak

### Two second half goals lift Guilderland past Bethlehem

The Guilderland boys' soccer team hadn't lost a game. The Bethlehem boys' soccer team hadn't allowed a goal.

Something had to give when the two Suburban Council powers collided in Guilderland Saturday. As it turned out, it was Bethlehem's shutout streak and its winning streak.

Caleb Ciaschetti and Sahr Nyuma scored second half goals to lead Guilderland past Bethlehem 2-0 and take over sole possession of first place in the council's South Division.

"It was all about the team," said Ciaschetti. "Getting a win against Bethlehem is big because it proves we can play with anybody."

"It's nice for the kids, and I'm glad they're enjoying it," said Guilderland coach Mike Kinnally. "I'm just happy that we played well today."

Guilderland (7-0 league, 9-0 overall) had several chances to take the lead in the first half, but Bethlehem's defense kept the Dutchmen off the scoreboard. However, Guilderland's defense

prevented the Eagles (6-1, 6-1) from counterattacking effectively.

"They won the 50-50 balls in the midfield, and that's something that we have to work on," said Bethlehem coach Phil Ridgway.

The pattern continued until midway through the second half. Guilderland midfielder Pat Quinn sent a pass across the goal crease, where Ciaschetti knocked the ball past goaltender Dan Maddock for the Dutchmen's first goal and the first goal allowed by Bethlehem.

"I saw the ball come in, and I just wanted to get any part of my body on it," said Ciaschetti.

"That was a great finish, and that was a great cross," said Kinnally.

Bethlehem had no luck mounting a response to Guilderland's goal, as the Dutchmen's defense denied the Eagles any quality scoring chances.

"When they scored, they sat back six or seven players, and it was very difficult for us to get anything by them," said Ridgway. "It's pretty typical in the Suburban Council."

Nyuma sealed Guilderland's victory late in the second half. The senior midfielder pounced on a slow-rolling backpass by a

## The ABCs of AAU teams and sports camps

The writer is the former Bishop Gibbons boys varsity basketball head coach.

What are AAU basketball and elite summer camps doing for and to the game? I was somewhat reluctant to write about this subject because I know, like big business is to our economy, many of the individuals associated with AAU programs and basketball camps are only about making money and making a name.

Unfortunately, the people who support these programs (i.e. parents, grandparents and in some cases, friends) are often misled. They feel that attending camps and playing AAU will increase an athlete's opportunity to win a college scholarship. In some cases, it can be argued that camps and AAU will help some athletes who are already endowed with exceptional skill, but in most cases for the average athlete, it's just not so.

What I've seen with most AAU programs is that they have a few exceptional players on a team surrounded by a few more good players, then several more average players.

Here is a common scenario: Two or three exceptionally talented players will get an opportunity to play on the college level; the others will finish playing high school ball and then continue playing at some level in college but not on the actual school team. A few will try to "walk on" to their college teams but they will not have what it takes to make the team. After it's all said and done, the student who wants to continue playing will end up playing intramurals.

(Please note that I believe that

intramurals in college is a great opportunity to continue enjoying the game. My only purpose in going through this long litany is to encourage potential AAU athletes and anyone paying the bill to reassess the costs and the payoffs.)

No longer is AAU just for the high school athlete. AAU now is open to kids as young as the fifth grade, usually as young as age 10. In fact, some kids will be playing in programs at even a younger age because they are the "exceptional" players.

The price of playing AAU can be very costly. Consider, at a minimum, paying to play AAU for just a summer at these prices: about \$40 a tournament per player, about \$20 for a hotel room (based on about 4-to-a room for a one-night stay), \$120 for gas, and food for the weekend at approximately \$25 (\$5 breakfast, \$10 lunch, \$10 dinner). I don't think you need to be a math expert to figure out that it can cost in excess of \$250 a weekend just for one athlete to play, and remember that this is just for one AAU outing.

These figures don't include the cost to a parent who might travel and stay the weekend to watch his son or daughter play. Many parents also travel with other siblings, which creates all kinds of additional expenses. How can the average

family with a modest income afford this year after year?

How many contests does an AAU team go to each summer? Well if I took a guess, I'd say, at a minimum, four tournaments per summer. Once again, let's do the math. It looks like \$1,000 a summer.

Some will certainly argue with me about the figures, but I believe that for those programs without sponsors, this approximate figure is what participants are facing. By the way, I didn't list the fee some team charge for uniforms and other incidentals.

Now what are you getting for your money, and will it pay off in the long run? Some will say "Time will tell," but for many parents, they can judge for themselves. Evaluate your kid and be realistic about whether he or she is going to play at the "next" level.

How do you evaluate? Look at the kids your sons or daughters play with and the kids they play against when they go to each competition. You can gauge the level of your kids' skills by how well they do against the best teams, and how consistent they are from week to week. You might want to reconsider whether you really want to shell out that kind of money when you honestly don't believe your kid is a top-tier player.

But what if he or she is? Let's say that you have made the assessment and determined that your kid is indeed skilled and belongs in an AAU program because he or she is a "top tier" player. Then what?

These talented kids are the ones who benefit the most from AAU programs. Let's say for the sake of

this argument that you think your kid is doing pretty well and you don't mind spending the money. I suggest you give serious thought to the following questions:

What does the AAU program you're involved in offer that will make your kid a better player? Are there weekly practices? How long are the practices? Are the coaches knowledgeable about skills training and what are their credentials? You wouldn't want a person offering improper training and skills which could lead to poor habits and maybe even conflict with the training their high school coaches will emphasize.

Don't assume every person that offers an AAU program knows what he or she is doing. Some people are great team coaches, but lack the knowledge and ability to teach individual skills. When you pay for AAU, you not only want the experience of team play, but you also want your son or daughter to have some individual time to work on skills, which is really what you should be paying for in the first place. Again, it is important to determine if the coach is capable of teaching those skills. The ideal program should have a time for team practice and sessions for individual skill development.

I also believe in both the AAU coaches and the high school coaches working together for the good of the athletes. If both are truly trying to do what's best for the athletes, then they shouldn't have a problem working together, identifying the strengths and the weaknesses of the athlete. If both work together, then the athlete will
