Glenmont 'green' house on display

Candidates talk energy while touring environmentally friendly home

Every good greenhouse needs an adequate supply of water, lots of windows, plenty of sunshine — and crystalline silicon solar cells? At least, that is, if you want to have a green house.

Christian Grieco owns what from the outside appears to be a normal suburban home on 71 Henderson Road in Glenmont. However, how the home gets its energy is not the norm; at least until more Americans attempt "to get off the grid." It becomes apparent what separates Grieco's

humble abode from the neighbors once you walk in his backyard.

"My son's Xbox now gets its power from those," Grieco said pointing to his rear roof covered with 32 solar panels.

Grieco said he has cut his electricity bill by more 70 percent and his natural gas usage by 52 percent through the use of solar electricity, solar hot water, "super insulation," ultra-efficient windows, passive solar heating and cooling, and a soapstone high-efficiency wood stove.

Between new energy-saving windows and foam insulation, Grieco said his home retains 48 percent of the energy is captured from Mother Nature.

Throw in electric lawn mowers, a Plug-in Toyota Hybrid Prius that gets more than 100 miles to



Ravena man arrested in grocery store theft

Everett C. Wilson, 34, of Ravena, was arrested on Saturday, Sept. 27, on Glenmont Road for felony fourth-degree grand larceny.

Bethlehem police said they received a call from an area grocery store's manager reporting that a larceny had occurred, stating Wilson had "filled a cart with merchandise and exited the store without paying." The cart had more than 80 items in it, including food and household products, according to the police report.

According to the arrest report, when Wilson was approached

"he took off" toward a nearby bank, losing his sandals in the process, and then "hid in the woods."

A Bethlehem police officer discovered Wilson leaving the wooded area a short time later, and placed him into custody and brought him back to the grocery store in order to get a positive visual identification.

After being identified, Wilson was transported to the Bethlehem Police Department for processing and his vehicle was towed, the report states.

He was arraigned before Bethlehem Town Justice Ryan

Donovan and the assistant district attorney recommended a \$7,500 bail be set. Donovan sent Wilson to Albany County Correctional Facility on \$1,500 cash bail or bond and he is scheduled to return to town court on Wednesday, Oct. 15.

Other arrests

• Marie. A. Shea, 39, of Cohoes, was arrested on Wednesday, Sept. 17, on a bench warrant and for third-degree aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle and for driving without a seatbelt.

Bethlehem police said an

officer on routine patrol saw Shea driving south on Route 9W with no seat belt, and, once stopped by police, a check revealed her driver's license was revoked and that an active arrest warrant for Shea's arrest was issued out of the city of Saratoga Springs.

Her vehicle was towed and Shea was transported to Exit 4 of the Northway where a Saratoga Police Department officer took her into custody.

• Miriam N. Edmunds, 21, of Albany, was arrested by Bethlehem police on Tuesday, Sept. 16, on an active bench warrant for petty larceny.

Police said Edmunds was

arrested and processed on a bench warrant out of Bethlehem Town Court, which signed by Justice Paul Dwyer.

State police stopped Edmunds and discovered the active arrest warrant, according to police.

Edmunds was arraigned before Justice Ryan Donovan and sent to Albany County Correctional Facility on a \$2,500 cash bail or bond and is scheduled to reappear in town court on Oct. 7, according to the arrest report.

The bench warrant stems from a petty larceny incident that occurred at the Glenmont Wal-Mart on April 10.

Summer was diagnosed with leukemia in July. Donations can be made at any Bank of America to the Summer Hess Benefit fund.



Ambulance services tout new billing system

Rescue squads will now charge insurance companies

The Delmar Volunteer Ambulance and the Bethlehem Volunteer Ambulance services are moving forward with their plan to bill a patient's insurance company for emergency services.

Both companies said that no resident will be denied service and that no collection agencies are involved in the billing process, according to Delmar Ambulance's director of operations Steven Kroll, only a billing company that will accept any payment as "payment in full."

"Nobody will be denied service for any reason," Kroll said. "If we're called to someone's house and for whatever reason you don't need to go to the hospital, then you won't be billed at all. Residents will only be billed if someone is transported to the hospital."

For insured residents, the insurance company will be billed directly, said Bethlehem Volunteer Ambulance Service Director Linda Raynor. For those residents who are not insured, they will receive two bills in the mail. Only the two bills will be sent to resident, if there is no response then the matter is dropped.

"The company will just do the billing for ambulance companies," Raynor said.

The Delmar squad is 100-percent volunteer from 6 p.m. until 6 a.m. and it has two paid

ambulance squads during the workweek, according to Kroll. The Bethlehem squad has at least one paid worker on hand 24 hours a day, seven days a week, according to Raynor.

"We're one of the last towns to do it," said Supervisor Jack Cunningham of the move to billing insurance companies for emergency services. Neighboring ambulance squad, the Western Turnpike Rescue Squad in Guilderland, which covers a small portion of Bethlehem, has been doing it for years, as well as the Voorheesville, Ravena and Rensselaerville ambulance squads.

Cunningham said the new system allows the emergency crews to continue operating at the current level without having to add to the town's tax rate to help cover ever-growing operating costs.

The Delmar Ambulance Corps made a presentation during the Wednesday, Sept. 24, Bethlehem Town Board meeting about changes to its billing practices and then held a public question-and-answer forum on Wednesday, Oct. 1.

During the presentation, it was noted that the town's ambulance corps receive 3,500 calls a year and that the number of calls increase between 10 percent and 15 percent each year. Because of the increased demand and the fact that volunteers usually work during the day, the town has had to hire professional EMTs during the daytime, which has added "hundreds of thousands a year" to emergency medical services expenditures.

"The residents of our community benefit every day from the skill and commitment of our EMS volunteers who dedicate thousands of unpaid

hours each year to respond to the emergency needs of their neighbors," said a release from the ambulance squads. "That will not change. However, with the demands of careers and family and the extensive training required to be an EMT, it will allow the ambulance service in the town of Bethlehem to grow with our community, continue enhancing service, and keep on sound financial footing."

Kroll said the two rescue squads would continue informing the public of the new policy.

"Every person will get a full explanation of the new billing policy in writing when they get their first bill," he said. "In case they didn't see our notification on the town's Web site or see our presentation at the town board meeting or read about it in *The Spotlight*, we didn't want people to be surprised."

Firefighter allegedly impersonated cop

Bethlehem police say man tried to pull over another vehicle

Bethlehem police say they arrested a Selkirk firefighter after it was reported that he was allegedly impersonating a police officer and attempting to pull another vehicle over on South Albany Road.

Kenneth D. Bovia, 26, of Delmar, was arrested on Tuesday, Sept. 16, for second-degree criminal impersonation; second-degree reckless endangerment; and reckless driving — all misdemeanors.

Bethlehem police said a complainant reported that while leaving CSX he was driving south on Albany Road behind another vehicle when he saw Bovia's vehicle two cars ahead of him pulled off to the shoulder on South Albany Road.

Bovia then allegedly pulled in front of the complainant with activated emergency lights and a siren, according to the arrest report.

The complainant told police that he asked to see Bovia's badge when Bovia stopped his vehicle and that he then

sped off when Bovia could not produce it. Bovia began to follow him onto Curry Road, the report states.

"He did not display any ID indicated through his actions that he worked with police," said Lieutenant Thomas Heffernan. "He falsely expressed with his actions he was a member of the police."

Heffernan added that the reckless endangerment charge stemmed from abruptly pulling in front of the complainant.

"The victim drove away from the scene and said that Bovia continued to follow him on some side streets while he contacted police," Heffernan said.

The complainant contacted Bethlehem police, who say they collected a deposition and discovered Bovia's vehicle parked at Selkirk No. 3 Fire House.

"A show up was conducted at Selkirk No. 3 with a positive identification" of Bovia, according to police.

Bovia was taken into police custody without incident and transported to the Bethlehem Police Department where he was "booked and processed," the report states.

Police said alcohol or drugs were not a factor in the case.

Bovia was released on appearance tickets after being arraigned by Bethlehem Town Justice Paul Dwyer and was scheduled to return to town court on Oct. 7.

"He didn't resist arrest or anything like that," Heffernan said of Bovia being taken into custody. "His version of the story is a little different, though."

Artist contributes to local cause

An international message of love and family values on display in Albany

Whether you say "family" or "famiglia," Italian artist Piero Maffei has come to America to show that it means the same thing.

And he wants to share its meaning, along with his work, with the Capital District.

Originally an architect and moving on as a sculptor, Maffei's work ranges from portrait paintings to intricate and detailed visualizations of symbolic family themes. His background in sculpture is easily recognized in his artwork, with three-dimensional designs dripping with color and chiseled shapes creating dramatic contrasts on the canvas.

Maffei received a grant from the Italian government to come to America. His daughter, Iride, acted as a translator for her father in a slight English accent, having been taught the language in Britain.

"It is big. Everything is very big," Maffei said of his first trip to the U.S. "The big spaces create a sense feeling of freedom in a

way."

He said he was particularly impressed with the Empire Plaza in downtown Albany with such unique features like the Egg and an abundance of outdoor sculpture and artwork.

The Family and Children's Service of the Capital Region (FCSCD), the oldest social services non-profit in the United States, featured Maffei's work at the grand opening of its new Social Art Gallery on Friday, Oct. 3.

Keith Pickett, executive director of FCSCD, said he was pleased to present Maffei's art because of his family-themed work that spoke a language understood by all.

"Society needs focus, and family, in that sense, is the core and society needs that. It needs something to hold onto," Maffei said. "When society isn't working [properly], it's because at its base there is a family that is not working, so we need to improve that because that's where it all comes from."

Maffei said his artwork reflects "good values and good messages ... and that society can benefit from the family working together." He added that the artwork he donated to the Family and Children's Service of the Capital Region illustrates the various points that the organization strives for in improving the lives of families in the Capital District.

"As a sculptor, I already know what I'm going to put down on paper," said Maffei. "Like when I am using lava stone, it's very

hard, and I look at the stone and I already know what's going to come out of that shell. ... You must be able to visualize what's going to happen."

The Social Art Gallery is being billed by the center as "an exciting and unique local gallery that will feature artists from the Capital Region and around the world, brings together the worlds of specialized family and individual counseling services with the arts to promote the concept of 'healing through the arts.'"

The gallery will feature sculpture, paintings and photography exhibits that promote these family and healing related themes. The grand opening exhibit is a family-themed event featuring local Italian cuisine and the works of Maffei, who is from Sicily and is a well-known Italian artist in Europe. The event is co-sponsored by the Laziali Nel Mondo Association and Albany's Italian American Community Center.

Pickett invited many guests, including Albany Mayor Gerald Jennings, Albany County Executive Michael Breslin, Senator Neil Breslin, local assembly members and other elected officials and community leaders, as well as representatives from IBM and other corporate supporters.

Paul Tonko, 21st Congressional District candidate, also spoke at the event. Bethlehem councilmen Kyle Kotary and Sam Messina are both board members of FCSCD.

Getting the most joy out of holiday dough

I was having a problem with my kreplach dough. Kreplach are like wontons (meat-filled dough pockets). So I did what I always do. I called the hotline number for Jewish holiday cooking questions. The same person always answers: my Aunt Selma in Queens.

"Rachel and I are making kreplach for Rosh Hashanah," I told her, "but I'm only getting 10 pieces out of one dough. How many do you get?"

"Twenty," she said.

"Twenty? Out of one dough? What am I doing wrong?"

She said maybe I needed to roll the dough out thinner. I told her I tried that but then the dough sticks to the cutting board. So then she said I should add more flour. But I told her that I worried that too much flour would make them taste too doughy.

"How much flour is in your dough?" she asked.

"One cup," I told her, "Isn't that what's in your dough?"

She said, "Yes, a cup of flour, an egg, and some water."

"What about the salt and the oil?"

"What salt and oil?" she asked.

"Your recipe calls for salt and oil," I reminded her.

"I never put salt and oil in my dough."

"Then whose recipe have I been using all these years?" I demanded.

"I don't know. Maybe the oil is making it too doughy," she answered.

So I asked Rachel to make another dough, just using flour, egg and water. And with Aunt Selma on speakerphone, I rolled out the newest dough and was able to cut out 14 circles. Was it the lack of oil that enabled me to increase the number from 10 to 14, or were my skills boosted by my aunt's voice?

The Jewish High Holy Days are a time of deep reflection, beginning with the celebration of Rosh Hashanah and ending with the solemn observance of Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. It is a time for contemplating how to be a better parent, spouse, child, neighbor and friend.

Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year, is a joyous holiday.

This year much of my joy came from making kreplach with my daughter. She's 12 now,

so she can work right alongside me with minimal guidance. It's not like when she was 6 years old and just wanted to coat herself and the kitchen with flour.

Jeff took photographs while we prepared the kreplach. Usually Rachel and I cook while Jeff's out playing racquetball or mowing the lawn or working on a project in the basement. But this time he was still in the kitchen so I wrangled him into capturing the process. This was a big help because when it's just Rachel and me, I switch between the cooking and the picture taking, and although I wash hands in between, inevitably traces of flour are left on the camera.

This year, I was able to keep my hands in the dough while directing the photo shoot.

"Get one of her adding matzah meal to the ground beef," I told my husband.

Then I told my daughter, "Give Daddy a turn blending the ingredients and I'll get a picture of him while my own hands are still clean."

"Wait, you're not done yet," I told Jeff moments later when I saw him trying to put his camera away, "Rachel's going to cut out the dough circles."

"You want me to take another picture?" he asked.

"Yes, you need to take one of each step. Later, when we scroll through the photos it'll look like

a little movie."

And so we documented the process: First we made the meat filling, combining ground beef, chopped onion, egg, garlic and matzah meal.

No one took photos of me chopping the onions. That's probably a good thing.

"Onions don't really make a person cry, but they make your eyes sting," Rachel informed me as I began peeling an onion.

"Onions actually make my eyes water," I told her. "My eyes start to sting and water, and I need to squeeze them shut tight to lessen the sting."

And sure enough, my eyes began to sting and water, and I had to keep stepping away from the chopping bowl.

I reminded my child how I usually need to place a cool, damp paper towel over my eyes to relieve the pain so I can open up my eyes again.

"So, would you help me out and finish chopping these onions?" I asked through squinted eyes.

"No, my eyes are stinging," she answered.

"From across the room?"

"Yes. But if you want, I'll get you a wet paper towel for your eyes."

Mercifully, Jeff jumped in and finished the chopping.

And luckily, making the dough caused none of us eye pain.

This year, I just told Rachel to follow the recipe. She knows where to find all the ingredients and the measuring cups and spoons. She knows how to use

the back edge of a knife to level out the flour in the measuring cup.

I only gave one piece of advice before we started: "Take off that dark blue sweatshirt. You probably don't want it covered with flour!"

She removed the sweatshirt, then we tossed our hair into ponytails, washed our hands, and got to work.

"It says one tablespoon of water, but we always need more," Rachel pointed out, as she added the first tablespoon to the flour and egg mixture, "Why don't we just add more to begin with?"

"Because if we add too much, we can't take it out!" I explained.

Soon we were kneading the dough, rolling out the dough, and cutting out circles. When we had several dough circles, Rachel began spooning the meat mixture onto the dough circles, folding the circles in half and pinching the edges together, and pressing along the edge with the tines of fork to hold the seal. Finally, it was time to toss the kreplach into boiling salted water.

Twenty minutes later we completed the process: remove from pot, drain and eat.

Yup, this year we ate the entire first batch as soon as they were cooked. Usually we each taste just one and the rest get saved for Rosh Hashanah dinner. But this year was different. Also, I hadn't had any dinner, which made the kreplach even harder to resist. Plus Aunt Selma says she always eats her first batch, too.

Race for 108th Assembly District continues

Independent Tim Gordon faces challenge from Conservative Steve McLaughlin

Incumbent state Assemblyman Tim Gordon is facing challenger Steve McLaughlin with less than a month to the general election on Tuesday, Nov. 4.

Both men say they are the right person for the job and agree on little else. Even though the race has been fairly low-key up to this point, McLaughlin has been consistently critical of Gordon's first term in the Assembly.

Gordon, I-Bethlehem, is finishing his first term in the Assembly after being a Bethlehem councilman, and is running for re-election on his record in office. He is Bethlehem's Independence Party chairman and is running on both the Independence and Democratic lines.

McLaughlin, C-Melrose, is a businessman and former airline pilot running for his first elected office. He is running on the Conservative and Republican lines, and has criticized Gordon for voting in line with downstate Democrats such as Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, D-Manhattan, and failing to reform a "dysfunctional Albany."

Gordon lives with his wife, Christine, and four children in Slingerlands and is a 1978 Shaker High School graduate and a 1982 SUNY Brockport graduate.





The Bible says the first murder was committed between two brothers, Cain and Abel, because of one's jealousy of the other's sacrifice to the Lord.

Shortly after Cain killed his brother, he was asked by God where Abel was:

Helping bluebirds feel at home

Did you know that around 50 years ago, it was very difficult to find a bluebird in New York?


Prior to the 1700s, the bluebird was about as common as the American Robin. Back then, it was actually referred to as the blue robin. But, in the second half of the 19th century, house sparrows and European starlings were introduced to the United States in New York City. One interesting story of the birds' arrival is of a man who had a love for the birds of Shakespeare who imported starlings into Central Park. The birds quickly multiplied and started to compete with bluebirds for food and housing.

Starlings and sparrows have hard beaks that they use to open and eat seeds, but bluebirds have soft beaks because they mainly eat bugs and berries. This almost guaranteed that the starlings and sparrows would win in a fight. This competition with bluebirds for resources, along with other environmental challenges, resulted in a steep decline in the bluebird population; resulting in the state listing the Eastern Bluebird as a species of special concern in 1973.

Then, a teacher named Ray Briggs and his students started putting up bluebird houses in Schoharie County. Today, he is especially known for his trail of yellow painted bluebird houses on Route 20. Eventually, he became president of the New York State Bluebird Society — NYSBS.

The Bluebird Society promotes activities to benefit bluebirds, such as a nestbox program. They also educate and inform people of state on the ecology and management of Eastern bluebirds.

Over time, with more and more people putting up houses and monitoring them, more and

more bluebirds were fledged, and in 1999, the Eastern bluebird was removed as a species of special concern from the state's Endangered, Threatened and Special Concern species list.

At a more local level, so far this year, the NYSBS has received data on 63 bluebird houses in Albany County. Eighty-seven bluebirds were fledged from those houses this year, but the birds are still very dependent on people to provide houses for them and to monitor those houses to keep them safe.

On a more personal level, I have always been interested in birds, especially the Eastern bluebird, for as long as I can remember. Ever since I became a Boy Scout, I have wanted to put up bluebird houses for my Eagle Scout project. Through the dad of one of my friends, I was fortunate to be put in touch with Bryan Braun, one of the Albany County Bluebird Ambassadors for the Bluebird Society. Together we organized a project to build and install around 30 bluebird houses on Cherry Avenue Extension and Route 85 in Bethlehem. This

will increase the total number of houses monitored by the New York State Bluebird Society in Albany County by about 50 percent. I am hopeful that this increase in houses will result in a similar increase in bluebirds in our area. Maybe one day, bluebirds will be once again as common as their cousin the robin.

Everyone who contributed to the success of my project deserves a great deal of thanks. I have been amazed at the generosity I have received from the Bethlehem community. In fact, the list is too long to mention all of them, but I would especially like to recognize TACS Autobody, Curtis Lumber Co., the town of Bethlehem, and Mr. Braun of the New York State Bluebird Society for their support of the project. Without their help and assistance, this project would not have been possible.

In closing, I hope this article has provided some information and perhaps stirred an interest in bluebirds. As part of my project, I built a few extra houses for anyone who might be interested in putting them up and monitoring them for the New York State Bluebird Society. I would like to compliment Herb Crossman for his article on the Amateur Athletic Union and summer camps for kid sports ("The ABCs of AAU...", Sept. 24).

I have been feeling the same way for years. I began coaching girls' basketball in 1977 and am still involved. I remember when there was only one AAU program around: Doc Gallivan's Troy program. The early programs were for the better players and were designed to get these players exposure during the summer, when college coaches were out scouting.

However, over the past 30 years, AAU has grown to be mainly just a place for kids to play basketball. I agree with Herb when he says that not much teaching really goes on, as very few have more than a few practices a week where team play is emphasized, not individual skills. So it's a place where bad habits are reinforced in game situations.

Yes, if you travel, college coaches see you. But how many of these thousands of players go on to play in college, and how many of them get scholarships? As Mr. Crossman pointed out, not many.

Is it worth the thousands of dollars spent by parents every year? Many times, it becomes a

social event for parents following their children and it engulfs their lives in order to keep up with the Joneses.

I coached AAU for about five years while my youngest daughter was playing. We kept it simple, playing in four or five local tournaments with a team comprised of local girls who were or became friends. A few went on to play college ball at the D-3 level. No money. My two practices a week involved many individual drills. My goal was to improve each player so that they could improve their chances of playing high school ball, feel better about their abilities and have fun.

Now, there are many AAU programs around with many kids playing. Unfortunately, not much practicing or teaching really goes on. So, as Mr. Crossman pointed out, whether you are picking out an AAU program or summer camp, make sure there is teaching going on and by someone who can teach individual as well as team skills. Make sure it's not just lots of scrimmaging and playing games where bad habits are just reinforced.

In today's economy we need to be careful of where we spend our money and be realistic. Will your child really get a college scholarship?

Town sets hearing on CZAC member

Liz Kormos says previous consulting work is not a conflict of interest

The New Scotland Town Board has scheduled a hearing for Wednesday, Oct. 22, to discuss a potential conflict of interest regarding a member of the commercial advisory committee.

According to a written statement from Liz Kormos, the member of the Commercial Zone Advisory Committee who is at the center of the controversy, a representative of the Bender Melon farm sent a letter to CZAC chairwoman Roz Robinson accusing Kormos of having a conflict of interest because of a 2006 consulting relationship with a developer that showed an interest in the Bender Melon property.

"We completely deny that there would be any conflict of interest, or any appearance of a conflict of interest," said Peter Lauricella, of the law firm Wilson, Elser, Moskowitz, Edelman and Dicker LLP, who has been placed on retainer by Kormos. "There's

Kormos is also a member of New Scotlanders for Sound Economic Development, also known as NS4SED, and an outspoken supporter of a 50,000-square-foot size cap on retail developments in the town of New Scotland.

A temporary moratorium on new buildings larger than 30,000 square feet has been in place since May to allow the town, through recommendations by the CZAC, to draft zoning laws that better coincide with the town's comprehensive plan. The moratorium was enacted in response to a commercial development proposed by Syracuse-based Sphere on the Bender Melon farm property that would include a 137,000-square-foot "anchor" store.

Kormos said the homebuilder she consulted for in 2006 considered a mixed-use

community for the property but eventually backed out. The builder later made another proposal to develop the property similar to Sphere's and made a deposit, before being outbid by the Syracuse-based company, Kormos said in the letter. She said she did not know about that proposal and has not had contact with that developer since 2006.

"I have no relationship with the builder and nothing to gain if the competing offer is successful. Again, I have no financial interest or involvement with any entity with a financial interest in the Bender Farm," Kormos said.

Lauricella said Kormos had "no formal relationship" with the owners of the Bender Melon farm or the former potential developer, and no contract was signed.

He was also critical of Town Board member Peg Neri, who asked Kormos to step down. He is calling for Neri to remove herself

from any hearings regarding Kormos, saying that she will not be able to be impartial since she made a judgment regarding the matter before hearing all of the facts.

"To judge the matter before a public hearing is held ... it boggles my mind," Lauricella said.

He added that the CZAC did not have the right to hold executive session regarding the issue, which it did at the last CZAC meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 24, as its mission statement holds that "all meetings shall be open to the public."

Town Supervisor Tom Dolin said the town board is still considering how to handle the matter, and said the board has not taken any formal action against Kormos.

"[The issue] may postpone the final report from the committee. That may require a further extension of the moratorium," Dolin added.



SUNY's survival at stake

The State University of New York is facing devastating funding cuts that threaten to dismantle the University, as the state tries to slash its way out of its budget deficit. But why cut an entity – SUNY – that produces much more revenue than the state invests and that serves as a major engine of economic growth?

SUNY's budget has been cut by \$148 million this year. The state also ordered SUNY to freeze \$109.4 million in revenues the University system collects from dormitory fees, food services, bookstores and other payments. The freeze even applied to the revenue SUNY's three public hospitals collected directly from patients and their private insurance.

Cumulatively, SUNY has lost nearly a quarter of a billion dollars, making it one of the hardest-hit state agencies. As the crisis on Wall Street continues, SUNY faces the possibility of even deeper cuts.

Unless these funds are restored, SUNY is in the fight of its life. The State University has already been cut to the bone and is now looking at being cut into the bone.

New York's elected leaders need to rethink these cuts to SUNY and view state support to

the University as an investment in the future economic health of the state rather than as a drain on the state's finances. Restoring state support to the levels in the original 2008-09 budget is a good start. That's why United University Professions is calling on the governor and SUNY administrators to give the University the funding it needs to keep SUNY's economic engine humming.

According to SUNY, for every dollar in state support it receives, its campuses return between six and eight dollars to local communities.

In a number of regions across the state, SUNY is the economic lifeline. For example, UAlbany contributes \$3 billion annually to the local economy. Upstate Medical University generates over \$2 billion in economic activity for the Syracuse region. If SUNY campuses are forced to slash their budgets, the repercussions would be far-reaching – not just for these communities – but for the state economy as a whole.

To deal with the state's budget cuts, some campuses are planning to limit enrollments, enlarge class sizes, reduce course offerings, and cut the ranks of full-time faculty through attrition. Students who qualify for admission or transfer from a community college would likely be denied access to SUNY.

Without additional funding, SUNY campuses


will be unable to retain the faculty needed to teach advanced courses, the type of courses that students need to graduate on time. That would hit working families whose children attend SUNY. Already strapped to pay rising energy and food bills, families would be forced to pay thousands of dollars more for a SUNY degree that takes five or more years to complete.

SUNY is a major engine that drives the state's economy. It's responsible for educating the next generation of New York's workforce with the skills needed to retain and attract employers. Eighty percent of the students who graduate from SUNY remain in New York to live and work. If those students are forced to study elsewhere, New York will suffer a brain drain that will hamper its efforts to bolster the economy, and we will lose the tax revenues generated by college graduates.

New York needs a strong public university system now, more than ever.





Carey Foundation walks with the community

Carey Walk draws big crowds to Delmar fundraiser

Looking to stomp out abuse and neglect of society's most vulnerable citizens, the Jonathan Carey Foundation took to the streets of Delmar for its second Jonathan Carey Walk.

A virtual who's who of the area's political arena — from town officials up to state politicians and a congressional candidate — made an appearance at the event held at Bethlehem's Elm Avenue Park. Area residents also turned out en masse during the warm and sunny fall morning of Saturday, Oct. 4.

The community came together not only to honor one of its own who had died in the hands of state caregivers, but to raise money and awareness so that other vulnerable individuals would be spared a similar fate.

Jonathan Carey, who was autistic, was 12 years old when he died in 2007 while being forcibly restrained by O.D. Heck employees.

Michael Carey led the event by offering a prayer to all those in attendance alongside Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham; councilmen Mark Hennessey and Kyle Kotary; Assemblyman Tim Gordon; and 21st Congressional District candidate Paul Tonko.

Cunningham spoke next. "Everybody here today, I think, is aware of the struggles that Jonathan had in his life and

the tragedy of his death. And I think when we think about our own lives we want to leave a legacy and your presence here is a testament to his legacy," Cunningham said.

Cunningham added, "We are all very happy to provide the area for the Jonathan Carey Foundation walkathon. ... We have a beautiful day here — the sun always shines in Bethlehem."

Continuing the light mood before returning to seriousness, Gordon spoke next.

"No, I am not Michael Carey's stunt double," Gordon, who bares a striking resemblance to Carey, quipped. "But if I have to take a fall for him I gladly will."

Gordon said that although Jonathan Carey's life was short, he led "a positive and glorious life."

"When Jonathan came into the world the Careys knew there would be challenges for the family, but what they received was more love than they could imagine," Gordon said. "And that love is still very present and all around us right here and now. It's not in the past tense whatsoever."

Carey introduced Tonko as a congressional candidate and former assemblyman.

"Probably more appropriate as a banner is displacing that 'candidate' label with a label of 'friend.' I had previously served in the assembly when Jonathan's Law was advocated, discussed and eventually passed," Tonko said. "I have

such respect for Michael and Lisa for the outstanding work they did surrounded by an immense measure of pain, I have to believe."

Tonko said the Carey's reminded the public that they can make things happen when they set their minds to it. He applauded them for continuing the "living legacy" of Jonathan Carey and for caring for other vulnerable members of society.

Carey then took a moment to praise Bethlehem board member Kyle Kotary as "instrumental" in guiding he and his wife toward the legislative process after Jonathan's death.

"Kyle came to us after Jonathan passed away," Michael Carey said. "Lisa and I didn't

know much about getting laws done and whatnot, and Kyle pointed the way, and I believe he was the vehicle God used to help us to get to the right people

to speak at the right time.

"We can't thank him enough," Carey said.

Lisa Carey told the crowd about new initiatives in and victories in the state Legislature involving the treatment of the developmentally disabled, the creation of a study looking at reducing the number of hours for working staff and aides in state facilities, and extending the retroactive request for medical records to parents for another two years.

She also shared a story with the crowd about a dream both she and her husband had a month after Jonathan's death where they both saw their son riding a white horse and carrying sword before riding into heaven.

"When we woke up and shared our dreams we were just

amazed at the similarities and just about a week later we were attending a memorial service at O.D. Heck for Jonathan ... and we were given a gift of Jonathan on a white horse," Lisa Carey said.

After Lisa Carey spoke, hun-

dreds gathered and walked two and a half miles around Delmar in honor of Jonathan and the foundation in his name.

the gallon, and few other energy improvements, and Grieco is well on his way to claiming energy independence.

Both candidates for the 21st Congressional District to replace outgoing Congressman Michael McNulty, D-Green Island, made an appearance at Grieco's Glenmont home Saturday, Oct. 4, in order to tour a prototype of what future residential homes could look like and to pitch their own plans for America's energy future.

Democratic candidate Paul Tonko, the state's former energy chairman in the Assembly and former CEO of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, attended the first round of the tour flanked by Bethlehem Democrats Supervisor Jack Cunningham and Councilman Kyle Kotary.

Republican candidate James Buhrmaster, CEO of Buhrmaster Energy Group, toured the home next after having a brief strategy talk with Bethlehem Republican chairwoman Melody Burns.

Grieco gave both candidates separate tours, along with members of the media and the public, and explained his home's energy-saving features.

Grieco said he was inspired to make changes to his home by former Vice President Al Gore's global warming documentary "An Inconvenient Truth." He decided to begin acting on his own instead of waiting for change on the national level.

"It was the 'Inconvenient

Truth' that put me over the edge," he said. "Look at a map, we have just as many solar hours as some parts of Florida."

Tonko said he was impressed by Grieco's use of alternative energy sources.

"Government should encourage energy policy that's beneficial like this," Tonko said. "If it weren't for inspirations like this, we would be even further behind."

Buhrmaster said he was equally impressed with Grieco's home.

"Energy prices have gone through the roof, and now all of a sudden we should probably be in the \$70 or \$75 range, but we've got almost to \$150 and that's just wrong," Buhrmaster said. "Each homeowner has to do what they can, but you've gone above and beyond, and I think that's just fantastic."

The open house held at Grieco's home was part of an initiative by the Northeast Sustainable Energy Association to invite politicians and candidates to tour "green buildings."


"With fuel costs on the rise, the opportunity to talk one on one with building and homeowners about ways they have reduced their fuel consumption is invaluable," said NESEA Executive Director David Barclay. RCS officials tighten budget

With the economic downturn looming large, RCS officials are taking steps to tighten the district's \$41.9 million budget.

The moves are designed to help prepare for potential losses in state aid, as well as rising costs of fuel, energy, food and all items.

Interim Superintendent Michael Johnson said steps already taken include placing on hold the approximately \$60,000 expenditure of funds to start a distance learning program in the high school, as well as a \$50,000 plan to hire a firm to conduct a long-range strategic planning study of the district's academic and facility needs.

"It is clear that with the economy as it is, this is not the time to undertake these expenditures," he said. "It's important that we plan for the future and the fiscal realities we may be facing."

Assistant Superintendent for Instruction Diane Albano

said the district's Curriculum and Instruction Committee will now undertake the initial needs assessment and data collection for the academic aspects of the plan.

Meanwhile, Johnson said the district's representative on the state-funded EXCEL Capital Project, Armlin Damon McDormdie and Associates, will conduct the facilities needs study within the scope of his work on the capital project.

Additional areas of savings has been found in Johnson's and the administration's review of all positions that are vacated within the district.

"We examine each opening to see if we can do the work a different way," said Johnson.

This has resulted in the hiring of a data analyst through BOCES instead of filling the position through an RCS hire when it was recently vacated. The move will reduce the cost of the position for RCS since the district receives approximately 66 percent aid from the state on BOCES expenditures, Johnson said.





An apple a day

What to do with all that fruit gathered from the annual orchard visit?

This fall, we packed everyone into the car on a crisp, sunny afternoon and headed out to pick apples. It's the same as we have done every year since Lucy was a baby. This is an event that we have built family traditions around. First of all, there is the location. We've tried other orchards, but Indian Ladder Farms is our favorite. It's the delicious apples, the scenic Heldeberg Escarpment backdrop, Rosie the big cow and all the other animals that keep us coming back. I also sincerely appreciate that they minimize pesticide spraying.

The time we pick has become important as well. On a school day with no piano lesson, no practice, no commitments, we drive out to pick apples right after school. I'll pack a small snack, nothing big. That way there will be lots of apple munching in the orchard. We'll pick apples until our bags are full, and then we'll lay out a blanket for a picnic.

Our dinner will be simple: roasted chicken, bread and a few raw vegetables. We don't eat much; our bellies are full of apples. But we will be hungry for dessert. It's always the same: sugar-coated apple cider doughnuts.

There has never been a time when I have resisted an apple cider doughnut. I anticipate the moment the piping hot dough and crunchy sugar makes it to my mouth. And I am sure that I appreciate every bite much more than any 4-year-old does. So I try to eat my doughnut slowly, each bite followed by cool apple cider.

We always leave the orchard heavy with bags of apples and a gallon of cider to take home. I spend the entire car ride home dreaming about apple baked goods. The coming week will bring apple sauce, apple muffins, apple pancakes and if my kids and husband are lucky, an apple pie. We'll have so many apples that for a few weeks, they will make an appearance at every meal.

And this year, besides our twilight pick, we went out on a Sunday afternoon. It was a very warm and sunny day. If it weren't for the chance to connect with friends, we probably wouldn't have gone. It's the big crowds that keep us away from the orchards on the weekends. On that day we navigated through rows of trees and packs of other families, happy to be with friends. But this time I was successful in leaving the orchard not overwhelmed and cranky, as big crowds can make me feel. Instead I was pleased to see so many people supporting local farms and eating well.

That day we learned that big crowds in the orchard means big crowds at the doughnut stand. The line wrapped around the corner of the building. Devoted as I am to apple cider doughnuts, I just couldn't wait an hour for one. So I was left at home, with a big gallon of apple cider in the refrigerator and no cider donuts. It just isn't right to have one and not the other. And I began to wonder: is it possible to make an acceptable doughnut at home? The first concession

that had to be made was that they wouldn't be fried in oil. And was it possible to make doughnuts with whole wheat flour? Although I do sneak whole wheat flour into almost everything I bake, this just isn't the place for it. Doughnuts need to be lighter. So I added in some wheat germ to the white flour for flavor and texture. Coating the finished product in butter and cinnamon and sugar goes a long way towards making these baked treats act like doughnuts. On one of the days I was testing doughnut recipes, Elliot and his pal Teddy were playing at our house. They actually stopped an engaging game of airplane to help me cut the doughnuts. They loved cutting the outside circle, and then the smaller one inside. If your kids like to help in the kitchen, they'll love that task.

There is another apple season treat that I recently made for my kids. A few weeks ago, I was lucky enough to try a different kind of apple crisp. In my life, apple crisp experiences have gone something like this: sliced apples topped with brown sugar, cinnamon, butter and oats. Good, yes. But I would always pass it up if there was another dessert being offered. Cake or pie was just a yummier choice. This recipe changes all that. The apples underneath the topping bake into little clouds of apple. They melted in my mouth. And the topping, it is what apple crisp topping should be - buttery and crisp. This recipe came from my good friend Shawn St. James. The recipe was her mother's, and she was kind enough to share it with me. I only made one change to it: I threw in a cup of raspberries. They added color and the right amount of tanginess, which went well with the sweet apples and crunchy topping. It is equally as good without them.

One more note about the doughnuts: The first time I made them, I timed it so they would be hot just as my girls were getting off the bus. It was nasty outside: cold, rainy and windy. I met them at the bus with a hug, and announced that I had made doughnuts, they were still hot and waiting inside. Zoe didn't waste any time. She pushed past me, running to the house to see for herself. Lucy stood in the rain, stunned by the news.

"You...made...doughnuts?" she wondered aloud. And, instead of doing what I usually do, which is give my kids too much information (things like, it really is good for you and there is spinach right in there), I smiled and said, "Yup." They never pointed out the important differences between our homemade doughnuts and the real thing. I gave one to a friend and she compared it to a scone. Whatever you call them, however you describe them, these baked doughnuts are a nice treat for kids. And they go very well with a tall glass of apple cider.

Baked apple cider doughnuts

1/4 cup white sugar
2 tablespoons vegetable oil
2 eggs 1/4 cup apple cider
3-3/4 cup white flour 1/4 cup wheat germ
1 tablespoon baking powder
2 teaspoons cinnamon
1/4 cup raw sugar mixed with 2 teaspoons cinnamon
2 tablespoons butter, melted

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, beat the eggs with the sugar, oil and apple cider. Add the flour, wheat germ and baking powder. Mix until well combined. The dough will be very soft. Using your hands, turn the dough out onto a floured surface, and knead a few times, until well combined. Pat into a circle approximately 1-1/2-inch thick. Using a 3-inch circle cutter, cut out rounds. Use a small circle cutter, or a small sharp knife, to cut out centers. Place on a greased cookie sheet. Bake for 9 minutes, and test the doughnuts. They will be spongy when done. Remove from the oven, and while hot, dip the tops in a bowl of sugar and then in a bowl of the sugar and cinnamon mixture. Eat while hot.

Shawn's mom's apple crisp

4 cups peeled, sliced apples (4 to 6)
1 cup raspberries 7 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon of cinnamon
1/2 cup of water 1 cup of sugar
3/4 cup of flour

Butter a casserole dish. Put the apples and raspberries in the prepared dish. Pour the water over the fruit and then sprinkle them with the cinnamon. In a food processor, process the sugar, butter and flour until a crumbly mixture forms. Pour over top of the apples. Sprinkle some additional cinnamon on top of the crisp. Bake at 400 degrees for 30 minutes. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream or whipped cream.

Performing together is a way of life for Lisa Franklin and her four kids.




After recently losing three out of four games, the Bethlehem boys soccer team is back on track.


