Food pantries across the Capital District brace for a lean holiday season

nemployment has risen to levels not seen in 14 years. The stock market is tumbling. The prices of many products and services are still spiking and a number of homeowners have foreclosure on the mind.

Just in time for the holidays.

While for most people the economic downturn means forgoing a few presents or a few pounds on the turkey, others are finding that putting food on the table day to day (let alone the traditional holiday feast) seems a distant possibility. And those who are helping the needy might need help themselves.

Feeding America (formerly America's Second Harvest), a nationwide organization of 200 food banks supporting more than 700,000 programs, conducted a nationwide survey of local food banks and pantries in May and found that 99 percent of food banks reported a rise in client numbers in the previous 12 months, with the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York estimating a 20 percent jump in users, many of whom are "non-traditional."

That means a lot of people in the Capital District are turning to food pantries for the first time in their lives.

New faces at the food pantry

Karie Cushing, executive director of the Franklin Community Center of Saratoga Springs, said she has noticed the trend locally.

"Traditionally we served people who were very low income; people who usually relied on social services," she said. "Now, we're seeing people who are working two or three jobs

Budget vote set

Bethlehem's proposed 6.89 percent tax levy increase expected to pass

Arguing that the town still offers among the lowest taxes in the county, Bethlehem officials are set to vote on the proposed 2009 budget and a 6.89 percent tax rate increase.

The town board unveiled its \$38.67 million spending plan for next year during its Wednesday, Sept. 24, meeting. The proposed budget is the first item on the agenda for the Wednesday, Nov. 12, meeting at Town Hall, which begins at 6 p.m.

The town board is expected to pass the budget.

The proposed budget constitutes a 2.8 percent spending increase over this year's \$37.63 million budget and an overall 6.89 tax rate increase for the town's combined general fund, highway department tax rate, and water and sewer district tax

rates

The proposed tax rate increase would result in a \$17.45 increase per \$100,000 of assessed value. Supervisor Jack Cunningham said the average home assessment in Bethlehem is \$285,000.

According to Judi Kehoe, the town's outgoing comptroller who has taken a job with the Bethlehem Central School District, the tax levy increase is being proposed at 6.89 percent. However, the 6.89 percent increase combined with the expanded assessment base will result in an increase of 7.3 percent in revenues to the town from property taxes, she said.

Cunningham has said on several occasions that balancing this year's budget was "difficult on many different levels," citing a bad economy, poor consumer confidence, and the challenge of balancing "what was desirable and what was absolutely necessary" for the town.

The supervisor said that a large chunk of the budget was going to pay for town employees and their benefits, but that "our

Soares handily defeats Cusick

With 70 percent of the vote, incumbent district attorney gets another four years

After a contentious campaign against a former opponent, Albany County District Attorney David Soares scored a big win on a big night in Albany and was overwhelmingly re-elected to another four-year term.

Challenger Republican Roger Cusick ran on the Integrity line against the Democrat and netted several big endorsements by the local service unions but ultimately lost the race by 29,128 votes to 80,441 votes.

Soares appeared to be running unopposed during the summer, but Republicans mounted an aggressive campaign against him and created the Integrity

Party to challenge him late in the political season.

Cusick used critical audits by Democratic Albany County Comptroller Michael Conners as fodder to accuse Soares of mishandling public funds in the weeks leading up to Tuesday's election.

In the opponents' only public debate at Albany Law School in October, Cusick repeatedly referred to Conners' audits and made the case that Soares was abusing his public position by using poor financial controls.

Cusick called Soares a "headline chaser" and said the district attorney was using his office to push a personal political agenda and philosophy instead of prosecuting criminals. He also argued that with Albany County being the seat of state government, an opposing political party should being sitting in the prosecution's chair to serve as a watchdog and a check and

Welfare check leads to DWI arrest

An Albany woman told Bethlehem police she had been drinking beer and vodka before she was arrested for DWI on Delaware Avenue.

Danielle R. Grand, 27, was arrested Sunday, Nov. 2, and charged with DWI and driving a motor vehicle with a bloodalcohol content of 0.08 percent or greater.

Bethlehem police said they saw a parked vehicle with its engine running and its light on in a parking lot along Delaware Avenue. Officers observed a female sitting alone in the driver's seat, according to the arrest report.

"Police approached the vehicle "for the purpose of checking the welfare" of the woman, the report states, at which point Grand allegedly told officers she drove from a friend's house in Albany and stopped to check a text message.

Bethlehem police said while interviewing Grand, officers could smell alcohol on her breath and said she had watery eyes and showed other signs of intoxication.

When asked, Grand allegedly admitted to "consuming between three and four beers and vodka earlier in the night," according to the report.

Police said she was asked to

exit her vehicle and perform field-sobriety tests, which she failed, before being placed into police custody and transported to the Bethlehem Police Department for processing.

Grand submitted to a breath test, which revealed a BAC above the legal limit of 0.08 percent, the report states, and she was scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Dec. 2.

Her vehicle was towed and she was transported to a residence on Union Avenue in Delmar at her request.

Other arrests

• Matthew R. Ward, 49, of Ballston Lake, was arrested by Bethlehem police on Tuesday, Oct. 28, for fourth-degree grand larceny, a felony.

Police said Ward turned himself in on an active arrest warrant out of the Town of Bethlehem and that he was processed without incident.

Ward was arraigned in front of Town Justice Ryan Donovan and sent to Albany County Correctional Facility in lieu of a \$5,000 cash bail or bond, according to the arrest report.

He had a preliminary hearing on Friday, Oct. 31, and is scheduled to reappear at Bethlehem Town Court on Nov.

Gordon holds on to 108th Assembly District seat

State's only Independence assemblyman cruises into second term

Tim Gordon is going back to the state Assembly for another two years after besting Republican challenger Steve McLaughlin on Election Day.

Gordon, who is the state's only Independence Party assemblyman and Bethlehem's Independence Party chairman, got 34,289 votes to McLaughlin's 22,610 votes. Gordon, who is finishing up his first term in office, campaigned on his record and said there was more work to be done with his Democratic caucus.

"I feel the people have given me a mandate for the next two years,' Gordon said. "We won by 12,000 votes, I consider to be significant."

On McLaughlin's first run for public office, he netted roughly 40 percent of the vote. McLaughlin said he was proud of his campaign, which he ran on very little money.

His campaign was highly critical

of Gordon, citing taxpayer waste and the dysfunctional Democratic Assembly majority that Gordon sided with. But it wasn't enough to sway the majority of voters in a district that covers four counties and was the former seat of Republican Pat Casale, who endorsed McLaughlin.

"Public corruption has run rampant in state government in recent years. Both former Gov. (Eliot) Spitzer and former state Comptroller (Alan) Hevesi had to resign in disgrace because of their actions, along with a slew of Democrat assemblymen. These are Assemblyman Tim Gordon's colleagues, and he has done nothing to stop the habitual corruption from reoccurring," McLaughlin said while campaigning in October.

McLaughlin campaigned to ease the burden of skyrocketing property taxes through a tax cap, eliminating backdoor borrowing, putting an end to unfunded mandates that drive up the cost of local taxes and make health care more accessible and affordable to businesses and residents.

When asked about the 40percent of the voters who picked McLaughlin, Gordon responded, "My job is to represent everyone in the district ... so it really doesn't .

The state Assembly will remain heavily Democratic, but for the first time since 1964, the state Senate will shift to a Democratic majority, which will give New York a Democratic governor and legislature, which is a first since the Great Depression.

In his first term, Gordon has authored and sponsored 12 bills that passed both the Assembly and the Senate before being signed into law by the governor. He also penned five other bills that passed the Assembly but did not make it out of the Senate. Among those bills turned into law was a Jonathan's Law Amendment.

The first-term assemblyman 3 also authored a bill to allow non-

residential electricity producers to use a meter on their wind power to sell back to the grid and netted \$3 million for the Vista Technology Campus in

Bethlehem as well as an unrestricted \$500,000 for the Bethlehem School

Now that the Senate has a new Democratic majority, bills penned in the Assembly by Gordon and his Democratic colleagues have a much better chance of passing the other house.

"As we introduce new legislation, we'll be seeking to partner with senators in the majority," Gordon said. "We will also be looking to re-introduce a number of bills from last year."

State Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, is now the only ranking majority senator in Gordon's district, compared to the three Republican senators in the 108th District, which contains Columbia, Rensselaer, Greene and Albany counties.

Gordon lost his first political race

for Bethlehem town supervisor before being elected twice to the Bethlehem Town Board and then to the state Assembly. He said he wants to continue his platform

of state reform and wants to help tackle the problems facing New York, such as rising energy costs, costs of living and a statewide population drain.

He is the founder of Albany Media Group, an advertising. and public relations firm, and has been a community volunteer for many years. As a

firefighter in North Bethlehem, he was awarded the Heroic Effort Award in 2004.

Gordon lives with his wife, Christine, and four children in Slingerlands and is a 1978 Shaker High School graduate and a 1982 SUNY Brockport graduate.

"During the next two years, we've got to fight to bring relief to homeowners who are being crushed by property taxes," Gordon said. "And we have to prepare for the transition to energy independence."

Burning body ruled a suicide

Bethlehem police said the burned body of a 39-year-old Menands man found in a roadway near the town's Henry Hudson Park was an apparent suicide.

Police said they have identified the man as Michael Freeman, who was found on Tuesday, Nov. 4, after a woman leaving the park in Selkirk called 911 when she discovered what she thought was a burning mannequin in the middle of the road. Bethlehem Deputy Police

Chief Tim Beebe said that when emergency crews arrived, they discovered a body still on fire in the intersection of Winnie Road and Cedar Drive.

"We got the call from a cell phone from a woman reporting what could be a body or a manneguin. was a body."

He said the call came around 11:30 that morning.

The Selkirk Fire Department extinguished Freeman's body and Albany County paramedics transported Freeman to the county coroner. An autopsy was performed the next morning on Wednesday, Nov. 5, which determined that Freeman's death was caused by asphyxiation.

Beebe said foul play has been ruled out but would not comment when asked if a suicide note was found at the scene.

"We're not releasing that kind of information," he said. "It's been ruled a suicide."

Detectives determined that the accelerant used to burn Freeman's body was gasoline.

"He was right in the roadway," said Beebe. "He did it in the middle of the road."

Years later, Milton Bradley connects four

If Grace Bedell had never written a letter to Abraham Lincoln, I wouldn't be the family man I am today.

In early 1860, a gentleman by the name of Milton Bradley started a lithography business in Springfield, Mass. One of the first lithographic works he produced was a portrait of presidential nominee Abraham Lincoln, who, at that point was without his trademark beard. The Lincoln lithograph flew off Bradley's Civil War-era shelves - until about a month after an 11-year-old girl from New York wrote a letter to Lincoln, explaining why he needed to grow a beard in order to get

"I have got four brothers and part of them will vote for you anyway and if you let your whiskers grow I will try and get the rest of them to vote for you," she wrote on Oct. 15, 1860. "You would look a great deal better, for your face is so thin. All the ladies like whiskers and they would tease their husbands to vote for you and then you would be president."

She signed her name at the bottom: Grace Bedell.

It is fortunate that Lincoln did not have thin skin, or that



he wasn't overly concerned with public opinion, for he replied to the young Grace on Oct. 19: "As to the whiskers, having never worn any, do you not think people would call it a piece of silly affectation if I were to begin it now?"

Within a month, he had grown a beard.

Milton Bradley's little lithograph company back in Springfield, having made its bread and butter on beardless Lincoln lithographs, saw its business drop considerably once the public was used to (as we all are) the iconic, bearded, President Abraham Lincoln. Bradley needed some other product to keep himself in business, and turned to a game he had invented years before, but had put aside in favor of lithography. It was called "The Checkered Game of Life."

It was instantly successful.

Twenty years after Lincoln grew his beard, Bradley expanded into jigsaw puzzles and other games. In 1911, the blonde sat directly across man died. Today, Milton Bradley, the company — swallowed up by the larger Hasbro toy company in 1984, of course — is the No.1 maker of games and puzzles in the world.

One such game, Connect Four, was trademarked by Milton Bradley in 1974, one year before I was born, and several years before the birth of my wife. Nineteen years after Milton Bradley first put the game on store shelves around the country, someone placed one on an old cafeteria-style table in a break room in an area big-box retail store where I was working at the time.

I began to assemble the game absent-mindedly when my lunch hour started. It didn't take long. If you're not familiar with the game, it consists of a sort-of cage in which red and black checkers are dropped and stacked. The cage is supported by two plastic legs. The first player to string four of the same color checkers together, in any. direction, is the victor.

(I found out today, incidentally, and from the most trusted of sources — Wikipedia — that the original version of this game was called "The Captain's Mistress." How fitting.)

Shortly after I assembled the game, an energetic young from me. I'd spoken to her before, mostly work-place chatter, but more recently a little unreciprocated flirting on my part.

I was older than her (in fact, I still am — funny how that works); and she was wary but tolerating of me. I was surprised she had chosen to sit across from me.

She was very direct: "I'm very competitive," she said.

I am not, but I am determined. "Let's have at it, then," I said.

She beat me the first few times we played. It's not a difficult game, Connect Four. Winning is composed of equal parts luck and skill, I think, and I was too busy listening to her talk to pay much attention to the game.

Our lunch hour ended, but we made a "date" to play at the same time the next day.

"Let's make this interesting." she said during our third or fourth game that day. "Let's bet something.

Married to my noncompetitive streak is an unwillingness to wager on anything. I'm interested in sure things only, and of those sure things, only the ones that I have control over. I wouldn't make a bet with someone that the sun would rise tomorrow if I weren't pulling it through the sky myself.

I saw a way to make this a win-win. "How about dinner? If you win, I buy. If I win, viceversa." She agreed.

It didn't matter who won or lost. All we had to do was finish the game, and I would have won myself dinner with this young, attractive, intelligent woman.

"Hey, one of you guys needs to get back out on the floor," a supervisor shouted at us from the door of the break room. "We're getting busy out there.

I was ready to protest and procrastinate. My victory, whether I won or lost, was close. All we had to do was finish the game.

The young blonde got up immediately. She had then, and still has, a better work ethic than I do.

I was crushed. Who knew if she'd agree to dinner again? In fact, maybe it was an aversion to having dinner with me that caused her to so easily leave the game before we were finished. That's the end of that, I thought, and I took apart Connect Four.

The next day, I sat in the break room, alone, for most of my lunch hour. The young blonde came in toward the end and sat across from me. She set up Connect Four and pushed the red checkers toward me.

After a few games she said, "We could bet dinner again."

"We could," I said.

"Or you could just take me to dinner," she said.

And I did.

Three years later we were married. A classy affair, the ceremony and reception of which were held at the Hall of Springs in Saratoga. Too classy for me, some would argue. Certainly classy enough for my wife, those same people would say. On the inside cover of our wedding programs, there was a list of people we wanted to thank for making such a wonderful day possible.

Sandwiched in there, among our friends and family, was Milton Bradley, creator of Connect Four, over which my wife, Jessica, and I met and, well, connected.

I did not know then that I would be here, the father in a family of four, just as I did not know then anything about the history of the Milton Bradley company and its connection to Abraham Lincoln and a little girl from Chautauqua County, New York.

So I would like to say the following:

I love you, Jess, and I thank you, Grace Bedell, for pointing out Abraham Lincoln's skinny



Candidate keeps low Election Day profile

Breslin opponent says politics shouldn't be about fancy parties

When the buzz of Election Day descended on the Capital District last week and swarms of politicos huddled around televisions and computer screens in bars, restaurants and meeting halls, one candidate decided that the best place for him to spend the evening was at home with his family.

Charlie Voelker, a Democrat running on the Conservative line in the 46th District Senate, lost to long-term incumbent Neil Breslin, D-Delmar (see related story, page 8).

Despite the outcome, he said running for office was a great experience.

Voelker, who lives in Delmar just across the road from Bethlehem High School. said his decision to watch the historic night unfold from

stemmed from a belief that. elected office is not about

fancy clothes and lavish parties.



Support the arts, to a point

You can't force culture down people's throats.

Saratoga Performing Arts Center officials, in the wake of a few money-losing seasons by the New York City Ballet, shortened the ballet's season for the first time in its 43-year history at the amphitheater.

It's about time.

SPAC and the ballet lost a combined \$2.3 million during the ballet's 2008 residency. Though SPAC ended the 2008 season in the

black, it saw a drop in classical show attendance from the previous season of 9 percent — a 6 percent drop in ballet attendance alone.

A 2004 attempt at eliminating the ballet's residency because of revenue loss resulted in an investigation into SPAC operations. After the investigation, and amid public outcry at such an ignorant proposal as actually removing something that loses money, the prestigious and dignified New York City Ballet remained. Many members of SPAC's board of directors, including its president, did not.

That's too bad, considering they had the foresight to identify a problem that the current board is only now grappling with: You can't keep the lights on with prestige and dignity.

You can blame the truncated ballet residency on the economy. You can lay it at the feet of the Great Unwashed, who would rather pay to see Rush and the Allman Brothers perform. But the fact of the matter is that for too long, SPAC has overvalued the New York City Ballet in this market.

We at Spotlight Newspapers support the arts. But we also understand the folly of supporting a particular art form to the point of being blind to its limited appeal. The public outcry says that SPAC's classical programming lends the venue a refinement and elegance that, say, Meatloaf and Dave Matthews do not. We say that these musicians are artists in the same vein as any classical act that may grace SPAC's stage, and, what's more, they're profitable.

Area business people are worried that the shorter ballet season will affect their sales. If only Saratoga Springs could host some sort of event throughout August, something that could draw thousands of tourists, so area businesses could try and get some of those lucrative ballet-dollars back. Maybe something involving that race track over there on Union Avenue.

Horse racing too lowbrow? Perhaps SPAC can partner with the New York Racing Association to get an extra week tacked on to the racing season - and host the ballet there.

The reeling economy has a trickle down impact on pets. Six dogs were recently abandoned in the Town of Bethlehem, including four dogs that were brazenly dumped out of a vehicle near Meads Lane in Delmar in front of a witness.

Local animal control officers are struggling with a surge in abandoned animals, yet the public remains largely unaware that many local municipalities, including the Towns of Bethlehem and Coeymans, either nolonger take their animals to the Mohawk Hudson River Humane Society or use it as little as possible to keep down

New York state only requires municipalities to hold stray dogs for five days before they can be euthanized or released for adoption.

Local animal control officers like Dick Watt of Bethlehem and Jim Shear of Coeymans often are unsung heroes who go above and beyond the call of duty to find homes for the dogs in their care so that they will not have to be euthanized.

kenneled temporarily at Reigning Cats & Dogs on Route 9W and Coeymans dogs are housed in the Town Garage. Dick and Jim volunteer their own time and sometimes money to give their charges extra time and they reach out to local rescue groups like Peppertree Rescue for much-needed assistance in rehoming them.

In fact, local rescue groups are increasingly overwhelmed by the sheer volume of dogs we are being asked to assist.

November is "Adopt a Senior Dog" month.

Bethlehem dogs are Peppertree Rescue and other local rescue groups have so many loving dogs waiting, sometimes from your own community. Please consider opening your hearts and home to a canine companion that will return your love

Democrats take the state Senate

McEneny securely holds the 104th

Democrat cites 'new era' of politics in America

Longtime incumbent Jack McEneny will keep his seat in the 104th Assembly District for at least one more term. He said his win comes at a special time in American politics.

McEneny, D-Albany, defeated Republican challenger Terry O'Neill for the 104th Assembly District seat, garnering 39,742 votes to O'Neill's 10,828, according to unofficial results from the Albany County Board of Elections.

McEneny said, though, he spent as much time concentrating on the national election between Sen. John McCain and now President-elect Barack Obama, as his own.

He also said he was thrilled to see the high voter turnout in all elections, especially in the national election.

"There were a lot of first-time voters," McEneny said. "This is their JFK."

McEneny called Obama a "transformation" leader, and said

that is what the country needs right now.

He said that this election season has inspired many people to get involved in the political process, and that is an exciting notion.

"We're on the threshold of a new era in American politics," McEneny said.

McEneny also congratulated fellow Democrat Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, who, as a result of the 2008 elections, is also in the state Senate majority.

"We all have to treat Neil Breslin a whole lot nicer now that he's in the majority," McEneny joked.

McEneny added that he still has an interest in bringing Hudson Valley Community College to "this side of the river," and will work to do so from his seat in the 104th Assembly District.

Challenger O'Neill released a written statement after his concession from the race.

"I want to thank the Albany County and City Republican Committees — John Graziano, Peter Kermani and the awesomely energetic Dan Farrell – for giving me the astonishing privilege of seeing my name on the ballot a few inches away from that of

the next president of the United States. I will never forget that. I owe you a debt of gratitude and of honor."

He also thanked Responsible New York for its endorsement, as well as all of his supporters.

He added that bipartisanship and cooperation is pivotal after the 2008 elections.

"All of upstate New York's elected officials are going to have to come together in a new, bipartisan coalition to balance the shift in power that we have witnessed today. That we do so is critical to the safety and prosperity, indeed the future, of our communities," O'Neill said in the written statement.

He added that he plans to challenge McEneny again in the next election for the 104th Assembly District.

Ethics matter on agenda

New Scotland officials will also discuss extending building moratorium

New Scotland officials will discuss extending the moratorium on commercial development, as well as how to proceed on a potential ethics violation, at its Wednesday, Nov. 12, meeting, according to town officials.

Liz Kormos, a member of the Commercial Zone Advisory Committee, has been accused by Committee Chairwoman Roz -Robinson of having a conflict of. interest regarding her relationship with a potential buyer of the Bender ... melon farm, a key piece of property inside the commercial zone.

That developer was later outbid by Sphere Development LLC, which is planning to develop the farm with a 137,000-square-foot anchor store, pending the approval of zoning laws recommended by the committee and approved by the Town Board.

Kormos also is a member of advocacy group New Scotlanders for Sound Economic · Development, which supports a 50,000-square-foot size cap on commercial retail stores.

Town Supervisor Tom Dolin said the Kormos issue will be an agenda item for the Town Board meeting on Nov. 12, in addition to the scheduled public hearing

n for extending the commercial moratorium, which has been in place for six months.

The discussion of a potential extension to the moratorium on commercial buildings is scheduled for 6 p.m.

Town Attorney Mike Mackey said town officials could remove Kormos without a hearing, since she is a political appointee, but she would still have the right to an ethics hearing...

The town was planning to have its own ethics hearing, but Mackey said that under the provisions of the General Municipal Law, New Scotland does not have a body in place that constitutes a valid ethics board.

Mackey said in a letter dated Friday, Oct. 31, that in the absence of a valid ethics board, the matter would be referred to the Albany County Ethics Board.

The county ethics board does not have any authority over the matter, Dolin said, but it can make recommendations

about how the town should proceed.

Dolin said that board issues advisory opinions only, and he does not believe there is sufficient

reason to remove Kormos. "I do not see any need to go any further, but if the board feels otherwise. I would like to see an advisory opinion from the county ethics board," Dolin said.

Kormos' attorney, Peter Lauricella, said he is unsure what the town plans to do.

"Everything is up in the air right now," Lauricella said.

He said the Town Board has not contacted him since Kormos' original hearing was postponed on two weeks ago.

He said, though, he is aware of the agenda item for the upcoming meeting, but he does not believe the town could remove Kormos from her appointment without an ethics hearing.

Appointed positions generally do not involve litigation for the appointment or removal, however Lauricella said that since the town has begun the proceedings for an ethics hearing, he does not believe they can remove her without following through on those procedures.

Calls to the county ethics committee were not returned.

Lauricella, who is a member of the county ethics board, said he would recuse himself in this instance.

"That would be an issue. I would have to remove myself from that process considering Kormos matter," he said.





RCS to add time to phys ed program

RCS elementary and middle school students will be more active in the second half of this school year as the district adds class time to the physical education program.

The move will impact all. students in grades kindergarten through six, Assistant Superintendent for Instruction Diane Albano said.

The additional time is the result of the implementation of a Healthy Body Healthy

Minds Program which, in turn, addresses a need highlighted during a state audit of the physical education program last summer.

The new initiative will involve students in first through third grade spending 10 minutes each day following their lunch walking in a structured program modeled after the walking program that was launched last year at A:W. Becker Elementary School. At the same time, kindergarten students will receive 10 minutes of additional motor skill activities daily in their classrooms.

In the fourth and fifth grades, students will take part in a 10minute walking program three times a week while in the sixth grade, the Healthy Body Healthy Minds program will focus on nutrition and health, adding two, 20-minute physical education classes a week to the students' schedule, Albano said.

The new classes will address a physical education class time shortfall of 30 minutes per week in grades K-5 and 40 minutes every other week in the sixth grade.

The state requires daily physical education classes totaling 120 minutes per week in grades K-5 and 120 minutes of physical education classes in the middle school, though those classes do not have be daily.

The initiative has been included into a physical education plan recently sent to the state Education Department.





Coming home to Malta

With development on the way, state of market doesn't worry area real-estate agents

Editor's note: This is the second installment of Spotlight Newspaper's series on AMD coming to the town of Malta.

It seems everyone is talking about change these days.

And in the Town of Malta, there is a definite point at which it will begin: when ground is broken on an Advanced Micro Devices subsidiary fabrication facility, a \$4.6 billion project that AMD hopes to have running in 2011. It's been called the most important economic development in the state's history, and with it a huge influx of jobs is expected to come to the area.

There are estimates on the table, including figures from AMD that say the project will bring the immediate area about 6,500 "sustained, long-term jobs," as well as up to 4;300 temporary jobs during the construction of the facility.

It is hard to say exactly how many of these supposed jobs will be filled by current residents of Malta and the surrounding area, and how many will be snagged by those relocating. AMD officials have said it is likely that Fab 4X will be initially staffed by a work force largely made up of the company's current employees, and locals will be phased in over time as education and training programs across the region come online and expand.

If that is to be the case, many temporary workers will no doubt want temporary housing.

"Right now, we're experiencing a lot more rental requests than we did in the past," said Bruce McClellan, broker/owner of Pinnacle Realty, which has offices in Malta and Saratoga Springs. "From the real estate perspective, it's one of the most exciting things going on in the market."

According to September statistics released by the Greater Capital Association of Realtors, the number of home sales closed across the Capital District dropped 13 percent from a year prior. In Saratoga County, the figure was 17 percent.

Those numbers don't worry

Nelson VanUllen, branch manager at RealtyUSA's Clifton Park office.

"Saratoga County has been a county in growth for the last 15 years," he said. "During the so-called housing crisis, we've really fared much better than other areas."

That's chiefly because home prices didn't grow out of control over the past few years, so the collapse of the mortgage market was not quite as painful in the Capital District. With the credit crunch in full swing and most Americans bracing for an economic downturn, it's not surprising that many are forgoing mortgaging a house, but with the region poised for growth, most realtors are optimistic about the future.

"It's one thing to sit there and be optimistic without a cause, but I think that we have a reason," said Stephen Towne, chief operating officer at Roohan Realty. "It's been a tough go for a lot of folks, but I think there's a real optimism that things will start improving."

Realtors aren't only optimistic about residential offerings, but also an increased demand for business space along Route 9 in Malta near the proposed downtown area. New developments offering both are being built presently.

Park Place, sitting on 60 acres of land, is slated to hold 238 condominium units, 60 single-family homes and roughly 115,000 square feet of retail space. The first buildings have already been

erected, including a sales office.

Just down the road, Ellsworth Commons will be a more compact development, but still will hold 310 apartments, 21 homes and 70,000-square-feet of retail space on its Route 9 plot of land directly opposite town hall. Developer Albany Partners LLC, who created the nearby Steeplechase Apartments, would hope to have the site up and running by the time AMD opens its doors.

Closer to Fab4X itself, homebuilder Thomas J. Farone and Sons bought 66 acres of land at the Luther Forest Technology Campus in April. The Gansevoort-based firm's exact plans for the plot were not available.

Both Eilsworth Commons and Park Place were begun long before AMD committed to building in Malta.

The two projects aim to be a part of plans for Malta's downtown area. The town has been crafting a set of standards for downtown development for years, and it is often a process complicated by differing visions of what Malta should look like when "built out," and the delicate nature of looking years into the future.

"Once we develop, if we do it the wrong way, it would be somewhat irreversible," said Town of Malta Supervisor Paul Sausville. He doesn't anticipate a population explosion in Malta, but said that with the influx of businesses every decision must be made with care.

"I think we need to be in balance with ourselves," he said. "We need to honor and respect our small town character."

Cellist returns for concert

Ken Olsen's musical journey has landed him prestigious role in orchestra

When Ken Olsen left home to become a professional cellist. he had no idea how rough life could be.

Until his bank account dropped to \$90 last February, and he was beginning to grow tired of living out of a suitcase and spending many nights on the couches of friends. Still, he did whatever he could to ensure he got a full four hours of practice in every day, even if it meant practicing while his friends watched television.

Olsen had a hard time finding the orchestra he would call his family, though close friends say he never lost sight of his true calling in life. He tried out three times for openings in the cello section in the Boston Symphony Orchestra and twice he auditioned for the principal position, a position Empire State Youth Orchestra Manager Julie Shapiro labeled the highest honor a cellist can receive, in the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra and the San Diego Symphony.

Finally, he auditioned for a position as assistant principal, the second highest honor, in the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

Olsen received a call that he had got the position, and his life changed.

"My life did a total 180 in one day - upside down. I was freaking

out, thinking, 'Here I am, in the cello section of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, and last week I didn't have a job, an apartment, or much of anything else," he said.

While Olsen was surprised to have earned such a prestigious and high-paying title, old friends of his who knew him when he was younger, were not shocked to hear that he had made it to the top.

"I knew his teacher, and she said she'd never seen anyone play this well," said Shapiro, who used to manage Olsen while he was playing in the Empire State Youth Orchestra.

Shapiro said she had known

Olsen from when he was between the ages of 10 and 11 and that he had come to her house because he was accompanying her husband to a recital.

"I said, 'This kid is good.' He was young and he was good," she said.

While Olsen was not available for further comment, Shapiro said the young cellist became part of the Empire Youth Orchestra in the mid-'90s and that he eventually left the orchestra, after more than four years, to play in the New England Conservatory.

"It's not common," she said. "But it's not uncommon for our really skilled [performers.]'

After graduating from Colonie Central High School, Olsen attended the Cleveland Institute of Music, according to Shapiro. Shapiro also said she thinks that Olsen's graduate school years may have been the time that he was living out of a suitcase.

Shapiro has not seen Olsen for a number of years, but was very pleased to hear of his new position with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. "We are very proud of him," she said.

Shapiro explained that as assistant principal, Olsen must be prepared to take over as the lead cellist in the orchestra should the principal fall ill, or not be able to attend a concert. But according to her, Olsen has experience as the principal, as he has played the role in a number of concerts. she said.

Olsen will be making a return to the Capital District and performing with the Albany Symphony on Friday, Nov. 14 at 8 p.m. at Troy Savings Bank Music Hall. Tickets range from \$25 to \$49 and are \$15 for students. To purchase a ticket, call Troy Savings Bank Music Hall at 273-

Olsen will also be visiting his alma mater, Colonie Central High School, on Wednesday, Nov. 12.

who used to live paycheck to paycheck, but just can't make ends meet anymore.

That story is being told at pantries all over. Lynda Schuyler, executive director at Food Pantries for the Capital District, a group that helps 48 pantries across Albany and Rensselaer counties meet their goals, said that 2008 will likely be a historic year.

September was about the busiest month on record, said Schuyler. The rising cost of food has weighed heavy on many for months, and a flagging economy is pushing some over the edge. Schuyler said people tend to push off going to a pantry for as long as possible, which can be a poor choice.

We didn't see the increase right away," she said. "The · first thing you're going to do is start using your credit cards ... then you hit a wall with another monthly bill."

Jane Sanders, an outreach worker with the Town of Bethlehem Senior Services, which runs the town's food pantry, said Bethlehem has encountered similar trends.

The numbers have been going up," she said. "We have seen some new, first -time users."

Many of the newer faces are the recently jobless or those working part-time, who just can't make ends meet, said Sanders. The pantry serves around 35 families monthly.

Donations dry up

The same factors pushing people to pantries are having an effect on donations, as well.

The number of people we serve goes up, but our donations continue to dwindle," said Cushing.

The Franklin Community Center's food pantry is somewhat unique in that it relies solely on community donations to stock its shelves. Many pantries accept funds or donations from food banks, large organizations that shuffle millions of pounds of food every year toward pantries and sometimes buy in bulk.

Cushing says the relatively

successful Saratoga Springs community makes this possible through its generosity.

"Saratoga is viewed as an area of affluence, but there are pockets of poverty," she said.

With demand rising and supply dwindling, it's clear that food resources must be properly managed. Unfortunately, the United States and the world as a whole do not use the entire food supply far from it, in fact.

According to a government study conducted earlier this year, Americans waste 27 percent of the food available for consumption. The EPA study figured that the country discards around 30 million pounds of food waste per year, comprising 12 percent of the total waste stream. Virtually all of it ends up in a landfill, as programs to compost or use spoiling food for animal feed are not widespread.

The waste originates at multiple sources. Households regularly toss food or leftovers as they "clean out the refrigerator." But cafeterias, restaurants and bakeries are often guilty of throwing out tons of unfinished or unsold meals, as

Fortunately, at least some prepared goods are put to use rather than being chucked.

Food Pantries for the Capital District has two trucks dedicated to picking up day-old donations of bread, milk and produce from bakeries, grocery stores and the like. Rather than going to waste, the food can then go to needy persons to supplement the non-perishable selection in food pantries. In 2007, the program rescued over 230,000 pounds of food.

"Food that would put out for donation at 8 or 10 last night is going to be on a food pantry shelf by 10 this morning, and used in someone's meal to-, night," said Schuyler.

Hannaford Supermarkets, who has stores across five northeastern states, makes it a point to guide unsold foods to pantries whenever possible. They participate in the Movable Feast program through the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York, in which refrigerated trucks pick up perishables pulled off shelves before the expiration



Tonko takes 21st by wide margin

Former Democratic state legislator and NYSERDA employee to replace McNulty

The 21st Congressional District will continue to be represented by Democrats, a more than five-decade tradition with Paul Tonko's Election Day victory. Tonko defeated Republican Jim Buhrmaster by a large margin, garnering 149,377 votes versus Buhrmaster's 89,502. Phil Steck, who challenged Tonko in the Democratic primary, earned 7,214 votes on the Independence Party line.

Tonko will fill the seat to be vacated by Democrat Michael McNulty, who has held the position for 20 years and will be retiring in January.

Tonko ran on the Democratic and Working Familie's lines, with Buhrmaster on the GOP and Conservative lines in the district that contains all of Albany, Montgomery, Schenectady and Schoharie counties, as well as parts of Fulton, Rensselaer and Saratoga counties.

"I give him credit for involv-Josh Hills, Jim Buhrmaster's spokesman, of Tonko.

The announcement Tonko's win came in around 10:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 4, to a crowded room of supporters at Mallozzi's Banquet House in

"I'm flattered and moved by your show of support here. ... I look forward to serving the 21st Congressional District," said Tonko. "I'm very proud that we ran a totally positive campaign. ... We didn't resort to gimmicks or bashing any-

Tonko touched on his plans for Congress, including focusing on the economy, bringing troops home from Iraq and universal health care. He said he hopes to use his background in engineering and energy to help solve national energy issues and spark local economy.

"It's a personal sense of acis passionate about his community. He'll help execute Barack Obama's mandate. He reinforces that we can have good people in government," said Shawn Chin-Chance, a Tonko volunteer.

Tonko, a Rotterdam native, represented the 105th District in the New York State Assembly, beginning in 1983, for nearly 25 years before leaving to become president and CEO of NYSERDA, where he worked until his resignation to run for U.S. Representative. He won

against four other Democratic candidates. The district has a majority of registered Democrats, totaling 163,929, and 110,482 registered Republicans. According to New York State's Board of Elections, there are 398,873 registered voters in the district.

"We need a prosecutor in this county, not traveling all over the country," Cusick said at the debate, referring to Soares' high-profile work in a steroids case in Florida and frequent visits to other municipalities around the nation and Canada. "Who's doing the prosecuting? Someone's got to be back in the office prosecuting cases. ... Mr. Soares has developed a reputation of seeking headlines over safety."

In the end, the attack wasn't enough to upset the first-term incumbent on a night when Democrats swept the nation and the state as voters woke up after Election Day to find

the first Democratic New York Senate since the 1960s and a : new Democratic president.

Democrats also widened their control in Congress, picking up a handful of new seats.

With more than 70 percent of the vote in his favor, Soares spoke to supporters at Jillian's Restaurant in Albany, which was the local headquarters for now President-elect Barack Obama's campaign. It was a historic night as Democratic supporters were engaged in a boisterous celebration watching the national results roll in.

When key battleground states like Pennsylvania and Ohio went for Obama, the crowd exploded into cheers and revelry and Soares played to the crowd telling them they were witnessing history as the country elected its first black, ponent.

He told supporters that "scare tactics" used by his opponent and the Republicans supporting him did not sway

Cusick, who was watching the results at Albany's Hibernian Hall, blamed his substantial loss on the national Democratic fervor.

On Friday, Nov. 7, following the election, Soares released a letter to the executive director, James Lyman, and union president, Christian Mesley, of Council 82, the local police union that backed Cusick in the race. Soares alleges that the two made false accusations and "smear tactics" in the union's endorsement of his op-

"Jim Lyman and Christian Mesley have misled the public — and, unfortunately, some of their own members — with allegations that at best are disingenuous and at worst, outright untrue," Soares wrote. 'It seems as though the leadership of Council 82 is more concerned with political sensationalism than upholding the rights and benefits of the men and women who put their lives on the line every day to keep our communities safe.

Along with Council 82, which serves many of the local police departments, including Albany's, Cusick picked up

the endorsement of two other large civil service unions, the Civil Service Employees Association (CSEA) and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AS-

Soares said he is planning several technology-centered initiatives in the coming years to help engage the public's help in reporting and solving area crimes.

He also said his focus will remain on taking guns out of the hands of inner-city Albany youths and getting drunk drivers off the roadways throughout the county.

employees in Town Hall are our biggest assets" and that the town has to be as committed to them as they are committed to the town.

At the proposed budget's public hearing on Wednesday, Oct. 22, Cunningham told residents that not all tax increases are equal.

The supervisor argued that a much smaller tax increase in other municipalities resulted in a much higher actual dollar. amount than what is paid in Bethlehem. Cunningham said town residents enjoy a nigh level of service for a fairly low dollar amount.

"Property taxes are the only revenue stream over which the town board has control," Cunningham said. "The property tax revenue accounts for 27 percent of the proposed 2009 town budget."

Cunningham went on to say that sales and mortgage tax revenue makes up 31 percent of the town budget and that the town has to draw from its fund balance to meet its expenditures each year. The town has drawn approximately \$4 million since 2005 from its fund balance, which he likened to using one's savings account to balance a checkbook.

The supervisor warned that

the town is taking a proactive approach and constantly looking for new revenue streams to ravoid massive budget deficits like neighboring municipalities such as Colonie.

A meal kids will be thankful for, too

Don't overwhelm children with a Thanksgiving menu just for grown-up tastes

During the weeks leading up to Thanksgiving, I am waiting in anticipation for the holiday. I spend a lot of time pondering menus, wines and guests. A fair amount of time is devoted to planning desserts as well.

But this warm and fuzzy feeling was not always so. When I look at the Thanksgiving of my childhood, I see brussels sprouts, oyster stuffing and creamed onions. Definitely not kid food.

The brussels sprouts were deemed disgusting by my sister and me. And the oyster stuffing? I used my fork as a shield, to prevent my mother from putting any of the scary-looking stuff on my plate.

As an adult, I do want to give her credit. In the 1970s cooking world, oyster stuffing was elegant and exotic. I am sure that it was enjoyed by every adult at the table. Unbelievably, my mother was shocked that we refused the oyster stuffing. And the creamed onions. And the brussels sprouts. My plate was always

empty, save for a scoop of mashed potatoes.

My sister and I sat in our

My sister and I sat in our fancy dresses, bored and itchy. The adults talked and talked. The table felt like our own personal prison, and we were dying to escape. Finally, after much asking and whining, we were excused. Thankfully, there was the promise of dessert, so we didn't stray too far. That's how it was, year after year.

And then I grew up and left home.

Paul and I moved to Colorado directly after college, and so it was time for us to create our own Thanksgiving traditions. We always had a big, festive gathering with our friends. Most of the people we knew in Colorado were transplants, like us, and did not travel home for the holiday. So we would invite everyone we knew to celebrate with us.

This was not the Thanksgiving of my youth. I remember many of the dishes brought for our potluck dinner: barbecued tofu, corn pudding and baked beans. One year someone even brought ribs.

The thing was, those holidays completely changed the way I perceived Thanksgiving. It had become my event. The day would be fun, casual and filled with all of the foods I love to eat. And there would be no oyster stuffing or creamed onions.

Since we have had children, our Thanksgiving table has been full with people of all ages. Relatives come. Friends From a Caterer's Kitchen

and neighbors are invited. Children organize ball games and make place cards and table decorations. The adults nibble appetizers and sip wine. I spend the day going between the kickball game, the stovetop and the living room. The day is always blissful, with the food and the company.

A few years back, we invited Paul's brother and his family to spend the holiday with us. Peter and his wife came, with their two boys in tow. At the time, our oldest kids were just 5 years old, and I will never forget how disappointed our nephew Mason was in the Thanksgiving desserts. He looked at the table – the pumpkin pie, pear tart, and the

ginger cheesecake – and then he started to cry. Really cry. We all rushed over, trying to help, but his mother stopped us.

"It's because there isn't any chocolate," she explained. I sympathized with him. Here is one meal that people look forward to all year. And it didn't include his most favorite food. Who wouldn't be disappointed?

It was that moment I realized what I had done: I had created the Thanksgiving of my childhood.

Canol salad is a kid-friendly Thanks giving the creamed onions - my balsamic roasted

onions. Not exactly kid food. So I vowed to make a change. Our holidays from then on would be created equally. Kids. Adults. All of them well fed at our table. There would be no more plates with only a serving of mashed potatoes.

This year, I asked my kids what their most favorite things to eat on Thanksgiving are, and we came up with this list. Lucy's hands-down favorite is the chocolate zucchini bread. Elliot, the carrot lover, will eat bowls of carrot salad. And Zoe, she loves applesauce. Loves it so much that I have to guard the container after I make it. Other wise there wouldn't be any for the dinner table.

On the day of Thanksgiving this year, I will try to spend time with my family, put a beautiful meal on the table, and please all tastes. A tall order, I know. But I believe that both Mason and my mother would approve.

Carrot salad

6-7 large carrots, washed and peeled

2 Tablespoons maple syrup

2 Tablespoons apple cider vinegar

1/2 teaspoon salt

Cut the carrots into thin strips and place in a large glass bowl. Combine the remaining ingredients, and pour over the carrots. Allow to marinate for 4-5 hours. Serve chilled or at room temperature.

Chocolate zucchini bread

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1 cup white sugar

2 teaspoons salt

2 teaspoons cinnamon

2 teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

2-1/3 cups white whole wheat flour

1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder

2 medium zucchini, grated (about 3 cups)

3 eggs

1 cup applesauce

1 tablespoon vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease two loaf pans. Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl. In another bowl, mix the wet ingredients, and then pour it into the dry mixture. Mix well, and pour into the prepared pans. Bake for 45 minutes, or until the tops are spongy. Cool before slicing.

Roasted apple applesauce

1 peck of apples (about 40 apples)

1/2 cup honey

2 tablespoons cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Slice the apples into quarters. Arrange on 4 baking sheets, skin side down. Drizzle the honey over, and then the cinnamon. Bake for 30 minutes, or until the apples are very soft. Allow the apples to cool. Working in batches, scoop about a half of each baking sheet into a food mill*. Process all of the apples and store in an airtight container in the refrigerator. It will keep for a week, but ours is always gone after a day or so.

* If you don't have a food mill, peel and core the apples before baking, it's more work but still worth it. You could also purchase a food mill for about \$30 at any kitchen store.

*A note about last month's recipe for doughnuts:

A sincere apology to anyone who tried to make the doughnuts printed here last month and failed. The error was mine, as I forgot to add 1/2 cup applesauce to the recipe. The dough should be very soft, like biscuit dough.

bit of a latecomer to acting. He was in his 30s when he appeared in his first production in Schenectady.

It didn't take him long, though, to realize community theater wasn't his calling.

Community theater tends to be "safe," he said, and he and a core group of theater friends like to put on shows that are a bit of a risk, both for themselves and the audiences.

"We want to give them something that's going to make them think," he said.

That mindset led to the creation of McMullen's production company and ical latest show, Neil LaBute's "Wrecks," which will be staged at ZuZu's Wonderful Life Café in Albany on Nov. 15, 16, 21, 22, and 23.

McMullen launched his company, D&M Productions, in the mid-1990s with Paul Dellio. Like McMullen, Dellio was excited by the thought of having a hand in plays that branched out beyond standard community theater fair.

"Things can get a little limited in the community theater area," Dellio said.

Over the years, the two collaborated on plays such as "Murder in the Cathedral," "Faith Healer," "Molly Sweeney," and "You Can't Take it With You."

Their partnership dried up when work and other commitments cut into their theater time. D&M Productions went dark until two years ago, when McMullen decided to revive it.

As a rule, he said, he likes to keep productions small, with minimal casts and settings. Part of the reason is that he finances

his productions himself, but beyond that, he thinks that smaller productions allow actors to really sink their teeth into their roles.

"There's much more actors can do," he said. "It's much more concentrated." "Wrecks" has one of the
McMullen's smallest casts yet.
It's a one-man show, starring
McMullen as Edward Carr, a
man who recently lost his wife.
At her wake, Carr looks back on
their long and happy marriage,
taking a trip down memory lane
that Dellio thinks will endear
him to the audience.

A simple love story, though, isn't the type of play LaBute writes.

"He's kind of the bad boy of film and theater," Dellio said. "He's constantly sticking his finger in the eye of everyone."

As such, the story takes a twist at the end that both floored and fascinated McMullen.

"I was shocked." he said, remembering the first time he read the play. "I just didn't see it coming."

So when another play McMullen was planning to put on fell through, he called Dellio and asked him to consider directing "Wrecks."

Dellio read it, and he, too, was hooked.

"It's very rich," he said.
"There's an intensity about it. It really asks us to consider things in a whole different light."

When the two got together to rehearse, McMullen found he didn't have trouble being the show's only star. He's so comfortable on stage that "it's easy enough to be out there without the support of another actor," he said.

But the process of learning his lines did present some difficulty. The play is about 75 minutes long, requiring McMullen to memorize about 30 pages of dialogue.

"When I was younger, my memory was a steel trap," he said. "It's not quite as sharp as it used to be. I find I have to work harder."

Not that he's complaining. McMullen's interest in acting was piqued when he was just a teenager and saw Marlon Brando in "On the Waterfront." But McMullen was a jock in high school; he didn't really have the time or inclination to act.

"I never got on stage," he said. "It didn't seem to be the thing to do. I was involved in a different crowd."

After that initial show in Schenectady, though, "I was hooked." he said.

Dellio is his favorite director

and describes the pair's collaboration as free of egos and star trappings. Instead, each works to help the other

realize his vision – and the writer's vision – of the play.

"The end product is not what either of us envisioned,"
Dellio said. "It's really kind of a birthing process."


The end product with "Wrecks" has a little bit of everything. The show is deep, but it's funny, Dellio said. McMullen called it "quite beautiful."

And of course, there's the "jolt" at the end, which neither McMullen or Dellio wanted to give away.

"On the surface, it's a nice story about a husband," McMullen said. "He's your guy next door, so to speak. But he pulls something on you that you don't see coming."






