## Councilman Rich Reilly proposed law as Local Law B

The New Scotland Town Board approved a motion to forward a draft zoning law with an 85,000 square-foot size cap on retail buildings for review, at a Wednesday, April 15, meeting.

The motion to adopt the law, primarily drafted by Councilman Rich Reilly, passed 5-0. The

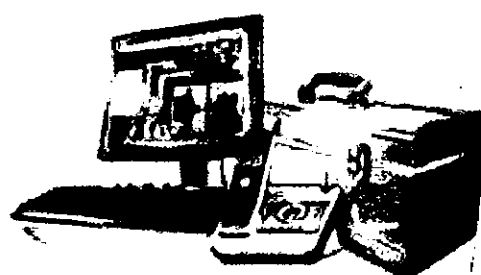
board voted to send the law to the Albany County and New Scotland Planning Boards, and will have a public meeting regarding it sometime in June.

Discussions about the town's zoning laws were prompted by a proposal from by Sphere Development LLC to place a 137,000 square-foot anchor retail store at the corner of Routes 85 and 85A, and a desire for the town to upgrade the laws to coincide closer with its Comprehensive Plan.

# Police Blotter

## Couple busted with heroin in Delmar parking lot

Police made an arrest as a result of a call about a man and woman possibly doing drugs inside of their car parked in a lot on Equinox Road in Delmar.

Danny Sanchez, 32 of 3545 Carman Road, Schenectady, was charged with seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance and possession of hypodermic needle, both misdemeanors. Tara R. Kirker, 28, of 16 Equinox Court, Delmar, was charged with seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance, a misdemeanor.

Both were arrested by Bethlehem Police on Thursday,

April 9.

After getting the call "for possible drug activity," police said they found Sanchez and Kirker sitting inside of a vehicle and approached them.

While interviewing Sanchez "he appeared nervous and began to sweat," according to the arrest report, and after he was asked to exit the vehicle, he was asked if he had anything illegal in his possession.

Sanchez told police he had a hypodermic needle in the front left pocket of his jeans.

Police said they after locating the needle they began to search Sanchez and the vehicle for illegal

contraband when, during the interview, an officer saw Kirker attempt "to place a wax baggie in her waist line."

Sanchez and Kirker told police "they were going out for a ride and that they both were users of heroin," the report states, and both the needle and the plastic bag were test by a "NARC kit," resulting in a positive reading for heroin for each.

The two were taken into custody without incident and transported to the Bethlehem Police Department and then arraigned by Bethlehem Town Justice Paul Dwyer, according to police.

Dwyer sent Sanchez to the Albany County Correctional Facility in lieu of a \$2,500 cash bail or bond and also sent Kirker to the county jail in lieu of a \$1,000 cash bail or a \$2,000 bond, the report states.

Police said that a New York

driver's license and a New York State benefits card not belonging to Kirker was located inside of her purse. The owner of the ID and the card was contacted and asked police to destroy both because she had already replaced them.

### Other arrests

• Demetrius L. Lanier, 35, of 7 B Limerick Dr., Albany, was arrested on April 9 in Albany on an arrest warrant for fourth-degree grand larceny, a felony, and petit larceny, a misdemeanor.

A probation officer contacted the Bethlehem Police Department and stated that Lanier was in her office and officers responded to the scene and transported him back from the Albany County Probation Office, according to the arrest report.

His arrest warrant was signed by Bethlehem Town Justice Paul Dwyer on Feb. 3, the report

states.

Police said Lanier was taken into custody without incident and was sent to the Albany County Correctional Facility by Dwyer on a \$30,000 cash bail or bond.

He is scheduled to return to town court on May 11.

# Bethlehem Central ready to adopt budget

District cuts \$4.4 million from 'rollover budget,' holds tax levy increase to 2 percent

The Bethlehem Central School District is preparing to adopt an \$88.1 million budget after one of its most grueling budget sessions in recent memory, with state cuts in aid, a tanking economy and a lengthy "wait and see" period to determine what funds it would get from state and federal government.

The board will make final decisions and is expected to formally adopt the new budget at its Wednesday, April 22, meeting at the district office in Delmar. The meeting begins at 7 p.m.

It was a rollercoaster ride, with many sacrifices and even job losses, but the district's board of education is ready to formally put a 2009-10 school budget before voters. The proposed budget represents a roughly \$3.3 million or 3.94 percent spending

increase over last year's and offers a tax levy increase of about 2 percent, which officials say is one of the lowest in years. The average spending increase over the last three years has been 9.06 percent, according to district officials.

A proposed tax rate has yet to be unveiled by district officials.

The district began working on the budget back in January by holding a first-ever public forum to receive input from the community. This year is Superintendent Micahel Tebbano's first school budget, and the public forum was one change he and fellow administrators imposed as a way to bring more transparency to the process.

The district then went through a weekly round of cuts in March under a three-tiered budget reduction system that ultimately removed \$4,352,096 from the budget. Some of the reductions were simply not filling vacancies that occurred. Others were the elimination of positions and policy revisions.

Almost no reductions were

adopted without controversy, but district officials maintained the cuts were necessary for the future fiscal health of the school and because of the economic situation the entire state is facing.

Some moves were more controversial than others.

The district had reservations about a tier-two proposal in its three-tiered plan to eliminate modified and freshmen level sports after receiving substantial criticism from the community. The board moved the reductions to the tier-three level, thereby keeping the programs intact.

No tier-three cuts, which included many staff and faculty cuts, were adopted by the board as a part of these weekly reduction sessions.

In a rare 5-to-2 split vote, the board voted to stop paying the fringe costs associated with hockey, golf and bowling. Board members Diane Glacone Stever and Matt Downey voted against the cuts. District spokesman Matt Leon said the district would still supply everything else, such as uniforms, coaches and referees.

However, those clubs will be responsible for raising the money for their respective fees to play. The district pays \$21,000 to rent the ice rink from the Capital District YMCA.

Bethlehem is faced with a \$2.2 million cut in state aid and tried to close the budget gap on an almost \$90 million budget by reducing expenditures and increasing revenues. Tebbano said during the process he was confident that there would be restorations to the state budget in terms of school funding, which turned out to be true because of some last minute changes and federal stimulus funds.

"It all matters if the Legislature can pass the budget. ... They're doing their thing, and we just have to be patient," he said before Wednesday, April 1, of the state passing its budget on time.

Tebbano, who said he would take no pay raise for the next two years, said he received a letter from the governor's office stating that once the budget passes, money will be flowing to area school districts. The state

budget ultimately passed a little under a week late.

There were contractual issues brought up throughout the budget process.

Last month, the district reopened contract negotiations with the Bethlehem Central Teachers Association while trying to make reductions in the school's spending plan.

Talks with the union did not result in any contractual changes or budget reductions. With "step increases," the BCTA gets a more than 5 percent raise as well as sabbaticals as a part of their contract with Bethlehem. The district's other two unions, an administrators union and a staff union, did not re-open their contracts.

A new contract with the BCTA will expire and be renegotiated next year.

The 2009-2010 budget proposal will be voted on by the community during the statewide local school and library Election Day on Tuesday, May 19. The public will vote on two board seats as well as the budget at the Bethlehem High School.

## Bethlehem gearing up to go green

Town to vote on resolution to become a 'Climate Smart Community'

The Bethlehem Town Board is planning to green up this spring and adopt a new energy initiative on Earth Day.

Councilman Kyle Kotary spoke during the Wednesday, April 8, meeting about teaming up with the state's DEC and the governor's office to make Bethlehem one of the first "Climate Smart Communities."

He spoke with The Spotlight about the importance of clean energy.

"This is really exciting for us," he said. "We all have a stake in this community and this planet and we all can do our part."

Supervisor Jack Cunningham said the board will be voting on a resolution in support of the Climate Smart proposal after members, and the public, hear a presentation from the state's assistant secretary for the environment, Peter Iwanowicz.

The resolution has a list of 10

goals that would be set by the town if passed to help create a "Climate Smart" community. They include investigating programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions; reducing consumption of gasoline and electricity use for local government operations by 15 percent no later than 2015; encouraging the use of renewable energy; investigating additional recycling programs; and informing the public about ways to reduce energy use and reduce climate change.

"The Town of Bethlehem believes that climate change poses a real and increasing threat to our local and global environments," the resolution reads. "And the effects of climate change may negatively impact our infrastructure, economy, farms, food supply, ecological communities; encourage the spread of invasive species and exotic diseases; reduce drinking water supplies; and pose health threats to our residents."

The resolution states that Bethlehem's response to climate change could result in new opportunities that could save money, reduce greenhouse gases and develop "energy-independent and secure communities."

"We're doing this in order to be energy efficient and to look for energy saving measures and investments," Cunningham said. "We are working in conjunction with the DEC and the governor's office. We were expecting to act on some more initiatives at the meeting, but the governor's [staff] has postponed it until the end of the month."

The board will still listen to Iwanowicz's presentation at the Wednesday meeting.

Cunningham said there was some discussion of wind turbines at the town's industrial section, but the town does not have the proper amount of wind generation to justify local turbines for energy.

"There was talk a while back about the creation of wind turbines that can generate sufficient energy on less wind, but I haven't seen it yet," he said.

Higher elevations in the county such as the Hill Towns and above the Voorheesville escarpment are more suitable for wind generation, according to local and county studies recently done in the area. There has been discussion on the county level, particularly by Albany County Legislator Alexander "Sandy" Gordon, a Democrat, to begin exploring wind generation in that area.

"This is something that is important to us and can help us grow in a smart, energy efficient manner," Kotary said about the Climate Smart project. "Our children and grandchildren will benefit from something that can start today."

## Sharma to run for school board

After 18-year-old Elijah Sharma graduates from Guiderland High School this June, he hopes to keep his ties to the Guiderland School District.

Sharma has announced his candidacy for the upcoming school board election on May 19, and would be the youngest and first openly gay member to serve if he wins, according to information he provided. He formally announced his candidacy on Thursday, April 16, at the Guiderland Public Library.

He pledged transparency and openness during the race.

"I want to be part of a board of

education that never shuts anyone out of the decision making process and makes sure that every voice is heard. Guiderland's Board of Education must never be about the superintendent's interests, never be about special interests, but only be about the public's interests," Sharma said.

Sharma said he has already reached and surpassed the 64 required signatures needed to run with more than 100, and was continuing to collect them until the deadline, Monday, April, 20.

"I want to offer voters a fresh perspective," he said.

Hey, now that we've denounced the phoniness of marketing yourself, it's time for a shameless plug:

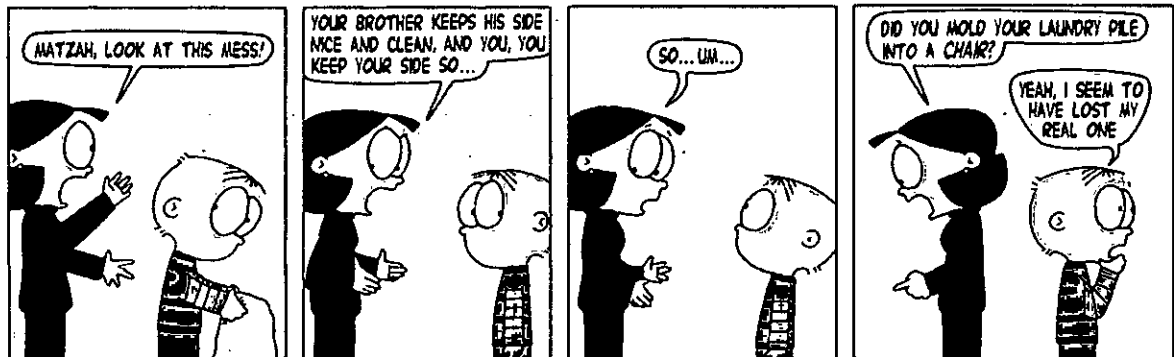
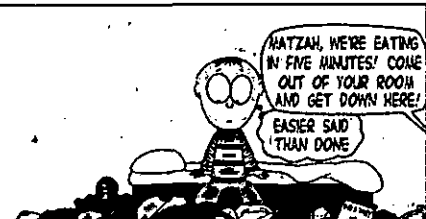

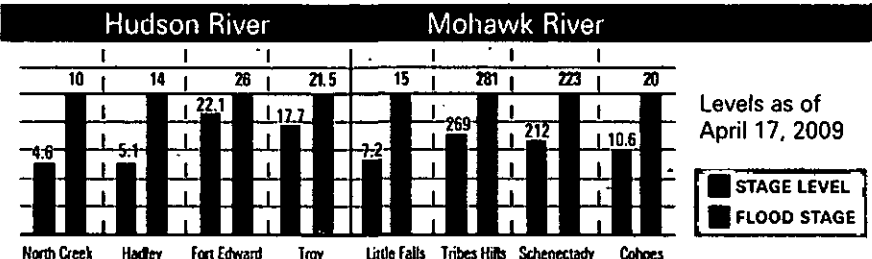

## Bethlehem Central senior nominated for Presidential Scholars Program

Bethlehem High School senior Dana Niu has a long list of academic achievements.

She's managed to maintain a GPA of 98 even while she takes senior courses such as Calculus 3, Linear Algebra, AP Physics, AP Statistics, AP English and AP Economics. She scored a perfect five on all of her Advanced Placement examinations. She has also received a perfect score on every SAT test she has taken — 1600 on the SAT I and 800s on each of three SAT II subject tests (chemistry, math level II and world history) — and she aced six state Regents exams.

Her latest accolade is a nomination for the 2009 Presidential Scholars Program, one of the top honors for a high school senior in the United States. Up to 141 students from across the country are typically chosen out of a few thousand nominees for the program.

Despite all of her successes, Niu remains down to earth, her school counselor, Scott Carlton, said.

"While her test scores and achievements are otherworldly, Dana's most endearing characteristic is her humble, friendly and unassuming demeanor," Carlton said. "She simply doesn't get too excited

about her accomplishments."

In fact, Niu did not even tell her friends about the SAT feat.

"In the end, they're just test scores," she said.

She attributes her success to the support of her parents and her own time management skills.

"There were some late nights," Niu said. "I have been busy."

It's not just schoolwork that keeps Niu occupied. She is an accomplished cellist who has spent hundreds of hours practicing and performing in the school's string quartet, symphony orchestra and in the Empire State Youth Orchestra. Niu is also the president of the BC Environmental Club, a member of the varsity tennis team, president of Key Club and a member of the pit orchestra for this year's musical.

Carlton said that a packed schedule makes Niu's accomplishments all the more impressive.

The Presidential Scholars Program was initiated in 1964 by the executive order of President Lyndon B. Johnson as a means to not only recognize the nation's most distinguished scholars, but also to provide an experience that helps shape the country's future leaders. The scholars

travel to Washington, D.C., in June as guests of the program for a week of seminars, lectures and workshops with people from the fields of government, education, science and the arts. The week culminates in a White House-sponsored event where the scholars are awarded the Presidential Medallion.

The detailed application for the presidential scholars program included six essay questions on a variety of topics. As Niu awaits word on the outcome, she is also waiting to hear about some other applications she's recently filed. Her sights are set on some of the finest colleges in the country.

While she won't know for several weeks where she will be next fall, Niu has thought about what she might study when she gets there. A daughter of Chinese natives, she is interested in possibly studying environmental sciences or international relations. She is also considering math and physics.

She expects to continue music lessons in college and would like to play an intramural sport such as badminton or tennis.

## Grant to help turn boat into museum

The New York State Museum has received a \$3.1 million federal transportation grant to make mechanical upgrades to the Day Peckinpaugh, paving the way for the historic canal boat's transformation into a permanent floating museum, dedicated to sharing the history and heritage of the state's canal system.

The grant was among more than \$81 million in federal funding for 59 transportation projects across New York State recently announced by Gov. David Paterson. Funds will be allocated through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act for Transportation Enhancement Program projects. TEP finances transportation improvements with cultural, aesthetic, historical and environmental significance.

The Peckinpaugh is scheduled to have temporary exhibits installed for the Hudson-Fulton-Champlain quadricentennial celebration tour in August and September. This was organized by the Erie Canal National Heritage Corridor, in conjunction with the state museum, Saratoga National Historical Park and the New York State Canal Corporation. This new federal grant will provide funds for the rehabilitation work necessary before permanent exhibits can be installed and the Peckinpaugh is ready for continuous tours.

Now, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Peckinpaugh was saved from the scrap heap in 2005 through the efforts of the New York State Museum, in partnership with the New York State Canal Corporation; state Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic

Preservation; the Erie Canal National Heritage Corridor Commission; the National Park Service; and the Canal Society of New York State.

The Peckinpaugh will follow a schedule of visits from New York City to Plattsburgh to Buffalo to Ithaca. When it is not touring during the navigation season it will be available for tours at the Matton Shipyard at Peebles Island State Park in Waterford. During the winter season it may also be open at its winter berth on the Waterford Flight.

Plans call for the Peckinpaugh's permanent exhibitions to be installed and ready for visitors by summer 2010. The National Park Service will coordinate the development and operation of the exhibitions in the 130-foot long open cargo hold of the motorship, which at one time carried 160 tons of dry cement. While maintaining the Peckinpaugh's industrial character, initial plans call for the creation of a gallery that is nearly as large as some gallery spaces in the state museum.

The grant will help to mitigate a decade of neglect that left many of the boat's mechanical systems in disrepair when it was largely abandoned in Erie, Pa. between 1995 and 2005. It follows a \$290,000 grant in 2006 from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation's Environmental Protection Fund that has been used to stabilize the Peckinpaugh. Additional work will include the replacement of fuel tanks, ballast piping and valves, the possible addition of a new ballast tank and the rebuilding of fresh water, sanitary and electrical systems.

## Why not just play along?

The mailboxes here at *The Spotlight* — both the physical and the digital — have been overwhelmed in the past week by letters, flyers and e-mails touting the virtues of Earth Day (the latter advising in the small print that you consider the environment and not print them out).

And, not surprisingly, Earth Day, celebrated April 22 to inspire awareness and appreciation for the Earth's environment, has critics who have also inundated our in-boxes with condemnation of the day.

If one were to make the determination based solely on the correspondence we've received, it would appear the critics fall into one of two categories: the outright Earth Day opponents — those who feel the day is nothing but a scam and a tool to spread "Hippie-Liberal propaganda," and those aforementioned Hippie-Liberal propagandists who feel the environmentalism and activism associated with the day when it was first observed in 1970 has been cast aside for marketed, profit-turning Earth Day specials on the Nickelodeon channel.

There are nuggets of truth in both camps. There can be no denying that the focus of Earth Day has gone from the appreciation of the Earth itself to the preservation of the resources it provides for human usage, just as there can be no denying that the day has been co-opted by activists on both sides of the political aisle.

*The Spotlight's* view is this: Who cares?

Why polarize something so much that its benefits become marginalized?

Validity has no agenda. The fact that a television station used more natural resources and spent more money to tell you to do something good than that action will ever replace doesn't make the message invalid. Earth Day may not be what it was and it may not be in tune with your personal views. But there are some good ideas and even better actions coming about because of it — critics shouldn't pass them by because of their dislike of the day.

## Mulch is good for any garden

I love being outdoors when spring finally arrives. It feels like we have waited a long time to declare that spring has finally sprung! This year, the cleanup is more extensive after all the damage the December ice storm caused. Fortunately, the towns are willing to step up and help residents with the chore. I know I appreciate all their hard work.

Once I get all the tree damage cleaned up, I want to renew the mulch in my perennial beds. I need to do this about every other year if I want to maintain

it at a 3-inch depth. In order to re-mulch the beds, I have to do a little math. First, I determine the total square footage of all my beds, then multiply by three to get the depth I want the mulch to be. This calculation gives me a cubic measurement. I then convert from cubic feet to yards. I purchase my mulch by the truck load as I find this to be the most cost effective means for acquiring 5 cubic yards.

I also like to put down some general purpose garden fertilizer, like a triple 10, at this time of the year. Making my application this early in the season prevents me from doing major damage to the newly emerging foliage with the granules. It also allows me to get the nutrients into the perennials as they begin putting on new growth. I then apply the new mulch over the top.

As I approach the first bed with my wheelbarrow, I find the leaves that I missed from my fall cleanup. I hate having to clean these up first but struggle through it each year. They are usually wet and often translucent. The only positive thing is that most of the time they are also stuck together

and can be removed in clumps. I collect them all and add them to my compost pile. Each spring I vow to do a better job in the fall, but each fall, as my back hurts, I look over the gardens and say, that looks good enough. And the cycle continues.

Mulch is a good addition to any garden. It helps keep moisture in the soil and breaks down over time, improving the soil by adding organic matter. Mulch also keeps lawnmowers and string trimmers at bay. Adding mulch gives trees and shrubs in the lawn a fair shake by reducing the competition for water and nutrients. Research has shown a marked increase in the growth of young trees when grown in a lawn where mulch has been added. When applying mulch, remember to keep it off the trunks of trees and shrubs. Mulch piled against the bark will maintain moisture and harbor microorganism, which will girdle the plant by rotting the bark away. Also keep in mind a widespread area of mulch does more good than a small, deep pile. Two to 4 inches deep is all you need to have a positive impact on your plants and the look of your beds. Working in the garden in the spring pays great dividends all season long. So enjoy this spring, and any time you get to work in your garden.

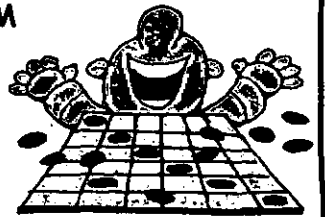

Parents of these students have been working for months preparing for the all night, alcohol-free party that has been a 20-year tradition at Bethlehem High.

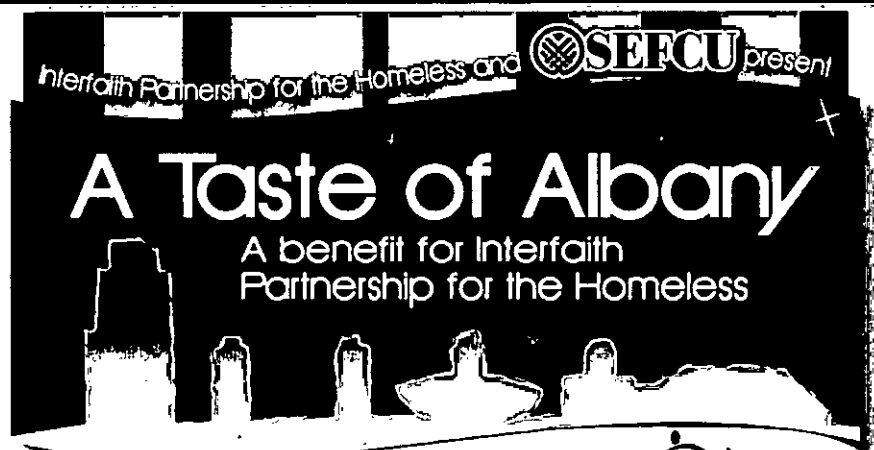

# Albany County hosts prom-season drinking forum

**Choices-301, district attorney and Albany County Stop-DWI to participate**

As prom season approaches, advocates against drunk driving and Albany County officials are sponsoring a forum dealing with misconceptions about alcohol use.

The forum will be held at the Beacon of Hope Care Center located at 6378 Gun Club Road in Altamont on Sunday, May 3, from 1 to 5 p.m.

The center is the location of the Choices-301 program run by Ed Frank, a former police officer.

Frank said there is an increase in conversation about the danger of drinking and driving close to high school prom time, and this forum is targeted to that audience.

"Everyone tries to concentrate on messages about underage drinking," Frank said.

He said although it is important to talk about it now, it is always something that the public needs to be educated on.

"Every weekend is prom weekend to me," Frank said.

Frank also said kids are inclined during prom time to ask their parents to host parties with alcohol at them, and the kids often put a lot of pressure on them to do so.

He said the forum would provide both parents and students with the necessary information about the civil and criminal liability of doing so.

He added that with the difficult economic climate, legal fees would be increasingly straining on families going through prosecution for hosting underage drinking parties.

Frank said a representative from the Albany County District Attorney's office will be on hand to answer questions about the county's position.

Staff Sgt. Lenny Crouch said informing parents is just as important as informing kids

about the issue.

He has already sponsored an initiative in Colonie on Tuesday, March 31, and is planning one for Shaker High School on Wednesday, May 6, to inform students and parents of the legal ramifications of "social hosting."

He also said he is planning to speak at Bethlehem High School on the topic.

"We've been spending a lot of time in the schools talking to the kids," Crouch said. "Parents need to be aware of what's going on."

He said some parents believe that if they are unaware of a party that they are not responsible for the outcome. That is not true, said Crouch.

He also addressed parents who argue that hosting a party allows

them to supervise their children and their friends while they drink, and that is recommended instead of having them drink outside of the home.

"It's ludicrous. There should be no parent that's out there that doesn't know it's illegal to do it," Crouch said.

He said serving another minor alcohol, even with written consent from the minor's family, is illegal.

"You cannot say that you can keep those kids safe regardless," he said.

Frank said Choices-301 is also planning several events to point out the dangers of text messaging while driving.

Two golf carts from Satch Sales in Menands were loaned to Choices-301, and they will

be used as part of the driving demonstrations about how difficult driving is while drinking and text messaging. Frank has one cart already on hand.

Frank said the carts are adorned with Dale Earnhardt icons, a notable racecar driver, to appeal to a younger audience. "We're doing the text messaging now, to show them, 'Hey, you can't do it while you're driving,'"

On Tuesday, May 12, Frank is having 50 kids from Schoharie participate in demonstrations regarding drinking and driving and text messaging while driving. He is also having students from Voorheesville High School and their parents at an informational forum later that night.

"We're taking this seriously," Frank said.

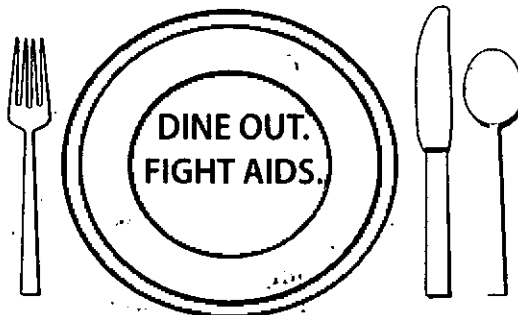

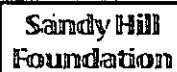

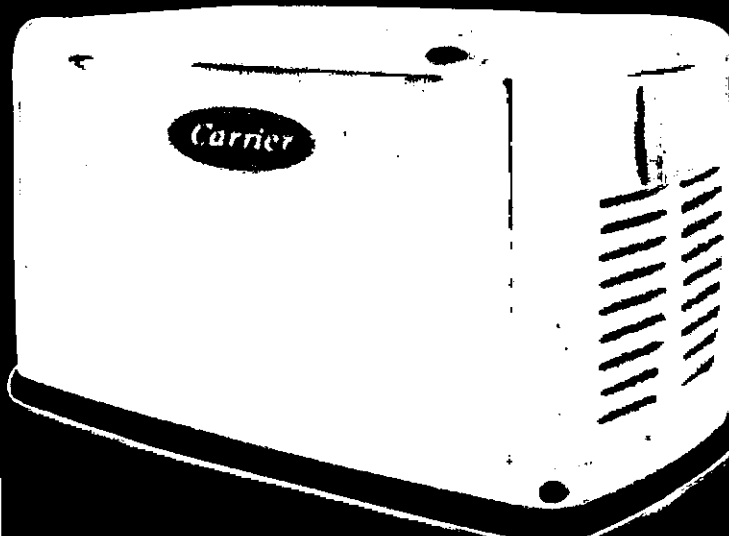

# G'land party bosses weigh in on November slates

## Supervisor race still in the air

Guilderland Democrats have cited third party endorsements as key to this year's elections, and Republicans expressed anticipation for an intense political season, according to both committees' chairs.

Neither party has committed to a slate yet for November's elections.

Ted Danz, chair of the Republican Party in Guilderland, is expected to release a slate of candidates for this year's elections by the end of this month, he said.

"It's going well," Danz said of the search process. "We did a little advertising and we're looking for people to get involved."

David Bosworth, chair of the Democratic Party in Guilderland, emphasized the importance of putting together a "coalition," and said many potential candidates gauge the support they will receive from the Conservative, Independence and Working Families parties before making a formal announcement to run.

He said many Democratic candidates in Guilderland have received endorsements from the Conservative and Independence parties in the past 10 years.

Bosworth said Town Supervisor Ken Runion made a preliminary decision not to run again, but added, "people have encouraged him to reconsider his decision."

"We were hopeful that he would make another run," Bosworth said. "He would have a lot of support from this committee."

Bosworth said there have been three serious candidates for supervisor who interviewed with the party. He said they all indicated they wanted to remain anonymous until Runion makes his decision, and all indicated they do not wish to run against Runion in a primary.

Bosworth said all three have prior political experience.

He also said there were others who were not previously "involved in the process" that expressed interest in the position.

"We won't be short of candidates," Bosworth said.

Speculation that Republican Councilman Mark Grimm will run for supervisor has shown up in media sources and blogs, but Grimm said he will release his final decision before April's end.

Danz also said he has had

conversations with Matt Nelligan, former high school teacher, and a source of debate when he was involuntarily transferred out of Guilderland High School due to a "cultural climate study," about running for a position, but it is not determined which position he plans to run for.

"Matt's got name recognition and integrity," he said. "He's a smart guy."

Danz said often times people are quick to criticize the government, but are unwilling to take action. He admitted, though, that running for office is a big commitment.

"You're setting yourself up for a lot of public ridicule," Danz said.

He said the money, time and hard work involved can be draining.

Bosworth estimates expenditures between \$30,000

and \$50,000 for the supervisor's race.

"Politics at the local level seem to be worse than politics at the national level," Danz said.

Runion chooses to run, "it's not going to be pretty," based on the already contentious relationship the two parties have in the town.

Bosworth said incumbent board members Patricia Slavick and Paul Pastore, Receiver of Taxes Jean Cataldo, Town Clerk Rosemary Centi, and Justice Denise Randall will likely run for their respective positions, all of which are open in November.

He added, though, that if Runion opts not to run, that could affect if they seek reelection.

He also said the economic climate might affect fundraising efforts, and could also play a role in their decisions.

The organization provides physical, occupational and speech therapy services, according to Arceci.

Autism affects one out of every 150 children, and primarily affects boys. Approximately 1 million children in the U.S. suffers from it, and treatment costs close to \$100 billion annually, according to information from www.generationrescue.com.

After the ride, participants will be treated to live music, a silent auction, a 50/50 raffle, door prizes and giveaways. A donation of \$30 includes the ride and the dinner. There will be hamburgers, hot dogs, sausage and peppers and two pigs to roast, Arceci said.

Arceci, who said he usually goes by Chico, is no stranger to charity. He helped raise close to \$8,000 for a local hospice last year.

He said he is hoping to raise several thousand dollars at the May event.

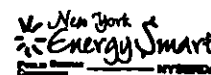

## V'ville team fares well at state tourney

A sixth-grade team from Voorheesville Middle School took first place at the Odyssey of the Mind State Tournament in Binghamton on April 3.

"The talent, camaraderie, diversity and opportunity to meet kids from around the world are rich rewards for teams that go to World Finals," Mackay said. "It will be a dream come true for this team if we are able to attend this year."

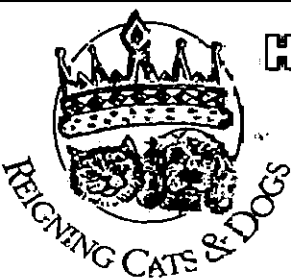
the Balladeers may play one of Lincoln's favorite tunes, "Dixie."

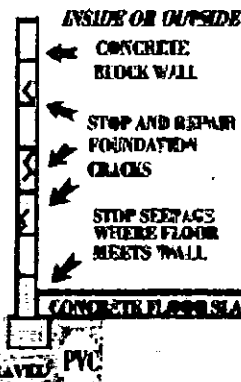

New York and U.S. history.  
Born on April 5, 1938, in Cedar Hill, Mathusa left behind a legacy that includes building nuclear plants in Alaska, Las Vegas, San Francisco, and Boston; assisting in building a propulsion system for the first Mars orbiter; a 38-year career in energy management at the Public Service Commission; working in various capacities at NYSERDA since 1978; and assisting in the building of the first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, *The USS Enterprise*.

At the age of 70, Mathusa lost a battle with ALS — also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease — on Sunday, Nov. 16, 2008, at his Delmar home.

"I am so pleased that we are joined here today by Parker's wife Polly, his daughters Heather, Ashlee, Bethany, and Elise, their spouses and all of Parker and Polly's grandchildren," NYSERDA Chairman Vicent Delorio said at the dedication.

NYSERDA board members Liz Thorndike, Garry Brown and Pete Grannis joined Mathusa's family. Also in attendance were past presidents such as Bill Valentino, Bill Flynn, Pete Smith and Congressman Paul Tonko.

Albany County Executive Mike Breslin and Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham were also on hand for the dedication, as was former employees Joe Visalli, Gunnar Walmet, Jean Woodard and Paul DeCotis and other NYSERDA staff.

The plaque unveiled in the boardroom in his honor reads as follows:

"Dedicated to the memory of Parker D. Mathusa, who, over more than 30 years, served NYSERDA with distinction as an energy research program director and then as a Member of the Board and as Chair of its Program Planning Committee.

"A nationally recognized research scientist, Parker led with integrity, knowledge and foresight, with a steady focus on NYSERDA's energy innovation mission and the interests of the People of the State of New York."

Mathusa was a graduate of the Historic Little Red School House in Cedar Hill and Ravena-Coeyman-Selkirk High School Class of 1955. In 1958, he was a community ambassador for the Town of Coeymans in Amsterdam, Holland. Mr. Mathusa received his bachelor's degree in physics from the University at Albany in 1959 and his master's degree in engineering management from Northeastern University in 1970.

He was an Eagle Scout and served in the National Guard.

"He began his career in Newport News, Virginia, after receiving his Bachelor of Science in physics from SUNY Albany by serving under the command of Admiral Rickover," Delorio said about Mathusa's work on the *USS Enterprise*.

He was also selected and served as emissary to China for Energy Infrastructure Development.

After retirement, he served on the NYSERDA Board of Directors as a Research Scientist for 10 years and was Bethlehem's planning board chair, member of the Planning Advisory Committee, the Comprehensive Planning Oversight Committee, and the Quadricentennial Committee.

Cunningham said the event was a nice way for NYSERDA

to acknowledge Mathusa's contributions and added that he wished he were still around today to with the new wave of energy initiatives. (See related story, page 3)

"It was very nice event and a good way to recognize his work for NYSERDA," said Cunningham. "I was proud to be there and it reminded me of how much I miss Parker."

History was a passion of Mathusa's and he was instrumental in preparing for this summer's 400-year celebration of the discovery of the very river that he grew up on.

In October of 2008, Mathusa had a bench and plaque dedicated in his name for this vision and dedication to the Quadricentennial Committee. The bench was appropriately placed near the Hudson River in Henry Hudson Park in Selkirk.

"Parker was a valued member of NYSERDA and all of us benefited greatly from his dedication, counsel, work ethic and great sense of humor," said Delorio. "He served with distinction and I know that I speak for all of us at NYSERDA when I say that his presence will be greatly missed."

Town Supervisor Tom Dolin supported, and presented to the public, an amended version of a zoning law featuring a 50,000 square-foot size cap to be sent along with Reilly's draft, but it failed 2-3.

Some meeting attendees voiced support for forwarding both laws for review.

"The public deserves the respect, and the opportunity to see two laws move forward," said Daniel Mackay, founder of the advocacy group New Scotlanders for Sound Economic Development. "Why would we not put two laws forward?"

He and his group have actively voiced support for a 50,000 square-foot cap.

Others at the meeting said sending two laws would have taken the power out of the hands of the board members, who ultimately should be working toward a law with its stamp of approval.

Several people spoke in front of the board during the meeting's public comment period.

At one point during the meeting one attendee, Donald Eberle, asked the members of the board who did not support a 50,000 square foot size cap on retail buildings to publicly pledge they, and any relatives they have, would not financially gain anything if the former Bender Melon Farm were to be developed with a large, bog-box, retail store.

The question prompted Lou Neri, husband of Councilwoman Peg Neri, to stand and reply that that was an "idiot question," and indicated it was out-of-line to insinuate foul play.

"The husband of Ms. Neri was acting like I was accusing his wife," Eberle said in a later interview. "I was just trying to find information."

All three members of the board who did not support the 50,000 square-foot cap — Deborah Baron, Peg Neri and Rich Reilly — expressed they did not have any financial interests in

the zoning law.

Some residents said the law restricted the commercial zone too much. Others pointed out that they purchased homes in the area for its scenic view, and more development would taint the rural nature of New Scotland.

Local business owner Rich Long said he feared his logging operation, which included retail, wholesale and manufacturing, would be limited by drafts of the zoning law that capped retail developments at 50,000 square feet. He said he opposed sending two versions of the law because it takes power away from the board.

"Maybe if that happens, we don't need a board anymore," he said.

He was hopeful for one law, agreed upon by the entire board.

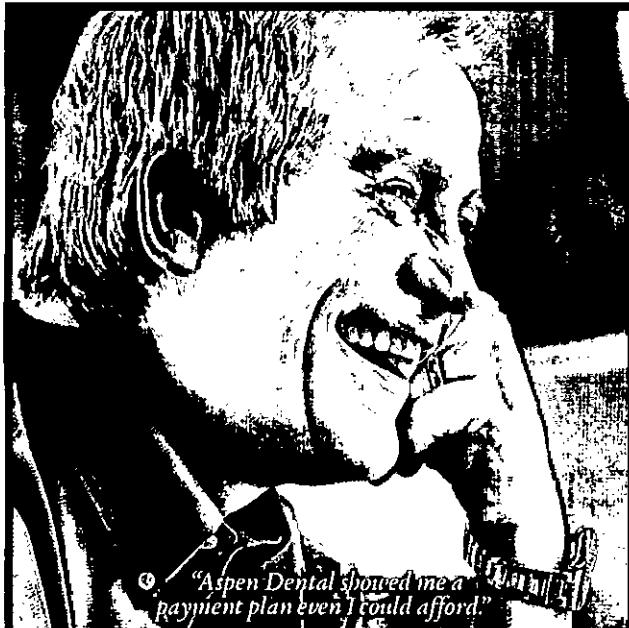
Dolin expressed a willingness to amend his and LaGrange's version of the zoning law so that it would not affect businesses like Fields', however that draft was voted down.

"I'm disappointed that they weren't agreeable to having both sent to the planning board," Dolin said during a Friday, April 17, interview. He said the town would await the recommendations of the county and town planning boards.

Anne Brill, an officer with newly founded group Pride of New Scotland, said she and her group support responsible growth in the town, involving limited residential development, a negotiation process with developers, and do not support a 50,000 square foot cap on retail development.

"All commercial development brings with it problems and potential," she said. She noted that limiting development is a bad idea, and keeping as many options on the table as possible is the best strategy.

# Entertainment *in the* Spotlight

When Mary Jane Hansen first started working with the New York State Theater Institute as an intern while she was a student at Russell Sage College, she wasn't completely comfortable.

She was young and unsure of herself, she said. In fact, that was one reason she liked acting: She could slip into the skin of another person.

"It's always clicked with me," she said. "I felt I could offer more in this way."

As Hansen got older, though, she grew more self-assured and found she had a lot to offer, too. She was drawn to her character of Tracy Lord in NYSTI's upcoming production of "The Philadelphia Story" because she embarks on a similar journey of self-discovery.

"She's a real human being," Hansen said. "She has her awkward moments."

Those awkward moments center around her love life. In "The Philadelphia Story," which debuts

## A romantic rigmorole

NYSTI brings charming tale to the stage in "The Philadelphia Story"

at NYSTI on Friday, April 25, and runs through Sunday, May 3, Lord is about to be married in 1930s Philadelphia. Complicating matters are her ex-husband, C.K. Dexter Haven, and Macaulay (Mike) Connor, a reporter assigned to cover the wedding for the society page.

The script didn't exactly resonate with Hansen when she first read it.

"I thought, we're going to do a play about rich people, isn't that cute," she said sarcastically.

But the script was deeper than she realized. As Lord struggles with her competing love interests,

she finds an inner strength.

"It shows we all have the opportunity to shine and show our character," Hansen said.

While all the male attention weighs on Lord, her younger sister, Dinah, delights in it. She gets word that Tracy may have had an affair and joyously spreads the hearsay.

"She's the one with all the gossip," said Eleah Jayne Peal, a sophomore at Columbia High School who plays Dinah. "She's spunky. She certainly isn't shy, which kind of sounds like me."

Peal's outgoing nature brought her to NYSTI when she was just 5. A kid with a self-described "huge imagination," she asked her mom

and dad if she could attend NYSTI camps and programs, and they embraced the idea.

"I just absolutely adore theater, and my parents always encourage anything I'm passionate about," she said.

While acting has always come naturally to her, this role presented a new challenge. "The Philadelphia Story" was a well-known movie starring Katherine Hepburn as Tracy Lord, Cary Grant as C.K. Dexter Haven and Jimmy Stewart as Connor. Peal wanted to see the movie, but at the same time, she wasn't sure that was a good idea.

"I was struggling with it," she said. "I wanted to develop the character in my own fashion."

She did eventually sit down and watch the movie, just as a point of reference. When she's on stage, she draws not on the movie, but on those around her, she said.

"A big part of my character is reacting to how my co-stars react," she said.

Hansen noticed when she watched the film for the first time that Hepburn had her own commanding take on the character.

"The role seemed written for Katherine Hepburn," Hansen said. "I saw a very confident woman. It was as if she was saying, 'This is mine. I own it.'"

Hepburn wound up earning an Academy Award nomination for her role, and Stewart took home the Best Actor Oscar for his portrayal of Connor.

Connor is played in NYSTI's

version by David Girard, and Lord's other love interest, ex-husband C.K. Dexter Haven, is played by Jason Marr. A Queens resident, Marr previously appeared in NYSTI's "Arsenic and Old Lace," and contacted his agent about having him play a part in "The Philadelphia Story."

tall and slender, which was the common look of the 1930s. He loves language and he's always liked old fashions.

"The clothes, I think, were just very elegant."

Beyond all of that, Marr is excited about "The Philadelphia Story" because he has a chance to play a very understated character.

"He's a smooth operator," Marr said. "You can sort of ride that and not do anything — just let the words do it."

Rising to the challenge, though, means trying to convey with looks and body language more of Haven's character, he said.

Like other plays of the era, "The Philadelphia Story" is very well-written, Marr said, and "I find that to be very satisfying."

Hansen thinks audiences will be satisfied, too.

"They should definitely expect to sit back and have a good time," she said. "It's charming."

"It's a good show if you want to see someone's life get extremely tangled and be glad it's not you," Peal added.

"The Philadelphia Story" will preview at the New York State Theatre Institute for a school audience on Friday, April 24, at 10 a.m. and for the public on Saturday, April 25, at 8 p.m. It runs until Sunday, May 3, at the Schacht Fine Arts Center, 5 Division St., on the campus of Russell Sage College in Troy. Tickets are \$20 for adults, \$16 for senior citizens and students and \$10 for children 12 and younger and can be purchased by calling the box office at 274-3256 or visiting [www.nysti.org](http://www.nysti.org).

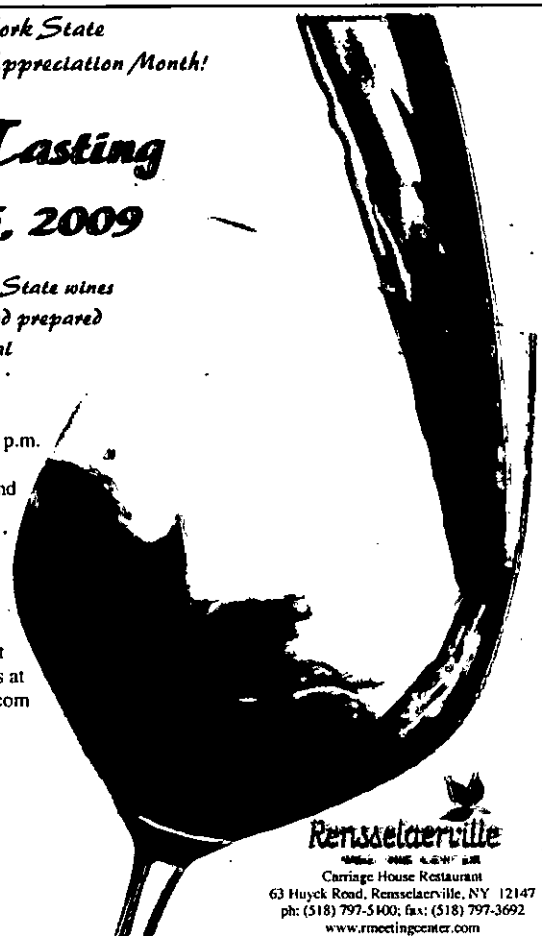

# Local chef likes it spicy

**Spotlight food writer Carolyn Barrett wins national award for dipping sauces**

When Carolyn Barrett was first introduced to the sauce at a Rochester pub several years ago by way of a friend, she was entranced by its syrupy, sweet nature. It generated in her a desire for more of that unique, spicy taste, despite the fact that as a general rule she disliked barbecue sauces, and it soon became a staple item in her household.

Little did Barrett suspect that her first encounter with Sticky Fingers Gourmet Sweet Sauce — renamed Sugar & Spice Sweet Sauce to avoid copyright infringement — would alter the course of her career.

Prior to the recent establishment of her new business, Pleasant Valley Kitchen Company, which is dedicated to the sole marketing of Sugar & Spice Sweet Sauce, Barrett had urged the owner of the pub that sold the sauce to put it on the market. Despite her pleas, he declined to bring it to stores, instead giving Barrett the recipe so that she might recreate the sauce on her own. She shelved it for a while.

The owner's sudden death a few years ago, however, caused Barrett to reconsider the sauce's future as a marketable product, deciding that it needed to be brought to the public to commemorate both its creator and the

sauce's unique flavor.

Recreating the sauce proved to be a more difficult task than Barrett had anticipated. On her website, [www.sugarandspicesweetsauce.com](http://www.sugarandspicesweetsauce.com), Barrett explains, "Even with the recipe I was not able to recreate the sauce. It seemed like there was some critical element missing, and I wondered if that was the pub owner's way of keeping his recipe a secret."

Persistence and determination enabled Barrett to continue. It took four months and cost \$400, but Barrett finally uncovered what she refers to as "the secret of the sauce."

Two years later, Barrett now owns a successful establishment facilitated by her husband Charles, who built her a kitchen complete with eight new burners on which she cooks her sauce.

She has also entered sauce competitions, winning second and third place for her Sugar & Spice Sweet Sauces — hot and mild varieties — in the 2008 Hot Pepper Awards for best dipping sauce. This international competition is restricted to commercial products containing no artificial ingredients.

The awards signaled the culmination of months of hard work and willpower.

According to Dan O'Berry, owner of [www.thehotpepper.com](http://www.thehotpepper.com), "the judges noted that the sauce was perfect for dipping. It is sweet with a bit of heat, and the flavor and consistency are great for egg rolls and other hand foods — a gourmet duck sauce replacement, with the added heat needed for 'chiliheads.'"

Recently, in response to demands, Barrett changed the sauce's recipe so that it

is now high-fructose corn syrup free. It is also low in sodium, Barrett says, and contains no trans fat.

Sugar & Spice Sweet Sauce has already enticed vegetarians, and according to Barrett, continues to tap into a market of people who, as a general rule, dislike wing sauces. "It's opened up a whole new culinary realm," said Barrett, citing her sauce's slogan, which proclaims, "Finally, a tasty alternative to barbecue sauce."

Barrett, who had been working as an executive assistant for what she called a "dead end job", was thrilled at the prospect of beginning a career that seemed to harness all of her best skills.

"I kind of created a job for myself that took advantage of all my natural talents," Barrett, who also writes for *The Spotlight* as a food columnist, said, explaining how her new business has caused her to employ her skills in driving, cooking, and writing in order to promote her product.

There is some apparent unspoken rule of business, however, which states that no fledgling company, Barrett's included, can attain full success without encountering a few obstacles along the way.

"It's very difficult to get into stores," said Barrett, "I've been met with a lot of pessimism, but my product has continued to prevail, and I'm very happy about that."



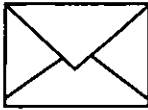

Bethlehem's strength was in the relays. The Eagles won the 1,600- and 3,200-meter relays to pick up 20 of their 96 points.

Paul Buehler had the top individual performance for the

Eagles. Buehler won the triple jump by covering a distance of 44 feet.

Buehler nearly won a second individual event when he placed second in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 16 seconds. LaSalle's Tyler Washington nipped Buehler at the finish line to win the race.

Gene O'Hanlon also had a second-place finish for Bethlehem. O'Hanlon ran a time of 22.9 seconds in the 200-meter dash to finish less than one second behind Albany's Kareem Morris, who was named the meet's most outstanding track athlete after winning two individual events.

Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk took 10th place in the team standings with 23 points. The Indians' top finish was a third-place performance in the 1,600 relay.

Certainly, the final scores are going to start resembling arena football scores.

It's not all bad news for the Yankees, though. The way the new ballpark is playing, guys like Swisher, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada will have career home run totals. And just wait until Alex Rodriguez gets his turn at bat. He's probably salivating over the prospect of hitting 70 home runs at home this season as you're reading this.

Still, you have to believe the Steinbrenners weren't intending on building a bandbox when they built their monument to excess. After all, they honored the history of the old ballpark next door by leaving the dimensions the same and creating a frieze around the top that reminded people of the stadium's predecessor - while adding such amenities as five-star restaurants and a giant high-definition video screen that can be seen from space.

Perhaps that frieze is the problem, though. The wind is blowing through all the openings and carrying the ball over the fence. It certainly can't be the Yankees pitchers - not after all the money they spent on upgrading their rotation.

Whatever the problem is, the Yankees had better figure something out to stem the tide. Perhaps building a giant wind screen behind the home plate stands to cut off the flow of air would be a start. They could use David Wells' old jerseys to build it. Or maybe they could go the Coors Field route and build a humidor to store all the game balls in an attempt to... well, I still don't know what good a humidor does, but it has cut down on the number of homers hit in Denver. Maybe it can do the same thing in the Bronx.

One thing is for certain: if the Yankees don't do something soon, the team will have to start selling neck braces at the merchandise tables for fans who suffer whiplash while watching all the home runs sail over the fences.

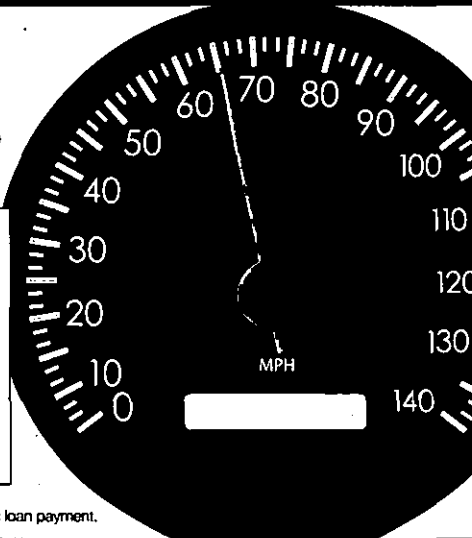

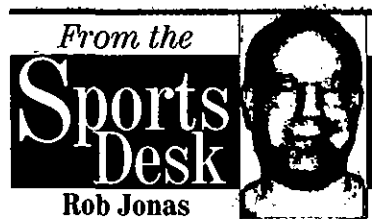
