# District OKs Vista plan

## Stakeholders must visit town before bonds can be issued

The Bethlehem Central School District Board of Education on

Wednesday, April 13, gave its approval to a plan that would see the Bethlehem Industrial Development Agency heading construction of Vista Boulevard.

Developers must still have Albany County and the Town of Bethlehem agree to hand over to the IDA any proceeds realized through a payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) agreement, which

would then be used to pay down tax-free bonds. The PILOT payments would be collected from property owners and tenants in the park.

It's an unconventional arrangement that had several members of the school board running through details with Vista Technology Campus stakeholders. Ultimately, they concluded BC

would have nothing to lose by signing off on such a plan.

"I most definitely think this is a win-win for the school district and for the town in general," said Superintendent Michael Tebano.

Vista Boulevard will run ¾ of a mile into the proposed tech

## County could open part of rail trail

### Pending approval by Bethlehem and county lawmakers, trail could be used from Slingerlands to Delmar

The Albany County Rail Trail could see some limited use in the near future, contingent on the approval of lawmakers in the Town of Bethlehem and County Legislature.

The county has reached an agreement with the town and the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy (MHLC) to open a 1.85-mile stretch of the trail to pedestrian use.

The portion of trail to be opened would begin at Fireman's Park in Slingerlands and end at the Veteran's Park on Delaware Avenue in Delmar.

# Walk left, ride right and more

## PaTHs and town roll out bike/pedestrian safety campaign

With the arrival of spring, many Bethlehemites are shedding sweaters, flinging open windows and venturing into the outdoors. And town officials and the Bethlehem Pathways to Homes,

Hamlets and Healthy Hearts Advisory (PaTHs) Committee are reminding pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists to be aware of one another this season.

The committee is launching an educational campaign aimed at driving safe practices home among these groups. Palm cards are to be distributed throughout the community and tips will also run on Channel 18.

This is a new approach for the PaTHs Committee, which has

contributed to planning how to expand bicycle and pedestrian access throughout town.

"I think in the past we concentrated more on the engineering side of bike/ped," said Bethlehem Senior Planner Robert Leslie, who serves as town liaison to the committee.

The palm card is to highlight rules that most everyone knows but far too few follow. Though most feel the community is behind a walkable, bikeable com-

munity and that goal is part of the town's comprehensive plan, planning and outreach go hand in hand, said PaTHs Committee member Anne Benware.

"That safety education and potentially enforcement of different aspect of pedestrian safety and bike safety is also important. The whole thing has to work together," she said.

Common rules to remember: bicyclists should ride to the right

# Slingerlands firehouse project vote scheduled

## Expansion plans moving forward

Plans are moving forward to expand the Slingerlands firehouse, with a public referendum on borrowing for the project tentatively scheduled for this September.

The Slingerlands Fire Department, which serves parts of Bethlehem and New Scotland, has been investigating making some more space for over a year now. Though discussion had stalled for a while, the department's Board of Commissioners have formed a committee and are searching for bond counsel and a construction manager.

"Right now we are in full swing with moving the project forward," said Walter Eck, chairman of the board.

A study has pegged the cost of the project at \$1.8 million, which would buy an equipment room, larger vehicle bays, a day room for on-call EMTs

and training and shower facilities. A ventilation system would also be added to the vehicle bays; right now, there is no venting of diesel fumes when the department's vehicles are started up.

That cost estimate doesn't include design work and other extraneous expenses, so the final figure could be larger, said Eck.

"There will be many more details coming out about all of this," he said.

The Board of Commissioners also approved setting a public meeting two weeks out from the bonding referendum. The department will need the approval of voters in the fire district to borrow money for the project, though an amount to bond has not been decided on.

If voters approve the borrowing, the department will look to the spring of 2012 for a groundbreaking.

# Town Hall renovations decision postponed

## Supervisor requests more time for discussion

The much anticipated agenda item pertaining to the use of General Fund Capital Reserve money to complete Town Hall

renovations was tabled at the Wednesday, April 13, meeting of the Bethlehem Town Board.

The Board was scheduled to discuss the deputy commissioner's request to authorize the use of up to \$385,000 from the General Fund

Capital Reserve to complete renovations. But with Supervisor Sam Messina absent from the meeting to give a presentation to the Board of Education, he requested the item be tabled until the April 27 meeting because there were still discussion points that need to be

addressed.

The Board passed three bond resolutions by a vote of 3 to 1, with Mark Hennessey being the dissenting vote on all three. The issuance of serial bonds not to

# Ritter convicted in Pennsylvania court

Former U.N. weapons inspector and Delmar resident Scott Ritter was last week found guilty of exposing himself over the Internet to someone he thought was a 15-year-old girl.

Ritter was convicted by a Pennsylvania jury on six of the seven charges brought against him after about eight hours of deliberation.

The charges include unlawful contact with a minor. He was acquitted on a charge of criminal attempt. Sentencing will be in May, and Ritter could face up to five years each for his two misdemeanor convictions and seven years each for his four felony convictions, though it's unlikely the judge will dole out that full sentence.

Monroe County Assistant District Attorney Michael Rykechevski said he argued a case based on the evidence at hand.

"I think that [the jury] looked at the evidence and made a decision based on the evidence," he said.

"The evidence really was the video and the chat log," Rykechevski added.

Ritter, 49, was arrested by the Barrett Township Police Department in February of 2009. An officer running an Internet sex sting operation pretended to be a 15-year-old girl named Emily and Ritter, under the screenname "delmarm4fun," exposed himself via web camera and masturbated.

The jury viewed that tape during the trial.

Ritter's attorney, Gary Kohlman,

argued in court his client believed the exchange to be a manner of fantasy and at no time did he believe the person he was chatting with was actually 15.

That was an unbelievable defense, Rykechevski said, given the fact Ritter deactivate the camera when the issue of age came up, but later turned it back on to complete the act. That fact was a key component of the prosecution's case.

"I think its clear that he consciously disregarded a risk that this was a minor," he said. "If he would have stopped right there...I would have had a lot more difficult time prosecuting it."

Ritter took the stand in his own defense. A call to Kohlman's Washington, D.C. office was not returned.

The jury also heard information about Ritter's two past arrests in the Capital District under similar circumstances. Of those, one case was dismissed and records were sealed in the other. Ritter allegedly tried to meet with underage girls he met on the Internet but were, again, actually undercover officers.

In court, Ritter argued that he knew these were sting operations and wanted to be caught.

Rykechevski said the information from New York law enforcement was of great help in his prosecution.

Ritter will have the opportunity to appeal the conviction.

exceed \$780,000 for various road paving projects as approved in the 2011 budget. Resolution 2 authorizes the issuance of serial bonds for various town maintenance and highway and operations equipment as approved in the 2011 budget. Resolution 3 authorizes the issuance of serial bonds not to exceed \$15,000 for the acquisition of a 1 ton roller as approved in the 2011 budget.

The Board also

acknowledged it was in receipt of the police department's 2010 annual report, per the request of the Chief of Police.

The Board approved seasonal personnel for the Parks and Recreation Department and voted to authorize Messina to sign an agreement with Thomas Rowlands, Ellison enterprises to operate the concession stand at Elm Avenue Park Pool from 2011-13.

There were no significant changes between the old agreement and the new agreement, and the Parks

and Recreation Department said it was planning to build in a couple nights that the pool would be open later to accommodate special events. The department was also considering a separate project where people could reserve an area for pool parties, bring in party goods and have their own space.

Chris Hughes spoke during the public comment period and informed the board about a March 11 search warrant that State Police served him at his residence.

# Out of the blue and onto the stage

**Blue Man Group's performance includes ample audience participation**

Living, breathing, vaudevillian comic book.

This is the most accurate description of Blue Man Group's appearance at Proctors in Schenectady on Tuesday, April 12. To simply call the show that however, is to sell short the magnitude of the performance.

Not so different from great exhibitions of magic or professional wrestling, Blue Man Group's stage act is best viewed with suspended disbelief. How the marvels of music, technology and stagecraft you are watching unfold are happening is secondary to the fact that they are happening. To spend time concentrating on the how or the why is to focus too closely and lose the big picture of the show's vibrant colors and attention holding blend of elements.

Blue Man Group's idiom is carefully crafted out of a mix of mime, physical comedy and

broadly appealing music sensibility. The show is, in an abstract sense, a distant cousin of the classic Chuck Jones "Tom and Jerry" cartoons from the early '60s - the ability to tell a complete story without dialogue, and have the audience comprehend and react to that story, is testament alone to the skill of the performers.

Blue Man Group clearly told the Fourth Wall to stay at home and not wait up. From the very beginning, the troupe entices the audience to participate with scrolling LED marquees displaying light comedy and asking the audience to set the opening tone for the show through a combination of claps, cheers and chants.

The kind of in-depth audience participation on display, particularly as it relates to the selection of patrons for various hijinks, lends the performance an intimate feel, and opens the doorway for the two-way interaction

with what's happening on the stage. The show ends up being a whimsical and curious exploration of human interaction and observation; you are not just there to watch Blue Man Group, Blue Man Group is also there to watch you.

To that end, there is a part of the show that features a classically staged comedic scene of the Group eating at a dinner table. What makes the comedy stand out is that the trio has invited (perhaps "coerced" is more appropriate) an audience member to take

part in it. And the more the audience volunteer reacts to the Group's outlandish takes on activities we take for granted, the more they focus the attention on that person. As a spectator, you are drawn into the scene, wondering what your own reactions would be and empathizing with your peer who has been put on the spot before the masses.

What gets easily lost in the flashing lights and quality, if perhaps simple, comedy is the underlying musical base on which the entire show floats.

Though the music is predominantly percussive in nature, this is not simply a recitation of drums. The music is artfully crafted and skillfully arranged, especially as it interacts with the light show going on in the background. The songs rely heavily on the tropes of dance music or rock and roll, but are approached on stage in an unorthodox manner, with strange and unusual instruments, so as to appear fresh and imaginative.

Meeting at the crossroads of stand up comedy, jovial Broadway celebration and rock and roll spectacular, Blue Man Group puts on a light-hearted and captivating performance.

**Help...I think my dog has fleas! What do I look for and what can I do?**

Flea infestations are a common cause for itching in dogs and cats this time of year. Adult fleas feed on the blood of your pet. The adult flea can live for weeks and lay hundreds of eggs. The eggs fall off of your pet into your home and hatch into larvae. The next life stage, the pupae, makes flea eradication difficult as they can survive for up to 9 months!

Fleas can be tricky to diagnose as the adults are very fast and good at hiding in your pets hair coat. Using a specially designed comb to check for pepper-like specks of flea feces is a good way to check for the presence of fleas. Other signs of a flea infestation include excessive scratching and chewing, hair loss due to self trauma, scabs and hot spots, anemia and tapeworms.

There are many flea treatments for both your pet and your household. Although dogs and cats are both prone to fleas, it is important not to use products labeled for dogs on cats as this can be fatal. Please be aware that many of the flea treatments are toxic; before using any of these products consult with your veterinarian. Thoroughly clean your home and remember to discard all vacuum bags.

# Suspect in high-speed chase arrested

Bethlehem Police have arrested a man they say fled a traffic stop last week, led police on a high-speed chase and then vanished into the woods.

Robert Cooper Moor III, 43, of 16 Pulver Avenue, Ravena, was on Tuesday, April 12, arrested by Coeymans Police on an arrest warrant and arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court on charges of reckless endangerment, fleeing, resisting arrest, reckless driving, aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle and a laundry list of traffic violations.

Moor allegedly eluded police for over week after he was pulled over Sunday, April 3, on Route 9W for having inadequate exhaust on the 1998 Hyundai Elantra he was driving. As the patrol officer approached the car, Moor took off and headed south at a high rate of speed and "traveling erratically," according to police reports.

Police caught up to Moor and maintained contact as he allegedly broke a litany of traffic laws. In the vicinity of the Van Allen Senior Apartments he left the roadway and traveled across a muddy field, briefly becoming stuck at one point, police said.

Moor then allegedly drove the vehicle onto the parking lot at the apartment complex and circled the building, when police briefly lost sight of him. Upon circling the building, police saw the unoccupied car about 300 feet into the woods, sitting unoccupied.

Police set up a perimeter and began canvassing the woods. A call was received from a nearby homeowner reporting a white male on the property and police briefly caught up with their suspect before Moor was again lost in a dense growth of high bushes, according to police.

The registered owner of the Elantra said she had loaned it to her

daughter's boyfriend and police began tracking down Moor. At about 10:43 p.m. that evening an off-duty Coeymans Police Department officer reported seeing Moor at the Stewarts on 9W in Bethlehem Center, but while he was phoning in the information Moor became suspicious and left, according to arrest reports. A canvass of the area was fruitless.

The next contact reported by police was when Moor was arrested by Coeymans Police. He was arraigned and remanded to Albany County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 cash or \$30,000 bail bond.

The crimes Moor was charged with were misdemeanors and violations. He did not reveal why he decided to flee, said Sergeant Robert Helligrass, of the Bethlehem Police Department, though he was allegedly driving on a suspended license.

# Just this once ...

You can only go to the well so many times.

Waterford-Halfmoon and the Berne-Knox-Westerlo school districts are among 101 statewide that will use "surplus" from Employee Benefits Accrued Liability Reserve funds (EBALR) to ease the pain of state aid cuts, an act made possible through an allowance by State Comptroller Thomas P. DiNapoli.

First of all, what the heck is EBALR? We at *The Spotlight* aren't financial whizzes (we're in newspapers, for Pete's sake), so let's use the comptroller's own words:

"Reserved portions of fund balance are committed for specific legal purposes. Reserve funds are created under various laws which determine how the reserves can be established, funded, expended or discontinued. School districts can establish an Employee Benefit Accrued Liability Reserve (EBALR) under Section 6-p of General Municipal Law (GML) and use EBALR monies to pay employees for accrued leave time due to them when they leave district employment. Interest earned on money in the EBALR must become part of the reserve fund. School districts are not required to fund the liability for compensated absences, but they are required to calculate this liability and to report it in their financial statements."

OK. So, this money is used to pay out accrued time when an employee separates from the district, and the interest the fund earns must be used for the same purpose. The comptroller has deemed some districts have an "excess" of this separation money and is allowing them to use it, presumably, to keep people employed in order to offer a better education.

It seems that districts have somewhat of a problem with the EBALR, and that is they're not firing teachers fast enough to work off their "excess."

Or, you could change the municipal law that states accrued interest for one reserve fund can't be transferred to another. If the comptroller is going to make an exception just this once (yeah, right) then why not take a look at a system that would let school districts be more flexible with all their "excess" cash.

# Staying within the lines

## Reforming New York's legislative redistricting system

We urge children to stay in the lines when they learn how to draw, shouldn't we hold New York's lawmakers to the same standard when it comes to drawing reality-based legislative districts?

If you're into modern art or enjoy taking Rorschach tests, you might be interested in looking at a map of our state's legislative districts where you will see Assembly, Senate and Congressional districts that resemble salamanders, snakes, Abraham Lincoln, a witch on a broom and a whole host of other odd configurations that will leave you scratching your head.

New Yorkers deserve fair and equal legislative districts that are based on the commonalities of communities and not on political power blocks.

Unfortunately, the redistricting process has become more about legislative leaders cherry-picking voters to keep control rather than about voters picking their legislators.

If we're ever going to truly change the way New York State's government works, we've got to start by reforming the way legislative district lines are drawn.

No doubt, you may remember first learning about redistricting back in high school civics class. Redistricting is the process of using U.S. Census data to redraw legislative boundary lines of electoral districts.

In the last few months, you may have heard talk about redistricting reform and wondered, "Why does this even matter?" Redistricting impacts our communities in every possible way imaginable, from government spending to property taxes to job creation and even public safety. It sets the stage for

the kind of representation you will have in our state and nation's capitol and the volume of its voice on our behalf.

History has shown that too often legislative districts are gerrymandered – or carved up – to benefit the party in power to the detriment of minority party voices and the common concerns of voters. Cities are broken up and small towns and rural communities are lumped into districts dominated by larger municipalities that have very little in common in terms of economic, geographic or cultural needs.

Rather than drawing districts based on commonalities, legislative leaders engage in packing and stacking voters to protect partisan agendas.

The current process for drawing district lines in New York State has been widely criticized as lacking independence from the Legislature and serving partisan interests rather than the public interest.

Free, fair, open and competitive elections are at the heart of the democratic process. In spite of this fact for too long election maps in this state have been drawn up behind closed doors are motivated entirely by political concerns that have little if anything to do with effective representation for the people of New York State.

To restore public faith in our state government, meaningful reform of the redistricting process is necessary and such reform must create a new and permanent process whose hallmarks are independence, transparency and fair representation.

Last year, I was among several state legislators from both sides of the aisle who signed Mayor Ed Koch's NY Uprising "Hero of Reform" pledge on redistricting reform. I'm pleased to report back to you that I've kept my pledge to support non-partisan, independent redistricting.

I'm the author of two redistricting reform bills to create legislative districts based on common communities and not political power blocks. One bill would accomplish that goal via a constitutional amendment (A.1512), which is the most rock-solid legal approach. My other bill would get the job done via statute (A.4771). I stand ready to vote for any bill that ensures lines will be

drawn by an outside, independent, bipartisan commission.

There is no better way for ensuring that people have a voice in the process than by mandating that they play a role in choosing the people who will craft New York's election proposals. My legislation ensures that the expertise of elected representatives will continue to be part of the process by allowing the governor and legislative leaders the opportunity to appoint members to the reapportionment commission.

I've also signed on as a sponsor of Governor Cuomo's redistricting measure (A.5388) which establishes an independent redistricting commission that would draw maps for congressional and state legislative districts every 10 years following the Census.

The governor's bill is not perfect. For instance, I'm concerned about the number of appointments to the commission the Executive branch would have. Nonetheless, Mr. Cuomo's bill is a positive step in the right direction for reform and would lead to a better system of redrawing the legislative lines then now exists.

The bottom line is I will support any measure that produces true redistricting reform that creates fair and equal districts based on the things that unite people. This shouldn't be about what's best for Democrats or Republicans but what is best for all New Yorkers.

Time is running out to reform the redistricting process for New York's 19.5 million residents as the lines will be redrawn by next year to take effect for the 2012 election. Unfortunately, we missed an opportunity to pass the strongest possible redistricting reform late last year by taking up my bill to amend the state constitution to enable independent redistricting. A constitutional amendment requires passage in two consecutive legislative terms. This would mean the new process would not take place until 2022. This would be unacceptable and the people of New York have waited long enough for redistricting reform.

Let's bring redistricting reform to the floor of the Legislature this year for an honest and real debate. Our state deserves no less.

Missing this important opportunity to take decisive action will only delay the real reform that New Yorkers seek.



# Elmwood referendum passes on second go

The second time's the charm for the Elmwood Park Fire District.

A public referendum held Tuesday, April 12, passed 87-79, giving the fire district the OK to bond up to \$265,000 to purchase a six-acre plot of land behind the North Bethlehem firehouse. The Elmwood Park Fire District funds the North Bethlehem Fire Department.

A February vote

had ended up in a tie, and since then the fire department has held two public meetings. Though Tuesday's voter turnout was but a sliver of the roughly 3,000 residents in the district, for a fire district issue anything in the triple digits is considered a strong showing.

"Most of our votes over the last 10 years have been 25 people," said North Bethlehem Fire Department Chief Paul

Fuino.

The district will take \$50,000 out of its building improvement fund to supplement the borrowing. Also, the plan is to sell off portions of the property, including a trailer included in the sale. The bonds will be taken for one year, and hopefully money from the sale will cut down on debt service.

"The minute the property is in our hands,

we're going to have the real estate agent in," Fuino said. "Hopefully next year when the renewal comes up we won't have to renew as much."

Once the land is paid off the department will look at building an accessory structure for storage, operations and training. There is also talk of carving some nature trails out for community use.

Detours will be


posted, and due to the detour there will be no roadside parking on Ridge Road and Glendal Avenue.



"Opening doors"—that's what it says on our redesigned library card. What that means for you is access to the collections of 29 libraries in Albany and Rensselaer counties. It is also your ticket to free services beyond books and DVDs.

Show us your card and you can use one of our fifteen public computer stations for research or recreation. An hour session can be extended if no one is waiting.

Once you've logged on to one of our computers, we provide access to 21 online databases—magazines, journals, newspapers, academic reference tools for adults and kids, /Ancestry Plus/, business and consumer information, and more. Most are provided to us by the Upper Hudson Library System or the New York State Library. But eight of them—including Auto Repair Reference Center, Consumer Reports, Grolier Online, New York Times Historical, and several literary reference tools—have been purchased by us with your taxpayer dollars. Access to these requires a Bethlehem Public Library card.

Your Bethlehem Public Library card also allows you to borrow individual and family passes to a dozen regional museums. Family budgets get a reprieve when parents and kids can visit Hancock Shaker Village, the Old Stone Fort, the Eric Carle Museum of Picture Book Art, the Schenectady Museum and Planetarium and more, all for free. A complete list can be found



at [www.bethlehempubliclibrary.org](http://www.bethlehempubliclibrary.org).

If you have a library card, you can use one of our small study rooms for small-group study. Again, sessions of one hour can be extended if no one is waiting.

If you have a library card, you can sign up for advance email notification of holds and overdue. You can access your library "account" to track what you've borrowed and requested. All of this information is confidential and secure.

And of course, you can borrow books, DVDs, CDs, periodicals, ebooks and downloadable audiobooks—not only from our library but also from the 28 other libraries in the Upper Hudson Library System. Please bear in mind that although a library card from any system library is valid at all system libraries, borrowing policies of the lending library apply.

Bethlehem Public Library cards are issued to residents of the Bethlehem Central School District. Bring a picture ID and proof of current residence. Cards come with an additional key-tag version, and special-edition cards are available for children.

Any way you look at it, your library card opens doors to the Main Event—a richer, more informed life—and admission is

free.



# A political legacy comes to an end

## Albany County Executive Mike Breslin will not seek a fifth term

After 16 years as the Albany County Executive, Mike Breslin will be ending his run in office, saying he feels he has left a positive footprint in the county.

"I've been very pleased with what we've been able to accomplish over the last 16 years," Breslin said. "I did far more than I anticipated to be doing. I didn't come in as a professional politician. I feel like I have done a lot of great things."

One of the greatest accomplishments he achieved was making the Albany County Government more open, professional, transparent and accountable by focusing more on serving the public rather than political needs. Breslin said that he is going to continue

"I want to make sure the legacy continues," he said of finishing out his term. "Through the next eight months, I look forward to those challenges, particularly during these times, the bad economic times."

Breslin was appointed Albany County Executive in December of 1994 and was elected to his first full term in November 1995. During his tenure, Breslin has

been able to expand support for seniors and individuals with disabilities wanting to remain in their community with a home and community based services model. He also implemented several shared services to work with municipalities aimed at making government work more efficiently.

He also created the Department for Children, Youth and Families in 2001. This was meant to consolidate the delivery of services for at-risk children.

Albany County Legislature Chairman Dan McCoy, who said he is currently mulling over the possibility of running for county executive with his family, praised Breslin for his ability to consolidate the department but said that there were some complications that went along with it.

"It has its hiccups," he said. "But when you consolidate a department like that, you're going to have some hiccups."

There were some topics Breslin and he disagreed on during the county executive's time in office. But McCoy said that he thought Breslin did a fine job as the county executive and said that they had both agreed on the importance of caring for the elderly.

"Obviously, with being chair, we've have had our battle over the years," he said, adding that

Breslin came in during a period where a lot of things had to be cleaned up. "I think his record speaks for itself. We would agree to disagree on certain topics, but I think he has done a fairly good job. I wish him well in his retirement."

Newly elected Albany County Republican Chairman Don Clarey said that he had been hearing rumors for months that Breslin would not be running again, so it wasn't a surprise when the news broke.

Breslin was not the strongest executive, Clarey said, adding that the Democratic Party had significant internal issues that were reflected in his tenure.

"His heart was in the right place," he said. "From a policy point of view, taxes are going

up, but I realize a lot of that is mandate driven."

Clarey said he would give Breslin a grade of "Incomplete" for his time in office since he has a few months left, but said at this point he would give him a C.

"It's been an honest government," he said. "I think that in itself should be his legacy."

Former GOP Chairman John Graziano Sr. said that he also had heard rumors of Breslin stepping down and said he hopes he enjoys his retirement.

"My interactions with him have always been genuine," he said. "I wish him luck."

Breslin said he has no specific plans after finishing out his term in office. He said he would

still like to be involved in the community, but he's not sure in whether it would be in a public or private manner.

He did say, however, that he has not looked into possibly running for office in the state legislature.

"No, it's not something I've explored," he said. "I'm very much impressed with what Cuomo [Gov. Andrew Cuomo] has already done."


There would be multitude of advice Breslin said he could give the next county executive. But he would make sure to tell that person to continue the path he has paved.

"I think first and foremost that there are a lot of wonderful people working in county government that are doing a great job," he said. "They need to make sure we can continue to do that so we can serve people the best way possible."

Breslin said he thinks the residents of Albany County will remember the work the county government has done during his tenure and that they will ask of the next county executive to do the same.

"I think those people who are in county government recognize the difference in how it functions now," he said. "I'm confident they will retain that commitment to all those ideals. I think the public will demand it."

"We are excited to be able to progress the Rail Trail project with the help of the Town of Bethlehem and the MHLIC as we know many are eager to start using the trail," said County Executive Michael Breslin in a statement. "This collaborative effort will allow residents to begin enjoying part of the trail by the summer."

Once approved, the deal would see the Town of Bethlehem Highway Department clearing the stretch of trail for pedestrian use. This should be possible within the existing budget, said Supervisor Sam Messina.

"We're in really good shape, because it's not going to be a cost addition for us," he said. "We'll be able to take care of this with no strain on our staff."

This will still leave the trail in a relatively rustic condition, however. The MHLIC has agreed to begin raising funds to make additional improvements that would make mountain bike use possible, but it's unclear how soon that could happen. The town and conservancy would be responsible for trail maintenance.

This specific section of the trail was selected because it will require the least amount of work to get ready for public use.

The entire Rail Trail is nine miles, and was purchased by the county in January of last year. Since then, however, development has stalled because the county has been unable to secure

more grant funding. The goal has been to develop the trail without the use of taxpayer money.

The total cost of finishing the trail is pegged at about \$8 million. That would pave the entire length and pay for repairs to several bridges. A \$2.4 million in federal funding has been promised to the project, but only if it's completed all in one shot.

The Bethlehem Town Board will likely consider a resolution signing off on the agreement at its April 27 meeting. The Albany County Legislature's next meeting is on May 9.

Once the agreements are inked, the work can begin, Messina said.

of New York State Town Law to pass a retirement incentive resolution that had failed during a regularly scheduled meeting the week before. Another pointed out that a high-tech consortium's move

to New York may not be as good as it seems after some research into the millions of dollars it cost the state it was leaving. Another took aim at media coverage, itself, when *The Spotlight's* hometown of Delmar, made national news after a homeowner chased down and tackled a teenager after he and a group of friends trespassed on the

man's property, pounded on the man's door, rang his doorbell and ran away.

"It's an honor to be recognized by NYPA," said DeVoe, who writes the editorials for the various Spotlight papers around the Capital District. This is the second time DeVoe has won first place statewide for

editorial writing, and has also received NYPA awards for column writing and news coverage. "The award is a testament to the good work we do here at *The Spotlight* and our commitment to providing the best local news in the area."

"It's always great to win for editorial writing,"



# Poll: Some support, no consensus on consolidation

### Survey finds public has reservations on merging some services

A majority of New Yorkers are in favor of government consolidation, but when it comes to saying what that means and where it should be done there are divergent opinions.

So says a Marist College/Dyson Foundation study released Tuesday, April 12. The survey, titled "Striking a Balance: New Yorkers Speak Out on Rightsizing Local Government," polled 4,500 state residents by telephone, including about 500 in the Capital District. It was found 54 percent

of respondents outside of the city would favor consolidations in their own local government.

But an equally important discovery was how little of the public was aware of the issue. A whopping 86 percent of those polled said they had heard little or nothing about government consolidation. Also notably, about the same amount of respondents said consolidation means sharing services as those who said it constitutes merging governments.

"There are about as many ways to refer to consolidation as there is to restructure local government," said Lee Miringoff, director of the Marist College Institute of Public Opinion. "People don't have a clear position, a precise meaning of what it's all about. I think people find the multiplicity of governments to not make a lot of sense."

At the same time, most New Yorkers gave their own local governments passing grades and responded negatively to the concept of dissolving them. But a slight majority outside New York City think there are too many local governments, suggesting that while they see waste in government they are loathe to give up their own structures.

Robert Conway, Mayor of the Village of

Voorheesville, said that finding is along the lines of what he hears from his constituents every day.

"Most people like the sense of local control over government," he said. "Most people I think feel government at the very local level is very responsive."

When the issue of consolidation is raised, the idea of dissolving villages and other small municipalities into the larger towns they inhabit invariably follows. At the same time, there have been only a few places across the state where this has gained traction.

"I think what has happened is that the discourse on this in the general public has been part of political campaigns, and they have purposes behind them that are skewed towards a political outcome rather than one based on fact," said Village of Altamont Mayor James Gaughan.

Again, the debate turns to a matter of definition. Both of these mayors said their towns have responded to the recession by seeking efficiencies and shared services agreements with the towns they are a part of—Voorheesville with New Scotland and Altamont with Guelderland.

But they also defended the necessity of their

governments, even if it means residents might pay another level of taxes.

Gaughan said his village is about 5 percent of the population of Guilderland, and having an autonomous leadership means residents will have their needs addressed instead of swallowed up in the din at Town Hall. He also argued taxes would probably go up for the rest of the town's residents if Altamont were absorbed.

"Behind the green door is a lot of other issues that don't get talked about," he said.

Conway said the recession means there's a lot more outside the box thinking, but added there needs to be a concerted effort to make sure people understand what's being done.

"You're always going to deal with turf battles and that type of thing, but

I think overall, as long as the municipal leaders are going to be able to show there's a clear benefit to any consolidation, I think the public will support moving forward with it," he said.

Marist poll respondents showed varying levels of support for consolidation in different areas. Things like public transportation, road maintenance and parks and recreational programming are prime candidates for mergers, but the citizenry was more or less split on consolidations in fire and police services. These are the services citizens tend to say they value most, according to the poll's findings, and their ranking breaks down similarly among supporters and opponents of consolidation.

The public responded negatively to the concept of dissolving local governments altogether, and their attitudes were even more clear when it came to schools. Just 45 percent thought districts should be consolidated at all.

"They think there are too many local governments in the state, but they think there's the right amount of school districts," said Marist's Barbara Carvalho.

Robert Dyson, of the Dyson Foundation (the survey's backer), said homeowners will often feel there's a direct connection between the quality of the community and the school district that's not present with municipal services.

"It ties in with property values," he said.

School district taxes tends to be the largest portion of an upstate New York homeowner's tax bill.

Perhaps one of the more solid conclusions of the study was that there seems to be little outside connection between those advocating for change and those against it.

"Demography and party don't drive these answers," Miringoff said. "What drives this is position on local government."

# It's EASY being GREEN

Local organizations observe Earth Day in their own unique ways

**S**andy Steubing knows that there are more relaxing ways to spend retirement.

"I could be scuba diving in the Caribbean," she said with a laugh.

But Steubing's life course was altered when she visited a website that mentioned "peak oil."

Curious, she clicked on a link. She learned about studies and research that concluded the world's oil supply is going to run out soon. The peak oil theory maintains that we are extracting the maximum amount of oil from the earth that we can; if we don't reduce our dependency on oil, our economy will collapse in about 10 years.

The volume of research and studies supporting this overwhelmed Steubing. And so retirement turned not into a life of leisure, but one aimed at reducing the world's dependency on oil. It's a lofty goal, but Steubing believes small steps can add up to a big accomplishment. To that end, she's helped organize a lunchtime bike ride through Albany on Friday, April 22, in honor of Earth Day. It's one of several local events being held in conjunction with Earth Day.

Steubing hopes the bike ride will accomplish a few things. It will get people on their bikes instead of driving cars. Maybe they'll think about riding their bikes more often. Even better, maybe they'll think about other ways they can reduce their dependency on oil.

Maybe a few will even be moved to adopt the cause the way Steubing has.

Bicyclists will meet at 11:30 a.m. at the corner of Eagle Street and Pine Street, kitty corner from City Hall. There will be Earth Day flags for bikers to fly from their bikes, the better to draw attention to their mission. There will be a speaker, and then riders will set off on a roughly one-hour journey that ends in Washington Park.

This is the first year for the bike ride, which had drawn about 25 participants as of the weekend. Steubing hopes for more people to take part in future years, but she's encouraged by the numbers.

"Each one of these things makes a small impact," she said.

Growing and eating local food is another step that can pay off, she said. "Gardens are a great thing - anything that encourages relocalization so we're not transporting food from thousands of miles away."

park, and carry in not only traffic but infrastructure like sewer and electricity. It's a key component in getting the stalled Vista project moving, said Joe Nicolla of Columbia Development, who tonight said he has signed leases from four tenants that are contingent on the installation of the road.

He declined to identify those tenants, though several retail interests have been unveiled, including a ShopRite grocery store.

The problem, Nicolla said, is competition from other such developments in the area and a freeze in lending set off by the recession.

"There is no money to put in right now," Nicolla said.

That spawned the idea to have the IDA rustle up the bonds for the estimated \$7 million project. The tax-free notes should be more attractive to long-term investors, who Nicolla said would be the ones exposed should the project languish.

Bethlehem Supervisor Sam Messina was at the meeting, and said the decision was an important step for Vista.

"I have seen nothing more exciting for Bethlehem, including for the school district, than the Vista

Technology Campus, in the last 25 years," he said.

BC's agreement to hand over PILOT receipts would only extend to this bond issuance. Future PILOT agreements and tax receipts would flow to the county, town and school district normally.

A meeting similar to the one held Wednesday was conducted the following afternoon with Albany County Executive Michael Breslin. Messina said after that meeting that Breslin agreed to bring a resolution to the County Legislature at its next meeting on May 9.

It's possible there will be a discussion about the \$1 million the county promised in 2003 for Vista development at that meeting. Earlier this year, the county was noncommittal on the realization of that payout, saying the money was promised to promote high-tech jobs and none have been identified yet.

Nicolla said Vista Boulevard can be completed in about seven months once the funding structure is in place, and there are plans to build the first of Vista's buildings even as the road is being laid. For now, developers are waiting on decisions from the town and county on the PILOT plan.

"Once we get them, then we'll be in great shape," Nicolla said.

of the road with traffic, walkers should stick to the left; motorists should slow down when approaching bicyclists and make sure to pass with a minimum of a 3-foot distance; cars must yield to pedestrians in a crosswalk; and bicyclists and pedestrians should always make an effort to be visible to motorists.

But the most important rule is to simply remember to share the road and be conscious of one's surroundings. Though motorists can sometimes draw the ire of walkers and bike riders for hogging the road, it's everyone's responsibility to keep things safe and orderly out there.

That goes doubly for areas with high pedestrian traffic. The town's Highway Department recently installed pedestrian bollards in several major crosswalks in town, such as in front of Town Hall and outside the Delmar Post Office. These are to serve as reminders to motorists that they law requires traffic yield to pedestrians in crosswalks.

Bethlehem Police Deputy Chief Timothy Beebe said police officers will be keeping an eye out for motorists violating this law as well as others who are acting unsafely. Walking facing traffic is one rule he sought to emphasize.

"I see this on a daily basis, and people are busy, speeding, talking

on their cell phone, whatever," he said. "At least if you're facing traffic and a car is coming close to you, you may have an opportunity to jump out of the way."

Beebe also suggested bicyclists and pedestrians wear bright or reflective clothing, especially at night or in the twilight hours.

The PaTHs Committee has also spoken about getting the educational campaign into the schools. The warm weather

means more children will forsake the bus or a car for their commute.

"I'm just always amazed at the number of bikes that are ridden to the high school and the middle school by students," she said.

The cost of printing the palm cards will be assumed by the now-inactive Bethlehem Citizens for Pedestrian Safety group, which was also behind the "walk left, ride right" signs posted around town.

The hurdles aren't your standard, thin, easily-knocked over type of hurdles you see in the 100- and 400-meter events. These are long, thick wooden planks that are not easily cleared by a single bound. Many of the competitors I saw tackling the Lady Eagles Invitational steeplechase stepped on to the top of the hurdles before going over them. So in addition to having to pace themselves to cover 2,000 meters, they had to break their strides in order to deal with the obstacles.

Overall, the steeplechase seems to be suited for runners who embrace a challenge because it is the most difficult event in track and field. You have to admire any high school runner who completes the event, win or lose.

The University at Albany women's lacrosse team's chances of a perfect regular season improved significantly with last Saturday's 12-11 win at America East rival Boston University.

The Great Danes (12-0) showed grit in battling the defending league champion Terriers. Boston University led by two goals three times in the first half, but UAlbany kept coming back and took a 9-8 lead

late in the second half. The Terriers tied the game two more times before Arianna Parker scored on a free-position shot with 10.4 seconds left to put the Great Danes ahead for good.

The question for the No. 7-ranked Great Danes is can they avoid the upset bug down the stretch? They visit Metro Atlantic power Canisius (10-4) Thursday in a non-league game. If they get past the Golden Griffins, then they have to avoid a trap game against Binghamton Saturday before facing their closest America East competitor, UMBC, in the regular season finale April 30.

A loss in any of those three games would be disappointing, but by now it would not be a dagger in UAlbany's hopes for a NCAA Tournament bid. With their top-10 national ranking and four wins against teams that were ranked in the top 20 at the time of their meetings, the Great Danes have done enough to earn at least an at-large berth.

Still, you get the feeling that UAlbany isn't going to relinquish its role as one of the last remaining undefeated teams in the nation without a fight. That was certainly in evidence against Boston University.

Beware of the Ballston Spa boys lacrosse team this season.

The Scotties are 4-1 after the first two weeks of the Suburban Council season, with their lone loss coming against defending Section II Class A champion Shenendehowa. Ballston Spa's signature win thus far is last Saturday's 8-7 overtime victory over South Division power Guilderland, with Troy Gargiulo netting the winning goal in the extra period.

Gargiulo is in the middle of a breakout senior season for the Scotties. He has 14 goals and eight assists for 22 points, which ties him with Bethlehem's Liam Christiansen for second place among all Suburban Council players in scoring. Bethlehem's Jordan Scheid leads with way with 23 points.

Though the 14 goals are impressive, the eight assists are the more telling statistic for Gargiulo. He's getting his teammates involved in the offense — something he didn't do much last season.

• I don't get the opportunity to watch the steeplechase at track meets very often.

When I do, I wonder what drives these athletes to compete in an event that looks like a method of torturing humans.

The steeplechase combines a long distance running event - 2,000 meters for high school girls and 3,000 meters for high school boys - with jumping over hurdles, one of which is set up in front of a sizeable pit filled with water.
