Wemple Corners gains favor

Rezoning request will go to Planning Board for review

Members of the Bethlehem Town Board generally have positive things to say about a proposal to build a huge hamlet-style development in Glenmont.

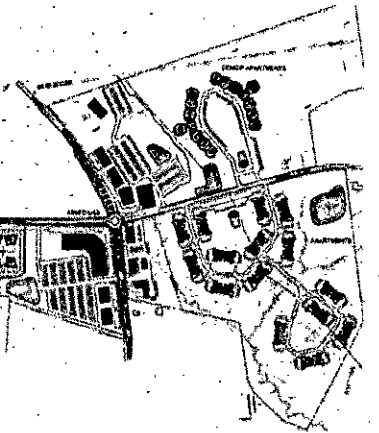
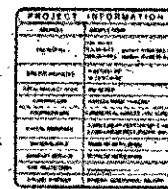
The Wemple Corners project came before the board for the first time Wednesday, May 27, to ask for a rezoning of the 95-acre property. The Town Board voted unanimously to forward this request along to the Planning Board for a recommendation, which is customary practice.

Donald Zee, local attorney for Milltowne Plaza Inc. of Massachusetts, laid out the scope of the development. Wemple Corners would be a "new urbanism"-style project, with a mix of townhomes, apartments, senior apartments, commercial and retail space. All said, Milltowne is seeking approval to erect up to 526 units of housing and build 145,000 square feet of offices and retail.

The vision is to have a mix of small stores, doctors offices and restaurants. Zee said a regional family restaurant chain has expressed interest, though he declined to name the business.

"We aren't talking about big box things,"

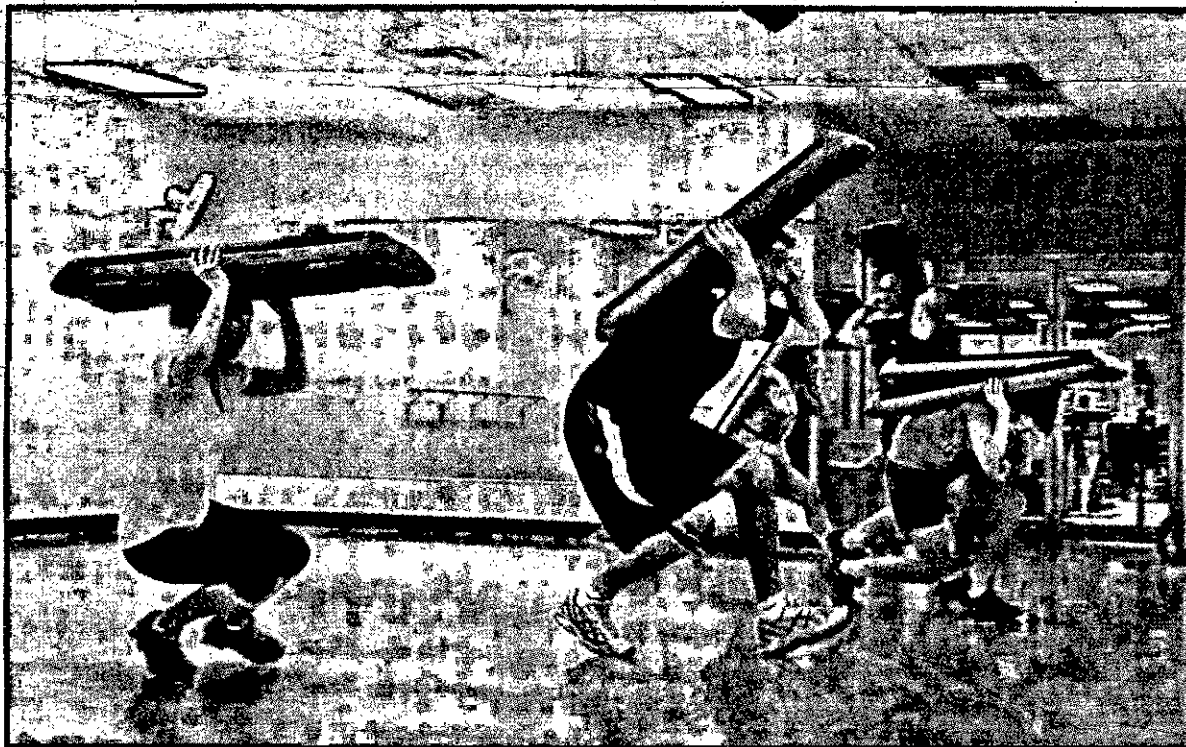

Longer term for town super?

Committee also
suggests making three
other elected positions
appointed

Should the length of the Town of Bethlehem supervisor's term be doubled?

That's the question officials and the public will be examining in the coming weeks and months. It's but one suggestion made in a 2020 Implementation Committee report that, if fully adopted, would greatly change the structure of town government.

In addition to lengthening the supervisor's term to four years, the committee is proposing moving elected department head positions (the highway superintendent, the tax receiver and the town clerk) to appointed offices. These changes would all require voter approval, and could be conceivably be placed on the 2011 ballot.

Town leaders recently decided the May 25 Town Board meeting should largely be set aside to begin a public dialogue on the changes.

"I think the public outreach side of this needs to begin as soon as possible," said Councilman Mark Hennessey at a Wednesday, April 27, Town Board meeting, when the report was presented.

Town Hall renovations OK'd

Months of debate reveal discontent with state of facilities

Interior renovations to Bethlehem Town Hall will at long last be going forward after first being brought up over a year ago.

About \$240,000 of work was approved in a split vote taken at Wednesday, April 27's Town Board meeting. The project will mainly involve shuffling some town staff to other areas in the building and modifying existing offices to give the staff in Human Resources and the Comptroller's Office more room. Some staffers are now sharing workspaces.

Included in that figure were renovations to the holding cells in the police department, a measure that passed unanimously. The money will come out of reserves.

The project has been modified greatly since it was first introduced, including the extraction of office equipment. The town will try to acquire some furnishings from the state Office of General Services.

There was some lamentation on Wednesday over the amount of money being put into Town Hall this year. Along with a repair of the courthouse roof and the parapet wall lining the roof (a portion of which fell and crushed several cars earlier this year) more than \$850,000 will go into the building.

Students on stage for two nights only

troupe to perform
'The Boardinghouse'**

If all the world's a stage, then the members of the BC Middle School's Staged Creations troupe are truly masters of their own universe.

This dedicated group has for weeks been preparing to perform "The Boardinghouse," a comedic mystery written by Vern Harden. And they've been working hard on every aspect of this production, as director and math teacher Diane Henderson-Suker tells it.

"The intent of Staged Creations is to have it be a student creation," said Henderson-Suker. "They kind of help each other to grow."

A big tenet of every Staged Creations show is that the students should take as much control as possible. At one after-school practice, Henderson-Suker placed herself in the back row, occasionally calling out a direction but mostly observing. Students armed with scripts patrolled the stage and took care of many directorial duties.

The cast and crew are also responsible for running the lights, making the set, designing the costumes and applying makeup. Everyone, from the lead role on down, gets their hands dirty at some point.

we almost create the play," said Siena Marcelle, an eighth grader who said she plans to come back to the Middle School next year to help out with the next production, like some other students who have graduated.

When the troupe members decided they'd like to do a mystery this year, Henderson-Suker cast a wide net to find something that wasn't too serious, and came up with "Boardinghouse," by Vern Harden, which has definite comedic elements.

That doesn't mean the audience won't have a good time following the mystery though. A cast of unusual boarders runs from a poet who practices dying as an inspiration for his work to a taxidermist who communicates with the spirit world, and they search the house for a treasure supposedly hidden in the basement.

and crew of 65. That's slightly smaller than with last year's production of "Dorothy Meets Alice," but a nice fit for this play, said Henderson-Suker.

Another nice part about "The Boardinghouse" is that there are no real leading roles. The main parts all get substantial play, which gives a good swath of the cast great exposure.

characters," he said. "It would be really cool to have a career as an actor, and I think this would be a big help."

"The Boardinghouse" will show on Friday, May 6, and Saturday, May 7, at 7 p.m. in the BC Middle School auditorium. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$4 for students and seniors. The play runs for about two hours, including one intermission. Tickets may be purchased at the door or by contacting Henderson-Suker at henddms@bcsd.net.org.

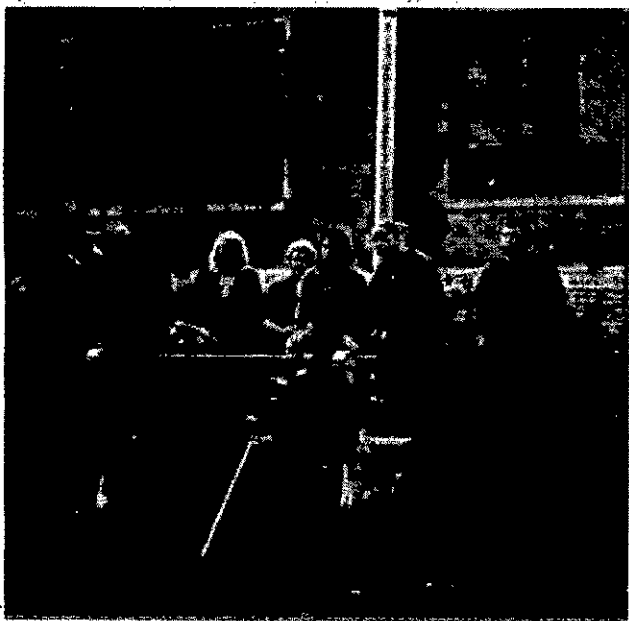

Bethlehem will open a portion of Rail Trail

The Town of Bethlehem has signed off on a plan that would see the Albany County Rail Trail partially opened up for use this summer.

The Bethlehem Town Board has granted unanimous approval to an agreement to help open a 1.9-mile stretch of the trail along with the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy. The Albany County Legislature still must take up the issue on May 9.

Use would be restricted to walkers and mountain bike use for now since the trail has not seen much in the way of improvements. The portion of trail to be opened would begin at Fireman's Park in Slingerlands and end at the Veteran's Park on Delaware Avenue in Delmar.

A contingent of about 50 volunteers organized by the MHLC recently walked the stretch to clear away brush.

would be a quality of life issue for the town. There are quite a few people who have wanted it for years," said MHLC Executive Director Jill Knapp at the Wednesday, April 27, meeting of the Town Board.

Indeed, there has been little progress made on the project since the county purchased the corridor in early 2010. It's been trying to secure grant funding ever since to finish the \$8 million project in one shot, which would result in cost savings. A lot of the cost will come from improving bridges along the route,

and the stretch of trail set to be opened was chosen in part because it has none.

It also features five points of entry for the public, several with parking nearby.

Before the vote, a few members of the public voiced concern about the town taking on an extra burden. Supervisor Sam Messina said the town would only be responsible for some mowing and placing signage at the trail's crossing with Adams Place. That could be done without adding to the budget or taking services away elsewhere, he said.

"I look at it as a management thing, to just manage your day's work a little bit better," he said. "I wouldn't advance this if there was going to be any out of pocket cost."

The MHLC would assume the burden of liability coverage.

Woman charged with DWI

The Bethlehem Police Department on Friday, April 22, at about 10:09 p.m., arrested Kathleen Ellen Bartow, 64, of 37 Daniel Street, Slingerlands, and charged her with DWI.

Police allegedly observed Bartow operating a 2009 Toyota RAV4 stopped in the pedestrian crosswalk at the intersection of Paddock Place and Delaware Avenue

(at the Four Corners). A police patrol parked at the McCarroll's parking lot observed Bartow sit through several cycles of the traffic light before continuing westbound on Delaware Avenue once another car had pulled up behind her, according to arrest reports.

Police said Bartow had the odor of alcohol on her breath and displayed other

signs of intoxication, and said she had two glasses of wine at an area bar. A roadside breathalyzer test came back positive for alcohol, police said. At the station, a breathalyzer test showed her BAC to be 0.08 percent, according to police.

Bartow was released on tickets to return to Bethlehem Town Court on May 17.

Pickup crashes into BC High

A pickup truck crashed into the Bethlehem Central High School Thursday night in what police say was a drunken driving incident.

Police arrested William Clifton VanHoesen, 36, of 2018 Tarrytown Road, Feura Bush, and charged him with felony DWI, speeding, moving from lane unsafely, not wearing his seat belt and leaving the scene of an accident.

Police said at about 10 p.m. VanHoesen drove his 2005 Chevrolet Silverado pickup over two curbs and two grassy sections

of lawn before striking a pillar near the school's main entrance. When police arrived he had fled the scene and the front door to the school was unlocked, leaving police to believe he might be inside. State Police were contacted and brought in K9s for a search.

During the search VanHoesen was located at the district's bus garage on Van Dyke Road and arrested, police said. He allegedly smelled of alcohol and had sustained injuries, so EMS was called and transported him to

Albany Medical Center. A field breathalyzer allegedly tested positive for alcohol, but VanHoesen would not submit to having his blood drawn, police said.

A BC spokesperson said the two curbs will have to be repaired and the district will press charges on VanHoesen. The pillar was not damaged and the main entrance was in use the next day.

The school was empty at the time of the crash but earlier in the evening had hosted an elementary music concert.

Hoping Peter Cottontail hops past my veggies

I'm having mixed feelings about wild bunnies.

In April I enjoyed glancing out the window and spotting the brown bunny hanging out in my yard. One Saturday afternoon my daughter and I spied the bunny out behind the kitchen. We scurried quickly around the perimeter of the downstairs windows following the bunny as it moved in a similar fashion around the outside of the house.

"Oh, look, it's chewing. That's so cute," I exclaimed, eyes trained on the animal nibbling lunch off our shrubbery. Suddenly the bunny was on the move. Maybe it heard me?

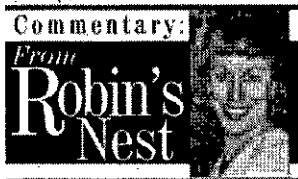
Usually when the bunnies in the yard get startled they hop off at lightning speed into the wooded area. But brown bunny had simply meandered over to the neighbor's yard where it sat down and began munching on grass. Rachel and I continued staring out the window.

My husband came downstairs. "We're watching a bunny," we told him.

And to think that my daughter was worried that we wouldn't do anything exciting over her spring break!

Why travel to Disney's Animal Kingdom when you can see deer, rabbits, squirrels, chipmunks and an assortment of birds from the comfort of your own home?

Although our backyard is sometimes a wild animal park these creatures are difficult to photograph or film. They seem to know



when I've left the window to go grab a camera. By the time I return they are usually gone.

But one day I was able to capture brown bunny...on video, that is. He (she?) was just hanging out in the neighbor's yard eating the grass. I ran for the digital recorder and zoomed in on the bunny. Now that I had the camera I was hoping for some hopping action. "Bunny in the distance eating grass" wasn't quite as interesting as "Bunny meandering in and out of bushes and showing off its bushy white tail."

Soon I grew tired of bunny watching. And then I grew suspicious. Who was this bunny and why did he feel so relaxed about hanging out in broad daylight in a wide-open space?

And then it hit me: This bunny could very well be on a reconnaissance mission. This bunny could be there to scope out our yet-to-be-planted garden. Sure our garden is out front and on the complete opposite side of the house from where I usually see the bunny, but that doesn't mean he's innocent. He probably waits until nightfall to venture out front and peak through the chicken wire.

I like to think of our vegetable garden as bunny-proof. And either it is bunny-proof or the bunnies didn't care for last year's sparse selection. The pepper plants appeared to be

eaten by bugs before they flowered, the zucchini plants flowered and mysteriously withered, and the frost hit before my late planting of peas and green beans had time to produce. There were a moderate number of cherry tomatoes, but maybe rabbits don't like tomatoes.

Last year, chiefly inspired by the James Kunstler novel "World made by hand," I decided I wanted to try growing vegetables. The book takes place "in the future" in a time where people still remember when they drove cars and used cell phones, but those things don't exist anymore because the raw materials and infrastructure no longer exist due to a war. The people live simply, without electricity and indoor plumbing. And as I read the book I realized that other than being rather proficient at improvising rhyming songs, I really didn't know how to do much of anything, at least not much in the category of basic survival skills. I was even a bit uncertain about how to light the gas grill.

My husband was happy to help with my garden project. He actually knows how to build things, whereas I can only envision them and write about it. Anyhow, I told him I envisioned keeping deer out of the garden. Over the years the deer have treated our property as a backyard buffet. I didn't want my garden to become their dessert table.

I selected what I believed to be the patch of

yard that gets the greatest sun exposure. This happened to be the spot where a perennial garden planted by the previous owners, but neglected by the current ones, had become overcrowded and non-blooming. Good gardeners know that bulbs and perennials need to be watered, fed, and occasionally dug up or "split." Other people know how to sit on a deck chair and read novels.

We began by digging up the area. I say "we" because I helped Jeff, sort of. He did most of the work, but his strength gave him an advantage. For example, with one foot he was able to pierce the earth with the spade and pull up a considerable amount of grass and old plant matter. I, however, had considerable trouble breaking ground even when I tried jumping on the spade like a pogo stick. I was good at sweating, though, and I might have done some complaining about the heat.

Next step was to prepare for the fence. I wanted to be a part of that too, seeing as how big a help I was with the excavation work.

"Do you think I could dig a post hole?" I asked Jeff.

"No." "How long does it take you?" I inquired.

"About 20 minutes and we only have one post-hole digger."

"Well what about if you start me off? You break ground for a hole and then I will remove the dirt one scoop at a time with a non-post-hole digger tool."

"No." "Well, what if I go inside the house?" "OK."

Once I went inside Jeff made tremendous progress and before long I had a beautiful fenced-in garden area. In fact, my fenced-in garden was so beautiful that I often found a bunny admiring the area. If I pulled into the driveway in my car this would often startle the bunny and he'd disappear. But sometimes the bunny would try the "I'm standing perfectly still so you can't see me" routine. Rachel refers to this as the "chocolate bunny pose" when the animal is displaying its profile.

The bunny that loitered by my garden was not the candy kind.

"I can see you, bunny" I told the creature as I walked toward him. Either my firm tone or my looming presence would lead the bunny to start moving away...but often this brazen bunny would only hop to the other side of the garden! Sometimes he scurried under a nearby bush.

"I know you're still here, bunny," I would shout, along with some stern warnings about staying away from my garden.

But those wild bunnies know they are just so darn adorable. They've probably heard me cooing over them from a distance. Besides, I'm pretty sure they are no danger to the garden. I'm pretty sure they can't get past the fence.

Wild chipmunks, however, are a whole other story.

Getting to the long and short of it

Two years isn't a very long time and it's certainly not enough time to implement and effect change in town governments – entities that aren't necessarily known for their efficiency to begin with.

The Town of Bethlehem's 2020 Implementation Committee has suggested changing the supervisor's term from two years to four, stating the shorter term is an "outdated practice" (see Charles Wiff's report on page one).

Now, we know what you're thinking: "A four-year term is too long for a bad supervisor and too short for a good one." And we recognize that should the constituents of Bethlehem pick a barker of a candidate to lead the town, they will be saddled with that individual for four long years. But we also realize that a longer term may cause voters to more thoroughly vet candidates – a process that, in turn, may draw a better pool of candidates.

Another benefit of a longer term is that, lacking the transient nature of a two-year term, more lasting and effective policy could be looked at and implemented. If we look at the City of Saratoga Springs, where the mayor has a two-year term, the very important issue of changing the city's form of government from a commission-style to a more traditional, mayoral/council-style one has been put on the back burner for years, largely in part because as soon as a mayor feels confident enough in their office to introduce such a hot-button issue, it's time to put together a re-election campaign – and who needs political baggage weighing them down on the campaign trail?

For those of our readers looking to play partisan with this recommendation, both sitting Town Supervisor Sam Messina and former Supervisor Jack Cunningham are proponents of the extension. The Town Board would have to hold a vote by Sept. 9 to place the referendum on this year's ballot for implementation in 2014, so it wouldn't benefit any candidate for this election cycle.

So think about it. Four years is an eternity in this age of instant information, communication and influence, but good leadership – just like good anything – takes time and is worth the investment.

Like we said, the town has until Sept. 9 to get it on this year's ballot for a referendum. They want your feedback on the issue. By our count, there are seven meetings between now and then, on the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month at Town Hall, just like they always are.

Stop by. Let them know what you think.

A colorful perennial winner

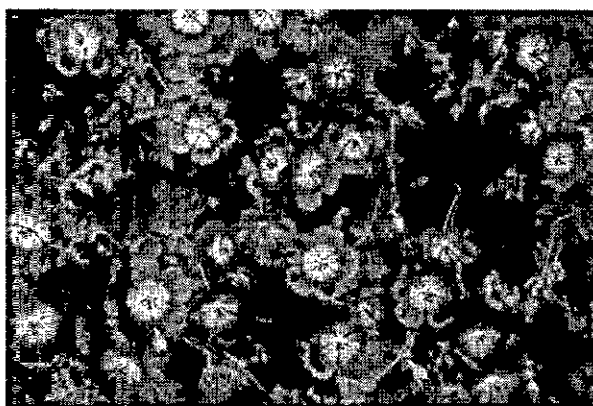
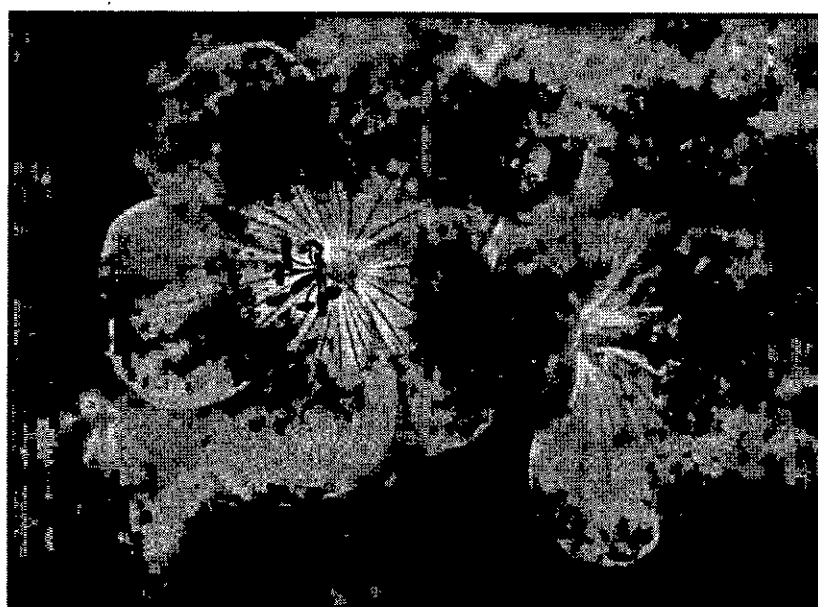

Each year since 1990, the Perennial Plant Association announces its pick for the perennial plant of the year, and for 2008 it was a cranesbill named "Rozanne." To be a perennial plant of the year, a plant must be suitable for a variety of climates, be easy to grow and maintain, and it must not be prone to insect or disease problems.

The PPA flyer announcing Rozanne describes the plant as having "large, jewel-tone, violet-blue flowers combined with deep green, lightly marbled foliage and an extended season of interest." The kudos continue with Rozanne as a "must-have" plant for any garden. And indeed it is, but what is especially interesting is that Rozanne is not new on the plant scene. It has been available in the trade since 2000. Many Capital District gardens have featured Rozanne the past few years, and its garden worthiness was evident from the start. So popular is this plant that it has a website, www.geraniumrozanne.com.

Discovered in Somerset, England, in 1989 by Donald and Rozanne Waterer, this geranium was a stand out in their garden. Rozanne is a hybrid cross between *Geranium himalayense* and *Geranium wallichianum*, Buxton's Variety. The cultivar Rozanne was introduced to the gardening world at the Chelsea Flower Show in 2000 by the Blooms of Bressingham team of the late Alan Bloom and his son, Adrian.

It was love at first sight for the gardening public, who is always in search of the perfect plant. Rozanne comes close with its alluring and persistent color and heat tolerance. Hardy in zones 5-8, Rozanne thrives in full sun to partial shade, preferring a moist, well-draining soil. A long season of bloom makes Rozanne a good

choice for a variety of uses in the garden including as a ground cover. Growing to 20 inches in height and 2-3 feet in spread, it is amply endowed without being pushy. Shearing the foliage back in late July to early August will promote new growth. Division is seldom needed, and Rozanne has no known enemies so it is an easy keep in the garden. The University of Georgia plant guru, Allan Armitage, calls Rozanne the "best geranium in our trial for bloom, vigor, foliage, health and overall attractiveness."

Most at home in the cottage garden, Rozanne begins blooming

in June along with *Leucanthemum*, *Snowcap*. Moving into summer it shines alongside *Salvia nemorosa*, *Rose Queen*, or *Pink Fresland* followed by *Veronica spicata*, *Tickled Pink*. Still going strong into late summer and autumn, Rozanne pairs well with the shorter grasses like *Pennisetum alopecuroides*, *Little Bunny* or *Little Honey*, as they come into their own time. It also plays well with daylilies, garden phlox and hostas of the blue-grey hue. Rozanne's high-energy habit make it a natural for front of the border prominence, a spiller in large patio pots, hanging baskets, or window boxes. It is a simple British charmer that has made a big splash across the pond.

Vista financing gets approval from town

Adviser says no taxpayer money, risk in bonding plan

The Vista Technology Campus has cleared another developmental hurdle with the Bethlehem Town Board's approval of a financing plan that is intended to make possible the construction of Vista Boulevard.

Along with the OK from the Bethlehem Central School District, Vista interests now only need to convince Albany County lawmakers to allow payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) structure to be put in place to back bonds issued through the Bethlehem Industrial Development Agency. The County Legislature will consider the proposal May 9.

As with the school board, the Town Board had extensive questions this evening. The IDA wants to handle the construction of the ¾-mile road, to be financed through tax-free bonds. Those bonds would be bought up by private investors and then paid off by a PILOT levied on

the landowner, passed on to tenants. In roundabout way, business owners will be paying for the road, but due to the nature of the agreement and state law the IDA must get all three taxing jurisdictions to sign off on the proposal.

It's not something you see every day, and this had Town Board members quizzing Joseph Scott, the IDA's bond counsel, on the details. Most wanted to make sure taxpayers would not end up losing out.

"You're not giving up anything, because it's not money that you would otherwise be entitled to," Scott said.

He went on to outline how the town, county and school district would still realize the taxes already collected on the land as well as any future taxes levied on the buildings erected at the Slingerlands development. This PILOT structure would be independent of those receipts and be targeted only at repaying the bonds.

"We do not use or affect the current money that's collected...and we're not going to use or affect in any way the money

generated by development of the site," he said.

If the plan gets the county's approval, the IDA would issue between \$6 and \$6.5 million worth of bonds, to be paid back over a 25-year term. These would be non-recourse bonds, meaning the IDA would not be held accountable should tenants default on their payments. Investors would only be able to go after a mortgage on the Vista property in a default scenario.

The IDA has been pursuing a financing plan for months now. Though there was a great deal of excitement about the tech

park plans, development has been stalled for years, thanks in no small part to the recession. Now that interest is picking up a lack of any infrastructure at the site is holding things back, said Columbia Development's Joe Nicolla, who related a now-familiar story about an interested business owner wondering if he'd have to helicopter his employees in.

Nicolla said he has leases secured from four tenants with plenty more interested in the site.

"Very soon we're going to have those people on the dotted line, as soon as we get going [on the road]," he said.

Those four tenants are for the retail component of the project, though, which Councilman Mark Hennessey cited as his key reason for casting tonight's only dissenting vote.

"Just even one [technology tenant] would give me enough lack of concern that I could support this," he said. "I promised the people in Slingerlands we would push forward with a technology campus, not a retail campus."

During the meeting, Nicolla disclosed that a tech company interested in a 100,000-square-foot building had decided to locate in Clifton Park because Vista would not be ready in time for its relocation.

Hennessey voted in favor of the financing structure as a member of the IDA board, but explained that while a win for the IDA this issue is different from the town's perspective.

Others, including Mike Tucker, president of the Center for Economic

Growth and former head of the IDA, said with high-tech businesses coming to the area, making sure Vista is ready is important.

"It's critical that this town have the ability to attract industrial and commercial development beyond retail development," he said during the meeting's public comment period. "In this economy, it's important the town is ready. Shovel ready."

Others in the audience panned not only the idea of having a public body involved in the project, but also criticized Vista's retail component. My Place owner Jim Giaccone said he knows many business owners in town who feel residential growth hasn't kept pace with retail expansion.

"It seems to be quite out of whack," he said. "The pie gets littler for every independent business."

Vista would be home to a CVS, SEFCU, Berkshire Bank and restaurants. The main retail tenant, though, would be a ShopRite grocery store.

Should I use online pharmacies?

Yes... some of these distributors are very reputable, however the FDA warns consumers to beware when buying online. One of the problems is that you cannot be sure that the products have been stored properly. Excessive heat, cold or humidity can inactivate some medications. Additionally, illegal online pharmacies may sell mislabeled, outdated or counterfeit products which may actually be harmful. For these reasons, ask your veterinarian if they would consider price matching reputable sites. Most veterinarians share our view that their own pharmacies are present for client convenience and will match prices to ensure the safety of your pets. If you do buy online, it is important to realize that the manufacturer of the medication will not honor the product's warranty. The FDA encourages consumers to look for red flags if they purchase medications online. Be cautious if the pharmacy does not require a veterinarian's signed prescription for a prescription drug. Always find out whether the site is licensed. Vet-VIPPS (Veterinary-Verified Internet Pharmacy Practice Sites) is a voluntary accreditation program which ensures that the pharmacy is appropriately licensed, has successfully completed a 19-point review and online survey and goes through a yearly review and re-accreditation. Identity theft is also a real concern online. Make sure that the company and your veterinarian do their part to protect your personal information by providing encrypted forms. Always look for the yellow lock symbol or https:// in the beginning of the web address which identifies it as a secure website. If you don't see these secure features, it is very risky to provide your personal information.

Talk with your veterinarian about online pharmacies and price matching. Ask if they have had a good experience with the online company you are looking into. Your veterinarian may consider price matching and free shipping to ensure that your pet's medications are effective and safe.

Building more than muscles

Bethlehem YMCA and high school officials team up for after school program

If you're a Bethlehem Central High School student and you're sent to see Assistant Principal Scott Landry, you should probably start worrying.

But not if you're in the I Can program. Landry, with the help of the Bethlehem YMCA, has been meeting with a small group of students after school, four days a week for about seven weeks. Last week, 10 of the 17 students who started the course completed it, and were rewarded with free one-year memberships to the Y.

Landry said he was pleased to see such great enthusiasm for the program, especially since these students aren't receiving school credit.

"This is more of a partnership with the school instead of a school program," he said.

As one might imagine, a lot of the I Can program focuses on physical fitness. On Wednesdays and Fridays, the students met in an aerobics studio at the YMCA branch and Landry led them through a intense, full-body workout. At a recent session, Bethlehem YMCA Executive Director Derek Martin sat in on a class.

"I took the class a couple of weeks ago and I was hurting," he said. "It's been absolutely fantastic having the kids come through the door because it has literally changed their lives."

The idea behind I Can is not just to improve students' self confidence through physical fitness, but to also foster connections with other students and improve language skills. Many of the students invited to the program are English as a second language students, hailing from countries like Yemen, Egypt, Ukraine and India, and on Tuesdays and Thursdays the group would convene to do some running and then work on reading and language comprehension skills as a group. Some shared stories about their native lands.

lived in Yemen until about six years ago, said the program has been challenging and rewarding.

"I loved it...they made you do more than you could, and then make you do something that you can't do," he said.

Even for those who are native speakers, I Can provided an opportunity to interact with others in a low pressure environment and make some new friends along the way, said freshman Courtney Trevett.

Budget process not over yet

There will be several opportunities for residents in the Bethlehem Central School District to speak up before they head to the polls on May 17 to vote on the budget.

The first will be a public hearing on the proposed 2011-12 school year budget to be held Wednesday, May 4, at 7 p.m. at the district's offices on Adams Place in Delmar. The hearing is required by law.

There will be a presentation on the budget and opportunity for public comment. The proposed budget was adopted unanimously by the Board of Education and weighs in at \$86.8 million, which is \$1.5 million less than the district is spending this school year. The tax levy would increase 2 percent under the plan.

In addition to Wednesday's required hearing, there will be a more in depth cyberforum devoted to the budget on May 11. The session will include opportunity for

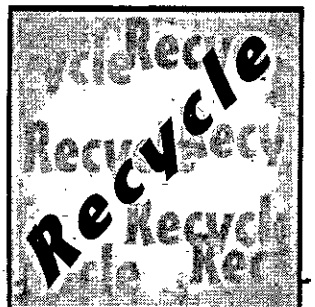
public comment and will be held in the Middle School auditorium at 7 p.m. Residents can also access the meeting via the Internet through the district's website, and will be able to submit questions and converse with one another in an online chatroom. The district has made cyberspace a component of several forums this year.

There are eight candidates running for three Board of Education seats, including incumbents Laura Ladd Bierman and Matthew Downey. School board President James Dering will not be seeking another three-year term.

The Albany County chapter of the League of Women Voters will be holding Meet the Candidates Night on

Friday, May 13, at 6:30 p.m. in the Middle School auditorium.

The budget vote will be held from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. in the Bethlehem Central High School gym. Voters must be residents of the school district for 30 days prior to the vote and do not have to be registered to vote. Absentee ballot applications must be received by May 10, or by May 16 if you plan to pick the ballot up in person. The ballots themselves must be received on or before the day of the vote.

Healing and humor

First-time author blends anecdotes and grief

Kim Perone and her family weren't dealt an easy deck. She lost her son in a car accident and five years later, her sister to a rare form of cancer. But instead of bowing out and succumbing to the grief, she drew on her mother's strength and attitude to spin the tragedies into something positive.

"I was talking about my mother and our relationship impacted me and how I was able to cope with loss," said Perone, of Burnt Hills. "I started to see a real story curve with some funny stories about us and how she approaches work, life,

divorce, marriage, death, everything."

Searching for an outlet for her emotions, Perone joined a writing group with the intention of writing a book about bereavement. After sharing short stories about her mother's funny antics, the scope of the project changed and she decided to meld humor and loss.

Her first book, "Vacuum Like No One is Watching" comes out Mother's Day weekend on Saturday, May 7.

"It really reflects a woman's life because of laughter and tears," said Perone. "When some of the tears are heartbreaking, you realize how important laughter is and how it's elevated in your life because it's a key part of resilience."

Perone considers positivity to be a key part

of a person's mental well being, especially in light of hardships like losing a loved one. Going through the grief process with her mother, she learned that humor helps make even the most devastating situation a little more bearable.

"You realize how important it is to laugh. Sometimes for all the pain in life, laughter becomes even more important," said Perone.

She didn't immediately turn to writing as therapy. It wasn't until her sister passed and she resigned from her job to spend more time in Connecticut with her nephew (who was only four months old when his mother died) did she realize it was time to write.

"I started to transcribe old journals. Things started to come to me. My

mother's a funny person, so some of the antics for the stories made me think of other ones and that's where the concept for the book came from," said Perone. "Instead

of individual stories or vignettes, it started to look like the chapters of a book."

Her mother is "vibrant" with a no-holds barred attitude. That combination

makes for some surprising stories, said Perone.

For example, one of the very first experiences Perone turned into a chapter for the book

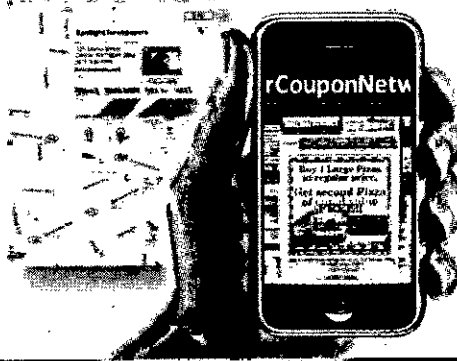

occurred on a drive home from Connecticut after her sister's chemotherapy treatment.

"We were driving back and [my mom] said to me, 'I forgot to tell you something,'" said Perone.

She cringed, because after all, how much more bad news could one family take?

"She told me that she'd told my sister she could have my eggs," said Perone.

At first, Perone was confused by the random and somewhat odd statement. Then she realized what her mother meant and she burst out laughing.

"At a doctor's appointment with my sister they told her chemo might destroy her eggs. She'd just had a baby so going from having a baby to being diagnosed with

cancer to maybe you won't have any more children," said Perone. "Part of my mother's personality was to be practical and focus on the big issue and that was fighting the cancer, so she told my sister 'Don't worry about the eggs, you can have your sister's eggs.'"

"Vacuum Like No One is Watching" tells similar stories about Perone's mother's reaction to situation and life.

"It's very funny in some parts and poignant in others," said Perone. "I found the more I wrote about her reactions, I realized how deeply it helped to form the way I deal and cope with problems or issues or

life." Writing the book was a special process for her, said Perone, and helped her put things in perspective.

"It was a great process for me. I really enjoyed it as much as I hope my readers do," said Perone. "I thoroughly enjoyed that, especially at a time after I dealt with loss, it was much more of a positive reflection time. I writing it and I dealt with letting go. It was very therapeutic."

Before she had a coping book to offer, Perone said it hasn't been unusual for people to ask her opinion about grief and loss.

"I was letting people know they'll survive it," said Perone. "This gave me the next level of helping people."

She wants people to appreciate where the book came from, but more than anything, Perone said she hopes it helps people feel less alone and open up about death, which can be taboo.

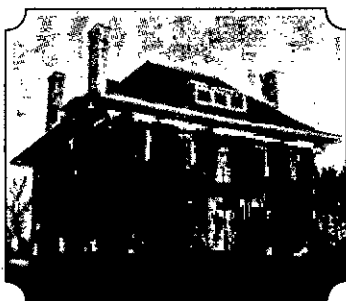

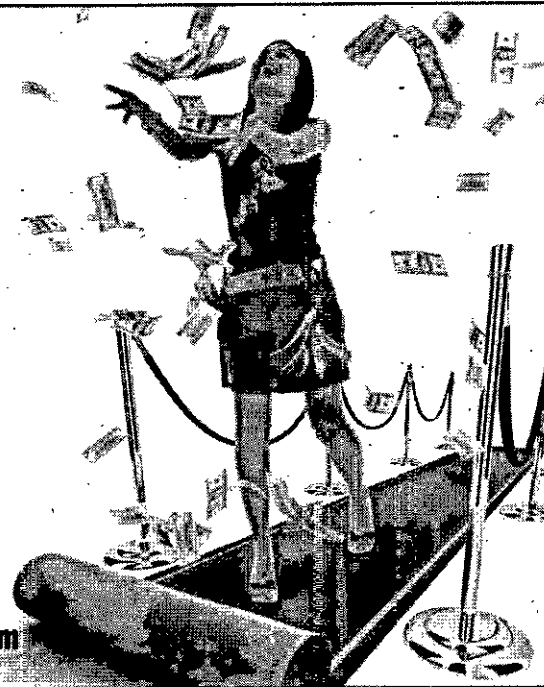

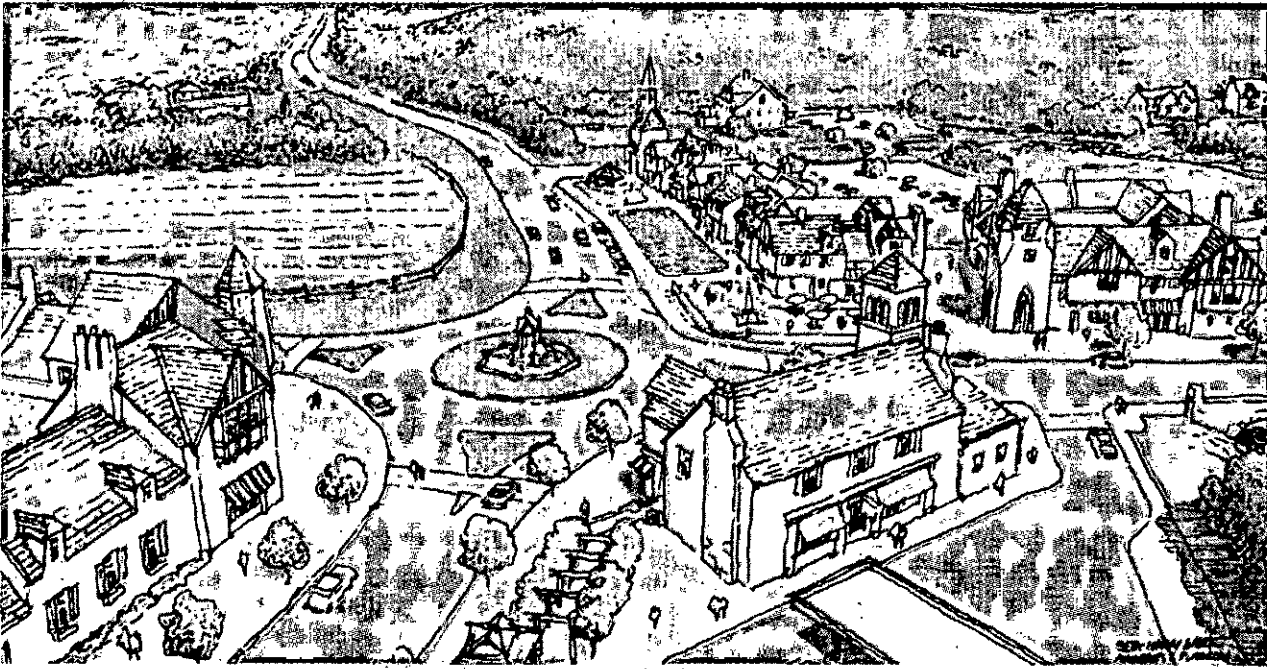
but more like mom and pop stores," he said.

It's been over a year since conceptual plans first came before the town, and since then much has been done, including a traffic study. The applicant is suggesting a roundabout be built at the intersection of 9W and Wemple and that sidewalks be installed in the area. Milltowne would cover that \$3.1 million cost if approval is granted.

Zee said the developer has also been in talks with the Bethlehem Soccer Club, which owns fields just down Wemple Road. Milltowne would aim to build extra capacity into its sewer and water lines for a possible extension to the soccerplex, where the club is planning to build an indoor facility.

The land is currently zoned mixed economic development, which would actually allow many of the uses in the plan. Building senior housing would require the change to commercial hamlet. The town's Comprehensive Plan does identify this location as a good place for a hamlet development.

The apartments would likely be priced at \$900 to \$1,200 per month, and

the senior apartment rent would be market driven.

Indeed, there has been a great deal of study as to what the future of this area might be, including the town's Route 9W Corridor Study. Councilman Mark Hennessey commended the developer for taking this document into consideration.

"I usually have a very tough time supporting a proposal like this," Hennessey said, "but it seems to me you've done a lot of the thinking about the direction we want to take this community in."

There was some talk about the size of the hamlet.

Zee said the developer wants to seek approval for the 526 units but could conceivably build fewer.

If approved, Wemple Corners would be the largest hamlet project to be seen in Bethlehem, and one of the biggest in the area. There are comparisons to be drawn to Glassworks Village in Gunderland. That development of 300 living units and 190,000 square feet of commercial space has been given the stamp of approval by the town, but shovels have yet to hit the dirt.

Not too far from the Wemple Corners site is a

hamlet-style project that is under construction. Kendall Square got the go-ahead from the town last year and structures are making their way up

now. This development is to be much smaller than the Glenmont project, with 110 housing units and up to 40,000 square feet of commercial space.

Kendall Square received some considerable criticism from neighbors of the property, who feared it would snarl traffic and change the area's character. The Town Board directed Milltowne to reach out to neighbors to let them know about the rezoning process.

Even if the zoning change is approved the plans would have to be reviewed by the Planning Board. Zee said he'd like to see construction start in 18 months assuming the approval process goes well.

Councilman Kyle Kotary noted this is just the beginning of the process.

"This is simply about a change in zoning. We're going to have opportunities to have narrow as well as broad discussions on how to develop this area of town," he said.

Sweeten the pot

Festival features dozens of ceramic artists in one place

Back when she lived in a Boston apartment, Mary Lafleur had lots of plants, but no pots to hang them in.

So, Lafleur took up pottery. And for three years, she turned out flowerpot after flowerpot.

Finally, her teacher took her aside. Um, the teacher said, had Lafleur ever thought about making something other than pots?

She laughs telling the story. "Not really," she said.

But the teacher encouraged her to try something else, so Lafleur made a coffee cup for her dad.

"He had to use two hands to life it," she said.

Other (better) pieces followed, and today Lafleur runs Pinewoods Potters, where she makes all kinds of pottery, some of which will be on display and for sale at Pottery Fest 2011. Set for Saturday and Sunday, May 7 and 8, at the Shaker Site near Albany International Airport, the festival will feature more

than 40 ceramic and sculptural artists.

Like Lafleur, the participating potters belong to the Collar City Clay Guild. Based in Troy, the guild hosts monthly meetings with speakers, workshops and lectures. One thing members don't often do is bring in pieces in progress, which is one of the reasons Lafleur gets a kick out of the pottery fest.

"It's so much fun to walk around and say, 'Oh my golly, I didn't know you were doing such great work,'" she said.

Lafleur's own work is still chiefly functional, although she does do some pieces that tend more toward the artistic. She loves working with clay, adding stamps and textures to create one-of-a-kind pieces.

"It's mine," she said. "Your uniqueness comes out."

Lee Glasheen squeezed in an interview about her pottery during a "marathon glazing session" for pieces she's working on for the festival. Glasheen made some pieces earlier in her life, but working a full-time job and raising a family left her with little time to pursue pottery. So, she put her pottery wheel away, thinking that maybe she'd sell it.

Her daughter, however, urged her not to.

"I didn't, and I'm grateful," Glasheen said.

Today, Glasheen runs Spring Avenue Pottery. As an art teacher, Glasheen has worked in all kinds of mediums, but pottery holds a special appeal to her. Like Lafleur, she likes creating something unique.

"I like to change things," she said. "I don't like to make the same thing over and over."

It's a funny thing – when she sits down with clay, ideas just come to her. She'll be making one thing and suddenly envision another.

The pottery festival is a chance not only to sell some of her wares, but to share them.

"People ask questions, and I don't know anyone who doesn't like to talk about what they do," she said. "It's sharing what you love and what you love to do."

Donald Glennon's love of pottery led him to open a shop and studio downstairs from his childhood home in Schenectady. Glennon moved back to the home when his dad got sick, helping his mom care for him. Today, he lives upstairs and works downstairs at Dragonfly Pottery.

After seeing a local woman's pottery, Glennon's interest was sparked and he took some classes at Skidmore College. Classes at Hudson Valley Community College followed, and then some at Northeast Ceramics.

Today, Glennon teaches his own classes, gathering potters around a table

in the back of his shop. Some of the resulting pieces join his on shelves out front for customers to peruse.

Pottery is fun and relaxing as well as rewarding.

"It's just that I'm creating something from the earth," Glennon said. "It's a forever-changing thing for me."

Glennon is so intent on creating new things that he frequently tries different glazes. On a recent trip to the supply store, he raised eyebrows when he bought several glazes.

"I need to find myself," Glennon joked. "I just can't be satisfied."

Glennon was part of the guild when it started with about eight people. It's grown to 45, and the pottery fest is one of its two main events each year. The other is a soup fest in Troy for which members make bowls. Attendees pay an admission fee, then get to pick a bowl and fill it with soup from participating restaurants. At the end of the day, people get to take their bowls home.

The pottery festival, meanwhile, is a bit of a spin on the idea of a pottery trail, in which people stop at pottery shops throughout an area. The festival features all the potters in one place – although the Shaker site is big enough that they'll be somewhat spread out, with potters inside and outside.

The festival runs from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. Admission is \$5, with kids younger than 12 admitted free. A dollar from each admission will benefit local food pantries.

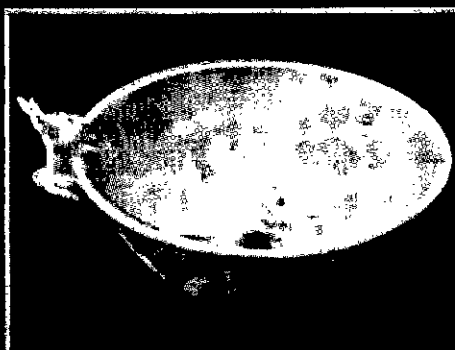

"That's my whole problem with this building. We keep sinking money into it year after year, hundreds of thousands of dollars, and it still doesn't do what we need it to," said Councilman Mark Jordan, who along with Councilwoman Joann Dawson voted against a portion of the renovations.

Town officials have long been aware of this dilemma. A 2006 report concluded the town

would do well to build an entirely new Town Hall, or at least spin off the police department and courts into another building. Even that would be expensive, though.

"The construction costs for the building was \$11 million, and that doesn't even include land space," Supervisor Sam Messina said. "I just don't know in this day and age how we can come up with the money."

Though there was no clear consensus on a long-term solution, the universal sentiment was

the current situation is unacceptable. Councilman Mark Hennessey said he'd toured the areas affected by the proposal and thinks a "radical realignment" is needed at Town Hall.

"It looks more like something out of the 1940s, or '50s or '60s," he said of the town's office space.

Dawson suggested the town look at spinning off departments into existing space outside of Town Hall, mentioning how Parks and Recreation is headquartered at the Elm Avenue Park.

In addition to

shuffling staff, there will be public transaction windows installed at the Department of Public Works and Building Department, a la the window at the Town Clerk's office. A conference room will also have a movable partition installed to make the space more flexible, since the Youth Bureau will be moving to an existing conference space.

"While it is a band aid solution, we need to put band aids on it. We can't just bleed out," said Councilman Kyle Kotary.

If the measures are put forward in July, the vote wouldn't affect the next set of terms, meaning the next supervisor would still sit for two years. If approved, it would become a four-year position in 2014. The proposals would all be voted on separately.

These recommendations are the result of a great deal of study by the 2020 Committee's Modernization Subcommittee, said the group's John Clarkson.

"It's not about any current town officers... it merely reflects what we think and what state reports show are outdated practices," he said.

Clarkson said conversations with four current and former town supervisors have returned at least tacit support for lengthening the term of office, mostly because it can be tough to advance large initiatives in a two-year timespan. But broaching the subject

is potentially a political albatross, since whoever brings the measure forward could be seen as simply trying to extend his or her time at Town Hall.

That's a reason why former supervisor Jack Cunningham never brought it up, he said in a 2009 exit interview with The Spotlight.

"I feel the town would be better served by allowing the supervisor to serve a term longer than two years," Cunningham said at the time.

Supervisor Sam Messina echoed those thoughts today.

"That in my opinion is why it hasn't been brought up in the past," he said. "I think Jack was correct in that observation."

Messina added he's been a supporter of extending the supervisor's term since he was a Town Board member. He said what makes this proposal work is that it's coming from the 2020 committee and that it sets its target on target 2014, not the next term in office. He also

acknowledged there is still political risk.

"We've got to be able to risk to make improvement," Messina said.

Messina is running for a second term, but no challengers have emerged yet.

As for making the three other positions appointed rather than elected, Clarkson said there could be some opportunities for efficiencies there, especially since interdepartmental consolidation would be easier without these different tiers of department heads. Quantifying those savings is something the committee will have to work on.

It remains to be seen if that argument will persuade voters to give up an element of control in their town government.

"I think in many cases the residents of the Town of Bethlehem are very happy with the way things are run, and they may have an attitude of if it's not broken, it does not need to be fixed," said Councilwoman Joann Dawson.

The Town Board would have to hold a vote by Sept. 9 to place the referendum on this year's ballot.





Strategy on the slopes

Saratoga high schoolers take part in national competition for Skiercross

There are skiers, racing skiers, and then there are Skiercrossers.

"I like going fast and going over the jumps and stuff. It's a freedom involved that there's different lines you can take and everybody will take the course different," said Peter Palumbo.

Palumbo is a sophomore at Saratoga Springs High School and from April 9 to 12, he spent his days on a Colorado mountain competing in the USASA Ski Nationals.

"It was fun and fun to meet new people and in Colorado, the mountains are so different that it was really fun to have a bit more challenging skiing and the snow was better," said Palumbo.

Palumbo competed in the Skiercross event as a member of the high school's Alpine Ski Team, traveling with junior Joshua Nixon. Skiercross is

similar to downhill ski racing except with obstacles built into the course and multiple skiers simultaneously navigating the route.

"There's usually four or six people on the course and it will range in distance but there's usually gates and rollers and jumps and stuff in the middle and obstacles that you have to figure out how to take and get by and a lot of turns," said Palumbo.

Finding a strategy to master the course—whether that's jumping over bumps or absorbing them—isn't the hardest part of Skiercross.

"The biggest obstacle is the other people on the course," said Palumbo. "It's accident prone and you really have to know how to handle yourself and get around people and make sure that you don't hook skis and crash."

The event might seem more hardcore than regular ski racing, but Palumbo said it's actually a little friendlier of a sport.

"Racing is a little more competitive ... but in Skiercross everybody is on the course at the same time and you have to be friendlier to make sure nobody's

really out to get you and take you out when you're on the course," said Palumbo. "You have to think of what the other people are doing and where they're going so you don't cross paths and crash."

Palumbo took home the Silver medal in the Skiercross 13 to 15 age group. He also competed in the slopestyle competition. He said he didn't expect to do as well as he did.

"Last year I went and I ended up eighth so I was hoping that I could do better this year," said Palumbo. "I wasn't really expecting it but was definitely hoping to."

To succeed in Skiercross, it takes a fearless attitude and a lot of hard work.

"Hard work and doing it a lot

gets you prepared. You have to not be afraid of going fast and going over all these things," said Palumbo. "It was easy for me since I was a ski racer before because when you ski race you don't have the fear of going really fast ... it's really just getting over all the other people on the course and getting over the fear of crashing into them and stuff."

Palumbo has been hitting the slopes with his family since he was 3 years old, racing since he was 6 and competing in Skiercross for two years.

"I like everything about skiing ... it's just great," said Palumbo.

Palumbo had the second best time out of 46 competitors in the qualifying trials, which are used to determine lane assignments for the afternoon heats and finals.

Palumbo finished in the top three for each heat, advancing him to the finals where he finished second.

His counterpart, Nixon, competed in the 16 to 18 age group and recorded the fastest time of the day in qualifying runs. He suffered a surprise mishap during his first heat when another competitor attempting to pass him, clipped the rear of his skis.

"It is just the nature of the sport, anything can happen at any time," said Nixon.

The USASA has held events locally at Gore Mountain and the Ski Nationals were held at Copper Mountain in Colorado. Palumbo and Nixon represented the Adirondack Region team at the competition.
