The line of duty

For nearly a year, officer Patrick Strollo has taken his partner George out on the beat with him. They've found emotionally disturbed people, criminals and narcotics together. Yet every day he's in the field, Strollo is a little nervous, because George isn't as well protected as he is.

Highway hopefuls meet

All four candidates vying for the position of highway superintendent in the Town of Bethlehem believe it would be inappropriate to make budget cuts to the department at its current staffing level.

The candidates met at a forum held at Bethlehem Town Hall on the night of Thursday, Aug. 22. The event was sponsored by Spotlight News, the Albany County League of Women Voters and the Capital Area Council of Churches.

Both the Bethlehem Democratic Committee and the Albany County Independence Party have endorsed Democrat and City of Albany Director of Recycling Frank Zeoli. Resident Brent

More than a handshake with new agreement

Towns of Bethlehem and New Scotland enter into a formal shared services contract

Bethlehem and New Scotland have been sharing services for years, but both towns just recently approved a formal contract after operating on nothing more than a handshake agreement.

The Bethlehem and New Scotland town boards both approved a shared service agreement on Wednesday, Aug. 14, that solidified an informal agreement between the

towns. The contract covers the borrowing of highway machinery and equipment, with or without operators, and the maintenance of such items.

"There has been a long history of Bethlehem and New Scotland working together with the highways for paving and other highway related projects," New Scotland Town Attorney Michael Naughton said at the Town Board's July 17 meeting.

Under the contract, each municipality is responsible for its own employees. The end result will likely be each town will operate its own machines with its own workers, since liability would fall to the operating town. Neither town would be paid for services

provided.

Hypothetically, if a New Scotland employee was operating one of Bethlehem's machines and it was damaged or needed to be repaired, then New Scotland would be responsible. If a dispute over any repairs, maintenance or services could not be resolved between the towns, then the contract allows for mediation or arbitration.

New Scotland Highway Superintendent Ken Guyer said typically, the lending town used its own employee to operate the equipment.

Guyer said New Scotland's biggest need

Garden Bistro opens doors in Vista

Second location for young restaurateur to place more focus on lunch

The first eatery in Slingerlands' Vista Technology Campus is open for business.

Chef and co-owner John Grizzaffi welcomed his first customers on Monday, Aug. 26, to the region's second Garden Bistro 24 location. An official ribbon cutting is expected in mid-September.

"We want to replicate the exact same feel we have over in Colonie," said Grizzaffi. "We want a casual feel, where you can be home mowing the lawn and if you don't want to cook that night, you can come here. Come in jeans, come in sandals and get a great meal."

After graduating from the Culinary Institute of America after high school, Grizzaffi, 27, opened the first Garden Bistro 24

location in Colonie three years ago. The cuisine is of French influence and the menu selections change with the seasons depending on what local ingredients are available.

Grizzaffi opted to open the second Garden Bistro location in Slingerlands because he and his wife live in Delmar. He co-owns the restaurant with his father, Charles.

Fresh, local ingredients are the keys to Grizzaffi's success. His kitchen is free of both microwave and freezer. In addition, his menu changes with the seasons to allow use of the best produce available.

Grizzaffi has said in the past the Slingerlands location would have a larger focus placed on its lunch menu. He is hoping to attract people who work in the area, and those who may work within Vista itself as the campus grows. Many lunch options are priced at less than \$10 and are made easy to transport

in case customers want to bring their food back to work.

"We don't deliver in Colonie, but we'd like to offer some type of service where we deliver to local offices. We really see an opening in the market to do that," said Grizzaffi.

The second Garden Bistro location takes

up half of the building at 5 Vista Blvd. A Verizon Wireless store is expected to fill the other 3,000 square feet. The restaurant employs around 25 people and seats 125, with additional seating located on the outdoor patio.

Construction on the building began in April and finished toward the end of August. Grizzaffi and his crew then spent the next several weeks getting the restaurant open for customers.

Grizzaffi said the restaurant is open seven

days a week, and brunch will be available very soon.

"We just really enjoy this community," said Grizzaffi. "They've been good to us and we want to return the favor."

Skin-care sweetens up

Delmar native puts made-at-home Skin Candi line into Wal-Mart contest

Two Albany entrepreneurs are hoping to win a Wal-Mart competition that would see their skin-care line on shelves all over the country.

Delmar native Jaclyn Livingston and her boyfriend, Shannon O'Brien, are competing in Wal-Mart's "Get on the Shelf" campaign with their all-natural skin-care line, Skin Candi. The products were created last year to help alleviate skin problems within their own family.

"Our baby had eczema and we were using the most expensive products to treat it," said O'Brien. "I started doing research into finding a more holistic approach, and it worked."

Livingston and O'Brien said they were unhappy with the chemicals found in the prescriptions they were given for their toddler. They began doing research on their own into

organic ingredients found in nature known to relive the symptoms of ailments like eczema, psoriasis and blotchy skin. Through trial and error, the couple came up with several lotions that they tested on their family.

The couple then took what they started at home and turned it into a product for the public. Through their website, Skin Candi offers three facial scrubs called Face Candi, Face Candi + and Face Candi Venom.

The couple said all of the scrubs are honey-based and are infused with antioxidants and essential oils. Face Candi + uses Manuka honey, which is alleged to be one of the few, if only, topical solutions to treat the MRSA virus, said O'Brien. Face Candi Venom also contains a small amount of bee venom to create what Livingston

called an "instant face-lift." "We're not experts, by any means," said Livingston. "But we wanted to create a skin-care product we felt was safe and pure."

O'Brien said they found all of their ingredients either at the grocery store or through local specialty stores. The couple said their products are even safe to eat, and taste "yummy," hence the name. But they wouldn't suggest customers ingest them, all the same.

Livingston said their goal was to put nothing in their products deemed too "scary" or "confusing." They wanted to know what they were putting into their bodies, and wanted those ingredients to be transparent for their customers.

Skin Candi has already made it through Wal-Mart's first round of judging, which ended

in July. The couple was next asked to create a video to be placed on Wal-Mart's "Get on the Shelf" webpage. The public is now being asked to vote for their favorite products, and those with the most votes will make it to the next round.

Finalists will then have their stories featured in an original web series produced by Wal-Mart. Another round of voting will then take place. Those winners will have their products made available through Walmart.com, and the "grand champion" will receive marketing support.

"For us, this is a huge opportunity," said Livingston. "We just began selling our products online, so the exposure alone is great. We could be reaching millions of people."

The couple is still making their project at

home in their own kitchen. Batches are made fresh, based on the size of orders. The tops of the glass jars are then hand-dipped into a wax seal that works to preserve the product.

"We can truly say each batch is made with love," said Livingston. "We hope we can keep doing that forever, but that may get harder as the brand grows."

Eventually, Livingston said she would like to grow the line and offer lotions and body scrubs, which are already being used by the

couple's family and friends. Skin Candi also stands behind their products, and offers a 100 percent money-back guarantee if customers are unsatisfied for any reason.

"We're just waiting to see where this all leads," said Livingston.

Police ID Slingerlands bank robbery suspect

Bethlehem police believe they know who robbed the Trustco Bank in Slingerlands Wednesday, Aug. 21, and as of press time were searching for him.

Police said Victor A. Shear, 45, entered the bank at 1569 New Scotland Road bank at about 9:15 a.m., displayed a handgun and demanded money. He made off with an undisclosed amount of cash.

Shear is now wanted for robbery in the first degree. Police said he should be considered armed and dangerous and should not be approached. His whereabouts are unknown, but anyone with information regarding Shear should contact Bethlehem police at 439-9973.

Shear allegedly appeared at the bank wearing a long-sleeve red flannel shirt, green colored "Docker style cargo pants, a yellow and orange reflective safety vest" and an orange construction hat. Police said he fled on foot towards

him with felony robbery in the third degree and harassment for allegedly robbing a customer at the Hannaford bottle return earlier in the night. Police said they received a call from the victim, who claimed Rosander confronted him about being a sexual offender. The victim then said he was pushed and had his iPod and cell phone stolen, and then was slapped. The victim said he pursued Rosander to the Hess gas station, where he was given back his stolen property. The victim then requested to press charges and wanted an order of protection. Police interviewed Rosander at his residence and he allegedly admitted to the slapping, but denied he stole property. Rosander was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to Albany County jail in lieu of \$5,000 cash bail or \$7,500 bail bond. He was scheduled to return to court at a later date.

• Bethlehem police arrested James Gibson Jr., 25, of 2188 Tarrytown Road in Clarksville at approximately 2:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 7, and charged him with misdemeanor driving while intoxicated and misdemeanor aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle. Ryder was charged with two charges of assault in the second degree, felony criminal mischief and multiple counts of petit larceny.

He was arraigned in the Town of Coeymans Court and remanded to Albany County jail without bail.

New Scotland hires DPW boss

Town adds position to ease workload, post will be part time to start

The Town of New Scotland has hired a retired Bethlehem police officer to the newly created position of Public Works commissioner to address a mounting workload in the DPW office.

The Town Board on Wednesday, Aug. 14, approved hiring Wayne LaChappelle as commissioner of public works, a part-time position totaling 20 hours a week at the rate of \$25 per hour. LaChappelle, who serves on the town's Zoning Board of Appeals, will start his new job on Monday, Aug. 26. LaChappelle retired from the Bethlehem Police Department in January of 2003 on disability after contracting Lyme disease while training his canine partner, according to Bethlehem Town Board minutes.

LaChappelle, a 57-year-old Feura Bush resident, was selected from a pool of candidates that was narrowed down to three finalists. The other two candidates had more of a "professional" background while LaChappelle had a more "hands on" background, which appealed to the majority of board members.

"I was humbled," LaChappelle said. "I was very, very appreciate of being trusted into a position like that and hopefully I will live up to the expectations of the Town Board and the town residents."

Councilman Daniel Mackay was the only member to vote

against LaChappelle's appointment. Mackay said he preferred one of the two other finalists because he believed that applicant offered a "greater chance for program development" and "launching" a new department.

Town Supervisor Tom Dolin said the position would be "heavier on the water and sewer" hands-on duties. Dolin said he is hopeful the position can be expanded over time.

"I am happy we are doing something to solve this problem," Dolin said.

He also said some candidates could be hired as consultants to handle parts of the job he does not feel there will be "enough time to handle."

Councilwoman Patricia Snyder said the town saw a "nice selection" of candidates.

"Each one of them brought some unique qualifications to the position and I think it made it a difficult choice until we resolved in which direction we wanted to go with this position," Snyder said. "We are moving in the direction of the more hands-on person to hit the ground running here."

After former Superintendent of Highways Darrell Duncan retired, town officials began reviewing the responsibilities he held. Ken Guyer was hired to Duncan's position, but Town Board members deemed the amount of

responsibilities Duncan had was too much for one person.

The town then moved to create the part-time position to help distribute responsibilities. The board budgeted the position at the start of the year, Deputy Supervisor Douglas LaGrange said.

"We are down to the last five months, so we do have a little latitude ... about possibly increasing hours as necessary and getting our feet wet with the position," LaGrange said.

At the meeting, resident Tim Stanton questioned how the board could hire someone for a new position due to fiscal constraints the town is tackling.

LaGrange said the town has carefully evaluated positions as people retire and in several instances didn't rehire someone to the position. He added the position could help the town prepare for future residential growth and increasing demands on the town's water and sewer systems.

"It wasn't a hastened decision. It was well thought out," LaGrange said.

Dolin said the board is trying to be cautious with creating new positions to avoid "bloating the government."

Some residents attending the meeting also questioned how the town could hire LaChappelle if

he retired on disability. Residents questioned the legality of him working for the town. He started his own construction company after retiring from Bethlehem.

LaChappelle, who heard about the questioning, said he has "absolutely nothing to hide" and added he had enough time on the police force to retire even without disability.

The type of physical disability he has after contracting Lyme disease left him unable to perform the duties of a police officer, he said. The disability is not such that would limit him with his ability to perform the duties of his new position, he said.

"It was bad. I almost died, frankly," LaChappelle said. "I go out and about every single day and I work hard. My only restriction is I cannot work in the police or fire system again, but any job in the public and private sector I can hold."

LaChappelle said he is looking forward to overseeing several developments in the pipeline at the town and is excited to be a part of the town's growth.

"It more than piques my interest," he said. "Being on the ground floor is interesting to me."

For children, shopping for school supplies is the event the signals the end of summer vacation. But as school supply lists grow longer with each passing year, so have the number of Bethlehem families who need assistance providing those items for their children.

For about 15 years, Bethlehem Senior Projects has partnered with the town's Senior Services Department to provide school supplies for children in need. When the program began, about a dozen families needed help. Now, there are about 60 families seeking assistance.

"There might be more that need help, but we just don't know of them," said Senior Services Outreach Coordinator Jane Sanders. Most of the families are those who have made use of the Bethlehem Senior Services Food Pantry.

On Wednesday, Aug. 21, volunteers from both the Senior Services Department and the Bethlehem YMCA worked to stuff backpacks with

supplies for those who were registered with either of the two groups. Bethlehem Senior Projects donated \$1,500 towards this year's initiative, while the town and YMCA have accepted donations from the community for the last month.

Sanders said there is a combination of factors contributing to the dramatic increase in families needing assistance, such as the recession and the growing cost of school supplies. Schools are also asking parents to provide more supplies these days.

Suggested supplies range from pencils, folders and looseleaf paper to backpacks, thumb drives and combination locks.

Participating families were asked to provide either Senior Services or the YMCA with their child's school supply list. Depending on age and gender, volunteers stuffed backpacks with all the supplies needed. In all, 102 children received school supplies through this year's drive.

This was the first year the Bethlehem YMCA partnered to help raise supplies for the drive. Derek Martin, district executive director with the Capital Region YMCA, said one of the organization's newest goals is to work more closely with the towns it's located in. Since similar collections take place in both Clifton Park and Gunderland, officials at the Bethlehem location felt it should get involved as well.

"It was a great opportunity to send children back to school fully equipped," Martin said.

The YMCA and its visitors collected 50 backpacks, along with enough supplies to stuff inside them.

Sanders said any leftover supplies would eventually be donated to the Selkirk Food Pantry, and then to students in the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Central School District.

Hometown overture for returning musician

Bethlehem native to perform acoustic set with band at Swifty's

An upcoming gig at a pub is more than just another show for Brian Mulkerne, because he's coming back to where he started strumming a guitar 45 years ago.

"It is just something I always wanted to do – to come back and get a gig down there," the Delmar native said. "It just means more to me than a regular place to play. We have done over 40 shows this year, but this one means more to me than any of them."

Mulkerne, a 56-year-old Whitesboro resident, is coming back to his hometown on Thursday, Aug. 29, performing with The Brian Mulkerne Band from 8 to 11 p.m. at Swifty's Pub and Restaurant in Bethlehem. The band plays a mixture of blues, folk and country music that includes covers and originals.

"I have been a musician since my days in Delmar. I started playing guitar when I was 12 years old," Mulkerne said.

Being a musician hasn't been a full-time job for Mulkerne, who has lived in the Utica area for around 35 years. He graduated from

Bethlehem Central High School and went to SUNY Cobleskill. Then he went to the SUNY Institute of Technology at Utica/Rome for its human services program, which led him to an internship at the state Office of Mental Health's Mohawk Valley Psychiatric Center. After graduating, he was offered a job at the Utica facility and he worked his way up the ranks to become a psychotherapist and treatment team leader.

He started out as a cleaner for the facility, but he didn't stay in that position too long.

"I worked my way out of that job pretty quickly," he said.

He is planning to retire soon and is looking forward to practicing more, along with doing some private counseling.

About five years

ago, Mulkerne started performing solo and eventually connected with George Deveny, who plays slide and lead guitar and sings in the band. Bassist Ken McConnell Jr. and drummer Oscar Crandall rounded out the band. Their performance at Swifty's will be acoustic, so Crandall is sitting it out.

"It is a learning experience every time I play and to some degree a test of wills as far as not being nervous playing in front of people," Mulkerne said, "but more than anything it is fun and I enjoy it when people like the music."

The band primarily plays older blues and country tunes, such as tunes by Bob Dylan, and Mulkerne said his playing style is similar to the fingerpicking of Hot

Tuna, the iconic blues-roots band consisting of former Jefferson Airplane members.

He credits his music roots to "many positive experiences" during his youth, especially at the defunct Bethlehem Coffeehouse that he managed from 1973-74.

"From being connected to the coffeehouse I had a lot of exposure to different kinds of music,"

he said. "There was also other people in the area that were very active musicians and still are."

During high school, Mulkerne said Stanley Scott taught guitar for two years before the course was removed.

"A lot of good guitar players got started (through the class)," he said.

Even though Mulkerne has lived away

from his hometown, he often drives down to see friends and family members living in the area. Most people probably won't know him for his music, he said, but he's hoping some old friends will show up for his concert.

"We are looking forward coming down and hope people will come out to hear us," he said.

Meredith, an engineer, will primary Zeoli on the Democratic line. Bethlehem Republicans and county Conservatives have endorsed the town's Coordinator of the Development Planning Committee Terry Ritz. Howard Hyer, a manager within the town's Highway Department, will primary Ritz on the Republican line. In addition, members of the Independence Party will choose between Ritz and Zeoli on primary day.

"Essentially, when you look at the Highway Department budget, out of a \$6.6 million budget, \$4.6 million goes to personnel," said Meredith. "So really

the only way to deep cuts in the department is to lose people, and at this point where the department is, we can't afford to lose any more people."

Hyer and Zeoli echoed those sentiments, while Ritz said he would not commit to cuts until an analysis was done to see if efficiencies could be found.

The superintendent position has been vacant since former Superintendent of Highways Gregg Sagendorph retired in April. The Bethlehem Town Board appointed Public Works Commissioner Erik Deyoe to act as interim highway superintendent until January.

This followed a referendum vote put forth

by town officials that would have abolished the office of highway superintendent as an elected position, clearing the way for a civil servant to be hired to help manage the Highway Department under the public works umbrella. That referendum failed 3,086 votes to 1,969.

Members of the audience provided questions for the candidates, who were not asked how they felt about the referendum's outcome, but many of the questions revolved around how the new boss would treat his employees. One question dealt with morale, while another asked about a four-day, 10-hour workweek.

Most of the candidates said they would be willing to look into making schedule changes, as long as they didn't conflict with getting work done on time.

UAlbany means business

School unveils \$64M business school building, details new major

Business students at the University at Albany will not only have a state-of-the-art building in which to attend classes this fall, but will soon have the choice of a new major.

On Monday, Aug. 19, school officials unveiled a new 96,000-square-foot School of Business building. The \$64 million facility possesses “technologically advanced” classrooms and workspaces, “collaborative research centers,” break rooms, a career center, graduate workspace and a stock and bond trading room.

“The new building provides our students and faculty with a stimulating, world-class learning environment that promotes innovation, networking and the sharing of ideas and resources,” said UAlbany President Robert J. Jones. “It will place our School of Business within the top tier of business schools in the nation.”

The building was mostly paid for in the 2008-09 New York State budget, which provided \$54 million for the project. The college raised another \$8 million and is still seeking an additional \$1.75 million.

Jones thanked Gov. Andrew Cuomo, SUNY Chancellor Nancy Zimpher, Senators Hugh Farley and Neil Breslin, and all the members of state legislature for their support of the building. He also had high praise for Business School Dean Donald Siegel for his hard work in seeing the project through.

“Thanks to Dean Siegel, our business school is ranked 86th among 450 business schools nationwide,” Jones said. “I am confident that over the next five to 10 years we will reside among the top 50.”

At the same time as the unveiling, the university announced a new major that will see collaboration between the School of Criminal Justice, the Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy, the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Computing. The University at Albany is now the first SUNY school to offer a four-year degree in digital forensics. It is also only the third such program in the nation, officials said.

Dr. Sanjay Goel, an associate professor of UAlbany’s School of Business and director of research at the New York State Center for Information Forensics and Assurance, described the program as the digital version of crime scene investigation.

“We are becoming increasingly dependent on information systems, which are now very complex,” he said. “What happens if something goes wrong?”

The new major is meant to “educate students in the protection, defense and investigation of information and information systems.” Goel said security demands in both the public and private fields

are growing, and there is a lack of people with the knowledge to fill those demands.

“The typical I.T. employees can’t do this work themselves and need more experienced people to deal with these complexities,” he said.

With increased attacks from online hackers to major companies like The New York Times, Google and Facebook, Goel said companies are seeking experts with the knowledge to not only stop these security breaches, but with the skills to analyze why and how it happened. This allows more controls to be put in place, and can help the company learn if the culprit is an employee committing internal fraud, an employee making mistakes or an outsider looking to break in to the system.

Goel said many companies use to rely on law enforcement to handle these types of situations, but the systems are too complex and businesses are often provided few answers. By hiring their own employees, companies now have valuable information that can be used to learn who did the hacking, what was taken and how to prevent it in the future.

This new degree will provide students with the competitive edge to find employment for years to come, officials said.

“There is a huge demand. We expect to be able to place 100 percent of our graduates within

the field,” Goel said.

The major will also work as a pipeline for several community

colleges that have similar programs. Six new faculty members were hired to teach and

do research within the digital forensics field. Classes are expected to begin in the fall of 2014.

“I’m very careful right now knowing that he’s vulnerable if somebody has a gun. I just might leave him in the car. If there was a situation where I couldn’t, I would just make sure I was even more alert,” Strollo said. “Anybody that’s unprotected, whether it’s human or an animal, shouldn’t be victimized.”

Knowing the department has a tight budget, Bethlehem High School Senior Rachel Piccolino decided to take her canine adoration to the next level by raising money through local animal shelters and hospitals to purchase a \$1,200 ballistic vest for George. After collecting about \$200, she’s now asking the community to help pitch in whatever they can to not only help buy George a vest, but vests for two other dogs soon to be a part of the county’s K-9 Unit.

“I’ve always been a dog lover. I have a black lab at home. I think it’s so important to protect these dogs,” Piccolino said. “They’re heroes.”

Piccolino decided to start up her own fundraising website through giveforward.com and is asking for donations. She said her original goal started with buying only one vest for George, but she hopes to raise \$3,000 to buy all three vests.

As of press time, the public had donated nearly \$2,800.

Hyer said he wasn't sure if four-day proposal would be favored by residents.

Others also said they were aware of issues with vacation time.

"For those of you who don't know, the Highway Department schedules your vacation period for you," said Ritz. "Those weeks might not line up with school or family vacations, so I would eliminate that policy that required vacations and institute a normal policy that would allow you to pick and choose your days."

Zeoli said a good manager should be able to balance staffing to allow for vacations, while Hyer said he and Deyoe are working with the town's Human Resources Department in an attempt to find compromise.

All of the candidates agreed that the town should not bond for paving, and work toward getting those costs within the department's budget.

Zeoli, however, said sometimes borrowing may be needed to fix an underlying issue to preserve the town's roads.

Candidates also agreed it was important to work hand-in-hand with town officials towards common goals.

"The citizens have to come first. Regardless of what party you come from or who you were endorsed by, at the end of the day we're all Bethlehem citizens," said Zeoli. "We all care about the town, and we need to keep that in mind while we're interacting."

Ritz said he would like to evaluate the department's equipment to see what could be shared with other departments, and also suggested sending highway staff out to do projects in small teams to be more efficient.

Zeoli said it would be his goal to restore hours at the town's compost center, and possibly find a way to open it unstaffed through an honor system. He felt the facility has the potential to "be a money-maker" if it was given more

attention. Meredith shared similar views, and said he would seek out state and federal grants to help fund programs.

Hyer said he would like to see the department advance its use of technology. He said he helped to develop a pavement assessment program for the town, which is now in use.

"The superintendent's main function is really to balance the demand of the public, within the limits of his budget and the capacity of his employees," said Hyer. "And it truly is a balancing act to get that all done equal."

Bethlehem Town Justice candidates were also each given five minutes to speak before the forum began.

In September's primary, Democrats will have the option to choose between Matthew Kelly and Andrew Kirby, while Conservatives will have the choice of Kelly or Dale Desnoyers. All three candidates will appear on the ballot for those registered Independent.

Desnoyers is a founding

member and partner at Allen & Desnoyers in Albany and has 25 years of experience practicing law. He was formerly the director of the Division of Environmental Remediation for the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. He lives in Glenmont with his wife, with who he has five grown boys.

Kirby has served as the Bethlehem town prosecutor since 2004. He is also a partner at Conway & Kirby, LLP. He lives in Delmar with his wife, Amy Conway, and their three children.

Kelly works at Roemer, Wallace, Gold and Mineaux in Albany. He is also past president of the Albany County Bar Association.

from Bethlehem is for paving, and the machinery used has a "steep learning curve." He said using the town's employees isn't practical, because they haven't been trained.

"We have never put one of our men on one of their bigger pieces of equipment, ever," New Scotland Town Engineer Mark Dempf said on July 17.

Naughton said Bethlehem Interim Highway Superintendent Erik Deyoe approached New Scotland about crafting a formal agreement between the towns. The contract is initially for a two-year period and it will automatically renew unless terminated by one of the towns, with 60 days notice.

"This has a long history

not only in Bethlehem but in towns across the state," Bethlehem Town Supervisor John Clarkson said. "The tradition always was highway superintendents of adjoining towns would reach agreements with neighboring superintendents on a handshake and that was the way that business was done for many years."

Clarkson said state auditors and lawyers would get "very upset" about these informal agreements, because there are liability issues not covered through a simple handshake.

"As a matter of public disclosure, it is good to have those relationships known," Clarkson said.

Clarkson said "money was saved and good services" were provided previously through the informal agreements, but the contract is a more "proper way" to do it.

Repeating won't be easy for the Lady Dutch

Guilderland faces tough Suburban Council field beginning with Bethlehem

Winning the Section II Class AA girls soccer title was a challenge for Guilderland. Repeating the feat will be another challenge.

The Lady Dutch defeated four-time defending champion Bethlehem 2-1 in last year's final for their first Sectional championship. That places the target on their backs entering the 2013 season.

"All I can do is try to prepare them like last year and hope the results come out as good as last year," said Guilderland coach Curtis Snyder.

The Lady Dutch graduated half of their starting lineup from last year's 16-4-1 team that reached the state semifinals after adding a regional title, but several players who saw significant playing time are returning.

"We're working hard," said Snyder, who is entering his third season coaching the girls varsity soccer team. "The girls want to fill the gaps left by the graduating seniors."

The biggest gap may be at goaltender, where Carli Weinberg and Taylor Dorado are vying to replace Jenna Cubello.

"I have a three-year senior (Weinberg) who was playing Jenna. She got in a bunch of games, so she's got experience," said Snyder. "And then, I've got a sophomore (Dorado) who played O.D.P.

(Olympic development program) soccer. So between the two of them, I've got a lot of talent."

The offense will be led by three returning starters – Lauren Kogelmann, Rebecca Golderman and Emma Oliver. All three played key roles in last year's success, and Snyder said he expects them to be active up front again.

But in order to repeat as Sectional champions, Snyder said everyone has to work together.

"It's not the talent I'm worried about," said Snyder. "It's the teamwork and the bonding that I'm concerned about."

"I was a small part of (last year's title), and they were a small part of it. It all came together."

Guilderland begins its season with the team it met in last year's Sectional final when it meets Bethlehem Tuesday, Sept. 2, in a Suburban Council South Division game.

"Right out of the gate, you're playing one of the top teams," said Snyder. "It's good because you know where you stand early, but you also know that later in the season, you're going to be a different team than you were at the beginning."

Making its way through the Suburban Council presents its own challenge for Guilderland. Snyder said the South Division is improving with Mohonasen and Colonie developing more soccer players, and he added the North Division is tough.

"I think the Suburban Council gets a little more even every year," said Snyder.

"I wouldn't say we were inconsistent (last year), but at times we gave up the big play when we couldn't afford to," said Penna. "If we can limit the big plays

this year, I think we will be in a better position to win games."

Several of Guilderland's opponents are dealing with significant changes in their personnel this year. Defending Empire Division champion Shenendehowa graduated

20 of its 22 starters from last year's team, while CBA graduated several key players.

"We have as much of a chance as anyone to win the division this year, but we also know that virtually everyone else has a chance to win it," said Penna.

Door is open for Dutch

Led by Gallo, Guilderland aims for Empire Division title

Could this be the year the Guilderland football team has waited for?

After finishing third in the Empire Division standings last year, the Dutchmen have an opportunity to challenge for the title this season. They have one of the most veteran-laden lineups in Class AA, led by record-setting senior quarterback Frank Gallo.

"Everything is getting back in place, and everyone is looking good," said Gallo, who led Section II in passing last season with a school-record 1,758 yards.

"Any time you have experience at most positions, it's reassuring," said Guilderland coach Dan Penna. "The thing you worry about is motivation ... but the kids have been pushing each other (in practice) to get the most out of each other."

Gallo has his favorite target back in senior wide receiver Jacob Smith, who caught 33 passes for 600 yards and six touchdowns, and senior tailback Micaiah Henningham returns after scoring 10 touchdowns last season.

"We're going to be very experienced," said Gallo. "We have the same coaching staff, which always helps. I don't think we have an advantage over any other team, but I feel like we are the top team."

"We're excited about not only the experience we have, but also the leadership we have (with

Gallo, Smith and Henningham)," said Penna. "It really helps to have, in essence, coaches on the field to lead the others."

Gallo said he never thought about setting any school records in his first year quarterbacking the Dutchmen.

"I've always had high

expectations of myself, but I didn't expect that," said Gallo.

The expectation Gallo and the rest of the Dutchmen have of themselves this year is to challenge for the school's first Section II championship.

"That's why we're here," said Gallo. "If you're not here to win

(a Sectional title), what's the point?"

To do that, Guilderland will need a more consistent defensive effort in 2013 than in 2012, when the Dutchmen had a hard time stopping some of the more elite offenses in Class AA.

Book will celebrate special Siena season

It's been so long since I wrote a column, my logo isn't even up-to-date. Look at it. I don't have a beard – just some stubble that would eventually become my beard.

I didn't break my silence to comment on my logo, however. I wanted to tell you about a book I'm working on to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the Siena College men's basketball team's famous 1988-89 season.

The untitled book takes a look back at Siena's wild ride from its early-season victory over Pittsburgh through a measles outbreak that forced the team to play in empty gymnasiums to its stunning NCAA Tournament first-round victory over nationally-ranked Stanford.

At the heart of the book is the 1989 ECAC North Atlantic Conference Tournament, which was played in an empty Hartford Civic Center due to the measles reaching Connecticut's capital city. The championship game between Siena and Boston University was a thriller that wasn't decided until Steve McCoy's basket with one second left gave Siena a 68-67 victory and its first conference title.

The ECAC North Atlantic championship game began a week in the national spotlight for Siena. The national sports media was



captivated by the fact that Siena spent nearly two months playing in empty arenas before gaining clearance to play in front of spectators in time for the NCAA Tournament. The story grew larger when the Saints defeated 13th-ranked Stanford 80-78 in the opening round before falling to the University of Minnesota 80-67.

That week in March 1989 was the first time I felt personally connected with any championship team. Growing up next door to the Loudonville campus, it didn't feel like a local college had achieved something at the highest level of a sport. It felt like my neighbors had achieved it. When Siena knocked off Stanford, I was tempted to go over to the campus and see how the students were celebrating the victory. I regret that I didn't, but when I listened closely through the walls of my house, I thought I could hear

the cheering.

I've already been in contact with several key members of the 1988-89 Siena team, including head coach Mike Deane (now an assistant at James Madison University), star guard Marc Brown (now a head coach at New Jersey City University) and Tom Huerter (now a Siena basketball announcer). The goal is to have the book written by next March, which would mark the 25th anniversary of Siena's ECAC North Atlantic championship.

What I would like now is for those of you who remember Siena's historic playoff run to share your memories with me. My plan is to include quotes from local fans into each chapter. You can talk about the team, Deane, the players, being at the NCAA Tournament (if you had the chance to go) or even the name-the-team contest that took place that season.

I want this to be more than a story about Siena basketball. I also want this to be a story about the region that has supported Siena basketball.

Caber tossing, pipes and culture on tap at Scottish Games

The hills of Altamont will come alive with the sounds of bagpipes on Saturday when The Scottish Games, a two-day festival and celebration of all things Scottish, begins.

The games have been a late summer tradition in the Capital District since 1939. The weekend full of pipes, caber throwers, dancers and traditional Scottish food draws crowds in the thousands.

Bill Munro, a piper from the Schenectady Pipe Band, which hosts the event, said the festival started more as a picnic in 1939.

"It was in the locomotive park in Scotia and more like a picnic for a bunch of Scots, mostly who worked at GE," he said.

In 1978, the games were moved to the Altamont Fairgrounds. The festival grew over the years, and now brings people from all over the country to compete in the athletic, dance and pipe band competitions.

The Scottish games are based on the games of skill that are still played during clan gatherings in the Highlands of Scotland.

"The most unusual and sought after is the tossing of the caber, which means 'tree trunk' in Gaelic," Munro said.

The caber throw has athletes in kilts running across a field, cradling one end of a 20-foot long, 130-pound pole before coming to a dead stop and flipping the pole into the air. Munro said the idea

is not distance, but to pitch the caber end over end so that it lands in a straight line from where it was thrown.

The athletes compete in six events, all of which involve throwing some heavy object such as a stone, hammer or bundle of straw.

The games are accompanied by Scottish and Celtic music, Highland dance competitions, pipe band parades, Scottish foods, clan gatherings, animal exhibits and food vendors.

Terrace Ballroom, 126 Campbell Ave. in Troy, on Friday, Sept. 6, from 6:30 to 11 p.m.

The event, which the organizers said will help spread the love of Italian culture, will also benefit the American Italian Heritage Association and Museum. The nearly 35-year-old organization opened its first museum in Utica in 1985 before moving to its new home at 1227 Central Ave. in Albany. Now, the international organization has 1,200 members from 38 states and several different nations.

Philip J. DiNovo,

president of the museum and association, said the museum is the largest Italian American museum in the east.

“The purpose of the museum is to honor the Italian immigrants, tell their story and the contributions of Italian Americans,” DiNovo said.

However, to keep up with the nonprofit’s roughly \$120,000-a-year expenses, DiNovo said they put on about six fundraisers annually. This September, they wanted to try out something new by establishing “Viva Italia.”

her culture.

“They’re very famous for the passion they bring to this dance. It’s going to be a passionate Italian tango,” Giuliano said.

As for the food, Cocca, the chief executive officer and corporate executive chef at Franklin Plaza, said he’s keeping the focus of the night on traditional Italian event-styled dinners.

“Anytime I grew up with either a Sunday dinner or event, this was how the meal went. That’s the format we’re following, a typical special event in an Italian home,” Cocca said.

Dave & Buster’s opens in Crossgates Mall featuring food, drinks, sports and a lot of games

As you walk towards the flashing lights beaming from the “Million Dollar Midway” at Dave & Buster’s, it’s hard not to feel like a kid again.

The 33,000-square-foot restaurant and game room at Dave & Buster’s in Crossgates Mall screams indulgence and aims to entertain. There are 170 games with 268 player positions, a 360-degree sports bar featuring more than two-dozen high-definition televisions, a sizeable menu offering some twists on classic American fare and bevy of alcoholic concoctions.

Dave & Buster’s opened

its doors on Saturday, Aug. 24, and is opened daily from 11 a.m. to midnight, with extended hours on Friday and Saturday stretching until 2 a.m.

Dan Johnson, general manager of D&B in Albany, said the business sets itself apart with the combination of a dining room, sports bar and gaming.

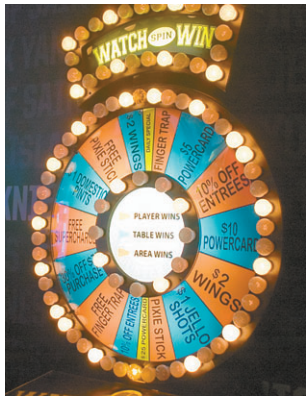
“We’re thrilled to bring our unique brand of food and fun to the Capital

Region,” Johnson said in a statement. “The new Dave & Buster’s Albany offers something for everyone with a great variety of dining and entertainment options.”

As such, patrons might want to block out more time for a D&B visit than a trip to a traditional restaurant.

“It is really an all-day event,” Johnson said. “It’s really an epicenter for fun.”

Johnson said on a rainy day you could come in and watch sports game, grab something to eat and then play some games before the next sporting event starts. He also said

opening a location in the Capital District, as opposed to the company’s home in Texas, allows for an entertainment option during the colder months.

“It is cold out here and I don’t know how many people are really the outdoors activity type,” Johnson said, “so to come inside and bring your friends and family ... and not be in a rush to do anything at all. Just to leisurely walk around the property is really the biggest point of difference for us.”

The Crossgates location is also around 10,000 square feet larger than most of the company’s restaurants.

Albany makes the 64th location for the national chain. Photographs of local landmarks, such as The Egg, are featured as part of the decor, along with the names of area sports teams.

“That is the cool thing about Dave & Buster’s; it is always localized,” Special Events Manager Kaitlyn Malloy said. “It is not that cookie-cutter. You go into every one and it is different.”

One game located outside of the midway and near the sports bar is the “Watch, Spin and Win” wheel. When an area team scores, an employee will select a patron to come spin it. The winnings

can be handed out to the individual spinning, their table, or the “entire area.”

“This is one of our new, sports watching features,” Regional Marketing and Tourism Manager Benjamin Maddy said.

The “Million Dollar Midway” actually constitutes more of an investment than the name suggests, according to Maddy. The variety of games available in the

midway ranges from the classic Skee-ball to the latest video game technology. Many games offer tickets, but a majority are just for fun.

“About 60 percent of the games people play are the redemption games where they win the tickets and they get the prizes to take in the winners circle in the corner,” Johnson said. “They can win anything from a PlayStation 3 to an iPad to a six-foot tall, stuffed banana.”

Games like “Dark Escape 4D” utilize not only 3D glasses, but blow air onto the player’s neck and monitors the user’s pulse.

“As the zombies are hording and jumping out at you it show your pulse jumping,” Malloy said. “The more frightened you get the scarier the game gets, so it is a very interactive game.”

There are also full-size versions of popular smartphone games, including Temple Run, Fruit Ninja and Cut the Rope, on screens much larger than you’ve seen it played.

The restaurant portion of the business also encourages people to get or refill a “power card” along with their meal. You’ll get 25 percent more chips, which are loaded onto the card and used for all games, if purchased alongside your meal.

Fare includes Black Jack burgers, baked chicken and shrimp alfredo, bacon wrapped beef medallions with



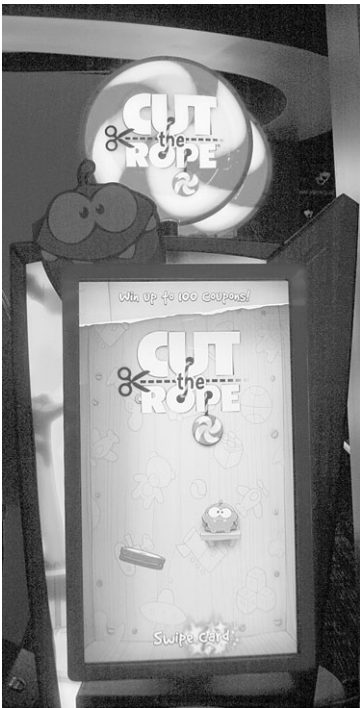

grilled shrimp, along with popular adult drinks including Snowcones, Walk the Plank and the Million Dollar Margarita. There are also a few deserts, which include hot sugared donut holes, bananas foster pie and Belgian chocolate fondue.

There are private rooms available at the location that can hold up to 65 people for corporate functions, birthday parties and other celebrations.

The founders of Dave & Buster’s combined their neighboring establishments in Little Rock, Ark. A few years after hatching their idea, the duo opened their first location in Dallas, Texas, inside of a renovated 40,000-square-foot warehouse. The company’s new goal is to open four new stores every year.



Don’t be surprised if any clock you see in D&B is frozen at 5:15, because that’s intentional. Maddy said the clocks show that time, because it was when people entered the first location and reminds staff how customers are the most important thing.

Munro likened the event to a fair at which all things are Scottish.

“We have a lot of exhibitions, vendors who sell imported Scottish and Celtic food like meat pies. We have a Scottish dog exhibition with an obstacle course where they will perform. We have Highland cattle and falcons. And we have Scottish clans from all over the Northeast that set up tents,” Munro said.

Munro, who has been a part of the Schenectady Pipe Band for 45 years, said one of the most memorable moments of the games is the massing of the pipe bands, which happens during opening and closing ceremonies each day.

“I always tell everyone to try and get there early,” he said. “All the bands play together. We could have 500 pipers and hundreds of drummers all playing together. It’s quite a sight to see.”

In addition to the mass bands, the games will feature a range of piping and drumming competitions, including solo piping, small group ensembles and the pipe bands themselves.

Traditional Highland dancers ranging from age 3 to adult will also take the stage throughout the day performing for judges. Munro said some of the competitors are local, but many of them also come from up and down the Eastern seaboard, Canada, Texas and as far west as Chicago.

“There is a circuit of Scottish

gamers that happens every summer. We are at the tail end and we become a place where they go and finish off their season,” Munro said.

Pipes and drums are not the only music heard at the games. Five Celtic stage bands will also perform throughout the weekend.

“This year our featured band is Manran. They are direct from Scotland and are six guys who are at the top of the Celtic record charts right now,” Munro said.

Additionally, Scottish clans will be on hand in tents offering history and information to anyone interested in Celtic heritage or just curious about Tartan tradition.

Several vendors will sell food, clothing, jewelry and other Celtic goods. Kids can stay busy with events such as a little caber toss, three-legged races, tug-of-war, pony rides, a petting zoo, a bounce house and a zip line.

“There is something going on in every corner of the field,” Munro said.

It all happens on Saturday, Aug. 31, and Sunday, Sept. 1, at the Altamont Fairgrounds, 129 Grand, Altamont. Gates open at 8 a.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. on Sunday. Tickets are available at the gate on the day of the event. For a complete schedule of events or more information, visit scotgames.com.
