Fowl request spurs discontent

G'land man seeks OK for chicken coop; zoning code revisions expected

Guilderland's zoning law may be silent on whether chickens are allowed in residential areas, but neighbors of one man requesting to raise the birds weren't.

The Zoning Board of Appeals on Wednesday, March 5, took up its third request since 2011 for a “keeping of chickens application,” with

Dale Owen seeking permission to keep chickens outdoors on his property at 140 Mohawk Drive. Board Chairman Peter Barber said the zoning code does not permit or ban the chickens in residential areas. Owen is proposing to keep up to 10 laying hens outside his home, and he said he is flexible as to where the coop would be built.

Unlike prior requests to keep chickens in town, both of which were granted, several neighbors of Owen appeared at the meeting in opposition to his plan.

Barber recused himself

from discussions and casting a vote on the application, because he lives near Owen. Board member Thomas Remmert is acting as chairman for the application.

After the meeting, Barber discussed the previous chicken requests before the town.

“One time, half a dozen or more people showed up, and all spoke in favor. In fact, enthusiastically in favor,” Barber said. “The other one, there were petitions signed by dozens and dozens of people. A good number showed up and

A second wind

Region's Patriot Flight program embraces 70th anniversary of D-Day

After a couple years of relative inactivity, the area's Patriot Flight program is readying to take World War II veterans to Washington, D.C., and commemorate D-Day's 70th anniversary.

Bill Peak, a Brunswick resident and WWII veteran, founded the local Patriot Flight program in 2007 covering several counties in the Capital District. Peak said the idea to start up the program was spurred after reading about a local state Assembly member traveling to the National World War II Memorial. Peak decided he should take the trip and eventually found out about Honor Flights taking veterans to the memorial honoring their service.

“I didn't want to go alone, so I thought I'll take some veterans with me,” Peak said. “I went to a seminar in Washington, and I was the only WWII veteran that started an Honor Flight hub.”

Many WWII veterans passed away before the memorial opened in 2004, but Peak was determined to help as many fellow veterans get to the memorial as he could. Organizing and running the Patriot Flight program isn't an easy feat, though, and Peak, an 89-year-old, stopped running

it around two years ago due to health problems.

Frank DeSorbo, founder and president of the D-Day Revisited Association, discovered the area Patriot Flight program wasn't active

anymore and wanted to find out what happened. DeSorbo, of Delmar, ended up talking with Peak for three and a half hours one day and decided he

Panel envisions aesthetic overhaul

Meeting focus on ways to beautify one of Bethlehem's major corridors

Bethlehem town officials and community leaders making up the Delaware Avenue Improvement Group met last week for the first time.

The focus of the community meeting held Thursday, March 6, at Bethlehem Town Hall was to give an overview of the future design goals for Delaware Avenue and to discuss what could be done now by the community and business leaders to help with the beautification project as the town awaits funds from a federal grant.

“We're here to work together in a partnership to see what we can do to improve the Delaware Avenue corridor,” said co-chair Jennifer Kilcoyne, who is also president of the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce.

In June of 2012, town officials went

LeVie subdivision, barn conditions approved

Property owner and town agree on timeline for barn relocation, 18 homes to be built

In about a year, the future of the historic LeVie barn should be clear, with New Scotland officials granted additional time to secure funding for relocation efforts.

The New Scotland Planning Board on Tuesday, March 4, unanimously approved the final plans for an 18-lot residential subdivision on a 22.4-acre property located in an agricultural district off Maple Road. Country Club Partners and the town also agreed to conditions delaying the development of lot 18, with construction moving forward on the remaining 17 lots. The conditions allow local officials more time to secure funding to

relocate the LeVie barn within the town.

“The town is very interested in preserving the barn, and the owners are very interested in working with the town,” Planning Board Chairman Charles Voss said. “Leaving (lot 18) as the last parcel to be developed allows you to put in your roads and everything else.”

The developer is required to offer the barn for free to the town for preservation and relocation efforts. The town would have until Feb. 28, 2015, to notify the property owner it has received a proposal to relocate the barn to another location. Once the

owner is notified, the town would have until May 31, 2015, to deconstruct and relocate the barn.

If the town were unable to relocate the barn, then the property owner would be allowed to demolish or deconstruct the barn without any conditions.

“The May 31 date ... there is nothing magical about it. If somebody really had a deal there and they had to take it out on June 30, there is no real problem,” Daniel Hershberg, the attorney representing the property owner, said. “Our goal here is to move it along so that we can get this project moving along.”

The property owner

and town officials are looking to give “first dibs” to someone within the town looking to relocate the barn, but the building could be moved further away if a local home isn’t found.

“At least we got the interest level up — that there are people interested ... to preserve the barn,” Hershberg said. “(The owners) certainly don’t want someone to deconstruct it and use it for scrap material if something else is available.”

Town Board member Daniel Mackay previously said state funding would likely be how the town would secure funding to

relocate the barn, which is estimated to cost at least \$500,000.

Cindy Elliott, a town resident, reached out to someone from Columbia County who said they would relocate the barn without any financial assistance to their property. This wouldn’t allow the barn to remain local.

Elliott also pointed out that the barn exceeds the height requirement allowed in the town’s zoning code, so a variance would be required before it could be reconstructed at another location.

“The code doesn’t let me put it up the way it is ... because the barn is bigger

than 35 feet tall,” Elliott said. “It is something to think about.”

Planning Board attorney Jeffery Baker said the height wouldn’t preclude the barn from being moved.

“It is a unique situation, which would meet one of the area variance criteria tests very easily,” Voss said.

Annual townwide ceremony calls out those who went above and beyond

Bethlehem's first responders were honored Monday, March 3, at the annual Community Awards event presented by the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard American Legion Post 1040 in Bethlehem.

The awards ceremony is held each year to recognize a member from each of the town's first response companies who went "above and beyond the call of duty." Awards and proclamations were given out to a total of 11 companies and departments.

"This is the time we in the American Legion honor our emergency personnel in grateful recognition of your devotion to the duty, and in appreciation for the contributions to public safety in the Town of Bethlehem," said Post Commander Al Hofaker, who served as marshal of the event.

Bethlehem Supervisor John Clarkson helped present the awards, while Albany County Executive Dan McCoy gave proclamations to each award recipient. A representative was sent on behalf of state Sen. Neil Breslin, with Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple also in attendance.

Bethlehem Police Lt. Thomas Heffernan Jr. presented the award for Police Officer of the Year on behalf of Chief Louis Corsi. This year's award was presented to all of the detectives on the Special Services Unit for their efforts in solving a number of notable investigations over the past 12 months. Those include arrests made in several bank robberies, an armed home invasion, several cases of identity theft from a local restaurant and a lottery scam against the elderly.

"The Special Services Unit was responsible for the seizure and recovery of over a half of a million dollars in stolen property, cash and assets during the investigations taking place over the past 12 months," said

Heffernan. "Detectives were also responsible for investigating 838 cases, which resulted in over 150 arrests."

The town's fire departments also presented awards to the fire fighters who helped save the life of an elderly Slingerlands woman whose home caught fire in September. Slingerlands Fire Chief Brian Sleurs said the fire officers were informed of the fire by a resident who reported a structure fire across from the Slingerlands Post Office. The base then radioed fire control.

“This is the point in time when the mutual aid system that we all worked so hard to put together worked, as firefighters from five neighboring departments, along with EMS personnel from within the town, gathered to do as they have been trained and saved a life,” said Sleurs.

Despite their efforts, the resident eventually died from her injuries several days later after being transferred to the Westchester Burn Center.

The fire departments
came together to

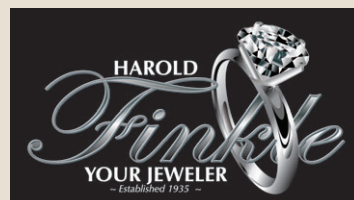

Knife attack leads police to 410 bags of heroin

A Colonie man was arrested for allegedly slashing the face of a Voorheesville resident, but police then discovered a stash of heroin inside his apartment.

Albany County Sheriff Craig D. Apple Sr. said deputies were dispatched to Pleasant Street in the Village of Voorheesville for a person that had allegedly been assaulted and slashed in the face with a knife. Police said Nicholas J. Desantis allegedly attacked the victim and had previously accused them of stealing drugs from him. Desantis allegedly fled the scene after the assault.

Investigators located Desantis, 21, in a vehicle at Colonie Center, with two other men in the vehicle. All three were detained and interviewed. The driver of the vehicle allegedly admitted to purchasing two bundles of heroin from Desantis for \$110, with the understanding he would drive Desantis to Voorheesville to confront the individual.

Police said Desantis allegedly possessed a knife used in the assault and had blood stained clothes, along with a cut to his finger.

Investigators executed a search warrant at Desantis' residence at 420 Sand Creek Road, Building 1, apartment 605, in Colonie Towers, and allegedly found 410 bags of heroin with a street

value of \$4,500. There was also more than \$3,000 in cash.

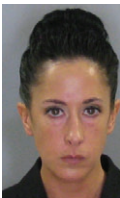
Police arrested Desantis and charged him with assault in the second degree, a felony, and criminal possession of a weapon in the fourth degree. Judge Margret Atkins arraigned him in the Village of Voorheesville and remanded him to the Albany County jail without bail.

Desantis is also facing charges in the Town of Colonie, which include criminal sale of a controlled substance in the third degree, criminal possession of a controlled substance in the third degree and criminal possession of a controlled substance in the fourth degree, all felonies.

The victim was transported to a hospital and was treated and then released.

March 4, who was allegedly involved in an embezzlement scheme.

Police said Hillary A. Downey, 35, of Solomon Avenue in Clifton Park, was arrested after Bethlehem detectives began an investigation into missing funds at Secure Solutions LLC, at 316 Delaware Ave. in Delmar. Business owners reported that in excess of \$70,000 was missing from accounts through fraudulent payroll records. An investigation determined that Downey, the account manager at the office, was depositing the money into her personal account between October 2013 and February 2014.

During the investigation, it was also determined that Downey allegedly offered the business \$10,000 to withhold information from the office of the District Attorney and to not initiate a prosecution against her in this case. Downey was charged with grand

larceny in the second degree, a class C felony, as well as misdemeanor counts of compounding a crime and criminal tax fraud in the fifth degree.

Downey was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to the Albany County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 bail. Downey was scheduled to return to Town Court on Monday, March 10, for a preliminary hearing.

Cops: Delmar woman forged prescriptions

Bethlehem police arrested a Delmar woman for multiple alleged counts of forgery in order to obtain prescription medication.

Police said April D. Rowley, 44, of Delaware Avenue in Delmar, was arrested on Friday, Feb. 28, after Bethlehem Police detectives began an investigation into New York state prescriptions that were being passed

in the Capital District with forged signatures of multiple doctors.

At the time of her arrest, police said Rowley was a registered nurse at First Care on Delaware Avenue in Delmar. It was determined that Rowley was allegedly stealing the prescriptions and forging the names of doctors at that location.

Rowley was charged with six counts of forgery in the second degree, all felonies. Rowley was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court by Judge Andrew Kirby and released after posting \$1,000 bail. Rowley is scheduled to return to Town Court on Tuesday, March 18.

Burglary charges for G'land man

A Guilderland man was arraigned on several charges tied to several alleged burglary and larceny incidents stretching from the summer of 2012 through the following year.

Albany County District Attorney David Soares on Friday, Feb. 28, announced that Matthew Woelfersheim, 37, of Guilderland, was arraigned in county Court on the felony charges of three counts of burglary in the third degree, grand larceny in the third degree and three counts of grand larceny in the fourth degree, as well as the misdemeanor charges of five counts of petit larceny.

Woelfersheim allegedly illegally entered a business on West Street in Albany between July 25 and Sept. 1, 2012, and stole more than \$1,000. He also allegedly entered a Watervliet Avenue home in Albany twice last August and stole money both times.

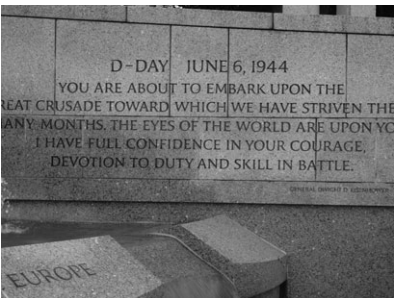

wanted to help relaunch the program.

“I sit back and I think these guys are living history,” DeSorbo said. “I watch the Military Channel a lot and read the articles in the newspaper, and they deserve the recognition while they are here.”

DeSorbo was already planning the fourth annual D-Day Recognition & Remembrance Day to be held June 1 and said the Patriot Flight this year will have the theme “D-Day goes to D.C.”

There are already at least eight veterans who stormed the beaches of Normandy, France, on June 6, 1944, who are planning to take the

Patriot Flight on May 10, DeSorbo said. There are a total of 35 veterans that submitted applications for the flight and another 16 veterans the group has contacted. He said the trip would probably include around 50 veterans.

The most time-consuming aspect

of the program is fundraising, which DeSorbo said is a “24/7” effort.

Peak worked in cryptography during the war and said he felt “terribly guilty” that he never stepped foot overseas. He said his daughter reassured him he was doing what he was supposed to do and played his own role in the war.

“It was my turn to pay them back, and that was really the motivating factor in this whole thing,” Peak said. “I felt obligated to help someone that couldn’t get down there.”

Peak said he’s losing his eyesight and is limited in his driving, but he has helped out the program recently through making calls from his home.

“I can do a lot on the telephone, but I just can’t drive,” Peak said.

Albany between Aug. 16 and Sept. 5, 2012, and stole more than \$1,000 from a newsstand in the county in March of last year. He also allegedly stole more than \$1,000 from a landscaping service in April of last year, along with stealing money from someone in the county the same month.

Woelfersheim also allegedly defrauded the state Department of Taxation and Finance last year for more than \$3,000.

Judge Steven Herrick remanded Woelfersheim to Albany County Jail without bail. Police said Woelfersheim was previously charged with “multiple counts” of arson in the third degree, a felony, in Guilderland Town Court, with those cases remaining open.

From the Editor's Desk

Time to teach interpersonal skills

Let's, for a moment, forget Common Core and look at an educational shortcoming that is causing problems right now for our graduates and their employers.

According to a recent Siena survey, area business leaders — nearly 68 percent who responded to the survey — are concerned about finding qualified workers who have good communication skills and can work as a team.

So while schools are busy trying to teach students how to write and meet new standards in that area, they aren't necessarily doing enough to teach students how to work together to solve problems.

Learning to work with others is a vital skill in any industry. Whether you work in a nanotech lab, an office, a coffee shop or an at-home business, you have to be able to interact with others to get your work done. Even one-on-one interaction can be challenging if you don't have the proper interpersonal skills.

The trouble is, many schools and universities don't make interpersonal skills part of their curriculum. The way they see it, students have to figure

out how to interact with one another on their own, and the whole "plays well with others" thing should have been straightened out in the sandbox long ago.

This thinking might have been OK 15-20 years ago, but it's not effective in today's world. Young people have grown up communicating in entirely different ways than the generations before them, with texting, Facebook, Twitter and even newer platforms like Snapchat being the primary means to stay in touch.

This type of communication may seem effective to this generation, but, at the risk of sounding like a bunch of fist-shaking old-timers, it does nothing to help them with the face-to-face interaction needed to do business in the real world. It's easy to say what you want to say when you type it on a screen, but saying it when the other person is standing in front of you can lead to consequences you're not prepared for.

Also, the reliance on texting and Tweeting shorthand may explain the decline in writing skills seen by business owners. While English teachers are still doing their best to teach proper sentence structure and

how to compose thoughts into a well-written presentation, students quickly throw those skills out the window when they are rushing to text their friends to meet them somewhere. People write the way they practice, not the way they are taught.

So, how can the tide be turned? For starters, more area schools can take a look at what Tech Valley High School is doing by teaching creative ways for students to interact with one another and business owners to solve problems. They can send students on group internships to local businesses, based on what their interests are. They can have students learn about the job application process by sending them on mock interviews. They can encourage teachers to come up with more group projects to get their students to work together. The same concepts can and should be applied at the collegiate level, too.

Business owners want to hire people who can work well together, and schools have to recognize that this is a skill today's students are not picking up on their own. So when we talk about preparing kids for the 21st century workforce, the issues go far beyond the Common Core.

Plan a backyard star party

This Grandma's Got Gigs column originally appeared in the March issue of Capital District Parent Pages.

Grandparents have a reputation for breaking the rules. There is a popular T-shirt that says it all: "What happens at Grandma's, stays at Grandma's."

We had the grandchildren staying with us on a crisp March evening when the moon was barely visible and the sky crystal clear. For their bedtime story, I chose a children's book about the night sky with glow-in-the-dark constellations. Without mentioning the "glow" capability to the children, I read about Orion the Hunter and Leo the Lion in the current sky. On the last page, on cue, Grandpa comes in and turns off the lights. With the lights out, the constellations light up.

With great formality, Grandpa announces: "You will be our honored guests at a Backyard Star Bash!" "When?" they scream. "Tonight," we both respond.

Instead of getting under the covers, the children were bundled up to go outside. With gig bag in hand, we traipse out to the backyard for some uncomplicated star gazing. The experts tell us to keep it simple, let the magic of wondering be in control. The sky belongs to everybody, and viewing what is up there is as unique and

individual as the imaginations of the stargazers. What we learned from the children's book gave us just enough basic information to get the children started on a lifelong appreciation of our natural world. Another secret for sharing the night sky with children, is to ask questions to get them thinking. What do you see? How many stars are in the sky? Can you count them? Do stars come in different colors?

Sometimes it's enough to have the questions even if you don't know the answers. If you Google free sky maps for cellphones, you can easily load an app to be your guide. We took our cellphone outside. By clicking on the app and holding it over our heads, we had a sky map with locations and labels. You could also take the glow-in-the-dark book outside; that will work too!

There we were, outside after bedtime, standing in the backyard looking upward when one of the children spotted in the west the three brilliant stars in a row that make up Orion the Hunter's belt. After we find Orion, we spot Betelgeuse, the orange star on his shoulder, and Rigel, the blue star at his knee. When we turn in the opposite direction, we face the majestic Leo the Lion making his debut on the eastern horizon. We have a light bulb moment when we realize the source of the saying, "March comes in like a lion." Leo is shaped

like a backward question mark. Right where his heart should be we see a sparkling white diamond star aptly called Regulus.

Does Orion really look like a hunter and Leo like a lion? That's the fun of it all; the patterns imply the image and our imaginations do the rest, just like people have been doing with the stars since the beginning of time. Before retreating back to the warmth of our beds, we wished on the stars as we remembered beloved family members no longer with us on earth.

This week in history in The Spotlight

Highlights from a half-century ago

From The Spotlight, March 12, 1964:

1945: War memorial planned by Legion

Editor’s Note: First public announcement of the Memorial Park was this copyrighted story, which appeared in the Tri-Villages on August 29, 1945. Interest mounted during subsequent weeks and then faded completely as the project was abandoned. No reason was ever given.


The Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post No. 1040, of the American Legion, has presented to the Town Board of the Town of Bethlehem a resolution advocating the construction in the Town of Bethlehem of a park as a post-war War Memorial project. A tentative plan has been proposed outlining a park of sufficient size to include a swimming pool, tennis courts, open air theatre, picnic grounds and areas with suitable equipment for the enjoyment of children and grown-ups. The Legion has long felt that there is a real need for such a park in the Town, which combined recreational, aesthetic and commemorative functions.

The value of open spaces where people can relax, meditate and enjoy the benefits of recreation, although hard to estimate in concrete terms, has been proven over and over again. They prevent human ailments and social ills, which uncontrolled create a steadily growing need for hospitals and prisons. They make for better neighborhoods and higher standards of citizenship.

Although no definite site has been chosen for the Memorial, the letters which were sent to the various organizations in the township brought responses in which they expressed the wish that they be allowed to donate certain specific sections. Individuals who have read about it have written and offered to help with personal donations toward the landscaping.

The Memorial, a large 20-acre park site, would be one of the outstanding spots of its kind in the State because it would offer a more varied program than most.

Among the proposed features are a beautiful, rustic outdoor theatre where plays could be staged during the summer months. Another feature, which has long been under consideration in the Tri-Village area, is the swimming pool. The pool, when finished, would be complete with sea sand beach and a separate shallow section for beginners and the smaller children.

How women can use networking and educational events to learn, grow

Several years ago, my friend and colleague at KeyBank, Ruth Mahoney, was presented with the Trailblazer Award from the Women's Fund. The award recognized Ruth for making a difference in the lives of women across the Capital Region, and as I listened to her acceptance remarks, two things stood out to me: her genuine appreciation for all the women who supported her throughout her career and the importance of making connections.

As women in business, most of us have had the good fortune of working with a strong mentor. Many of us have also served as mentors ourselves, sharing what others have shared with us and what we have learned with others. In the process, we all become better—better professionals and better people.

Networking and educational events that are developed to address the unique needs of women serve a similar function. In fact, in today's wired world, events like Key's upcoming "Healthy, Wealthy and Wise" conference are becoming more important than ever. They offer new ways for us to make connections, build skills and learn at a time when one-on-one opportunities to exchange ideas and experiences are harder to come by. You just need to make sure you're spending your time at the right events and optimizing your time.

Choose the right events

There is no shortage of events vying for your attention. Unfortunately, time is a premium. You can't do everything, and if you spend too much time doing the wrong thing it will have a negative impact on both your personal and professional life.

Asking yourself the following three questions can help you prioritize how and where you should spend your time:

1. Why am I attending? Do you want to learn new skills? Meet new people? Promote your service or product? Whether you're spending 30 minutes at a coffee meet-and-greet or a day at a conference, you need to have a clear expectation of what a positive outcome will be. Is it a qualified lead? Finding a resource? Making a contribution?

2. Who will be there? Effective events are targeted to meet the needs of a very specific audience. Review the event agenda and talk to event promoters to see who they are marketing the event to and what the audience demographics will be. Events with a proven track record are generally a safer investment of your time. Talk to other people who have attended the event to see if it

was well organized, delivered on its focus and was worth attending.

3. What is the event about? The Healthy, Wealthy and Wise conference I am helping to organize is about helping women look and feel their best by making smart investments—in their financial future, personal safety, appearance and overall health. It would be a mistake for an attendee to assume that just because the event is offered by a financial services company that the focus will be strictly financial. So before investing your time and money into an event, learn everything you can about it and analyze how well it aligns with your goals.

Also keep in mind your personal style and comfort level. Do you prefer smaller, more intimate gatherings or do you thrive in the energy of a large crowd. There are plenty of events that can offer you everything you need, provided you do your homework and have a plan for making the event an effective use of your time.

Plan for success

It's a mistake to think that registering and showing up is enough. Remember, you should only be attending events that align with your overall goals. So prepare to make them as successful as possible. Here are some things to consider:

- **You are there to learn.** While this may be obvious for seminars and conferences, it is equally as true for networking events. Why? Because networking is about making connections—about discovering what other people need and can offer so that you build a mutually beneficial long-term relationship. The golden rule: listen more than you talk. Asking open-ended questions about a person's business is a great way to convey interest.

- **You are there to make an impression.** Dress appropriately and professionally. Jean Sharkey, owner of Whitney Cooper, a fashion accessories and clothing company in Saratoga Springs, believes that when you look your best you exude self-confidence—something that can translate into boosting your visibility and creating more opportunities. Also be prepared to describe your business or what you do in 10–15 words, and make sure that you have business cards and other materials you would like to share.

- **You are there to meet new people.** Move around. Mingle. It's okay to spend time with people you already know during walk-around networking time (there's always room to strengthen relationships), but sit with people you don't know for table discussions, breakout groups and dinners. Also, don't spend too much time with any one person, and if possible, help other people make new connections by introducing them to your existing contacts. It will be appreciated.

- **You are there to grow.** Whether you're trying to win new business or develop new skills, events merely serve as an introduction. The meaningful work happens when you get back home or to the office. To apply what you learn, develop an action plan. Are there books you need to read, tactics to implement in the office or a schedule you need to create to help keep you healthier and more productive? To benefit from the connections you've made, send follow up notes within a few days of the event closing and make sure you personalize it with details

from your conversation. Just as important as your initial follow up is staying in touch. Set a calendar reminder to check in with all of your contacts every couple of months to share news and see how they are doing.

Margaret Thatcher once said: "Look at a day when you are supremely satisfied at the end. It's not a day when you lounge around doing nothing; it's when you've had everything to do, and you've done it."

Chances are, if you really look around at the days when you've accomplished the most, you'll find you probably haven't

done it on your own. You've done it with a little help from your friends—the personal and professional network of people you've surrounded yourself with who help you be a better you. The goal of attending events is to expand that network and find opportunities where you can do for others what they do for you—create opportunities for growth. That's how we all become better.

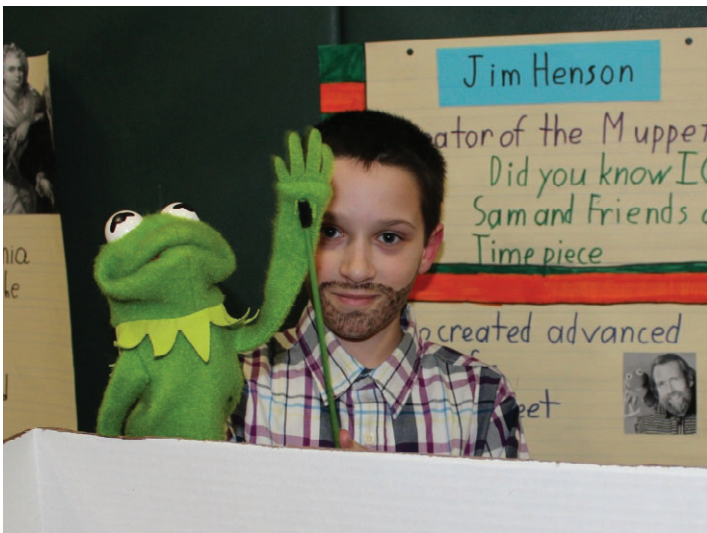

BC budget talks continue

Presentations focus on special ed, tech needs

As Bethlehem Central continues budget discussions for the 2014-15 school year, recent presentations highlighted possible staff reductions in the special education department and needed technology upgrades.

The second round of budget presentations were held on Wednesday, March 5, at the Bethlehem Central High School. The district is facing a preliminary budget gap of \$4.8 million, while residents could face a 3.12 percent tax levy increase that would not challenge the state’s tax cap.

Kathy Johnston, director of Special Education and Student Services, said after reviewing possible cost-saving measures for her department, the district could save about \$62,000 by getting rid of a social worker. The district currently has eight social workers and seven psychologists.

“Although social workers work with both special needs students and the general population, they are not mandated by the state,” said Johnston.

Another \$100,000 would be saved through staff

retirements, but service costs to BOCES have increased to be nearly just as much. If a social worker was let go, the potential cost savings for the department would be \$67,000.

Johnston said about 712 students within the district receive SESS help. Students are reevaluated on a yearly basis to see if changes need to be made to their special education programs, or if they are no longer needed.

“One year, we might have a lot of students move out. This year, we had a lot of students move in,” said Johnston. “There’s not an exact science to it.”

Johnston said because of these year-to-year changes in need, it can be hard to make reduction recommendations. She thanked her team for carefully putting the needs of students first.

The special education director also said previous cuts had resulted in challenges scheduling aids for middle school students, teachers losing valuable time with students because of the need to travel between schools and little time for professional development.

Despite these challenges, the graduation rate for special needs students remains at 82 percent, with many students also involved in extracurricular activities like the school play.

Sal DeAngelo, the district’s chief technology officer, proposed restructuring the technology department, but also requested additional money for equipment.

DeAngelo said although the recent bond provided funds to upgrade tech support, it did not provide money for equipment. He asked for \$200,000 to upgrade the online testing capabilities of the district’s buildings.

“The state is requiring us to be able to do more assessments online,” said DeAngelo. “The hope would be this could be used more in the classroom, as well.”

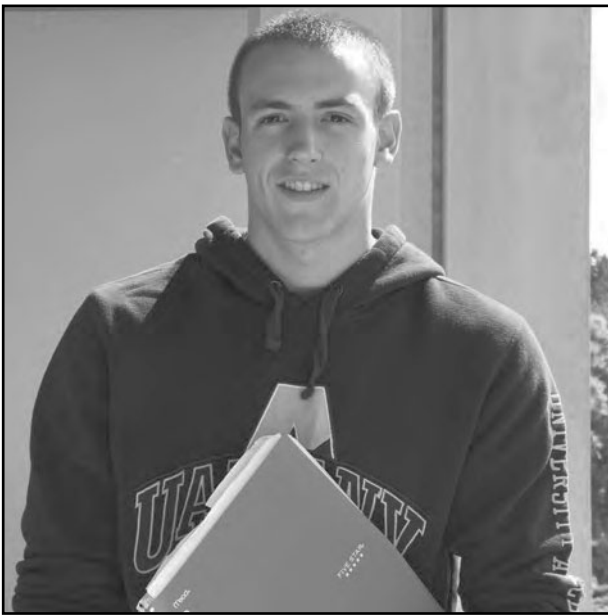
Also budgeted was \$3,000 to hire additional help over the summer.

Proposed restructuring of the department would call for one of the district’s help desk technicians be turned into an IT Services Specialist, with a slight raise. DeAngelo also asked for the elimination of a BOCES technician, with the work done in house. The total cost would be an additional \$30,000.

“We have current employees with the skill set and education,” said DeAngelo.

The next round of budget presentations will be held on Wednesday, March 19, and will discuss athletics, along with operations and maintenance.

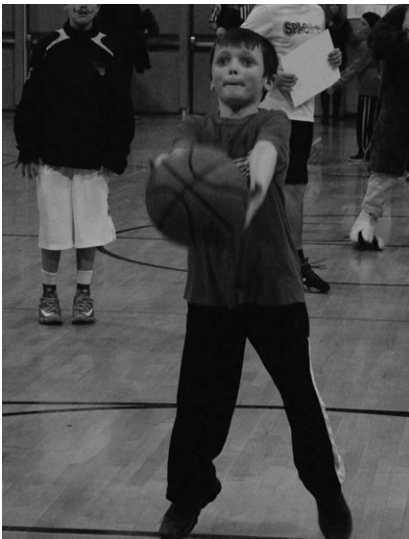

Realignment hits Section II football again

Bethlehem switches divisions following Niskayuna's voluntary drop

Section II football divisions have been changed for the 2014 season.

Niskayuna voluntarily dropped down from Class AA to become an independent Class A team this fall, which led to Bethlehem switching from the Empire to the

Liberty Division.

"They (Niskayuna) requested to play down without the chance to play in Sectionals this year," said Section II football chairman and Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk coach Gary VanDerzee.

Class A grew by a total of four teams in the new alignment, which is based on student population numbers reported to the New York State Public High School Athletic Association. Besides Niskayuna, Class A adds Green Tech, Lansingburgh

and Scotia-Glenville from the Class B ranks. Those moves also resulted in a change for Schalmont, which switched from the West Division to the Reinfurt Division.

"Schalmont moved over because geographically speaking, they were the closest to us," said VanDerzee, whose RCS Indians play in the Reinfurt Division.

Class C is home to both of Section II's three-way merger teams. Catholic Central threw

its football chips in with Bishop Gibbons and Saratoga Central Catholic, which fielded a merged squad last season. Meanwhile, Berne-Knox-Westerlo is sending players into the merged Schoharie-Duanesburg team.

VanDerzee said both three-way merged teams qualified for Class C status based on NYSPHSAA's formula.

"You take the school with the highest enrollment ... and then you take into consideration the

Though many folks may choose to celebrate their Irish roots with beer and corned beef at a local pub on St. Patrick's Day, authentic Irishness can be found in a different place this year. Seven well-known native Irish musicians will take the stage in Troy to bring the audience on a journey to the land of Ireland with music and story.

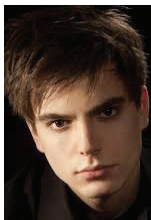

McCarthy said the lyrics and titles of the band’s music all reference some sort of story from their native country.

“It might be a story of a song local to a place in Waterford, to a story like ‘County Down’ based in County Down. Basically everything has a story, and we like to tell it,” he said. “All the music is links to what has happened in Ireland over the years.”

Danú’s well-known song, “County Down” is one example.

“Everyone loves ‘County Down.’ It’s a beautiful song — a newly written song, and a story about immigration” he said.

Though Danú prides itself on its ancient tunes, the band plays both traditional and new music.

“Not all of our material is ancient music. We have newly written pieces written in the traditional vein. They sound as if they were old,” he said.

Named for a goddess in Celtic mythology, Danú has performed in venues around the world since coming together as a band

in 1995 after an informal appearance at a music festival in Dungarvan, Ireland.

“We were playing for a festival and all kind of jamming together when we got an opportunity to go to a big Celtic festival in France. We decided we would go, and that’s where it all started. Before we knew it, we were a band. We didn’t set out to be a band from the start. All of a sudden, we found ourselves a name and doing a big concert, and we are still doing it,” McCarthy said.

That casual jam session was the start of big things for Danú. The group has since recorded seven albums and has toured North America, Europe and the Middle East.

McCarthy said the band, which consists of seven almost 40-year-olds, all came from some sort

of musical background, which he says is pretty typical in Ireland.

“Most everyone plays music in Ireland — traditional Irish music. It’s a great tradition,” he said. “Since 6 or 7 years of age, it was our social life, our hobby, our passion. We were all playing music maybe 13 to 14 years before we made a career out of it.”

McCarthy explains how traditional Irish music can be described in a variety of ways.

“For instance, you have people playing music with kind of a Celtic rock, but ours is very acoustic with instruments. The music is anything from — let’s say foot-tapping — jigs with good foot-tapping tempo, to very emotional songs in both Irish and English,” he said.

Danú’s music is known to be both energetic and

uplifting and capture the hearts of the audience.

“The music we are playing would have been handed down by ear ... learned from 90 year old musicians who would have learned from people before them. It’s tradition handing it down ... strong tradition ... very rich in that sense.”

McCarthy adds that he has been told people in the audience feel transported

to a different time and place.

“There are seven Irish people on stage talking. A lot feel transported in some sense. We try to make it as intimate as we can. After many years of playing, we can make a few thousand seats intimate. We can talk to the audience and tell a story as if we are sitting in a pub in Ireland,” he said.

The band is about two weeks into their U.S. tour.

“Right now we are in Tucson, Ariz.; two days ago in Illinois; then we go back to Kansas. It’s an amazing country. You can just drive two hours and see a different climate,” McCarthy said.

McCarthy said the band always enjoys performing in the United States.

“The audience is great fun and always up for a good time. In Ireland, you are playing for your own people who are used

to your music. When we come to America, people appreciate us coming all the way from Ireland.”

McCarthy also finds that a lot of people in the American audiences have a link with Ireland that goes back to great, great grandparents.

“They feel a connection,” he said. “They are very touched by the night. Fun, emotion and passion — all of these things, which are very strong in our music and performance, and we try to portray that.”

Danú will take the audience on a musical journey to Ireland at Troy Savings Bank Music Hall, 30 Second Street, Troy, on Sunday, March 16, at 4 p.m. Tickets are \$22-\$37 and are available by calling, 273-0038, in person, or online at www.troymusichall.org.
