Asset protection is an important part of wealth management

here's a popular piece of advice offered to many new business owners. Hire the best lawyer you can, because if you're successful, you're going to need one. It is advice often offered half-heartedly—in jest—or received with cynicism. But there is wisdom in it. As your business grows, it becomes subject to more opportunities and more risks, and a skilled lawyer can help you navigate both.

Asset protection planning is similar. As you gain wealth, you develop a greater need to protect it. Why? Because a lawsuit is filed once every two seconds in the United States, and the more significant your assets, especially if you are a physician, public personality or business owner, the more prone you are to risks and frivolous lawsuits. This is why developing an asset protection plan should be a component of every wealth management plan. Not only should it be a component, but it should also be a priority. For many people, it is the last line of defense to protect their personal assets and wealth.

What you need to know

Alack of awareness or guidance appears to be the main and implemented as early as

reason people lack an asset protection plan. Quite simply, asset protection is proactive planning to safeguard personal assets from future potential claims, such as unjust lawsuits and outrageous jury awards from personal or profes-

sional liability. The goal of an asset protection plan or structure is to discourage possible legal action against the individual and to bring any pertinent legal problems to a swift conclusion.

The most effective asset protection plan is one that goes unchallenged. For example, if the protective structures of an individual are perceived as too formidable or expensive to breach, the creditor might come to the conclusion that he may not be able to collect the claim. This may force the creditor to pursue a smaller settlement or abandon the pursuit of claims altogether.

Understand your options

When it comes to asset protection planning, there is no single effective strategy. It typically involves a series of arrangements and structures, and it should be developed

possible. This will make it more effective in providing protection against potential future lawsuits. The following are various strategies that can be used.

Liability insurance. Liability coverage can be an effective way to provide asset protection, as long as

the creditor's claim is not a result of unpaid bills. Insurance is typically the first line of defense in managing risks associated with protecting one's assets.

At minimum, families should have an umbrella liability insurance policy. For life insurance and annuities, some states offer protection of only the cash value while other jurisdictions account for the financial needs of the beneficiaries when determining the extent of conservation.

All businesses should have some form a general liability insurance policy, including directors and officers (D&O) insurance. Those with staff members should also have an employee practices liability insurance (EPLI) policy.

Estate planning as a wealth shelter mechanism. A properly structured and funded trust is a common and effective arrangement for personal asset protection. Using certain types of irrevocable trusts and gifting strategies can help shelter assets from claims against the donor.

With lifetime exemption amounts now at all-time highs, many families now have even greater opportunities to shift assets to descendants, either directly or for their beneficial interests through trusts and other arrangements.

Domestic asset protection trusts (DAPTs). Almost one-third of all states now offer some form of asset protection trusts. DAPTs allow an individual to establish an irrevocable trust, which provides asset protection, while also retaining the ability to receive income from the trust. A properly planned DAPT can protect assets—including those from a closely-held business—from

future creditors. It can also be used as an effective premarital planning solution to protect assets in the event of a future divorce.

Business owner considerations. Legal commercial entities, such as limited liability companies (LLCs) and family limited partnerships (FLPs), can be used as a buffer of protection for a business owner. These formal structures and similar legal arrangements segregate the entity's assets from the owner's personal assets.

A creditor of a business will not be able to get a court to award them an equity position in the business so the ownership structure of the business itself remains uncompromised. Rather, the creditor may be able to attain a beneficial interest, which insulates the assets of the business and limits the creditor

to claims against income or distributions of the business.

Protect what you earn

Most individuals and families have worked hard to accumulate their assets and wealth. But as wealth increases, it can be equally challenging to protect it. A well-structured, comprehensive asset protection plan is critical to ensure the preservation and protection of wealth.

The numbers: A look at why asset protection is important to business owners

a ccording to a Litigation Trends Survey by Fulbright, 90 percent of all U.S. corporations are currently involved in lawsuits. Of U.S. small business owners, 90 percent fear a lawsuit, yet only 26.7 percent have an asset protection plan.

Small business owners are right to fear lawsuits. Bolt Insurance Agency reports that 57 percent of all lawsuits are filed against companies making less than \$1 million annually. And the cost of these lawsuits is significant. According to courtstatistics.org, median costs for a business lawsuit start at \$54,000 for a liability suit and can reach around \$91,000 for the median contract dispute. The average amount awarded to plaintiffs in a consumer product liability lawsuit is \$279,309. But the cost is more than monetary.

- 73 percent of small business owners report that a lawsuit hurt their reputation and creditworthiness
- 74 percent say it led to an increase in the cost of their products or services
- 71 percent say it forced them to cut back on hiring

Clearly, there is inherent risk in being a business owner, but there are ways to

minimize your exposure to risk. Whether it is incorporating, forming a LLC, liability insurance, estate planning, DAPTs or any other strategy, asset protection planning helps protect an individual's or family's personal assets and wealth.

So why do only one in four business owners have an asset protection plan? It's the same reason people don't save enough for retirement and fail to invest in their future. They just don't know enough about it and no one has showed them how to do it.

There is also the mindset of "it won't happen to me." Even though there is a lawsuit filed every two seconds in the U.S., which is one lawsuit for every 12 adults, nearly 75 percent of people don't think it will happen to them. But everyone is vulnerable, and some, like business owners, are more vulnerable than others. That's why asset protection planning should be a priority and why you owe it to yourself and your business to meet with private banking relationship manager. Because you've worked hard to build your business and accumulate wealth, and if you wait until a lawsuit is brought against you or your business to defend yourself, it's more expensive and more difficult to protect your assets. In fact, it could be too little too late. You and your business deserve better.

Third guilty in restaurant ID theft scheme

Saihing Chan, 21, pleaded guilty to criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second degree and identity theft in the first degree, both felonies, in Albany County Court Tuesday, Jan. 13.

Chan, of Brooklyn, faces four to 12 years in state prison when sentenced March 3, according to county District Attorney David Soares.

On August 5, 2013, the Bethlehem police, U.S. Secret

Service, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, State Police, and other local law enforcement agencies executed a search warrant at the Golden Town Buffet in Bethlehem relating to an identity theft investigation.

Authorities arrested Heng Li, then 27, of Brooklyn, for using a credit card skimmer device to obtain identification information of 39 credit card numbers. Li and three other employees at the restaurant were under an active deportation order when the search warrant was executed.

Further investigation led authorities to other suspects involved in the identity theft scheme. Police said Chan, along with others, used stolen credit card numbers and identities to purchase thousands of dollars' worth of merchandise.

Heng Li was sentenced

to two years and four months to seven years in state prison on Dec. 11, 2013, after pleading guilty to criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second degree and scheme to defraud in the first degree, both felonies.

Another employee of the buffet, Pheng Sathongoth, then 42, of Manhattan, was sentenced on April 28 to two years and four months to seven years in state prison, along with being ordered to pay \$4,549.64.

The only case still pending as of Wednesday, Jan. 14, was against codefendant Bao Hua Liu.

Police searching for armed robber

Guilderland police are seeking the public's help to identify a man that allegedly robbed at gas station at gunpoint.

Around 8 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 11, a man entered the Xtra Mart convenience store located at 3903 Carman Road. The suspect reportedly displayed a black, semi-automatic handgun to the clerk and demanded cash. The armed robber then fled on foot in an unknown direction with money and cigarettes.

The man was described as approximately 5-foot-6, weighing around 170-180 pounds, and wearing a black ski mask, horizontal striped teal and gray hoodie sweatshirt, with dark jeans and gloves.

Anyone with information is asked to

contact the Guilderland's Criminal Investigation Unit at 356-1501, or email police@townofguilderland. org. Police said calls are kept confidential.

Gloversville pair nabbed with heroin

Guilderland police around 2:20 a.m. Saturday, Jan. 10, approached a vehicle parked in the middle of Route 155 and allegedly found the driver and passenger to be in possession of heroin.

Jermaine Staley, 31, of 16 Almond St. in Gloversville, was found to have an active warrant out of the City of Schenectady. Further investigation led police charge the driver, Ashleigh Foster-Morrison, 28, of the same address, with driving while ability impaired by drugs.

Staley and Foster-Morrison each allegedly had heroin in their possession, which totaled 99 individual packets that were packaged for distribution, according to police.

The pair were each charged with criminal possession of a controlled substance in the third degree, a felony. Foster-Morrison was also charged with DWAI, unlawful possession of marijuana and three traffic infractions.

Drug charges follow seatbelt stop

Bethlehem police stopped an Albany man for not wearing his seatbelt and found him in possession of heroin and crack cocaine.

Justin A. Bouldin, 38, was stopped for the alleged traffic infraction on Route 9W in Glenmont around 3 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 31. Police said an Albany County Sheriff's Office K-9 conducted a "free air sniff" of Bouldin's vehicle and detected drugs. Police discovered he allegedly possessed a baggy of crack cocaine and 10 bags of heroin, along with \$412.

Police arrested Bouldin, of 14 Ten Broeck St. in Albany, and charged him with criminal possession of a controlled substance in the fifth degree and two counts of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the third degree, both felonies; criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree, a misdemeanor; and not wearing a seatbelt.

He was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to Albany County jail without bail due to having four prior felony convictions.

Other arrests:

• Bethlehem police arrested Bao Hua Liu, 52, of 104 Forsyth Ave., 1st Floor, in New York, at 9:45 a.m. Monday, Dec. 22, and charged him with criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second degree, identity theft in the first degree, attempted identity theft in the first degree, and scheme to defraud in the first degree, all felonies, along with

conspiracy in the fifth degree, a misdemeanor. Liu was arrested while at the Albany County Judicial Center related to an indictment and superior court warrant. The charges relate to him, along with accomplices, using credit card information from customers at the Golden Town Buffet to make unauthorized purchases. He was remanded to Albany County jail without bail.

• Bethlehem police arrested Michael Adam Russo, 36, of 117 Retreat House Road in Glenmont, around 3:45 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 30, and charged him with criminal possession of a weapon in the third degree, a felony, menacing in the second degree, a misdemeanor, and harassment in the second degree. Russo allegedly woke up the victim by placing a knife to their throat, and was yelling at the victim but "not making any sense," according to police. Russo then allegedly put the knife towards the victim's chest and said, "I'll stab you." Police said Russo had reportedly been "drinking heavily" throughout the night. He was arraigned and remanded to Albany County jail on \$20,000 bail. He was scheduled to reappear in Town Court on Tuesday, Jan. 6.

• Bethlehem police arrested Nicolai Justin Smith, 18, of 634 South Pearl St., Apt. K, in Albany, around 4 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 30, and charged him with grand larceny in the third degree, a felony. Smith, who worked at Starbucks in Glenmont Price Chopper, allegedly stole eight Amazon gift cards from the supermarket and activated each card for \$500, totaling \$4,000. Police said video footage from the store shows him activating the gift cards Monday night, Dec. 29, between 7:19 to 8:46 p.m. He allegedly admitted to stealing the gift cards in a written statement to Price Chopper.

 Albany County Sheriff's Office arrested Sloane N. Crawford, 51, of 381 Picard Road in Voorheesville, around 2 a.m. Saturday, Jan. 3, and charged him with DWI, failure to keep right and improper right turn. Police observed Crawford commit traffic infractions while driving westbound on Route 85A in New Scotland. Police stopped Crawford and observed him to have a strong odor of alcohol on his breath and bloodshot, glassy eyes. He allegedly admitted two consuming two beers in Albany after work and another two at his girlfriend's home before driving. Police said he failed the three field sobriety tests administered. A chemical breath test revealed he had a BAC of 0.12 percent.

• State Police arrested Sean T. Altimari, 31, of Glenmont, early Saturday morning, Jan. 10, and charged him with DWI. Police stopped Altimari in the Town of Schaghticoke for alleged traffic infractions. He reportedly had a BAC of 0.1 percent.

Mangia to close

A local favorite for 25 years says goodbye

BETHLEHEM —

After nearly 25 years in business, Café Mangia in Slingerlands is closing its doors at the end of the month.

Mangia's last day of business is expected to be

Saturday, Jan. 31.

Brian White, vice president of restaurant owner White Management, said there is no plan by the company to open a new restaurant in its place. White Management does not own the building, and the plan is to turn it back over to

the landlord.

"The building is old and at the point where it needs to be replaced," said White. "We feel like restaurants need to be redone after 25 years, and it's reached its maximum lifecycle. It's at the point where we either put a lot of money into it or move on." According to White, a number of new restaurants have moved into the area, but he didn't feel the market has grown to support them. "We love the area, but we can't justify the investment," he said.

The money saved will be used to reinvest in White Management's other 35 different dining establishments through New York. The company went through a large renovation of Bountiful Bread last year, which is also in Stuyvesant Plaza.

"We want to say thank you to the community for 25 years of service," said White. "We were able to do a lot of fun things at the location, and we've had a lot of people come in to say it's their favorite restaurant. We're sorry we can't continue there, but it's been a great run and we're very appreciative."

White Management will honor remaining balances on gift cards. Gift cards holders from Mangia can visit the restaurant's website and fill out a form.

Audit report online

This fall, the Office of the State Comptroller released the results of an audit of the Bethlehem Public Library that painted a positive picture of the library's fiscal procedures. The audit, which covered the time period of July 1, 2012, through May 31, 2014, found that overthe-counter cash receipts were properly accounted for and deposited intact and in a timely manner, and the system of controls was properly designed and implemented. Of the 16 libraries audited by the comptroller's office last year, Bethlehem was the only one to receive no additional recommendations.



line) – we were 56 percent. There's a difference there."

Four enter Council

League admits Albany, Troy, CBA and Schenectady

CAPITAL DISTRICT — The Suburban Council is growing.

The league's 12 high school principals voted to admit four former Big 10 schools for the 2015-16 school sports season – Albany, Schenectady, Troy and Christian Brothers Academy. All four schools are playing as independents this season following the dissolution of the Big 10 last year.

Bethlehem boys basketball coach A.G. Irons amd Bethlehem girls basketball coach Matt Bixby said they were looking forward to having the four former Big 10 schools join the league.

"I think this is a positive for Suburban Council teams because now, we'll have the advantage of seeing these (former) Big 10 teams at least once a year," said Irons.

"It's going to be like

coaching and playing in the ACC (Atlantic Coast Conference)," said Bixby. "Any time we can play great competition, I'm excited for that, and adding the teams that we're adding is bringing more competition. It solidifies our league as probably the strongest league in New York state."

What this means going forward for the league remains unclear. It must decide how to incorporate its four new members – whether to place them in the current two-division structure of North and South divisions, or to create new divisions. Then, there will be the matter of scheduling games so that each school can play most or all of its league opponents.


Irons said he's hoping the New York State Public High School Athletic Association will increase the number of regular season games teams can play so the Suburban Council can offer its 16 member schools the opportunity to not only play everyone else in the league, but also have nonleague games.


"My understanding is that with the additions, we'll be at 18 games, and rumor has it that the state is going to increase its total to 20 or 22 games," said Irons.

There will be an added wrinkle for the league to consider when scheduling girls games. Since CBA is an all-male school, there will only be 15 member schools offering girls teams in many sports. This creates a situation where one school will a bye day.

Bixby said he doesn't see the possibility of having a bye day during the season as a problem for his basketball team.

"We deal with that kind of stuff all year between the Christmas break and February break and midterm week. We deal with those breaks all the time. So, these kids are very accustomed to that by now," said Bixby.

Shaker Pointe receives national recognition

COLONIE — Shaker Pointe at Carondelet, a project five years in the making, has been nationally recognized for its dedication to Shaker architecture and remaining environmentally friendly in all steps of the project.

The "Senior Housing News" recognized Shaker Pointe as the best independent living facility in its 2014 Architecture and Design Awards in late December. The awards received over fifty applications with only seven chosen winners.

"We were delighted to receive the award," Sister Lauren Van Denmark said. She said that finding out about the award was a nice addition to Christmastime.

Shaker Pointe broke ground in 2010 with 38 housing units built. Now, Phase two is celebrating is one-year anniversary with The Pointe, or the Commons Building, and its residential wing having opened in January 2014. Phase three is currently under construction and includes a three-story residential building with 56 apartments, a marketing office and pastoral care. It has a projected completion date of June 2015.

Sponsored by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, the facilities were designed by KDA Architects based in New Jersey and the

Rochester-based company LeCesse Construction Services LLC. It was the architectural company that submitted the application for Shaker Pointe to be considered for the award.

The floor plans, design, pictures and a narrative were sent to "Senior Housing News," said Van Denmark. She said the judging panel looked at a number of different components beyond architecture, such as how the lives of the senior community are being enhanced by Shaker Pointe, to determine the winners of the awards.

"And so they saw in Shaker Pointe all of those aspects being dealt with by our project team, being built and now its implementation. Being, you know, well served by the people who live here and by our senior neighbors," said Van Denmark.

However, a lot of thought was put into Shaker Pointe's architecture.

"There was a whole process for the design, and when the Sisters were planning Shaker Pointe, they were talking about the name, Shaker, given the territory. This was an original Shaker site," said Sister Kay Ryan. "What the architects did was go in and look at a lot of Shaker sites....And then they met with the Sisters in planning, saying what are the kinds of things we want in our development. What do we

want, what are we looking for?"

The Pointe was built specifically with Shaker architecture in mind. The great room, a wide-open space with seating designed for meetings and recreation, is modeled after the Shaker communal buildings.

"This is similar to the Shakers, because the Shakers had a communal building, which is what they called their meeting house," said Van Denmark. "So it was built on that concept. It's a central place where people can come and take park of the life in the community."

Another part of Shaker Pointe that had a large role in the award was the eco-friendly design. The facilities were built based on LEED, or Leadership Energy Environmental Design, certification.

The Sisters of St. Joseph worked with the architects and designers to be sure Shaker Pointe was designed with a "green initiative." All aspects, from the air conditioning and heating system to the furniture used were modeled around the environmental impact.

Van Denmark said that, while complying with the certifications meant longer construction time and more money, the Sisters wanted to be sure Shaker Pointe was environmentally suitable.

In phase one of the

Love thy #selfie

site each month, many of who tether their Twitter, Instagram and other picture sharing social sites to their profiles. With the average person inundated with selfies each day, the subject often elicits a strong opinion.

"Too many selfies are unhealthy," said Jennifer Bullard, a native of Glens Falls. "A few here and there for specific reasons are okay." Bullard admits she and her husband, Ian, have posted such pictures on Facebook to capture moments with friends and family, but little else, she added. "Creating art, putting up a headshot for Facebook a few times a year, hanging out with your friends and family."

Studies of various themes have focused on practice.

The Ohio State University recently published a study the school's communication department conducted on men who post selfportraits. The study revealed men who posted pictures of themselves had a higher than average tendency for narcissism and psychopathy. The study also reportedly states that men who edit their photos exacerbate the issue further. Comparable studies on women often site lack of

Attempts to reach Jesse Fox, lead author of the Ohio State study were made but were unsuccessful.

"I admit I take selfies," said Delmar native Shaun Mahoney. "I wouldn't call myself narcissistic although like anyone I am sure I have my moments." The Pittsfield attorney doesn't associate self-portraits with negative behavior by itself. "I also know many other really wonderful and unselfish people who take selfies. Some do so more than others and some sure

go overboard. However, I don't feel that the taking of selfies, no matter how much or how little, should be a primary indicator of whether someone is narcissistic or how much so."

Everyone, including celebrities and heads of state, are in on the act. Last year, Ellen Degeneres snapped a photo at the 2014 Oscars. The picture of A-list actors included Brad Pitt, Angelina Jolie, Meryl Strep, Julia Roberts, Kevin Spacey, Jennifer Lawrence, and Jared Leto. Once posted on Twitter, the picture was re-tweeted by more than a million users. The frequency at which people shared the photo temporarily shut Twitter down.

Psychological arguments aside, the act of taking a picture is to preserve a moment in time. For one Albany photographer, the self-portrait was the perfect means to capture his travels across the globe.

"I selfied on my trip through Europe and Israel with my brother this summer," said Bryan Lasky. Pictures often taken of popular landmarks where turned into something fun and unique for Lasky, who attached a fisheve lens to his DSLR camera, extended his arm, and included himself as the subject. He said it was something to have funny pictures of the summer. "I haven't done it since," he said. "I might start doing self-portraits to test ideas

That's just what students from one area school did.

In November, Niskayuna Central School District opened "Selfies: The Art of the Self Portrait," an exhibit at the school's unique on-campus art gallery. It's a collaborative work involving both students and faculty "This is almost an ironic play on the idea as to what people see as a selfie," said Niskayuna art teacher Stephen Honicki, "because this was approached as fine art... at an age when anyone can use a smartphone or electronic device and use this technology to put themselves out there."

Honicki said the exhibit was inspired through observing the use of smartphones. "Self-portraiture is often used to explore and manipulate identity. The artist invites judgment and critique on not only their artistic message, but also their appearance and demeanor."The theme was incorporated into the school's art curriculum, covering a wide range of media that included print, paint, ink sketch, as well as digital.

Niskayuna's art exhibit is scheduled to run through Ian. 28.

"It's interesting how each student has taken to it," said Honicki. "There was a wide range of growing solutions from each level. It was interesting to see how each student decided to see themselves."

Regardless of your opinion, the act of snapping a picture still remains a piece of subjective art.

"They are all just photos and could never paint a true picture of the complicated and ever changing nature of a human being," said Mahoney.

New year, new library director

Alongside the New Year came a new face leading a village's beloved library.

Altamont Free Library Board of Trustees selected Joseph Burke to be the library's new director last month from a pool of 19 candidates. Trustee Tracy Russell, who chaired the search committee, said the candidates were very qualified and making the final decision was difficult. After narrowing down the candidates to four, each was interviewed.

"The welcome that I have gotten from Altamont has been incredibly warm and I am just over the moon delighted to be here," said Burke.

Burke's enthusiasm, positive outlook and passion for the community are part of what nabbed him the job, according to Russell.

"It seemed like every

time we asked him a question he knew exactly what we wanted," said Russell. "Sometimes you just connect with someone and in conversation he was very casual and comfortable."

Burke officially stepped into his new role on New Year's Day, with his contract initially for one-year. Trustees will then review and reevaluate, with a likely approval for a longer term.

Burke described Altamont's library as "one of the showpiece libraries" in the Capital District.

"There aren't many libraries that are so embraced with the community like the Altamont Free Library is," said Burke. "It is such a cool building, it is such a cool community, and it really is a dream job."

Community support helped move the library from the basement of a bank into a former train station, which was renovated for the use, at the center of the village. Burke said, "There are community member fingerprints all over the place ... nearly everything was done by community members and volunteers."

Burke fills the vacancy created after Judith Wines resigned to become director of the RCS Community Library in October. Wines had been Altamont's director for about nine and a half years.

Altamont Free Library Board President Sally Dague was delighted to have Burke leading the library.

"During our interview process, we were impressed with Joe's enthusiasm, his deep understanding of all that a library can offer its patrons, and his desire to help expand and grow our programming and services," Dague said in a prepared statement.

Burke said his first goal isn't to institute any great





Residents voice tech support

IDA vote on Monolith Solar expected in February

BETHLEHEM — A

proposal to give tax breaks to the first tech company within Slingerlands' Vista Technology Campus was met with encouragement last week by residents and town officials.

A public hearing on the project was held by the town's Industrial Development Agency on Wednesday, Jan. 14. Only a handful of people attended the meeting, but no one who spoke was opposed to giving tax breaks to SAE Sun and Earth Energy Inc. and Monolith Solar.

"Three years ago when we were first in negotiation to go into the Vista Technology Park ... we were looking at the demographics, and the demographics themselves didn't say this was a stellar proposal to go into," said Charles Grizzaffi, co-owner of Garden Bistro 24 with

his son John. "However, the growth potential that was presented to us by Columbia, in concert with the IDA, said it had potential and was strategically an important place.

Grizzaffi said business has been good, but they have been waiting two years for a tech business to enter the park. "I don't know what your definition of a technology job is, but having a lot of experience in the semi-conductor industry, I can vouch that I think Monolith is a great candidate for this to consider."

Bethlehem Town Supervisor John Clarkson, Planning Director Rob Leslie, Chamber of Commerce President Jennifer Kilcoyne and a representative from local Glenmont Union all spoke in favor of the project.

Since the last IDA meeting, SAE Sun made a few changes to its

application with the IDA. Some of the main changes were to officially name Monolith Solar on the lease and to reduce the amount sought in sales tax incentives. The applicant is now seeking about \$680,000 in tax exemptions, since they submitted a new site plan to only include about four acres of land the

building would sit on, and

not the solar field.

It was announced at a media event in October that Monolith Solar would be moving its headquarters from Rensselaer to Vista. The project includes a 16,000-square-foot administration building, a 10,000-square-foot building for warehouse and manufacturing and an

additional solar farm to potentially provide energy to Vista's other tenants.

Along with any tax breaks sought by Monolith Solar and Columbia Development, Empire State Development is providing the company with a \$400,000 grant and \$400,000 in performancebased tax credits from

Excelsior Jobs Program. These incentives are tied directly to job creation and investment commitments. The new building and expansion will be known as 85 Columbia. The \$4.9 million project is expected to retain 49 jobs, with the possibility of creating 76 additional jobs within the



'Miracle' needed to preserve barn

Relocation of former LeVie barn seems unlikely before nearing deadline

Only photographs and other documentation are likely to remain as evidence of the historic Hilton barn after this summer. Relocation costs are proving too great for the massive post and beam

New Scotland Town Board members on Wednesday, Jan. 14, lamented over the fate of the Hilton barn, commonly known as the LeVie barn, because local officials appear no closer to finding a new home for the building despite an impending deadline. Interested parties have inquired, but the barn's large size and fittingly substantial relocation costs have cooled any prospects.

Board member Daniel Mackay previously estimated relocating the structure could cost at about \$500,000. Mackay has led preservation efforts of the barn, which he called the "queen" of barns townwide.

"This is the issue that wakes me up at night," Mackay emotionally said, "and leaves me awake at night thinking that we may not be able to do right by this structure, and that pains me."

Country Club Partners received approvals last March to develop an 18lot residential subdivision on a 22.4-acre property located off Maple Road. The developer and town agreed to conditions delaying the development of the lot holding the barn, with construction moving forward on the remaining

The developer is legally required to offer the barn for free to the town for any relocation effort, but town officials must inform the property owner by Feb. 28 that it received such an offer. The town would then have until May 31 to deconstruct and relocate the barn

"I'm still open to pulling a miracle out of the hat here," said Mackay.

State funding had been eyed to cover preservation efforts, but economic development or a specific reuse must be tied to such funding, according to Mackay. "Simple relocation without viable reuse is a non-starter," he said.

Town Supervisor Tom Dolin shared Mackay's emotional concern for the

"As a rural community in the county, barns are a part of our heritage," said Dolin. "It's unfortunate that somehow a long time ago, it didn't get in public

Mackay restated how he originally reached out to a co-owner of Country Club Partners in October 2010 requesting access to the barn, but he wasn't granted a site visit until December

"I do think that if we had earlier access to assess the integrity ... (we) might have been able to done something," he said.

The property owners have been accommodating to such requests since the first site visit, according to Mackay.

Country Club Partners, in a statement to The Spotlight last January, contended the company "cooperated with the town on every request they have made" and planned to continue cooperating with local officials.

The Town Board during its Wednesday, Jan. 14, meeting approved stipulations the state Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation prescribed prior dismantling or demolishing the barn.

State officials are requiring archival photographs to be taken and prepared for submission to a town entity, likely the historical society, and another copy that would be submitted to the state Archives.

Suburban in name only

he Suburban Council should consider changing its name to something else this fall.

With former Big 10 schools Albany, Schenectady and Troy joining the Council for the 2015-16 year — along with private school Christian Brothers Academy — the league is no longer suburban. It will be the lone large school league in Section 2 and a step closer to creating classification play in all sports.

When the Big 10 disbanded last year, it was at the point where there was too much disparity between school sizes and, depending on the match-ups, too much distance to travel between schools. There was little benefit for a large school such as CBA to play a small school such as Bishop Gibbons in most sports. Bishop Gibbons could barely put enough kids on a team roster to compete, and CBA would often dominate.

Amsterdam's predicament as the outlier of the Big 10 was worse. Not only did it have a hard time competing in most sports, it also had to deal with long trips to play schools such as Troy and Catholic Central. In the end, it made more sense for Amsterdam to leave for the Foothills Council than to stay in the Big 10 — a move that led to the dissolution of the league.

For its part, the Suburban Council didn't have to add any of the remaining Big 10 teams. It already had a full roster of 12 Class AA and A schools covering a large geographical area from Bethlehem to Saratoga Springs. Its member schools often don't schedule non-league games because their teams are playing 16-game schedules in most sports, which is close to the maximum allowed by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association. Adding schools could add

scheduling headaches.

Yet, the Suburban Council chose to add the four largest schools from the defunct Big 10. It was a logical choice given how Albany, Schenectady, Troy and CBA fit, both in terms of school size and location. Still, the league must now decide how to create divisions and schedules to best serve its 16 schools. It also faces the challenge of having only 15 schools offering girls sports, since CBA is an all-boys school.

Ultimately, though, we think the Suburban Council should consider a name change to reflect the diversity of its member schools. Albany is no more a suburb than Boston or New York City, no matter how small its population is in relation to those other nearby metropolis'. The same goes for Schenectady and Troy. Perhaps the league should resurrect the Metroland Conference name, once attached to this region's high school

football scene. Or maybe the Tech Valley League after the nickname given to the area when nanotech companies began putting down roots in the region.

No matter what, the Suburban Council should retire the name because the league is no longer an association of strictly suburban school districts. It is a reflection of the heart of our region — an amalgam of suburban and urban areas strung together.

successful that way," said Dashew. "In 'Bye, Bye Birdie' there are a lot of teens. I think all of us know what it is like to have a crush on a heartthrob."

The fictional story takes place in 1958 centering on rock superstar Conrad Birdie, who has hip gyrations like Elvis Presley, and his agent Albert Peterson. Rose Alvarez, Peterson's secretary and girlfriend, also plays a key role.

When Birdie gets drafted into the army, Peterson concocts a publicity stunt to release a final hit for the rock star, which is the song "One Last Kiss." The song is set to be performed live on "The Ed Sullivan Show," with a girl from Birdie's fan club selected to receive his real last kiss on the show before he is deployed.

While the production isn't something students knew as well as the last two shows, Dashew said the

kids are "on board" with it.

"There is a lot of screaming that happens and they love it," she laughed.

Grant Napierski, an eighth grader, said he likes the musical because it's very different from productions he's previously done. Napierski is portraying Birdie's agent, Mr. Peterson.

Fellow eighth-grader Natalie Convertino, who plays Peterson's girlfriend, agreed the "feel" of the production is different, but still has some the same energy.

"Definitely, the time period is different than the production we did last year," Convertino said. "We had to learn about a lot of names for things and a lot of different people that were famous during that time period."

For Napierski, he was a part of an ensemble in prior shows, so this is his first standout character. His character ultimately faces the choice of being a "momma's boy forever" or getting married, said Convertino.

"The characters are definitely really old fashioned," said Napierski.

There are more than 70 students on stage, with about another 70 students on the production crew. Several dozen parents are also helping out. "It takes a village to put on a show here," she said.

Dashew said she and her husband, Jason, have a high level of expectations for students in every production.

"We don't look at it as a middle school show. We look at it as a production that is happening in the community," she said. "We expect kids to perform at a high level and they always do."
