Down payment placed on coveted digital projector, more funds needed to have it installed

BETHLEHEM — An innovative idea could be the saving grace for Jericho Drive-In, as the theater's owners attempt to make the next payment for the installation of a digital projector before the season begins.

For the first time, passes are available for purchase for the upcoming summer movie season. The discounted passes allow two people unlimited visits to the drive-in throughout the season. All of the money will go toward the installation of the theater's new projector.

In 2013, Jericho Drive-in owners Mike and Lisa Chenette lost their bid to win a new digital projection machine through a competition sponsored by Honda Motor Company. Turning challenges into opportunities

BCMS students listen to speakers discuss thriving with disabilities

BETHLEHEM—

Feeling uncomfortable in your own skin is a common experience for many people during their youth. John Robinson felt similar, but his discomfort stretched long past his teenage years.

"For the longest time I could not look at myself in the mirror," Robinson said. "I was uncomfortable with how I looked on video and I ran a video production company for a long time. I could not look at myself."

Robinson, of Glenmont, shared some of the obstacles he has overcome as a congenital, quadruple amputee with Bethlehem Central Middle School students Tuesday, March 3. The event was part of the school's Character Strengths program.

Robinson asked how many students had looked

in the mirror that morning before coming to school and nearly every student raised their hand. While most people are looking to check if there is anything wrong with them, he challenged them to look for something else while seeing if their hair looks good.

"What if you started your day by saying what does my best friend love about me?" Robinson asked. "How much better would your day be if you start out thinking what's good about yourself and not what's wrong with yourself?"

Robinson leads his company, Our Ability, which "mentors. connects and inspires people with disabilities towards education and employment." Growing up, Robinson said he did not have a role model or mentor with physical disability that he could talk to about issues he faced. The organization also works with other

companies to facilitate better employment results for people with disabilities.

Doug Hamlin, Vice President of Operations for Our Ability, joined Robinson at the school to share his story, too. Hamlin, a paraplegic, went through a different experience from Robinson, because an injury later in life led Hamlin to using a wheelchair.

In high school, Hamlin played several sports and lived an active lifestyle. "I

grew up in an athletic frame the trampoline and knew of mind." In the summer of 1983, shortly after Hamlin started graduate school, he was at a backyard birthday party for his sister. While jumping on a trampoline, he came straight down on his head in the middle of

he seriously injured himself.

"I knew the minute I hit that trampoline that my life had changed forever," Hamlin said. "It's funny how your mind sort of takes over and helps you

adapt to a new situation almost immediately."

He spent about six months in a hospital after the accident. While in recovery he eventually

Youth court sees cases decrease

Bethlehem peer program helps adolescents get second chance

BETHLEHEM—

Although Bethlehem Youth Court has seen a decrease in cases the last few years, those who go through the program are presented with more charges.

Youth Court Executive Director Katrina Charland presented the program's 2014 end-of-year report to the Town Board on Wednesday, Feb. 25. Although the number of cases dropped from 37 in 2013 to $\overline{25}$ last year, Charland said adolescents were being presented with more charges than before.

"We don't really know why this is happening, but some hypothesize kids aren't getting into as much trouble. So, the ones who do get in trouble commit more serious offenses," said Charland in a later interview. "There's also this newer trend toward not

arresting juveniles and young people for very low offenses, so if they get to the point they are arrested, we're seeing worse or multiple charges."

The program helps to divert cases out of the town's court system. Teens who are first-time offenders and have commuted low-level crimes can opt to go through Youth Court to be judged, tried and sentenced by a jury of their peers. Those found guilty are sentenced to hours of community service, based on the level of their crime.

The two most common charges continue to be for unlawful possession of marijuana and petit larceny. Tied for second place were reckless endangerment, harassment, endangering the welfare of a child and unlawful possession of alcohol. Charland said one of the most standout cases one involved a brush fire.

"The charges all depend," said Charland. "I know a couple of years ago, some kids were trespassing on school roofs. I don't know why, but it volunteers was a big thing that kids were hanging out on the roofs of the school, and the district decided to crack down. Youth court was a great option because the students weren't doing any damage or meant any harm, and the district wanted them to know this wasn't acceptable behavior."

Nearly 92 percent of the cases brought to the youth court made it successfully though the program. Those who don't go back through the normal court process. The report also showed male offenders committed the majority of crimes at 76 percent.

In addition, 708.5 hours of community service were sentenced. Charland said the organization works to match kids' community service work in some way to the offense they committed. Offenders can also be asked to write letters of apology and take educational classes.

About 25 participated in the program last vear as jurors, attorneys or judges. Volunteers also work additional community services hours as part of participating in the program. A total of 1,571.5 community service hours were done all together between offenders and volunteers at 33 sites in the area.

Charland said a new training session for Youth Court is about to begin in this month for those who would like to volunteer. Training is extensive, with about 24 hours of class time on nights and weekends.

"I kind of jokingly say we teach them how to become lawyers in those six to eight weeks," said Charland.

Volunteers get

background on the criminal justice system and guidance from adult peers. They are then taught how to perform all the roles in the court, from judge and jury to defense and prosecution. The program is open to anyone in high school, although eighth-graders can volunteer for the jury.

Volunteers do not have

to participate in a case if someone they know goes before the court.

"We would never have a student prosecute a friend or someone they may know," said Charland. "Or if they in anyway feel uncomfortable with the situation and don't want to be involved, they can recuse themselves."

Voorheesville schools eye \$71k gap

Guilderland Board of Education faces \$130k gap, targets 3 percent tax hike

VOORHEESVILLE

- Voorheesville district leaders welcomed a much smaller budget gap than in recent years, with next year's shortage falling to around \$71,000. The preliminary budget should total around \$23 million.

The Voorheesville Board of Education was presented with the superintendent's 2015-16 budget at its meeting Monday, March 2, with several community members attending. Interim Assistant Superintendent for Business Sarita Winchell outlined the spending plan, which includes a nearly 1.9 percent property tax levy increase, or about \$308,000.

Winchell said the unpredictability of state aid, even more so than in prior years, led district stay flat. Voorheesville's projected aid at \$5.15 million still falls below levels received in 2007-08

Gov. Andrew Cuomo's reform agenda, if implemented, would add \$1.1 billion of education funding statewide, but several proposals are controversial at each end of the political spectrum in the legislature.

"State aid — this is like playing chicken; who is going to run off the road first," Winchell said. "But I'm hoping it's Andrew Cuomo.'

Appropriated fund balance would be remaining flat with \$600,000 allocated to help balance the budget.

Several propositions were also proposed to be on the ballot alongside the budget.

Voorheesville is seeking to maintain its

leaders to estimate aid will bus replacement schedule through purchasing two 66-passenger buses for \$230,000. State aid covers approximately 52 percent of these costs.

Closing the school lunch fund deficit, totaling more than \$100,000 would be tackled in another proposition. The district is required to receive voter approval to transfer unappropriated fund balance from the general fund to the lunch fund. This would not add to the tax burden since the funds already exist.

District leaders struggled after new federal school lunch guidelines were implement and quickly dropped out of the program, which also withdrew its aid. Federal regulations eventually loosened and the district rejoined the program in September 2014.

An employee paid

through the school lunch fund recently signed up for a family health plan, which also drove up costs, according to Winchell.

The final proposition addresses needed repairs at the elementary school footbridge, but school board members are still weighing what option to pursue. Replacing the footbridge with a wooden bridge would cost around \$142,000, but a more sturdy galvanized steel bridge would cost \$162,000.

"I see this as a safety issue," said Winchell. "If there is any high water you can't use that bridge and then you do not have, what I consider, a safe entrance for students coming from that parking lot of the school, because they would be walking along the road."

To receive state aid on the bridge replacement project, the district is looking to replace several windows at the school, too. A certain portion of the project must tackle work indoors to receive aid, according to the district.

Adding staff

Staffing cuts and program reductions have been emblematic of Guilderland school district's budget in recent years, but Superintendent of Schools Marie

Wiles is proposing a net addition of 12.65 full-time equivalent positions next school year.

Wiles presented her proposed 2015-16 budget at the school board's meeting Thursday, March 5, which totals \$93.3 million and increases spending nearly 1.3 percent. The spending plan hold a 3 percent property tax levy increase, which falls \$7,325 below its tax cap limit.

Appropriated fund balance was \$500,000 less next school year and totaled \$1 million, along with appropriated reserves totaling \$210,000.

Despite the net staffing addition, there are some areas of the budget with reductions. A significant savings is projected in its pensions, which is dropping \$1.5 million.

District officials are proposing a proposition to address needs in the high school auditorium, football field and track totaling \$1.16 million. State aid would cover approximately 65 percent, according to the district.

Voters might notice the proposition looks familiar to what was proposed last

by 28 votes, the areas of concern in our auditorium and on our athletic field still exist and will need to be addressed."

The condition of the auditorium is not suitable as a teaching space, according to Wiles. "We have heard from teachers that students have had to use their cell phones for lighting and that is just not acceptable," she said.

There are safety concerns about the four nearly 30-year-old lighting poles at the football field. The poles are in direct contact with the ground and are not mounted into concrete. District leaders are concerned the poles could fall over, possibility hurting people and damaging property.

Shafer arrested for dumping cat litter

Bethlehem Democratic Committee member Howard A. Shafer, 70, was arrested for allegedly

dumping soiled cat litter on local cul-de-sac proprieties on two occasions, according to police.

While Bethlehem police Officer Javier-Luis Martinez was driving to check on

properties in the Trinity Place development, he said he observed a black Ford F-150 turn onto Trinity Place around 4:35 a.m. Sunday, March 1. The truck proceeded to park near the intersection at Sandy Lane. Martinez said the truck traveled slowly down the road and parked for about a minute. The truck then slowly drove forward and parked again.

According to Bethlehem Town Court documents, Martinez could not see what the driver, Shafer, was doing because he was behind a snowbank. The officer found Shafer's behavior to be "incredibly suspicious," because there had been several instances in the neighborhood of soiled cat litter being dumped in the roadway, sewer and near homes.

Martinez stopped Shafer after he allegedly failed to keep right on Trinity Place. There was said to be one empty box of cat litter on the front seat of the truck, along with another litter box on the back seat appearing full of soiled

litter, according to police.

When Martinez asked Shafer why he was on the street, Shafer said, "I'm a

politician. I'm checking on my neighbor's homes, seeing what's going on." Shafer said he knew a homeowner on the street, who is a fellow Democratic Committee member.

Martinez appeared unconvinced of Shafer's explanation and questioned him about the litter boxes.

"Howard, I wouldn't be asking you these questions if I didn't already know the answers. I see you have one empty cat litter box and one full one. Did you dump the cat litter in the cul-de-sac down the road?" Martinez asked Shafer, according to Court documents.

Shafer admitted to dumping the cat litter and said he dumped the litter to get rid of it. He then admitted to dumping litter in the neighborhood one other time.

Police arrested Shafer, of 346 Maple Ave. in Selkirk, and charged him with criminal tampering in the third degree, a misdemeanor, and failure to keep right on a two lane road, a traffic infraction.

He is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court Tuesday, March 17.

In November 2011, Shafer was ousted from Selkirk Fire Department, where he served as treasurer and a volunteer firefighter, after being charged with

insubordination.

Josh Therrien, then chief of the fire company, claimed Shafer refused to follow superiors' orders, along with failing to return department equipment and records after an injury led him to be taken off active-duty. Shafer appealed his dismal to state Supreme Court's Appellate Division, but the expulsion was upheld.

Lt. Thomas M. Heffernan Jr. said there have been about two dozen incidents reported of cat litter being dumped in a roadway or near a home over the last two years. The incidents have occurred in neighborhoods other than Trinity Place.

Heffernan said the sporadic nature of the incidents hampered police investigations.

"In incidents like this there is usually very little evidence that is usable for the police," said Heffernan.

Shafer has only been charged for the most recent incident as of Thursday, March 5. Police said the investigation is ongoing and additional charges are pending.

Ex-lawmaker **Scavo faces forgery** charges

Former county legislator Brian Scavo was arraigned on a sealed indictment Monday, March 2, for felony forgery charges, according to county District Attorney David Soares.

The indictment, unsealed

in Albany County Supreme in the second degree, a Court Monday afternoon, charged Scavo, 61, of Albany, with two counts of criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second degree and two counts of falsifying business records in the first degree, all felonies.

Authorities alleged Scavo on April 10, 2014, possessed two forged checks while at Kinderhook Bank located on Delaware Avenue in the Town of Bethlehem. He allegedly intended to defraud the bank \$5,450, according to police reports.

Scavo pleaded not guilty to the charges and was released under the supervision of probation. The District Attorney's Office said there are no future court appearances scheduled as of March 2.

In a prepared statement emailed Tuesday, March 3, Scavo claimed he had not committed a crime.

"Never in 30 years of business have I ever done anything fraudulent nor participated in any Illegal activity with either friends, or business partners. I am proud of all that I have contributed to Albany County and to the City of Albany," Scavo said in his statement.

Scavo, a Democrat, lost his re-election bid in 2011 after losing in the Democratic primary and running on the Conservative ballot line.

Car parts taken

Joseph Cranker, 31, of Altamont, pleaded guilty to criminal mischief

felony, in Albany County Court Thursday, March 5, according to District Attorney David Soares.

Cranker reportedly cut out the catalytic converters on multiple vehicles parked on residential streets in the Town of Colonie, according to police. When Colonie police apprehended Cranker, he possessed tools and the stolen parts in the

truck he was driving.

He faces two to four years in state prison when sentenced on April 28, along with being ordered to pay full restitution to the

Lady Eagles soar into final

Balanced Bethlehem eases past Colonie in Section 2 Class AA semifinal

TROY — The Bethlehem girls basketball team reached the Section 2 Class AA finals for the second time in three years following its 62-49 semifinal victory over Colonie Thursday, March 5, at Hudson Valley Community College.

Olivia Hughes and Gabby Giacone each scored 14 points to propel the second-seeded Lady Eagles (19-2) into the Class AA finals Tuesday, March 10, against top-seeded Shenendehowa at Albany's Times Union Center.

Hughes scored Bethlehem's first nine points of the game on a pair of three-pointers and a three-point play. Colonie (12-10) closed the gap several times, but Bethlehem never trailed on its way to beating the Lady Raiders for the third time this season.

"Could not have asked for a better start to the game," said Bethlehem coach Matt Bixby. "Olivia (Hughes) came out ready to play."

Jenna Giacone contributed 10 points, while Maggie Kirby and Emily Wander combined to score 16 points off the bench to help Bethlehem advance.

"When you can have a kid like Emily Wander or a kid like Maggie Kirby come off the bench and play like they do ... that's just a huge

Dutch advance to final

ALBANY — For the first time since the state athletic association added Class AA to boys basketball, a Suburban Council team will win the largest school division title in Section 2.

Guilderland's 68-62 overtime victory over Green Tech Tuesday, March 3, at Albany's Times Union Center set up an all Suburban Council final between the Dutchmen and Shenendehowa. The Plainsmen defeated Catholic Central 68-48 in the other semifinal.

The Dutchmen (19-3) led 53-47 in the final minute of regulation when defending Sectional champion Green Tech (20-1) made a last-ditch run. The Eagles made one three-pointer and then got another following a Guilderland turnover to tie the score at 53-53.

Guilderland pulled away late in overtime, however. A three-pointer by Andrew Platek started a final run for the Dutchmen that created the final margin of victory.

Platek drained six three-pointers on his way to a 28-point night for Guilderland. Andrew Sischo contributed 16 points, and Ralph Simeone added 10 points.

Israel Griffin had 17 points, and Anquad McLean added 14 points for Green Tech, which defeated Guilderland in last year's Sectional final.

boost to our team," said Bixby.


And, in Castner's own words, he is "Crazy."

The Celtic punk band out of Boston has been a popular attraction for years, and have been known to make appearances at Irish Fest in the summer.



Getting cozy with jazz and funk

Albany's own Dave Spadaro Group's self-titled debut

"Pushin" starts the record off strong with a great guitar groove from Dave Spadaro, that is accompanied by wonderful saxophone work by Brian Patneaude. Patneaude takes the song over with wonderful melodies dancing over the great rhythms by Stephen Orsini on bass, Andrew Costa on keyboards and Brandon

Isles on drums. The play between Costa and Spadaro in the middle of the song in a call-and-response before Patneaude takes back over is a truly beautiful music moment. Like many songs throughout the album, if you close your eyes you can picture the band directly in front of you coaxing those extra notes out of one another to push the limits of the songs.

Funk and psychedelia take over in the latter part of "The Upside", pushing the band into new territory and getting more of how the band sounds live onto the album. Although the jam in this song was most likely thought out clearly, the fact that it sounds like a live jam is a testament to how great the musicianship

on the album is. "It's Alright" gives the album its "single" with Josh Farrell on vocals. This is the most radio-friendly tune on the album, which isn't a bad thing, because the more chance people have to hear this band the better.

"As She Moves" brings the album to a slow groove with help from Jeff Nania on sax and flute. Careful guitar interplay by Spadaro lets Nania highlight the song. "They Said" and "Fat Tony" bring the album to a close, with "Fat Tony" putting a great cap to the album with beautiful solos by Spadaro, taking over the song completely, yet not overshadowing the rest of the band.

Spanning so many genres, this seven-song album moves along too quickly. In its 42-minutes, it goes and leaves you wanting more. But, for a debut record, this is exactly what you want from a band. Music lovers should have no problem getting cozy with this album through



LIVE MUSIC

Sons of Saratoga Springs

The Spa City is embracing a band bringing life to the music scene

SARATOGA
SPRINGS — At the doorstep of New York's Adirondack State Park, Saratoga Springs has a natural appeal for liberal thinkers and creative minds. It is, therefore, by no mistake the Spa City is a college town with a devotion to the arts and the avant-garde.

It is Upstate New York's own Greenwich Village framed majestically within Victorian-era homes, babbling streams and mountain-scape views. A city that forbids thrashing skateboarders, but encourages dogs leashed to their humans.

Saratoga Springs has long been a beacon for music aficionados, whether looking for that rare LP on vinyl or enveloping one's self in coffeehouse tunes over a hot cappuccino. But, those associated with the local music scene found the nightlife lacking in recent past.

That's changing.
Part of what's driving that change is a little bit of crazy. Figures that within the cauldron of smoldering creative juices in this college town a concoction only best described as crazy would emerge.

"The thing that's different about this band, from other bands, is that we come up with crazy ideas," said Dustin Alexander, lead singer for Jesus Christ and

the Hallucinogenic Allstars (JCHA). "But, this band always seems to follow through with it."

Case in point: on a warm October evening in 2011, the four-piece band (three, plus their on-stage bartender) surprised a throng of Caroline Street pedestrians with a flash mob. The logistics behind it all involved a rented box truck, an extension cord, and careful planning around local law enforcement's schedule.

Everything was captured on camera and posted onto YouTube.

"We thought about how we could get it mobile, so we rented a Budget truck," said Alexander. "We're in touch with the town pretty well, and we actually found out when the police schedule was for patrol on Caroline Street. So, we hit it right when they were on break."

Flash forward to 2015, this hard rocking group has moved out of the box truck and into a residency at the Putnam Den. George DeMers, host of Skidmore College radio show Full Metal Racket, drawing from more than a decade of experience on the Spa City music scene, has proclaimed JCHA as the band to see in 2015. And, on Wednesday, March 18, they host their first EP-release party, sharing the stage with Bobaflex, another hard rock band that draws nationwide attention.

The three musicians got together in 2009.

"I really love this town.
The music scene was faltering a little bit, and it's good to see it come back around. I'm going to keep on pushing hard, and we're going to really start blowing this place up."

Alexander on bass. Ross Kelch playing the drums. Jonathan Imbo on guitar. All of whom have played in various local bands respectively. They each grew up in Saratoga Springs and cut their teeth at the bars sprinkled around Caroline Street.

"This band was started as an experiment for me, personally," said Alexander. His vocals are characteristic of the hard rock genre they listen to themselves, like Mastadon and Red Fang. For Alexander, who also plays bass, being the lead vocalist is new territory. His presentation has been the experiment, sometimes touching upon metalcore - with guttural and angry vocals. "The way my voice is now has been through trial and error. Seeing what I can sing, and how I can sing it. I don't think I'd call it metalcore. I don't usually go out and listen to metalcore music. But, I kinda get angry a little bit. When I grew up, my mom yelled at me all the time.

The Long Walk

Radio-controlled robots are usually the first to disassemble an explosive. But, when all such measures have been exhausted, the explosive has to be approached in person. The anxious moments leading to that encounter is described as "The Long Walk."

His 2012 book, "The Long Walk: A Story of War and the Life That Follows," is a piece he started writing while still battling with anxiety. "It doesn't get better," he said. "But, at a time, it was getting worse."

So, once he sat down to write, he recalled what he heard from writing coaches.

"Writing coaches tell you," he said, "you should start with what's most important. And, so, it happened, the most important thing you should know about me is that I'm crazy."

The first sentence captures the attention and cascades into a story depicting a man who continues to struggle with images of war despite being back in his comfortable suburban home with his wife and children.

Though "crazy" is not a fair description, the author admits it is a form of "self-incrimination" touching upon a larger issue. "I didn't have another word for it," said Castner. "I felt if I called it anxiety, it would have been a

cheat." He said addressing "Crazy" as a proper noun was, "extremely deliberate" because as much as it seemed to be a part of him, it was also something of its own. He and other veterans fight the stigma of being that "crazy vet." And, that the first sentence served as "self-incrimination" – as if to say, "Look. You've become the very thing you wanted to avoid," he said.

Castner's story had an immediate impact on Lawrence Edelson, artistic and general director of Opera Saratoga.

"The piece really hits home for me," said Edelson, who first read the book in 2012. "My grandfather was in World War II. ... For me, war is very much far away – over there. This opera brings it home. It tells the story of how our servicemen and women come back home to a world that has changed in their eyes."

More than two years later, the book has now become an opera.

"We thought it was an important subject to engage head-on," said Edelson. How do our soldiers intergrate back into society once they return home, come back to work, and are introduced to their children, he said. "It's a moving and beautiful piece."

"The Long Walk" is just another example of Edelson's efforts to bring American contemporary operas to his audiences. Fans of traditional opera will still enjoy it, while novices can gain appreciation for the art without stumbling through language barriers. "I believe that every opera company is obligated to present a contemporary American Opera. It's powerful and moving at times. ... There are emotional scenes that happen in this opera, but it does end giving one a sense of hope."

Castner recalls the phone call from his literary agent, when he first learned about the idea."He called to say he had a proposition, 'but you have to promise not to laugh'." The author said Edelson had pitched the idea to his agent. Through time, librettist Stephanie Fleischmann penned words to an opera composed by Jeremy Howard Beck. "I heard the music one evening last summer," said Castner, "and the next morning I was signing it in my head."

Castner now lives in Buffalo with his family, where he's now a full-time writer, working on his third manuscript, a non-fiction piece focused on the subject of Ebola in Liberia. He also serves as an editor for an anthology of "The first thing you should know about me is that I'm Crazy.

short stories. The book, he said, has opened up opportunities for him. One of which collaborating with Edelson, Beck and Fleischmann. "They have been extremely generous and gracious," he said.

"They didn't just take this on as another opera," said Castner. "They took it on as a full-time project."





piece of Americana still needs our help to save it.

Bethlehem's Jericho Drive-in has made a down payment on a digital projector, which will allow one of the last outdoor movie theaters to continue to operate. But in order to get it installed, owners Mike and Lisa Chenette are asking the community to purchase a limited number of \$200 season passes.

The Chenettes have shown considerable determination to keep their drive-in from fading away, as so many others have across the country. In 2013, they participated in a national competition to win a digital projector, only to fall short. They tried crowd sourcing last year to get the funds for a digital projector, but they didn't meet that goal, either. They kept the drive-in going in 2014, despite having fewer movies to choose from as Hollywood continued to move away from using 35mm film.

Now they have found a refurbished digital projector they can afford, but they still need our help to complete the deal.

That's where the season pass comes in. They want us to invest in their dream to keep the drive-in alive, after all the efforts they've made to invest in the community.

Even though the \$200 price may seem steep on the surface, it's small potatoes when you consider the value you'll get in return.

Keeping a drive-in open means summer nights sitting in a car as a couple or a family watching two movies, enjoying some popcorn and a soda, and feeling a gentle summer breeze blow through the open windows. It connects us to our country's 20th-century, driving-based past when people cruised the streets of small town America on a beautiful evening. It reminds us of what we used to have before subdivisions and big box stores.

The immediate value these \$200 season passes give us is just as important. Two people can go to any double feature at the drive-in and get a free large soda to go along with a large popcorn. And it means the drive-in can keep showing today's Hollywood blockbusters with

older movies, which provides a value for everyone.

We know that people's budgets are still tight, and \$200 is a considerable investment — especially when we still have high energy bills to contend with following a miserably cold winter. However, we can't think of a better way to shake off our winter blues than by preserving a summertime institution such as the Jericho Drive-in.

It's an investment worth making to save one of the last pieces of Americana we have in Albany County.



learned how to ask for help, which was new to him. However, he knew getting out of the hospital was something he must achieve himself.

"It was hard work and it took a long time," Hamlin said. "This terrible thing that happened to me made me learn more about myself probably more than any other life experience."

After getting out of the hospital, he had to learn how to adapt to people

looking at him differently. He said typically younger kids are just really interested in how his life is different from their own. Despite using a wheelchair for the majority of his life, Robinson was the person that convinced Hamlin he had a disability.

"I didn't feel like I had a disability and I didn't live my life like I had a disability," Hamlin said. "But (Robinson) me told I have a story tell ... because I had achieved some things that sometimes able bodied [people] didn't reach."

Michael Klugman, principal of the middle school, said Robinson lives with a different perspective than most people have experienced. Sharing Robinson's perspective with middle school students, Klugman said, could help kids who are struggling with their perspective.

"All they know is the world that they come from and our biggest challenge ... is to teach our kids different perspective, so that they have tolerance and accept other people," said

Klugman. "Maybe one of the most important points of their message is also selfacceptance."

There was only one message Robinson wanted the students to remember from the talk: oftentimes opportunities are disguised as challenges.

"When you look in the mirror tomorrow morning you might be thinking about something that's an obstacle in your life," Robinson said. "I'm asking you to turn that around and see the challenge and the opportunity that the obstacle has. I've had a lifetime of doing it. If we can do it, anybody can do it."

35mm film.

"We thought the passes would be a fun idea, but we weren't sure if people would be willing to spend the money," said Lisa Chenette. "If you think about it, it's actually a really great value. We have some people who come to the drive-in every weekend we're open, so we thought those would be the customers who would be the most interested."

Each pass is \$200, and it also allows for a free large soda with the purchase of a large popcorn. There are a limited number of passes available, and Chenette said about 50 percent have already been sold.

"We figured out the savings is about \$200 if the pass is used 10 times throughout the season, so there's the potential to save even more money if you're someone who visits more often." said Chenette.

Some big movies opening this summer include "Jurassic World," "Avengers: Age of Ultron," "Fantastic Four" and "Furious 7."

The Chenetttes worried that they could open this season after not meeting previous fundraising goals. Depending on the equipment needed, the projectors can cost between \$70,000 and \$100,000. They were also worried they would no longer be able to show a double feature each night.

Drive-ins attract fans of Americana and families on a budget looking for summer fun with their children. But, drive-ins have been disappearing on account it is harder to find movies on film. Theaters that haven't made the switch to digital are finding

it harder to obtain movies to show

However, over the winter, the couple was able to find a company that resells refurbished digital projectors at a lower cost. A down payment has already been given, but another large payment is needed at the time of installation.

"It took thousands of dollars off the price," said Chenette. "We want to be able to do the installation before opening night. If we don't have the money, we might have to wait a few more weeks to open."

The drive-in opens around April, but it depends on the weather and if the ground has hardened enough for cars to park on the lawn. The ice cream stand is expected to open March 17.

"We have a limited amount of passes, so we're really telling people to hurry if they want them," said Chenette.

The drive-in has been a Glenmont institution since it first opened in 1957. In 1995, it was purchased by Mike Chenette, who had saved up for years in order to own his own business. The Chenettes have owned the drive-in for more than 20 years.

"We really appreciate the community and how much was donated last year," said Chenette. "People were calling and offering ideas for how to fundraise over the summer, and we just appreciate everything everyone has done for


