Turning the tables

Fundraising campaign seeks to help Four Corners Luncheonette owner with medical expenses

BETHLEHEM — After years of helping out local charities and organizations, the owner of a community staple could use help of his own.

Mark Heffley recently started a fundraising campaign to benefit his brother, David, who owns the Four Corners Luncheonette in Delmar. David and his wife, Lisa, have dealt with some medical issues over the winter, which have taken a toll financially. The fundraiser, hosted on GoFundMe.com, is seeking to cover additional expenses they have occurred over the last several months while keeping the restaurant operational.

"David and Lisa are in a pretty difficult situation," said Mark Heffley.

On Christmas morning, David went to visit Lisa in the hospital as she recovered from an emergency surgery. While he was in the hospital, he had his second pulmonary embolism. He ended up staying in the hospital two floors above his wife.

New event seeks to unite residents

Voorheesville to host Village Green Clean day featuring recycling collection and activities

VOORHEESVILLE — Following a particularly long winter, a new initiative is hoping people are ready to get back outside and join neighbors in an effort to do some collective spring cleaning.

The first Village Green Clean will be held Saturday, April 18, which is meant to compliment Earth Day. Residents and business owners can volunteer to clean up village streets, parks and neighborhoods from 10 a.m. to noon, along with recycling collections for several different

items until 2 p.m. at the Voorheesville Volunteer Fire Department. A community gathering will also be held from noon to 2 p.m. at the firehouse as a thank you for volunteers, though anyone is welcome, with music, food, refreshments and activities for kids.

Village Deputy Clerk Karen Finnessey worked with local businesswomen Kaela Knoth, Kait Lyons and Amanda Scalzo to plan the event, which includes a balloon raffle fundraiser to support the Helderview Garden Club, which maintains flower boxes across the village.

"People in Voorheesville are very proud of the community and the DPW does an absolutely wonderful job maintaining the village," Finnessey said, "but I just thought if some of the residents took some of the responsibility onto themselves they might think twice about (littering)."

Finnessey said people she talked to about the event seemed enthusiastic and she is hoping residents embrace the new event, which could become an annual activity to build community pride. "I am confident that the roadside cleanup will be good," she said.

Some areas where clean up efforts are being focused on include along the far end of Voorheesville Avenue, Grove Street and Prospect Street. A few youth groups are also being sought to help clean parks while adults handle streets. Homeowners could also use the two hours to rake or clean up their front lawn.

The three women helping Finnessey plan the event thought to expand it into a fundraising effort, along with holding the after cleanup appreciation

activities.

"They decided they would like to try to get the local businesses involved and agreed to contact all of the businesses," said Finnessey. "We got quite a few who are participating, not only monetarily, but to go out and clean up."

The recycling collection will be accepting batteries, books and magazines, clothing and textiles, and plastics bags and films.

While all types of batteries will be accepted the emphasis is on car batteries. TJ's Auto & Truck Parts (NAPA) will be overseeing the collection and the business will donate \$3 to the garden club for every vehicle battery that is donated.

Books and other reading materials in good condition will be donated to The Albany Book Project, a literacy initiative collecting books to be given to individuals who are homeless, living in a shelter, or don't have the resources to obtain books of their own. Paper products not collected for donation, such as notebooks and folders, will go to the village's GreenFiber recycling program.

The American Clothing Recycling Company will have a truck ready to collect unwanted articles of clothing and linens. Even articles of clothing considered not good enough to wear anymore due to wear and tear can be recycled. Donations can be in any condition as

long as it is clean, dry and odorless, which includes shoes, bathmats, underwear, stuffed animals and other miscellaneous items.

The plastic bags being collected can be much more than the traditional grocery bag. There are a few rules, which include bags and wrap being clean and dry with all strings, rigid plastic, zipper mechanisms and food residue removed. Examples of donations include newspaper bags, plastic cereal bags, plastic wrap from toilet paper packaging and dry cleaning bags.

Town tackles deer nuisance

Advisory committee recommends new program to manage deer and pests

BETHLEHEM — The town's Deer and Tick Borne Disease Committee is recommending a new program be put in place to help manage the deer population.

The Committee gave a presentation to the Town Board on Wednesday, March 25, to recap a year of meetings on the subject. Supervisor John Clarkson had recommended a citizen's advisory committee on the topics of deer and ticks be convened last year after the town received numerous complaints.

Councilwoman Julie Sasso is chairwoman of the committee.

"At that point, it was more of a sense that we had as a board that we had started to hear residents concerns about the two

disparate populations," said Sasso. "But we didn't know what the extent of the concerns or the options that were appropriate for a town board or town government to undertake to address the concerns."

Residents were not only worried about Lyme disease, but the number of traffic accidents that have been caused in town by deer. Others have been concerned that the larger numbers of deer are disturbing their gardens. The committee was filled shortly after Clarkson mentioned its creation in his State of the Town address last January.

Throughout the year, those on the committee heard presentations from experts about the area's deer and the pests they carry, from state Department of Conservation Wildlife Biologist Karl Parker

to Matt Frye of the state Integrated Pest Management Program. Meetings were held once a month throughout the last year.

Last September, committee members asked residents to participate in an online survey to "to assess community experience with deer and tick populations." Most felt the deer population was more of an issue in more central parts of the town, like Delmar and Slingerlands, rather than those who lived in more rural areas like Glenmont and Selkirk.

The results of the survey were shared for the first time with the public at last week's meeting.

A total of 1,740 residents responded to the survey. Most found the deer to be a nuisance, with 73 percent of survey takers claiming to have landscape

or garden damage. Even more felt the methods they used at home to deter the deer, such as soap or specific plants, were not working.

Of greater concern was the increased amount in car accidents in recent years caused by deer. About 66 percent of those who took the survey said they have seen deer by town roads once or twice a week, while 23 percent said someone in their immediate family had been in a car accident involving a deer.

As for ticks, 81 percent of respondents said they had found a tick on themselves or immediate family member. Another 86 percent said they knew someone who has had a tick-borne disease.

Committee member Ed Tesiny said many of those who chose to leave comments following the

survey shared anecdotes about family members who had contracted a tick-borne disease.

"Some of the comments were really poignant," said Tesiny. "Some of the people whose family members contracted Lyme disease, it was really devastating. It was heartbreaking to read some of their comments."

The goals of the new program would be to raise public awareness, along with implementing low-cost and low-controversial interventions of the deer population.

Public education includes discouraging public feeding of deer, and working with residents to landscape lawns in ways

that would no longer attract deer. Thoughts to reduce car accidents included adding flashing message boards to notify drivers of "hot spots," more signage along the road or deer whistles on cars.

Other possible suggestions to reduce the deer population include longer hunting seasons, an increase in hunting

Cooking with cookies

Local restaurants present original recipes using Girl Scout cookies as inspiration

COLONIE — As young Girl Scouts begin to appear outside of stores and in malls, offering boxes of cookies, local restaurants gathered to see who could come up with the best recipe using some of America's favorite treats.

For the third year, Girl Scouts of Northeastern New York (GSNENY) hosted Cookie Cuisine with 14 district restaurants putting forward original recipes for appetizers, entrees and desserts made with Girl Scout cookies. Proceeds from the \$40 admission price went to the Girl Scout camp program, going towards scholarships for girls who may not be able to afford it.

"Everybody knows about the Girl Scout cookie," said Allison Marinucci, community and government relationship

associate for GSNENY. "The program is the most popular entrepreneurship program in the country for girls, so this is kind of the ultimate twist on Girl Scout cookies."

Restaurants that participated included Garden Bistro 24, Honest Weight Food Co-op, Druther's, and the Bull and Barrel Smokehouse. The Desmond Hotel in Colonie once again hosted the event, and put forward a Thin Mint chocolate soup in a Savannah Smiles encrusted glass and Trefoil chicken sliders.

Desmond Hotel sous chef Stephen Fratianni said that he and his coworkers had been brainstorming ideas for the night for some time. "These were the ones that stuck," he said. "It was a lot of fun to make."

One Six Five Restaurant in Delmar and Frederick's Pastry Shoppe of East Greenbush were also among

the returning restaurants. One Six Five was last year voted as having the best entrée with Sonrisa short ribs with Savannah Smiles and Dulce de Leche. This year, the restaurant featured a braise pork mole with Samoas and peanut butter moose with Tagalongs.

"I tried to do something savory and sweet to kind of please the masses, but we also like to pick our favorite cookies. We're big fans of those, especially," said One Six Five's representative Emma Towsley. "We were actually a fan favorite (last year), so we have to defend our title."

Frederick's, meanwhile, returned with a simpler dessert recipe. "The last two years, I did these high-end desserts and put a lot of effort into them, but I realized, for me, simple is best," said co-owner Dan Raymond. The pastry shop offered whoopie pies made with Tagalongs, Samoas

and Rah Rah Raisins.

This year, judges chose The Bull and Barrel Smokehouse as having the best overall recipe for its lamb sliders with Masala Thin Mint sauce. Prime at Saratoga National was chosen as having the best use of a cookie for the night with its Samoa cheesecake. The cheesecake was also chosen as the Best Dessert by attendees. Yono's in Albany was the People's Choice with a Rah Rah Raisin curried chicken.

"It's a fun competition," said Marinucci. "It's not serious, but some of (the restaurants) get very into it and are really in it to win it."

By the end of the night, more than \$8,000 was raised for the camp program, according to Marinucci. On top of scholarships for camp, funds from cookie sales also went towards helping a Scout troop plan an overseas trip.

Police: Man tried to touch boy in restaurant bathroom

A 38-year-old man allegedly attempted to forcibly touch inside the bathroom at a restaurant in Crossgates Mall on Friday afternoon, March 20, according to police.

Guilderland police said Nathan D. Harrington, of 152 Fuller Road East in Bennington, Vt., approached an 11-year-old boy standing in front of a urinal in the bathroom at Dave & Buster's. Harrington allegedly proceeded to put his arms around the boy and attempted to touch his private area, according to police. The boy then started screaming and kicking Harrington, who then left the area.

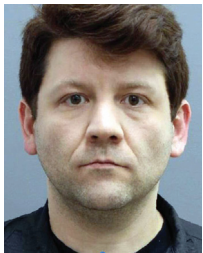
An employee who assisted with the incident noticed Harrington return to D&B later that day.

Police arrested Harrington and charged him with unlawful imprisonment in the second degree, endangering the welfare of a child and forcible touching, all misdemeanors. He is scheduled to appear in Guilderland Town Court

Guilty plea for illegal handgun

Thomas McLaughlin, of Albany, pleaded guilty to attempted criminal possession of a weapon in the second degree, a felony, in Albany County Court Tuesday, March 24, according to District Attorney David Soares.

The Albany County Sheriff's Department executed a search warrant on March 31, 2014, at a Western Avenue home in the Town of Guilderland.

While police were searching the premises for the narcotics investigation, McLaughlin entered the home claiming to be there to fix the plumbing.

Police searched McLaughlin and reportedly found him in possession of 1.8 pounds of marijuana and a loaded Glock handgun.

McLaughlin faces three years in state prison, followed by five years of post-release supervision,

when sentenced on May 19, according to the District Attorney's Office.

Police: Driver had pound of pot

State Police stopped a vehicle at Exit 25 on I-90 for multiple traffic infractions and found the driver to allegedly be in possession of approximately one pound of marijuana.

Police arrested Joseph D. Thorpe, 44 of Schenectady, around 2:15 a.m. Saturday, March 21, and charged him with criminal possession of marijuana in the third degree and possession of a forged instrument in the second degree, both felonies.

Further investigation revealed the inspection sticker on his vehicle had been forged, according to police.

Thorpe was arraigned in Guilderland Town Court and remanded to Albany County jail without bail.

Selkirk man guilty of DWI

Gary Zinzow, 60, of Selkirk, was found guilty of DWI, a misdemeanor, Tuesday, March 24, after a bench trial in Albany City Court, according to District Attorney David Soares.

On May 4, 2014, around 4:20 a.m., Zinzow was reportedly driving while intoxicated on Central Avenue in Albany following a night of drinking at several local bars, according to police. He reportedly

drove his vehicle across two lanes of traffic, up onto the median and then struck a tree.

He was sentenced to pay court fines and surcharges, participate in a victim impact panel and drinking driving program, and install an ignition interlock device in his vehicle.

Other arrests:

• Bethlehem police arrested Zachary J. Acquilla, 27, of 211 W State St. A-5 in Johnstown, around 11 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 28, and charged him grand larceny in the fourth degree, a felony. 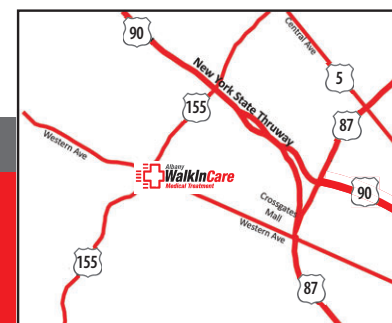

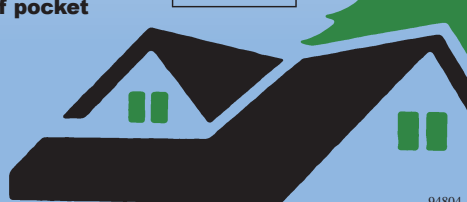

Reaching out to younger voters

Bethlehem GOP hopes for big wins during campaign season this year

BETHLEHEM — As campaign season gets underway, the Bethlehem Republican Committee is looking to reach out to younger voters and regain a seat on the Town Board.

The party plans to hold endorsement interviews on Saturday, April 11, and is willing to except resumes for possible candidates until that time. Official endorsement announcements will be made that same week, but the committee already has a good idea who they will be backing in the coming election.

"As of right now, all of the candidates are pretty young," said Bethlehem GOP Chairwoman Melissa Kermani. "No one is older than 45 or 50. We think a younger ticket could be of more appeal."

Kermani, 42, became chairwoman last September, after former Chairman Fred DiMaggio decided to step down from the position. A lifelong Bethlehem resident, she's been active on the committee for about six years, formally acting as treasurer.

"Having grown up here, I want to be able to give the residents a voice who feel they have been shut-out of the process because

of a one-party rule," said Kermani.

The last Republican to serve on the Town Board was George Lenhardt from 1994 to 2005. He later served by appointment for one year in 2012 as an Independent. Former Highway Superintendent Gregg Sagendorph and former Receiver of Taxes Nancy Mendick, both of who have retired within the last two years, were also Republicans.

DiMaggio opted to step down from the position of GOP chairman last fall, following a failed bid for Supervisor in 2013.

"Having served twice as chairman and two runs for office, I thought it was time for someone else to step-up and work to attract younger voters," said DiMaggio. "I'm still on the candidate's selection committee and very interested in having a two-party system in the town."

Kermani said the goals for the coming year was to get younger Republicans involved in the party, promote a younger ticket and entice younger residents out to vote. The positions of supervisor, town board, highway superintendent, town clerk, receiver of taxes and five county legislature seats are up for election this fall.

"I think there's a distorted impression of

what the party is about, and we want to fix that," said Kermani. "Although all the candidates will have their own issues to run on, there's been issues with large tax increases, a reduction in services and public safety."

Some residents have become active in the party following last year's reassessment project, which resulted in tax increases for some large landowners and businesses. Others are concerned about gaps in services for leaf pick-up and plowing, while some have taken issue with modifications

recently made in the Police Department by Supervisor John Clarkson that limits scheduling changes.

Keith Wiggand is one of those people who became active in the party once again last year and spoke on behalf of landowners. Wiggand is another former party chairman, who resigned in 2004 from the position and his job with the state after an investigation found he used state property for political gain.

"I kind of laid back on politics for a few years, but I got reinvigorated again

last year," said Wiggand. "There are several thousand voters who haven't come out because they weren't excited about the elections. We have to motivate them again. We also have to properly staff the police, and maintain serves like leaf pick-up and plowing. If you're going to take those things away, then lower the budget and lower our taxes. Bottom line."

Wiggand said he plans to play an active part in the upcoming campaigns, but does not plan to run himself. However, he

said enthusiasm is high with more people coming forward as potential candidates than in recent memory.

"Our goal is to get someone on the Board so that we have a voice," said Kermani. "But we also want to re-build the committee and start raising money."

The next Bethlehem Republican Committee fundraiser is a happy hour at Swifty's on June 1. Tickets are \$20 per person. Endorsement announcements are tentatively set for April 13.

Redistricting violated voting rights

Court rules county plan diluted power of black voters, orders new minority-majority district in legislature

ALBANY COUNTY — County officials are barred from holding elections until a new redistricting plan is drafted after a federal judge ruled the recent plan dilutes the power of black voters.

Senior U.S. District Judge Lawrence Kahn issued an 81-page decision Tuesday, March 24, ruling Albany County violated the 1965 Voting Rights Act, and must submit a remedial redistricting plan by April 14. Kahn sided with plaintiffs arguing a fifth county legislative district should have been created with a majority of minority voters, as opposed to only four such districts.

This is not the first time county lawmakers have had to redraw district lines. The latest decision marks the third consecutive redistricting plan that

has had to be redrawn following legal challenges over diluting minority voting power.

County Executive Dan McCoy, then chairman of the County Legislature, selected members of the recent Redistricting Commission. Shawn Morse, now chairman of the legislature, also served as chairman of the commission.

McCoy's Office in a prepared statement said, "It has always been the county's intent to create (majority-minority districts) where voting has not been diluted and to protect the voting rights of all minorities."

Replying to questions from *The Spotlight* Tuesday, March 23, a spokeswoman for McCoy said there would be no comments outside of its issued statement. McCoy reportedly told other media

outlets the county should not appeal the decision, which other county officials have echoed.

John Merrill, a longtime county employee, had been hired to help the commission draw new district lines. When drawing the lines, Merrill only used "single-race black" to establish majority-minority districts (MMD).

When residents initially questioned how the commission defined minority, they were told it was mixed-race black and Hispanic. However, the commission eventually said it had used the more restrictive single-race black population figures.

According to the decision during a May 2011 caucus meeting, Merrill said data showed a fifth MMD was possible, "but that he was told to create only four MMDs."

The court found

protecting incumbents was an "important priority" for the commission. However, "most commission members were generally uninvolved" in redrawing districts. The commission also never met to discuss how many MMDs to create, or how minority was defined.

A spokeswoman for McCoy said the 2003 litigation asked county officials to create MMDs containing "more than a bare majority of minority voters," which the recent plan sought to implement.

"In the 2011 redistricting process, the county attempted to honor this request and to protect the ability of minority voters to elect candidates of their choice by creating voting districts that were at least 55 percent African-American voters," said McCoy's Office in a statement.

This led to the four MMD approach, which had black voting-age populations of 59.2 percent in District 1, 55.4 percent in District 2, 61.75 percent in District 3, and 55.1 percent in District 4.

Advocates for a fifth MMD distributed an alternative, known as the Arbor Hill Environmental Justice Plan, which had black voting-age populations of 52.2 percent in District 1, 52.7 percent in District 2, 50.4 percent in District 3, and 51.6 percent in District 5.

The commission, thus the legislature, did not

consider the alternative plan before Michael Breslin, then county executive, signed the new district lines into law.

Kahn said "laudable progress to address racial disparities in the county has been made," but the recent plan failed to represent black residents. He cited several examples of addressing racial disparities, such as moratorium on construction of further oil facilities in the South End of Albany.

McCoy's Office, pointing to such statements, said the court found "significant achievements" were made "towards racial equality and sensitivity to minority issues."

A day after the decision, Legislature Majority Leader Frank Comisso announced the formation of a Redistricting Committee, which includes five Democrats and two Republicans nominees.

Democratic legislators Comisso appointed legislators Sean Ward, Justin Corcoran, William Clay, Timothy Nichols and Norma Chapman to serve on the committee. Minority Leader Lee Carman selected Rachel Bledi, Republican commissioner of the county Board of Elections, and legislator Christine Benedict.

Comisso, D-Albany, is confidant committee members will be able to meet the tight deadline, which the court appears to have imposed to not disrupt ballot petitioning in June

for elections this year.

"The Voting Rights Act was enacted to help effectuate the Fifteenth Amendment's guarantee that no citizen's right to vote shall be 'denied or abridged...on account of race, color, or previous condition of servitude,' and the members of this committee will do everything they can to ensure that."

Carman, R-Guilderland, remains "skeptical" the new commission, with a majority of Democrats, would be able to draft "fair and equitable" district lines.

"Past attempts to manipulate legislative districts to benefit the existing regime of county Democrats has failed miserably, both for the people and in the courts," Carman said in a statement. "The only true solution is supporting a plan proposed by the Albany County Charter Review Commission to establish a non-partisan, independent and inclusive reapportionment commission to permanently reform this process."

The court also awarded attorney's fees to the plaintiffs, with the amount to be determined in a separate motion, which have been estimated to fall around \$1 million.

The case was heard during an 11-day bench trial between Nov. 6, 2014, and Jan. 13.

According to the United States Department of Agriculture, 23 million Americans live in environments devoid of healthy food. These food deserts, as they have been named, are as likely to occur in urban areas as they are in rural ones. The definition applies to communities without supermarkets or grocery stores. So, despite the plethora of fast food chains in town, this still leaves residents without fresh, healthy and affordable food. Pockets of the Capital District, including North Albany, South End, South Troy, Rensselaer and portions of Schenectady, fall under this definition according to USDA data.

"So, now we're moving all these apartments, we want people to live here," said Katherine Wolfram, president of the Electric City Food Cooperative, Inc. "They can come down here, to live here and to work, for entertainment, for restaurants, but they have to leave Schenectady for food, which is a basic need."

Baseball fantasy life

If you have an upcoming draft and you're reading this, you need help

Right now, there is someone you know scrutinizing over statistics and algorithms that marvel those from actuaries in multi-million dollar life insurance companies in Hartford.

For the fun of it.

The Pew Research Center estimates that 5 percent of adults participate in fantasy sports. Within that same study group, nearly one out of every ten men is in a fantasy league.

This weekend marks the start of the professional baseball season. Many fantasy leagues wait until teams formulate their final roster before conducting their drafts. That would be this Friday night. If you're in such a league, here are some tips to help you succeed in the draft room:

Keep in mind, the following advice is based on head-to-head leagues.

At the Plate:

Fantasy Leaguers often overthink the first pick, considering the scarcity of talent at a given position instead of looking at the big picture. In a 12-team league, half of your league is going to miss out on an elite talent in the first round. If you benefit from having one of the first few picks, you're obligated to identify those players and select accordingly, regardless of position. Otherwise, get the player who will impact the most categories in your scoring system. Sounds obvious, but you'll be surprised how many foolishly go after a free-swinging homerun-hitter over a five-tool player with modest power.

First Base:

Your first pick was simple. Your next four picks

are crucial to having a successful draft. Before walking into the draft room, you should have already identified the Top 10 players at each position. For the sake of middle infielders and catcher, you best look at the Top 5. Look over mock drafts and projected values from a source you depend on like Yahoo or CBS Sports. These players will all be gone by the time you start Round Six. Spreading your wealth across the diamond may help you later in the season when someone asks to trade.

Second Base:

Key your eye on rookie pitchers. Often times a hard-throwing kid comes up as a starter and stays on the squad as a middle reliever. After a few appearances, your league qualifies him in both roles, allowing you an envious amount of flexibility. Placing a reliever in a

starter's slot, assuming you can update your line-up throughout the week, can allow you to rack up more numbers than your competition. Keep in mind, rookies are also unpredictable. Early season success can turn once hitters start figuring out his flaws.

Third Base:

Out of the 25 players you choose, you will cut 25 percent of them before the end of the second week, and another 50 percent will change hands before your playoffs start. So, don't get too attached. You should spend your last five picks on first or second-year players who have yet to tap into their potential. Scouting reports from a few years ago may still be spot on, so crack open a Baseball Almanac from 2011 to see who top prospects were at the time. Fantasy experts are sometimes short-sighted

and only focus on what players did the year before. You may find yourself a gem.

Heading Home:

Just about every year, there is a Hall of Fame caliber player who is at the end of his career. He may be on the cusp of being nudged off the Top 200 list, or worse. Last year, he presented lousy numbers in an injury-shortened season, and everyone is saying he should hang it up. Take him. If the player in question was an MVP during his prime, chances are his work ethic will push him over the top. He may rest more often, and he certainly won't have MVP numbers again, but he's the best shot you have in picking up a .285 hitter with 25 homers and 85 RBIs this late in the draft. Not to mention, you can turn around and trade him for that pitcher you wanted in Round Ten.

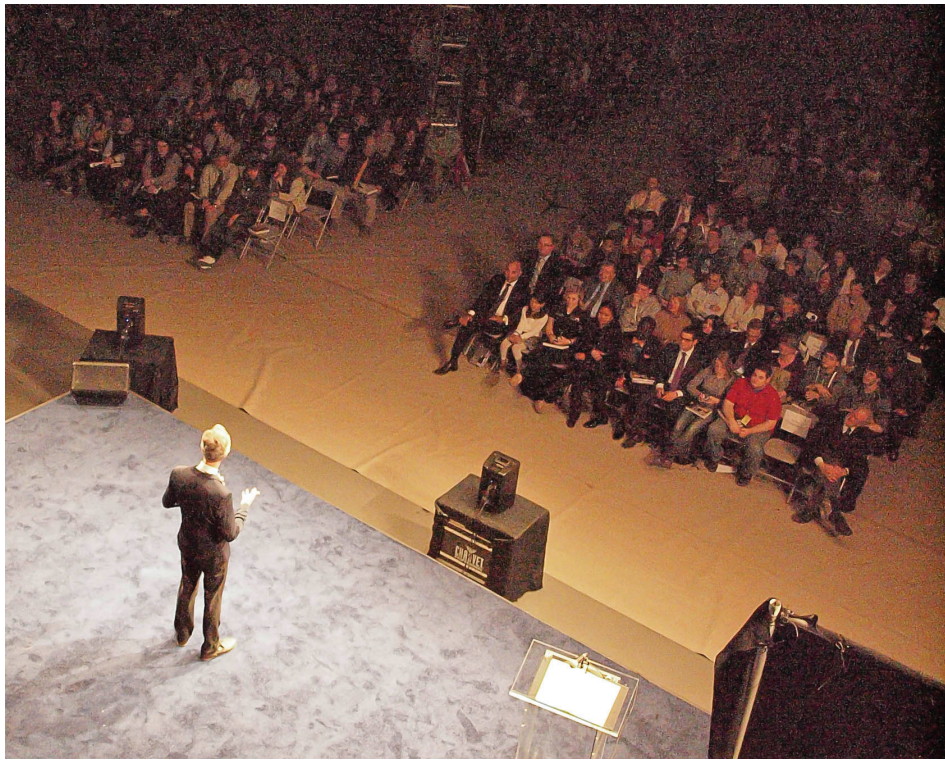

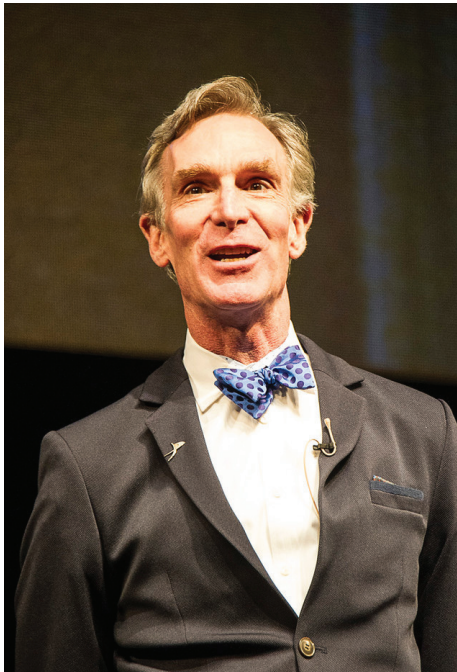

Wolfram's idea is just that, an idea. The coop has no store front, and no produce to sell. Not yet. But, in a relatively short amount of time, the corporation has earned the respect and support of some of the most influential members in town.

"She's been working really hard for a long time, taking an entrepreneur's approach to the co-op business," said Charles Steiner, president and CEO of The Chamber of Schenectady County. Community leaders such as Steiner see the benefits of the proposed community-owned market to the region as a whole. Of course, the focus of bringing a food co-op draws potential consumers back to Schenectady, and, "the co-op is investing in their community," said Steiner.

Since establishing the business plan, Wolfram describes a cosmic chain of events that helped introduce Electric City Food Cooperative Inc. to the Mallozzi family, "I took them over to Honest Weight in Albany, so they could see what I was talking about; how busy, how active, how engaged people were. They saw the bulk foods, the meats, [and] the fresh produce," she said.

On Tuesday, April 7, Johnny's Restaurant will host a membership drive for the co-op from 5 to 7 p.m. Wolfram said the evening is focused on educating people.

"The common question is, 'Why would you start a co-op instead of a regular a market?'," said Wolfram. "I thought if this was something that could be supported by the community, it will live. It will exist for a long time. If it's [only] something that Katherine wants to do, it

may not survive."

A food cooperative is a mutually-owned market, where the members who shop their own a stake in the business. Members also have a say in what produce is sold in the market, which is often food obtained through local farmers. Other food not native to the area are obtained through fair trade, said Wolfram.

The concept has grown in popularity in recent years, through the collective movement of a more environmentally conscious consumer. Locally grown food appeals to consumers concerned with carbon emissions otherwise expelled from transporting produce from other areas of the country, or globe. While bulk foods encourage shoppers to bring their own containers from home, promoting recycling and reducing waste from discarded packages. Organic foods may also be available, said Wolfram, which is food produced without the aid of pesticides, growth hormones or other agents.

The 60-year-old Wolfram is no stranger to fresh food. As a child growing up in the Carolinas, her family owned a farm with 250 dairy cows, chickens and food available off the land. In time, she moved on and became a molecular biologist. Away from the farm, she bought her food from the supermarket. When she lost her job about five years ago, like most Americans at the time, she had difficulty finding a job in her field. No one was hiring "grandma" for an entry-level position, she said.

"When I lost my job I wanted to start a business," said Wolfram. "We don't have a natural food store here [in Schenectady], and I saw that Amsterdam has

one. I thought 'That was it'. That was it for me. That gave me what I wanted to do."

In 2011, Wolfram attended an entrepreneurial boot camp organized by the Albany-Colonie Regional Chamber of Commerce. It's a 12-week program that guides people through the process of starting and managing a business. Wolfram earned her certificate, and plotted out the first steps to a corporation that now has more than 100 individuals, either holding positions within the organization or committed to earning a share in the co-op.

"[I] developed a survey and sent it around to everyone I knew, and asked them to send it around to everyone they knew," said Wolfram. "And, in a year's time I had 466 people who responded, and 261 of those said they would be likely to join. So, that gave me enough reason to keep going. So I pursued it."

Through the assistance of Cornell Cooperative Extension, Wolfram arranged a meeting with the community, and from there a steering committee formed in 2012. They met a couple of times a month, researched a number of different aspects on co-ops and foods, and developed by-laws. Two years after receiving her entrepreneurial boot camp certificate, she was filing letters of incorporation.

Dozens of community leaders aided in the creation of Electric City Cooperative Inc., said Wolfram, including other food co-ops throughout the region. "The idea

here is we are stronger together," she said. "A good experience at one co-op leads people to shop preferentially at co-ops." Mohawk Harvest (in Gloversville), Honest Weight (in Albany), Niskayuna Co-Op and Schenectady Greenmarket have all helped as mentors and for providing connections to local farmers.

Establishing a store front downtown will set Electric City apart from contemporaries often located in suburban locations. Parking may be a challenge, said Wolfram, which hindered a similar project from thriving in Troy. But, she said, her organization has looked at areas where they can avoid such a pitfall. Once the co-op garners approximately 400 members, Wolfram

said they start focusing on a place to call home.

Just another step towards making another dream come to life in the Electric City.

"Neighborhood revitalization requires bringing affordable housing and healthy food to neighborhoods," said Wolfram. "We want to be part of that progress towards revitalization."

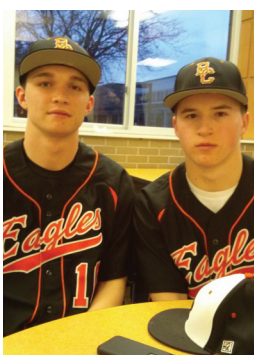

Carroll claimed the men's division title with a time of 25:52, and Dunham earned the women's division title with a time of 28:42 in the 27th running of the Dash Sunday, March 29.

Carroll took the lead within the first quarter mile of the 5-mile road race and pulled away from the pack — so much so, he had to challenge himself by trying to catch the person riding the pace bike.

"I was expecting to run with some of the guys," said Carroll, a Saratoga Springs resident. "Once I was in the lead, I just tried to catch the woman on the bike. She was pretty quick, but she was very good at pointing out all the icy spots on the course."

The clear, cold morning conditions allowed the thin coating of snow to remain on the ground, giving the race a mid-winter atmosphere, which suited Dunham just fine.

"I thought (the pace) was going to be slow, but my time was faster than last year," said Dunham, a Peru resident who finished the course in a time of 28:42. "Besides the black ice, it was a good day to run."

Albany's Mike Roda was second overall with a time of 26:17, 25 seconds behind Carroll. Latham's Thomas O'Grady was third with a time of 26:20.

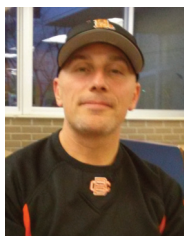
Here is a closer

glassy, bloodshot eyes. He allegedly told police he had consumed three to four drinks at a bar and was driving home. According to police, he was "overly apologetic," apologizing five to six times before he was asked to exit his vehicle. Police said he failed all three standardized field sobriety tests that were administered. A chemical breath test revealed he had a BAC of 0.16 percent.

• Albany County Sheriff's Office arrested Terri A. Henry, 53, of 157 Knox Gallupville Road in Berne, around 10:45 a.m. Saturday, March 14, and charged her with DWI and speeding. A deputy

observed Henry traveling 70 mph eastbound on State Route 443 and stopped her. Police observed Henry to have a strong odor of alcohol emanating from her breath, slurred speech, and bloodshot, glassy eyes. She was visibly upset, according to police, and said she was traveling to the hospital to see her mother. She initially said she had consumed cough medication before driving and a glass of wine the prior night. She later admitted to allegedly consuming a "large cup" of vodka before driving, according to police. A chemical breath test revealed she had a BAC of 0.12 percent.

permits, allow hunting on currently prohibited land, or allow hunting near the Hudson River. The committee also suggested the program could work to connect hunters with those landowners who want to reduce the deer population near their property.

The committee did not recommend surgical sterilization, town-sponsored culling, a catch-and-release program, euthanizing deer, DEC

approval of bait stations or the increased use of pesticides on town-owned lands.

Committee member Linda Jasinski said another solution could be the increased allowance of chickens in residential areas to keep the ticks at bay. Currently, chickens are only allowed in agricultural areas unless granted a variance from the town's zoning board.

Ultimately, the committee recommended the town start its own program to deal with the population problem. The current advisory committee

would stay in place, with the inclusion of additional town staff, school district staff, community organizations and residents. The working name is the Bethlehem Management Program for Deer and Ticks, but another name could be selected in the future.

"While I was in the hospital through Christmas, I ended up closing nights for two weeks" at the Luncheonette, said David. "I couldn't make people work the kind of hours I work."

David also is a chef at his restaurant and works up to 100 hours a week. Lisa works long hours as a partner of Log Cabin Fabrics, along with doing behind the scenes work at

the Luncheonette.

"I just finished paying off Albany Med for my first embolism 18 months ago," said David. "We have better health insurance now than the first time around. When you are self-employed there is no such thing as disability" or getting paid time off.

Lisa also just went through another surgery. David said she is doing well and is likely to be

released early next week.

Mark said his brother works longer hours than anyone he knows. "He has really poured his effort into this place for more than 30 years," said Mark.

Most of the financial stress for David has come from just keeping the restaurant operational while he was unable to work. He had to give employees more hours to cover his duties during a tough winter with business already taking a hit. David also plows in the winter, but he had to hire someone to cover his plowing duties

so his clients weren't snowed in.

What has been helpful for David through the tough time is how others have been empathetic of his situation. There is a mechanic that's allowed him to defer payments. His produce supplier has also "been easy" about slow payments.

"What my brother is hoping is that I can pay-off my friends and get back on track," said David. "My goal is to pay-off everyone that has been helping me along."

Admittedly, David said it's "weird" to have a fundraiser supporting him. "I have never asked for help," he said.

Mark did not expect his brother to ask people for assistance, which is why he spearheaded the fundraiser. Setting it up on GoFundMe.com also allowed Mark to easily manage it, because he lives Georgia.

"He wouldn't have done this [fundraiser] himself and wouldn't tell people who come in ... he definitely needs the help right now," said Mark. "He has gotten some of (the

money) already and he said it was very helpful."

Mark thought community members would want to help David and Lisa out if they knew about their situation.

"I think it would certainly make him feel like he is appreciated" if people donated to the fundraiser, said Mark.

For years, David has been on the opposite end of fundraising and charitable donations. He views it as just a part of being in business, but his outreach has stretched beyond giving out gift certificates.

"It is just part of being a business, being a community," he said. "It is real people and it is not just sort of nebulous money you throw away."

He has provided thousands of "Performance Muffins" for Tour de Cure bike riders, according to Mark. David has also formed a team for Tour de Cure and is trying to fundraise for this year's event. Some regular participants will even start chanting "muffin men" when they see anyone riding up wearing one of

his team's jerseys.

"It is a lot of fun and you meet the great people at these things," said David.

He has also participated annually in the "Cooks for Kids" fundraiser, which supports an inner-city reading program for disadvantaged children. Some other charitable ventures have included preparing holiday dinners for the homeless in Albany, donating food to customers being treated for cancer and several instances of donating food to fundraisers.
