

**CAPITAL DISTRICT** — The holiday shopping season continued with Small Business Saturday on Nov. 24 as residents were encouraged to peruse local stores and support neighbors who own them.

Since American Express started the

movement eight years ago, it has grown nationally to join Black Friday and Cyber Monday in emboldening people to open their wallets. That movement has reached the Capital District, and the Bethlehem and Guilderland Chambers of Commerce, in particular, are hoping that the crowds don't just shop at larger-scale stores.

She explained that the chamber had frequently corresponded with and received promotional materials from Amex for several months. Such materials included signs, reusable shopping bags, pens and banners, all aimed to supply participating small businesses in order to promote Small Business Saturday and their stores.

In turn, the chamber shared information with Amex so that it can gather nationwide statistics as to how many small businesses were participating in the movement. This year, she said that the chamber generally first reached out to small businesses to ask if they want to take part in the movement and let them know of the benefits, such as getting the aforementioned promotional materials.

"We also have been promoting Small Business Saturday by communicating about it in our weekly newsletters and on social media," McGuinness said. "It makes sense for the chamber to help out because we have dynamic businesses which would benefit the community."

On the Guilderland side, its chamber president Michelle Viola-Straight said that it has also been gathering marketing bags filled with promotional materials which it gave out to its sphere of small businesses. "We've been promoting to people to think, 'Shop local,' and reshape their mindsets," she said.

The chamber organized an event at the Guilderland Public Library on Saturday, Nov. 24 where 25 vendors were able to promote themselves, interact with residents, expand their social media outreach and network with other small businesses.

Viola-Straight specifically noted how the chamber has paid attention to Altamont too, where it reached out to small businesses there.

"Altamont is a tight and small community, and the people there love their small businesses. They do have a different set of concerns and hurdles to jump as residents there shop more within Altamont and don't typically want to go out to other areas to shop," she said. "So in general, we want to help businesses and work with local officials to create rich economic growth for each town, although

in Altamont, we want to keep in mind its quaint, rustic aspect as well."

She also brought up how the chamber has started setting up the Altamont Business Council which would be one of its divisions—it would have its chair and committee. She has attended village meetings in Altamont and even met with New Scotland's Douglas LaGrange in hopes of setting up another council in that town, too.

"By next year, we hope for two separate councils in Altamont and New Scotland," she said.

In Guilderland, Viola-Straight said that there have been many people moving into the town from elsewhere in the country in hopes of opening their own business and joining the chamber.

"Lots of folks will contact us and say, "I'm looking to move from like California or Connecticut' and they'd ask about what the Guilderland area is like and where places like hospitals, stores, and schools are. We're basically a one-stop shop for business needs and advice."

# COMMUNITY Local YMCA ready for holiday traffic

To keep residents physically active through the end of the year

BETHLEHEM - With so manyThanksgiving dinner leftovers, shopping temptations and more hearty holiday meals to come, it could become quite tough to stick to one's regular exercise routine or stay fit during this time of year.

Despite this general mindset, Carl Oropolla, the executive director of the Bethlehem branch of Capital District YMCA, said he believes that "people during this time of year are more determined to stay fit and active, and even though many think about the food and shopping, that gives people yet even more motivation."

Located at 900 Delaware Ave. in Delmar, the branch has scheduled a number of events and activities to welcome residents to stay active during this festive season.

Oropolla said that during the month of December, the Bethlehem Central High School hockey team will play Queensbury High on Wednesday, Dec. 5 at the YMCA. Also, on Dec. 28 and 29, various hockey teams from out of town

will come and play at 3 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. respectively, which will be open to the public. Oropolla added that "generally large crowds" come out for these games.

Andrea Fecteau, the branch's office assistant, scholarship coordinator and member service manager, said that a family movie night is planned for Friday, Dec. 7. Expect treats like popcorn and hot cocoa, she added.

Also, the Winter Ice Show will occur on Saturday, Dec. 15 from 12 to 2 p.m. which is held by the Albany Figure Skating Club. It will feature young figure skaters from across the Capital District who will perform both solo and in groups. Keep an eye out for a bake sale and basket raffle there too, all proceeds of which will support the club's activities and programs. Admission is \$5 for adults, \$3 for seniors and students, and it's free for children aged 5 and under.

Rusty Decker, the branch's program and rink director, said that on Sunday, Dec. 23 from 3:45 to 5:45 p.m., its ice rink will showcase a public skating session "with a holiday twist as there will be a Christmas tree at the center with presents all around." There will also be hot chocolates and snacks for attendees.

The session's admission prices are the same as they are all year round. For

YMCA members, it's \$2 for adults, \$1 for students, free for children aged 5 and under, and \$1 for skate rental. For non-members, it's \$5 for adults, \$4 for students, \$3 for children aged 5 and under, and \$2 for skate rental.

From Dec. 27 through 30, people can take a lifeguarding course from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. To sign up for that, visit https:// cdymca.org/programs/.

With all these events for the festive season, Oropolla said the branch expects a surge in attendance "because families and college students generally come home here Diego Cagara / Spotlight News

Regarding numbers, he said the branch has 10,500 members and "usage of the Y is high in the holiday season. It's upwards of 35,000 swipes per month."

He concluded that "our branch boasts a welcoming space inside to hang out with family friends. So come on in!"

# What to expect at First Night

To bring families together and welcome 2019

**BETHLEHEM** — The town's third annual First Night celebration will kick off on New Year's Eve on Monday, Dec. 31 with fireworks at the Four Corners at 6:30 p.m, and lots of family-friendly entertainment and activities within walking distance.

People can expect things like an outdoor ice sculpture, face painting, children-friendly crafts activities, a green screen photo booth, and a kosher food festival.

Organizations like Therapy Dogs International, Bethlehem Traditional Irish Dance, Broadway Bound Performing Arts Academy and the state Department of Environmental Conservation will also appear. The live entertainment lineup will include Nisky Dixie Cats, magician Jim Snack, Andy the Music Man, and the Mendelssohn Club. There will even be a Bethlehem's Got Teen Talent Show at the Town Hall.

"First Night Bethlehem is a great new tradition that brings our community together to have fun and raise money for groups that help our neighbors in need," said Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven, in a press release sent out on Nov. 15.

Presented in partnership with the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce, First Night helps raise money for local non-profit organizations and their programs—Bethlehem Community Fund, Bethlehem Opportunities Unlimited (BOU), Bethlehem Senior Projects, and Friends of Bethlehem Parks and Recreation.

Buttons are \$10 per adult or \$15 on the day of the event, \$5 for ages 12 to 18, and they are free for children under 12.

They can be bought in person at the Bethlehem Public Library (451 Delaware Ave.), Town Hall (445 Delaware Ave.), Delmar Marketplace (406 Kenwood Ave.), Perfect Blend Cafe (376 Delaware Ave.), and Twisted Vine Wine & Tap (384 Kenwood Ave).

the middle school to take shelter from a sub-zero wind chill.

Weather forecasters predicted record cold temperatures for the Northeast as a winter cold front swept over the region the night before. The front produced wind gusts as high as 25 mph. Those winds rushed over a snowy landscape making the quiet town feel more like the inside of a freezer.

The Albany International Airport recorded the temperature at 11 degrees shortly before the start of the race. With a steady wind of 14 mph, the calculated wind chill was -5 degrees once the race began.



Working with Mitchell Associates Architects, a Voorheesville-based firm which specializes in the design public safety buildings, the project entails three main components: constructing a new headquarters on district-purchased land located along U.S. Route 9W next to Albertus W. Becker Elementary School, reconstructing its second station at 301 Glenmont Road in Glenmont, and making improvements to its third station at 480 Bridge St. in South Bethlehem.

The bond vote would enable the Selkirk Fire District to borrow all of the money necessary to complete this project, mostly through 30-year bonds. However, according to a press release issued by the District on Nov. 16, some of the costs "will be offset by revenue generated from the sale of property and income from unused portions of the new property on Rt. 9W." If passed, it would cost the average district homeowner around \$100 annually.

According to Selkirk Fire District Chairman Charles Wickham, this proposal was the most costefficient avenue the district could take now, based on the results of several reports and analyses conducted on the fire stations' safety and efficiency standards over the last 13 years, including the 2005-published Selkirk Fire District 2010 Report, the 2011 Manitou Study, and the Mitchell/FAC Report in 2017. Having consulted professional engineers and architects, these studies not only looked into each station's overall serving capacity, but also outlined numerous recommendations for the future, including the purchase of land on which to build a new headquarters, and better consolidating the fire district's resources. All three of these documents are available online for the public to view at http:// selkirkfd.org/buildingproject/.

The project's roots originated more than a decade ago when members felt each of the three firehouses seemed less adequate to handle its personnel, fleet of fire trucks, and other needed services.

The two main issues of concern are firefighter safety and the stations' outdated architecture, which could result in lower recruitment rates in the future.

These include how each fire station is physically too small to safely house and maintain its vehicle fleet; for example, there is a weight limit on the parked vehicle fleet at one of the three stations because there is a basement right underneath where the trucks are parked; some of the trucks must be taken outside for maintenance or other activities as they almost touch the ceilings within the station. In addition, the three stations do not have enough space for firefighters to work nor hold community events; the trucks' diesel fumes and other harmful chemicals used during emergencies can easily affect firefighters' health and spread across the stations' rooms; and there is not enough space for firefighters to safely board or exit the fire trucks.

Saying that some fire trucks have actually hit the stations, Wickham added, "We're scared because if somebody gets hurt, it's not going to be a bruise. It's going to be serious. Someone can get killed very easily, like first getting their foot stuck, or tripping and falling, or getting run over."

why the fire stations have felt substandard in recent years is because they were originally built using architectural and design standards from a time when both apparatus and the district's population were much smaller. Station 1, located at 126 Maple Ave. in Selkirk, was originally built in 1928, while Station 2, in Glenmont, and Station 3, in South Bethlehem, were constructed in 1952 and 1956 respectfully. Currently, the district has more than 50 volunteer firefighters who serve almost 2,500 homes across a 32 square-mile radius, this explains why the stations' outdated architectural designs are troublesome today, whereas they seemed ideal in the past.

"The new project plans to have a more open space to show off this original fire truck to the public so that they can see how fire trucks used to look like then and admire its design,' Wickham said. "It's tragic and unfortunate that for now, we're forced to leave it inside that room."

A pair of public meetings, during which district residents can learn more about and better understand the proposed project and its importance, are scheduled to take place prior to the Dec. 11 bond vote. Fire District Commissioners strongly encourage members of the public to attend one or both of these meetings and speak with members of the fire department.

The first was held on Tuesday, Nov. 27, at Station 2, while the second is scheduled to take place at Station 1 on Thursday. An open house will run from


She did point out that Crossgates Mall, which is located within Guilderland, does have some local-owned stores, even though people may assume it only includes bigger chain stores.







As a children's author, she helps young readers understand the benefits of mindfulness; to pay attention to who you are, and where you are, without passing judgment.

From a young age, Verde felt comfort while reading books. Her parents enjoyed reading to her and there were lots of books throughout their home. Throughout her life books have helped quiet her mind and inspire her imagination. When she became a teacher she collected picture books and loved the way they could express big messages in simple ways. Her love of reading combined with the positive ways books have influenced her life, helped her decide to write.

Her story "I Am Human" has become a New York Times best-selling book and she loves conveying the messages that are within its pages. She believes that in today's difficult climate people are forgetting that each one of us is human and share so many qualities that make us vulnerable and wonderful. Children (of all ages) need to be reminded that at our core we are all living the same human experience full of mistakes, joy and sadness. Verde explains how the term "mindfulness" has been confused over the years. In one sense, parents use the word in place of carefulness. While others brush off the concept as something too esoteric to invest any time in. What she brings to light is something more simple.

Verde, who is a parent of three, speaks of mindfulness in terms that relate to both children and parents. Regardless of age, we are all exposed to stressful moments. Times in which our surrounding environment pokes and prods us into an emotional reaction. The stress of the situation takes us away from the moment. That esoteric concept, Verge said, can be achieved by simply breathing.

"It's a way of really connecting in the moment," said the author. "To know you can pause and breathe and connect to what is happening makes parenting a bit easier and allows me to project less and observe more and it makes the moments in life more fulfilling."


The importance of breathing is something the author learned from her times practicing yoga. It's a means of helping one pay attention to the body, it's also used as a means of meditation to control the mind. It's not a mistake. Verde explained how breathing is connected to the body's nervous system.

"As a lover of books, I am inspired by the messages Susan conveys through her works," said Deborah Wyngowski, the Brown School ibrarian who came up with the idea to bring the author to the school. "At Brown School we focus on helping our students to be mindful in everything they do. We actively work with them on this so they can apply it to their lives in many ways. We believe Susan will touch many in the short time she is with us and we are honored to have her visit."

# **A Day of Simple Giving**

Hundreds volunteer to help troops, community before Thanksgiving

ALBANY — 300 eager volunteers transformed Grassroot Givers' 12th annual Day of Simple Giving into a Day of Joyful Giving.

With passion and good humor, volunteers manned 20 work stations for three hours at St. Sophia's Greek Orthodox Church on the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The day's effort of creating and organizing produced \$30,000 worth of goods and holiday treats to be donated to Albany County's destitute.

To date, the organization has collected and given away 260,000 books as well as thousands of dollars worth of new or like new used clothing, basic necessities, and household goods to people who cannot afford them.

Aware of their own good fortune, people of all ages and walks of life - Boy and Girl Scout troops, families, millennials, senior citizens, and business employees

- worked in harmony to bring a measure of comfort and pleasure to their neighbors living in poverty.

Teagan McLoughlin, 5, came with her mother and sister. She was the first volunteer to send warm wishes to servicemen serving abroad.

"I'm going to write stuff and draw pictures for the troops," she said, proudly. "I know it will make them feel happy.'

Handwritten messages from many volunteers will be sent abroad, along with Chapstick, puzzle and crossword books, and composition notebooks.

Liz Salerni and Rosina Ansaldo manned the book station where books are organized by grade level and then given to teachers who need them.

The cookie decorating table was staffed in part by enthusiastic children as young as 8-years-old. Some adorned themselves with

frosting and sprinkles on their faces.

Teenagers worked side by side with elementary school students to craft beautiful bracelets and jewelry. Senior citizens and students from Green Tech packed warm socks and toiletries for the homeless. Items included shampoo, conditioner, lotion and other in front of goody essentials.

"I'm determined to help out the community," said Donell Henry, a highschool senior. "I want to get out of my comfort zone and volunteer more."

A Girl Scout troop from Selkirk wrapped bars of soap and washcloths, and tied them with ribbon. Teenagers from Jack and Jill, an African American youth group organization, assembled bean soup mixes with 10 varieties of beans and spices.

"When you see caring hearts and loving outreach, it reinforces the sense of good so prevalent in all of us," said Congressmen Paul Tonko, who circled the room and chatted at length with volunteers.

At the close of the Simple Giving event, weary, but smiling and several volunteers hefted hundreds of bags filled to the brim and put them in cars, all headed for many of the



## Slow Cooker Spiced-Cranberry Pork

#### Ingredients: Makes 8 servings

- 31/2 to 4 pound pork shoulder1 6-oz can jellied cranberry sauce
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup cranberry juice
- 2 tablespoons Dijon-style mustard
- 11/2 teaspoons ground cloves
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper Salt to taste

#### **Instructions:**

Trim fat from pork roast, if necessary. Place roast in 4- to 6-quart slow cooker. Use wire whisk to stir together cranberry sauce and sugar in medium bowl. Stir in juice, mustard, cloves and pepper until well combined. Pour cranberry mixture over roast in slow cooker.

Cover slow cooker and cook on low for 6 to 8 hours or until pork roast is tender. Season roast to taste with salt; serve juices with roast.

# Fasting the pounds away

Fasting for weight loss and better health


ntermediate fasting plans are among today's most popular diets. Many people embrace fasting as an effective way to shed pounds, reduce risk for various weight-related illnesses and improve overall health. Interest in intermediate fasting is growing, and experts offer varying opinions about the best and safest ways to make the most of this diet strategy.

Fasting comes in various forms. With the 5:2 fast, for

example, individuals follow a traditional diet for five days of the week. The remaining two days are fast days. Those fast days allow only water as sustenance, but often include caloric intake that does not exceed 500 to 600 calories.

Alternate-day fasting is another option, with one day of having normal caloric intake, followed by the next with the 500-calorie limit; rinse and repeat.

Other fasting plans involve timed eating. With the 16:8 diet, people eat whatever they like within a predetermined window of time, typically between 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. They then fast for the remaining 16. A





study published in the journal Nutrition and Health Aging and led by Krista Varady, an associate professor of kinesiology and nutrition at the University of Illinois at Chicago, found the 16:8 diet a successful way for obese individuals to lose weight. The study also found that this diet helped to lower blood pressure in participating individuals. On average, when compared with the control trial, those on the 16:8 diet consumed 350 fewer calories and lost 3 percent of their weight. In addition, their blood pressure dropped by an average of seven millimeters of mercury over the length of the study.

In addition to weight loss and improved blood chemistry metrics, fasting may also improve longevity, suggest researchers. An ongoing study by the National Institute on Aging conducted on rhesus monkeys, which share 93 of their genetic makeup with humans, found calorie-restriction diets helped certain monkeys live anywhere from 14 to 17 years longer in captivity. Restricting calories may activate genes that direct cells to preserve resources and stall out instead of grow. In this state, the cells are resistant to stress and illness.

It can take some time for people to find a fasting plan that works for them. Before the body becomes acclimated to fasting, headaches, hunger pangs, low energy, and mood swings may occur. Eating high-fiber foods can help a person feel fuller longer. Consuming plenty of water also can help. Always consult with a doctor before beginning a new diet regimen.




