DELMAR — The Bethlehem Central School District transportation department installed the first of its stop arm cameras for its school bus fleet last week on Tuesday, Jan. 3.

The stop arm cameras were installed at no cost to the district or the county, the district shared in an online statement.

Shot fired on Kenwood Avenue

DELMAR - Bethlehem Police arrested a Troy man on Tuesday, Jan 3 after he allegedly fired a gun at a woman after a domestic incident in February.

According to police, the victim in the case reports that there was a domestic incident that occurred on February 15, 2022 at approximately 7:00 p.m., in the area of lower Kenwood Avenue.

As the victim was leaving that area in her vehicle - Zereem Williams, 21, of Troy, allegedly discharged a firearm at her vehicle.

No one was injured during the incident.

Williams was charged

with attempted murder, criminal use of a firearm, attempted assault and reckless endangerment.

He was arraigned by Bethlehem Town Judge Ryan Donovan and bail was set at \$65,000. Williams was sent to the Albany County Jail to await bail.

New Scotland man arrested for X-mas robbery

VOORHEESVILLE -State Police arrested a New Scotland man on a variety of charges stemming from a Christmas day incident.

On Tuesday, Jan. 3, State Police arrested Shandell L. Scott, 32, of New Scotland, for robbery, grand larceny, criminal contempt and aggravated family offense, all felonies, and petit larceny and harassment, both misdemeanors.

On Sunday, Dec. 25, at

about 12:00 p.m., Troopers responded to reports of a dispute with theft in Voorheesville.

The investigation determined that Scott struck and forcibly took multiple items from the victim. The incident occurred while an active stay-away order of protection was in effect against Scott, protecting the victim.

Scott surrendered himself to State Police at the New Scotland barracks and was processed. He was arraigned at the New Scotland Town Court and remanded to the Albany County Correctional Facility without bail.



You're on camera

"This is an exciting day as we welcome Bethlehem Central Schools into Albany County's School Bus Safety Program," said Albany County Executive Daniel P. McCoy. "They are one of the largest school districts in the Capital Region and the second to partner with us on this initiative. I want to thank them for putting the safety of their students first."

BusPatrol's stop arm cameras and sensors will be installed on the outside of BC's buses. If a driver violates the required stop by passing around a bus, the artificial intelligence-equipped cameras will automatically record license plate details and a video clip of the violation, which will be sent to law enforcement for evaluation. Tickets will be issued to a vehicle's registered owner unless the automobile is proven stolen during the offense. The owner can request a transfer of liability if someone other than the owner was driving at the time.

Violators will learn about the potential dangers of their actions in addition to a fine. The BusPatrol program offers a toll-free number that offenders can call; a representative will review the video evidence with them and help to educate individuals on the dangers of illegal passing.

According to the state Department of Motor Vehicles, penalties up to \$300 can be levied upon the owner of a vehicle that passes a stopped school bus. The first violation carries a \$250 penalty. A second violation within 18 months costs \$275. A third violation, or more, within 18 months results in a \$300 fine.

"Student transportation safety is top priority," said Bethlehem Central's Director of Student Transportation, Karim Johnson. "Stop arm cameras have proven to make a dramatic difference in buses being passed, this adds another level of safety for our students going to and from school. I'm grateful to County Executive Dan McCoy and BusPatrol for making this extra precaution a reality."

Data from other safety programs demonstrates that 94

percent of first-time offenders do not receive a second ticket, and that 95 percent of drivers do not contest their ticket after seeing video evidence of their violation.

Passing a school bus with its stop arm extended is illegal in every U.S. state. An estimated 50,000 cars illegally pass stopped school buses in New York State every day, these stop-arm violations endanger the lives of students. Bethlehem Central School district will combat dangerous driving around its school buses with the installation of stop arm cameras, a new safety initiative, led by the Albany County Executive's office, in a partnership between the County and BusPatrol.

"One child lost to reckless driving is too many, and our school bus cameras hold drivers accountable in order to prevent tragedies down the road," McCoy said. "I hope that today's announcement will encourage more school districts to opt into our program so every student across Albany County has this added protection."

A percentage of proceeds from ticket revenue will go to BusPatrol America LLC in exchange for the service.

Albany Pine Bush adds 15 more acres

ALBANY – The Albany Pine Bush Preserve Commission recently acquired a 15.1-acre parcel of land to add to the 3,400-acre preserve.

The Commission purchased the property from a landowner that indicated they were interested in selling it late last year. This new addition adds to the 41 acres the Town of Colonie dedicated to the preserve last February, making up an area of nearly 120 connected acres of protected land in western Colonie.

"The goal is to fill in these pieces and connect them for continuity – lands adjacent to one another provide for species movement, public recreation and buffer from nearby development," said Commission Executive Director Christopher Hawver.

Since 1988, with the creation of the Albany Pine Bush Preserve Commission, over 3,400 acres, spanning 3 municipalities, have been permanently protected as part of the preserve. However, more remains to be done. The Commission still needs to protect an additional 2,000 acres in order to assure the viability of the ecosystem. Protecting the land, however, is just the start of making the barrens healthy again. The specialized plants and animals there are fire-dependent, so the Commission uses prescribed fire as well a variety of other tools to conserve this distinct local treasure.

The Albany Pine Bush Preserve is not complete; neighbors can help protect more land as well as support the restoration of this globally-rare National Natural Landmark. The Albany Pine Bush Preserve is the largest open space area in the immediate Capital District, with a future goal of 5,380 acres. Hawver continued, "There are a number of additional properties we'd like to see added and protected from willing landowners. With our state and local partners, we hope to continue the momentum."

The Commission encourages anyone who has land within the Albany Pine Bush Preserve study area, and is interested in selling, to contact Christopher Hawver at chawver@ albanypinebush.org.

At approximately 3,400 acres, the Albany Pine Bush Preserve protects one of the best remaining inland pitch pine-scrub oak barrens in the world. This extraordinary fire-dependent ecosystem provides habitat for many plants and animals, including more than 20 percent of New York State's wildlife Species of Greatest Conservation Need, such as the endangered Karner blue butterfly.

The Pine Bush is a National Natural Landmark, Maurice D. Hinchey Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area, National Recreation Trail Site, a New York State Unique Area, Birding Trail Site, Bird Conservation Area, and a National Audubon Society Important Bird Area.



The addition of new controllers with faster technology to the entire fleet of bikes made for a more efficient rental process for CDPHP Cycle! members. The program expanded into Menands and Watervliet, where more than 1,200 rides were taken this season. The biggest increase in ridership this year came from Schenectady. The city went from 2,800 rides in 2021, to more than 6,000 rides this

In all, the program saw 128,600 miles ridden, 5.1 million calories burned, 113,400 pounds of carbon reduced, and saved \$74,600.

GUILDERLAND — A renewed sense of normalcy

COVID

The extended hours closely reflect how the mall operated prior to the onset of the COVID pandemic nearly three years ago. Virus mitigation protocols forced the mall to close in March 2020. Limited operations slowly increased since doors were allowed to reopen four months later. Progress was slowed as mall operators lobbied and sued the governor's office, as they fought to meet mitigation measures.

Infection cases in Albany County have remained steady over the past three months. Since a peak of 106 cases reported in October, only 19 new cases were reported to the County on Tuesday, Jan. 3. There was a similar spike in new cases at the end of the year, with 79 reported on Dec. 30.

As of Tuesday, the 7-day average for new cases is 44.



Guilderland EmUrgentCare reopens

Broadview \$500K in donations to fight food insecurity



The Eagles defense was strong out of the gate, but the Bengals came back to lead at the half 32-28.


Bethlehem's Kieran Barnes led the Eagles back to tie the score at 36 in the third quarter and led the team in scoring for the game with 21 points.



SABIC, OQ and KPI together in world-scale petrochemical complex prop

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia — SABIC, OQ and Kuwait Petroleum International signed a Project Development Agreement of a jointly owned petrochemical complex in the Special Economic Zone at Duqm, the Sultanate of Oman.

The three companies aim to establish a petrochemical complex consisting of a steam cracker and derivative units and a natural gas liquid extraction facility. They will conduct the necessary studies and collaborate to develop the project.

Petrochemicals' demand is expected to continue its growth path as living standards and human development improve, particularly in growing markets close to Oman. The project intends to monetise Natural Gas Liquids and other feedstocks from OQ and KPI's joint venture refinery, OQ8 in Duqm, to manufacture petrochemical products targeting growing markets linked to energy transition, clean technologies, mobility, construction, durable goods, healthcare and packaging amongst others.



A record-breaking for CDPHP Cycle!

Season 6 of program results in more than 80K rides

TROY — The Capital District Transportation Authority reported a record-breaking 28,600 members used its CDPHP Cycle bike-sharing program for 80,311 rides last season.

The amount of use set a new record for the bike-sharing program, which last year was the sixth season in activity.

"We are beyond thrilled to see record-breaking ridership on CDPHP Cycle! as we continue to grow the program," said CDTA CEO Carm Basile. "It reinforces the need and want for more mobility options in the Capital Region. We want to thank our riders, partners, and

the community for their continued support in making CDPHP Cycle! a huge success. We can't wait to welcome everyone back in Spring 2023 and to introduce electric bikes."

CDTA officials credited new technology and further expansion into new areas for the jump in numbers. Last year, the program expanded into Menands and Watervliet, where the transportation company said they observed more than 1,200 rides. The largest increase in ridership occurred in Schenectady, where participation went from 2,800 in 2021 to more than 6,000.

"It's hard to believe that we've closed out an incredible, record-breaking sixth season of CDPHP Cycle!," said John D. Bennett, MD, president, and CEO of CDPHP.
"This program is a true testament to the need for a healthier, more sustainable

mode of transportation for area residents and visitors. I am immensely proud of the partnership CDPHP has built with CDTA and look forward to an even more exciting season 7!"

In all, the program saw 128,600 miles ridden, 5.1 million calories burned, 113,400 pounds of carbon reduced, and saved \$74,600!

CDTA said the popular bike-sharing program will return this spring, with the introduction of electric bikes, new technology and more locations. The company also announced a new, three-year partnership with Drop Mobility and Shared Mobility, Inc. that will manage the fleet and daily operational services.

CDTA was named the 2017 Best Mid-Sized Transportation System in North America by the American Public Transportation Association.

"What makes the park unique is the topography; it is unlike any other town park," said Bethlehem Town Parks and Recreation Administrator Jason Gallo.

The park that has the Normans Kill creek also has forests filled with 300 acres of oak and birch trees. "Gorgeous ravines, views of the Normans Kill, real oldgrowth trees, and beautiful views," he added. He likens

the park to the experience of being in the scenic Adirondacks.

Throughout the past few years, Bryant and Primomo began to envision formally finding the resources to build a multi-use trail that residents could utilize. Primomo says that revisiting the area almost forty years later deepened his perspective, and he felt "stewardship for preserving"

the land for future generations."

Bryant remembered how it wasn't until analyzing maps that the extent of the land was discovered. "It's a very unknown resource in our town," he remarked.

Primomo lives near the land and sees many people use it for hiking, walking, snowshoeing, skiing, and bird watching. The varied terrain makes it ideal for a multi-use trail system and park. This distinctive topography also provides opportunities for mountain biking, which would

necessitate the development of an expanded trail system.

"I want to try to build for Normans Kill Ravines a high-quality park that will allow for folks to come from inside our town and outside of our town to enjoy this park," Bryant commented.

He believes that the proximity of the park to the Four Corners and local businesses will help to "endorse the small business owners and small business-owned restaurants in town."

While the park is still in its early stages, they have completed an important State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) process and are finalizing additional permits for further expansion. An upcoming development will be the construction of a professional trail system. Jason Gallo anticipates that there will be even more progress made in the park within the coming year that will aid in its accessibility

necessitate the development and multi-use purposes.

"I would be remiss if I did not mention the countless volunteers who are imperative to making this park a success," said Jason Gallo.

He credits the local mountain biking community for their volunteerism and support in getting the park developed. Individual donors' financial support and Mark Bryant and Lisa Callahan's matching donations through the Friends of the Bethlehem Parks and Recreation have aided in the growth of the park.

Currently, trails have been 'sketched out' by the avid volunteers. Eagle Scout Colin King organized volunteers and fellow scouts to create signage for the trailhead. Maps and photographs on the Town of Bethlehem's website also provide further information about the park.

With the goal of continuing to develop local

parks and trails such as Normans Kill Ravines, a group of committed local volunteers is in the process of forming a nonprofit association that will be called the Bethlehem Trail Association.

The association will be similar to Friends of Bethlehem Parks and Recreation. It will be equipped to organize volunteers, assist with trail system financial support, and contribute to and develop trail systems.

Bryant is optimistic about the association's future success and the many benefits of the Normans Kill Ravines Park. "We've got this gem of a town," he enthused.

"I have all kinds of visions for this... creating parks and pavilions down there, all kinds of uses," said Primomo. "It's just an asset that makes this town just another reason to come here."

Imaginary City- The large-format, abstract paintings of Tomm El-Saieh (b. 1984, Port-au-Prince; lives and works in Miami) teem with dense and dynamic marks that evoke ornament, language, and architecture. By variously layering and erasing his linework, and using vibrant color to optically push or pull his pictures, El-Saieh creates rhythmic, all-over compositions from which larger forms appear to emerge—testing both the limits of our perception and our expectations about abstraction. The exhibition title, which comes from one of the works in the show, refers to a cityscape theme common in Haitian art (Vilaj Imaginé). El-Saieh's paintings, which resemble informal urban plans, likewise develop intuitively, without the use of preparatory studies or outlines. For the artist, who has been unable to return to his birthplace in recent years as a result of the instability there, Port-au-Prince now also exists mainly as a figure in his memory and imagination—a site of joy and trauma, potential and uncertainty.Tomm El-Saieh was born in Haiti and grew up in Miami; he is of Haitian, Palestinian, and Israeli descent. He was the subject of a solo show at the Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA) Miami in 2018 and was included in the New Museum triennial in New York that year. He is partner at the artist-run

gallery CENTRAL FINE in Miami and long directed the El-Saieh Gallery in Port-au-Prince, a venue for contemporary Haitian artists that his grandfather established in the 1950s. This yearlong exhibition appears in public spaces around the Clark and is free and open to the public. 



Pepperoni Pizza Dip with Breadstick Dippers

INGREDIENTS: Serves 8

- 3/4 cup chopped turkey pepperoni
- 4 green onions, chopped

- 1 can (21/4 ounces) sliced black olives, drained
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 package (3 ounces) cream cheese, softened

Dippers

- 1 package (8 ounces) refrigerated breadstick dough
- 2 teaspoons melted butter
- 2 teaspoons minced fresh Italian parsley

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Combine pizza sauce, pepperoni, green onions, olives, and oregano in a 2-quart slow cooker. Cover; cook on low 2 hours or on high 1 to 1/2 hours or until mixture is hot.
- 2. Stir in mozzarella and cream cheese until melted and well blended. Serve with warm Breadstick Dippers.



Food for thought

The basics of meditation

aking steps to safeguard mental health is a vital component of a healthy lifestyle. The National Institute of Mental Health notes that mental health affects how individuals think and feel, the choices they make, and how they relate to others, which underscores just how important it is to prioritize mental health.

- 3. Notice your body. Individuals should be stable and sit in a position they can maintain for a while.
 - 4. Feel your breath.

As you breath in and out, make an effort to feel the sensation of your breath.

- 5. Notice if your mind wanders. It's likely that your mind will wander to other places during your sessions. Pay attention to when it does and then refocus your attention to your breathing.
- 6. Don't judge yourself. Wandering thoughts during meditation are not deserving of scorn. When the mind wanders, simply return to meditating without obsessing over the thoughts that came into your head when your mind wandered off.
- 7. Close with kindness. As your session draws to a close, gently lift your gaze and take a moment to notice your surrounding environment, how your body feels and your thoughts and emotions.



MUSIC REVIEW

Kilashandra's 'Live From The Parting Glass' By LUCAS GARRETT

Bringing Celtic culture together with jam-band stylings is local band Kilashandra. Releasing their record, Live at the Parting Glass, the band – Mark Emanation on guitar and vocals; Chris Gil on guitar and vocal; Eileen Markland



on violin, whistle, and vocals; Tom Dolan on bass and bouzouki – expertly showcase their shared love of Irish music, eclecticism, and technical prowess.

The album opens with a nice reel ("Road to Lisdoonvarna") played initially on guitar, soon followed by the violin. Throughout, the low-end from the bass greatly helps to glue it all together. One of the best parts about this type of music is the ornamentations – the ones you won't find on any sheet music. The band does well to perform this type of music by paying great homage to its tradition. Halfway through, we switch over to another reel, dominated by the violin, and supported well by the guitar ("Cooley's Reel").

Unlike the majority of the record, the following two songs are original compositions. "I Remember Bobby Sands," begins with a palmmuted acoustic guitar part. As the vocals enter the mix, we are greeted with a hauntingly reverb-

saturated performance. The extremely high harmony during the chorus put way back in the mix, is a nice arrangement touch. After the first chorus, we hear a violin part building up further and further until it gets a nice standout feature following the second chorus. After this section, the song has a verse and two consecutive choruses that build in intensity, before a final drop in energy as it ends.

The next song, "To Ireland From Here,"starts with an isolated tin whistle part. It's a great way to draw the listeners' ears in; they are spending time wondering where this is going. As the echo-y whistle recedes temporarily, an acoustic guitar part enters. The combo of this guitar part, along with the whistle coming back to float above and below, is very captivating for this listener. During the latter half of the tune, we hear some tasty lead lines from the guitar, as the whistle takes a backseat. In the song's outro, we hear the

introductory motif as it fades to an end.

Track four, "Spancill Hill," is a very interesting take on the traditional ballad. The version performed by Kilashandra incorporates a lot of improvisation across the array of instrumentation and is punctuated by a vocal passage heard here and there. By doing this, the band blends together improvisational characteristics as well as traditional aspects to the song, a theme that is apparent throughout the album. Another great example of this improvisatory nature is in track five, "Red is the Rose."The ballad opens with a lovely passage of violin, soon followed by a strong tenor lead vocal. During the song's interlude sections, listeners hear the bouzouki and violin weave the piece together in great

Following that song is "Temperance Reel." Wonderfully executed by the band, the piece is in the same key as the

previous song, and serves well as an interlude to the next tune, "Go Lassie Go." Also known historically as "Wild Mountain Thyme," Kilashandra puts forth quite a compelling take on this classic tune. The contrast between the plaintive rhythm guitar part and the bold vocal is hard to miss – it's great. In this listener's opinion, what is really enjoyable about Kilashandra is their ability to oscillate flawlessly between strong vocal and instrumental parts of their tunes. This song is no exception.

Officially closing the record, "Black is the Colour," begins with an extended intro, featuring interplay between guitar and violin. After this, we hear yet another vocal start its delivery. What really sets Kilashandra aside from other Irish music acts is their tendency to lengthen the songs via jamming. Not typically heard that in this particular genre, it is a nice and refreshing change of pace. It is easy to forget this is

a live album - everything is terrifically performed from start to finish. Listeners will get a brief reminder as the song ends with the singer bidding goodnight to everyone as the song concludes. For one more sonic offering, those that keep listening will be greeted with a brief cover of "Parting Glass." Meant as a hidden track, the band's rendition of the haunting hymn is performed mainly on acoustic guitar and bouzouki. Played fairly straightforward, it is perhaps the simplest, true-to-form delivery of a song from the band. No frills - a great way to end the record.

An album comprised of original and traditional material, Kilashandra has put forth a record that pays homage to a vast and strong heritage, while also putting its unique stamp on the sound. Fans of Celtic music and jam bands will find this an entertaining and enjoyable listen.







TROY — Exit 97.7 FM released its list of Top 97 songs from local artists for 2022, a few of which carry the promise of making next year's list, too.

The list is based on airplay and pieced together by the station's Dave Michaels and Andy Gregory.
